PREFACE

The Louisiana Historical Records Survey Project is a unit of the WPA Historical Records Survey Program headed until March 1, 1940, by Dr. Luther H. Evans. In the nation and in the state, the project operates under the administrative supervision of the Research and Records Section of the Division of Professional and Service Projects, Work Projects Administration. From its beginning as a nation-wide project late in 1935, the Historical Records Survey operated under the Writer's Project until November, 1936, when it became an individual part of Federal Project No. 1. The Louisiana unit remained under the Writer's Project until March, 1937. Since October 1, 1939, the work has been continued in Louisiana as a state-wide project.

In Louisiana, the Survey began operation in March, 1936, under Lyle Saxon. On March 10, 1937, the writer became State Director of the Survey. Since March 6, 1938, Vergil L. Bedsole, has served as Supervisor in Louisiana, during the absence of the writer from the State on regional business.

The project is sponsored by the Department of Archives, Louisiana State University, Dr. Edwin A. Davis, Archivist, and co-sponsored by some 65 governmental agencies throughout the state. In this particular instance, the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson has provided the funds necessary for the publication of this series of volumes, as well as the Inventory of Parish Archives, for Jefferson Parish.

The procedures used in the preparation of these transcripts are detailed in the preface to volume I of this series, published in June, 1939, pp. ii-iv. Verne Fisher, Hedda M. Johnson and Oralie Gravemberg, have been the editors in charge of transcription work in Louisiana. The indexes have been prepared under the supervision of David E. Lott.

A physical description of the original record here reproduced follows: The book is bound in reddish brown imitation leather with gold trimmings. A slip of paper pasted to the top of the back binding is marked "No. 10" in ink. Below that in gold letters five inches from the top, are the words "Minute Book". Five inches from the bottom also in gold letters are "Police Jury, Parish of Jefferson." On the front cover is written No. 10 in black ink. There is no writing on the back cover. Two fly leaves are in the front and one in the back of the volume. The book is 18½ by 12½ by 2½ and consists of 399 pages. The following pages are blank: 6, 22, 28, 40, 64, 72, 86, 92, 98, 102, 106, 110, 124, 150, 154, 165, 176, 184, and 190.

General regulations and procedures applicable to all Historical Records Survey Projects in the forty-eight states have been followed in Louisiana. The officials of WPA in the state have given the project cordial support. The interest and cooperation of Jefferson Parish officials is most gratifying.

PARISH OF JEFFERSON

Office of the Police Jury,
Parish of Jefferson,
Gretna, La., Oct. 15, 1918.

The Police Jury met this day in special session.

Members present--Jules G. Fisher, President; A. Rouprich, Wm. E. Strehle, E. Stritzinger, E. Conzelmann, Wm. Luke.

The president announced that the purpose of the meeting was to act jointly with the Board of Alderman of Gretna, the Town Council of Kenner and Jefferson Chapter of American Red Cross in formulating ways and means to combat the epidemic of Influenza prevalent throughout the Parish.

After discussing the matter, it was resolved, on motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Rouprich, that the Police Jury appropriate the sum of \$1500 toward the establishment and operation of an Emergency hospital for the care and treatment of the influenza patients.

The Jury then adjourned.

Messrs E. B. Anthony and W. Toledano, representing citizens of Harahan City, presented a petition requesting that a pole booth be established at Harahan City, to be designated as the 2nd. precinct of the 9th ward.

On motion of Mr. Clancy duly seconded it was resolved that the Parish engineer, in conjunction with the committee representing the voters and residents, be instructed to lay out the boundary lines of said proposed precinct and polling place and report on same at the next regular meeting of the Jury.

F. G. Sheffler, representing Gould Steam Fire Co., No 2, appealed to the Jury for aid in the cost of operating said company's fire truck.

On motion of Mr. Rouprich duly seconded it was resolved that \$40 per month be allowed as one-half cost of operating truck of Gould Steam Fire Co., No. 2, beginning at such time as chauffeur is secured.

The regular order of Business was then resumed.

Petitions was received from residents of Barataria relative to cattle roaming at large, but no action was taken on same.

Aldermen Gugel and Flesch, of the City of Gretna, appeared before the Jury and asked co-operation with the Board of Aldermen of Gretna in the matter of dredging a canal, the cost to be approximately \$2500.

On motion of Mr. Clancy seconded by Mr. Burbank it was resolved that \$500 be appropriated for drainage in the rear of Gretna and that a check for such amount be drawn in favor of the Jefferson & Plaquemine Drainage District, a like sum to be appropriated by the City of Gretna, as part payment of the cost of said canal.

On motion of Mr. Burbank seconded by Mr. Thompson, the president was authorized to loan \$2000.00 of the General Fund to the Sheriff's salary fund.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded By Mr. Strehle, the secre-

tary was instructed to notify Penick & Ford Ltd., that the practice of pumping refuse water into the public ditches must stop at once, otherwise the legal advisor of the Jury will be authorized to secure an injunction to prevent such nuisance.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Strehle the secretary was instructed to notify the Jefferson Distilling Co., that unless action is taken by said company to abate the smoke nuisance at its potash plant the legal advisor of the Jury will be authorized to secure an injunction to prohibit such nuisance.

President Fisher addressed the Jury in behalf of the Fourth Liberty Loan, and at the conclusion of his patriotic appeal, on motion of Mr. Clancy seconded By Mr. Thompson it was resolved that the Police Jury ## subscribe to \$1,000.00 of Fourth Liberty Loan Bonds,

The secretary reported that the sum of \$5 had been turned over to him from 2nd J. of P. as fines collected from violators of the cattle roaming ordinance, and on motion duly seconded the said amount was ordered to be deposited to the credit of the General Fund.

on motion duly seconded same was adopted and bills were ordered paid.

Report of 5th Justice of Peace and Constable of 5th J. of P. court received and ordered filed. Report of Dr. A. W. Vernheder, supervising inspector, was read and ordered filed.

Reports of M. M. Pitre and F. L. St. Martin, dipping vat inspectors, were read and ordered filed. Bill of E. Russell was referred to finance committee, and all other bills were ordered paid. Communications from Jefferson Distilling Co., Supervisor of Public Accounts W. R. Perkins, C. M. Weeks, W. M. Landry were received and ordered filed. Communications from A. B. Graves and I. B. Rennyson Co. were referred to the road superintendent. Communications from Bonnabel Land Co. and E. K. Ferry were referred to the constable of the 5th. J. of P. Court. Communication from Howard Egleston was referred to the 4th. Drainage District Board. Communication from E. H. M' Caleb was referred to the district attorney. Request of Louisiana Meadows Co. that the Jury pay one-half of salary of bridge tender at Bayou Oies was granted, and the sum of \$15.00 per month was ordered appropriated therefor. Request of H. K. Pettigrew that the Jury pay one-half of the value of his cow, claimed on account of the death of the animal after being dipped in the vat at Metairie Ridge, was referred to the district attorney for an opinion. Claim of Wm. Kerner, through John D. Nix, attorney, for \$65.00, alleged to be due for loss of a cow through the dipping process, was referred to the district attorney for an opinion.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Thompson, the following resolution was adopted: Whereas, there has been a continuous complaint lodged with the Police Jury relative to the roaming of cattle upon public roads of 7th and 8th wards of Jefferson Parish; and, Whereas, it is incumbent upon this Police Jury to grant the complaintants relief; and, Whereas, the constable for the 7th and 8th wards covers the said territory to the best of his ability and according to his finances.

Resolved, that the order to grant relief sought in said wards 7 and 8, the salary of the constable for said wards be and the same is hereby fixed at \$100.00 commencing January 1, 1919, payable yearly. Resolved further, that all ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Thompson the following ordinance was adopted: An ordinance of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson regulating the manner of use on the public streets or highways of this Parish, of drays, carts, wagons, automobiles, trucks, motorcycles and every description of carriages and other vehicles used on public streets or highways

in this Parish: Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that the owner, operator, driver or person in charge of any dray, cart, wagon automobile truck, motorcycle and every description of carriage or other vehicle used on the public streets or highways of this parish, shall conform to and observe the following provisions upon all such streets or highways in said parish:

Section 1. A vehicle meeting another shall pass to the right leaving each other at least one-half of the roadway.

Sec. 2. A vehicle overtaking another shall pass to the left side of the overtaken vehicle until entirely clear of it.

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Sec. 3. No Vehicle shall stop except on the extreme right hand side of the street or road.

Sec. 4. In slowing up or stopping, a signal shall be given to those behind by extending the hand horizontally.

Sec. 5. No vehicle shall be used on any street or highway after dusk and before daylight unless provided with one white light forward to the left hand side and one red light in the rear.

Sec. 6. Every motive vehicle shall be provided with adequate breaks, in good working order, and sufficient to control such vehicle at all times; and with a suitable device for signalling.

Sec. 7. No vehicle shall proceed at any time or any conditions at a greater speed than twenty (20) miles an hour.

Sec. 8. All vehicles passing one another shall reduce their speed to at least ten (10) miles an hour.

Sec. 9. No vehicle shall pass through villages, thickly populated parts of the parish or approach or pass curves or business or public places at a greater speed than five (5) miles per hour.

Sec. 10. No horse, mule, cow, goat or other animal shall be allowed on the public streets or highways of this parish, nor shall they be tied thereon.

Sec. 11. No one shall place any object that may interfere with the traffic on any street or highway.

Sec. 12. All persons driving a vehicle shall keep on the lookout for all vehicles approaching from the rear and on being signalled shall at once drive to the right, slowing up his speed, and allow the vehicle in the rear to pass him.

Sec. 13. No one shall drive a vehicle that is so covered or so constructed as to prevent the driver thereof of having a sufficient view of the traffic following, unless he has someone on top or in the rear of said vehicle who can and will notify him of the approach of such vehicle.

Sec. 14. No one shall operate an auto or auto truck who is less than sixteen (16) years of age, nor shall any parent or guardian allow same

Sec. 15. The roads, streets or highways are primarily intended for vehicles, but pedestriains have the right to cross them in safety, and drivers of vehicles must exercise all possible care not to injure pedestriains. Pedestriains should, on their part never cross the street without first looking to see what is approaching, and should not, needlessly, interfere with the passage of vehicles

Sec. 16. The word VEHICLE INCLUDES $\frac{1}{2}$ EQUESTRIANS, led horses and everything on wheels or runners except baby carriages.

Sec. 17. The word driver includes the rider of a horse or mule the rider of wheels and operator of a motor vehicle.

Sec. 18. The work horse includes all animals drawing veicle

Sec. 19. The driver of any vehicle in any accident shall stop and render all assistance possible to the injured person.

Sec. 20. Ignorance of these rules shall furnish no excuse for disregarding them.

Sec. 21. Be it further ordained, that any person or persons, violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to fine not to exceed twenty five (\$25) dollars and costs or to imprisonment nor not more than thirty (30) days, or both, within the discretion of the court having proper jurisdiction.

Sec. 22. Be it further ordained, etc., that the provisions of this ordinances shall become operative after its prumulgation

Sec. 23. Be it further ordioned, etc., that all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict weith the provisions of this ordinance be and the same are hereby repeialed. The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance the vote resulted as follows.

Declaring the roaming of animals, such as cattle, horses, mules sheep, goats, hogs and cows, in and upon the public streets, roads and highways, to be a public nuisance; providing for the impounding of such cattle roaming at large; designating the impounding places; providing how such animals may be released to the owners from such impounding of unclaimed animals.

Section. 1- Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular session assembled, that the roaming of animals at large, such as cattle, horses, mules, sheeps goats, hogs, and cows, in and upon the public streets, roads and highways, of the Parish of Jefferson, is hereby declared to be a nuisance.

Section. 2 - Be it further ordained, that the constables and deputy sheriff's of the Parish of Jefferson are hereby empowered to seize any animal found loose or astray roaming at large on the public streets, roads and highways of this Parish, and to place said animals in the pound where said animal shall remain in the possession of said officer until the cost hereinafter

stimulated shall have been paid before the release of said animal to the owner.

Section. 3 - Be it further ordained, that the grounds enclosed and presently used in the various wards of this Parish for dipping vats are hereby designated as the pounds of the different respective wards of this Parish in to which all stray, loose or roaming animals shall be placed until such time as the cost have been paid by the owner.

Section 4 - Be it further ordained, that whenever any officer shall take into his possession or drive into said pound any animal astray or loose or roaming at large upon the public streets, roads and highways of this Parish, he shall try and locate the owner of said animal and notify him of said seizure and impounding of his animal, and said officer shall be entitled to charge and collect from the owner of said animal the sum of Three Dollars and Fifty-Cents (\$3.50) as costs and fees for taking said animal to said pound, for which said amount he shall have the right to retain possession of said animal to secure the payment of said costs and fees until the same are paid; provided, that if said officer cannot ~~ascertain~~ ascertain the name of the owner of said animal by due and diligent inquiry then he shall notify the constable, if the officer be a deputy sheriff or if he be the constable of the ward in which said animal is impounded be the officer who placed said animal in said pound, in either case, a notice of such impounding of said animal with a description of same shall be posted at the office of the Justice of the Peace of the ward in which said animal was impounded, and on the fourth day after the posting of said notice, at the hour of 11 A. M. if no one appears and claims said animal and pays the costs and fees here in above provided for, the said constable shall auction said animal to the last and highest bidder for cash to pay all costs, for which services said constable shall receive the sum of Two Dollars and Fifty Cents, and the balance if any, shall be turned over to the Secretary of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, and out of the fee for impounding there shall be paid to the secretary of this Jury the sum of One Dollar and Fifty cents, and out of the fee for auctioning said animal there shall be paid to the secretary of the Police Jury of this Parish, the sum of Fifty cents, both of which said amounts shall be collected for the purpose of repairing fences, etc., of the various pounds.

Section. 5- Be it further ordained, that all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith on the same subject matter be and the same are hereby repealed, except that this ordinance shall in no way repeal the ordinance or any part there of which makes it a misdemeanor to allow animals to roam at large upon the public roads, but shall be construed as an addition and supplementary thereto.

Be it ordained, that the boundairies of the Seventh, Eight, and Ninth Wards and their precincts be defined so that they will conform to the present registration and their geographic conditions.

DESCRIPTION

The Seventh Ward shall comprise the area within the boundairies starting from the lower line of the Parish of Jefferson dividing the Parish of Orleans, on the Mississippi River Left Bank along the Mississippi River to the lower line of the City of Harahan, being the same line known as the upper line of Le Freniere Plantation, from said intersection at the Ricer and on said division

line the western boundry, and extending toward the rear until it intersects the northern side of the right of way of Illinois Central Railroad; from said point and on the northern side of railroads right of way toward the lower line, where it intersects the line dividing the Parish of Orleans from said intersection and on said Parish line toward the river, the point of beginning.

The Eight Ward shall comprise the area north of the Seventh Ward to Lake Pontchartrain, starting on the lower line of the Parish of Jefferson, the line dividing the Parish of Orleans, and the northern side of the right of way of the Illinois Central Railroad, and extending upward on said line until it intersects the upper line of the property of C. T. Soniat line of the Company Canal, the line dividing the Second Precinct of the Ninth Ward, from said intersection and on said upper line of C. T. Soniat, line of the Company Canal extending toward the Lake Ponchartrain, the western boundary from said point and along the said Lake Pouchartrain extendinf until it intersects the lower line of the Parish of Jefferson, intersecting the Parish of Orleans, thence on said line line dividing the Parish of Orleans from Jefferson and extending toward the Northern side of the right of way of the Illincis Central Railroad, the Point of Beginning.

The Ninth Ward, Precinct No. One, shall start from the upper line of the Parish of Jefferson, dividing the Parish of St Charles, on the Mississippi River left bank, and extending along said river to the lower line of the City of Kenner, thence on said lower line of the City of Kenner extending toward the Lake Pouchartrain, thence from said intersection and along Lake Pouchartrain, upward to the point on the line dividing the Parish of Jefferson and St Charles thence on said Parish line dividing the Parish of St Charles, and extending toward the Mississippi River, the Point of Beginning.

Ninth Ward, Second precinct, shall start from the lower line of the City of Kenner, on the Mississippi River left bank, and extendinf along said River to the lower line of the City of Harahan, dividing the Seventh Ward thence on the line extending to the northern side of the right of way of the Illinois Central Railroad, from intersection and extending

upward on the right of way until intersects the upper line of the property known as C. T. Sniat or line of Company Drainage Canal, from said intersection and extenting a further depth until it intersects the line of the City of Kenner at the point of angle, the line dividing the Eight Ward, from said point of intersection and abgle, and extending toward the river being the line of the City of Kenner until it intersects the point of beginning.

A copy of the Grand Jury report was read and ordered filed for reference.

Poundkeeper of 7th Ward returned \$12.50 fines collected, which was ordered deposited in the general fund.

Reports of Cattle dipping vat inspectors was received and ordered filed.

Communications from E. B. Anthony, calling attention to road conditions at Harahan was referred to the District Attorney to take up the matter with T. Johnston.

Communication was received from L. H. Gosserand, calling attention to the fact that a fence has been built across the road at Hope Haven Farm, Barataria, and the public traffic is thereby impended. On motion of Mr. Conzelmann duly seconded the Secretary was instructed to notify the superintendent of Hope Haven Farm to remove said fence.

Communication from W. L. Belton calling attention to road conditions on Stella Street, Metairie, was referred to Police Juror A. S. Thompson. Request of L. W. Wilkinson that he be allowed to apply to his auto expense account a check of \$34.75 drawn in his favor to defray expenses of a Parish Exhibit at Donaldsonville Fair, which expenses was paid by Fair Association, was granted.

Request of Geo A. Hero, President of Jefferson-Plaquemine Drainage District, that the Jury order a check for \$500 drawn to pay one half cost of dredging drainage canal in rear of Gretna, (second Payment), as per agreement, was referred to Mr. A. Rouprieh, chairman of the Drainage Committee.

Request of Camp Nicholls for a donation to assist in the care of the old soldiers was granted, and the sum of \$25 was appropriated there for.

Protese of Otto Katz, secretary of General Building and Loan Association against the granting of a permit for the operation of road-house and saloon at Harahan was received and ordered filed.

On motion of Mr. Thompson seconded by Mr. Burbank the following ordinance was adopted:

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson:

Section. 1 - That there is hereby levied an annual house tax for the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1919, upon each person, associations

of persons, or business firm or corporation pursuing any trade, profession, vocation calling or business conducted, pursued or carried on or operated within the limits of the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana, which may be subject to such license tax under Article 229 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana.

Section. 2- That the annual license hereby levied is declared to be the same as and to be graduated in accordance with the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana now in force, and is hereby declared to be the same as to graduation and amount as the license laws of the State of Louisiana now in force provided for State purposes, and are to be determined in accordance therewith, to wit:- Act 171, of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana of the Session of 1898 and the subsequent acts of the General Assembly of Louisiana

It is hereby declared to the intention of this body to herein levy the same license tax for parochial purposes, both as to graduation and amount, as is now imposed by the General Assembly for State Purposes, to which laws special reference is hereby made as being part hereof for the purposes aforesaid: provided, further, that hereafter for every business of conducting a barroom, cabaret, coffee house, Cafe, beer saloon, liquor exchange, drinking saloon, grog shop, beer house, beer garden or other places where spirituous, vinous or malt liquors, or intoxicating beverages, bitters or medical preparations of any kind, are sold, directly or indirectly in quantities of less than five gallons, the license shall be based on the annual gross receipts of said business as follows, to wit:

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First Class - - When said gross annual receipts are \$50,000 or more the license shall be \$2,000.

Second Class - - When said gross annual receipts are \$40,000 or more, and less than \$50,000, the license shall be \$1,800.

Third class - - When said gross annual receipts are \$30,000 or more, and less than \$40,000 the license shall be \$1,500.

Fourth class - - When said gross annual receipts are \$20,000 or more and less than \$30,000 the license shall be \$1,200.

Fifth Class - - When said gross annual receipt are \$10,000, or more and less than 20,000, the license shall be \$1,000.

Sixth Class - - When said gross annual receipts are \$5,000, or more, and less than \$10,000 the license shall be \$800.

Seventh Class - - When said gross annual receipts are less than \$5,000 the license shall be \$500.

Provided that no license shall be charged for selling refreshments for charitable or religious purposes; provided further, that no establishment selling or giving away or otherwise disposing of spirits, wines or

alcoholic or malt liquors in less quantities than five gallons shall pay a license of less than \$500; provided, further, that for the business of selling malt and vinous liquors exclusively in quantities of less than five gallons the license shall be one-half of that provided for the general sale of alcohol in beverages; provided, further, that nothing in this ordinance shall be so construed as to exempt druggist who sell alcoholic vinous or malt liquors or other intoxicating beverages on the prescription of a physician or otherwise from the payment of the license herein imposed; provided, further, that this ordinance shall not apply to the sale of druggists of tinctures or drugs compounds in the preparation of which such liquor or intoxicating beverages are used and soled on the prescription of a physician or otherwise, and which tinctures and compounds are not intoxicating beverages prepared in the evasion of this ordinance, nor of the local option law; provided, further, that in all other respect the provision of Act 176 of 1908 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana are hereby adopted as part of the ordinance and the penalties and procedure relative to the collection of said license therein provided are hereby adopted and made a part of the ordinance; provided, further, that in the event, the selling, giving away, exchanging or otherwise disposing of spirits wines, alcoholic or malt liquors prohibited by State National, Municipal or Parochial legislation, or otherwise, after June 30th 1919, then and in the event, pro rata return from the license amount collected by the Parish of Jefferson for that part of the year during which the sale of liquor is prohibited by law will be made to all holders of license.

Section 3. That for all traveling shows giving performances in this Parish a tax of \$5 shall be paid for each and every day performances are given.

Section 4. That for every automobile operated publicly as a "Jitney" an annual tax of \$10 shall be paid by the owner or operator thereof

Section 5. Be it further ordained, that the procedure in the collection of parochial license herein levied, and that to ascertain the amount due for same by the tax collector, shall be same as in now provided by the law for State Purposes, and particularly in Act 171 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana of the session of 1898, as amended by subsequent acts of the said General Assembly and at subsequent session; and the penalties imposed upon and interest and costs to be collected from delinquents are declared to be the same manner as provided by said act of the General Assembly as amended by subsequent acts, for state purposes.

Section 6. Be it further ordained, that the parochial license which are being levied are declared to be for the purposes which may be required by the Constitution and laws of the State for parochial purposes.

Be it further ordained that from and after the adoption of this ordinance the tax collector shall begin to collect from each of the persons Corporations pursuing within the limits of said Parish any trade, calling, profession vocation or business a license tax as herein provided. All license are due and collectible during the first two months of each year, and all unpaid license shall become delinquent on the first day of March of each year, and all firms who commence business after that date shall become delinquent unless the license is paid

within ten days.

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The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance the vote resulted as follows:

YEAS - - Rouprich, Strehle, Stritzinger, Conzelmann, Burbank, Thompson, Luke, and Clancy.

NAYS - - NONE.

On motion seconded by Mr. Burbank the following resolution was adopted; Be it resolved that the President be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow the sum of \$1500 from Road District No 2 and loan said sum to Road District No. 1, same to be repaid from taxes in January. On motion of Mr. Thompson seconded by Mr. Luke the following resolution was adopted:

Be it resolved, that the action of the President is hereby approved in signing several compromises and acts of exchange with Dominick Mumphrey A H Ahten, Theodule and Miss L. E. Arnoult, Emile Geissenheimer, and the Donors Joseph D. and Minnie Hyland, covering certain property owned by them in Harlem and Shrewsbury, a portion of which was used in building a public road along the Orleans Kenner Electric Railway, and in which compromises and exchange a portion of Carrollton Street was given in exchange of property so taken from them, the whole as will more fully appear by reference to the several acts passed before S. J. Mc Cune, Notary Public in and for this Parish;

Be it further resolved, that a duly certified copy of this resolution be registered in the Conveyance Office of this Parish to serve as occasion may require.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Burbank the following resolution was adopted:

Be it resolved that Conrad A. Buchler be and he is hereby employed as the special attorney for the purpose of preparing all ordinances and resolutions to put into effect the levy of one mill tax in Road District No. 1 and Road District No. 2, of Jefferson Parish,

Resolved further that the President of this Police Jury for the purpose of making arrangement for said employment and fixing the fee of the said special attorney, and all other matters pertaining to said tax levy.

The president appointed on this committee messrs. Thompson, Luke and Conzelmann.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Clancy the following resolution was adopted:

Be it resolved that the President of this Police Jury appoint an advisory committee of twelve resident property owners of Jefferson, resident within Road District No. 1 and Road District No. 2, for the purpose of conferring with the special attorney and committee this day appointed for the purpose of calling a special election to levy an additional tax of 1 mill in said Road Districts.

On motion of Mr. Burbank duly seconded the following ordinance was adopted:

Whereas, it is for this Jury to levy the annual Parish taxes in order to obtain the necessary usual and ordinary expenses as well as other charges or claims that may be due by the Parish of Jefferson,

Be it ordained that a tax of ten mills on the dollar be and the same is hereby levied on all property subject to taxation in the Parish of Jefferson,

Be it further ordained, etc., that a copy of this ordinance be given to the assessor of the Parish of Jefferson as his authority for extending the said tax on his assessment rolls in the Parish of Jefferson and a copy be given to the sheriff of the Parish of Jefferson as evidence of his authority to collect said tax.

Be it further ordained that the said sheriff be and he is hereby authorized to pay to the treasurer of the Board of School Directors of this parish 4-3/4 mills of the general Parish taxes collected by him until the sum of \$50,000 is realized, collected and paid to the school Board; said Board to remit and refund any amount or amounts over and above \$50,000 collected.

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Be it further ordained, that the sheriff of the Parish of Jefferson be and he is hereby authorized to pay over to the treasurer of the Parish any balance collected by him.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance the vote resulted as follows:

YEAS - - Rouprich, Strehle, Stritzinger, Conzelmann, Burbank, Thompson, Luke and Clancy.

NAYS - - NONE

On motion of Mr. Thompson seconded by Mr. Burbank, the engineer was authorized to make survey of road from Shrewsbury to Kenner, paralleling the La. R. & N. Co's track.

On motion of Mr Burbank seconded By Mr. Strehle, Walter Landry was appointed to the beneficiary scholarship at the L. S. U., Baton Rouge, under provisions of the law.

On recommendation of Road Superintendent Roussell a committee was appointed to purchase a large motor tractor out of the funds of Road Districts Nos. 1 and 2. The President appointed on the committee Messrs. Rouprich, Burbank Thompson and Conzelmann.

On motion of Mr Rouprich seconded by Mr. Luke the secretary was instructed to notify th N. O. Terminal and the La. R. and N Co., that unless the crossing at Shrewsbury is repaired ar once, same will be done at expense of said Companies.

Section 6- Be it further ordained etc., that the purchaser of the within bonds may designate as a place of payment of said bonds and coupons some bank in New York, N. Y. or Chicago, Ill., or any other place upon giving due notice in writing to this Police Jury before the printing of the bonds

Section 7- Be it further ordained, etc., That the proceeds of the sale of the within bonds, according to law, shall constitute a trust fund for the purpose of constructing, improving and maintaining the Public roads within Road District No. Two of the Parish of Jefferson, and particularly such roads as were specially in the proposition submitted at the special election held on March 12th, 1919.

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Section 8- Be it further ordained, etc., That in order to pay the semi-annual [interest] due on the within bonds on the first day of December 1919 the Treasurer of Road District No. Two of the Parish of Jefferson in hereby specially instructed and authorized to set aside as a trust fund, the sum of One Thousand Eight hundred and seventy five (\$1,875.00) Dollars same to be taken from the funds now to the credit of said Road District and deposit it with the fiscal agent at said Road District.

Section 9- Be it further ordained, etc., That the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson acting as the governing authority of Road District No. Two shall annually [levy] at the same time as other taxes are levied and in addition to all other taxes now authorized by the Constitution and

laws including any special tax levy, a tax above all other taxes sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds herein directed to be issued as they may mature which tax may be levied if not already levied and extended on the assessment rolls at any time prior to the final collection of taxes due for that particular year.

Section - 10 - Be it further ordained, etc., That the Secretary of this Police Jury shall cause the original of this ordinance recorded in the Mortgage office of this Parish and also publish in the official journal of the Parish of Jefferson.

Report of the Oil Commission on the petition of the Mexican Petroleum Oil Company representing privilege to erect two or more tanks on the Edenborn property for the storage of fuel and lubricating oils was ordered filed.

Road Superintendent D. H. Roussell reported on the condition of roads in McDonoghville and recommended the digging of a main drain ditch on Hancock Street and the Cleaning of out of ditches on various other streets estimating that about seven cars of gravel would be needed for repair of the main road from Gretna to McDonoghville.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann, seconded by Mr. Stritzinger, the sum of One Thousand Dollars was appropriated out of the general fund for ditching of the various streets and repair of the main road form Gretna to McDonoghville. Communication was received from Dr. A. W. Von Heder advising the Police Jury that he had informed the live Stock Inspectors at Grand Isle and Barataria of the expiration of their commission.

Communication from M. D. Kostmayer, relative installation of water service at Metairie Ridge was referred to the Parish Engineer for investigation and report at the next meeting.

On motion of Mr. Rouprich seconded by Mr. Sthrele, the following ordinance was adopted.

Whereas a suit has been filed by one Joseph Oury against the Police Jury in the matter No. 2771 of the docket of the Twenty-Eight Judicial District Court; and,

Certain residents of New Carrollton submitted a comunication notifying the Police Jury of the withdrawal of their named from the petitions protesting against the application of a Texas Oil Company.

The Oil Commission of Jefferson Parish having approved the application of the Mexican Petroleum Corporation of Louisiana Inc., for permission to erect storage Oil tanks loading racks, etc., on and adjacent to the William Edenborn Property in Jefferson Parish the application was on motion of Mr. Clancy seconded by Mr. Thompson, granted by a unanimous vote of the Jury.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Thompson, the following ordinance was adopted:

ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson that the Mexican Petroleum Corporation of Louisiana Inc., be and is hereby authorized to construct, maintain, erect and operate on the Mississippi, in this Parish a landing wharf or pontoon in front of the following described property to-wit:

Approximately nine and one-half acres of land known as the William Edenborn property bounded on the up stream side by property owned by the American Cresote Company; on the down stream side by property owned by John E. Glover; on the front by the Mississippi; on the rear by the spur track of the Louisiana Railway & Navigation Co., serving the American Cresote plant, which said property is shown on the attached map.

And in connection with said wharf to construct, maintain, and operate, lines of pipe and supports foundations therefor for the handling of petroleum and its derivatives, and drainage, wastage and wastewater to and from ship side to and from the storage plant, permission to erect which on the herein above described property has been this day granted by the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish to the Mexican Petroleum Corporation of Louisiana, Inc.

All structures erected under this ordinance shall be built in a substantial manner and all pipes shall be made oil tight and if the pipes are laid above ground there shall be the same clear space from the surface of the roadway, between the levee and the property herein above described and the lowest portion of the lines of pipe of supports therefor a distance equal to the distance which now exists between the

surface of the roadway and the lowest portion of the line of pipe and foundation therefor connectinf the plant of the American Creosote Company with a wharf in from thereof.

Be it further ordained, that permission is hereby granted to the Mexican Petroleum Corporation of Louisiana, Inc., to run a line of Pipe for the carrying of petroleum and its derivatives and one for steam under and along Protection Street from the right-of-way of the Louisiana Rail-way & Navigation Co., near the corner of Pope and Protection Street to the right-of-way of the main line of the Illinois Central Company said lines of Pipe to be up to but not exceeding twelve inches in diameter.

The permission herein granted with refferance to the wharf or land-ing or pontoon and to cross with pipes the levees along the Mississippi River is granted subject to the approval of the Board of Commissioners of the Pontchartrain Levy District.

All of the construction herein authorized is to be done under the supervision of the Engineer of the Parish of Jefferson whose fees are to be paid by the Mexican Petroleum Corporation of Louisiana, Inc., accord-ing to the schedule of the American Society of Civil Engineers.

Whereas, the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish under resolution duly adopted and under the provisions of Act 49 of 1910 petitioned the State Highway Department Board of State Engineers for the State aid and Supervision and for Federal aid in the construction of the New Orleans Baton Rouge, and the New Orleans, Houma Highways; and,

Whereas, the State Highway Department Board of State Engineers has made the necessary surveys and has submitted a report, together with maps plans profiles, typical sections etc., relative to the location, length, quantities, and estimate costs etc., of said highways situated in the Parish of Jefferson State of Louisiana between Shrewsbury and St Charles Parish line in Road District No. 1, and Willswood and St Charles Parish line in Road District No. 2, same being approximately 13.58 miles long; and

Whereas, the State of Louisiana through its Highways department, Board of State Engineers, has egreed providing it can secure aid from the Federal Government to extend the Parish of Jefferson the sum of \$72,187.02 or approximately 50% of estimate cost out of funds avail-able during the year 1919 toward the cost of constructing the afore-said highway and provided that the Parish of Jefferson has on hand or will secure with out delay all additional funds necessary for the con-struction of this Highway and the maintainance of same after completion; therefore be it,

Resolved by the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish State of Louisiana that President Jules G. Fisher or his successor be and he is hereby instructed authorized and empowered to accept the offer of State anf Federal aid made by the State of Louisiana through the State highway Department, Board of State Engineers on the construction of the above highway, as indicated on maps plans, profiles, and as described in re-port submitted by the State highway Engineer and embracing a total distance of approximately 13.58 miles. Engineer.

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A communication from South New Orleans, Light & Traction Company,
was read and referred to the Parish Engineer.

The request of John Remero, bridge tender at Harvey, for an increase
of salary was read, and, on motion seconded by Mr. Rouprich, the salary
of the bridge tender at Harvey was ordered to be increased to \$75 per
month, beginning Aug. 1, 1919.

The report of Prof. L. W. Wilkinson for an expense allowance of
\$30 per month, begining July 1, 1919, for the operation of his automobile,
was on motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Rouprich, granted.

The application of Geo. A. Cox proprietor of the Jefferson Democrat
for re-election for the position of Parish printer for the year begining
July, 1, 1919. was read, and on motion of Mr. Strehle, Seconded by Mr.

members of the Board of Commissioners of the Fourth Jefferson Drainage
District. The prtion was read; whereupon the President appointed a
committee, consisting of Messrs. Strehle and Burbank and the Secretary,
to tabulate the number of acres of land owned by each of the petition-
ers recommending the appointment of drainage commissioners.

The committee retired and later reported that the petition recom-
mending the appointment of Messrs. A. H. Johness, Frank J. Clancy and
A. H. Ahten contained 14, 733 acres, and the petition recommending the

re-appointment of Messrs. Frank E. Fagot, J. Ernest and A Alexander contained 6, 773 acres.

After the report of the Finance Committee was submitted and read, the following ordinance offered by Mr. Strehle, seconded by Mr. Thompson was adopted:

Whereas, it has been brought to the attention of this Police Jury by means of a petition of property owners of the Fourth Jefferson Drainage District, that the appointment made by this Police Jury on April 2, 1919, of three (3) members for the board of Commissioners for the said Drainage District have been questioned on grounds that there were vacancies existing at that time, and, further, because this Police Jury took no means to ascertain and determine the number of acres or the number of signatures on each of the petitions presented, in order to decide which petition contained the majority of the number of acres of resident property owners;

Whereas, the Police Jury is convinced that there are now three vacancies on the Board of Commissioners of the Fourth Jefferson Drainage District for the reason that the term of office of Messrs. John Ernst and A. Alexander expired on March 5, 1919, and the term of office of Mr. F. E. Fagot expired on March 5, 1917, and for the further reason that none of these parties have been qualified by taking the oath of office prescribed by law and had same recorded within Thirty (30) days of their appointment;

Petition to appoint commissioner 4th Drainage Dist.

Whereas, the Police Jury has, in open meeting, tabulated, examined and computed the various petitions presented to this Police Jury recommending the appointment of Messrs. A. H. Johnness, F. J. Clancy, and A. H. Ahten, and the petition presented a recommendation and re-appointment of Messrs. F. E. Fagot, J. Ernst and A. Alexander;

Whereas, this Police Jury has been convinced of the genuineness of the signatures to the said petitions and the number of acres contained therein, and after due examination and inquiry and considering the expert information given, and after due investigation, finds that the petitions of the property owners recommending the appointment of Messrs. A. H. Johnness, F. J. Clancy, and A. H. Ahten have the majority in acreage and in the number of acres as against the petition recommending re-appointment of Messrs. F. E. Fagot, J. Ernst and A. Alexander, and under the law this Police Jury, in its discretion, may appoint the parties recommended by the majority in acreage or the majority in number of resident property owners who have signed the petitions, and;

Whereas, it is the intention of this Police Jury to

settle beyond all doubt the question of the appointment of three (3) members of the Board of Commissioners of the Fourth Jefferson Drainage District, in order that there may be no further delay or litigation regarding this matter to retard the drainage and reclamation of the land within the Fourth Jefferson Drainage District, and in order that this great Public improvement be accomplished, at once.

Commissioners of 4th Jefferson Drainage Dist

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in regular meeting assembled. That Messrs. A. H. Johnness, F. J. Clancy and A. H. Ahten be and they are hereby appointed members of the Board of Commissioners of the Fourth Jefferson Drainage District.

Be it further ordained, etc., that Mr. A. H. Ahten be appointed to succeed Mr. F. E. Fagot, whose term of office, if he had qualified, expired on March 5, 1917 Mr. F. J. Clancy be appointed to succeed Mr. A. Alexander Mr. A. H. Johnness be appointed to succeed Mr. John Ernst. Both of the terms of office of the said Mr. Alexander and Mr. Ernst would have expired, if they had qualified on the 5 day of March, 1919, Each of the parties herein appointed are to serve for the term of four (4) years each beginning with expiration of the term of office of the parties they have been appointed to succeed.

Be it further ordained etc., that all laws or ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above resolution the vote resulted as follows:

On motion of Mr. Luke seconded by Mr. Strehle, the following Ordinance was adopted by unanimous vote.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury that the President, Secretary, Treasurer and Finance Committee be and they are hereby authorized to trans- the sum of \$2, 136.56 from the general fund and deposit same to the credit of Road District No. 1 of the Parish of Jefferson, and \$2,000.00 from the general fund and deposit same to the credit of Road District No. 2, of the Parish of Jefferson.

Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Burbank offered the following resolution:

Be it resolved, that bids be advertised in accordance with the plans and specifications submitted by the Parish Engineer, for the erection of a dwelling house at the Parish Jail grounds.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson:

Section 1- That there is hereby levied an annual license tax for the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1920 upon each person, association of persons or business firms or corporations pursuing any trade, profession, vocation calling or business conducted, pursued, carried on operated within the limits of the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana, which may be subject to such license tax under Article 229 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana.

Section 2- That the annual license hereby levied is declared to be the same as and to be graduated in accordance with the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana now in force, and is hereby declared to be the same as to the graduation and amount as the license laws of the State of Louisiana now in force provided for State Purposes, and aer to be determined in accordance therewith to-wit: Act 171 of the general Assembly of the State of Louisiana of the session of 1898 and the subsequent acts of the General Assembly of Louisiana. It is hereby declared to be the intention of this body to herein levy the same license tax for parochial purposes, both as to graduation and amount, as is now imposed by the General Assembly for the purposes, to which laws special reference is hereby made as being part hereof for the purpose aforesaid: provided, further, that hereafter for every business of conducting a barroom, cabaret, coffee house, beer saloon, liquor exchange, drinking saloon, grog shop, beer house, beer garden or other place where spirituous, vinous or malt liquors, or intoxicating beverages, bitters or medicinal preparations of any kinds, are sold directly or indirectly, in quantities of less than five gallons, the license shall be based on the annual gross receipts of said business as follows to-wit:

First Class - When said gross annual receipts are \$50,000 or more, the license shall be \$2,000.

Second Class - - When said gross annual receipts are \$40,000. or more, and less than \$50,000. the license shall be \$1,800.

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Third Class -- When said gross annual receipts are \$30,000 or more and less \$40,000, the license shall be \$1,500.

Fourth Class -- When said fross annual receipts are \$20,000. or more and less than \$30,000. the tax shall be \$1,200.

Fifth Class -- When said gross annual receipts are \$10,000 or more, and less than \$20,000, the license shall be \$1,000.

Sixth class -- When said gross annual receipts are \$5,000. or more, and less than \$10,000. the tax shall be \$800.

Seventh Class -- When said gross annual receipts are less than \$5,000 the license shall be \$500.

Provided, that no license shall be charged for selling refreshments for charitable or religious purposes; provided further; that no establishment selling or giving away or otherwise disposing of spirits, wines, alcoholic or malt liquors in less quantities than five gallons, shall pay a license of less than \$500; provided further, that for the business of selling malt and vinous liquors exclusively in quantities of less than five gallons the license shall be one-half of that provided for the general sale of alcoholic beverages, provided further, that nothing in this ordinance shall be so construed as to exempt druggist who sell alcoholic, vinous or malt liquors or other intoxicating beverages on the prescription of a physican or otherwise from the payment of the license herein imposed; provided further, that this ordinance shall not apply to the sale by druggist of tinctures or drug compounds in the preparation of which such liquors of intoxicating beverages are used and sold or the prescription of a physician or otherwise, and which tinctures and compounds are not intoxicating beverages prepared in the evasion of this ordinance, nor of a local option law; provided further, that in all respects the provisions of Act 176 of 1908 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana are hereby adopted as part of the ordinance and the penalties and procedure relative to the collection of said license therein provided are hereby adopted and made a part of the ordinance.

Section 3 - That for all traveling shows giving performances in this parish a tax of five dollars shall be paid for each and every day performances are given.

Section 4 - That for every automobile operated publicly as a "jitney" an annual tax of \$10. shall be paid by the owner or operator thereof.

Section 5 - Be it further ordained that the proceduer in the collection of parochial license herein levied, and that to ascertain the amounts due for same by the tax collector, shall be the same as is now provided by the law for state purposes, and particularly in Atc 171 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana of the session of 1898, as amended by subsequent Acts of the said General Assembly and at the subsequent sessions; and the penalties imposed upon and interest and cost to be collected, from delinquents are declared to be the same and

to be collected in the same manner as provided by said Act of the Genral Assembly, as amended by subsequent acts, State purposes.

Section 6. Be it further ordained, that the parochial license which are herein levied are declared to be for the purpose which may be required by the Constitution and laws of this State for parochial purposes. Be it further ordained, that from and after the adoption of this ordinance the tax collector shall begin to collect from each of the persons and firms, associations of persons and corporations pursueng within the limits of said parish any trade, calling, proffession, vocation or business, a license tax as herein provided. All licenses are due and collectable during the first two months of each year, and all unpaid licenses shall become delinquent on the first day of March of each year and all firms who commence business after that date shall become delinquent unless the license is paid within ten days.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance the vote resulted as follows:

Sale of franchise to Sell water in 7-8-9 wards

An ordinance providing for the sale at public auction of a franchise for supplying water and power in the Seventh, Eighth and Ninth Wards of the Parish of Jefferson.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that a franchise be offered for sale for the purpose of supplying in the Seventh, Eighth and Ninth Wards of the Parish of Jefferson, water and water power for domestic and commercial purposes and for public use and consumption.

That said franchise shall be sold at public auction at the Court house door, in Gretna, La., said sale to be preceded by public advertisement once a week for thirty days in a newspaper published in the

Parish of Jefferson; and that the sale shall be conducted by the President of this Police Jury.

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, Etc., That said franchise shall be adjudicated to the highest bidder on terms cash, payable at the execution of the notarial act in confirmation of said adjudication, to be prepared and signed by the President of the Police Jury and the purchase within thirty days after the adjudication. The purchaser shall also deposit with the president of the Police Jury at the time of the adjudication of said franchise, a check for TWO HUNDRED (\$200.00) DOLLARS, drawn on a solvent bank in the City of New Orleans, or Parish of Jefferson, made payable to the order of the Police Jury and certified by said bank, which check shall be held undeposited until the execution of the notarial act aforesaid, and upon such execution said check shall be returned to the purchaser, endorsed by the President of the Police Jury. Should the purchaser fail to execute the notarial act aforesaid in confirmation of the adjudication the said certified check shall be forfeited to the Police Jury as liquidated damages and in lieu of all further rights, claims or demands against the adjudicate, which by law or otherwise may result from said adjudication.

The President of the Police Jury is authorized to do any and all things necessary to convey a valid title of this franchise to the grantee.

Sec. 3. Be it ordained, etc., that the price of the said franchise when paid in cash at the completion of the adjudication aforesaid, shall belong to the general fund of the Parish of Jefferson, and shall be paid over to the Parish Treasurer to the credit of the said account.

Sec. 4. Be it ordained etc., that the right-of-way and of use is hereby granted to the purchaser of said franchise in all the streets, roads and highways and public places in the seventh, Eighth and Ninth Wards of the Parish of Jefferson for the purpose of construction therein and erecting thereon all the means and facilities, pipe lines, pipe mains, and other appurtenances needed for the maintainance and operation of said franchise.

Sec. 5. Be it ordained, etc., that the purchaser shall within six months after the date of said notarial act accepting the said franchise, designate to the Police Jury the location of the first route to be laid out by it for the purpose of operating under this franchise, and the Parish Engineer shall survey a route and give lines and levels therefor, if so requested by the grantee. The purchaser shall begin construction of the route so designated within twelve months; after such designation upon failure to begin work twelve months after said designations as aforesaid, the grantee may pay to the Parish the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00), at the discretion of the Police Jury for an additional twelve months extension within which to begin work; and if at the expiration of said additional twelve months a further extension of twelve months is desired, the Police Jury at its option grant the same, upon a payment of the sum of three hundred dollars. Upon failure to obtain said second extension, his rights under this franchise shall be forfeited without any other default except a notice from the Police Jury.

The purchaser, after designating the first route, shall at his discretion from time to time thereafter designate such additional routes as may be required for the operation of this franchise, and shall proceed to the construction of the same in the manner hereinafter provided for.

Failure to designate the first route within the period herein prescribed, or to obtain the additional extension, if desired, in the manner

above stipulated, or make the payments, provided shall operate ipso facto as a forfeiture of this franchise without the necessity of putting the grantee in default save and except by a notice from the Police Jury. Upon such notice all payments made by the grantee for the said franchise or its extension shall be forfeited to the Police Jury, Parish of Jefferson, and the grantee exempted from any further liability in the premises.

The grantee will be entitled to delays actually caused by conditions beyond his control, such as strikes, delays of railroads to transport material, etc.

The Parish Engineer, in laying lines, shall be paid by owners of the franchise.

Sec. 6. Be it ordained, etc., that all excavations shall be done in workmanlike manner and the surface reatored to its previous condition by the grantee and maintained in good condition at all times thereafter.

Sec. 7. Be it ordained, etc., That this franchise shall exist in favor of the purchaser or his assigns, successors, etc., for the period of fifty years from and after the date of the notarial act as aforesaid; at the expiration thereof, during its said period, grantee, shall have the right to remove the plant, pipes or improvements which it had constructed should it decide to abandon the said franchise, in which case the said franchise and the rights thereunder shall revert to the Parish of Jefferson without any compensation to the grantee or its assigns.

Sec. 8. Be it ordained, etc., That the right is conferred upon the purchaser of the said franchise to sell water and water power to all consumers of the same, for domestic and public purposes, upon such rates and prices as shall enable the purchaser to earn a fair profit upon the investment made by him and provide for a sinking fund for the maintenances of the plant etc., and for the retirement of any bonds or other indebtedness of and purchases incurred in the building, operation and maintenance of the same.

Sec. 9. Be it ordained, etc., That the purchaser of said franchise shall have the right to transfer, assign, sell and convey the same to any person or corporation, undertaking to fulfil the obligation of this franchise shall rest upon such transferee, assignee, or purchaser, without recourse by the Parish of Jefferson upon the adjudicatee aforesaid.

Sec. 10. Be it ordained, etc., that the right is granted to the purchaser to create a corporation for the purpose of receiving the transfer and assignment of the franchise and of operating same the same upon the terms and conditions named in the preceding sections and the purchaser of and transferee or assignee of the same shall have the right to execute a mortgage upon the said franchise, plant, pipe lines, mains and other appurtenances to secure any bonds, notes or other indebtedness of the said purchaser.

Sec. 11. Be it ordained, etc., that fire hydrants shall be placed at such points designated by the Police Jury on the line under actual construction or in operation, the cost of construction of said hydrants to be at the expense of the Parish of Jefferson,

A flat rate to be made to the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for water consumption in all hydrants used for fire purposes along their line.

Sec. 12. Be it ordained, etc., that this ordinance shall take effect from and after the promulgation of the same.

or imprisoned at the discretion of the court of jurisdiction.

Regulating
Carrying Capacity
of Motor Trucks
etc.

On motion of Mr. Toledano duly seconded the following was adopted:

An ordinance regulating carrying capacity of motor trucks, trailers or other vehicles or conveyances no matter how propelled that may drive and operate over public hard surfaced roads in Parish of Jefferson; providing penalties for violation of this ordinance and providing for disposition of fines collected thereunder.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish in lawful session convened, that it shall be unlawful for any motor truck, trailer or any vehicles or conveyance, no matter how propelled, of a greater carrying capacity than two tons, to drive over and operate over the public hard surface roads in the Parish of Jefferson, provided that when the said truck, trailer or other vehicles shall beladen, and an overload of 25 percent shall be permitted.

SECTION 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that any person or persons, firms, corporations found guilty of violating this ordinance by a court of competent jurisdiction, shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$25 and not more than \$100, or to be imprisoned in the parish jail for not less than thirty days nor more than three months, or both, at the discretion of the court; provided however, that both the fine and imprisonment hereinabove provided may be doubled for a second offense, at the discretion of the court, and provided further that one-half of the fine collected under this ordinance shall go to the informant or officer making the arrest.

SECTION 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that all ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed,

Be it further ordained etc., that there shall be appointed in each ward of this Parish one or more poundkeepers, whose duty it shall be to impound all animals found roaming on the public street or highway, and also to impound all animals roaming on other persons' property when so notified by them.

The owner of the animals impounded shall have the right to the release of said animals only upon the payment of fees as provided for herein.

In case where animal is not claimed within five days it shall be sold at public auction after being advertised three consecutive times in the official journal of the parish.

Each poundkeeper shall keep a book in which the description of every animal impounded and name of owner if known, and name of purchaser if same is sold, as well as other information in reference to animals impounded and make a detailed report of same to the Police Jury monthly.

The fees and costs under this ordinance shall be as follows:

For impounding, one dollar; for keeping, fifty cents per head for each and every day said stock is kept by the pound keeper; for making the

sale fifty cents per head for each and every animal sold.

For proceedings in case of estrays, such costs as are now allowed by law in case of estrays in the several parishes, except sheep and goats, on which the charge for impounding shall be ten cents per head; for keeping five cents per head for each and every day; for making sale, ten cents per head.

Be it further ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that all ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

The Police Jury met this day in regular session.

Members present - Jules G. Fisher, president; T. Erlinger, Wm. E. Strehle, H. H. Gautier, E. M. Conzelman, Hugh P. Burbank, A. H. Athen, A. S. Thompson, W. R. Toledano.

The reading of the minutes was dispensed with and they were approved as published.

The regular order of business was deferred to allow various persons to address the Jury.

Coroner Chas. F. Gelbke, as a representative of the Jefferson Chapter of the Red Cross, addressed the Jury on the necessity of having a nurse to visit the schools and people of the parish, so as to prevent the spread of disease, such as measles, smallpox and tuberculosis when discovered in time to prevent its spread, and suggested that the parish appropriate and amount sufficient to carry on the work with the Red Cross chapter, which would meet the parish half way.

Miss Ella Graham, representing the American Red Cross, addressed the Jury and stressed the point that the State and parishes were spending a vast amount to eradicate ticks and were neglecting disgracefully the children, which she considered far more deserving of care in the first instance than all the ticks, and concluding by asking for a \$1200 appropriation to carry on the nursing work and that a nurse would cost between \$125 and \$150, plus traveling expenses a month, and that Jefferson Chapter would meet the parish on a fifty per cent basis.

Leon Samuel announced the Jefferson Chapter had a balance on hand of \$4000 and was ready to meet the parish half way to promote health and prevent the spread of disease, and that the parish be prepared to supply \$1200 for nurse work.

Other ladies and gentlemen addressed the Jury.

The regular order of business was then resumed.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann duly seconded it was resolved that \$1200 be appropriated to defray the parish's share of the nurse's pay and that the secretary be hereby authorized to draw a voucher for \$100 in favor of Jefferson Chapter of American Red Cross from and after Nov. 1, 1920, and, montly thereafter until such time as he be instructed to suspend the issuing, and that a member of this body be appointed to work jointly with the Red Cross nurse.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above resolution the vote resulted as follows:

On motion of Mr. Athen duly seconded it was resolved that Mrs. Widow Henry Huff be hereby appointed pound keeper for the 7th ward and the secretary was instructed to so notify her.

On motion of Mr. Toledano duly seconded it was resolved that Joseph Crochet be and he is hereby appointed as poundkeeper for Harahan City and the secretary was instructed to so notify him.

A committee from the council of the City of Gretna and Mayor Chas. F. Gelbke requested the jury to notify Mr. Geo. A. Hero that the dredge was sunk in the canal in the rear of Gretna and that it was impairing the drainage and should be removed, and suggested that a committee of three be appointed to take up the drainage improvement for the betterment of the community.

On motion of Mr. Strehle duly seconded the secretary was instructed to notify Mr. Hero to have said dredge removed, so that drainage may be restored and that a committee of three be appointed to take up the drainage condition and improvement and report the finding at the next meeting of the Jury.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in regular session assembled, that there be and is hereby levied a Parish license tax upon each person, association of persons, or business firm, partnership or corporation, engaged in or pursuing any business whereby horses are run for purposes or where any entrance fee is charged for the entrance of the said horses in a race, for each and every race track so operated the sum of one hundred dollars per day for each and every day or part of the day any such race track is operated or any horses permitted to race for purses or where any entrance fee is charged.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that the license tax herein provided shall be paid in advance daily to the constituted authority charged with the collection thereof, and no race shall be run unless said license is paid under penalties hereinafter provided.

That this license tax shall become due and owing on each and every day that said races are run and shall become delinquent on the following day, and it shall be the duty of the District Attorney of the Parish of Jefferson to enforce the collection of the aforesaid license tax, and for his services rendered in enforcing such

Race Track Licenses of Ordinance \$100.00 per Day

collection he shall be entitled to a fee of twenty per cent 20% over and above the amount of the license collected from the delinquent debtor as attorney's fee which said attorney's fee shall be paid by the delinquent license debtor and shall be assessed as costs in case of suit.

SECTION 3. Be it further ordained, That all suits or rules to enforce the collection of this license tax, shall be summary and be tried in accordance with the existing laws now in force for the collection of delinquent license or taxes.

SECTION 4. Be it further ordained, etc., That the provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to an association of persons or corporations engaged in holding or conducting a fair solely for the purpose of exhibiting abrcultural or manufactured products or natural resources looking towards the advancement of the agricultural interest of the development of the natural resources in the Parish of Jefferson where said horse racing is conducted as an auxilliary sport, and as an incident for amusement and entertainment and not for the purpose of profit, provided that said fairs so conducted shall not be for a longer period than 14 days.

SECTION 5. Be it further ordained, etc., That any person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporations conducting or operating a race track or races in contravention with the provisions of this ordinance without having first paid said license tax, as aforesaid, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00 or not less than \$250.00 and by imprisonment of not more than 90 days and not less than 60 days, provided further; that in case the violator be an association, firm or corporation, the managing officers and agents or both thereof shall be punished by such fine and imprisonment; and provided further, that such fine and imprisonment shall not be construed as relieving said violator from the payment of said license tax.

K. line and Shrewsbury road. He desired to know if the Levee Board could be made to build a new road in lieu of the one taken for levee purposes, which was a dirt road.

The president instructed the secretary to request Attorney General for an opinion on the matter at issue, and to advise if it was compulsory on the part of the Levee Board to rebuild said road.

G. F. Pohlig, representing the Property Holders association of Bonnabel Place, complained of cattle roaming and complimented the work Mr. Mehan was doing in driving cattle to pound and requested the Jury for permission to haul filling from Harlem avenue, the property of the parish, so as to grade a park and play ground.

On motion of Mr. Athen seconded by Mr. Thompson the permission asked for was granted at the expense of petitioners, the Jury to be in no wise liable therefor.

Mr. Pohlig also complained of New Orleans Railway not operating according to schedule from Orleans line to Shrewsbury and are employing inefficient labor to operate the cars, and also requested the Jury to find out if the franchise was meeting with its requirements. The Jury requested the Secretary to write to the New Orleans Railway Company and place the complaint before the superintendent.

Mrs. Favalaro requested a donation for the Touro Free Clinic, because so many residents of our parish are benefited by it.

Section 1. When the gross sales shall exceed seventy-five thousand dollars, the license shall be ninety dollars, (\$90.00).

2. When the gross sales are fifty thousand dollars or more, and under seventy-five thousand dollars, the license shall be sixty dollars, (\$60.00).

3. When the gross sales are forty thousand dollars or more, and under fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars, (\$50.00).

4. When the gross sales are thirty thousand or more and under forty thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty-five dollars, (\$35.00).

5. When the gross sales are twenty-five thousand dollars or more, and under thirty thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars, (\$30.00).

6. When the gross sales are twenty thousand dollars, or more, and less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars, (\$25.00).

7. When the gross sales are fifteen thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty dollars, (\$20.00).

8. When the gross sales are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars, (\$15.00).

9. When the gross sales are five thousand dollars or more, and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be ten dollars, (\$10.00).

10. When the gross sales are less than five thousand dollars, the license shall be five dollars, (\$5.00).

Be it further ordained, etc., That all persons, associations, firms, and corporations engaged in the sale of soda water, ice cream, confections, soda pop, cocoa-cola, Chero-Cola, Grapico or other similar soft drinks or beverages or refreshments, shall pay license based on the gross annual sales, and such license are hereby affixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

1. When the gross sales exceed ten thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars, (\$50.00).

2. When the gross sales are eight thousand dollars or more, and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be forty dollars, (\$40.00).

3. When the gross sales are six thousand dollars or more, and less than eight thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars, (\$30.00).

4. When the gross sales are four thousand dollars or more, and less than six thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars, (\$25.00).

5. When the gross sales are three thousand dollars or more, and less than four thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty dollars, (\$20.00).

6. When the gross sales are two thousand dollars or more, and less

than three thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars, (\$15.00).

7. When the gross sales are one thousand dollars or more, and less than two thousand dollars, the license shall be ten dollars, (\$10.00).

8. When the gross sales are less than one thousand dollars, the license shall be five dollars, (\$5.00).

Be it further ordained, etc., That all persons, associations, or persons, firms, or corporations engaged in the sale at retail, of distilled, spiritous, vinous, malt, cereal or other liquors or beverages containing any alcoholic content, shall pay licenses based upon the gross annual sales, and each separate establishment at which such beverages are sold at retail whether conducted as principal, agent or distributor, shall pay a separate license, which licenses are hereby fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

1. When the gross sales shall exceed ten thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars, (\$100.00).

2. When the gross sales are five thousand dollars or more, and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

3. When the gross sales are two thousand five hundred or more, and less than five thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty seven dollars and fifty cents, (\$37.50).

4. When the gross sales are less than two thousand five hundred dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars, (\$25.00).

Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed to authorize the issuance of a license for the sale of any liquor or beverage, the sale of which is prohibited by law or ordinance of the United States or the State of Louisiana or of any municipality or other subdivision thereof.

Provided that a person, association, firm or corporation engaged in the business mentioned in this Section and having a proper license, may sell in connection with said business any of the commodities mentioned in the preceding Sections of the Ordinance without paying a separate license, but the total sales from such combined business shall determine the amount of license to be paid according to the classification in this section.

Provided further, however, that the business of retail merchant and the sales of such soft drinks, or of alcoholic liquors shall be considered separate business, and a separate license shall be charged.

Light and Traction Company and the West New Orleans Railway Company.
Members Present - Jules G. Fisher, president; Fred Erlinger, W. E. Strehle, H. H. Gautier, E. M. Conzelmann, A. H. Athen, A. S. Thompson, W. R. Toledano.

Absent - H. P. Burbank.

The application of the railways companies was read, mentioning that the previous application was misunderstood and that the companies wanted to make clear their application for a raise in car fare, offered a 6 cents fare on the West New Orleans from Copernicus avenue to Marrero and vice versa, and 7 cents from Copernicus avenue to Immigration Station, and 5 cents fare to and from Marrero to Copernicus avenue for all school children.

Mr. McCaleb and Mr. Burgis explained at length the necessity for the raise.

The president suggested that the carmen operate the cars for 15 days at the same pay, or until the committee to be appointed could report, and should the report recommend the increase and the Jury think the increase was just and necessary, that their pay would be retroactive for the time worked until such time as the report was received and the increase was granted.

The Grand Jury offered their suggestion that the companies issue tickets in lots of five or more at 5 cents, good for fare, or a cash fare of 7 cents.

On motion of Mr. Strehle seconded by Mr. Erlinger the following resolution was adopted:

Whereas, it is the desire of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson and the South New Orleans Light and Traction Company and the West New Orleans Railway Company to have an amicable settlement of the strike which now exists on the said lines.

The Police Jury met this day in regular session.

Members present - Jules G. Fisher, president; F. Erlinger, Wm. E. Strehle, H. H. Gautier, E. M. Conzelmann, Hugh P. Burbank, A. H. Athen, A. S. Thompson, W. R. Toledano.

The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was suspended.

The regular order of business was deferred to allow various persons to address the jury.

Mr. Edmiston, representing Liberty Realty and Securities Company, addressed the Jury on the extent of improving Seventeenth street from Canal street to Parkway, to Atlas Powder Works, and offered to meet the expenses on a third basis.

L. J. Fizolata addressed the Jury, requesting the grading and raising of 1st and 3rd streets at Orleans Parkway to facilitate the children attending school, as there is no banquet. The road superintendent was instructed to take up the matter of improving that section when practicable.

The regular order of business was then resumed.

The Jury instructed the road superintendent to consult with the Atlas Powder Company, who offered some time back to meet a part of the expenses, and if still of the same opinion that he should proceed to culvert, grade and put said street in condition, the above named parties and the parish to prorate share and share alike.

A letter was received from Southern Surety Company, relative to securing the Jury's consent to the acceptance from Paxton Miller; contractor of the 3.8 miles of completed road and the payment to him of the retain percentage on his completed portion of the road.

On motion of Mr. Toledano duly seconded it was resolved by the Police Jury as governing authority of Road District No. 1, that the president be authorized to sign a withdrawal in accordance with the proposition of the Southern Surety Company, upon the approval of State Highway Department of same.

K. to increase the capacity of its culverts along its line that it would relieve the situation, whereupon the Jury instructed the parish engineer to take this matter up with the O. K. line and have the proper ditches dug.

Mr. Pohlig advised the Jury that Mr. Codifer was prepared to furnish free culverts, and the Jury instructed Mr. Roussell to work the road.

On motion of Mr. Thompson duly seconded it was resolved that the president be and he is hereby authorized to sign a contract with the New Orleans

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Gravel Co., Inc., on the following terms to wit: Said gravel company to furnish 7500 cubic yards, more or less, of pit run sand-clay-road gavel, to be shipped to Willwood switch, at rate of five or more cars per day, price \$2.08 per ton of 2000 lbs., not including war tax, based on freight rates in effect at present time, any change in freight rates to change the price accordingly; payments cash within ten days.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann duly seconded it was resolved that the treasurer furnish the required bond for this parish in favor of railroad company to secure freight charges due for gravel to be delivered in Road District No. 2, at Willwood Switch, in order to have car relieved as arriving.

The committee appointed by the Police Jury to determine the application of the South New Orleans Light & Traction Company for an increase in carfare submitted the following:

Whereas, in order to avoid a strike and prevent a hardship on the people, on account of cars not operating, and as a necessity and relief for the general public;

Be it resolved, that the said street railway company be and is hereby granted the right to charge school children over both lines a five cents fare to and from school, and a 6 cents ticket fare, or a 7 cents cash fare on its lines provided that the New Orleans Commission Council accept this offer for a period of six months and 15 days.

AN ORDINANCE

Authorizing of the issuance of Sixty Thousand (\$60,000) Dollars Excess Revenue Bonds to complete the good road system throughout the Parish of Jefferson and providing for the payments thereof by pledge of all Excess Revenue sufficient to pay principal and interest.

WHEREAS, the assessed valuation of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1920 as evidenced by the tax rolls on file, amounts to the sum of Twenty-three Million, Eight Hundred Fifty-Four Thousand, Nine Hundred and Twenty-eight (\$23,854,928) Dollars and for the preceding four years averaged annually, the sum of Twenty-One Million, Seven Hundred and Seventy-Eight Thousand, Six-Hundred Fifty (\$21,778,650) Dollars, as showed by the Certificate of the Assessor of this Parish, and,

WHEREAS, in our opinion there is no reason to apprehend any decresase in said assessed valuation for the next ten years, but on the contrary, that said assessed valuation will materially increase, and,

WHEREAS, and annual levy of 4 1/2 mills general property tax on the dollars of assessed valuation is calculated to be sufficient to pay all satuary and ordinary charges of the Parish of Jefferson for the next seven years, and,

WHEREAS, there is then estimated to be a residue between such necessary levy on the five mill tax authorized under Article 232 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana as amoneded of one-half (1/2) mills per annum,

4 1/2 mills

and,

WHEREAS, there is now according to the budget adopted for the fiscal year 1920-1921 and actual Excess Revenue providing for the payment of all satuary and ordinary charges od Seventeen Thousand (\$17,000) Dollars and that the Excess Revenue for the next Seven years (7) will be at least equal annually to said amount, and,

WHEREAS, it is the sense of this Police Jury, that for the purpose of constructings highways and public roads in the Parish of Jefferson, and particularly for the purpose of completing the Good Road system throughout the whole Parish of Jefferson, that said Excess Revenue should be set aside during the years of 1921 1928 inclusive and should be funded into bonds to run for seven (7) years and to bear interest at the rate of five (5%) per annum and that shall not be sold for less than par, and,

WHEREAS, the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson is the governing authority through which such taxes shall be levied, and bonds issued according to Law, and particularly Article 291 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana, now therefore;

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular meeting assembled, that of the five (5) mill tax authorized under Article 232 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana to be expended by said Parish of Jefferson for all purposes, one-half (1/2) mills on the dollar of assessed valuation is hereby levied and the same shall be annually assessed on the property of the said Parish of Jefferson for a period of seven years, beginning with the taxes collected during the fiscal year 1920-1921 and ending with the fical year 1927-1928; and the proceeds thereof shall be collected and set aside as a trust fund to extinguish the bonds therein provided for and for any other purposes.

1/2 Mill assessed for Payment of 60,000 Bond Issue

SECTION 2. Be it ordained, etc., that the said one-half (1/2) mills per annum on the dollar of assessed valuation for seven years on all of the property of the Parish of Jefferson herein above levied and set aside are hereby authorized and directed to be funded into bonds, amounting to Sixty Thousand (\$60,000) Dollars which said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of 5% per annum, payable semi-annually and which shall not be sold for less than par.

SECTION 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that the funds derived from the sale of said bonds shall be expended exclusively for the purpose of constructing, improving and maintaining the Public Roads throughout the Parish of Jefferson and particularly to complete the Good Road System throughout said Parish of Jefferson.

SECTION 4. In absence of Mr. Fisher, Mr. A. S. Thompson officiated as president pro tem.

The report of parish engineer on drainage conditions on the Hyland estate estimated that it would cost \$4500 to make necessary ditches to drain that section and cross the ridge with deeper ditches, and the request of Mr. Toledano to ascertain what would be the cost to ditch and clean a ditch parallel to the property of the O. K. sub-station to relieve the overflow at Harahan developed that the cost would be \$350.

Relative to repair of courtroom it was reported that about 15% of the work is done and also making of emergence repairs to the jail.

Matters pertaining to construction of the New Orleans-Hammond highway; 5th. Matters mentioned in the letter from district attorney relative to law library and employment of an extra clerk for criminal matters; 6th. Complaints of Board of Health and property owners relative to fertilizer at Shrewsbury and hog pens on Metairie Ridge.

The call was signed by the following members of the Police Jury; W. E. Strehle, Fred. Erlinger, H. H. Gautier, E. M. Conzelmann, A. H. Athen, A. S. Thompson, and the following freeholders and inhabitants agreeing with the jurors; Max Charbonnet, John Zufle, N. C. Richard, P. B. Cassagne, A. T. Higgins, F. Oubre, Herbert Fink, W. C. Kieffer, M. M. Pitre, A. Hourgettes, H. S. Clerc, Ed. Iver.

The meeting was called to order by President Jules G. Fisher.

The report of the grand jury also dwelt on the subject and requested the Jury to take action to abate the nuisance.

Mr. Fagot addressed the Jury relative to the hog pens, claiming that he and the foreman of the grand jury passed the hog pens and that the foreman of the grand jury did not take any notice of the hog pen odor. Whereas, there is now pending before the State Board of Liquidation, the matter of letting of contract for the construction of part of the New Orleans-Hammond Highway and particularly the part from New Orleans to LaBranche, and

Whereas, there is a movement to abandon the construction of the said road and use the funds now available to construct a road to end at Ary in the Parish of St. John the Baptist, thereby depriving the Parish of Jefferson of said benefits that it may derive from the funds contributed to the construction of the New Orleans-Hammond Highway, and

Whereas, it was always understood and the bonds were issued based upon a road to be constructed along the shore of Lake Pontchartrain to La Branche and thence

to Hammond along the Illinois Central Railroad;

Be it Ordained, by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in special meeting assembled, that is the sense of this Police Jury that the funds now available for the construction of the New Orleans-Hammond Highway should be used at once on the New Orleans-La Branche section, work to start at the City of New Orleans, and that the District attorney be instructed to take such steps as he may deem necessary to prevent the use of said funds on any other route not contemplated at the time of the issuance of the bonds and if necessary file legal proceedings to enjoin the use of said funds on a route that will not directly benefit the Parish of Jefferson, as was originally intended when the bonds were voted ..

The Police Jury met this day in regular session.

Members present - Jules G. Fisher, president; F. Erlinger, W. E. Strehle, H. H. Gautier, H. P. Burbank, A. H. Athen, A. S. Thompson, W. R. Toledano.

Absent - E. M. Conzelmann..

The regular order of business was deferred to allow various persons to address the Jury.

Mr. Turner, representing the Armour Fertilizer Company at Shrewsbury, explained in detail the efforts of the company to abate the odor emanating from the plant, and promised that the proper machinery ordered would very soon be placed in operation to destroy the odors complained of, and it was due to war conditions that these improvements had not been accomplished.

Judge L. Arnoult described the conditions and the suffering caused by the odor, as well as the effect of the fumes on roofs, gutters and the water.

Mr. Johness also explained conditions is due to odor and fumes, declaring that these conditions were the cause of depreciation in real estate values and that none of the company's officers lived in the vicinity to appreciate the conditions. He stated that the plant was a nuisance and asked that it be classed as such.

Mr. Turner gave assurance that the new machinery would shortly be installed and would destroy the odors, positively assuring the Jury that the nuisance would be abated.

On motion of Mr. Gautier seconded by Mr. Strehle it was resolved that the ordinance adopted at the meeting held February 11, 1921, declaring the Amour Fertilizer Company's plant at Shrewsbury a nuisance, be reconsidered.

Mr. Toledano, seconded by Mr. Burbank, offered the following as a substitute to the above motion:

Be it resolved, that the Police Jury has no valid reason to reconsider its ordinance declaring the Armour Fertilizer Company's plant to be a public nuisance,

Be it further resolved, that the district attorney be instructed to proceed legally to have the said Armour Fertilizer Company to suspend operation of its plant while repairs are being made.

District was received and read, relative to conditions existing at intersection of Hoey's canal and the protection levee. No action was taken in the matter.

Report of the district attorney relative to the Armour Fertilizer Company and the pig-pen nuisance at Metairie Ridge was received and ordered filed.

Judge John E. Fleury and Attorney A. T. Higgins submitted offers to purchase bookcases that are to be discarded.

On motion of Mr. Strehle seconded by Mr. Athen, the courthouse and jail committee was authorized to negotiate for the sale of said book cases at the most

advantageous terms possible.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above resolution vote resulted as follows:

Yeas - Erlinger, Strehle, Gautier, Burbank, Athen, Thompson, Toledano.

Nays - None.

Absent - Conzelmann.

The Jury decided to postpone action until the June meeting on the report of the parish engineer relative to the Harvey bridge, the cost of repairing being estimated at \$3500.

The parish engineer approved for payment the bill of Mr. Schurb for \$50 for the work of boarding up the floor of the jail building.

The New Orleans Gravel Company offered to replace any gravel shipped that is up to specifications.

The Jury rejected the claims of Jos. Cristina & Sons for crossties, for the reason that the ties were bought from A. & C. Centanni and settlement was made in full with them in October 1919.

Proposal from W. B. Cooter to place lightning rods on courthouse was received, but no action was taken.

Petition from the Mexican Petroleum Corporation of Louisiana to erect a gasoline service station adjoining the American Creosote Works was received, and the secretary was instructed to inform the applicants that there was no ordinance regulating gasoline service stations and that by taking out a license to sell oil all requirements would be met.

Mr. Erlinger requested that the parish engineer be instructed to look into the completion of Virgil street crossing on the M. L. & T. Railroad in McDonoghville.

On motion by Mr. Strehle seconded by Mr. Burbank the following ordinance was adopted:

Whereas, it has been brought to the attention of the Police Jury that the South New Orleans Light and Traction Company has discontinued the light at Harvey bridge and at the Marrero station, and also that the waiting room at station is in bad condition.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular meeting assembled, that the South New Orleans Light and Traction Company be requested to replace at the approach of Harvey bridge and Marrero station the lights are heretofore, so as to avoid accidents, and the waiting room or station be also replaced so as to accommodate the traveling public in inclement weather.

Be it resolved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that it is the

sense of this body that we are opposed to the joint operation of any public ferry with the Commission of the City of New Orleans that operates between the City of New Orleans and the Parish of Jefferson, for the reason that we believe that such an arrangement is not feasible and is impracticable.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above resolution the vote resulted as follows:

Petition was received from citizens of Barataria, requesting that a ferry be located at a convenient point on Bayou Barataria.

On motion of Mr. Thompson seconded by Mr. Burbank it was resolved that the member of the Jury from the sixth ward be instructed to locate said ferry, and that he be empowered to install same at as early a date as possible.

On motion of Mr. Erlinger seconded by Mr. Strehle the following resolution was adopted:

Whereas, the main road connecting Gretna, McDonoghville and Algiers, comprising the following streets from Algiers line: Hancock to Perry, to Monroe, to Periander, to Jefferson, to Herschel, to Washington, to Front, are in need of repairs in order to permit the residents and business interests to carry on their business over route in question between Algiers, McDonoghville and Gretna:

Be it resolved, that the Police Jury, in regular session, do hereby authorize the road superintendent to purchase the necessary washed gravel to surface the streets above outlined. Carried.

On motion of Mr. Toledano seconded by Mr. Gautier it was resolved that for the purposing of surfacing with gravel or cinders the public roads in the ninth ward this Jury hereby appropriates from the general fund the sum of \$150. Carried.

On motion of Mr. Burbank seconded by Mr. Erlinger it was resolved that the Southern Pacific Railroad be requested to clean culverts back

of the Texas and Pacific depot at Waggaman, so as to improve drainage, and that the secretary is instructed to notify said Southern Pacific Railroad Company accordingly.

On motion of Mr. Burbank seconded by Mr. Strehle it was resolved that T. S. Landry be granted permission to install a syphon on the levee at Willswood and comply with Police Jury ordinance, and that the \$50 deposited last year, which is still in possession of the Jury, be posted as a guarantee that the road will be placed in the same condition as it is now, carried.

On motion of Mr. Thompson seconded by Mr. Strehle the following ordinance was adopted:

An Ordinance to authorize the president of the Police Jury to borrow from the Gretna Exchange and Savings Bank on the terms and conditions most advantageous possible, at various times, different sums not to exceed in all the sum of \$25,000, to be used in improving the road of the parish, and designating the fund from which said amount is to be paid.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that Jules G. Fisher, president of the Police Jury, be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow from the Gretna Exchange and Savings Bank on terms and conditions most advantageous possible, from time to time, various sums not to exceed in all sum total of \$25,000, which said money is to be used for the purpose of improving the roads of the parish;

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that the said Jules G. Fisher be and is hereby authorized to sign the necessary notes and documents in order to

carry this ordinance into effect;

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that the various sums of money borrowed under the provisions of this ordinance be paid from the general fund of this parish.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance the vote resulted as follows:

The secretary was instructed to write to the district attorney relative to driving cattle on the public roads during the day, and if it was possible to ordain against such practice.

On motion of Mr. Burbank seconded by Mr. Erlinger, it was resolved that C. E. Campbell be appointed poundkeeper for the 6th ward. carried.

There being no further business the Jury adjourned to meet in regular session on April 6, 1921.

The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was dispensed of with and they were adopted.

The regular order of business was deferred to allow various persons to address the Jury.

Messrs. Theard and Meral presented a petition signed by residents of Southport protesting against the erection of oil tanks by National Petroleum Company, regardless of all protection, and fully describing the danger should the tank be struck by lightning and the damage the spread of burning oil would cause, also that the tanks were built on their property line, leaving no room to build a protection levee, and requested the Jury to prevent such hazardous conditions.

On motion of Mr. Athen, seconded by Mr. Burbank, it was resolved that a committee of three be appointed to take up the matter with the parties at interest and make recommendations.

The president appointed Messers. Athen, Strehle and Toledano on this committee.

Mr. S. C. Braselman, representing the American Creosote Works, requested the Jury not to take any action against said plant, declaring the use of carbon as fuel a nuisance and stating that the smoke was not injurious to plants or to vegetation, and that some of the signers had gardens and declared that these were not affected by either smoke or soot.

Mr. Luke, ex-police juror from that section, said he did not notice any damages done by the use of carbon as fuel.

Mr. Mire again protested and stated that for a few days the wind was blowing the smoke away from his garden he did not notice any destroying effect, nor when smoke was light or passed above the plants, that the smoke was not so injurious to vegetation; but when floating low it produced its deadly effects on plants, and he asked the Jury to have such nuisances abated.

On motion of Mr. Thompson seconded by Mr. Strehle, it was resolved that Messers. Athen and Toledano make an investigation of the above complaints by going over the grounds to ascertain conditions and to suggest a remedy and report to the Jury. Mr. Quinette requested repairing of road known as front road, stating that also bridges were in bad condition and needed repairing.

Report of the parish engineer was received and ordered filed.

Communication from David Walter Wiedman Post No. 21, American Legion, was received and read.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann duly seconded it was resolved that it is the intention of the Jury to be present in a body and participate with the Legion Post in the great public observance of Memorial Day and the decorating of the graves of our departed soldiers and sailors on May 29, 30, 1921.

Communication was received from Paul Jones, D. V. Johnson and Association of Commerce of New Orleans.

Communication from J. K. Gaudet in behalf of F. E. Fagot, for reimbursement of \$50 overcharge on license for selling "nearbear," was referred to the district attorney.

Mr. H. H. Gautier Submitted request to property owners abutting the wood side between Gulf Refining Company's lower line to Grefer's Lane to dedicate a sidewalk to the public about 7 feet wide, and the secretary was instructed to write to the property owners requesting their cooperation.

Judge L. E. Arnoult reported collection of \$40, for convictions of speeding, which was turned over to the treasurer.

Judge J. T. Fitzgerald reported collection of \$25, for convictions of speeding, which was turned over to the treasurer.

A. T. Higgins paid \$12 for book-case sold to him by courthouse and jail committee as per instruction of Jury, Said amount was turned over to the treasurer.

Communication from State Highway Department was received and read. Communication from O. K.-Farm was read and the road superintendent was requested to attend same.

Constable Chas. Root reported that his effort to apprehend the negro woman who assaulted the teacher was not successful.

Communication from Miss Melancon, the school teacher complaining, praised the efforts of Constable Chas. Root to arrest the negro woman for assaulting her, but after several different persons had been arrested she was unable to identify the guilty one.

Communication was received from judge Jno. E. Fleury, representing the testamentary executor of estate of the late sheriff, L. H. Marroro, refusing a settlement on the basis as made by the parish auditor, and

advising the filing suit against the parish immediately.

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Dr. Johnson informed the Jury of small pox cases at Harvey and requested the building of an isolation hospital and to advise all people to be careful.

The Jury called in the secretary of the Board of Health and advised him to call a meeting so as to take the necessary steps as outlined by Drs. Johnson and Gelbke, it being the sense of the Jury that Supt. J. C. Ellis, of the public schools, be advised of the small pox conditions and be requested to take necessary steps to enforce vaccination rules as to school children, so as to prevent the spread.

The Public Nurse Service also reported small pox prevailing at Harvey.

The Jury was informed that Mrs. H. Huff, pound-keeper at Shrewsbury, had sold cattle impounded without first advertising same, and the secretary was instructed to send her a copy of the ordinance for her guidance.

The Police Jury met this day in regular session.
Members present - Jules G. Fisher, president; F. Erlinger, W. E. Strehle,
H. H. Gautier, E. M. Conzelmann, H. P. Burbank, A. H. Athen, A. S.
Thompson, W. R. Toledano.

The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was dispensed with

and they were adopted.

The regular order of business was deferred to allow various persons to address the Jury.

Mr. T. S. Wamsley, of the attorney general's office, took up the matter of the injunction filed against Road District No. 2, the parish and the Highway Department by Estate of Hyland, in reference to the dam placed by State Highway Department in the vicinity of said Hyland property.

Mr. Cane and others presented petitions requesting that Antony Costa be kept on the payroll of Road District No. 1, as supervisor of roads of said road district.

Mr. Chapman made a like request, also stating that J. Meham, who did good work keeping cattle of the highway, be retained, as the parish could not, after building the road, let the roaming cattle destroy it.

Mr. Deckbar appreciated Costa's service, but if Road Superintendent Roussel has no work for him it would not be consistent to create a useless position, and that the road superintendent was the sole judge and should be in full control of the work with authority to hire and discharge at will.

Mr. Costa said he got up the petition to show that the public approved him.

Mr. Casey that if it was not for Costa, there would be no road around his place and wanted him retained.

Mr. Roussel, in plain language, explained that the road on west bank was nearly completed and he had directed his work on the east bank and had no further use for Costa's services, that he could fully cope with the situation himself, and that he had no malice or political reason for dispensing with Costa's services. He stated that if he could not handle the road problem without being dictated whom to employ and discharge he would not continue to hold the job an hour longer.

On motion of Mr. Gautier, it was resolved that Antony Costa be retained as road superintendent for east bank.

Before the vote was taken Mr. Conzelmann moved that the above resolution by Mr. Gautier be tabled.

The roll was called to table the above motion and the vote was as follows:

National Petroleum Corporation condition to build

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular meeting assembled, that permission is hereby granted to the National Petroleum Corporation to use oil tanks erected by it on its property located at Southport, in this parish, but said permission is subject to the following conditions.

The large tank now in course of construction is to be used for crude oil or what is generally known as fuel oil, only: and in no case shall said tank now in course of construction be used for storage of gasoline, petroleum or other like products.

All the tanks erected, or to be erected, shall be surrounded by a concrete enclosure under the supervision of the parish engineer, the State Fire Marshal and the Louisiana Fire Prevention Bureau; and the National Petroleum Corporation shall take such further precaution to protect the property rights of adjoining owners, as may be designated by the said parish engineer, the State Fire Marshal and the Fire Prevention Bureau; and all work is to be done under the supervision of said parish engineer, State Fire Marshal and Fire Prevention Bureau, and on the approval of the Oil Commission of this parish:

Be it further ordained, that all waste oil on said premises shall be handled as required by law.

Fifth Justice Peace reported collections of fines for speeding and, cattle roaming, amounting to \$80.20, which was turned over to the treasurer.

Sixth Justice of the Peace reported collections of fines in the sum of \$10.00, which was turned over to the treasurer.

The Parish Board of Equalization made its report, which was read and received, recommending:

1. That the assessment rolls should be placed on a geographical basis.
2. That accurate and up-to-date map of the parish be made.
3. That the assessor should place an accurate description on all property and the dimensions.
4. To devise a system for the clerk of court, whereby transfers could reach assessor weekly or monthly.

5. That means be devised to inform assessors of improvements when made. Communication from Mr. Katts Complaining that Planter's Fertilizer Company was discharging refuse water in the drainage ditches, and he wanted same to stop, was received and referred to the district attorney for action.

Communication from Board of Health was received and read.

J. P. Draube requested the Jury to refund \$30.00, paid to the parish for licenses which were not due to the parish, but were due to the City of Harahan. Mr. Toledano made verbally the same request for H. Kielman, and both claims were referred to the district attorney for an opinion.

Communication from the American Legion for a donation to help defray expenses incurred for Decoration Day was received, but no action was taken.

Communication from Commissioner of Public Utilities in reference to the Napoleon avenue Ferry was received.

Frank E. Fagot asked the Jury to appropriate \$25 per month for a veterinarian to visit dairies so as to prevent the spread of tuberculosis, but no action was taken.

Communication from Ross & Shaw and Kostmayer, insurance agents, soliciting business were received.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Burbank, it was resolved that the district attorney take the necessary action to enforce the execution and termination of the sale of the Napoleon avenue ferry franchise to Bisso Ferry Company.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above resolution the vote re-

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sulted as follows:

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Erlinger, it was resolved that Fred. Erlinger, police juror in said section, be empowered to take up with the New Orleans and Lower Coast R. R. Company officials the matter of building a ramp at the intersection of Madison and Keppler streets.

On motion of Mr. Toledano seconded by Mr. Athen the following ordinance was adopted:

Whereas, A suit has been filed against Road District No. 1 due to drainage conditions along the Jefferson Highway between Kenner and Harahan City; and

Whereas, The principal cause of complaint is the failure of the Orleans-Kenner Traction Company to place sufficient culverts and openings through its right of way, so as to allow the water to flow freely in the direction towards the swamps and also the failure of the property

owners to open up the necessary drain to carry off the water from the front of their properties to the rear:

Be it ordained), By the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that the Orleans-Kenner Traction Company be instructed to construct at once the necessary drains or culverts through its right of way, to properly take care of the flow of water falling between its tracks and the Mississippi River:

Be It Further Ordained), etc., That the various property owners be instructed to open up the necessary drains to carry off the water on their properties so as to properly drain the public road, known as the Jefferson Highway, running through their property:

Be It Further Ordained), etc., That should these parties refuse to place the proper culverts and open up the proper drains that same be done by the road superintendent, and that the cost thereof be charged against the respective parties.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance the vote resulted as follows:

On motion of Mr. Athen seconded by Mr. Thompson, it was resolved that Joseph Meham be and he is hereby continued as cattle driver to keep cattle off the road and impound them, at a salary of \$75 per month.

On motion of Mr. Toledano seconded by Mr. Gautier, it was resolved that E. Roussel be reinstated as speed officer, his compensation to be fixed at \$50 per month and he is to receive in addition one-half of the fines imposed and collected.

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On motion of Mr. Strehle seconded by Mr. Thompson, the ordinance was adopted:

Be It Ordained, By the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular meeting assembled, that the president of this Police Jury be and he is hereby authorized to borrow from fiscal agent of the parish an amount not to exceed \$7500, to be deposited to the general fund and that same be paid out of the proceeds of the sale of the excess revenue bonds and in lieu thereof out of the first revenues of the parish collected from taxes for the year 1921.

It is the sense of the Jury, that the Parish Engineer ascertain if the Hyland fence is on public property; and to request the district attorney to take up with the Armour Fertilizer Company the abatement of odors and discharge of refuse water from their plant into the ditches of the Fourth Drainage District.

The resignation of Mr. E. M. Conzelmann, as oil Commissioner, was presented and accepted.

On motion of Mr. Thompson seconded by Mr. Burbank, it was resolved that the president appoint two members for the oil commission, to fill the vacancies made by the resignations of E. C. Flory and E. M. Conzelmann.

The motion was carried unanimously, whereupon the president appointed Mr. W. E. Strehle, Vice E. C. Flory, resigned, and William Luke, vice E. M. Conzelmann, resigned.

O. Terminal Co., be requested to open culverts at upper end of Shrewsbury and at west end of the road and to give a general cleaning, and also that the L. R. & N. Co. clean culverts at Geisenheimer's place.

The secretary was instructed to request Mr. Hero to be present at the regular meeting July 6, 1921, to take up some very important and urgent matters.

There being no further business the Jury then adjourned.

The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was dispensed with and they were adopted.

On motion of Mr. Toledano seconded by Mr. Burbank, it was resolved that the Jury adjourn for five minutes out of the respect to the memory of our late colleague, Mr. H. H. Gautier, member from the third ward, demised June 4th, 1921.

The president appointed Messrs. Samuel, Strehle and Erlinger as a committee to draft suitable resolutions of condolence on the death of our esteemed member, the late Mr. H. H. Gautier, and that a page in the minutes, be set aside for the inscription of these resolutions, and a copy sent to his bereaved widow.

President Fisher and Mr. Strehle made appropriate remarks, touching on his usefulness as a citizen and official, and declaring that his death proved to be a shock to the whole community, also of earnest efforts to accomplish much for his constituents. It was realized that he was a model citizen and that a place has been made vacant by his death that could scarcely be filled.

Also, that the Jury provided for good roads and other public necessities and that it was necessary that the Jury thus aid in the cause of humanity.

Prof. Ellis and Dr. Gelbke concurred in the appeal, asserting that the cause was deserving of encouragement and that a helping hand should be extended.

The jury was informed that next week the Red Cross was going to

have Baby Week and parents are requested to meet the committee and have children exam-

ined. Mr. Lapeyronnie said that the small pox case which developed at Harvey came from another parish, and that a public nurse had declined to attend the case, due to the fact that she did not want to take any chances to spread it, as she was attending school children of the parish in general.

Father Wynhoven explained that the nurse could not be too careful, due to fear of spreading the malady and did all she could in the small pox cases.

On motion of Mr. Burbank seconded by Mr. Strehle, it was resolved that a monthly contribution be and is hereby made to the Jefferson Chapter, Red Cross, of \$100, from and after July 1, 1921, for the support of the public nurse service, the secretary to voucher according.

Petition was received protesting of a hog farm in Metairie Ridge and was referred to the district attorney, with instructions to have the nuisance suppressed and to proceed legally if it be necessary.

The president appointed Mr. Samuel to cooperate with Red Cross public nurse service.

Mr., Clymer, representing the Alfacorn Milling Co., requested the Jury to grade and culvert the Protection Levee road to Deckbar and Deckbar road to Brooklyn Avenue, Mr. Ogden, representing Lucas E. Moore & Co., made the same request as did Mr. R. Ottermann, Mr. J. H. Snyder, representing Russe & Burger Inc., and S. C. Broadman, representing Glover Realty, made request for the grading and graveling of above roads and repair crossing.

On motion of Mr. Athen, seconded by Mr. Toledano, it was resolved that the road superintendent be and he is hereby instructed to grade culverts and gravel Protection Levee road to Deckbar road and Deckbar road to Brooklyn avenue.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above resolution the vote resulted as follows:

Nays - None.

Absent - Erlinger, Conzelmann.

On motion of Mr. Samuel seconded by Mr. Strehle, it was resolved that the road superintendent be and he is hereby instructed to order two carloads of gravel to be used on Cuvier to complete the unfurnished part of it to the Southern Pacific railroad tracks.

W. B. Jones, representing a surety company giving protection against raising and forging of checks, requested the Jury to take the insurance.

The Jury rejected the offer because it did not see necessity of having it.

Judge Trauth requested the Jury to close Cuvier street at Third street, in view of the fact that it is in the limits of the City of Gretna. No action was taken.

Mr. Theriot complained that the City of Gretna was dumping garbage on the street in the rear of Gretna, Hero Subdivision, parish limit,

and wanted the Jury to have same suppressed.

Judge Fleury, attorney for the City of Gretna, told the Jury that the Council had instructed the garbage man not to dump any garbage on any street or private property without first having the consent of the residents or owners.

Communication from the City of Kenner, through the secretary and attorney, were received and read.

Mr. McCaleb, representing South and West N. O. Traction and Light Co., in reference to contributing toward repair and upkeep of Harvey bridge that it was agreeable to the companies to absorb some of the expenses.

Mr. Burgess recalled several instances where the company contributed to work and repair of Harvey bridge and was yet ready to make a yearly contribution toward the expense incurred for repair and the wear and tear was not due in full to the cars because the cars use only the rails.

On motion of Mr. Thompson seconded by Mr. Strehle the following was adopted:

Be it ordained, by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that the Public Utilities Commission, formerly known as the Railroad Commission, be requested to ask all railroads and railways to install electric bell signals at all public road crossings throughout the Parish of Jefferson, on both sides of the Mississippi river.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance the vote resulted as follows:

The superintendent of roads was intructed to give his attention to the Kenner roads and put same in shape.

Judge Fleury, attorney for the City of Harahan, requested a donation of \$500 to help towards installing lights and other improvements anticipated by the City of Harahan.

On motion of Mr. Toledano seconded by Mr. Samuel, it was resolved by the Jury appropriate for the City of Harahan the sum of \$350 for public improvements, payable in three installments, to-wit: 3, 6 and 9 months apart.

Whereas, the Louisiana Tax Commission has seen fit to deny the recommendations made by this Jury sitting as a board of review, for reduction on certain properties; from the assessed valuation as fixed by the board. In the estimation of the Jury, it is unfair, unjust and persecutive, and the presumption of this Jury is that the Louisiana Tax Commission is not fully acquainted with the local conditions and that the Jury is of the opinion that its members, being residents, have a better knowledge to pass judgment than non-residents, who are not fully conversant with the local situation; and that their findings should have been accepted; therefore,

hereafter it should not meet as a board of review to make recommendations to the Louisiana Tax Commission, which does not consider them; unless the Police Jury is given more consideration in the future, it will be useless to take any action whatsoever, as a board to review assessment values fixed by the Tax Commission, due to the fact that the said Louisiana Tax Commission ignored their findings, and is of the opinion
