Be it resolved, that the courthouse and jail committee, with the parish engineer take the necessary steps to have such repairs made or remodel or rebuild, so as to carry out the suggestion outlined by the State Board of Health; and that the Pauly Jail Company be requested to submit a plan as to what could be done to carry out the requirements, and its cost, and to ascertain what arrangements and terms could be made for payments required, report to be made at the meeting of Jury.

license tax ordinance for 1922 was adopted.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular session assembled, that for every business of selling merchandise at retail, and not otherwise provided for by this ordinance, whether the business be conducted as principal, agent or on commission or otherwise, the license as herein fixed, graded and levied for the year 1922, shall be as follows, to-wit:

Section 1. When the gross sales exceed \$75,000.00, the license shall be \$90.00.

2. When the gross sales are \$50,000, or more, and under \$75,000 the license shall be \$60.

3. When the gross sales are 40,000, or more and under \$50,000, the license shall be \$50.

4. When the gross sales are \$30,000, or more and under \$40,000, the license shall be \$35.

5. When gross sales are \$25,000 or more and under \$30,000, license shall be \$30.

6. When gross sales are \$20,000 or more, and under \$25,000, license shall be \$25.

7. When gross sales are under \$15,000 or more, and under \$20,000, license shall be \$20.

8. When gross sales are \$10,000. or more, and under 15,000, license shall be \$15.

9. When gross sales are \$5,000. or more and under \$10,000, license shall be \$10.

10. When the gross sales are less than \$5,000, license shall be \$5.

Be it further ordained etc., that all persons, associations, firms and corporations engaged in the sale at retail of soda pop, coca cola, chera-cola, grapico, other similar soft drinks or beverages or refreshments, shall pay license based on the gross annual sales and such licenses are hereby fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

Section 1. When gross sales exceed \$10,000, license shall be \$50.

2. When gross sales are \$8,000, or more and less than \$10,000, license shall be \$40.

3. When gross sales are \$6,000 or more and less than \$8,000, license shall be \$30.

4. When gross sales are \$4,000 or more and less than \$6,000, license shall be \$25.

5. When gross sales are \$3,000 or more and less than \$4,000, license shall be \$20.

6. When gross sales are \$2,000 or more and less than \$3,000, license shall be \$15.

7. When gross sales are \$1000, or more and less than \$2,000, license shall be \$10.

8. When gross sales are less than \$1,000, license shall be \$5.

Be it further ordained etc., that all persons, firms, or corporations engages in the sale at retail, of distilled, spiritous, vinous, malt, cereal or other liquors or beverages containing any alcholic content, shall pay license based on gross annual sales, and each separate establishment at which such beverages are sold at retail whether conducted as principal, agent or distributor, shall pay a separate license, which licenses are hereby fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

1. When gross sales exceed \$10,000, license shall be \$100.

2. When gross sales are \$5,000 or more and less than \$10,000, license shall be \$50.

3. When gross sales are \$2,500 or less than \$5,000 the license shall be \$37.50

4. When gross sales are less than \$2,500, license shall be \$25.

Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed to authorize the issuance of a license for the sale of any liquor or beverage, the sale of which is prohibited by law or ordinance of the United States or the State of Louisiana or of any municipality or other subdivisions thereof. Provided that person, association, firm or corporation engaged in the business mentioned in this section having a proper license, may sell in connection with said business any of the commodities mentioned in the preceding section of the ordinance without paying a separate license, but the total sales from such combined business shall determine the amount of license to be paid according to the classification in this section.

Be it further ordained, etc., that there be and is hereby levied a license tax upon each person, association of persons or business firm, partnership or corporation, engaged in or pursuing any business whereby horses are run for purses or where any entrance fee is charged for the entrance of the said horses in a race, for each and every race track so operated, which said license shall be graduated, upon daily receipts from admission paid by spectators an entrance fee charged for the entrance of the said horses in said races as follows:

First Class - When said paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for horses racing amount to \$12,000 or more per day, the license tax shall be \$250 per day for the time of the race meeting.

Second Class - When said paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for horses racing amount to \$10,000 and less than \$12,000, the license tax shall be \$200. per day for the time of duration of the race meeting.

Third Class - When said admission by spectators and entrance fees for horses racing amount to \$8,000 and less than \$10,000 the license tax shall be \$150. per day for duration of the race meeting.

Fourth Class - when the said paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for horses racing amount to less than \$8,000 per day, the license tax shall be \$100. per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Be it further ordained etc., that all the provisions of the general license law of 1920 and the special race track license law of 1920 be adopted and made a part of this ordinance.

Hoppe and others, to the closing of Villere Street, between Hullen and Severn Avenues to be divided in equal area E. and J. Hoppe and E. Geisenheimer, owners of the adjacent property, as the law directs

in the closing of streets, which said area shall serve for the area used in the right of way of the Metairie or Jefferson Highway, between Hullen and Severn Avenues.

Report of Constable C. Root as to merchants who has not paid their licenses was ordered referred to the sheriff.

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On motion of Mr. Ahten, seconded by Mr. Strehle:

Be it resolved, in view of the district attorney's ruling that the account rendered by the Jefferson Democrat for publishing the grand jury's report and other work considered extra, be paid. Carried.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann, Seconded by Mr. Ahten; It was resolved that treasurer transfer from the Gretna-Belle Chasse Highway freight fund the balance on hand to the general fund.

The Jury requested Mr. S. J. McCune to report what progress is being made in the indexing of the records.

There being no further business the meeting stood adjourned.

Dr. Vornheder expressed the view that the dipping of cattle should be suspended and that vats should be cleaned by Feb. 1922.

The secretary was instructed to notify Jos. Mehan not to do any tick eradication until he receives orders from the Jury

The finance committee's report was received and read.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann, seconded by Mr. Burbank, the bill of J. B. Dauenhauer Jr., sheriff, for keeping prisoner, \$125.00 was ordered not paid, and the district attorney requested to write to the attorney general asking for an opinion as to whether or not the Police Jury shall pay the sheriff's deputy as keeper of the jail, due to the fact the amount paid the former sheriff for maintaining prisoners was not allowed the salary of the keeper of the jail, and that in all other respects the finance committee's report be approved and received, subject to the deduction on the sheriff's bill of the amount claimed for the keeper at the prison.

The ferry franchises of the Napoleon Avenue and the Louisiana Avenue were taken up, and on motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Burbank, it was resolved that the president appoint a committee of 5 to confer with Commissioner of Public Utilities of the Commission Council of New Orleans to take up the matter of said franchises and to report on December 12 at 2 o'clock at special meeting. Carried.

The president thereupon appointed the following to wait on the Commissioner of Public Utilities relative to ferry franchises; Messrs. Conzelmann, Burbank, Strehle, Samuel, Thompson.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Ahten, it was resolved that the communication of Mr. Commander, relative to the bad odor emanating from the Armour Fertilizer Plant at Shrewsbury be referred to the district attorney for action and report at the next meeting of the Jury.

The offer of the Harvey Canal Land and improvement Co., to wit:

To Jules G. Fisher, President, Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana November 22, 1921

Dear Sir:-

Harvey Canal Land and improvement Co. offer for a Highway from the ferry landing to main road.

Inasmuch as the Police Jury is now considering the terms of an ordinance to prescribe the rights and privileges of a ferry at the head of Harvey Canal, opposite Louisiana Avenue, we think it well to make some suggestions to the jury in the interest of the people of the parish, which we trust will be received and considered by you from the point of view and under the ideas which have actuated us in presenting it.

We realize that the present landing place is not as convenient to the people as it would be if the landing were higher up and facing a public road which they could quickly and conveniently reach the main highway running through the parish along the line of the electric railway. At present, those who leave the ferry are compelled to take a long round about and inconvenient route, mostly over private property and not always kept in the best of condition.

Our board has given serious consideration to the subject and we are prepared to make you the following proposition: We will donate to the Parish a roadway (30) thirty feet wide, commencing at the public road at the upper line of the property of the Harvey Canal Land and Improvement Co., running thence in a straight line through our property to the rear thereof at the right of way of the Texas and Pacific Railway, on the following conditions:

(1) That you will establish the landing place of the ferry in front of the public road thus opened and require the purchaser to remove the present landing place and its piling and other things which would then prove an obstruction to navigation.

(2) That you will dedicate the road which we are offering to the public use forever, and in short, make it the highway for traffic from the river to

the rear.

(3) That you will lay out and maintain the said highway, ditch and fence the same on both sides and pave the said highway with gravel or other substance as quickly as possible; granting us also the right of drainage for our remaining property into the ditch on the nearest side.

(4) That you will take down the building owned by us, situated on the right of way here discussed, and pile the debris upon our other land at a point which we will designate near to the present site of the building, and that you will pay us five hundred dollars for the said building, which in our judgment represent the loss of revenue which we will suffer from the destruction of the same.

(5) That you will compel the various railroads lying across the end of the highway here granted to make and preserve for the public use, crossings and ditches so as to connect the same with the public road, and that you will also compel the said railroads to put in culverts of sufficient size and depth to carry the drainage of the said ditches into the public ditch now maintained along the side of the main highway, and culvert that highway also for the same purpose.

Should the foregoing receive the approval of the jury, we are ready to meet you and your engineer and legal adviser at any time for the purpose of consummating the proposition here submitted.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury in regular session assembled, that Mr. Ed. Stoulig, of Kenner, be and he is hereby appointed registrar of voters of the Parish of Jefferson, and that notice of his appointment be forwarded to the proper authority.

The matter of the appointment of the registrar of voters was then declared open for discussion.

Mr. Conzelmann stated that the call of the governor for a Constitutional convention was limited: that it provided that the term of office of those presently holding office would not be disturbed, whether he was appointed or elected. The registrar of voters is an officer, in his opinion, and when the Constitutional convention created the office of registrar of voters, and designating that he shall be appointed on or before the 15th day of December, 1921, that provision of the constitution was in direct violation of the call of the governor, and any attempt to create the office of registrar of voters to take office before the office of the present re-

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gistrar of voters has expired is in direct violation of the call, unconstitutional, null and void, and is of the opinion that the appointment is in direct violation of the law.

Society Inc., of Jennings La., made a request for a donation, and on the motion of Mr. Conzelmann it was resolved that the Police Jury contribute the sum of \$20.00, and that a warrant be drawn and sent.

N. J. Nolan, insurance agent, asked to be advised when the policies of any kind expire to be informed thereof in order to submit bid. The matter was referred to the treasurer as to dates.

On motion of Mr. Thompson seconded by Mr. Strehle, the following resolution was adopted:

Whereas, the State Highway Department is about to begin mapping out of good roads throughout the State of Louisiana; and

Whereas, the Lafitte road, the only road connecting certain portions of the 6th ward of the Parish of Jefferson, is very essential to the commerce and convenience of the people living along said road and in the vicinity of Bayou Barataria and other waterways, in that part of the Parish of Jefferson and forms the only connecting link with the parish seat; therefore,

Be it resolved by the Police Jury in regular session assembled, that the State Highway Department be requested to improve said Lafitte road and to take the necessary and proper steps to complete said roadway over Little Bayou Barataria and Goose Bayou, just as soon as possible, so that the commerce and industries in the vicinity of said roadway may be encouraged and developed, and that said roadway be connected with the parish seat.

Be it further resolved that a copy be sent to said State Highway Department.

T. J. Kelly asked if it would be unlawful to operate a 3-ton truck to haul empty boxes, with less than two ton weight, and the Jury did not think so, and he was given a copy of the ordinance regulating the carrying capacity.

Petition of Seventh and Eighth ward property holders, protesting against the driving of cattle from the dairies to the pastures and to return daily, thus cutting the roads and destroying drainage and asked the Jury to put a stop to it.

On motion duly seconded the petition was ordered to be turned over to the district attorney, to render an opinion as to what authority the Jury has to enact an ordinance to prohibit the driving of cattle on the public thoroughfares.

Mr. Gloud, representing Pauly Jail Co., approximated the cost of building a jail capable of accommodating eighty prisoners would be about \$60,000 and agreed to submit plans also submit to prospective bidders price for fixtures; plan to be submitted to the parish without cost.

On motion of Mr. Toledano seconded by Mr. Thompson, it was resolved that plan be drawn for a jail capable of accommodating eighty prisoners said plan to be submitted free.

Parish of Jefferson, the Parish of Jefferson was adjudged to be entitled to a right of way 400 feet in width, over and across the property of the heirs of Samuel Davis, located on the line of canal to be constructed by the United States government from Bayou Dupont to Bayou Cutler; and, whereas, the jury of freeholders in said case rendered a verdict in favor of the heirs of Samuel Davis and against the Parish of Jefferson for the sum of \$160, said amount being the value fixed by said jury for the land taken; and

Application of Max Charbonnet for the appointment of traffic officer and poundkeeper was received, and on motion of Mr. Strehle seconded by Mr. Samuel it was resolved that Max Charbonnet be hereby appointed traffic officer for the right bank of the Mississippi River, and to be paid one-half of all fines collected on his affidavits.

Ordinance granting A. H. Johnness to operate Electric Light & Heating plant.

An ordinance authorizing Allen H. Johnness, his successors and assigns to construct, maintain and operate a light, heat and power system and to generate vend and distribute electric energy in Parish of Jefferson and describe the method of exercise of this privilege.

Section - 1. Be it ordained, by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular meeting assembled, that Allen H. Johnness, his successors and assigns shall have the right, power and authority to erect, maintain for and over and through the streets and highways and public places in the Parish of Jefferson, all such wires, conductors and cables as shall or may become necessary to carry out the objects

and purposes of said grantees, and to establish and extend as may be required, electric lights and a system of lighting by electricity and furnish electrical power in the Parish of Jefferson, and to supply the demand therefor, as the same may arise or increase in the future.

Subject to the limitation and condition in the ordinance or any other may be enforced at this time, Providing that this grant be limited to the term of Twenty-Five [25] Years.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that all lines of wires, poles, masts, landing of the shore end of all cables and construction shall be located and constructed so as not to obstruct unreasonably the public use of the streets and public places, or to interfere with commerce or travel, nor in such close proximity to buildings as to endanger them or the occupants thereof.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that all work involving the tearing

up of the streets or highways, or in other way interfering with traffic thereof, or their use thereof by the public, that may be done by said grantee herein, his heirs, successors or assigns, under the provisions of this ordinance shall be done with the consent and under the control and direction of this Police Jury, which body shall have full say and discretion, as to how streets and portion of city streets, highways or public places that may be torn up for the use thereof, interfering with at any time, and who shall further dictate when and for how long a period said street, highway or public place shall be torn up, or otherwise interfere with as above set forth.

Police Jury shall have full power to dictate the manner in which streets shall be repaired that have been torn up by the grantee, his heirs or assigns herein, and should the said grantee herein, his heirs or assigns fail or neglect to make the repairs designated by this Police Jury after Forty-Eight (48) hours notice, then same shall be made at the cost and expense of the grantee, his heirs or assigns.

Section 4. Be it further ordained, etc., that the said grantee his successors or assigns shall be bound and hereby contract as a consideration upon which the right hereunto applies for or confers that he, his successors or assigns agrees to furnish electric energy to private consumers, Parish of Jefferson, for rates not to exceed the following:-

Commercial and Residential Lightning Rates.

10¢ net per K W H for the 20 K W H per meter consumed in any one month.

8¢ net per K W H for the next K W H per meter consumed in any one month.

7¢ net per K W H for the next 150 K W H per meter consumed in any one month.

6¢ net per K W H for all over 200 K W H per meter consumed in any one month.

The consumer to guarantee to pay a monthly service charge of 25¢ for each meter connected.

1¢ per K W H will be deducted from all bills if paid on or before ten days after date of presentation.

Electric Power Retail Rate.

6½¢ net per K W H for all electricity consumed in such month up to and including an amount that would be equal to 30 hours use of the consumers demand in such month.

4½¢ net per K W H for all electricity consumed in such month in excess of the above.

When the consumption is less than 8½ K W H per meter per rated h.p. of motors connected, there will be service charge of 50¢ per h.p. or fraction thereof, or rated capacity of month.

1¢ per K W H will be deducted from all bills when the consumption is in excess of 8½-3 K W H per meter per rated h. p. of motors connected if paid on or before ten days after date of presentation.

No installations to be rated at less than 2 h.p. per meter.

The demand for any one month shall be the number of kilowatts equal to the per cent of kilowatts capacity of all motors connected in accordance with the following tables:

Installations under 10 h. p. 75 per cent.

Installations of 10 h. p. and over, up to 50 h. p. 65 per cent.

Installations over 50 h. p. 55 per cent.

Section 5. Be it further ordained, etc., that the grantee herein, his successors and assigns shall indemnify and save harmless Parish of Jefferson from all suits or actions that may be brought against it by reason of any injury or alleged injury to the person or property of another resulting from negligence or on account of any act of commission or commission on the part or the said grantee, his successors or assigns or representatives or employees, and if anything in the provisions of the ordinance should result in the injury to private property or be in conflict with any right or privilege heretofore granted by the Parish of Jefferson to any person or company, the said grantee, his successors and assigns by their acceptance of this ordinance bind themselves to hold the Parish of Jefferson harmless from all damages or reclamations whatever, arising from injury or conflict.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, at special meeting assembled that whereas it is necessary to borrow funds from fiscal agents of the Parish of Jefferson, sufficient to pay the current necessary and usual expenses of the Parish of Jefferson, that the President of this Police Jury be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to negotiate with the fiscal agent of the Parish of Jefferson, for the purpose of the effecting a loan not exceeding the sum of \$75,000, said amount to be advanced by the fiscal agent at the rate of \$6200 per month and interest to be paid on said loan not to exceed the rate of interest paid by the fiscal agent of the parish for the parish deposits. The said President of this Police Jury has been given full power and authority to sign all necessary notes, documents and other papers, as may be necessary to represent amount borrowed and the binding of this Police Jury.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that the amount to be advanced by the fiscal agent shall be credited to the various items on the budget and used for the purpose of paying the current necessary usual and ordinary expenses of the Parish of Jefferson.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that the amount borrowed from the fiscal agent shall be duly budgeted, and there is hereby pledged and set aside for the purpose of re-payment of the amount borrowed, together with interest due, the first proceeds, to be collected from the taxes to be imposed and collected for the year 1922.

F. P. Philip complained that residents at Papworth avenue were taking mud from streets to fill their yards. he was advised to report parties guilty so that action may be taken against them.

On appeal of Capt. Dinkins the jury donated \$100.00 to the American Legion convention.

Mr. Deckbar, inspector for the levee board, called the Jury's attention to seepage due to high water, and the jury ordered culverts and ditches to be cleaned to allow necessary drainage.

Petition from Seventh Ward Improvement League was received and numerous complaints were referred to the proper authorities for remedy.

Mr. Charles Koerber presented a petition requesting improvement of Harlem avenue and grading Jefferson boulevard.

On motion of Mr. Thompson, seconded by Mr. Burbank, It was resolved to give Harlem avenue the necessary attention and to post speed signs on Brooklyn avenue.

The supplemental and amended agreement of New Orleans Gravel Co., was presented. as follows:-

STATE OF LOUISIANA
PARISH OF JEFFERSON

This supplemental and amended agreement, entered into on this 5th day of April, A. D. 1922. by and between the POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, represented herein by its President, Jules G. Fisher, duly authorized hereto by resolution of the Police Jury hereinafter called the Police Jury, and the NEW ORLEANS GRAVEL CO., INC., a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Louisiana and represented herein by I. S. Lothrop, President, duly authorized hereto by resolution of the Board of Directors, hereinafter called the Gravel Company.

WITNESSETH :

That, Whereas, differences has arisen between the Police Jury and the Gravel Company as to the construction and performance under the contract between these parties of date July 22, 1921, for the purchase of \$60,000.00 of excess revenue bonds of said Parish, and the sale and delivery of gravel therein provided for;

Now, therefore, to compromise and adjust all differences growing out of the interpretation of said contract, the following is agreed to:

It is now agreed and understood that the contract of July 22, 1921, shall be construed and understood to be limited to requiring the Police

Jury to take and the Gravel Company to deliver gravel of the kind therein provided for at Two Dollars, Forty-four and one-half cents (\$2.44½) per ton of two thousand pounds, railroad weights to govern, up to a total amount of Thirty-five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000.00) and the Police Jury now agrees to receive, accept, and pay for gravel to the amount of \$35,000.00 at \$2.44½ per ton, F. O. B. unloading points, Parish of Jefferson, less 3602.05 tons already delivered under said contract; said gravel to be delivered at the rate of not less than twenty (20) cars per month, and to be delivered daily through the said months as nearly as possible. All of said gravel to be delivered within ten (10) months from the date hereof.

The gravel Company agrees to deliver said amount of gravel and under said conditions.

It is further understood and agreed that one-half of number of cars of gravel delivered each month shall be by the Police Jury credited to the sums previously advanced under said contract and now due to the Police Jury by the Gravel Company one-half (½) of all cars delivered each month shall be credited to the payment of the \$10,000.00 of bonds now in escrow in the Gretna Exchange & Saving Bank, it being understood and agreed that the bonds shall released and delivered to the Gravel Company as fast as paid for by the delivery of gravel in other wards, when gravels sufficient to cover one bond and accrued interest will have been delivered, the Gretna Exchange & Saving Bank will authorized to deliver one bond to the Gravel Company and a letter from the Treasurer of the Police Jury to the effect that the gravel equal to the amount of the bond has been delivered will be sufficient authority for the Exchange Bank to make a delivery of the bond. This shall continue until the debt due the Police Jury by the Gravel Company is paid and the bonds are all paid for and delivered shall be paid for in cash, settlements to be made monthly.

To this agreement intervenes UNITED STATES FIDELITY & GUARANTY COMPANY, of Baltimore, Maryland, represented herein by L. L. Debout attorney in fact, who takes cognizance of his supplemental agreement and consents and agrees thereto and consents and agrees that the bond heretofore issued shall remain in full force and effect as a guarantee for the performance of the original contract as amended herein.

IN EVIDENCE WHEREOF the parties hereto have signed this amended agreement in duplicate-originals, on the day and date above written.

On motion of Mr. Thompson and seconded by Mr. Strehle, the following ordinance was adopted:

ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, there has been presented to this Police Jury supplemental and amended agreement between the New Orleans Gravel Company and the Police Jury, relative to original agreement entered into between said parties, dated July 22nd, 1921, and.

WHEREAS, said supplemental agreement is intended to adjust a difference between the parties that have arisen under the original contract.

THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular meeting assembled, that the said supplemental and amended agreement is hereby approved, and the president of this Police Jury is hereby authorized and empowered to sign said supplemental and amended agreement for and on behalf of this Police Jury, providing that said supplemental and amended agreement is acceptable to the United States Fidelity & Guaranty Company, of Baltimore, Maryland, the surety and the bond furnished by the New Orleans Gravel Company, to guarantee the faithful performance of applications of the original, as well as the within supplemental and amended agreement.

The roll being called on the adoption of above ordinance, the vote resulted as follows: Yeas - Erlinger, Strehle, Samuel, Conzelmann, Burbank, Fisher, Athen, Toledana, Thompson.

Nays - None.

Mr. Wills, superintendent of the S. P. R. R. agreed to grade crossing and place culverts in good shape at the New Harvey Ferry Road.

Mr. Burgess of the S. N. O. L. & T. Co. offered to do the same for the New Harvey Ferry Road.

It was resolved on petition from residents from Fredericks Avenue to grade and gravel same as soon as possible.

ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS, the citizens living on the west bank of Bayou Barataria in this parish, in that part known as the Upper Village of Barataria, the Lower Village of Barataria, and that known as Little Village is without means of access to their property which is on the west bank of Barataria, when the highway known as the Barataria Boulevard on the east bank of Barataria: and,

WHEREAS, the property holders of the above named villages have petitioned this Police Jury for three roads leading from the Barataria Boulevard to Bayou Barataria in order that they may be able to get to and from their property.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the President of this Jury be instructed to purchase the right of way 50 feet wide for the following three roads, not to exceed one hundred and twenty-five dollars for each road:

1st. The Road leading from the Barataria Boulevard

Purchasing from Brady 3 roads 1st from Barataria Boulevard in plot 12-2nd in plot 28 3- in Hunt property

to Bayou Barataria in that part of the subdivision of the Hunt property in Plot No. 12, which leads to the upper end of the Village of Barataria,

2nd. The road leading from Barataria Boulevard to Bayou Barataria in that part of the subdivision of the Hunt property in Plot No. 28, which leads to the lower end of the Village of Barataria.

3rd. The road leading from the Barataria Boulevard to Bayou Barataria in that part of the subdivision of the Hunt property at the spot leading to Bayou Barataria at about a spot in front of the property of John Christina in Little Village.

BE IT FURTHER resolved. That just as soon as the above right of ways are purchased the Parish Road Superintendent and he is hereby instructed by this Jury to immediately grade the said roads and place them in a passable condition.

The roll being called on adoption of the above resolution, the vote resulted as follows: Yeas: Erlinger, Strehle, Samuel, Conzelmann, Burbank, Fisher, Athen, Thompson, Toledano, Nays: None.

Letter from District Attorney Buchler to effect that Louisiana Cypress Lumber Co., would permit use of road through their yard when Harvey bridge is out of commission and temporary permit of Mrs. Gus Odom was received and selection of jury of free holders was suggested, to obtain right of way for new road commencing at Barataria Boulevard, a continuation of the Westwego road to Gretna, running parallel with the Southern Pacific Railroad.

On motion of Mr. Samuel, seconded by Mr. Burbank, It was resolved that the road superintendent grade and drain River road from Harvey bridge to Brown's lane and from there to the main highway.

Further resolved, That the Louisiana Cypress Lumber Company be instructed to build new ramp near Harvey bridge on the River road and that same be made wider.

Bids for fiscal agency were ordered advertised in the official Journal up to 1 p. m. May 3, 1922.

The Jury agreed to take up offer of Mr. Jones to contribute labor towards grading of roads of Barataria and Bayou Willow section.

The sum of \$300.00 was appropriated for drainage in McDonoghville section.

ORDINANCE.

An Ordinance providing for the appointment of a jury of free holders, for the purpose of laying out and tracing new public roads to connect with the present road running from Westwego to Marrero.

WHEREAS, this Police Jury has been requested to provide for the opening of a new public road to connect with public road now being used running from Westwego to Marrero, said new public road to run from Marrero to the line of the City of Gretna, and from Westwego to the line of the Parishes of Jefferson and St. Charles:

WHEREAS: said new public road will materially shorten the distance to be traveled and will connect with proposed new road to run from Boutte, in the Parish of St. Charles, through the Town of Westwego, and will be to the best interest of the inhabitants of the Parish of Jefferson.

New Public Road and appointment of Jury of free holders

SECTION 1. Therefore, Be it Ordained, by the

Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in regular meeting assembled, that in accordance with and under and by virtue of Section 3369 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Louisiana, relative to the opening of the new roads, that a jury of free holders, consisting of the following inhabitants and taxpayers of the Parish of Jefferson, be, and they are hereby appointed towit:

W. Rebentisch, Paul Pizarrie, Leo. A. Marrero, Edward Gardere, Michel Flesch, Vic. A. Pitrie.

Section 11. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, Etc., that said jury of free holders

shall take the oath prescribed by law, shall appoint their own chairman and other officers, and shall then proceed to trace and lay out the new public road to run from the end of the present public road at its intersection with the Baratatia Boulevard and to connect with the line of the City of Gretna, and also new public road connecting with present public road in the Town of Westwego and to run to the line dividing the Parishes of Jefferson and St. Charles. Said new roads are to be laid out to the greater advantage of the inhabitants and as little as may be to the prejudice of enclosures and shall assess such damages as any person may sustain where damages are claimed. All damages assessed by the said jury to any individual through whose land the road may run shall be deemed a Parish charge and be paid by the treasurer of the Parish.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that each member of the said jury shall be allowed the sum of three dollars (\$3.00) per day, for each day actually served. in all, irrespective of the total number of days served.

The above Ordinance having been considered by section, and then as a whole was duly adopted, and the roll being called upon the adoption of same, the vote resulted as follows; Yeas: Erlinger, Strehle, Samuel, Conzelmann, Burbank, Fisher, Athen, Thompson and Toledano. Nays - None.

Mr. Vering was informed that lumber promised could not be obtained as yet.

Mr. Beveridge, agent for Anderson-Clayton-Flemming requested grading La Barea Road and placing of gravel between I. C. R. R. and river, as they were ready to construct cotton warehouse. Also permit to lay switch tracks at two points to be determined later between L. R. & N. R. R. track and I. C. R. R. tracks to serve as connection with L. R. & N. R. R. Co., and the other with the N. O. Terminal R. R. switch tracks to run down and within Lausat or Canal street, covering two blocks. By unanimous consent of the Jury this request was granted.

Communication from Parish Engineer Zander, to State Highway Commission was presented to the jury.

Communication of Louisiana Highway Commission allowing \$200.00 a year for maintenance of roads was received, and motion of Mr. Conzelmann and seconded by Mr. Thompson, the following application was presented:-

The Police Jury of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana in regular session convened respectfully submits for your consideration and approval, this application for State Aid upon maintenance of the following described highways:

- Route No. 1. Jefferson Highway, - - - - - 13.0 miles
- Route No. 2. Southern National, Gretna, St. Charles -- 19.0 miles
- Route No. 30. Algior, Marrero, to Lafitte - - - - - 25.0 miles
- Route No. 31. Marrero-Gretna-Belle Chasse - - - - - 3.0 miles
- Total - - - - - 60.0 miles

Whereas; The Police Jury of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, does hereby agree to secure and guarantee its said portion for maintenance and for repair of the above described highways, in the amount of Twelve Thousand (\$12,000.00) Dollars, therefore.

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish, in regular session convened HEREBY MAKES FORMAL APPLICATION and petitions the Louisiana Highway Commission for aid, named highways included in the State Highway System. The work to be done by the State Highway Engineer under the direct supervision of the Louisiana Highway Commission and about which the following information is furnished and admitted:-

1. Length (net) 60. miles.
2. Through traffic, approximate average daily number (a) Trucks 30. (b) passenger motor vehicles 200, and (c) horsedrawn vehicles 200.
3. Local Traffic, approximate average daily number (a) Trucks 100 (b) passengers motor vehicles 600 and (c) horse drawn vehicles 300.
4. Description and present condition of travel way roads in fair condition.
5. Width of existing right of way 50 feet.
6. Width of existing surfacing 9 feet up to 20 feet.
7. Location, nature and extent of deposits of local materials suitable for use on this project.
8. Parish's share of cost of maintenance to be provided by General Fund in the following manner and amount:
9. Official, Officials, or depository authorized by State law to receive public funds of the Parish designated by the Parish Police Jury to receive funds for this project.
10. Additional remarks.

Assurance is given that the foregoing information concerning the project herein described is known by the Police Jury to be correct. Respectfully submitted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the President of the Police Jury of Jefferson be, and he is hereby authorized and instructed to draw on the Parish Treasurer and remit to the State Treasurer for the credit of the General Highway Fund and special credit of the project herein contemplated, sum of Twelve Thousand (\$12,000.00) Dollars, when and as demanded by the said Commission, being its portion of said maintenance, and for repair of the within described Highway.

Request of Assessor for January, February, and March was read and deferred due to want of funds.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann, seconded by Mr. Toledano, the following franchise was adopted:-

advertisement for the sale of a lease to operate a ferry system on the Mississippi River from the head of Napoleon Avenue on the New Orleans side of the river, to the village of Marrero, on the opposite side of the river, in the Parish of Jefferson.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury, Parish of Jefferson that the Commissioner of Public Utilities be, and is hereby directed to advertise for bids, for a period of not less than sixty (60) days, and otherwise according to law, for the sale, at public auction, to the highest bidder, a lease that will embrace the authority and right to maintain and operate for a period of fifteen years

Avenue Ferry
Franchise

to date from the signing of the notarial contract, a system of ferries on the Mississippi River from the head of Napoleon Avenue on the New Orleans side of the river, to the village of Marrero on the opposite side of the river in the Parish of Jefferson, all in accordance with a subject to the hereinafter prescribed terms, conditions and specifications, to-wit:

TITLE.

Wherever the work lease is used in this ordinance it is understood and agreed to mean the lease provided for by this ordinance: Wherever the word "purchaser" is used in this ordinance it is understood and agreed to mean the firm or corporation acquiring the lease provided for herein; Wherever the word "City is used in this ordinance, it is understood and agreed to mean the City of New Orleans.

Wherever the term "Police Jury's" is used it is understood and agreed to mean the Police Jury of Jefferson.

PRICE.

The lease shall not be sold for a less amount than \$35,000. The purchaser shall pay the City of New Orleans and the Parish of Jefferson in cash, one-half of the adjudicated price of the lease, to be equally divided between the City of New Orleans and the Parish of Jefferson, and for the balance of the price of adjudication the purchaser shall make and execute twenty (20) promissory notes of equal denominations, two which shall mature and be made payable annually for a period of ten (10) years, said notes to bear interest at the rate of 8% per annum from the date of maturity until paid: ten (10) of which notes shall be made payable to the City of New Orleans, and the remaining ten (10) notes made payable to the Parish of Jefferson.

As the notes mature annually for the said period of ten (10) years, ten (10) shall be delivered to the

City of New Orleans, and made payable to its order, and the remaining ten shall be delivered to the Parish of Jefferson and payable to its order.

LESSOR'S OBLIGATION.

On their respective sides of the river, the City of New Orleans and the Parish of Jefferson shall provide the ferry houses and such other land improvements as they may deem necessary to facilitate the public.

All monies received by the City Of New Orleans from the sale of this franchise are hereby dedicated for exclusive use of ferry improvements, such as ferry houses, roadways, etc., or contiguous to the ferry landing on the New Orleans side of the river, and said monies shall constitute a special and separate fund for the purposes of the said dedication, and the City of New Orleans hereby binds and obligates itself to the purchaser of the said franchise to use said fund for the purposes of said dedication.

TERM.

The term of the lease shall be fifteen (15) years, and shall extend from the date of the signing of the notarial contract.

EXCLUSIVE PRIVILEGE.

The lease shall embrace the exclusive privilege of operating a system of ferries on the Mississippi River from the head of Napoleon Avenue on the New Orleans side to the Villago of Marrero on the Jefferson Parish side.

COMMON CARRIER

The purchaser shall be a common carrier and shall be responsible not only to the City of New Orleans and the Parish Of Jefferson, but to any and all persons who may suffer injuries or sustain damages because of his non-compliance with the terms, conditions and specifications of the lease; and such persons so damaged or injured, may bring suit in any court of competent jurisdiction for the full amount of damages or injuries resulting from the purchaser's to faithfully comply with the lease.

LANDING.

The lease shall embrace the exclusive privilege of occupying with ferry houses, pontoons, piles, wharves, gangways, driveways, footwalks and other appurtenances and improvements necessary to the proper operation of a ferry system that portion on the New Orleans side of the river, presently occupied by ferry improvements, extending from the middle of the road up-stream 35 ft. 6 inches and down-stream 59 ft 6 inches, and on the Jefferson Parish side of the river, that portion of the bank presently used for ferry improvements, extending upstream from the middle of the road 26 feet, and extending down-stream from the middle of the road 26 feet.

MAINTENANCE OF BOATS, DOCKS, ETC.,

The purchaser shall provide and maintain in good order and condition all such boats, docks, wharves, pontoons, bridges, gangways, lights and other equipments as may be necessary to furnish safe, adequate and convenient ferry service to the public in the transportation of passengers, vehicles and freight across the Mississippi River; convenient and safe: landings for said boats and proper connections for passenger and vehicles to the shores and roadways adjacent to the landing.

FERRY HOUSES.

The ferry houses at each landing shall have suitable and separate waiting rooms for whites and colored passegners. The purchaser shall keep the ferry houses in a clean, sanitary and well ordered condition

and shall furnish heat and light and ice water for the comfort of the passengers, as the season may require.

No part of the ferry house on either side of the river shall be rented for the conduct of private business.

TICKET SELLER.

From 5 o'clock, A. M. to 8 o'clock, p. m. there shall be stationed in a ferry house on either side of the river at the option of the purchaser, a ticket seller and a ticket taker.

PILOTS AND CREW

The purchaser shall employ only competent pilots and engineers having certificates from the proper officials of the United States Government. In executing the lease purchaser shall in all particulars comply with existing Maritime Laws of the United States and the rules of the local United States Inspectors office.

PONTOONS

Pontoons at each landing shall be strong, substantial and of suitable dimensions, properly decked and provided with necessary railings and other appurtenances requisite to the comfort and safety of the public.

The deck of each pontoon shall be partitioned off so as to divide the space used by vehicles from the space used by pedestrians.

The entire space on the deck of each pontoon so partitioned off for the use of pedestrians shall be roofed ensuring protection from weather conditions.

SHORE CONNECTIONS.

The connections between the pontoons against which the boats and the shore, for the passage of vehicles and pedestrians shall be of such construction as will admit of the flattest slope practicable at extreme low water, the requirements being that these connections shall be of as easy grade at all points as existing conditions will permit. They must be so constructed as to sustain weight of 12 ton loads in transit.

VEHICLES GANGWAYS.

The gangway for the passage of vehicles on either side of the river shall be a convenient and substantial structure, its width and general proportions subject to the approval of the City Engineer for the City of New Orleans, and such authority as the Police Jury may designate. The vehicle gangways shall be for the exclusive use of vehicles and shall not be used by pedestrians.

PASSANGERS GANGWAYS

Substantial and convenient gangways, properly covered and safe guarded against weather conditions, shall be constructed at either landing, subject to the approval of the City Engineer of the City of New Orleans, and such authority as the Police Jury may designate.

DETAIL PLANS

Before the purchaser shall commence work on any of the structures he shall submit plans and specifications for the approval of the Commissioner of public Utilities of the City Of New Orleans and the Police Jury.

LIGHTING.

The ferry houses, pontoons, vehicles and passenger gangways and

ferry boats shall be properly lighted subject to the approval of the City Electrician of the City of New Orleans and the Police Jury.

BOATS.

The purchaser shall provide and operate during the hours herein after specified, one or more substantial boats of not less capacity than 150 tons burden (United States Maritime Measurement).

The boats shall be maintained in a substantial and safe condition, kept painted and neat in appearance, and shall be equipped in the most approved manner to secure the safety and convenience of passengers and vehicles.

The lower deck of the ferry boats shall be primarily for the use of vehicles and the purchaser shall be privileged, when the movement of vehicles would be inconvenienced, to exclude foot passengers therefrom and require them to use the upper deck.

The purchaser shall, periodically, at his own expense, have the boilers and hulls examined by qualified United States inspectors as provided by the United States Maritime Regulations, and such certificates of inspection properly framed shall be conspicuously displayed on the boats.

BOATS SCHEDULES.

The boat or boats shall be operated on the following schedules, wind, weather and vehicular traffic permitting;

From 5 o'clock A. M. first departure from the Jefferson Parish side of the river, to 8:30 A. M. every twenty minutes or from 5 a. m. 5.20 A. M. 5:40 A. M. 6 A. M. 6:20 A. M. 6.40 A. M. 7 A. M. 7.20 A. M. 7.40 A. M. 8:00 A. M. 8:20 A. M. From 8.30 A. M. to 4 P. M. every thirty minutes on the hour and half.

From 4. P. M. to 7 P. M. every twenty minutes, or at 4. p. m. 4.20 P. M. 4.40 P. M.; 5 P. M. 5:20 P. M. 5.40 p. m; 6 P. M. 6:20 P. M.; 6.40 P. M: 7 P. M.

From 7 P. M. to 8.30 P. M. every half hour on the hour and the half hour.

From 8.30 P. M. to half an hour after midnight every hour on the half hour.

From half hour after midnight to 5 A. M. the purchaser shall operate one of the aforesaid boats or a substantial boat capable of transporting not less than 100 passengers and not less than ten vehicles at a time, every thirty minutes so as not to make less than one crossing each way every hour. During the last five years of this franchise, the purchaser shall operate every thirty minutes from 8.30 P. M. to 12.30 P. M.

FREE TRANSPORTATION.

The purchaser shall carry to and fro, free of charge, fire engines and firemen of the New Orleans Fire Department and the Parish of Jefferson Fire Department; Charity Hospital Ambulances, and the regular police of the City of New Orleans, while in uniform, and the police of Jefferson Parish.

The free right passage over the said ferry in accordance with Section 10 of Act 120 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, Session of 1916 shall be granted all children attending school, and no fares shall be demanded or exacted of them in their passage to and from school between the hours of 7 o'clock A. M. and 9 o'clock A. M. and 3 o'clock p. m. to 6 o'clock P. M. provided that on Sundays and holidays no children shall have the right to cross on said ferry on terms

different from those of any ordinary passenger.

TARIFF

The maximum rate which the purchaser shall have the right to charge be as follows:

8 passenger tickets for 25¢

33 tickets for \$1.00

Each foot passenger paying cash fare, 5¢

Each foot passenger paying tickets fare, 1 ticket.

Each foot passenger between the hours of 9 p. m. and 5 A. M. 10¢ or two tickets.

Each vehicle shall be entitled to have one person accompany it for the tariff prescribed, unless otherwise specified.

Additional passengers accompanying vehicles shall be charged as foot passengers.

For every passenger on horse back or mule back, 10¢ or two tickets.

For every head of cattle, horse or mule, 10¢ or two tickets.

For every hearse, 40¢

For every vehicle drawn by one horse or mule, 20¢

for every two-wheeled vehicle (jumper) one horse 15¢

For every vehicle drawn by two horses or mules, whether loaded or unloaded 30¢

Navy Department, having decided to dismantle the Radio Station at Grand Isle, La., the beginning of last month (April), but through the efforts of Congressman Dupre and Senators Randsell and Broussard and Congressman O'Connor dismantling was ordered postponed by the Honorable Secretary of the Navy, to the 30th day of June, 1922, the end of the current fiscal year: and

Whereas, the Grand Isle Radio Station was originally ordered established as an auxiliary to the U. S. Coast Guard Station No. 214, located at Grand Isle and to furnish weather reports to aid the rapidly

growing important food supplying, fishing and truck farming industries of that place and vicinity, and to furnish timely special storm warnings to prevent loss of life and property; and

Whereas; the Radio Station has numerous and emphatically demonstrated the wisdom of the U. S. Government in having established the same at Grand Isle for its own purposes, as well as those of commercial and humane interests;

Therefore be it resolved that it is the opinion of the members of the Jefferson Parish Police Jury, that the discontinuance of the Grand Isle Radio Station would be an act of misapplied retrenchment, especially in view of the fact that the station was primarily ordered established for humane purposes, and this body most earnestly suggests to the Honorable Secretary of the Navy to provide for permanent postponement of dismantling the Grand Isle Radio Station.

Resolved further, that a copy of this resolution be mailed to each of the members of Congress and the two Senators from Louisiana, and the Secretary of the U. S. Navy and parties at interest.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above resolution the vote resulted as follows:

A donation of \$100 was made to the Jefferson Parish American Legion to defray expenses of Decoration Day, May 30, 1922.

Communication from State Relief Committee and from Mr. Hero were received and parish engineer was instructed to notify Mr. Hero to remove stumps, etc., which were dumped in the ditch paralleling Gretna-Belle Chasse Highways, making drainage sluggish.

Report of Oil Commission was received relative to escaping oil at the National Petroleum Corporation who disowns fault was received and the matter referred to district attorney.

The sum of \$300 was appropriated for expropriation purpose relative to widening road from Gretna to Harvey and engineer to furnish plans and map.

Petition from residents of Metairie Ridge Subdivision asking removal of dairies of Paul Esat, L. Grouch and S. Lapeuyade, due to cattle destroying streets and drainage was received and signers informed to make complaint to State and Parish Health Boards and pound keeper instructed to enforce the

cattle roaming ordinance.

On motion of Mr. Thompson seconded by Mr. Toledano the following ordinance was adopted.

An ordinance relative to the building, erecting or operating of fertilizer or rendering plant or other plants producing nauseating odors and providing for the method of obtaining permission from this Police Jury to erect and operate same.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson at regular meeting assembled, that it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to erect, build or operate any fertilizer

or rendering plant, or any other chemical plant that may create nauseous, disagreeable or obnoxious odors, whether produced from solid, liquid or gaseous matter, and which will tend in any way effect the health and comfort of the residents and inhabitants of the Parish of Jefferson.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that should any person, firm or corporation desire to erect, build or operate any of the plants described in Section 1 of this ordinance, application in writing must first be made to the Police Jury, stating specifically the location and nature of the plant to be operated; said application shall be referred to a special committee of this Police Jury, which committee shall make full investigation of the matter and report back to this Police Jury, and final action shall be taken by this Police Jury on the application filed, and it shall be unlawful to build, erect or operate any such plant described in Section 1, without first obtaining the permission of this Police Jury, in accordance with provisions of this ordinance.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc. that any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance upon conviction before any court of competent jurisdiction shall be liable to a fine not exceeding the sum of \$25 or imprisonment not exceeding 30 days or both at the discretion of the court, provided that each day shall be considered as a separate and distinct offense, and fine and imprisonment or both may be imposed for each and every offense.

Section 4. Be it further ordained etc., that nothing in this ordinance shall be construed as in any manner waiving or limiting the rights of this Police Jury to at any time abate as a public nuisance any plant that may be now operating or which may not have obtained permission from this Police Jury to operate.

Section 5. Be it further ordained, etc., that all ordinances or parts or ordinances in conflict therewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

The above ordinance having been duly considered section by section, and then as a whole is duly adopted section by section, and then as a whole, the vote resulted as follows:

Reading of minutes of previous meeting were dispensed with.
The regular order of business was deferred to allow various persons to address the Jury.

Mr. Deveridge, representing Anderson, Clay & Co., requested that La Barre road be graded and graveled, and the road superintendent was instructed to do the grading, etc.

On request of Chas. Vering the obstructions in Bayou de Familles were ordered by the Jury to be removed in 10 days by August Muller, owner, so that a bridge can be constructed.

Mr. Villars and other complained of cattle roaming and of a vicious bull belonging to Mr. Fagot, with request that the Jury take the matter up. Mr. Fisher said he would endeavor to get Mr. Mehan re-commissioned by the sheriff in order that the law be enforced.

Mr. Deckbar complained of odors and refuse water from Armour Fertilizer Works, and requested that the place be closed as it is a

public nuisance.

Mr. Harrison said that vegetation was dying and people were sick from it.

Mr. Mumphreys made concurring remarks, especially as to fruit trees not bearing.

District Attorney instructed to take action against Armour Fertilizer Co.

Be it resolved that the district attorney be and is hereby instructed to take the necessary steps to close and to keep closed the Armour Fertilizer Works, located at Shrewsbury, until such time as the said works shall have the odor abated, and to suppress the pumping of refuse water in the ditches.

It was resolved the road superintendent be and he is hereby instructed to grade, gravel and dig ditches at 42d street, Metairie Ridge, and place the necessary culverts also.

Capt. Harvey advised the Jury that the U. S. Burglar Alarm ordinance

Knight, his lessees, successors and assigns shall have and possess the right, power and authority to establish and maintain a central office for the purpose of connecting and working with signal boxes and other electrical appliances and apparatus necessary to conduct and operate a general burglar alarm, fire alarm, messenger and night watch signal service, and for this purpose he shall have the right and power to erect poles, string construct and maintain over all streets, highways, byways and place in the Parish of Jefferson, such wires as shall or may be used for the operation of the said business of said party, his lessees, heirs, successors, and assigns, the current to be used upon said wires and conductors to be a light current not to exceed sixty volts and not liable to cause injury, damage, or detriment of any kind.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc. that said party, his heirs, lessees, successors and assigns shall have the right, with the consent of the owners, to attach said wires and conductors on suitable fastening to the side or roof of building or other structures, or to use other existing poles in lieu thereof, if same be found practicable taking all necessary precautions in no manner to injure the building to or on which the said wires may be attached,

provided, however, that any damage done to said property shall be immediately repaired by said party, his lessees, successors and assigns.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc. that the said party, his heirs, lessees, successors and assigns shall be subject, in the stringing of said wires and conductors, to all police regulations in governing the manner of attaching light current wires not to exceed 60 volts on or to the roofs or sides of buildings or other structures where the same are to be used.

Section 4. Be it further ordained, etc. that the privilege granted by this ordinance shall be for the term of twenty five-years from date of promulgation of this ordinance, and that in consideration the said Nathaniel B. Knight, his heirs, lessees, successors, or assigns shall for the term of twenty-five years from the promulgation of this ordinance pay annually to the Parish of Jefferson the sum of on the 1st day of July of each year, commencing on the 1st day of July 1922, and on the 1st day of July of each and every year thereafter, said amount to be paid in cash.

Section 5. Be it further ordained, etc., that the right and privilege and franchise hereby granted shall not be assigned, transferred or set over to any person, firm, association or corporation without the consent of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson is had and obtained.

Section 6. Be it further ordained, etc., that the said Nathaniel B. Knight must accept this ordinance by notarial act passed and executed before a notary within fifteen days after notification by said notary to said Knight to sign the said act: That failure on the part of said Nathaniel B. Knight to do so within said period shall ipso facto avoid annul and set aside this ordinance.

Section 7. Be it further ordained etc., that the president of the Police Jury be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to sign and execute said notarial act on behalf of the Parish of Jefferson.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance, resulted as follows:-

On motion of Mr. Toledano seconded by Mr. Burbank, Messrs. Athen, Toledano, and Thompson were appointed to investigate the complaints of Mr. Keep relative to dust and to L. R. & N Co's, whistle at all hours of the night, also the suggestion of Mr. Smith to abate the dust by the use of oil was referred to the same committee, who are to report at the next meeting of the Jury.

On motion of Mr. Toledano, duly seconded, a voucher for \$25 was ordered to be drawn to pay Madison Edwards, of Kenner, for certain land used for the highways.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann, seconded by Mr. Erlinger the following ordinance was adopted;

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish, that it shall be unlawful to drive any kind of vehicle over and across of the public bridge in this parish at a speed exceeding ten miles and hour.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, that any person violating this ordinance shall, upon trial and conviction before a court of competent

jurisdiction, be fined not less than five dollars and not more than twenty-five dollars, and in default of payment of fine, imprisoned not exceeding thirty days.

The 1st Justice of the Peace reported \$10 collected as fines, which was placed to the credit of the general fund.

Communication from Mr. Otto Katz, president of Fourth Jefferson Drainage District, relative to restraining certain waters from draining into the canal, and closing it at the intersection of Labarre and Metairie roads, was received.

On motion duly seconded it was resolved to send a copy of the parish engineer's report on the subject to the president of the Fourth Jefferson Drainage District.

It was the sense of the Jury that the Commissioner be thanked for having erected a shed at the Jackson avenue car approach.

Communications were received from parish engineer adverse to cleaning of drain ditches at Labarre and Metairie roads; from N. C. Hero relative to balance due on the Gretna-Belle Chasse highways; from sentors and representatives, advising effort to retain Grand Isle Radio station; from the Memorial Committee of ex-service men and D. W. Wiedman Auxiliary thanking Jury for its donation; from Anderson Clayton & Co., relative to the grading of Labarre road; from Mrs. C. Levenberg, for reimbursement on erroneous or dual taxes paid for 1919 tax bill No. 2862 \$47.45, 1920 tax bill No. 3371 \$39.70 1921 tax bill No. 3383 \$39.15, located in 6th ward; from H. L. Zander, parish engineer relative to stakes to be replaced in Cristina Sub-division to the effect that neither maps nor consent from the Jury are in evidence; from Commissioner of Public Safety of New Orleans relative to adjusting pay for fire engines when called to Jefferson requesting that a committee be appointed from Jefferson Parish Board of Equalization, in reference to property inspections in Gretna, Kenner and Metairie Ridge.

On motion of Mr. Erlinger seconded by Mr. Toledano the following ordinance was adopted;

An ordinance authorizing the president of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson to borrow from the Gretna Exchange and Savings Bank the sum of \$31,000.00 with interest at 7% per cent per annum, for the purpose of liquidating the present indebtedness of the Police Jury to the said Gretna Ex.

and Savings Bank, amounting to \$32,000.00 and for the purpose of paying current expenses, and to set aside appropriate out of the first revenues of the year 1922 a sufficient amount to pay this loan together with interest on same.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury, in regular session assembled, that the president be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow from the Gretna Exchange and Savings Bank the sum of \$31,000.00 payable January 3, 1923, at the Gretna Exchange and Savings Bank, with the interest at the rate of 7% per annum from date until paid.

This amount to be used in liquidating the present indebtedness of the Police Jury to the said Gretna Exchange and Savings Bank, and for paying the current expenses of the Police Jury.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that the president be and is hereby authorized to sign the necessary note in order to carry out the provisions of the foregoing section.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that the sum of \$31,000.00 plus the sum necessary to pay the interest on said note, be and the same is hereby set aside and appropriated out of the first revenues of the Police Jury for the year 1922, in order to secure the payment of said note and the interest thereon.

Be it resolved by the Police Jury of Jefferson, in regular session assembled, that the sum of \$1500 be and is hereby ordered transferred from the account of the general fund of the Parish of Jefferson to the account of the general fund of Road District No. 1.

Be it further resolved, etc., that the sum of \$3000 be and is hereby ordered transferred from the account of the general fund of the Parish of Jefferson to the account of the general fund of Road District No. 2

On motion of Mr. Toledano, seconded by Mr. Burbank, the following ordinance was adopted:

Kenner Ferry Franchise

An ordinance to provide the sale of a ferry franchise or lease from the head of Minor Street, in the Town of Kenner, Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, on the east bank of the Mississippi River, to a point on the opposite shore of the Mississippi River, known as South Kenner, in the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, on the west bank of the Mississippi River.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that the president, jointly

with the Town of Kenner, be and they are hereby authorized and directed to advertise according to the law, and to sell at public auction to the highest bidder, for an amount not less than \$100, the lease for operating a ferry or ferries to ply between the head of Minor street in the town of Kenner, Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, on the east bank of the Mississippi River, to a point on the opposite shore known as South Kenner, in the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana on the west bank of the Mississippi River, for a period of 10 years, to begin with and to extend from the date

of the signing by the Mayor of the Town of Kenner and the President of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson and the adjudicate herein and under the terms and conditions herein fixed, of the contract of lease and privilege herein provided for and to be adjudicated.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc; that the condition and specifications to be observed and complied with by the purchaser under the provisions of this ordinance are declared to be as follows:

Kenner Ferry Franchise

The ferry landing on the east bank of the Mississippi River in the Town of Kenner, Parish of Jefferson, shall be at the head of Minor street, or at the option of the purchaser with the consent and approval of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Kenner may be placed at any other street that may be agreed upon and which may be convenient for the grantee and the patrons of said ferry, which space shall always be provided by the Town of Kenner during the continuance of this lease.

The ferry landing on the right bank of the Mississippi River shall be at a point opposite the location of the ferry landing on the left bank, and may be fixed at a point agreeable to the grantee and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson and which may be found most convenient, which space shall always be provided by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, during the continuance of this lease, provided that when one location has been selected no change shall be made on the other bank of the river, except upon the approval of the respective governing authorities of the location on the respective banks of the river.

The party or parties to whom this lease is adjudicated shall maintain in good repair and condition during the continuance of this lease, all bridges, landings and approaches thereto on each side of the river as always to provide convenient and safe landing for the boats and proper connections to shore for both passengers and vehicles.

The pontoons or floating wharves are to be maintained in a strong and substantial manner and whenever they have deteriorated to such an extent as to be unsafe they

shall be replaced by new ones, which shall be built of such dimensions and in such manner and according to such plans as will meet with approval of the proper officials of the governing authorities having jurisdiction over the landing.

The connections between the pontoons against which the boats shall land and the shore for passengers and vehicles shall always be of such construction as will admit of the slope at extreme high or low water to be such as will meet the approval of the public officials having supervisions over the landings.

These inclines are to be as easy as the conditions existing at the points will permit.

If gangways are used for vehicles and passengers, the same shall be of dimensions as will respectively take care of both vehicles and passengers.

Purchaser shall, during continuance of this lease, maintain in good order and condition all other existing improvements and make such improvements from time to time for the landing of the boats and the convenience of vehicle and passenger traffic as may be necessary to meet and satisfy modern requirements.

The purchaser shall be bound to provide and maintain at his own expense a sufficient number of lights on the approaches, gangways, landings, etc.,

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Kenner shall have supervision over the ferry landing in the Town of Kenner and the Police Jury of

Jefferson Parish shall have supervision over the ferry landings in South Kenner on west bank of the river.

The approaches to the landings on both sides of the river shall be maintained and kept up at the expense of the purchaser and the purchaser binds and obligates himself not to interfere with the roadways presently existing on the land side of and running parallel with the levees.

The purchaser shall be bound to run, or cause to be run, during the hours hereinafter mentioned, one good steam or gasoline ferryboat, which shall have a capacity of not less than 25 tons burden (United States Maritime Measurement) and is to be constructed and maintained in every respect safe and suitable for first class service.

The purchaser shall be bound to operate a boat on the following schedule wind, weather, and traffic permitting:

From 5.30 o'clock a. m. until 8.30 o'clock p. m., every 30 minutes, so as to make not less than one crossing each way of the river every hour, the last boat under schedule to leave South Kenner side of the river at 8.30 o'clock p. m.

The purchaser shall hold himself responsible as a common carrier not only to the Town of Kenner and the Parish of Jefferson, but to all persons who may be grieved at his non-compliance with the above stipulations and such parties may bring suit in any court of competent jurisdiction for the full amount of damages resulting from failure on the part of purchaser.

The maximum rates which the purchaser shall have the right to charge

shall be as follows, to-wit:

Each foot passenger, 10 cents.

Each vehicle shall be entitled to have one person accompanying it for the tariff herein after mentioned unless otherwise specified; additional persons accompanying the vehicle, unless herein after expected, shall be charged as foot passengers.

For each passenger on horseback or muleback, both inclusive, 25 cents; for each head of cattle, horse or mule, 25 cents; where two or more are ferried across belonging to the same person, 20 cents; per head; for every hearse 60¢; for every vehicle drawn by one horse or mule 30 cents; for every loaded float or cotton wagon 80 cents; for every vehicle, except a loaded float or cotton wagon drawn by two horses or horse kind, whether loaded or unloaded 50 cents; for every vehicle, except a loaded float or cotton wagons drawn by three or more horses or horse kind, whether loaded or unloaded, 80 cents; all oxen drawn vehicles, whether loaded or unloaded, 80 cents; for every two wheel vehicle loaded with lumber 30 cents; for every automobile or runabout occupied and accommodating two persons, 30 cents. for every automobile, retail delivery wagon, 30 cents; for every automobile, with tonneau, occupied and accommodating four persons, 50 cents; for every automobile, with tonneau, occupied and accommodating more than five passengers, 75 cents; for every 1-ton truck, 50 cents; for every 1½ ton truck, 50 cents; for every 2-ton truck, 80 cents; for every 2½ ton truck, 80 cents; for every 3-ton truck 80 cents; for every truck over three tons and not over five tons, \$1.00.

School children, during school days, between the hours 6 a. m. and 6 p. m. shall be admitted free of charge.

The purchaser shall have the privilege to charge one fare and a half for all foot passengers, vehicles, automobiles or trucks crossing between the hours of 8.30 p. m. and 5.30 a. m.

For every sack of coffee, salt, flour, potatoes, buckwheat, barley, beans,

wheat, corn, oats, cornmeal, turnips, apples, etc., or on articles in sacks, bags or boxes, not exceeding three cubic feet, box of dry goods or merchandise, not over three and not exceeding ten cubic feet 10 cents; for every loaded barrel 10 cents; for every empty barrel 5 cents; all boilers or heavy machinery by contract; for every tierce of rice, meat, etc., 30 cents; for every bale bundle of empty sacks 15 cents; for every loaded half-barrel 10 cents; for every empty half-barrel 5 cents, for goats, sheep, or hogs 10 cents; for every trunk 15 cents; for grate, furnaces or chimneys for same 10 cents; for 5 gallon can or demijohn 10 cents; for every crate of earthen ware or such kind 50 cents; for every wheel-barrow, loaded or unloaded, 20 cents; for small article carried by passengers in their hands, no charge will be made.

Articles not enumerated, corresponding rates may be charged, and for heavy spars, machinery, boilers etc., of unusual dimensions or weight, such prices as may be agreed upon.

For tubs, buckets or measures 10 cents; for small packages not enumerated a charge of 5 cents will be made and purchasers shall receipt and be responsible for same.

No freight shall be delivered aboard boat weighing over 500 pounds, and the lease shall have the right to refuse to receive any freight which would delay the ferry and prevent the keeping of the schedule. The owner of any vehicle shall have the right to ride thereon with his driver, without any extra charge.

All freight delivered aboard boat shall be removed by the owner or consignee within twelve hours after same has been delivered aboard the vessel, and should said freight remain on said boat after the above specified time, double charge shall be made by the leasee and same may be removed from the boat and held at risk of the owner.

The purchaser shall always carry to and from free of charge, charity wagons, fire engines, firemen of Kenner, Westwego and Gretna fire departments when in actual discharge of their duty: the Mayor, Members of the Board of Aldermen, Secretary, Tax Collector, Marshal, Deputy Marshals, City Attorney and special officers of the Town of Kenner, the Sheriff, Coroner and Parish health officers, clerk of court, assessors and Members of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson and the sheriff's deputies when accompanied by a letter from the said sheriff, and employee of the Town of Kenner, when accompanied by letter from the Mayor of the Town.

The exclusive rights of the ferry shall embrace the dividing line between the parishes of Jefferson and St. Charles the upper line of the Village of Harahan on the eastbank of the Mississippi River and the dividing line of the parishes of Jefferson and St. Charles and the lower line of the Jefferson Planting Manufacturing Company's "Willswood" Plantation on the right bank of the Mississippi River.

The privilege of operating this ferry to be sold by the Mayor of the Town of Kenner and the president of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson Democrat at public auction in front of the Town Hall of the Town of Kenner, on a day to be fixed and agreed upon by the Mayor of the Town of Kenner and the president of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson.

All parties desiring to bid for this lease, before being eligible to do so shall first deposit with the Mayor of Kenner the sum of \$50 in United States currency or in certified check, which amount shall be forfeited in case the franchise is not accepted, said deposit to be used for the purpose of defraying the expense of advertising and drafting of this franchise and to insure the signing

of the contract, and in the event of the signing of the lease by the successful bidder the amount deposited by the accepted bidder shall be credited in his bid, the successful bidder being allowed 20 days after the date of adjudication within which to sign notarial contract of the acceptance of this franchise.

The cost of advertising of this franchise shall be borne by the successful bidder, it being understood that the governing authorities shall have the right to apply the proceeds of the deposit made for this purpose without any further authority.

No sale of the lease herein proposed shall be executed until approved by both the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Kenner and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, the governing authorities of

both reserving the right to reject any and all bids.

The accepted purchaser shall pay to the Town of Kenner and the Parish of Jefferson in cash the whole amount if the price of adjudication does not exceed \$200 or one-half of the adjudicated price of the lease if the price exceeds \$200, to be equally divided between the said Town of Kenner and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, and for the balance of the price of the adjudication the adjudicatee or accepted purchaser shall make and execute his 6 notes of equal denominations, two of which shall mature and be made payable annually for a period of 3 yrs. said notes to bear interest at the rate of 6 per cent per annum from date of maturity until paid, 3 of which said notes shall be payable to the Town of Kenner and the remaining 3 notes to the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson; 3 of said notes maturing annually for the said period of 3 years to be delivered to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen and made payable to the Town of Kenner, and the other 3 notes maturing annually for the said period of 3 years, to be delivered to the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson and made payable to its order, provided that the adjudicatee shall have the right and option of paying the entire price of adjudication in cash at the time of signing the contract without the necessity of furnishing notes, in which event the money so paid shall be divided equally between the Town of Kenner and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson.

The accepted bidder shall not have the right to sub-lease, transfer or assign his right without the consent of the Town of Kenner and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson.

The accepted bidder is required to comply with the terms of his bid and to sign the contract within ten days after he is notified by the City Attorney and Notary of the Town of Kenner, before whom the notarial contract of lease and privilege must be signed for the acceptance of his bids and that the notarial act is ready for execution and signing.

The successful bidder shall have gangways, pontoons and all shore connections completed and the boat in operation within 90 days from and after the signing of the contract.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance, the vote resulted as follows:-

The Police Jury met this day in regular session:

Strehle, A. Samuel, E. M. Conzelmann, Hugh P. Burbank, A. H. Ahten, W. S. Thompson, W. R. Toledano.

The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was dispensed with.

The regular order of business was deferred to allow various persons to address the Jury.

On complaint of residents of Metairie section against poundkeeper Noveh, Mr. Thompson was instructed to investigate the matter and report at the next meeting of the Jury.

After the complaint of Mr. Deckbar and letters from the Dist. Attny. and Armour Fertilizer Works, the Jury by resolution of Mr. Toledano seconded by Mr. Thompson, instructed the district attorney to institute abatement proceeding against the said Armour Fertilizer Works.

Judge Fleury requested reimbursement of erroneous assessments for 1919 and 1920 collected by the parish from the Jefferson Planting and Manufacturing Co., for \$506.38 and as governing authority of Road District No. 2 for the years 1919 and 1920 in the sum of \$340.77. The matter was referred to the district attorney for adjustment.

The finance committee report was received and approved.

The report of the treasurer was received read, adopted.

Mr. Pratsman, appeared on behalf of the N. O. Gravel Co., asking for the advance of more funds in order to enable the Co., to deliver more gravel. His request was refused, and he acknowledged to the jury that the Company could no longer deliver gravel and gave up the contract.

The District Attorney gave an opinion the Jury could forfeit the contract and go to the bonding company for the completion of contract.

On motion duly seconded the president appointed Messrs. Conzelmann, Samuel, and Toledano as a committee with full power to abrogate said contract to the best advantages.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Samuel, the following ordinance was adopted.

An ordinance fixing the limit of speed at which automobiles may be driven through towns and villages and on the public highways outside of villages and public bridges of this parish and to prohibit the use of spot lights.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury that hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to drive or operate an automobile on the public roads which traverse any town or village in the parish at a greater speed than 15 miles per hour.

SECTION 2. Be it further ordained by the Police

Committee to abrogate contract of N.O. Gravel Co.

Regulating the speed of automobiles on Highways and bridges, outside of towns and

villages and repeal of all ordinances in conflict.

Jury that it shall be unlawful hereafter for any person, firm or corporation to drive or operate an automobile on the public roads, except through villages and towns of this parish, at a greater speed than 25 miles per hour.

SECTION 3. Be it further ordained etc., that it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to operate or run an automobile over the public bridges of the parish at a greater speed than 10 miles per hour.

SECTION 4. Be it further ordained etc., that from and after the passage of this ordinance it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to operate an automobile in this parish to use or operate what is commonly known as a spotlight

SECTION 5. Be it further ordained, that any person found guilty by a court of competent jurisdiction, of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than \$5.00 and not more than \$25.00 or be imprisoned for a term not more than 30 days.

SECTION 6. Be it further ordained, that the person making the affidavits, except a duly commissioned and paid deputy sheriff, shall upon trial and conviction of a violation of this ordinance receive and be paid all of the fines assessed and collected from violators, to an amount not exceeding \$200.00 a month.

SECTION 7. Be it further ordained etc., that all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and they are hereby repealed.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance the vote resulted as follows:

Mr. Geo A. Cox, on motion duly seconded, was reappointed parish printer for the term of one year, beginning July 1st. 1922.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann, seconded by Mr. Burbank the following was adopted

An ordinance relative to the bringing of tick infested cattle, horses, or mules from quarantine areas or other places into the Parish of Jefferson; relative to the roaming of tick infested cattle, horses or mules at large; providing for the impounding of tick infested cattle and authorizing the inspector to mark or brand cattle that have been dipped.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in regular meeting assembled that it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or

TICK ordinance and Impounding infected cattle, horses or mules

corporation to bring into the Parish of Jefferson any infested cattle, horses, or mules or to bring any cattle, horses or mules from any quarantined areas without having first obtained a certificate from the cattle inspector in the parish from which the cattle, horses or mules are brought showing that said cattle, horses or mules had been dipped as required by law, which said certificate shall be delivered to to the inspector of the Parish of Jefferson.

SECTION 2. Be it further ordained etc., that it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to allow any tick infected cattle, horses or mules to roam at large on the public highways or commons, and outside a fence or enclosure.

SECTION 3. Be it further ordained etc., that it shall be the right for any person and the duty of the inspector of the Parish of Jefferson to impound any found roaming at large outside any fence enclosure, and any person driving said infected cattle, horses or mules to the pound shall be entitled to receive the sum of \$5.00 for each head of cattle, horse or mule so impounded, and the pound keeper shall be entitled to charge 50 cents per day for every day said animals are maintained at the pound, and if said animals are not claimed within 5 days or the owner of said animals is unknown it shall be the duty of the pound keeper to report this fact to the Justice of the Peace having jurisdiction over the territo-

ry in which the cattle are impounded and the said Justice of the Peace shall advertise the sale of said cattle, horses or mules in two issues, of the official journal of the Parish of Jefferson and shall sell said animals at public auction, and after deducting all the cost and expense, the balance, if any, shall be paid over to the treasurer of the Parish of Jefferson.

SECTION 4. Be it further ordained etc., that the cattle inspector of the Parish of Jefferson shall have the right and authority to mark or brand all cattle horses or mules in order to identify same, so as to determine wether or not said cattle, horses or mules have been properly dipped according to law.

SECTION 5. Be it further ordained, etc., that any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance upon conviction before any court of competent jurisdiction shall be liable to a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$25.00, or imprisonment not exceeding 30 days or both fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court.

The above ordinance having been duly considered section by section and then as a whole was duly adopted section by section and as a whole and the roll being called on the adoption of said ordinance, the vote resulted as follows:

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann, seconded by Mr. Samuel, the following ordinance was adopted:

Be it ordained that the Police Jury accepts the ferry franchise as per Calendar 7153, relative to the Louisiana Avenue ferry, and as per Calender 7154, relative to the Naopleon Avenue ferry, as adopted by the Commission Council of the City of New Orleans, and to advise said Commission Council of the action taken by the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish.

On motion of Mr. Thompson seconded by Mr. Toledano the following ordinance was adopted:

Sheet No. 2586, 4th ward, International Harvester Co., of America. J. D. Miller, attorney, requested a reduction on land from \$55,000 to \$40,000. On motion duly seconded it was resolved that the Police Jury recommend a remaking of total value \$44,000.

Sheet No. 2697, 4th ward, Manhattan Real Estate Co. Frank Soule, attorney, requested a reduction on land to extent of \$6,000. On motion of Mr. Erlinger; duly seconded, it was resolved that the Police Jury recommend a decrease as requested, reducing values to \$24,000.

Sheet No. 1431, 3rd ward, Gulf Refining Co. of La. J. Hammermann, Jr., requested a decrease and asked that a \$100,000 valuation be placed. On motion of Mr. Samuel duly seconded, it was resolved that the Police Jury make no recommendation.

Sheet No. 3782, 3rd ward, American Creosote Works, S. C. Braselman requested a decrease on merchandise, placed on report through error, which was intended for \$22,500, but was placed by the commission at \$32,500, making an increase by error of \$10,000 for which the company asks to recommend that the proper value be placed at \$22,500. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson that the president, jointly with the Town of Kenner, be and they are hereby authorized and directed to advertise according to law, and to sell at public auction to the highest bidder, for an amount not less than \$100, the lease operating a ferry or ferries to ply between the head of Minor street in the Town of Kenner, Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, on the east bank of the Mississippi River, to a pontoon on the opposite shore known as South Kenner, in the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, on the west bank of the Mississippi, for a period of 20 years, to begin with and to extend from the date of the signing of the Mayor of the Town of Kenner and the President of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, and the adjudication herein and under the terms and conditions herein fixed, of the contract of lease and privilege herein provided for and to be adjudicated.

Sale of Kenner Ferry Franchise

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 2. Be it further ordained that the President is further authorized and empowered to execute in favor of said Jefferson Trust and Saving Bank a note or certificate of indebtedness for the amount hereinabove set forth, together with the interest due or to become due thereon.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that for the payment of the amount thus borrowed and the notes or certificate executed as herein provided, the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson hereby dedicates, appropriates and sets aside the sum \$8000 out of the taxes and revenues of the Parish of Jefferson, for the year 1922, together with such further sum as may be necessary to pay the interest on said amount.

Section 2. Be it further ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson that any person or persons, firm or corporation desiring to conduct, maintain or operate a roadhouse, cabaret, dance hall or dance pavillion shall first give public notice in the official journal of the Parish of Jefferson for two weeks prior to making application for permission to the Police Jury of his intention to apply for permission, and a certificate from the Printer certifying to the fact that notice has been given shall accompany the application of person or persons, firm or corporation coming within the provision of this ordinance.

Sec. 3. Be it further ordained that any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, and that the operation, maintaining and conducting of a road house, cabaret, dancehall or dance pavillion on each and every day shall constitute a separate offense and punishable as a separate and new offense.

Resignation of Max Charbonnet as traffic officer for the east bank was accepted.

Communication from Board of State Engineers, of dates Aug. 14 and Aug. 31, was received and read.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Samuel, it was resolved that in reference to a letter of State Board of Engineers, giving an outline of the road to be constructed in front of Penick and Ford's plant.

Be it resolved, that it be to the parish engineer and Mr. Roussell, the road superintendent, they to receive an opinion from the district attorney, as to where the burden of cost, as to the purchase of the right of way for the construction of said road; they in turn to report their findings at the next meeting of the jury.

The president appointed the following committee to take up with the Sewerage and Water Board the 17th Street Canal bridge matter; Messrs. Thompson, Toledano, Conzelmann, the parish engineer and the district attorney.

Communications were received from Mr. Westerfield as follows; relative to rerouting the Shrewsbury and Napoleon avenue street car lines; from Harry K. Johnson relative to supplying power to 17th Street Canal pumping station, secretary being instructed to advise him that the parish did not have any contract, and that the City of Orleans was for it; from United States Fidelity and Guaranty Company attorney in fact John J. McGrath, relative to the cancellation of the bond furnished by the New Orleans Gravel Co., for the delivery of gravel, was read and referred to the next meeting.

Resolution from the Louisiana Tax Commission, denying all

recommendations as made by the Jury as a board of review, except as to cancellation of Dumbar & Dukate's erroneous assessment of water craft.

The parish engineer reported that J. A. Gaudet was empowered to lay drain pipes in Metairie Bayou without a permit and the pipes laid are not to grade and must be taken out and relaid to grade fixed by parish engineer, which can be obtained upon request.

On motion duly seconded the secretary was instructed to write to Mr. Gaudet that pipes laid without permit and not to grade in Metairie Bayou, must be taken up and relaid according to grade; also that secretary write to Mr. Chas.

Root, constable, to ascertain if any one is laying pipes in said Bayou, without approval of parish engineer, and to notify parties to procure grade and approval of engineer.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Burbank the following was adopted:

AN ORDINANCE.

An ordinance to authorize the president, on behalf of the Police Jury, to borrow from the Jefferson Trust and Savings Bank, the sum of \$15,000 and such additional sum as may be necessary to pay the interest on said amount to pay the current expenses of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1922, authorizing the execution of a note or certificate of indebtedness in favor of said bank for said amount and appropriating, dedicating and setting aside the said amount of principal and interest out of taxes and revenues of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1922, to pay the amount borrowed with the interest.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in regular session assembled, that the President be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow from the Jefferson Trust and Savings Bank, on behalf of this Police Jury, the sum of \$15,000, and such additional sum as may be necessary to pay the interest due or to become due on said amount, for the purpose of paying current expenses of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1922.

Be it further resolved that the sum of \$1,400 be and is hereby ordered transferred from the general fund of the parish to the credit of the general fund of Road District No. 3.

At the request of Mr. M. B. Kostmayer the parish engineer was instructed to lay lines for a sidewalk on Metairie Road. And the Road Superintendent instructed to move fence to line made by the engineer.

Mr. H. L. Harry called the Jury's attention to the dust on Metairie Road and the bad condition of the Seventeenth Street Canal Bridge.

Communications from the New Orleans Gravel Co., and the U. S. Fidelity and Guaranty Co. surety.

On motion of Mr. Samuel seconded by Mr. Thompson the following ordinance was adopted:

Whereas, this Police Jury has received writ of notification from the New Orleans Gravel Co., Inc. and the United States Fidelity and Guaranty Co. surety on the bond furnished by the New Orleans Gravel Co. Inc., under the terms and provisions of contract entered into on the 22nd. day of July, 1922, wherein the Police Jury bound itself to purchase gravel from the said New Orleans Gravel Co. Inc. and the Gravel Company agreed to purchase the excess revenue bonds of the Parish of Jefferson and the said surety company guaranteeing the faithful performance of the contract on behalf of said gravel Company, and

WHEREAS, the said Gravel Company and the said surety company have notified this Police Jury they are ready and willing and consent to the cancellation of said contract.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, at regular meeting assembled that the said contract entered into between the Police Jury and said Gravel Company and said surety company, be and the same is hereby cancelled and set aside, and the Police Jury given the right to dispose of the balance of said bonds amounting to the Sum of \$6000.

The above ordinance having been duly considered, was duly adopted and the roll being called the vote resulted as follows:

Cancellation of the New Orleans Gravel Co. Inc. contract

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Erlinger, the following was adopted:

WHEREAS, the contract heretofore existing between this Police Jury and the New Orleans Gravel Company, for the purchase of excess revenue bonds have been this day cancelled, and there is now on hand excess revenue bonds amounting to the sum of \$6000.

Therefore, be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, at regular meeting assembled that notice of the intention of this Police Jury to sell said bonds under the law for not less than 90 cents on the dollar and accrued interest be advertised in the Jefferson Democrat, the official journal of the Parish of Jefferson.

Be it further ordained, etc, that the President and Secretary of this Police Jury be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to advertise for sealed bids for the purchase of said \$6000 excess revenue bonds, said bids to be received in open meeting at 12:00 noon, November 8, 1922, at the Court House, Gretna, La.

Each bidder to deposit with his bid a certified check for the amount of one hundred and fifty dollars \$150, to guarantee the faithful performance of the bid.

The above ordinance having been considered, was duly adopted, and the roll called on the adoption of same, the vote resulted as follows:

Whereas, this Police Jury, did on the 8th day of March 1922, grant to one Allen H. Johness, his successors and assigns, a franchise to construct, maintain and operate a light, heat and power system and to generate, vend and distribute electric energy in the Parish of Jefferson, and

Whereas, the Police Jury has this day been advised in writing by the said Allen H. Johness, that he desires to transfer all of his rights, title and interest in and to the said franchise to the Citizens Light and Power Company, of the City of New Orleans, which said company is here present accepting all of the rights and the obligations of the said Allen H. Johness, under said franchise,

therefore, be it ordained, by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular

meeting assembled that consent and approval is hereby granted to the said Allen H. Johness, to transfer, assign and deliver all of his rights, title and interest in and to the aforesaid franchise to the Citizens Light & Power company of the City of New Orleans, the said Citizens Light & Power Company to assume all obligations of the said Allen H. Johness, under said franchise.

The above ordinance having been considered, was duly adopted, and

the roll being called on the adoption of same, the vote resulted as follows:

Ordinance providing the sale of Water Franchise 8th. w.

An ordinance providing for the sale of Water Franchise:

On motion of Mr. Ahten seconded by Mr. Burbank:

Providing for the sale at public auction of a franchise for supply water and water power in the 7th, 8th and 9th wards of the Parish of Jefferson.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson that a franchise be offered for sale for the purpose of supplying in the 7th, 8th and 9th wards of the Parish of Jefferson, water and water power for domestic and commercial purposes and for public consumption: said franchise shall be sold at public auction at the Courthouse door at Gretna La., said sale to be preceded by public advertising once a week for 30 days in a newspaper published in the Parish of Jefferson and that the sale shall be conducted by the President of this Police Jury.

Section 2, Be it further ordained, etc., that said franchise shall be adjudicated to the highest bidder, terms cash, payable at the execution of the Notarial Act in confirmation of said adjudication to be prepared and signed by the President of the Police Jury and the purchaser within 30 days after the adjudication. The purchaser shall also deposit with the President of the Police Jury at the time of the adjudication of said franchise, a check for Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars, drawn on a solvent bank in the City of New Orleans, or Parish of Jefferson, made payable to the order of the Police Jury and certified by said bank which check shall be held undeposited until the execution of the Notarial Act aforesaid, and upon such execution said check shall be returned to the purchaser, endorsed by the President of Police Jury. Should the purchaser fail to execute the Notarial Act aforesaid in confirmation of adjudication, the said certified check shall be forfeited to the Police Jury as liquidated damages and in lieu of all further rights, claims or demands against the adjudicatee which by law or otherwise may result from said adjudication.

The President of the Police Jury is authorized to do any and all things necessary to convey a valid title of this franchise to grantee.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that the price of said franchise, when paid in cash at the time of the completion of the adjudication aforesaid, shall belong to the general fund of the Parish of Jefferson,

and shall be paid over to the Parish Treasurer to the credit of the said account.

Section 4. Be it further ordained, etc., that the right of way and all use of is hereby granted to the purchaser of said franchise of all streets, roads, and highways and public places in the 7th, 8th and 9th wards of the Parish of Jefferson, for the purpose of constructing therein and erecting thereon all the means and facilities, pipe line, pipes, mains, and other appurtenances needed for the maintenance and operation of said franchise.

Section 5. Be it further ordained, etc., that the purchaser shall within 45 days after the date of said Notarial Act accept said franchise designate to the Police Jury the location of the first route to be laid out by it for the purpose of operating under this franchise and the Parish Engineer shall survey the route and give lines and levels therefor if so requested by the grantee. The purchaser shall begin the construction of the routes so designated within 30 days after such designation: upon failure to begin work 90 days after said designation, as aforesaid, the grantee may pay to the Parish the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty (250.00) Dollars at the discretion of the Police Jury for an additional 60 days extension within which to begin work; upon his failure to obtain said extension his rights under this franchise shall be forfeited without any other default except a notice from the Police Jury. The purchaser after designating the first route shall at his discretion from time to time thereafter designate such additional routes as may be required for the operation of this franchise and shall proceed to the construction of same in the manner hereinafter provided for. He shall also use his discretion as to the necessity of laying laterals or making any extension from main auxiliary lines, which laterals do not have to be submitted to the Police Jury.

Failure to designate the first route within the period herein prescribed or to obtain the additional extension, if desired, in the manner above stipulated, or make payment provided, shall operate ipso facto as a forfeiture of this franchise without the necessity of putting the grantee in default save except by notice from the Police Jury upon said notice all payments made by the grantee for said franchise or its extension shall be forfeited to the Police Jury Parish of Jefferson, and the grantee exempted from any further liability in the premises. The grantee will be entitled to delays, actually caused by conditions beyond his control such as strikes, delays railroad transporting material, etc.

Section 6. Be it ordained, etc. that all excavations shall be done in workman like manner and the surface restored to its previous condition by the grantee.

Section 7. Be it further ordained, etc., that this franchise shall exist in favor of the purchaser or assigns and successors, etc., for the period of 50 years from and after the date of the Notarial Act as aforesaid; at the expiration thereof or during this said period, the said grantee shall have the right to remove the plant, pipes or improvements which it had constructed should it decide to abandon said franchise, in which case the said franchise and the right thereunder shall revert to the Parish of Jefferson without any compensation to the grantee or his assigns.

Section 8. Be it further ordained, etc., that the right is

conferred upon the purchaser of the said franchise to sell water power to all consumers of the same for domestic, commercial and public purposes upon such rates and prices as shall enable the purchaser to earn a fair profit upon the investment made by him and to provide for a sinking fund for the maintenance of the plant etc., and for the retirement of any bonds or other indebtedness of the purchaser incurred in the building, operation and maintenance of the same.

Section 9. Be it further ordained, etc., that the purchaser of said franchise shall have the right to transfer, assign, sell and

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convey the said franchise to any person or corporation undertaking to fulfill the obligations of this franchise and said obligation shall rest upon such transfer assignee or purchaser without recourse to the Parish of Jefferson by the adjudicatee.

Section 10. Be it further ordained, etc., that the right is granted to the purchaser to create a corporation for the purpose of receiving the transfer and assignment of the franchise and to accept same upon the terms and conditions named in the preceding section, and purchaser, or any transferee or assignee of same shall have the right to execute a mortgage upon the said franchise, plant, pipe lines, mains or other appurtenances to secure any bonds, notes indebtedness of said parties.

Section 11. Be it further ordained, etc., that fire hydrants shall be placed at such points designated by the Police Jury on the line under construction or in operation, the cost of hydrants and their installation and construction to be at the expense of the Parish of Jefferson, a flat rate, yearly, to be made to the Police Jury of the Parish Jefferson for the right to use the water through any of said hydrants for fire or other public purposes along their line.

Section 12. Be it further ordained, etc., that this ordinance shall take effect from and after the promulgation of same.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance, the vote resulted as follows:

Yeas - Erlinger, Strehle, Samuel, Conzelmann, Athen, Thompson, Toledano.

Nays - None.

Permission was granted The Gulf Refining Co. to build storage tank provided same met with approval of the Oil Commission.

The Jury requested the Red Cross Chapter to have public health nurse to make a monthly report to Jury and state why a local nurse could not be employed.

District attorney asked the Jury to purchase a civil code.

Report of Grand Jury was received.

The sum of \$10 was received from 1st Justice of Peace for fines collected.

Miss Idella Lehmann was given Normal School scholarship.

James Morales was appointed traffic officer for right bank of Mississippi River.

On motion of Mr Samuel seconded by Mr. Erlinger the following ordinance was adopted:

An ordinance to authorize the president, on behalf of the Police

Jury to borrow from the Jefferson Trust and Saving Bank, the sum \$7000.00 and such additional sum as may be necessary to pay the interest on said amount, pay the current expenses of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1922.

Authorizing the executing of a note or certificate of indebtedness in favor of said bank and amount and appropriation, dedicating and setting aside amount of principal and interest out of the taxes and revenues of the Parish of Jefferson for the year of 1922, to pay the amount borrowed with the interest.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in regular session assembled, that the President be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow from the Jefferson Trust and Saving Bank the sum of \$7,000 and such additional sum as may be necessary to pay the interest due or to become due on said amount for the purpose of paying the current expenses of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1922.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that the President is further authorized and empowered to execute in favor of said Jefferson Trust and Savings Bank a note or certificate of indebtedness for the amount herein above set forth, together with the interest due or to become due thereon.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that for the payment of the amount thus borrowed and the notes or certificates executed as herein provided, the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish hereby dedicates, appropriates and sets aside the sum of \$7,000 out of the taxes and revenues of the Parish of Jefferson for the Year 1922, together with further sum as may be necessary to pay the interest on said amount.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance the vote resulted as follows:

On motion duly seconded the sum of \$1500 was transferred from the general fund to Road District No. 1 fund. The sum of \$800 was transferred from the general fund to Road District No. 2 fund. The sum of \$150 was transferred from the general fund to freight fund of Road District No. 3.

The secretary was instructed to request the Planters' and manfg. Co. to reimburse Jury to amount of \$80.47, sheriffs commission on taxes erroneously collected for years 1920 and 1921.

The treasurer was given full power to place all insurance on parish property with lowest bidder.

The Jury then adjourned.

On motion of Mr. Strehle, seconded by Mr. Ahten, the following ordinance was adopted

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Authorizing William J. Fleury, his heirs, successors, hereinafter called grantee, to construct maintain, and operate a light, heat, and power system, and to generate, vend and distribute electric energy in the Parish of Jefferson, and to describe the method of exercise of this privilege.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana, in regular meeting assembled that W. J. Fleury, his heirs, successors and assigns, shall have and he is hereby granted the right, power and authority to establish, erect on, in, over and through the streets, highways, lanes, alleys, railroads and railways, canals, and public places, in the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana, all such poles, wires conductors, conduits, cables and other construction, as shall be or may become necessary and the same to locate, relocate and change, to carry out the objects and purposes of said grantee, and of the grant and privilege herein created, and to extend the same as may be required for electric lights and a system of lighting by electricity and of transmission of electric energy and to furnish electrical power in the Parish of Jefferson and to supply the demand therefor as the same may now or hereafter exist, arise or increase subject to the limitation and conditions in this ordinance contained, provided that this grant be limited to the term of twenty-five (25) years.

SECTION 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that the grantee may, and if required by the Police Jury shall make and file with the Secretary of the same, blueprints of the routes established by it and of any changes made thereon.

Section 3. Be it further ordained etc., that all lines of wires, poles, masts, cables, landing of the shore end of all cables, and construction shall be located and constructed so as not to obstruct unreasonably the public use of the streets and public places, or to interfere with commerce or travel, nor in such close proximity to buildings as to endanger them or the occupants thereof.

SECTION 4. Be it further ordained etc., that all work undertaken for the purposes of this privilege and involving the tearing up of streets and highways or in other ways interfering with traffic thereon, or their use by the public, shall be done by the grantee under the supervision of the Parish Engineer, and when completed, the grantee shall restore such premises to

their previous condition within a time specified by said engineer and failure to begin work on such restoration within three days after written notice so to do, shall authorize the Police Jury to restore the same at the cost and expense of the grantee.

SECTION 5. Be it further ordained etc., that the grantee shall begin work in the section between Harvey Canal and the lower limits of the Parish of Jefferson within one year from the acceptance of this ordinance by him by notarial act, delays due to unforeseen circumstances or matters not within the control of the grantee to be excepted therefrom.

SECTION 6. Be it further ordained etc., that the charges to be made by grantee for electricity for lighting purposes shall not be more than eleven cents (11) per kilowatt hour with a discount of ten per cent (10%) to be allowed for cash settlement within ten days after date of bill; the consumer to guarantee to pay a monthly service charge of twenty-five cents (25¢) for each meter connected.

Grantee shall also have the right to charge and collect from each consumer a service charge of one dollar (\$1.00) per month for electricity furnished even though his bill at the rate above specified would not amount to one dollar, this extra charge being allowed to cover meter installation, expense and service of the grantee holding himself in readiness to furnish electricity to consumers.

The charge for electricity when used for power shall not be more than five and a half cents (5½¢) per kilowatt hour. Upon installation having a maximum demand of twenty-five electrical horse power or less, there shall be a minimum charge of fifty cents (50¢) per month for each electrical horse power installed, and for installation having a demand in excess of twenty-five electrical horse power, said charge shall be fixed by contract and agreement between grantee and consumer.

SECTION 7. Be it further ordained etc., that the grantee shall indemnify and save harmless the Parish of Jefferson from all suits and actions that may be instituted against it by reason of any injury or alleged injury to the person or property of another resulting from negligence or on account of any act of commission or omission on the part of said grantee.

SECTION 8. Be it further ordained etc., that if anything in the provisions of this ordinance should result in injury to private property or be in conflict with any right or privilege heretofore lawfully granted by the Parish of Jefferson to any person or company, the grantee by his acceptance of this ordinance binds himself to hold said Parish harmless from all damages or declamation whatsoever arising therefrom.

SECTION 9. Be it further ordained etc., that wherever in this ordinance the word "grantee" is used, it shall be and is intended thereby to include and shall always be construed to include the grantee, his heirs, successors and assigns.

Pledge of \$1500.00. A. and M. School at Hope Haven Farm.

The jury pledged \$1,500.00 to A. M. School at Hope Haven Farm on the request of Rev. P. M. H. Wyhoven provided the \$100,000.00 pledge by parties is accepted by the American Bank and Trust Company as responsible, on or before March 31, 1923, otherwise said pledge is null and void. This to be made in three yearly payments.

On the request of Capt. James Dinkins, the sum of \$300.00, was donated by the jury to defray expenses of the Confederate Veterans Re-Union at New Orleans in April 1923.

The Library Bureau offered to do the indexing of the Mortgage office under a certain plan from Jany. 1, 1922 to Dec. 31st., 1923, inclusive and to complete work and furnish the books and material within four months from date of contract for the sum of \$4050.00.

On motion of Mr. Erlinger, seconded by Mr. Toledano:

POLICE ROOM JEFFERSON PARISH
Gretna La, March 7, 1923

The Police Jury met this day in regular session.

Members present - Jules G. Fisher, president; F. Erlinger, W. E. Strehle, A. Samuel, E. M. Conzelmann, H. P. Burbank, A. H. Ahten, A. S. Thompson, W. R. Toledano.

Reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was dispensed with.

The President stated to the jury that the La. Highway Commission would take charge of the highways, bridges, ferries, etc., from and after March 31, 1923. Mr. Roussel would be retained and would give his attention three weeks a month to the highways and the parish would have him one week a month to attend to the parish roads which are not part of the highway. He suggested the sale of certain road machinery no longer needed and had instructed the road superintendent to advertise same for sale.

The regular order of business was deferred with.

Mr. Brewer, Mrs. Margaret Knight and Mr. Villars complained of cattle roaming on Metairie Ridge and stated that owners paid no attention to complaints and asked the Jury for relief.

The President explained that a pound-keeper was appointed but his commission as a deputy had been revoked and asked complaining parties to suggest some one for the job.

Be it further resolved etc., that W. L. Stevens be and he is hereby appointed and employed as architect to prepare plans and specifications for the proposed new jail building and to do such general supervisory work in connection with the construction of same as is usual and customary under such architectural service; the fee to be paid said W. L. Stevens, Architect, to be 3% three per cent. of the cost of construction of the building, said amount to be due and payable 1/3 one-third at the time contract for construction is awarded, 1/3 one third when the work is half completed and 1/3 one-third when the work is completed.

Be it Further Resolved etc., that H. L. Zander be and he is hereby employed as Superintendent of Construction of the said new jail and his fee is hereby fixed at 3% three per cent. of the cost of construction payable 1/3 one-third at the time of awarding of contract, 1/3 one third when work is half completed and 1/3 when work is completed.

Be it Further Resolved etc., that all previous ordinances or resolutions in conflict herewith be and are hereby repealed.

To prohibit the movement of any cattle or tick infested horses or mules from any quarantined area or other places into the Parish of Jefferson, or from one area or premise to another area or premise within the Parish of Jefferson; prohibiting the possession or charge of tick infested cattle, horses or mules; providing for the seizure, impounding, disposal and the costs thereof of tick infested cattle, horses and mules; authorizing the inspectors to mark or paint all dipped cattle, horses or mules; providing for the seizure, impounding, disposal and costs thereof of cattle, horses and mules not so marked and providing penalties for the violation of this ordinance.

Section 1. Be it Ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, agent, firm or corporation to move or cause to be moved any cattle from any quarantined parish or area into the Parish of Jefferson without having obtained a certificate of regular form, duly signed by an inspector

officially commissioned by the Louisiana State Live Stock Sa-

nitary Board, certifying such cattle to be free of Texas fever ticks.

Second 2. Be it further ordained etc., That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, agent, firm or corporation to move, transport or cause to be moved or transported any cattle from premise or area within the Parish of Jefferson to any other premise or area within the Parish of Jefferson unless such cattle are accompanied by a written permit signed by an inspector of the parish duly commissioned by the Louisiana State Live Stock Sanitary Board.

Section 3. Be it further ordained etc., that it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, agent, firm, or corporation within the Parish of Jefferson to allow any tick infested cattle, horses or mules owned by them or in their charge to roam at large on the public highways or open ranges of this parish or to have in their possession, in their charge or on their premises any cattle, horses, or mules carrying on their bodies the Texas fever Tick; provided, that this shall not apply to cattle, horses or mules that are being regularly and systematically dipped as required by law.

Section 4. Be it further ordained etc., That it shall be the right and duty of any inspector of the Parish of Jefferson to seize and impound any tick infested cattle, horses or mules found within the borders of the Parish of Jefferson, and any person or persons driving said tick infested cattle, horses or mules to the pound to quarantine pasture shall be entitled to receive the sum of five dollars \$5.00, for each head of cattle, horses or mules so impounded, and the pound or keeper of the quarantine pasture shall be entitled to charge fifty (50) cents per day for every day said animals are maintained at the pound or pasture, and if said animals are not claimed within (5) days or if the owner of said animals is unknown it shall be the duty of the pound or pasture keeper to report this fact to the Justice of the Peace having jurisdiction over the territory in which the cattle, horses or mules are impounded and the said Justice of the Peace shall advertise the sale of said cattle, horses or mules in two issues of the Parish Journal of the Parish of Jefferson, and said animals shall be sold at public auction by the constable having jurisdiction, and after deducting all costs and expenses, the balance, if any, shall be paid over to the Treasurer of the Parish of Jefferson; provided, that all cattle to be impounded under this ordinance must be dipped in a standard arensal solution before being placed in the pound or pasture and to be redipped as directed by the supervising inspector of the parish.

Section 5. Be it ordained, etc., that the several inspectors of the Parish of Jefferson shall have the right and authority to mark and paint all cattle, horses or mules either before or after being dipped, for the purpose of identifying the dipped from the undipped. And, any inspector commissioned by the Louisiana State Live Stock Sanitary Board shall have the legal right and authority to seize, dip and impound any cattle not so marked when in the opinion of the federal supervising inspector such cattle should have been regularly and systematically dipped; provided, the owner of such cattle so seized, dipped and impounded shall be held for costs of such seizure, dipping and impounding as provided for cattle seized

under Section 4 of this ordinance.

Section 6. Be it further ordained, etc., That any person or persons, agent, firm or corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, or any person or persons, agent, firm or corporation interfering with or resisting any person or inspector while in the performance of his duty in carrying out the provisions of this ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than (\$10.00) ten dollars nor more than fifty (\$50.00) dollars, or in default thereof not less than 10 days nor more than 30 days imprisonment in the parish jail or both, at the discretion of the court and shall be liable for injury to any person and for all damages resulting from such violation.

Section 7. Be it further ordained etc., That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance, be, and the same are herewith repealed.

Section 8. Be it further ordained, etc., That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and promulgation.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that all electric or steam railways and railroads, operating in this Parish, be required to pave with concrete, all crossings of said railways or railroads, intersecting any part of the State Highway in this Parish. The said paving to include the space between the rails and shall extend for a distance of two feet on outside of said rails. And whenever there are two or more tracks, the entire space between all of said tracks shall be paved with concrete. The concrete paving to be flush with the top of the rail and to be of the same width as connecting highway.

Section 2. The said paving shall be done under the supervision of the Parish Engineer.

Section 3. Any person, firm or corporation violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine not to exceed Twenty-five Dollars, or imprisonment in the Parish Prison, not exceeding thirty days, or both in the discretion of the Court.

Section 4. Every day that elapses from the time of the filing of an affidavit for the violation of the ordinance, shall constitute a new and separate offense, conviction of which shall be subject to the penalty provided in Section 3 hereof.

Section 5. Be it further provided that this ordinance shall become effective thirty days, from date of passage.

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Police Jury Room, Parish of Jefferson, Gretna, La., May 2, 1923

The Police Jury met this day in regular session.

Members present - Jules G. Fisher, president; F. Erlinger, W. E. Strehle, A. Samuel, E. M. Conzelmann, H. P. Burbank, A. H. Ahten, A. S. Thompson, W. R. Toledano.

The minutes of the previous meeting was dispensed with.

The regular order of business was deferred to allow various persons to address the jury.

On appeal of Mayor Anthony of Harahan, the jury donated \$500.00, for the establishment of a fire company.

Request of Prof. J. C. Ellis for donation of square of ground in rear of Gretna for a colored school, was laid over to the next meeting and residents of locality of proposed school are to be advised.

On request of Mrs. Mary, the road superintendent was instructed to grade and gravel Orchard Road in Hyland Farm.

On request of Mr. Mestayer the road superintendent was instructed to grade Nichols Avenue, the Stafford Land Company to donate the gravel.

Mr. Ristroph's request for information on partition fence was referred to the District Attorney.

Mr. Deckbar's petition for opening of streets was received and his protest of rerouting of Orleans-Kenner line resulted in the following resolution:-

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann, seconded by Toledano, the following was adopted:

Whereas, the attention of this Police Jury has been called to the fact that it is proposed to re-route the Orleans-Kenner Lines and change the terminus of said railway in the City of New Orleans, and

Whereas, the franchise granted the Orleans-Kenner Line was a joint franchise of this Police Jury and the Commission Council of the City of

New Orleans in which the route was definitely fixed, and cannot be changed without the consent of this Police Jury.

Therefore be it resolved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in regular meeting assembled, that this Police Jury go on record as protesting against any change of the present route of the Orleans-Kenner Line, without consent of this Police Jury, and that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Commission Council of the City of New Orleans.

Dr. Vornheder reported that the parish would be free of ticks by November as 4 vats are in operation.

On motion of Mr. Burbank, seconded by Mr. Strehle, the following was adopted.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of Jefferson at regular meeting assembled that the President of this Police Jury be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to deliver to the Louisiana Highway Commission the following equipment:

Two Nash Quad trucks, one ten-ton Holt Tractor, one light aviation truck, one steel drag, one Mogul Grader, one small grader.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this Police Jury reserves the right to use the said ten-ton Holt Tractor and Mogul Grader for its own use on roads to be maintained by the Parish whenever same may be necessary, and further that the cost of maintaining the above equipment shall be at the expense of the Louisiana Highway Commission as well as all insurance on same.

P. Davidson, the purpose of said right of way being for the construction of a public navigation canal from Bayou Dupont to Bayou Cutler, and

Whereas, it is necessary that said rights of ways acquired by

this Police Jury be duly transferred to the United States Government for their uses and purposes in order that said canal may be constructed by the United States Government

Therefore, be it resolved by the Police Jury, Parish of Jefferson, in regular meeting assembled that the President of this Police Jury, Jules G. Fisher, be and he is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to sign for and on behalf of this Police Jury act of transfer and donation of the rights of ways acquired by this Police Jury from the Wisner Estate, Inc., and heirs of C. P. Davidson, said transfer to be made to the United States Government free of all cost and to be used by the said United States Government for the purpose of constructing a public navigation canal from Bayou Dupont to Bayou Cutler, same to be known as Dupre Cut.

The above resolution having been read and put to a vote on the adoption thereof, the vote resulted as follows:

On motion Mr. Conzelmann, seconded by Mr. Burbank, the following was adopted:

An ordinance creating and establishing three voting precincts in the Fourth Ward of the Parish of Jefferson.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of Jefferson in regular meeting assembled that the Fourth Ward of the Parish of Jefferson, which comprise all of that part of the parish from the west bank of Harvey Canal to the lower line of the Fifth Ward, which is known as Fairfield Plantation, and from the Mississippi River in the front to the line of the Sixth Ward in the rear, be and the same is hereby created and established into three voting precincts and to be described and known as follows:

Precinct Number one (1) shall comprise all of that territory from the west Bank of Harvey Canal to a point three hundred feet east of Barataria Boulevard, and from the Mississippi River to the line of the Sixth Ward of this Parish.

Precinct Number Two (2) shall be comprised of all of that territory from a point three hundred feet east of Barataria Boulevard to the line of Dugue Canal on the upper part of Southside Plantation, and from the Mississippi River to the line of the Sixth Ward of this Parish.

Precinct Number Three (3) shall be comprised of all that territory from the Dugue Canal on the Southside Plantation to the lower line of the Fifth Ward, which is fixed as the dividing line between Fairfield Plantation and tract formerly known as the Elmirtia or Le Breton's Place, and from the Mississippi River to the line of the Sixth Ward of this Parish of Jefferson.

Section 2. Be it further ordained that all ordinances or parts of

ordinances in conflict herewith and especially the ordinance of this Jury adopted on the 7th day of May, 1919, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Peters St., New Orleans, La., be and they are hereby requested to have ditches dug along the Orleans-Kenner Line to the Drainage Canal, on the river side of the Y. M. V. Railroad; and further

That the New Orleans Public Service Corporation, Inc., be and is hereby requested to provide the required culverts under their roadbed on the line of their right of way on Metairie road, the lack of culverts and the sizes of culverts are not sufficient for draining the Metairie road; the embankment forming a levee against the road or highway prevents drainage and should be such as not to interrupt drainage; and

That W. Bertucci be and he is hereby requested to remove pipes placed in Metairie Bayou in front of his property without permission from the Jury and not of the size established by the Jury and of a smaller size, which should be 24 inches and should be placed to the grade established by this Jury; and further

That Chas. Rolling be and he is hereby requested to remove drain pipes placed without permission from the Jury, and too small and not in conformity as to size and grade, which pipes should be 27 inches at this location, And that the said New Orleans Public Service Corporation Inc., W. Bertucci, and Chas. Rolling, are hereby requested to apply to the Parish Engineer and Road Superintendent for all grades and size of pipes required for their respective location free of cost.

Further, that all of above requests should be complied with within 15 days after due notice being given, otherwise the work shall be done by the Road Superintendent at their expense for failure or refusal to comply with the request.

In the absence of the president, Mr. A. S. Thompson was appointed president pro tem.

Reading of minutes of previous meeting were dispensed with.

Regular order of business was dispensed with to allow parties to address the Jury.

Mr. Watermeyer requested the Jury to close and abandon 40 foot strip its whole length of Seminary avenue and connect with Luxor avenue and Labarre Road and in consideration to dedicate certain streets as per plan submitted.

On suggestion of Mr. W. L. Stevens, architect, changes in new jail plans were accepted, same meeting approval of contractor.

Mr. Deckbar protested against the changes in route of O. K. Line as proposed in Beeler plan.

The following franchise was accepted and adopted on request of Mr. Higgins:

Authorizing the Gretna Light and Power Co., Inc., its successors and assigns, hereinafter called grantee, to construct, maintain, and operate a light,

heat, and power system, and to generate, vend and distribute electric energy in the Parish of Jefferson, and to describe the method of exercise of this privilege.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana, in regular meeting assembled that the Gretna Light and Power Co., its successors and assigns, shall have and is hereby granted the right, power and authority to establish, erect on, in, over and through the streets, highways, lanes, alleys, railroad and railways, canals and public places, in the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana all such poles, wires, conductors, conduits, cables and other constructions, as shall be or may become necessary and the same to locate, relocate and change, to carry out the objects and purposes of said grantee, and of the grant and privilege herein created, and to extend the same as may be required for electric lights and a system of lighting by electricity and of transmission of electric energy and to furnish electrical power in the Parish of Jefferson and to supply the demand therefor as the same may now or here-after exist, arise or increase, subject to the limitation and conditions in this ordinance contained, provided that this grant be limited to the term of 25 years.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that the grantee may, and if required by the Police Jury shall make and file with the Secretary the same blueprints of the routes established by it and of any changes made thereon.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that all lines of wires, poles, masts, cables, landing of the shore end of all cables, and construction shall be located and constructed so as not to obstruct unreasonably the public use of the streets and public places, or to interfere with commerce or travel, nor in such close proximity to buildings as to endanger them or the occupants

thereof.

Section 4. Be it further ordained, etc., that all work undertaken for the purposes of this privilege, and involving, the tearing up of streets and highways, or in other ways interfering with traffic thereon, or their use by the public, shall be done by the grantee under the supervision of the Parish Engineer, and when completed, the grantee shall restore such premises to their previous condition within a time specified by said engineer and failure to begin work on such restoration within three days after written notice so to do shall authorize the Police Jury to restore the same at the cost and expense of the grantee.

Section 5. Be it further ordained, etc., that the grantee shall begin work in the section between Harvey Canal and the lower limits of the Parish of Jefferson within one year from the acceptance of this ordinance by it by notarial act, delays due to unforeseen circumstances of matters not within the control of the grantee to be expected therefrom.

Section 6. Be it further ordained, etc., that the charges to be made by grantee for electricity for lighting purposes shall not be more than 11¢ per kilowatt hour with a discount of 10% to be allowed for cash settlement within ten days after date of bill; the consumer to guarantee to pay a monthly service charge of 25 cents for each meter

connected.

Grantee shall also have the right to charge and collect from each consumer a service charge of 1.00 per month for electricity furnished even though his bill at the rate above specified would not amount to \$1.00, this extra charge being allowed to cover meter installation, expense and service of the grantee in holding itself in readiness to furnish electricity to consumers.

The charge for electricity when used for power shall not be more than 5½ cents per kilowatt hour. Upon installation having a maximum demand of twenty-five electrical horse power or less, there shall be minimum charge of fifty-cents per month for each electrical horse power installed and for installation having a demand in excess of twenty-five electrical horse power, said charge shall be at such special rates as may be fixed by contract and agreement between grantee and the consumer.

Section 7, Be it further ordained, etc., that the grantee shall indemnify and save harmless the Parish of Jefferson from all suits and actions that may be instituted against it by reason of any injury or alleged injury to the person or property of another resulting from negligence or on account of any act of commission or omission on the part of the grantee.

Section 8, Be it further ordained, etc., that if anything in the provisions of this ordinance should result in injury to private property or be in conflict with any right for privilege heretofore lawfully granted by the Parish of Jefferson to any person or company, the grantee by its acceptance of this ordinance binds itself to hold said Parish harmless from all damages or reclamation whatsoever arising therefrom.

Section 9, Be it further ordained, etc., that wherever in this ordinance the word "grantee" is used, it shall be and is intended thereby to include and shall always be construed to include the grantee, its successor and assigns.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular meeting assembled that it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park or to leave unattended any automobile, truck or other motor vehicle, without lights

between the hour of sunset and sunrise on any of the public roads in the Parish of Jefferson.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park or leave unattended any automobiles, truck or other motor vehicle with lights between the hours of sunset and sunrise on any of the public roads in the Parish of Jefferson, for a greater period than fifteen 15 minutes, provided this section shall not apply to any person visiting friends, relatives or disabled automobiles or trucks.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that any person firm or corporation found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance by any court of competent jurisdiction shall be liable to a fine not exceeding \$25.00. or imprisonment of thirty days for the first offense, or a fine not exceeding \$50.00 or imprisonment not exceeding sixty days for the second offence, or both fine imprisonment in either case at the discretion of the court.

The agreement made this fifth day of the month of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand, nine hundred and twenty three, and between A. Rouprich, of lawful age and resident of the Parish of Jefferson, party of the first part hereinafter designated as Contractor, and the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, herein appearing through and represented by the Police Jury, Jules G. Fisher, President, duly authorized to act herein by resolution of the said Police Jury, party of the second part, hereinafter designated as owner;

Witnesseth, That as will appear by building contractor executed between the parties hereto on the 25th day of May, 1923, which said contract was recorded in the Mortgage Office of the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, in Book 61, Folio 608, which provides for the erection and construction of a two-story fire roof jail building in the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, and,

Whereas, Article IX of said original contract above referred to provides for the payments to be made under said contract, presently reads as follows, to-wit;

Article IX. It is hereby mutually agreed between the parties hereto that the sum to be paid by the Owner to the Contractor for said work and materials shall be Eighty-Seven Thousand, One Hundred and Thirty-two (\$87,132) Dollars, subject to additions and deductions as hereinbefore provided, and that such sum shall be paid by the owner to the Contractor, in current funds, and only upon certificates of the Architect, as follows:

First payment of Nine Thousand (\$9,000) Dollars, when foundation work is completed.

Second payment of Thirty Thousand (\$30,000) Dollars, when all of the masonry work is completed and jail work installed, except bunks which must be delivered to the premises, and rock is on.

Fourth payment of Sixteen Thousand (\$16,000) Dollars when all mechanical equipment except raditors, and plumbing and lighting fixtures in completed, plastering done and first coat of paint applied.

Fifth payment Twenty-One Thousand, One Thirty-Two (\$21,132) Dollars,

The fifth and final payment shall be made forty-five days after the completion and acceptance of the work included in this contract, and all payments shall be due when certificates for the same issued.

If at anytime there shall be evidence of any lien or claim for which if established,

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the owner of the said premises might become liable, and which is chargeable to the Contractor, the owner shall have the right to retain out of any payment then due or thereafter to become due, an amount sufficient to completely indemnify it against such lien or claim. Should there prove to be claim after all payments are made, the Contractor shall refund to the owner all moneys that the latter may be compelled to pay in discharging any lien on said premises made obligatory in consequence of the contractors default, and, whereas, It is impossible for the said contractor to complete all of the masonry work as provided for by said Article IX, due to the fact that he is unable to claim deliveries of the steel cages necessary to complete said jail work, and the masonry work therein provided, and

Whereas, the said contractor being unable to complete said work aforesaid, the said owner is unable to make the payments as provided for by said original contract, particularly Article IX thereof, and

Whereas, It is the intention and the desire of both of said parties, the said Roupnich and the said Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, to amend and supplement said Article IX so as to permit the said contractor to continue said work under said contract up to the point where the installation of the steel cages only remains to be done and the masonry to be done subsequent to the installation of said steel cages, and in order to make to the said contractor said payments which will enable him to proceed with said work, it is their intention to alter, amend and change said Article IX of, said referred to, and they do hereby change and alter said Article IX so as to make same read as follows, to-wit;

Article IX. It is hereby mutually agreed to between the parties hereto that the sum to be paid by the owner to the Contractor for said work and materials shall be Eighty-seven Thousand One hundred and Thirty-two (\$87,132) Dollars, subject to additions and deductions as hereinbefore provided, and that such sum shall be paid by the Owner to the Contractor, in current funds, and only upon certificates of the Architects, as follows:

First payment of Nine Thousand (\$9,000) Dollars, when foundation

work is completed.

Second payment of Nine Thousand (\$9,000) Dollars, when the building is one story high.

Third payment of Twenty Thousand (\$20,000) Dollars, to be made when the second floor is constructed and when the plumbing, heating and lighting roughing in is done to this point and jail steel work other than cells delivered, and that of the first story set in place.

Fourth Payment of Twenty-nine Thousand (\$29,000) Dollars, to be made when roof is on, all plastering, except felon cell room finished, all plumbing and heating and electrical work with fixtures except in felon cell room installed.

Fifth payment of Eleven Thousand, One Hundred and Thirty-two (\$11,132) Dollars, is to be made when the entire building is finished and completed and the acceptance thereof is recorded in the Mortgage Office for the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, by the owner as provided by law.

The Sixth and final payment of Nine Thousands (\$9,000) Dollars, is to be made thirty days after the recordation of the acceptance by the owner in the Mortgage Office for the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, as above provided, and all payments shall be due when certificates for the same are issued.

Provided further, that before the last payment said contractor shall deliver to said owner at the contractor's expense, a certificate from the Clerk of Court, and Ex-Office Recorder of Mortgages in and for the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, said certificate to be signed and dated, so that no liens or claims growing out of his connection with said work are recorded, neither shall there be any legal claims against said contractor in any manner affecting said owner of the said work, and all payments are to be made under the above and foregoing conditions.

If at any time there shall be evidence of any lien or claim for which, if established, the owner of the said premises might become liable, and which is chargeable to the Contractor, of any payment then due or thereafter to become due, an amount sufficient to completely indemnify it against such lien or claim they prove to be any such claim after all payments are made, the Contractor shall refund to the Owner all money's that the latter may be compelled to pay in discharging any lien on said premises made obligatory in consequence of the Contractor's default.

It is hereby further agreed and understood by and between the said Contractor and the said owner, that in all other respects said contract is to remain intact and unchanged.

And now the Union Indemnity Company, of the City of New Orleans, State of Louisiana, surety on the bond of the said Roupnich, Contractor in the above and foregoing contract intervenes in this agreement, taking cognizance of the change made as above set forth, and consents and agrees to same.

All of the above parties, their heirs, successors, executors, administrators, and assigns do hereby agree to the full performance of the covenants herein contained;

hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise, to
be equipped with two head lights of which the lamps of
which shall be of a capacity not less than 16 candle-
power each, and in no case of a greater capacity than
24 candle-power. The lenses or glass, in such head-
lights, if of plain glass, shall be frosted, sand-
blaster or planed, or if a patent type, shall be made
in such manner as to diffuse or defect the rays of
light from the lamps, that on a level surface, at a
distance of 75 feet or more from the headlights, no
portion of the beam of light shall be projected more
than 42 inches above the roadway. All patented lenses
shall have approved by the U. S. Breau of Standards as
complying with the above requirements. Plain, clear
glass may be used in headlights only in case of the
reflectors behind such lights are permanently so fixed
in place as to deflect the beam of light as herein pro-
vided.

That no spot-lights shall be used on any motor
vehicle except for the purpose of casting a light to
the right or left, or the rear of vehicle is

stationary or in slow speed or in reverse.

That any person convicted of the volitaion of any provision of this
ordinance will be guilty of misdemeanor and upon conviction, be punished
by a fine of not less than \$5.00 (five dollars), or imprisonment for not
more than thirty (30) days or both at the discretion of the Court.

The Police Jury met this day in regular session.

The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting were dispensed with.

On motion duly seconded the Jury adjourned for five minutes out of respect to the memory of the late Judge H. N. Gautier.

The regular order of business was deferred to allow parties present to address the jury.

The Realty Development Co., was ordered to open Lumor avenue to connect with Labarre Road in rear of their property to grade and hardsurface same. Failure to comply with the above, the Jury will be forced to take necessary steps against the company.

The request of Mr. D. F. Holmes, for the return of the \$750.00, contributed by the property holders for the construction of a canal, due to the delay of constructing same; was granted by the Jury and the construction of Lafayette was deferred for the time being.

On motion duly seconded; the appropriation made for the construction of Lafayette Canal, of \$650.00, be and the same is hereby withdrawn.

On motion duly seconded, Messrs. Samuel, Strehle, Parish Engineer,

Appropriating Road Supt. with Messrs. Rein and Holmes were appointed \$650, to drain to look after drainage of Nicholl's Ave. from 25th Street to Verret Canal and the sum of \$650.00, was appropriated for the work.

Mr. Holmes, complained of cattle roaming and stopping drainage and asked for some relief.

Mr. E. E. Hanmer, with petition signed by property holders consenting, requested a permit to build and operate an Ice Plant and Cold Storage on Labarre Road between Ridgeway and Metairie Lawn, Fagot and Vivian streets, Metairie Ridge and to be Motor Driven Plant.

From the New Orleans Public Service Inc., relative to smoking in Shrewsbury cars.

From Mr. W. L. Stevens, permission to use the old sink with an extra cost of \$70.00, for the plumbing.

On motion of Mr. Ahten seconded by Mr. Thompson, and adopted;

Prohibiting smoking on railroad, electric cars, motor bus, or other public conveyance.

Whereas, this Police Jury has been advised as to the nuisance and annoyance to patrons of the Shrewsbury Car Line due to smoking; and requesting relief from the Police Jury by taking the proper steps and measures to prohibit same, therefore.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in regular meeting assembled, that it shall be unlawful for any person to smoke upon and while being conveyed on any railroad train, electric

car, motor bus, or any other public conveyance, except where special compartments are set aside for smokers.

Be it further ordained etc., that any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall upon conviction before any court of competent jurisdiction, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding \$25.00 or imprisonment not exceeding 30 days or both at the discretion of the court.

Whereas, the President of this Police Jury, in accordance with resolution adopted at the last meeting, authorizing him to negotiate for the employment of special counsel in the case now pending in the 28th Judicial District Court of the Parish of Jefferson, entitled Vic. A. Pitre VS. Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, No. 4097 of the docket of said court, has advised this Police Jury that he has taken the matter up with the law firm of Dart, Kernan & Dart, who agreed to handle the case for this Police Jury for a fee of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars, as a retainer, and like amount upon the final termination of the suit.

Therefore, Be it resolved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular meeting assembled; That the law firm of Dart, Kernan & Dart be, and they are here- employed and the action of the President is hereby approved and ratified, said employment having been approved by the Attorney General and the Governor of the State of Louisiana, in accordance with law, said approval being on file with the secretary of this Police Jury.

Be it resolved, by this Police Jury, that the offer of the American Heating and Plumbing Co., to install the old sink in the new jail, be and the same is hereby rejected and sink ordered placed at the expenses of the contractor, that will meet all conditions and requirements of the jail building.

The S. O. N. L. & T. Co., was instructed to build platforms from Marrero Division to Marrero Addition as per resolution adopted Sept. 5, 1923 and clean culverts along its right of way from Copernicus Ave. to Marrero;

and from Copernicus Ave. to the lower line of Brooklyn Pasture; as well as to grade its road bed likewise, and to clean the Verret Canal culvert and to keep same clean as agreed and promised to this Police Jury.

Mr. Barbara, complained of dam, he was advised to take the matter up with Mr. Katz.

Mr. Leo. W. McCune's offer of \$5.00 for the purchase of a couch, was referred to the Court house and Jail Committee; which offer the Committee accepted.

On motion duly seconded, and adopted; the secretary was instructed to advise Mr. A. F. Theard, engineer of the Guaranty Investment Co., to at once repair and complete Glenwood Drive as same was plowed up and left in condition, unbearable to residents; same being an infraction of the law.

The Road Supt. was instructed to repair Copernicus Avenue from 11th. Street to Protection Levee.

On motion of Mr. Strehle seconded by Mr. Samuel and duly adopted.

Be it resolved that the secretary shall advertise in the Official Newspaper that the Police Jury is prepared to receive sealed bids for the filling and grading of the site of the new jail.

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Area is about 250 feet by 308 feet, with an average fill of about 2 feet or approximately net 5,000 cubic yards. Measurements and grades stakes will be furnished by the Parish Engineer.

Property located in Square bounded by Third, Fourth Derbigny and Dolhonde Sts.

The Police Jury reserves the right to reject any or all bids. Work to start 5 days after contract is made.

SECTION 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that the President is further authorized and empowered to execute in favor of said Jefferson Trust and Savings Bank, a note or certificate of indebtedness for the amount herein set forth, together with the interest due or to become due thereon.

Stevens, Architect, for the new Jefferson Parish Jail Building, just completed has been most thoroughly satisfactory and we unqualifidely recommend his services to those intending to undertake the construction of prison building work.

Mr. Stevens was employed by us largely because of his years of experience in designing and constructing prison buildings, and the work just completed for this Parish embracing many new and novel features, is pronounced by competent authorities to be perfect in design and execution.

We cordially invite your inspection of our new Jail Building and would be glad to furnish any information at our command, to those contemplating new prison building work.

On motion of Mr. Samuel, seconded by Mr. Strehle the following was adopted:

On motion of Mr. Samuel, seconded by Mr. Strehle;

Be it Resolved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson that it is the sense of this body that the architectural services of Henry L. Zander in supervising the construction of the new jail erected by the Parish of Jefferson has been entirely satisfactory, and we hereby recommend his services to all parties who may desire his assistance for the erection of public buildings.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above resolution, the vote resulted as follows:

John Fricke, 8th ward pound-keeper complained that job did not pay and that he would resign if Jury did not pay him.

Communication from St. Charles and St. John against freight rates was received.

Paving bill from City of Gretna was received.

Application of Gulf Refining Co., was referred to oil commission.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann, seconded by Mr. Burbank the following ordinance was adopted:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in special meeting assembled that the President of the Police Jury be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow from the Gretna Ex. & Saving Bank, fiscal agent of the Parish of Jefferson the sum of Eleven Thousand (\$11,000.00) Dollars, payable on demand and bearing interest at the rate of per cent per annum, and to pledge as collateral security on said loans Ten (10) certain promissory notes, each dated July 19th, 1923, each for the sum of Four Hundred and Fifty (450.00) Dollars, payable respectively one to ten years after date and signed by the Louisiana Avenue Ferry Company, Inc., by Joseph A. Bisso. President, and also Ten (10) certain promissory notes, dated December 20th, 1922, each for the sum of Seven Hundred (\$700.00) Dollars, payable respectively one to ten years after dates, duly signed by W. A. Bisso, and the President is further authorized to sign for on behalf of this Police Jury all documents including notes or certificates of indebtedness, binding this Police Jury to the repayment of a loan herein authorized.

An ordinance relative to the subdivision of tracts of land in the Parish of Jefferson in connection with the opening of new roads and streets and drainage through said subdivision; providing for the method of obtaining permission for the subdivision of lands and providing for penalties in violation of this ordinance.

SECTION I. BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in special meeting assembled that it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to hereafter subdivide into town lots or lay off public roads or streets or sell land with reference to a plan of

subdivision until permission has been first obtained from the Parish Engineer of the Parish of Jefferson.

To obtain permission to Subdivide Land.

SECTION II. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that all persons seeking permission to subdivide lands into town lots shall first submit a copy of the plan of subdivision to the engineer of the Parish of Jefferson, and it shall be the duty of the engineer of the Parish of Jefferson to examine said plan of subdivision in connection to adjoining properties in order that all new roads and streets on said plan of subdivision shall connect, with existing roads and streets and said roads or streets shall not be placed at a greater distance than six hundred feet apart, unless it shall be necessary to increase or decrease this distance in order to connect with existing roads or streets.

SECTION III BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all persons at the time of filing applications for approval with the parish engineer shall at the same time submit in writing the contemplated improvements to be placed in said subdivision relative to side walks, streets and drainage, and the Police Jury reserves the right to refrain from maintaining any public roads or streets that may be laid out and which roads or streets are not graveled, paved or hard-surfaced by the promoters of the said subdivision, and no responsibility will be assumed by the Police Jury for the maintenance of said streets, unless they are turned over to the Parish in good condition.

SECTION IV. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that the parish engineer shall be allowed a fee of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars for inspecting all plans of subdivisions submitted to him, said fee to be paid at the time of the filing of application with the parish engineer.

SECTION V. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that the parish engineer shall have a right to approve the plan of subdivision submitted to him or to reject said plan and should said plan be rejected then the applicant shall have a right to appeal to the Police Jury and after due hearing the Police Jury may approve or reject said plan or order changes to be made to suit the conditions existing in the location of the lands relative to roads, streets and drainage.

SECTION VI. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction before any court of competent jurisdiction shall be liable to a fine not exceeding One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or imprisonment not exceeding thirty (30) days, or both at the discretion of the court.

The above ordinance having been considered section by section and then as a whole having been

adopted section by section, and than as a whole the roll being called on the adoption of same, the vote resulted as follows:

Yeas - Strehle, Conzelmann, Burbank, Athen, Thompson, Toledano.

Nays - None

Absent - Erlinger, Samuel.

Petition of Metairie residents for street lights was received.

All bids for filling jail square were returned.

On motion duly seconded, James Morales was named traffic officer for the right bank.

On motion Mr. Conzelmann, seconded by Mr. Strehle the following ordinance was adopted.

AN ORDINANCE

An Ordinance to authorize the President, on behalf of the Police Jury to borrow from the Gretna Exchange & Savings Bank the sum of Twelve (\$12,000.00) Thousand Dollars and such sum as may be necessary to pay the interest on said amount, pay the current expenses of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for the year of 1924, authorizing the execution of a note or certificate of indebtedness in favor of said bank for said amount and dedicating, appropriating and setting aside the amount of principal and interest out of the taxes and revenues of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1924, to pay the amount borrowed.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in Special meeting assembled that the President, be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow from the Gretna Exchange & Savings Bank, on behalf of this Police Jury the sum of Twelve Thousand (\$12,000.00) Dollars, and such additional sum as may be necessary to pay the interest due or to become due on said amount, for the purpose of paying the current expenses of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for the Year 1924.

Section 2. Be it Further Ordained, etc., that the President is further authorized and empowered to execute in favor of said Gretna Exchange & Savings

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Bank, a note or certificate of indebtedness for the amount hereinabove set forth, together with the interest due or to become due thereon.

Section 3. Be it Further Ordained, etc., that for the payment of the amount borrowed and note or certificate executed as herein provided the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson hereby dedicates, appropriates and sets aside the sum of \$12,000.00 out of the revenues and taxes of the Parish of Jefferson, for the year 1924: together with such other of further sum.

The roll being called, the vote resulted as follows:-

Yeas - Strehle, Conzelmann, Burbank, Athen, Thompson, Toledano.

Nays - None.

Absent - Samuel, Erlinger.

Resignation of Mr. Joseph A. Bourgeois, as secretary of the Jury was accepted.

He was tendered a vote of thanks for courtesies during his term.

W. Hepting appointed secretary of the Police Jury

On motion of Mr. Strehle, seconded Mr. Toledano, Wm. Hepting was appointed as secretary of the Police Jury, Parish of Jefferson, effective Feb. 1st 1924.

Mr. Deckbar suggested sidewalk space in survey of Shrewsbury Road to Carroll Avenue. The Jury resolved to take action in matter.

The committee is composed of Messrs. Athen, Zander, and Deckbar.

Request for data on above survey was made to Highway Department.

On motion Mr. Conzelmann, seconded by Mr. Strehle, it was resolved to advertise for bids for enlargement of Clerks office to be opened next meeting.

The Jury then adjourned.
