PREFACE

The Louisiana Historical Records Project is a unit of the WPA Historical Records Survey Program which was under the National Supervision of Dr. Luther H. Evans until his appointment as Chief of Legislative Reference, Library of Congress. Sargent B. Child has been the National Director since March 1, 1940. In the nation and in each state the project operates under the administrative supervision of the Research and Records Section of the Division of Professional and Service Projects, Work Projects Administration. From November 1936 until its discontinuance on October 1, 1939, the HRS operated nationally as a unit in WPA Federal Project No. 1. The work has continued in Louisiana as a state-wide project.

Sponsored by the Department of Archives, Louisiana State University, Dr. Edwin A. Davis, Archivist, the Louisiana Project is co-sponsored by some 65 governmental agencies throughout the state. In this particular instance the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, as co-sponsor, has provided funds necessary for the publication of this series of volumes as well as the Inventory of Parish Archives for Jefferson Parish.

The procedures used in the preparation of these transcripts are detailed in the preface to volume 1 of this series, published in June, 1939, pp. ii-iv. Verne F. Fisher, and Oralie Grevenberg have been editors in charge of transcription work in Louisiana. The indexes have been prepared under the supervision of David E. Lott.

A physical description of the original record here reproduced follows: This loose-leaf volume is bound in dark red imitation leather and fastened together with metal binders. A conventional line design in gold appears in each of the four corners of the front and back covers. Five inches from the top, on the back binding, are the words "Minute Book" in gold letters; in the center of the back binding are the words, "Police Jury" in gold letters; and five inches from the bottom of the back binding are the words, "Parish of Jefferson", in gold letters. A large numeral No. 11, in black ink is in the center of the front cover. The back cover contains no writing or label. There are two fly leaves in the front and one in the back of the volume. This typewritten volume is approximately 18½" X 12½" X 2½" and contains 402 pages.

Office of the Police Jury,
Gretna, La., Feb. 6, 1924.

The Police Jury met this day in regular session.

The following were present: Julse G. Fisher, president, Fred Erlinger, Wm. E. Strehle, Albert Samuel, E. M. Conzelmann, H. P. Burbank, W. R. Toledano, A. S. Thompson and District Attorney Buchler, Absent A. H. Ahten.

Reading of Minutes of previous meeting was dispensed with and ordered approved.

Regular order of business was dispensed with to allow parties to address the Jury.

Petition of Mr. Diamond on behalf of the 7th and 8th ward citizens asking for reappointment of M. D. Kostmeyer as member of the Fourth Jefferson Drainage District was read and action deferred to next regular meeting of the Jury.

On behalf of Miss E. W. Tonges, the sum of \$100 was donated to the Nancy Lee House for destitute children at Jennings La., provided same is in compliance with the law.

Road superintendent and Parish engineer were instructed to co-operate with Mr. Paillet in regards to hauling and spreading gravel on Labarre Road.

Mr. Paillet to pay for gravel and freight on same.

Mr. Floury's proposition to the Jury taking up the matter of fixing a flat rate for water in fire hydrants with Jefferson Water Co., was refused.

Road superintendent was instructed to do whatever possible to remedy condition complained of by Mr. Fagor.

Regular order of business was then resumed.

The secretary was instructed to advertize for bids for the sale of old parish prison.

on motion duly seconded the Jury recessed for five minutes out of respect for late Woodrow Wilson.

the date of dedication of new parish prison was set as March 11, 1924 and the secretary was instructed to invite all officials as well as the general public.

on motion of Mr. Conzelman seconded by Mr. Burbank the Courthouse and Jail committee was asked to meet with the engineer for purpose of filling new parish prison site.

The jury received bids for enlarging the clerks office as follows Mr. A Roupnich, \$5060.00. and Abel Hargis \$2160.00.

on motion of Mr. Conzelman seconded by Mr. Toledano bid of Abel Hargis was unanimously adopted.

the district attorney was instructed to draw up contract with Abel Hargis for work in clerk's office and said Hargis to give binds for \$2000.

secretary was instructed to notify I. C. R. R. to place a Flagman crossing and place signal in working order.

on motion of Mr. Conzelman seconded by Mr. Ahten the following ordinance was adopted.

Close season
 for killing
 Deer

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, that the close season for killing of deer is hereby fixed from the 1st, day of February, this year and each succeeding year, to the 1st, of November of this year and each succeeding year.

Be it further ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson that it shall be unlawful for any person to kill any deer or fawn during the close season fixed above, and it is hereby made an offense.

Be it further ordained that any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction before a court of competent jurisdiction, be imprisoned in the Parish Jail for not less than (30) thirty days nor more than six months and fined not less than fifty Dollars nor than two hundred and fifty dollars, or both, in the discretion of the court. Roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance resulted as follows;

An ordinance to authorize the president on behalf of the Police Jury to borrow from the Jefferson Trust and Savings Bank the sum of \$18,000 and such additional sum as may be necessary to pay the interest on said amount, pay the current expenses of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1924, authorizing the execution of a note or certificate of indebtedness in favor of said bank for said amount and dedicating appropriating and setting aside the said amount of principal and interest out of the taxes and the revenues of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1924, to pay the amount borrowed.

SECTION (1)

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in regular meeting assembled, that the President be and is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow from the Jefferson Trust and Savings Bank, on behalf of this Police Jury the sum of \$18,000. and such additional sum as may be necessary to pay the interest due or to become due on said amount, for the purpose of paying the current expenses of the Police Jury of the Parish Of Jefferson for the year of 1924.

AN ORDINANCE, relative to the inspection of brakes on motor vehicle operating on public roads in the Parish of Jefferson, providing for the appointment of break test committee and imposing penalties in violation of this ordinance.

Section (1) be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in regular meeting assembled, that every Motor vehicle shall be provided with at least two adequate brakes, each of which works inde-

pendently of the other, excepting Motorcycles which shall be provided with not less than one adequate brake, Brake or brakes shall be sufficient to bring and capable of bringing, such vehicle, together with any trailer that may be attached thereto, to a complete stop within fifty (50) feet when the same is traveling at the rate of twenty (20) miles an hour on a dry asphalt roadway or under similar road conditions.

Section (II) every motor vehicle operated on the streets of the Parish of Jefferson shall at least once every six months have its brakes tested by some firm, person or corporation authorized to make such tests by the brake test committee herein provided, and shall carry at all times a certificate of such inspection.

Section (III) The president of the Police Jury is hereby authorized and directed to appoint a committee consisting of three (3) members of the Police Jury, which committee shall be known as the brake test committee of the Parish of Jefferson, and shall be authorized to examine and license persons, firms and corporations for the making of brake test, provided for in this section and to make such rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry into effect.

Section (IV) Persons, firms and corporations licensed as provided to make official brake inspection in accordance herewith are authorized to issue certificates attesting such inspection, which certificates shall be good for a period of six months.

Section (V) certificates herein provided shall be attached to the motor vehicle in a conspicuous place and carried at all times, and be subject to inspection at all times by any sheriff, deputy sheriff, constable or other police officer.

Section (VI) Persons, firms and corporations making official brake inspection in accordance with provisions of this section shall be entitled to charge a fee not to exceed (50) cents for each inspection.

Section (VII) The chairman of the brake test committee is authorized and directed to furnish to persons, firms, and corporations licensed here under the proper credentials and such blank forms as may be necessary for certificates as provided herein.

Section (VIII) Licenses issued by the brake test committee provided herein to persons, firms, and corporations authorizing such persons, firms, and corporations to make the inspection and issue certificates provided herein shall be issued under such rules and regulations as the said committee shall supply and shall be revokable for cause by said committee at any time upon the approval of the president of the Police Jury.

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BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED etc., That any person firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction before any court of competent jurisdiction be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty five (\$25.00) dollars or imprisonment not exceeding thirty (30) days or both at the discretion of the court.

The years roll on and eight years have passed, my term of office as your President has expired, My friends, no one not in my situation can appreciate my feelings of sadness at this parting the fork of the road has been met, and now I leave you, but to a task I know not will be greater or lesser [than the] precedent one. Still to leave you imparts in my heart a tense feeling of regret, as with you these long years I have served you. My colleagues, each one of you, as I gaze into your faces the warm lines of faithful service to your people are interwoven with that pleasing smile, the trials and tribulations that arose were met calmly and successfully by you. A feeling beyond words to express can I attribute to you for your co-operation that has been the chief element to the success of these two terms of office, And my people, I have served you to the best of my ability and have done my utmost to give you a Parish that anyone in the State of Louisiana can say is second to none my Jefferson. How proud I feel of Jefferson.

Let us lift the veil and briefly go over what has been done during those eight years. As I cite to you a few things that has been accomplished, let your memories wander back eight years and try to imagine your Parish then as your Parish now.

The greatest factor in any Parish is the means of transportation, for Commerce depends upon the highways and waterways. The latter are only natural resources that have been of great aid to our Parish, as the greater part of Jefferson is in a region where there are many lakes and bayous. But I will dwell

upon the artificial means, that is road. Today you have sixty miles of hard surface road. These roads were built during my eight years in service and over a quarter of a million have been spent, but not ruthlessly for you have property worth three times in value by these roads in the service they have given to you. From the North end to the South end and from the West and to the East end of the Parish of Jefferson, these are roads that bring you in contact with each other. I have struggled to maintain the best roads obtainable from any source and now your roads are second to none in the State.

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I have always impressed my colleagues of the necessity of good roads and they have assisted me so that you can boastfully praise those long white stretches of gravel and shells. At present perhaps you are acquainted with the facts of my strong advocacy of concrete roads on the east bank. I know what this will mean and though I will be no longer with the Jury, I will do whatever is in my power to build concrete roads.

There is the beautiful Jail, a structure second to none of its kind in the state, a building that you can be proud of.

In the line of education with your help, we have not left a stone uncovered so that at the present, day, Jefferson from the statistical reports ranks among the leaders in her school system. Only a few days ago a beautiful school was dedicated and presently another one will be dedicated. On the East Bank and on the West Bank these beautiful buildings will dominate to tell you their purpose. Institutions that have cost through the issuing of bonds over half a million dollars.

The finance system that is the handling of our money has been developed into (100%) system, that is all bills are met promptly, a contrast to the old system. Not a bill will be found in the treasurer's hand that is not receipted.

The drainage boards are composed of the best men adaptable for their knowledge and efficiency of the working of such board. The Jury in their appointments have closely aligned to this scheme, as it is the only way to success. And now your drainage system through the efforts and cooperation of the members and the Police Jury is beyond reproach.

Two things stand out, the increase in population and the increase in assessments. The farms has been increased about 16,000 which certainly shows that during these eight years people thought Jefferson was good place to throw their lot in. Smoke stacks are pouring out their black fumes along the lines, which is evidence of great industrial growth. By reports it shows that assessments have increased over 11,000 dollars. This is great for eight years time and still more and more are coming.

There are two men whom I wish to thank heartily and I am certain that the Police Jury agree with me. These, men, Mr. Roussell, and Mr. Costa, have worked hard to overcome any difficulties in the past that they have been, assigned to. However, the more difficult the work was they never quit and have reached the pinnacle of success in their road building. They should be complimented.

My friends, I hope, I have served you faithfully and that you are satisfied, it only makes me feel happy to know that I have performed my duties within your accord and satisfaction. I am leaving you now, but my successors I am sure, they will do their utmost to serve the cause of you

my dear friends.

At the close of Mr. Fisher's remarks, Mr. Gaudet arose and after touching on Mr. Fisher's long record of service, presented him with a traveling bag, silver mounted military set beautifully engraved and silver mounted shaving set to match.

The Jury then adjourned.

On motion by Mr. Erlinger Seconded by Mr. Ottermann, that the Jury receive Protests and hear complaints of assessments as fixed by the Tax Commission.

Mr. Curro, in representing the Southern Hard Wood Lumber Co., requested a reduction of \$9,270 on Machinery.

Mr. Johnson representing the Consolidated Mills Incorporated requested a reduction of \$5,600 on Merchandise.

The Lucas E. Moore Stave Co., requested a reduction of \$5,800 on machinery and \$5,400 on buildings.

C. F. Borah, representing the Celotex Co., requested a reduction of \$5,250 on office furniture, claiming same is not in the State and asked the cancelation of \$137,000 assessment on patent right claiming said patent right is owned by a non resident corporation and leased to the Celotex Co., on a royalty basis, and asked an allowance of \$13,255. to cover a better engine discarded but not yet charged off the books, also an additional reduction on depreciation of machinery of \$13,864 being an addition of 5% per cent depreciation on the 1922 assessment.

Capt., Barrow, owner of the Barataria- Lafouche Canal Co. asked a reduction of \$36,218 on Canal and Locks, for the reason that the Canal is a link of a chain of canals leading from Morgan City and other points into New Orleans, and claim that the chief value of the Canal was the Locks, since the Harvey Canal owned and operated by the U. S. Government, his locks have not earned \$20.00 in the last month, and as the matter stands is a liability and not an asset.

There being no other protest or complaints before the Jury on motion duly seconded went into executive session after discussion of protest and complaints Mr. Erlinger moved seconded by Mr. Ottermann that the

Jury Make the following recommendation.

Lucas E. Moore Stave Co., Sheet # 4879, 7th, Ward Valuation as fixed on buildings \$54,000 asking a reduction of \$5,400 valuation as fixed on machinery 58,100 asking a reduction of \$5,800 recommend a 10% percent reduction on beath, to wit: \$11,200

To supplement existing ordinance or ordinances relative to the eradication of cattle fever ticks in this parish and to prevent reinfestation therefrom; to provide for the seizure, dipping, impounding and disposal of cattle, horses and mules entering this parish unless the same be accompanied by an official permit signed by a duly authorized inspector; providing penalties for violations of this ordinance and repeal all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson that:

SECTION 1. Should any cattle, or horses or mules be driven into, drift, or enter by swimming or otherwise the Parish of Jefferson from any parish that is under state or federal quarantine for cattle fever ticks, unless such cattle, horses or mules are accompanied by an official permit of the Louisiana State Live Stock Sanitary Board or an official certificate of the U. S. Bureau of animal Industry, such cattle, horses or mules, shall be seized, dipped and impounded by an inspector or range rider employed by the Parish of Jefferson or by an inspector duly commissioned by the Louisiana State Live Stock Sanitary Board in tick eradication work. A Seizure fee of \$5 per head shall be imposed in all cases, which fee shall enure to the benefit of the tick eradication fund of this parish. Such seizure fee shall be paid by the owner or out of the proceeds of the sale of such animals made as herein after directed. The keeper of the pounds or quarantine pastures, at the discretion of the inspector supervising tick eradication work in this Parish, shall be entitled to compensation at the rate of .50 cents per day for every day such animals remain in pound or pasture, payable in the same manner

as the fee of the person seizing and delivering such animals. All impounded animals shall be sold from time to time at the several pounds or quarantine pastures at public auction after ten days advertisement of date hour and place of sale by two publications if in a weekly, and by three if in a daily paper published in this parish. All sales shall be made for cash and without appraisal to the last and highest bidder for what the animal will bring. All animals that have been in pound or quarantine pasture for five full days may be sold at such sales. The Sheriff of this Parish, his deputies and all constables hereby constituted Commissioners with authority to make said sales. They shall be compelled to make such sales when called upon to do so by the supervising inspector in charge of tick eradication work in the Parish. Commissioners shall receive 10% on the gross proceeds of all sales made by them as compensation for their services but in no case shall such compensation be less than \$2.50 for making any sale. out of the proceeds of such sales, the commissioner shall pay all fees, cost and expenses, retain his own commission or fees, and the balance, if any, he shall turn over to the Parish treasurer of this Parish. Impounded animals may be redeemed by their owners at any time before sale on paying all costs, charges and penalties incurred up to the time of redemption including a fee of \$1.00 per head for the commissioner if redemption be not made before day of sale. All animals siezed as aforesaid shall be dipped before being placed in a pound or quarantine pasture and as often thereafter as may be required by the supervising inspector in charge of tick eradication in this parish.

SECTION 2. All horses, mules and asses, directly exposed to or infested with cattle fever ticks in the Parish of Jefferson shall be subject to the same dipping, seizure and quarantine regulations and requirements as are cattle when exposed or infested with cattle fever ticks.

SECTION 3. Whoever shall interfere or resist with any inspector or range rider in the performance of his duties as herein defined, or shall interfere with or resist any person while driving tick infected cattle, horses or mules to a pound or quarantine pasture or dipping vat, or shall interfere or molest such animals while in pound or quarantine pasture, or shall wantonly or maliciously open, destroy or damage the enclosures of any pound or quarantine pasture or dipping vat, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and on trial or conviction shall be fined not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$50.00 or imprisonment for not less than ten days nor more than thirty days or both at the discretion of the Court.

SECTION 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Parish of Jefferson contrary or incosistent herewith and such ordinances or parts of ordinances only, be and they are repealed.

WHEREAS, The Legislature of Louisiana, has passed an act, effective July 30, 1924, providing for a deputy registrar of Voters in the eight larger Parishes in the State-Caddo, Rapides, East Baton Rouge, Calcasieu, Acadia, Jefferson, Ouachita, St. Landry.,

WHEREAS, The salaries of said Deputy Registrar of Voters are made payable one half by the State and the other half by each of the said Parishes, and

WHEREAS, the salary of the Deputy Registrar of Voters, for the Parish of Jefferson, has been fixed at six hundred (\$600.00) dollars per annum, and half payable by the Parish of Jefferson.

Authorizing the Gretna Light and Power Co., its Successors and assigns herein after called grantee, to construct, maintain and operate a light, heat and power system, and to generate vend and distribute electric energy in the Parish of Jefferson, and to describe the method of exercise of this privilege.

SECTION 1, Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana, in regular meeting assembled that the Gretna Light & Power Co., its successors and assigns shall have and is hereby granted the right power and authority to establish erect on, in, over and through the streets, highways, lanes, alley, railways and railroads, canals, and public places, in the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana all such poles wires, conductors, conduits cables and other constructions, as shall be or may become necessary and the same to locate, relocate and change to carry out the objects and purposes of said grantee, and of the grant and privilege herein created, and to extend the same as may be required for electric lights and a system of lighting by electricity and of transmission of electric energy and furnish electrical power in the Parish of Jefferson and to supply the demand therefore as the same may now or hereafter exist arise or increase, subject to the limitation and conditions in this ordinance contained provided that this grant be limited to the term of 25 years.

SECTION 2, Be it further ordained, etc., that the grantee may and if required by the Police Jury shall make and file with the Secretary of same blue prints of the routes established by it and of any changes made there on.

Section 3, Be it further ordained etc., that all lines of wires, poles, masts, cables, landing on the shore end of all cables, and construction shall be located and constructed so as not to obstruct unreasonably the public use of the streets and public places, or to interfere with commerce or travel not in such close proximity to buildings as to endanger them or the occupants there of.

Section 4, Be it further ordained etc., that all work undertaken for the purpose of this privilege and involving the tearing up of streets and highways, or in other ways interfering with traffic thereon, or their use by the public, shall be done by the Grantee under the supervision of the Parish Engineer, and when completed, the grantee shall restore such premises to their previous condition within a time specified by said engineer and failure to begin work on such restoration within three days after written notice so to do, shall authorize the Police Jury to restore the same at the cost and expense of the grantee.

Section 5, Be it further ordained Etc., that the grantee shall begin work in the section between Harvey Canal and the lower limits of the Parish of Jefferson within one year from the acceptance of this ordinance by it by notarial act, delays due to unforeseen circumstances of the matter not within the control of the grantee to be accepted therefrom.

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Section 6, Be it further ordained etc., that the charges to be made by grantee for electricity for lighting purposes shall not be more than 11 cents per kilowatt hour with a discount of 10% to be allowed for cash settlements within ten days after date of bill; the consumer to guarantee to pay a monthly service charge of 25 cents for each meter connected.

Grantee shall also have the right to charge and collect from each consumer service charge of \$1.00 per month for electricity furnished even though his bill at the rate above specified would not amount to \$1.00, this extra charge being allowed to cover meter installation, expense and service for the grantee in holding itself in readiness to furnish electricity to consumer.

The charge for electricity when used for power shall not be more than $5\frac{1}{2}$ cents per kilowatt hour. upon installation having a maximum demand of twenty-five horse power or less, there shall be a minimum charge of fifty cents per month for each electrical horse power installed and for installation having a demand in excess of twenty-five electrical horse power, said charge shall be at such special rates as may be fixed by contract and agreement between grantee and consumer.

Section 7, Be it ordained, etc., that the grantee shall indemnify and save harmless the Parish of Jefferson from all suits and actions that may be instituted against it by reason of any injury to the person or property of another resulting from negligence or on account of any act of commission or omission on the part of said grantee.

Section 8, Be it further ordained etc; that if anything in the provisions of this ordinance should result in the injury to private property or be in conflict with any right or privilege heretofore lawfully granted by the Parish of Jefferson to any person or company the grantee by its acceptance of this ordinance binds itself to hold said Parish harmless from all damages or reclamation whatsoever arising therefrom.

Section, 9, Be it further ordained etc; that wherever in this ordinance the word grantee is used, it shall be and is intended thereby to include and shall always be construed to include the grantee, its successors and assigns.

An ordinance relative to the issuance of \$500,000. public improvement road bonds in Road District No. 1, of the Parish of Jefferson, providing for the redemption of said bonds, and also for the sale thereof.

Whereas, in the pursuance of an ordinance adopted by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, acting as the governing authority of Road District No. 1, of the Parish of Jefferson, on May 7th, 1924 there was held in and throughout Road District No. 1, of the Parish of Jefferson, June 17, 1924 an election in which there was submitted to the property tax paving electors of said road District No. 1, a proposition to incur debt and issue bonds for the said Road District No. 1, for the full sum of (\$500,000) for the following purposes to-wit:

1st., To pay the proportional cost and share of the Parish of Jefferson including cost of additional right-of-way towards the construction of a hard surface road from the Protection Levee to Pollock Street of Hanson City along the Orleans Kenner Railroad Line, this road to be constructed jointly by the Louisiana Highway Commission and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, acting as the governing authority of Road District No. 1, The construction of said road to begin at Protection Levee.

2nd, To construct a hard surface road from the intersection of the Shrewsbury road and the Orleans, Kenner Railroad along Shrewsbury road to the Metairie Ridge Road and thence along the Metairie Ridge Road to the Protection Levee.

3rd, after providing for the construction of the above two roads, that an amount not exceeding the sum of \$50,000. be appropriated to construct and complete the road on the north side of L. R. & N. Railroad and running parallel thereto from Shrewsbury Road to William Street in the Town of Kenner.

4th, Whatever surplus may remain after provision has been made for the payment of the above three named roads, that said surplus be distributed equally between the Seventh, Eighth, and Ninth Wards to be used by the Police Jury for the purpose of constructing, improving and maintaining the lateral roads within

the limits of the said three wards, which comprise Road District No. 1 of the Parish of Jefferson.

Said bonds to be secured and paid by special tax to be imposed each year sufficient to pay the principal and interest due on said bonds annually, and

Whereas, said election was duly held according to law and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, acting as the governing authority of Road District No. 1, did meet on the 18th day of June, 1924, in open session, and did then and there open the ballot boxes count ballots therein, in number and amount examine and canvass the returns compile the results of said special election and declare the results of said special election to be favorable to the said proposition, and the results of said special election being duly promulgated by publication of the Proceedings of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, acting as the governing authority of Road District No. 1, declared same, in the Jefferson Democrat, the Official Journal of the Parish of Jefferson, in the issue of June 21st, 1924, and proces verbal of the canvassing of the returns of said special election being duly recorded by the Secretary of State and in the Mortgage records of the Parish of Jefferson, with the Clerk of Court, and one copy retained in the files of this Police Jury.

Now therefore, be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, acting as the governing authority of the Road District No. 1, of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular meeting assembled.

Section 1, That the President and Secretary of this Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, be and they are hereby authorized and directed to have prepared and to execute and to deliver to the purchaser thereof bonds of Road District No. 1, of the Parish of Jefferson State of Louisiana, payable to bearer, in the aggregate sum of (\$500,000), all said bonds to be of the denomination of (1,000.) each, to be dated Sept. 15, 1924, numbered from one to five Hundred (1-500), both inclusive and maturing Sept. 15th, 1923 to 1924

The regular order of business was dispensed with to allow various parties to address the Jury

Senator addressed the Jury relative to bridges across Barataria at Wagners Ferry and Bayou Souer or Goose Bayou and urged ordinance providing for same.

On motion of Mr. Fisher the following ordinance was adopted;

Be it resolved that it is the sense of the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish State of Louisiana, to submit the following to the Honorable President and members of the Louisiana State Highway Commission.

That two bridges be constructed in the Parish of our state. The first bridge should span one certain Bayou in the Parish of Jefferson

known as Little Bayou Barataria. This bridge will intersect that section on one side of the bayou known as Wagner's Ferry. The second bridge should span one certain bayou known as Bayou Desouer, or Goose Bayou. This bridge will intersect that portion of land known by all men as La fitte.

The crossings of these two bayous at the present time is being handled in an antiquated manner; by pontoon ferries drawn across by wire ropes, taking on two automobiles at a time by this means of transportation, therefore traffic is congested by these inadequate means.

These crossings are the links of the chains of excellent roads that are property of the State of Louisiana in this section, therefore the crossings to cohere as links in this great chain should be constructed so as to promote and build this section to the extent that the ultra-modern times require.

The natural resources of this section are the richest to be found in any part of our State as these roads lead to the center of industry there should be adequate means of facilitating these farmers and fisherman to that part where their lively hood depends.

It is just, in the wake of progress of the creation of splendid roads, that such means of transportation should be promoted to join the chain of that system of excellent roads which are nowhere to be found in our state as an equal.

Be it resolved, that copy of this resolution with seal of Secretary will be forwarded to the Secretary of the Louisiana State Highway Commission.

An ordinance governing use of fire hydrants connected with the water distribution mains of the Jefferson Water Company, and interference with said mains; making it a misdemeanor and providing penalty for violation hereof.

Section 1- Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson State of Louisiana, that no person other than an employee of the Jefferson Water Company Inc., and for the purpose of said Company; or

an employee of a duly constituted Fire Department, in the Employ of said Fire Department, and for the purposes of said Department, within limitation to be from time to time set and determined; or any other person bearing a permit from a properly authorized agent of the Jefferson Water Company Inc; and for a specified time and purpose, shall screw or remove any caps from any Fire Hydrants, or open or close or tamper with any Fire Hydrant, or cause same to be done.

Section 2- Be it further ordained, etc; that no person shall introduce any foreign object into any Fire Hydrant to mutilate destroy or remove any part thereof, or cause same to be done.

Section 3 - Be it further ordained, etc., that no person shall open, close or tamper with any fire hydrant with any other tool or appliance than a special 5- sided wrench which fits the operating nut of such hydrant, or cause same to be done.

Section 4- Be it further ordained etc; that no person shall leave any fire hydrant open, wasting water, unless he be an employee of the Jefferson Water Company Inc., for the purpose of said company and acting under the instruction of a duly authorized official of said company or cause same to be done.

Section 5- Be it further ordained etc; that no person other than an employee of the Jefferson Water Company Inc., acting under the instructions of a duly authorized official of said Company, shall open, close or tamper, with any valve whatever on any main or street pipeline, or corporation cocks or curb cocks, laid or operated by the Jefferson Water company Inc., or cause same to be done.

Section 6- Be it further ordained etc; that any person or persons, firm or corporations violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, in any particular, shall be subject to fine not exceeding \$25.00 or imprisonment not exceeding 30 days, or both at the discretion of any court of competent jurisdiction.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in regular session assembled, that for every business of selling merchandise at retail and not otherwise provided for by this ordinance, whether the business be conducted as principal, agent or on commission or otherwise, the license as herein fixed, graded and levied for the year 1925, shall be as follows to-wit:

Section 1, When gross sales exceed \$75,000, the license shall be \$90,

Section 2, When the gross sales are \$50,000 or more, and under \$75,000 the license shall be \$60.

Section 3, When Gross sales are \$40,000 or more, and under \$50,000, the license shall be \$50.

Section 4, When gross sales are \$30,000 or more and under \$40,000, the license shall be \$35.

Section 5, When gross sales are \$25,000 or more and under \$30,000, license shall be \$30.

Section 6, When Gross sales are \$20,000 or more, and under \$25,000 license shall be \$25.

Section 7, When gross sales are \$15,000 or more, and under \$20,000 license shall be \$20.

Section 8, When gross sales are \$10,000 or more, and under \$15,000, license shall be \$15.

Section 9, When gross sales are \$5,000 or more and under \$10,000, license shall be \$10.

Section 10, When gross sales are less than \$5,000 license shall be \$5.

Be it further ordained, etc. that all persons, associations, firms and corporations engaged in the sale of soda water, ice cream, confections, soda pop, coco-cola, chera-cola, garpico other similar soft drinks or beverages or refreshments shall pay license based on the gross annual sales and such license are hereby fixed and graded as follows: to-wit:

1. When gross sales exceed \$10,000 license shall be \$50,
2. When gross sales are \$8,000 or more, and less than \$10,000, license shall be \$40.
3. When gross sales are \$6,000 or more, and less than \$8,000, license shall be \$30.
4. When gross sales are \$4,000 or more, and less than \$6,000, license shall be \$25.
5. When gross sales are \$3,000 or more and less than \$4,000 license shall be \$20.
6. When gross sales are \$2,000 or more and less than \$3,000, license shall be \$15.
7. When gross sales are \$1,000 or more, or less than \$2,000, license shall be \$10.
8. When gross sales are less than \$1,000 license shall be \$5.

Be it further ordained, etc., that all persons, associations of persons, firms, or corporations engaged in the sale of retail, or distilled, spirituous vinous, malt, cereal or other liquors or beverages containing any alcoholic content, shall pay license based on gross annual sales, and each separate establishment at which such beverages are sold or retailed whether conducted as principal agent or distributor, shall pay a separate license, which are hereby fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

1. When gross sales shall exceed \$10,000 license shall be \$100.
2. When said sales are \$5,000. or more, or less than \$10,000 license shall be \$50.
3. When gross sales are \$2,500. or more, and less than \$5,000 the license shall be \$37.50
4. When gross sales are less than \$2,500 license shall be \$25.

Nothing in the ordinance shall be construed to authorize the issuance of a license for the sale of any liquor or beverage, the sale of which is prohibited by law or ordinance of the United States or the State of Louisiana or of any municipality or other sub divisions thereof.

Provided that a person, association firm or corporation engaged in the business mentioned in this section having a proper license may sell in connection with said business any of the commodities mentioned in the preceding section of the ordinance without paying a separate license but the total sales from such combined business shall determine the amount of license to be paid according to the classification in this section.

Provided further, however, that the business of retail merchant and the sales of such soft drinks, or of alcoholic shall be considered separate business, and a separate license shall be charged.

Be it further ordained, etc., that there be and is hereby levied a license tax, upon each person, association of persons or business firms, partnership or corporation engaged in or pursuing any business whereby horses are run for purses or where any entrance fee is charged for the entrance of the said horses in a race, for each and every race track so operated, which said license shall be graduated upon daily receipts from admissions paid by spectators and entrance charged for the entrance of said horses in the said races as follows:

First Class - When said admission by spectators and entrance fee for horses racing amount to \$12,000. or more per day, the license tax shall be \$250. per day for the time of the race meeting.

Second Class - When said paid admission by spectators and entrance fee for horses racing amount to \$10,000 and less than \$12,000. The license tax shall be \$200. per day for the time of duration of the race meeting.

Be it further ordained Etc., that all the provisions of the general license law of 1920 and the special race track license law of 1920 be adopted and made a part of this ordinance.

Reading of the minutes of the previous meeting were dispensed with. Regular order of business was deferred to allow various parties to

address the Jury.

Senator Jules G. Fisher, called attention, to the Jury of the proposed change in right of way of the Intercoastal Canal from Harvey Canal to Bayou Plaquemine, and the following resolution was adopted;

On motion of Mr. Fisher, seconded by Mr. Cantrelle, the following resolution was adopted;

Whereas, in Times Picayune of the 7th, day of January appears a story emanated from Washington, D. C. to the effect that the Congress of the United States Through its duly authorized committee handling the subject matter, had changed the proposed route of the Intercoastal Canal, suggesting Bayou Plaquemine as the route instead of the Harvey Canal, and,

Whereas, the citizens of this Parish are vitally interested in selection of Harvey Canal as the proper route for the said Intercoastal Canal, and,

Whereas, the citizens of this Parish and surrounding territory, including the city of New Orleans, have lent their best efforts for the purpose of assisting the Government in securing rights of ways and in enlarging the present water ways, through which the proposed Intercoastal Canal supposed to go, and,

Whereas, this Police Jury has, at the request of the United States Government, spent its money in obtaining said right of ways, in order that short cuts might be made in the lower water-ways of Louisiana, for the purpose of facilitating the construction of the Intercoastal Canal, so as to make the route as short as possible, and,

Whereas, since the work has been started the United States Government has purchased at a cost of some \$500,000,00 the present Harvey Canal, located in this Parish, as one of the links in the said Intercoastal Canal, and,

Whereas, Harvey Canal due to its location and proximity to the city of New Orleans, is the logical route for the proposed Intercoastal Canal's entrance into the City of New Orleans due to the fact that the Harvey route will serve a larger territory of Louisiana that cannot

be served by the Plaquemine route, and,

Whereas, Harvey Canal is directly opposite the City of New Orleans and all freight coming through said Canal can be deposited on the wharves at New Orleans within ten minutes after the boats carrying such freight leaves the locks of the said Harvey Canal, and,

Whereas, Bayou Plaquemine is over 100 miles distant from the city of New Orleans, and the Territory between said Bayou Plaquemine and the City of New Orleans is served by large packet boats, and the territory between said points will be in no wise benefited by the adoption of the Plaquemine route, whereas if the Harvey route is adopted water transportation will be the means of affording an outlet for farm products heretofore disadvantaged, because of inadequate facilities for getting same to the market of New Orleans, and,

Whereas, the Harvey route will also serve territory that is inaccessible to railroads, and will open up an immense territory of land heretofore idle;

Request of Mr. Mc.Cullen, por Gulf refining Co., to construct a draw bridge across public road at Companies property Gretna, was granted subject to the approval of the parish engineer.

Edw, M Reim, presented petition of property owners asking that certain land be expropriated for public road purpose on 25th street from Lafayette Ave, to Hero property line Gretna according to plan of H. L. Zander, made July 12th, 1918. then engineer of the City of

Gretna, On motion by Mr. Cantrelle, seconded by Mr. Erlinger, the matter was referred to the District Attorney.

Mr. Reim appealed to the Jury for better drainage in the rear of Gretna asked that a ditch be dug to take off standing water. On motion duly seconded the matter was referred to the Police Juror of the 3rd ward.

Mr. I. B. Renneyson, representing the Claiborne Avenue Realty Co., asked the closing of certain streets, and the widening of certain streets, in Claiborne Gateway subdivision. in Shrewsbury. On motion by Mr. Ottermann, seconded by Mr. Toledano, the following ordinance was adopted;

Streets dedicated in Claiborne Sub-Division.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana that the following described streets be and the same are hereby dedicated in the following manner to-wit;

(1) a certain strip 50 feet in width extending from Jefferson Highway north to Berwick Street, designated on the annexed sketch by the name Rencopasse Court.

(2) A strip of ground 7feet in width on the southern edge of the Jefferson Highway, which said strip being at the western edge of the Hullon Street, and measures thence in a westerly direction 180 feet front on Jefferson Highway between equal and parallel lines.

(3), A certain strip of ground on the northern edge of Jefferson Highway, which strip of ground measures 25 feet front on said northern extremity of Jefferson Highway.

(4), A certain strip of ground 50 feet in width and 480 feet in depth between equal and parallel lines, which said strip represents the continuation of Sondorn Street, in the Parish of Jefferson and connects the suburbs, Harlem, & Shrewsbury.

(5) Two streets shown on the annexed sketch and designated respectively as Claiborne Court, and Shrewsbury Court, which connect the public road paralling the Mississippi River with Jefferson Highway.

And the said Claiborne Avenue extention Realty Company Inc; through its president acting for an on behalf of said Company, declares that said Company is the owner of the above described property.

Whereas, the president of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson declares that it is the owner of the strips of ground designated on the annexed sketch by the letters "A" "B" "C" "D" "E" "F" "G" "H", and also by the letters, "I" "J" "K" "L" "M" "N", and "P", which strips were formerly portions of Clermont Street, and Hawkston Street, that the said Police Jury of Jefferson is also the owner of the strip of ground shown on the annexed sketch lying between Jefferson Highway and Berwick Street, which was the former extention of Julien Street connecting Jefferson Highway with Berwick Street.

Whereas, Charles A. Cody, acting for and on behalf of said Company, done by these presents transfer to the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson all of the above described property owned by the said Claiborne Avenue extention Realty Company, Inc.,

(Over)

and the said Police Jury dedicate the same forever to be used as a public road for the use and benefit of all parties in interest in perpetuity.

Whereas, the said William E. Strehlo, who acting in his capacity as president of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, declares that in return and consideration of the above dedication, the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, does hereby transfer to the Claiborne Avenue Extention Realty Company Inc; all of the above described property which is owned by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson.

In consideration of this exchange, the parties hereto hereby agree to warrant forever and defend the titles to the property herein conveyed against all legal claims and demands whatever.

The parties do moreover transfer unto each other all and singular the right and action of warranty to which each is or may be entitled against any and all former owners and proprietors of the properties herein conveyed or exchanged hereby subrogating each of all the said rights and actions to be by them enjoyed and exercised in the same manner as they might have been be either of the parties hereto.

There is annexed to this act of dedication and exchange a plan made by Elbert G. Sandoz, dated May 11th, 1925, which plans is made part hereof.

Whereas, all streets to be dedicated and meet with the new policy adopted by the Police Jury, same being paved hard surface roads. This entire track has no rights of way or no streets have been previously dedicated to the Parish.

Streets Dedicated

Therefore, be it resolved by the Police Jury that these streets be accepted and dedicated as per ordinance of October 5, 1921, and May, 13th, 1925. to the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson.

Roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance the vote resulted as follows;

Mr. H. V. Deckbar, reported the necessity of plan of survey from the State Highway Department for rights of way for hard surface road from Hanson City to Protection Levee, and also assessed valuation of land to be taken for said rights of ways, and on motion duly seconded

the secretary was instructed to furnish right of way committee with assessed valuation of each property within the route of said hard surface road,

On request of A. P. Keator, of the Louisiana purchase Highway, the Jury appropriated \$100.00 for marking highways and for publicity, provided same is legal.

The following agreement was reached with the committee appointed by the Police Jury to confer with the Highway Department relative to constructing hard surface road from Hanson City to Protection Levee,

The Louisiana Highway Commission in conference with the committee of the Police Jury, including District Attorney, and others agreed to the following.

That the bids for paving the section of highway between Kenner, and Shrewsbury, (State Project 42--A. & B.) which were to have been received at 11, A M, April, 28th, 1925, will not be received but, the entire project between Pollock Avenue, in the town of Hanson City, and Protection Levee, will be advertised at one time.

The advertisement covering the entire section of highway will include;

(1) paving the section between William Street in the town of Kenner and Shrewsbury.

(2) Grading and drainage structures and temporary gravel surface between William Street in the town of Kenner, and Pollock Avenue in the town of Hanson City.

(3), Grading drainage structures and temporary gravel surface from Shrewsbury to Protection Levee.

(4), Paving the section between William Street in the town of Kenner, and Pollock Avenue in the town of Hanson City.

(5), Paving the section between Shrewsbury and Protection Levee.

It was further agreed that the paving of two sections, one between William street in the town of Kenner, and Pollock avenue, in the Town of Hanson City, and the other between Shrewsbury and Protection Levee, while included in the same contract will be held up pending the proper seasoning and compacting of the sub-grades and temporary gravel surface on these two sections.

It was further agreed that the plans and specifications covering the above will be prepared as soon as possible and a copy thereof will be furnished the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, so that all rights-of-way may be acquire and so that the arrangements may be made for moving the Orleans, Traction Company's tracks where necessary. The contract covering this project will not be let until all rights-of-way matters, including the moving of tracks, have been settled.

The regular order of business was then resumed.

Report of Parish treasurer was received.

Report of finance committee was read and bills approved ordered paid.

Sum of \$3.00 received for issuance of brake test licenses was ordered turned over to treasurer for deposit in general fund.

Secretary reported no bids for repairs to courthouse and said report was ordered filed.

Report of Engineer Payne relative to North Line Highway along L. R. & N. was received and on motion of Mr. Toledano seconded by Mr. Ottermann. Committee composed of Jurors 7th, 8th, and 9th wards with engineer was ordered to take up matter of extending canal No. 6 as far as station 255

plus zero with 4th Jefferson Drainage District.

Communication from Jefferson Trust & Savings Bank relative to interest on Loan was received.

Communication was received from District Attorney relative to Public Health Matter.

Communication from State Highways Department relative to hard surface road in 7th, 8th and 9th wards and speed limits was received.

Communication from Bryson Vallas, Engineer State Highway department relative to repairing 17th street canal Bridge was received.

Mrs. P. Molaison and Mrs. Irene Burlet were given Court order for maintenance at \$20 per month each for one year, to be paid out of Widows and orphans fund as per budget.

Clerk of Court was granted court order for \$50 per month increase in expense account beginning May 1, 1925.

Petition was presented of property holders asking appointment of Mr. Geo Heebe as member of 4th Jefferson Drainage District; petition was presented also for re-appointment of Mr. J. B. Dauenhauer Sr., as member of said Board and on motion of Mr. Fisher seconded by Mr. Erlinger petitions were ordered tabulated and action laid over to next meeting.

Engineer Zander made verbal report on fire plugs from property owners of Metairie.

Mr. J. Rohr reported that nothing definite was done by fire commission of New Orleans relative to fire apparatus from 7th ward residents, but that aid was assured in near future.

Road Superintendent and Parish engineer were ordered to repair and gravel bridge over 17th street canal.

On motion duly seconded it was resolved to receive action of the Jury April. 18th, 1925. whereby the L. R. & N. Illinois Central and Y. M. & V. Railroads were instructed to provide road crossings in J. H. Little Farms, Parish of Jefferson.

John Ledeaux, was named assistant road superintendent in District No. 1, at a salary of \$125.00 per month beginning May 15th, 1925.

The secretary was instructed to request Mr. Auer secretary of the Jefferson water Co., to be present at the next meeting of the Jury. and was instructed to notify H. C. Leake president of the Ponchartrain Levee Board to fill Barrow pit at protection Levee.

Messrs Jno Ernst, A. Ernst, and P. J. Bordos, were named additional members of the right of way committee to secure land for hard surface road from Hanson City to protection Levee.

Mr. H. V. Dockbar reported the following corporations willing to donate right of way for the proposed hard surface road, T. C. R. R. New Orleans Compress Co., and American Creosote Works, and the secretary was instructed to request of the said corporations to donate necessary land for said highway.

On motion by Mr. Ottermann seconded by Mr. Toledano, it was resolved that right of way committee be and is hereby authorized to secure proposal covering land for right of way for proposed hard surface road between Shrewsbury and Protection Levee, and that in securing proposals

that a fixed price be set in proposal for the necessary land. The whole to be subject to acceptance by this Police Jury, provided where fences and buildings are to be removed the cost of same to be included in proposal.

Auto
Speed Limit

An ordinance fixing the limit of speed at which Automobiles may be driven through towns and villages and on the public highway outside of villages and on bridges of this Parish, and to prohibit the use of spot lights;

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury that hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person, or a member or employee of a firm, or a member of or employee of a corporation to drive or operate an Automobile on the public roads which traverse any town or of the villages in the Parish at greater speed than fifteen (15) miles per hour for a distance of one eighth (1-8) of a mile, or at a rate of speed greater than ten (10) miles an hour where the

Chauffeur's view of the road traffic is obstructed whether upon approaching the intersection of highways on roads or in traversing a railway or highway crossing intersection or in going around a corner or curve in a street or highway.

Sec. 2, Be it further ordained, etc, by the Police Jury that it shall be unlawful hereafter for any person, or a member or employee of a firm, or a member or employe of a corporation to drive or operate an automobile on the public roads outside of villages or towns of this Parish at a greater speed than thirty-five (35) miles per hour for a distance greater than one half (1/2) a mile continuously.

Sec. 3- Be it further ordained etc., that it shall be unlawful for any person, or a member or a employe of a firm, or a member or employe of a corporation to operate an automobile over the public bridges of the Parish at a greater speed than ten (10) miles per hour.

Sec. 4- Be it further ordained etc; that from and after the passage of

this ordinance it shall be unlawful for any person, or member or employe of a firm, or a member or employe of a corporation to operate an automobile in this parish to use or operate what is commonly known as a spotlight.

Sec. 5- Be it further ordained, etc., that any persons found guilty by a court of competent jurisdiction of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than \$10. and not more than \$25. or the imprisoned for a term not more than thirty (30) days.

Sec. 6- Be it further ordained that the Police Jury shall designate some duly commissioned town marshal, deputy town marshall or deputy sheriff in the Parish of Jefferson to enforce this ordinance, and the said person so designated shall upon trial and conviction of all persons violating this ordinance be paid one half (1/2) of the fines assessed and collected from all violators to an amount not exceeding \$200 a month and that no officer other than the officer designated by Police Jury to enforce this ordinance shall be entitled to receive or be paid said fine,

Sec. 7- Be it further ordained etc; that all ordinances or part of ordinances in conflice herewith he and they are hereby be and they are hereby repealed, provided that this ordinance shall not effect persecutions now pending before the courts under and pre-existing ordinance.

Covering the laying of water, gas, or other Pipe Conduits, Poles, or any other obstruction in or upon any Street, Road or Highway in the Parish of Jefferson.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that from and after the passage of this ordinance that all persons, firms or corporations desiring to lay or construct conduits such as water, gas, air, electric conveyors, poles or other obstructions which are necessary to be located on or upon the public streets, roads or highways of the Parish of Jefferson, shall before doing so, file a map or sketch with the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, showing the point and depth at which said works are to be conducted, which map or sketch shall be subject to the approval of the Parish Engineer and of the Road Superintendent under whose direction same shall be constructed and all expenses shall be paid by the person making said construction.

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained that all obstructions now existing or placed in or upon any of the streets, roads or highways of the Parish of Jefferson which impedes of roads or the clearing of drainage ditches shall be removed from the same by road superintendent and the Parish Engineer after a lapse of thirty (30) days notice given to the person owning same that they shall be removed and all expenses incurred thereby shall be paid by the owner of said conduits constructed, etc;

Sec. 3. Be it further ordained, that any obstruction or construction placed in and upon the roads, streets, or highways of the Parish of Jefferson after the passage of this ordinance not in accordance herewith shall be removed at the expense of the owner by the road superintendent of the Parish of Jefferson.

On motion of Mr. Fisher, seconded by Mr. Ottermann, the jury met in the district court room to accommodate the large attendance for the meeting.

Senator Jules G. Fisher, presented the Police Jury through attorney J. K. Gaudet with a handsome gavel and marble block.

Mr. Dusenbury and citizens took up the matter of the Orleans Levee, Board proposed placing a concrete culvert with flood gate in Hays Canal, and on motion duly seconded same was referred to the parish Engineer, and Police Jurors of the 7th, and 8th, wards to investigate and report their findings at the next meeting, of the Jury.

On complaint of Mr. A. C. Dumestre property owner of the eighth ward in regards to drainage in said ward at certain times, Mr Ottermann, moved seconded by Mr. Bordes, that the 4th, Jefferson Drainage Board be notified to operate drainage pumps at the proper times particularly when tide is high and during heavy rains.

Mr. Geo Auer, secretary-manager of the Jefferson Water Co., appeared before the Jury, as requested and discussed water service and other matters of the Company in the 7th, and 8th, wards.

Messrs, Zuffle, and Vicknair, appeared before the Jury, and in reference to petition of property owners filed with the jury at its last meeting requesting the expropriation of enough land to provide a 70 foot wide public road across the Zuffle and Vicknair property on

25th, street from Lafayette Avenue to Copernicus Avenue, stated that they would donate the required amount of land across their property on 25th, street for a public road from Lafayette Avenue, to Copernicus, Avenue, provided provisions were made to gravel the said proposed road. and on motion duly seconded the matter was referred to juror of the 3rd. ward.

The regular order of business resumed

Report of parish auditor was received and ordered filed.

Report of the finance committee, was received and all bill approved ordered paid.

Report of the local office Bureau of animal industry was read and ordered filed.

F. T. Payne, engineer of road district "No. 1, submitted plans and specifications for hard surface road on North Line Street from Shrewsbury to Kenner, and reported Canal No. 6 not yet completed, which made it difficult to calculate excavations to closest approximation and reported that excavations shown in plans to be near enough to advertise for bids and determine lowest bidder.

On motion of Mr. Bordes seconded by Mr. Ottermann, the following resolution was adopted;

Whereas, the McWilliams Dredging Co., at present have there dredging equipment near the proposed right-of-way of the proposed road to be built from Shrewsbury to Kenner, and

Whereas it is necessary to construct a ramp about 3500 feet as a part of said proposed road, and

Whereas, said McWilliams Dredging, Co., are about to complete their work which they are now doing for the 4th, Jefferson Drainage District, and

Whereas, said McWilliams Dredging, Co., will complete its said work for the 4th, Jefferson Drainage District and remove its said equipment from said locality before the regular advertisement provided for bids on said work according to act 349 of 1924, elapses, in which event it will necessitate the floating of new equipment to said locality, and the additional cost and that by reason of emergency created thereby and in order to take advantage of the low price submitted for said work, therefore;

This property, upon which these crossings are to be installed, is owned by the J. H. Little Farms of New Orleans, Louisiana. at the present time, it is impossible to further the building of a road upon this land

until such time as the crossings are placed in, Further, the right-of-way has been cleared and these crossings are the only hindrance to the development of the necessary work that is hauling of materials with tractors and trucks to the completion of certain streets in this now sub-division.

Whereas, this road when completed should be of assistance to the Parish in the hauling of material etc., to the North Line Road to Shrewsbury, and moreover will be of great utility to the public in general, inasmuch as it will shorten the route to New Orleans by four miles.

Annexed here are found two maps determining and indicating the exact location as to where these two ramp highway crossings should be installed.

Agreement between Board of Levee Commissioners of the Orleans, District and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, relative to Hocoy's Canal.

Whereas, there has been pending for many years a controversy between the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, and the Board of Levee Commissioners of the Orleans Levee District, in reference to the flow of water from Hoyes Canal into the Seventeenth Street Canal and

Agreement with Orleans Levee Board Regards to Flood Gate in Hocoy's Canal

Whereas, on different occasions the Board of Levee Commissioners of the Orleans District, has attempted to construct flood gates, barriers, or other flood control outlets in the mouth of Hocoy's Canal in order to take precautionary measures to avoid flood waters reaching the City of New Orleans through the said Hocoy's Canal, should a cravass occur above the present protection Levee, which is located in the Parish of Jefferson, and

Whereas, the Police Jury or some of its subdivisions of Parish Government have obtained through the Courts a writ of injunction to prohibit the Board of Levee Commissioners of the Orleans, Levee District from interfering with the flow of water through Hocoy's Canal into the Seventeenth Street Canal or from in any matter interfering, damming up or putting any flood control machinery in the mouth of the said Hocoy's Canal which is a natural stream located wholly within the Parish of Jefferson, and which acts as a drainage canal for property situated in the Seventh and Eighth Wards of the Parish of Jefferson, and

Therefore, in order to set at rest all future controversy as to the damming of said Hocoy's Canal by the Board of Levee Commissioners of the Orleans, Levee District, and the repairs of the upper Protection Levee located wholly in the Parish of Jefferson, the Board of Levee Commissioners of the Orleans Levee District, Parish of Orleans, herein represented by Peter J. Flanigan, its President, hereinafter called the Party of the First part, and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson herein represented by Weaver Tolodano, its President, does hereby covenant, agree and stipulate as follows:

Witnesseth: The Board of Levee Commissioners of the Orleans Levee District hereby agrees, consents and binds itself to construct an 8 x 8 drain box with flood gate attachment in the mouth of Hocoy's Canal where the same

drains into the seventeenth street canal and agrees to pay all of the cost and expense of said construction; which said drain box and flood gate is to be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the state board of engineers and the respective engineers of the board of Levee Commissioners of the Orleans Levee District, and the police jury of the Parish of Jefferson, and in consideration of the construction and permission to construct the said flood gate at the mouth of the said Hoey's Canal herein granted to the Board of Levee Commissioners of the Orleans Levee District by the police jury of the Parish of Jefferson, it is further understood and agreed that said flood gate and said drain box is not to be dropped or closed by the Board of Levee Commissioners of the Orleans Levee District at any time or for any reason or under any circumstances except only in case of a cravass occurring on the Mississippi River above the limits of the City of New Orleans on the East Bank of the Mississippi River.

Be it further agreed and understood that the said flood gate shall further more be dropped or closed at any time upon request of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson or its president for any purpose deemed sufficient by the said Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, or its president.

Be it further agreed and understood that upon the signing of this agreement that all injunctions and court proceedings instituted or pending or in force and effect shall ipso-facto be dissolved and set aside.

This agreement made this nd day of July, in the year 1925, by and between the Mc Williams Dredging Company, a corporation organized under the laws of _____ herein represented by _____ its duly authorized _____ appearing herein by virtue of a resolution of the Board of Directors of said Corporation dated _____ a certified copy of which is annexed hereto and made a part hereof, hereinafter termed the contractor, and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, as governing authority of road district No. 1. of the Parish of Jefferson, herein appearing through Weaver R. Toledano, its president duly authorized by resolution of the

Police Jury under date of June 10th, 1925. a certified copy of which is annexed hereto and made a part hereof, hereinafter sometimes designated as the Police Jury.

WITNESSETH

That in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereafter mentioned to be performed by the parties hereto and of the payments agreed to be made, it is mutually agreed as follows;

The contractor shall furnish all materials, apparatus, machinery, equipment, labor superintendance and transportation, and shall execute, construct and finish in an expeditious, substantial and workmanlike manner to the satisfaction and acceptance of Frank T. Payne, engineer of said road district of the parish of Jefferson, all the work embraced and described in the plans of the said F. T. Payne, for the digging and extension of drainage canal No. 6, as same is designated in the plan of drainage of the Board of Commissioners of the 4th, Jefferson Drainage District of the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana, which canal is to be dug commencing from station 220 to station 255, being a distance of thirty-five hundred (3500) feet, said canal to be constructed with a width over all at the top not more than forty (40) feet and a depth of not more than seven (7) feet, all in strict accordance with the said plans and in accordance with the following general conditions, requirements, and specifications forming a part of this contract;

The work covered by this contract shall be commenced within five (5) days from the execution hereof and be completed as expeditiously as possible; time being of the essence of this contract.

And in consideration of the completion of the work described herein and the fulfillment of all of the stipulations of this agreement to the satisfaction and acceptance of the said engineer Frank T. Payne, the police jury shall pay or cause to be paid to the said contractor in full compensation for all work done and all material furnished and for all expenses incurred and damages sustained and for every matter, thing or act furnished or suffered in the performance of the work of this contract in accordance with the provisions hereof and of the instructions, orders, and direction of the engineer thereunder, except extra work, which shall be paid for as provided herein and except as in this contract otherwise specifically provided, the sum of Thirteen decimal Five (13.5) cents per cubic yard of excavation, and in addition thereto, such amounts, if any as may be due the contractor for extra work performed under the instructions, orders, and directions of the engineer as provided for herein.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

Definitions

Whenever words herein defined occur in the contract and specifications they shall have the meanings here given.

The word "District" shall mean the first road district of the parish of Jefferson.

The word "Jury" shall mean the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson.

The word "Engineer" shall mean the engineer employed by the police jury of the parish of Jefferson, as the governing authority of road district No. 1. of the said parish. or his duly authorized agent.

The word "contractor" shall mean the person, persons, partnership or corporation, whose bid for the work shall have been accepted by the jury.

The word "Surety" or "securities" shall mean the corporation or corporations which have furnished a bond to provide for the faithful performance of his contract.

BOND

The contractor shall at the time of the execution and delivery of this contract and before the taking effect of the same in other respects, furnish and deliver to the jury a written bond of indemnity to the amount Three Thousand (3000.00) Dollars in form and substance and with surety thereon satisfactory and acceptable to the jury, to insure the faithful and prompt performance by the contractor of all the covenants and agreements on the part of the contractor contained in this contract, and further conditioned as may be otherwise provided by law.

(over)

this bond shall remain in force and effect for the full amount or such smaller amounts as may at any time be specified by the engineer.

CONTRACTORS UNDERSTANDING

It is understood and agreed that the contractor has, by careful examination, satisfied himself as to the nature and location of the work, conformation of the ground, the character quality and quantity of the materials to be encountered, the character of equipment and facilities needed preliminary to and during the prosecution of the work, the general and local conditions, and all other matters which can in any way affect the work under this contract. No verbal agreement or conversation with any officer, agent or employee of the police jury, either before or after the execution of this contract, shall effect or modify any of the terms or obligations herein contained.

ASSIGNMENT

The contractor shall not let or transfer this contract or any part thereof (except for the delivery of material) without consent of the jury in writing. Such consent, if given, shall not release or relieve the contractor from any of his obligations and liabilities.

SUPERINTENDENCE

The contractor shall constantly superintend all the work embraced in this contract, in person or by a duly authorized manager acceptable to the jury.

INDEMNITY

The contractor shall indemnify and save harmless the district from and against all losses and all claims, demands, payments, suits, actions, recoveries and judgments of every nature and description brought or recovered against it be reason of any act or omission of the said contractor, his agents or employes, in the execution of the work or in consequence of any negligence or carelessness in guarding the same, and he shall carry Employes Compensation Insurance in an amount sufficient to protect the work and the jury.

LABOR AND MATERIAL CLAIMS AND LIENS

The contractor shall discharge all claims for work done and material furnished in the prosecution of the work and shall, upon request furnish the jury with satisfactory evidence that all persons who have done work or furnished material under this contract have been fully paid for such work or material, and incase such evidence is demanded and not furnished

such amount as the jury may consider necessary to meet the claims of the person aforesaid may be retained from any moneys due or to become due the contractor until satisfactory evidence is furnished that all liabilities have been fully discharged. The failure, however to retain such amount or if too small an amount be retained, shall not release the contractor of said surety from liability.

ORDER AND DISCIPLINE

The contractor shall designate in writing to the Engineer a representative to receive and carry out the Engineers instructions and order, the contractor shall at all times enforce strict discipline and good order among his employees and any employes of the Contractor who shall appear to be incompetent disorderly or intemperate, or in any other way disqualified for or unfaithful to the work instructed to him shall be discharged immediately on the request of the Engineer, and he shall not again be employed on the work without the Engineer's written consent.

Determination of Quantities

The Engineer shall make all measurements and determine all quantities and amounts of work done and materials furnished.

Charges and alterations.

The Jury reserves the right to make any alterations, elimination or additions that it may deem necessary in the line, location and dimensions for the work to be done, or any part thereof, and to make any variations in the quantity of work to be done, provided that any such alterations, eliminations and additions shall not increase or decrease the total aggregate amount of work to be done under this contract more than 25 per cent, or materially alter the general character of the work as a whole so that the installation of a different equipment is made necessary.

If such changes diminish the quantity of work to be done, they shall not constitute a claim for damages for loss of anticipated profits on the work dispensed with. If by reason of changes the amount of work is increased, such increase shall be paid for according to the quantities actually done and at the unit prices established for such work under the contract.

Power of Engineer.

The Engineer shall have power to reject or condemn all work or material which does not conform to this contract; to direct the application of forces to any portion of the work which, in his judgment requires it; to order the force increased or diminished, and to decide questions which arise between the parties relative to the execution of the work.

Adjustment of Dispute.

All questions or controversies which may arise between the contractor and the Jury, under or in reference to this contract, shall be subject to the decision of the Engineer, and his decision shall be final and conclusive upon both parties.

Extension of Time.

Delays due to causes beyond the control of the Contractor other than those that, in the opinion of the Engineer, reasonably would be expected to occur in connection with the performance of the work, may entitle the Contractor to an extension of time for completing the work sufficient to compensate for such delay. No extension of time shall be granted, however,

-unless the contractor shall, within fifteen (15) days from the beginning of the delay, notify the Engineer in writing so such delay, and of the time of beginning and the cause of the same, After work is resumed, the Engineers will determine the extension of time, if any, that shall be allowed the contractor.

Hindrances and Delays.

The Contractor shall bear all loss or damage for hinderances or delays, from any cause, during the progress of any part of the work under this contract, and also all loss or damage arising out of the nature of the work to be done or from the action of the elements, or from any unforeseen conditions encountered in connection with the work, or from any other cause whatever, and no charge other than that included in this Contract price for the work shall be made by the Contractor against the District for such loss or damage.

Extra Work.

No bill or claim for extra work on material shall be allowed or paid unless the doing of such extra work or the furnishing of such extra material shall have been authorized in writing by the Engineer, who may either fix a unit price or a lump-sum price, or may, if he so elects, provide that the price shall be determined by the actual cost, to which shall be added 10 per cent to cover general expense and superintendence, profits, contingencies, use of tools contractor's risk and liability, If the Contractor shall perform any work or furnish any material which is not provided for in this contract, or which was not authorized in writing by the Engineer, said Contractor shall receive no compensation for such work or material so furnished, and does hereby release and discharge the Jury from any liability therefor.

If the contractor shall proceed with such extra work or the furnishing of such extra material after receiving the written authority therefor, as hereinbefore provided, then such work or material stated in the written authority of the Engineer, shall be covered governed and controlled by all the terms and provisions of this contract, subject to such prices as may be agreed upon or fixed by the Engineer.

If the Contractor shall decline or fail to perform such extra work or furnish such extra material as authorized by the Engineer in writing, as the aforesaid, the Jury may then arrange for the performance of the work in any manner it may see fit, the same as if this contract had not been executed, and the Contractor shall not interfere with such performance of the work.

Abandonment, Assignment, Delay or Violation of Contract.

If the contractor shall abandon the work or shall assign or sublet the work to be done under this contract, or any part thereof except in the manner hereinbefore specified or if he shall become bankrupt, if he violates any of the conditions or agreements of this contract, or if he fails to maintain a satisfactory rate of progress in the execution of the work, the jury may notify the contractor in writing not to proceed with the work or such part thereof as the jury may designate. A copy of such notice shall be given to the Contractors Surety.

This surety may then at its option, but within fifteen (15) days after receiving such notice, proceed with the work or that portion thereof on which the jury has ordered the contractor not to proceed, or may with the written consent of the jury, sublet the work thus taken over. The Surety in such event shall be subrogated to all the rights and

interest of the contractor arising out of and shall be subject to all the terms of this contract.

COMPLETION OF WORK BY JURY.

In case the surety does not within the said fifteen (15) days exercise its option to proceed with the work on which the jury has ordered the contractor not to proceed, then the jury shall have the right to complete, by contract, or otherwise as it may determine, the work on any part thereof and shall have the right to take possession of and use any of the material, equipment, or property of any kind provided by the contractor for the purpose of the work, and to procure other materials and equipment for the completion of the same, and to charge to the contractor all expenses incidental to the completion of the work. The contractor shall not be entitled to any further payment for any work on which he has been notified by the Jury not to proceed, until such work be wholly completed. The actual cost incurred by the jury in completing the work shall then be charged to the contractor, should such cost be less than the sum that would have been payable under this contract, if the same had been completed by the contractor then the contractor shall received payment in the amount of the difference; and should such cost exceed the amount that would have been payable under the contract if the same had been completed by the contractor, then the contractor or his surety shall pay the amount of such excess to the district.

CURRENT ESTIMATES

So long as the work herein contracted for is prosecuted in accordance with the provisions of this contract, and with such progress as may be satisfactory to the engineer, the said engineer will on or about the first, and fifteenth days of each month, make an approximate estimate of the amount and nature of the work done since the previous estimate, and the amount of said estimate after deducting 20 per cent thereof, shall be due and payable to the contractor at the office of the treasurer of the district on or about the 5th, and 20th, of said month.

ACCEPTANCE

The work shall be inspected for acceptance by the jury promptly upon receipt of notice in writing that the work is ready for such inspection.

FINAL ESTIMATE

Upon the completion and acceptance of the work the engineer shall execute a certificate over his signature that the whole work provided for in his agreement has been completed and accepted by him under the terms and conditions thereof, whereupon the entire balance found to be due to the contractor, including, said retained percentage, shall be paid to the contractor within fifteen (15) days after the date on said final certificate, Before the time of payment of said final estimate the contractor shall submit evidence satisfactory to the engineer that all payrolls, material bills, and outstanding indebtedness in connection with this work have been paid.

This agreement shall insure to the benefit of and be binding upon the legal representatives and successors of the parties respectively.

And now to these presents, comes and intervenes _____ hereinafter called the surety and takes cognizance of the above and foregoing contract and hereby declares that it hereby binds and obligates itself as surety, jointly, severally and in solido with the Contractor the Mc Williams Dredging Company, into the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, acting as the governing authority of road district No 1, of the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana, in the full sums of Three Thousand (3000.00) Dollars lawful money of the United States.

The condition of this bond is such that should the contractor well and truly perform the above contract and well and truly pay all sub-contractors, material men, workmen, furnishers of supplies and otherwise comply with the obligations imposed upon the said contractor by law, then this bond shall be null and void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect.

Payne, special engineer of the Police Jury, in said road district, the clearing of a right of way commencing at approximately Station No 86 to Station No. 104, clearing a strip fifty (50) feet wide a distance of approximately eighteen hundred (1800) feet; thence from station No 104, to station No. 108, clearing a strip seventy (70) feet wide a distance of four hundred (400) feet east of Jews Ditch; thence from station No. 108 clearing approximately to station No. 220 all of the trees, underbrush, swamp growth and all obstructions a strip twenty (20) feet wide over a distance of eleven thousand two hundred (11,200) feet being approximately 6.2 square acres; thence, clearing eighteen hundred (1800) feet One hundred and twenty (120) feet wide from station No. 220 to station 238, being approximately 5.0 square acres, all as will more fully appear by reference to plan of Frank T. Payne, which as annexed hereto and made a part hereof.

The work covered by this contract shall be commenced within two days from the execution hereof and be completed as expeditiously as possible, the said George Thompson agreeing at all times to have right-of-way fully cleared one Thousand (1000) feet in advance of the dredges and as directed by the engineer, time being of the essence of this contract.

And in consideration of the completion of the work described herein and the fulfillment of all stipulations of this agreement, to the satisfaction and acceptance of the said engineer, the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, shall pay or cause to be paid to the said George Thompson in full compensation for all work done, all material furnished, all expenses incurred and damages sustained for every matter, thing or act, furnished or suffered in the performance of the work of this contract in accordance with the provisions hereof and of the construction, orders and directions of the engineer thereunder, a sum equal to the number of superficial acres cleared as shown by engineers measurements multiplied by the price per acre for such clearing vis; One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars per superficial acre, and in addition thereto, such amount, if any as may be due the said George Thompson, for extra work performed under the instructions orders and directions of the engineer, as provided for herein.

The Said George Thompson hereby agrees to indemnify and save harmless the Police Jury from and against all losses or claims, demands, payments, suits, actions, recoveries, and judgments of every nature description brought or recovered against it by reason of any act or omission of the said George Thompson his agents or employes in the execution of the work or in consequence of any negligence or carelessness in guarding the same, and he shall carry employees Compensation and insurance in an amount sufficient to protect the work and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, acting as the governing authority of road district No. 1.

(over)

The said George Thompson further agrees to discharge all claims for work done and material furnished in the prosecution of the work, and upon request furnished to the police jury satisfactory evidence that all persons who have done work or furnished materials under this contract have been fully paid for such work or materials, and in case such evidence is demanded and not furnished, such amount as the police jury may consider necessary to meet the claims of persons aforesaid may be retained from any moneys due or to become due the said Geo. Thompson, until satisfactory evidence is furnished that all liabilities have been fully discharged, the failure however to retain such amount, or if to small amount be retained, shall not release the said George Thompson, or his surety from liability.

It is understood that the engineer shall make all measurements and determine all quantities and amount of work done and material furnished, and the Police Jury as such governing authority, reserve the right to make any alterations, changes, eliminations or additions as it may deem necessary in the whole or any part of the said work or any quantity and the engineer shall have power to reject or condemn all work or materials which do not conform to the contract and to order the force increased or decreased and to decide questions which arise between the parties to this contract relative to the execution of the work, and his decision shall be final and conclusive upon the both parties,

Delays due to the causes beyond the control of the said Geo. Thompson, other than those reasonably to be expected in connection with the performance of the work, may entitle the said Geo. Thompson to an extension of time for completing the work, sufficient to compensate for such delays, but no extension of time shall be granted unless the said Thompson shall within Ten (10) days from the beginning of the delay notify the engineer in writing of such delays and of the time of beginning and the cause of the same. After the work is resumed the engineer will determine the extension of time, if any, that shall be allowed to the said Thompson.

No bill or claim for extra work or material shall be allowed or paid unless the same shall have been authorized in writing by the engineer and the price therefor shall be fixed and determined by the engineer, at either a unit price or a lump-sum-price. If the said Thompson shall perform any work or furnish any material not provided for in this contract, or not authorized for in writing by the engineer, he shall receive no compensation therefor.

If the said Thompson shall abandon the work or shall assign or sublet the work to be done under this contract, or any part thereof, except in the manner herein specified, or if he shall become bankrupt, or if he violates any of the conditions, or agreements of this contract, or if he fails to maintain a satisfactory rate of progress in the execution of the work, the Police Jury may notify the said Thompson in writing not to proceed with the work or such part thereof as the Police Jury may designate. A copy of such notice shall be given to the said George Thompson's Surety.

The surety may then, at its option, but within fifteen (15) days after receiving such notice, proceed with the work, of that portion thereof on which the Police Jury has ordered the said Thompson not to proceed or may with the written consent of the police jury sublet the

work thus taken over. The surety, in such event, shall be subrogated to all the rights and interest of the said Thompson arising out of, and shall be subject to all the terms of this contract.

In case the surety does not within fifteen (15) days exercise its option to proceed with the work on which the police jury has ordered the said Thompson not to proceed, then the police jury shall have the right to complete by contract or otherwise, as it may determine, the work or any part thereof, and charge the said Thompson all of the charges incidental to the completion of said work, and the said Thompson and his surety agree to pay such amount as may be found to be due.

The Engineer shall make an estimate of the amount and value of the work done from time to time from the beginning of the work, and as the work progresses and after deducting 20% thereof, the Police Jury shall pay the said Thompson at the Police Jury Meeting in the month succeeding said estimate, provided said estimate is properly approved by the Finance Committee.

Upon the completion and acceptance of the work by the Police Jury, the Engineer shall execute a certificate that the work has been completed and accepted by him under the terms and conditions hereof, whereupon the entire balance found to be due to the said Thompson, including the said retained percentage, shall be paid to the said Thompson within Fifteen (15) days after date of said final certificate. Before the time of payment of said final estimate the said Thompson shall submit evidence satisfactory to the engineer and the Police Jury that all pay-rolls, material bills and outstanding indebtedness in connection with this work have been paid.

This agreement shall inure, to the benefit and be binding upon the legal representatives and successors of the parties respectfully.

And now to these presents comes and intervenes (The Indemnity Insurance Company of North America) hereinafter called the Surety, and takes Cognizance of the above and foregoing contract, and hereafter declares that it hereby binds itself as Surety, jointly, severally and in solido, with the Contractor, George Thompson unto the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson acting as the Governing authority of Road District No. 1, thereof, in the full sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars lawful money of the United States.

The condition of this bond is such that should the said contractor, George Thompson, well and truly perform the above contract and well and truly pay all sub-contractors material men, workmen, furnishers of supplies, and other wise comply with the obligations imposed upon said contractor, George Thompson by law, then this bond is to be null and void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect.

Section, 1, Be it ordained by the police jury of the Parish of Jefferson that from and after the passage of this ordinance it shall be unlawful for any person, persons, firm, or corporation to operate a race track in the parish of Jefferson where dogs are used in running races, unless and until said person, persons, firm or corporation shall have secured from the police jury of the Parish of Jefferson a permit for the operation of such race track.

Section, 2, Be it further ordained, that any person, persons, firm or corporation desiring to maintain, or operate a dog race track, shall prior to the operation thereof, file a written request with the secretary of the police jury of the Parish of Jefferson, with a plan of the proposed establishment designation of its location and a description of the method of betting and the amount of purse to be offered and the entrance fee and admission to be charged and at the next regular, or special meeting of said police jury, following the filing of said application, the said police jury may, by resolution, either grant, or, refuse said permit.

Section, 3, Be it further ordained, that any person, persons, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed a public nuisance and shall be fined not less than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars, nor more than Twenty five (\$25.00) Dollars, or, be imprisoned in the parish jail for not less than Ten (10) nor more than Thirty (30) Days at the discretion of the court for each and every day said dog race track is operated in violation of this ordinance shall be considered a separate and distinct offense and subject to a separate penalty.

Section 4, Be it further ordained, that in addition to the penalties herein set forth, the district attorney shall, and is hereby instructed and directed on behalf of this police jury, to institute civil injunction proceedings to abate said nuisance.

Amendment to License on Race Track where Dogs are Run

Race Tracks

An ordinance amending the license ordinance of this police jury for the year 1925, adopted at a meeting of this police jury on November 12th, 1924, so as to include a license tax on race track where dogs are run.

Section, 1, Be it ordained, by the police jury of the Parish of Jefferson that the license ordinance of this police jury for the year 1925, adopted on November 12th, 1924, particularly the section relating to race tracks on page 52 of the minute book be amended so as to read as follows;

Be it further ordained etc., that there be and is hereby levied a license tax upon each person, association of persons, or business firms, partnership or corporation engaged in or pursuing any business whereby horses or dogs are run for purse or where any entrance fee is charged for the entrance of said horses or dogs in a race, for each and every race track so operated, which said license shall be graduated upon daily receipts from admissions paid by spectators and entrance fees charged for the entrance of said horses or dogs in the said races as follows;

First class- when said admission fees by spectators and entrance fee for horses or dogs racing amount to \$12,000.00 or more per day, the license tax shall be \$250.00 per day for the time of the race meeting.

Second class- when said admission fees by spectators and entrance fee for horses or dogs racing amount to \$10,000.00 and less than \$12,000.00 the license tax shall be \$200.00 per day for the time of duration of the race meeting.

Third class- when said paid admission by spectators and entrance fee for horses or dogs racing amount to less than \$10,000.00 the license tax shall be \$100.00 per day for the time of duration of the race meeting.

Roll called on the adoption of the above ordinance the vote resulted as follows;

An ordinance by Mr. Dauenhauer, seconded by Mr. Erlinger, making it unlawful for any person to drive or operate a motor vehicle on the public roads of the Parish of Jefferson, without a drivers or operator's license secured from a proper authorized person, and for such license or permit said persons shall pay the sum of Fifty (50) Cents. Mr. Ottermann moved seconded by Mr. Cantrell, an amendment to make the license fee Twenty-five (25) cents.

Roll being called on the motion to amend and make the license fee Twenty-five cents, the vote resulted as follows,

ORDINANCE

Auto Driver's
Licenses Ordinance
Providing for Drivers'
License

An ordinance providing for the licenseing of all operators of motor vehicles; Prescribing fees and regulations; fixing a penalty; repealing all ordinances in conflict; providing further that this ordinance become effective on October 1st, 1925.

Whereas, it is dangerous to the public safty for incompetent and physically unfit persons to drive motor vehicles on the streets or roads of the Parish of Jefferson, and there are certain costs necessary and incidental to provide the proper regulations and examinations of all persons to drive motor vehicles.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the police jury of the parish of Jefferson, that no person shall after October 1st, 1925, drive in the Parish of Jefferson, any motor driven vehicle upon any street or road in the parish of Jefferson, unless said party shall have been licensed so to do, in accordance with the provisions and terms of this ordinance.

Section 2, Be if further ordained etc., that no person under the age of sixteen years shall be licensed to drive automobiles or motor cycles or any other motor propelled vehicle, and no person over sixteen years of age shall drive unless said person shall have passed a satisfactory examination before the person designated by this jury to issue license or permit as to his or her ability as an operator.

All drivers license certificates shall expire on the 30th day of September of each year. Said license shall be entitled to drive any registered automobile or motor vehicle, provided he or she has qualified for the type or license permitting him or her to operate that type or class of motor vehicle. The first license fee for all operators shall be Twenty-Five Cents, and for every yearly renewal thereof shall be the sum of Twenty-Five (25) Cents, provided, however, that whenever, a license has been revoked, at the time of renewal thereof, the applicant shall pay a fee of Twenty-Five (25) Cents therefor.

Section 3, Be it further ordained, etc., that the secretary of the police jury shall have charge and supervission of all examinations and inspections provided for by this ordinance, and every applicant for operators license shall be required to fill out an application, his place of residence and place of business, if any, and a statement as to whether he has ever been convicted of reckless driving, driving under the influence of liquor, and any other crime or offence no matter where committed.

Section 4, Be it further ordained etc., that the secretary of the police jury shall examine all applicants, and said applicants shall demonstrate their ability to properly manipulate said motor vehicle, and shall pass a satisfactory examination covering the general rules of

traffic on the road, whether prescribed by stature, ordinance, or general custom, and after satisfactory examination the secretary of the police jury shall cause to be issued a license or certificate entitling such party to operate a motor vehicle of the type and class for which he or she has applied, within the Parish of Jefferson.

Section 5, Be it further ordained etc., that the secretary of the police jury shall keep a record of license issued, together with applications, and every operator of a motor vehicle who, for any reason, is involved in an accident on any of the streets or roads in the Parish, in which a person is injured or damage sustained by property to the extent of \$25.00 or more, shall report same in writing to the secretary of the police jury within forty-eight-hours of said accident and if any person fails to report said accident within said time, his or her license shall automatically be suspended, and the same may not be reinstated for thirty days from the date thereof.

Section 6, Be it further ordained, etc., that the secretary of the police jury shall, in his discretion, issue to any person over sixteen years of age a written permit allowing said person to become an operator of a motor vehicle for a specified period of not more than three weeks, during which time said person shall be accountable for all violations of the traffic ordinance of this parish, and for such permit said person shall pay the sum of Twenty-five (25) cents.

Section 7, Be it further ordained, etc., that each license shall bear the name and address of the licensee and must be in possession of the driver at all times when the driver is in charge of a motor vehicle on the streets or roads of the Parish of Jefferson, and shall be exhibited to the secretary of the police jury, the sheriff, or any police officer at any time requested.

Section 8, Be it further ordained, etc., that any motor vehicle belonging to any person who is a non-resident of this parish, and who has a duly licensed and registered motor vehicle, and has complied with all the laws of the State, territory federal district of the United States or any province of the Dominion of Canada, in which he resides with respect to registration numbers, and shall display said registration numbers conspicuously, may drive his motor vehicle in this parish for a period up to twelve o'clock noon of the day, following his arrival in this parish, and on or before such time, shall make application for a visitors permit which shall be granted to him, without cost for a period not exceeding thirty days; provided the said operator shall, to the satisfaction of the secretary of the police jury show himself to be a competent operator of a motor vehicle and shall possess no physical defects that would incapacitate him, from complying with the terms and provisions of this ordinance, if he were a resident of this parish.

Section 9. Be it further ordained, etc., that whenever a person has obtained a license or permit, who is a non-resident of the Parish of Jefferson, in any parish, State or municipality, whose requirements for a drivers license or permit have a minimum equal to that of this ordinance, and who can pass the physical requirements required by this ordinance, shall have the same right and privileges and be subjected to the same restrictions and operations of this ordinance while in the Parish of Jefferson, provided that the parish, State or municipality in which the non-resident resides shall have granted to the residents of the Parish of Jefferson the same rights and privileges as herein granted.

There shall be no charges paid for this privilege if none be exacted by the Parish, State or Municipality granting these reciprocal privileges.

Section 10. Be it further ordained, etc., that every license certificate may be suspended or revoked by either the police jury, sheriff, or the district judge, for the violation of this ordinance, provided that before any license is revoked, notice in writing must be given the licensee., with the reason for the revocation, and a person whose license is suspended or revoked may appeal to the police jury of this parish, to have said suspension or revocation set aside, but in the meantime he shall not be allowed to drive said motor vehicle on the streets or roads of this parish.

Section 11, Be it further ordained, etc., that it shall be unlawful for any person.

(a) To drive an automobile while under the influence of liquor, or to permit any person who may be under the influence of liquor to operate any motor vehicle owned by him, or in his custody or control.

(b) To drive an automobile after his license has been suspended or revoked, and before the time of such suspension or period of revocation has expired.

(c) Not stopping to give the name, address, operators license number and registration number to persons injured, or to any officer or witness after an accident resulting in injury to person or property, and for any of said offense the license of an operator upon conviction, shall be taken up and shall not be issued to said person for a period of one year to operate a motor vehicle in the Parish of Jefferson.

Section 12, Be it further ordained, etc., that any person violating the provisions of this ordinance by failing to obtain the necessary license, or doing any of the acts prohibited in the foregoing section of this ordinance, shall upon conviction be fined not exceeding Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, or imprisonment not exceeding Thirty (30) Days, or both in the discretion of the court and in addition thereto the judge shall have the right to revoke or suspend the license of any person convicted for a period not exceeding one year.

Roll called on the adoption of the above ordinance vote resulted as follows;

to enforce the provisions of the auto drivers license laws, that he be authorized to pay the said assistants Fifty (50) cents on every dollar for license issued by them.

On motion of Mr. Bordes seconded by Mr. Petit, the following ordinance was adopted;

An ordinance to authorize the president, on behalf of the police jury to borrow from the Jefferson Trust and Savings Bank, the sum of \$11,000, and such additional sum as may be necessary to pay the interest on said amount, pay the current expenses of the police jury of Jefferson Parish for the year of 1925, authorizing the execution of a note or certificate of indebtedness in favor of said bank for said amount and dedicating appropriating and setting aside the amount of principle and interest out of the taxes and revenues of the Parish of Jefferson for the year of 1925, to pay the amount borrowed.

SECTION 1.

Be it ordained by the police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular meeting assembled, that the president be and is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow from the Jefferson Trust and Savings Bank, on behalf of this police jury the sum of \$11,000, and such additional sum as may be necessary to pay the interest due or to become due on said amount for the purpose of paying the current expenses of the police jury of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1925

SECTION 2,

Be it further ordained, etc., that the president is further authorized and empowered to execute in favor of said Jefferson Trust and Savings Bank a note or certificate of indebtedness for the amount herein above set forth, together with the interest due or to become due thereon.

SECTION 3,

Be it further ordained, etc., that for payment of the amount borrowed and note or certificate executed as herein provided, the police jury of the Parish of Jefferson hereby dedicates, appropriates and sets aside the sum of \$11,000, out of the revenues and taxes of the Parish of Jefferson, for the year 1925, together with such other or further sum as may be necessary to pay the interest on said amount.

On motion of Mr. Fisher seconded by Mr. Ottermann, the following ordinance was adopted;

An ordinance regulating the construction and maintenance of Privies and condemning certain privies as public nuisances and charging certain officers with the enforcement of this ordinance, and charging certain other officers with the prosecution of violations of this ordinance and prescribing penalties for the violation of this ordinance.

Definition of the word privy as used herein.

Section 1, Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in regular meeting assembled, that for the purpose of this ordinance, the word "privy" used herein means any common or private privy, pit, excavation or any other structure, appurtenance or device customarily or ordinarily used for the final reception and disposal of human feces and other human excreta, and any material such as paper waste or any other necessary cleansing material which has come or been put in contact with human feces, and other human excreta.

Minimum requirements

Section 11, that privies shall be so constructed and maintained as to prevent at all times the access of flies and other insects to the contents thereof and also to prevent the overflow, seepage leakage or any escape or discharge of the contents thereof to and upon the surface of the adjacent soil or into any open ditch.

Right and duty of Health officer and certain other officers to inspect

Section 111, That the health officer, or the sanitary inspector, and any other agent of the health office, and of the Board of Health of Jefferson Parish, and the Marshall of _____ and his deputies shall have the right and the duty to perform ascertaining through inspection or otherwise at any reasonable time, to-wit, between the hours of 9 o'clock a.m. and 5 o'clock p.m, and at frequent intervals during each calendar year, and as often as the Board of Health of Jefferson Parish shall require when a disease is prevalent which is communicable by and through unsanitary and unsafe privies, whether any privy is constructed and maintained in compliance or non-compliance with Section 11, of this ordinance.

Certificate of compliance for safe privy how issued.

Section IV, That said health officer of Jefferson Parish if requested to do so by the property holders, whether a person, firm, association or corporation, on whose property a privy is constructed or maintained or by the tenant who uses such privy constantly or ordinarily, shall issue to such property holder or tenant a written or printed certificate of compliance for such privy as is found to be constructed and maintained in compliance with the provisions of section 11, of this ordinance; which said certificates shall be signed by the Board of Health Officers or by some person authorized to sign and act for him

and shall give the date of such privy's inspection and the date of issuance of such certificate provided the date of issuance shall not be ulterior to the date of inspection by more than ten (10) days.

Non-compliance privy in non-compliance declared to be Public nuisance, Notice of non-compliance becomes notice of condemnation how to be served. Voidance.

Section V, that any privy constructed and maintained in non-compliance with the minimum requirements prescribed in section 11, of this ordinance is hereby declared to be a public nuisance and a danger to the public health, and that the health officer of Jefferson Parish shall serve himself or cause to be served by the sanitary inspector or by some other person acting for him, a written or printed notice of non-compliance for such privy of the property holder, or his agent whether the property holder is a person, firm, corporation or association, on whose property said privy is constructed and maintained, or in case the said service of such notice cannot be made on the property holder or his agent, then this service shall be made on the tenant or other person using such privy customarily or ordinarily; and that the notice of non-compliance shall become a notice of condemnation against further use of any kind, of such privy, and that such notice of non-compliance shall be signed by the Health Officers of Jefferson Parish.

Health officers and other officers to make charges of violations

SECTION VIII, That the Health Officer or the sanitary inspector, and any other agent of the health officer of Jefferson Parish, are hereby charged with the duty of profering charges in the 24th Judicial District Court in any case in which any provision of this ordinance is violated, and that the District Attorney of the 24th, Judicial District, or, that the Town or City Attorney of the Town or City of _____ is hereby charged with the duty of prosecuting any violation of this ordinance.

PENALTIES

ORDINANCE

By Mr. Petit seconded by Mr. Cantrelle, An ordinance requiring all motor driven vehicles to come to a full stop when approaching school busses receiving or discharging school children, and prohibiting motor driven vehicles from passing school busses when in the act of receiving or discharging school children, and providing penalties for a violation of this ordinance.

SECTION 1.

Be it ordained by the police jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that from and after the passage of this ordinance, all motor vehicles on the roads and highways of this Parish shall come to a full stop when approaching school busses receiving or discharging school children.

SECTION 11.

Be it further ordained etc; that it shall be unlawful for any person driving a motor driven vehicle to pass a school buss whilst in the act of receiving or discharging school children.

SECTION 111.

Be it further ordained etc., that any person violating any of the above provisions of this ordinance upon conviction shall be fined not more than One hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or be imprisoned, not exceeding Thirty (30) days or both fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

of the Grantee's gas.

SECTION 2.

Be it ordained by the Jury, in regular meeting
assembled, that Grantee is hereby given the right,
privilege and authority to erect operate and main-
tain a gas plant or plants in the parish of Jeffer-
son, State of Louisiana, for the purpose of manu-
facturing, piping, distributing, selling or pur-
chasing and reselling gas to the general public.

SECTION 3.

The Grantee shall have the privilege of using
the streets, alleys and public thoroughfares of
the Parish of Jefferson State of Louisiana under
the control of the Jury, but said Grantee is to
replace all payments and road surfaces, and to
refill all trenches where it is necessary to exca-
vate, either in the construction or maintenance of
the plant or plants, or the laying of or removing
of pipes.

The Grantee is to comply with all Parish, State and Federal laws in
regard to the operation of the plant or plants or system to be operated un-
der this franchise.

SECTION 4.

The Grantee shall keep a record of the following items, which record
shall be at all times open to the inspection of the Jury.

1. A record of interruptions of service and reasons therefor.
2. A record of meters tested, showing date of purchase, accuracy as found
by test and as left after test.
3. A record of the test of heat units.
4. A record of the test of impurities (See next Paragraph.)
5. A record of the pressure in gas mains.

The Grantee to furnish gas containing not more than a trace of Hy-
drogen Sulphite, not more than 30 grains of Sulphur or 5 grains of Ammonia
per 100 cubic feet of gas.

The Grantee to furnish gas for distribution, containing not less than
a monthly average of 550 British Thermal Units per cubic feet of gas, and
in no case to fall below 10% of this standard.

The Grantee to establish a pressure either as a whole, or dividing
the Parish into sections, and to not vary that established pressure more
than 2 inches of water.

All customers meters to be tested at least once every five, years,

and if in error, to be corrected within one per cent of correct. In the
event that a meter is found to be more than five per cent fast or slow,
the customer to be rebated or billed, as the case may be on back bills
for six months, provided the meter was installed or tested prior to
that date.

The Grantee to test customers meters upon request.

The customers to make a deposit with the Grantee covering an es-
timated bill for two months. This is to guarantee payment of bill and
is to draw 4% interest.

The Grantee to have free access at all times to the customers
premises for the purpose of reading, testing or inspecting meters, or
for any other necessary work.

SECTION 5.

The rates to be charged under this franchise will be based on the
following schedule:

Up to 10,000 cubic feet of gas per month, not over \$1.50 per M.
feet.

All over 10,000 cubic feet per month, not over \$1.40 per M feet.
A discount of ten cents per M feet may be allowed for prompt payment
of bills.

Nothing in this franchise shall prohibit the Grantee from making
a lower rate to a customer, or a class of customers, or where it would
be of particular advantage to do so.

The Grantee shall be permitted to charge a minimum amount of \$2
per customer per month. Each meter to be considered as a customer.

SECTION 6.

This franchise is limited to the term of fifty years, to begin
operation with-in one year.

to grant such authority;

(b), to establish and extend as may be required, gas lights and a system of lighting by gas and to furnish, vend and or distribute gas for light, heat, power and other purposes in the Parish of Jefferson;

(c), to contract for, construct or otherwise acquire own, maintain, alter, change operate and enlarge gas generating plants and or substations, boilers, engines, machinery, buildings and other equipment as may be proper or necessary for the operation of plants; works and systems for the generation and or distribution of gas for heat, light and other purposes;

(d), to furnish and receive artificial and or natural gas to and from any other manufacturer and, or distributor thereof,

SECTION 2, This grant shall be for a period of Ninety-nine (99) years, dating from the acceptance hereof by the grantee, his successors and, or assigns,

SECTION 3, This grant is made upon the following terms and conditions.

(a) to said grantee, his successors and, or assigns during the period that they shall exercise rights and privileges hereto conferred shall pay annually into the treasury of the Parish of Jefferson, on or before the first day of July, the sum of Twenty-Five (\$25.00) dollars; provided, that when the maximum demand in said Parish for the distribution of gas under this franchise shall exceed one million cubic feet (1,000,000) of demand capacity or fraction thereof;

(b) Unless and until changed by due authority of law, the rates to be changed to consumers of gas in the Parish of Jefferson by the grantee herein, his successors and, or assigns, shall be;

(b), That for the first 10,000 cu. ft. per meter, consumed in any one month \$1.65 per 1000 cu. ft.

for the next 15,000 cu. ft., per meter, consumed in any one month, \$1.58 per 1000 cu. ft.

for the next 25,000 cu. ft. per meter, consumed in any one month, \$1.52 per 1000 cu. ft.,

for the next 50,000 cu. ft. per meter, consumed in any one month \$1.45 per 1000 cu. ft.

for the next 50,000cu. ft. per meter, consumed in any one month \$1.39 per 1000 cu. ft.

for the next 150,000 cu. ft. per meter, consumed in any one month, \$1.32 per 1000 cu. ft.

for the next 150,000 cu. ft. per meter, consumed in any one month, \$1.28 per 1000 cu. ft.

for the next 150,000 cu. ft. per meter, consumed in any one month \$1.19 per 1000 cu. ft.

for all above 600,000 cu. ft. per meter, consumed in any one month, 1.15 per 1000 cu. ft.

Five cents (5¢) per 1000 cu. ft. shall be deducted from all bills if paid on or before (10) days after date of presentation.

Provided, that the minimum monthly charge per meter, to which the grantee, shall be entitled to collect shall be One (\$1.00) dollar.

The grantee herein, his successors and or assigns, shall have the right to require a meter deposit charge of each costermer, which deposit charge shall be refunded whenever said meter shall be taken out of the costermers promises by the said grantee, his successors and, or assigns for any reason except the default of said consumer.

A month as above referred to, shall mean the period between any two consecutive regular readings to the costermer's meter or meters by the grantee, his successors and or assigns, said readings to be made as nearly as practicable every thirty (30), days.

(c). All lines of pipes, and conduits, landing of the shore ends of all gas lines and all other necessary work and construction shall be located and constructed so as not to obstruct unreasonably the public use of the streets and public places, or to interfere with commerce or travel.

(d) The grantee, his successors and or assigns, shall indemnify and save harmless the Parish of Jefferson, from any action that may be brought against it by reason of any injury to the person or property of another resulting from negligence or of any act of commission or omission on the part of the said grantee, his successors and or assigns, representatives or employees thereof; and if any thing in the provisions of this ordinance shall result in injury, to private property the said grantee, his successors and or assigns, be acceptance of this ordinance, bind themselves to hold the Police Jury and the Parish of Jefferson harmless for all injuries or reclamations whatever arising from injury.

SECTION (4), All rights granted herein shall be subject to the exercise of the police power by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson or other regulatory authority in accordance with law.

SECTION 5. the franchise herein granted in so far as it extends to or over any State Highway is conditional upon the grantee, his successors and or assigns securing the written consent hereto of the Louisiana Highway Engineer, and no work done in pursuance and exercise of this franchise, granted on said state highways shall be done except in the manner and in accordance with requirements of the existing laws of the State of Louisiana, in reference to public highways and particularly of Act No 95 of 1921.

SECTION 6, The said grantee, his successors and or assigns shall within sixty (60) days after the adoption of this ordinance, accept the same by Notarial Act to be passed before the Clerk of Court for the Parish of Jefferson, ex-officio Notary Public, said act to be signed on the part of the Parish of Jefferson by the president of the police jury thereof; said acceptance to be accompanied by a bond in the sum of Five Thousand (5000,00) dollars, to be given by the grantee his successors and or assigns and to be signed as surety by a surety company authorized to do business in the State of Louisiana, said bond to secure the faithful performance of all obligations herein contained; provided, that said bond

shall be cancelled and the surety thereon relieved of further responsibility when the capital investment made by the grantee, his successors and or assigns, in the Parish of Jefferson under this franchise, shall exceed the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand (\$25000,00) Dollars.

unless acceptance is made and bond filed in accordance herewith, this ordinance shall be null and void, and none of the provisions hereof shall take effect until both requirements have been met.

SECTION 7, This ordinance shall become effective at once, or within the limit fixed by the law, if any there be provided, and the fact that

President Tolodano announced the purpose of the special meeting was called to take up right of way matter in connection with hard surface road in district No. 1; also matters of closing certain streets and opening certain streets in sub-division owned by Stafford, Derbes, and Roy. And property of Fred S. Weis on Metairie Ridge,

Mr Weis appeared before the jury and asked that they enter into an act of exchange for certain property known as Bath Avenue, for other streets to be laid out and gravelled by him in Dominican Fathers Tract; and in addition he would donate Ten Thousand (\$10,000) dollars for road purposes in the Parish.

After getting an opinion from the District Attorney, that the jury could not sell any streets but had a right to exchange, whereby said streets would remain closed in lieu of those to be opened especially where said streets would be more convenient to people owning homes in locality of now streets.

Weis relative to \$10,000 donation made in connection with the proposed dedication of now streets in Dominican Fathers Tract and for which the president has been authorized to make an exchange of Bath Ave., for certain proposed now streets.

It was further resolved that the president and secretary be authorized to accept said donation of \$10,000 from Mr. Fred S. Weis for roads and that same be deposited in the proper road fund.

SECTION 11, Be it further resolved that an additional sum of Forty Thousand (\$40,000) dollars be withdrawn from the said Hibernia Trust and Sav, Bank New Orleans La. the same being redeposited in the Jefferson Trust and Savings Bank Gretna, La.

The above sum of One Hundred and Sixty Thousand (\$160,000) dollars as shown and referred to in section No. 1 hereof, to be deposited in said above named bank in escrow, the said sum to be designated as the Protection Levee-Kenner Highway Fund, and the said treasurer, together with

the Jefferson Trust and Savings Bank Gretna Trust and Savings Bank, be, and they are hereby instructed to pay out the sum of One Hundred Sixty Thousand (\$160,000) dollars on monthly estimates of the Louisiana Highway Commission approved by the State Highway Engineer for work done and payments earned by the contractor, including material and freight on same.

Section, 111, Be it further resolved, that said payments are to be made on the basis of Fifty (50%) per cent of said estimate and to be paid out of the sum of One Hundred and Sixty Thousand (\$160,000) Dollars, provided, however the other Fifty (50%) per cent shall be paid out by the Louisiana Highway Commission out of the General Highway funds.

Section, 1V. Be it resolved further the sum of Forty Thousand (\$40,000.00) Dollars herein above referred to in Section 2 hereof be re-deposited in an account to be known as the Third Street Kenner Highway Fund and that said sum be paid out from time to time by the Treasurer on monthly estimates of the Parish Highway Engineer and approved by him for work done and payments earned by the Contractor including materials and freight on the same in the construction of a hard surfaced highway from intersection of Williams and Third Street in Kenner to the intersection of Third and Pollock Street in Hanson City, Parish of Jefferson.

Be it further resolved that the Police Jury of Jefferson consider that a license tax of not less than \$500 per day be imposed on the horse track, better known as the Jefferson Fair Association, Inc. and a license tax of not less than \$400 per day be imposed on the dog track, better known as the Metairie Kennel Club.

of the drainage boards, school boards Police Jury, and other public boards in this District and in this Parish, and his services are practically taken up by legal services rendered in connection with the criminal work of the District and the handling of litigation involving the various boards;

Therefore, be it resolved, by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson that in view of the facts aforesaid that they hereby endorse and approve the passage of said bill to fix the salary of the District Attorney for this District at the sum of \$5,000 per year, in lieu of all fees presently paid; and by the three Parishes in this District, be it prorated among the Parishes of Jefferson, St. Charles and St. John the Baptist, and we recommend to the Legislature that said bill be passed.

SECTION 1, The owner of the animals impounded shall have the right to the release of said animal only upon the payment of fees as provided for herein.

SECTION 2, In case where animal is not claimed within 5 days, it shall be sold at public auction after being advertised three consecutive times in the official journal of the parish.

SECTION 3. Each pound keeper shall keep a book in which the description of every animal impounded and name of owner if known and name of purchaser if same is sold as well as other information in reference to animals impounded and make a detailed report of same to the Police Jury.

SECTION 4, The fees and costs under this ordinance shall be as follows:

For impounding, \$1.50; for keeping, 75 per head for each and every day said stock is kept by the impounder or keeper, for making sale, 50¢ for each and every animal sold.

Section 5. For proceeding in cases of estrays, such as are not allowed by law in cases of estrays in the several parishes, except sheep and goats, on which the charge for impounding shall be \$1.00 per head and for keeping; 50¢ on goats and on sheep for impounding, 25¢ and for keeping 25 per head for each and every day; for making sale, .25¢ per head.

Be it further ordained, etc; that in addition to the penalties herein above provided, any person, firm or corporation permitting animals to roam at large, shall be subject to an additional penalty of a fine of not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$30 or imprisonment in the parish jail not exceeding 30 days or both fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the courts.

Section 1, Be it resolved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular meeting assembled that the treasurer be and is hereby authorized and instructed to withdraw from the general fund account of bond issue of \$500,000 of Road District No. 1 deposited in the Hibernia Bank and Trust Co; the sum of \$160,000 and re-deposited the sum to the credit of a fund to known as Protection Levee-Kenner Highway Fund in said Hibernia Bank and Trust Co; in escrow.

Section 2, Be it further resolved that the treasurer transfer from General Fund Account of Bond issue of said \$500,000 of Road District No. 1 deposited in said Hibernia Bank & Trust Co; the sum of \$40,000 and re-deposit the said sum to the credit of a fund to be known as the Third Street Kenner Highway Fund, in said Hibernia Bank and Trust Co; in Escrow.

The above sum of \$160,000 as shown and referred to in section No. 1 hereof, to be deposited in said above named Bank in escrow, the said fund to be designated as the Protection Levee-Kenner Highway Fund, and the said treasurer together with the Hibernia Bank & Trust Co. be and they are hereby instructed to pay out the sum of One Hundred and sixty thousand (\$160,000) dollars, on monthly estimates of the Louisiana Highway Commission, approved by the State Highway Engineer for work done and payment earned by the Contractors, including material and freight on same.

Section 3, Be it resolved, that said payments are to be made on the basis of Fifty (50%) per cent of said estimate and to be paid out of the sum of One hundred and sixty thousand \$160,000 dollars provided however the other Fifty (50%) per cent shall be paid out of the General Highway Fund.

Section 4, Be it further resolved, that the said payment be continued on the basis as hereinabove set forth until the basis as hereinabove set forth until the full amount of the said sum of One hundred and sixty thousand \$160,000 dollars of the Parish funds, deposited in escrow, shall have been expended and paid out, provided further that when an estimate made, and approved as provided for herein for which the remaining funds in said

Bank will not be Fifty (50%) per cent of said estimate then the full amount of the remainder thereof, provided further that after full amount of One hundred sixty thousand (\$160,000) dollars of the Parish Funds has been paid out and expended on the estimate as herein provided the Louisiana Highway Commission will pay all further additional estimates.

Section 5, Be it further resolved that the sum of Forty thousand (\$40,000) dollars herein above refered to in Section 2 hereof be re-deposited in an account to be known as the Third Street Kenner Highway Fund and that said sum be paid out from time to time by the treasurer on monthly estimates of the Parish Highway Engineer and approved by him for work done and payments earned by the contractor including material and freight on the same in the construction of a hard surface highway from intersection of Williams and Third Streets Kenner to the intersection of Third and Pollock Street in Hanson City. Parish of Jefferson.

Secretary was instructed to notify Engineer Payne to get all data in Levee Board matters relative to enlarging of Protection levee and said levee approaching the road on Jefferson Parish side.

Secretary was instructed to advertise for bids for construction of 1 1/4 miles of hard surface road on third street from Williams to Pollock Street in Kenner, according to plans and specifications on file in office of Frank T. Payne.

On motion of Mr. Cantrelle, seconded by Mr. Bordes Estimate No. 2, approved by engineer Payne for \$38,974. 29, for paving Metairie-Shrewsbury road was ordered Paid.

On motion of Mr. Ottermann seconded by Mr. Bordes, the following resolution was adopted:

Whereas, there has been introduced in the Legislature of the State of Louisiana a proposed Constitutional Amendment given to the Board of Commissioners for the Parish of Orleans, all rights, power and jurisdiction for the entire area and shores of Lake Pontchartrain; and

Whereas, in the proposed resolution of the Orleans Levee Board is given the right and power to exercise over the towns other than the City of New Orleans located within the Parish brought under the jurisdiction of

this Board; and

Whereas, the proposed resolution as a whole will give the Board of Levee

Commissioners for the Parish of Orleans authority and jurisdiction far beyond any precedent set by the Legislature of this or any other State in the United States; and

Whereas, the whole tenor of this proposed amendment would tend to handicap all private or public improvement that the Board of Levee Commissioners of the Parish of Orleans may see fit to reject and reserve unto itself only as the agency through which such developments may be made and carried on to a greater degree; and

Whereas, it is our opinion that the provisions of this proposed amendment are vicious and sinister in principal and aim, therefore.

Be it resolved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson does hereby go on record as being apposed to the proposed amendment as presently drawn and do urge that the Public authorities of all the towns and the Police Juries in the adjoining Parishes, which are drawn in the Jurisdiction of this body politic, to take similar action and urge every representative in the Legislature of the State of Louisiana to study this proposed amendment that the justice and natural rights of these public parties and the constitutents, which they represent be properly protected.

Be it further resolved, that other governing bodies throughout the entire State of Louisiana be urged to take cognizance of the pending resolution whereby a precedent will be established for the Levee Board in other portions of the State that would amount to destruction of the governmental authority of the Police Juries, town councils, and drainage Boards, in the flood District in the State of Louisiana.

Be it further resolved, that this resolution in any wise shall not be taken as opposing into right and power or interest in the public of the Parish of Orleans, in affecting the great development being made upon their own lake front, but it is for the purpose of keeping this development from interfering with public development elsewhere and under the jurisdiction of the properly constituted authorities.

On motion of Mr. Cantrelle seconded by Mr. Dauenhauer the following resolution was adopted:

Be it resolved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that the Legislature of the State of Louisiana be memorialized to pass the bill of Representative Ernest M. Conzelmann to divorce the Parish of Jefferson from the Jurisdiction of the board of Commissioners of the Port of New Orleans,

Be it further resolved that said Legislature be petitioned to give the Parish of Jefferson relief by the passage of said bill because of the fact that the said Board of Commissioners, although collecting tolls on shipping vessels landing for the taking and discharge of cargoes on the Jefferson Parish side of the Mississippi River, the said Dock Board does nothing towards improving the conditions on said Jefferson Parish side of the Mississippi River; that they control the granting of permits for the constructions of wharves and buildings on said Jefferson side of the Mississippi River and place all kinds of restrictions on such permits as are given the said dock board does not itself construct any wharves or landing

places for vessels, that said dock board has dictatorial powers in the operation of shipping and all the representatives of said board are from City of New Orleans, and none are appointed from the Parish of Jefferson and such a condition is tantamount to taxing our shipping without representation.

On motion of Mr. Petit seconded by Mr. Ottermann the following ordinance was adopted;

An ordinance to authorize the President, on behalf of the Police Jury to borrow from the Gretna Trust & Savings Bank the sum of \$12,000. and such additional sum as may be necessary to pay the interest of said amount, pay the current expenses for the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1926, authorizing the execution of a note or certificate of indebtedness in favor of said Bank, for the amount and dedicating, appropriating and setting aside the amount of principal and interest out of the taxes and revenues of the parish of Jefferson for the year 1926, to pay the amount borrowed.

SECTION 1

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in regular session assembled, that the President be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow from the Gretna Trust & Savings Bank, on behalf of this Police Jury the sum of \$12,000. and such additional sum as may be necessary to pay the interest due or to become due on said amount, for the purpose of paying the current expenses of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1926.

SECTION 2.

Be it further ordained, etc. that the President is further authorized and empowered to execute in favor of said Gretna Trust & Saving Bank a note or certificate of indebtedness for the amount set forth, together with interest due or to become due thereon.

SECTION 3.

Be it further ordained, etc; that for payment of the amount borrowed and note or certificate executed as herein provided, the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson hereby dedicates, appropriates and sets aside the sum of \$12,000. out of the revenues and taxes of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1926, together with such other or further sum as may be necessary to pay the interest on said amount.

The above ordinance was adopted by a unanimous vote.

At request of Mr. Edw. representative of the Gretna Improvement Ass'n the jury decided to meet in special session on July 30th, for the purpose of convening in joint session with the Algiers Bureau Association of Commerce, Jefferson Plaquemine Drainage Board, Board of Aldermen of Gretna, and interested citizens of the Parish, to take up important matters.

Bid of the Liberty Oil Co, to supply oil and gas to Parish road machines during the months of August and September, was rejected.

Petition of property owners on Hesper Avenue, relative to cutting said from present terminus, and open same to connect with Metairie Boulevard was referred to the Parish Engineer.

Petition presented by Mr. Fricke signed by property owners to open Papworth Avenue, in Papworth sub-division, and on motion duly seconded the following resolution was adopted;

Streets ordered opened up Metairie Nursery Ave and Papworth Ave.

Be it resolved, that the Parish Engineer be and is hereby directed to open Nursery Avenue from Frisco R. R. to Metairie Road and Papworth Avenue from Frisco R. R. to Narcissus street.

On petition of citizens request of Arthur Destor to erect a building on Metairie Ridge, was refused.

Application to construct a Tubercula Sanatorium in the Parish was referred to the Parish Board of Health.

On motion of Mr. Potit, seconded by Mr. Cantrello the following ordinance was adopted;

Provide for Sale of Ferry Franchise at Nine Mile Point

Providing for the sale at public auction of a franchise for the operation of a Ferry between Nine Mile Point in the 4th, Ward of the Parish of Jefferson, and the upper Protection Levee Road in the 7th, Ward of the Parish.

Section, 1, Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that a franchise be offered for sale for the purpose of operating a Ferry between the Nine Mile Point in the 4th Ward of the Parish of Jefferson and the upper Protection Levee Road in the 7th, Ward of the Parish of Jefferson, said franchise to be sold at public auction, at the front door of the District Courthouse on Second and Copernicus Avenue in the City of Gretna, Louisiana, said sale to be proceeded by public advertisement once a week for a period of Thirty (30) days in a newspaper published in the Parish of Jefferson, and said sale to be conducted by the President of the Police Jury.

SECTION 2, Be it further ordained etc., that said franchise shall be adjudicated to the highest bidder, terms cash, payable at the execution of a notarial act in confirmation of said adjudication, to be prepared and signed by the president of the Police Jury and the purchaser within Thirty (30) days after the adjudication. The purchaser shall deposit with the president of the Police Jury at the time of adjudication of said franchise a check for Two hundred Fifty and no/100 (\$250) dollars, drawn on a solvent bank in the Parish of Jefferson, or the City of New Orleans, and made payable to the order of the Police Jury, and certified by said bank which check shall be hold undeposited until the execution of the notarial act aforesaid, and upon such execution said check shall be returned to the purchaser by the President of the Police Jury, should the purchaser fail to execute the notarial act aforesaid in confirmation of the adjudication, the said certified check shall be forfeited to the Police Jury as liquidated damages, and in lieu of all further rights, claims or demands against the adjudicator, which by law or otherwise may result from said adjudication, the President of the Police Jury is authorized to do any and all things necessary to convey a valid title of this franchise to the grantee.

SECTION 3, Be it further ordained etc; that the price paid for sale of franchise, when paid in cash at the time of the completion of the adjudication aforesaid, shall belong to the general fund of the Parish of Jefferson and shall be paid over to the Parish Treasurer to the credit of said account.

SECTION 4, Be it further ordained etc; that the right of way and all use is hereby granted to the purchaser of said franchise, of all streets, roads and highways and public places near the landing places on both sides of the Mississippi River in the Parish of Jefferson, for the purpose of constructing thereon and erecting thereon all the ramps, gangways, piling, Ferry house, pontoons, wharves and all other means and facilities and appurtenances needed for the maintenance and operation of said franchise.

SECTION 5, Be it further ordained etc; that the purchaser shall within Ninety (90) days after the day of said Notarial act accepting said franchise, commence work and proceed with the operation of said Ferry and the erection of the necessary approaches and facilities for the operation of said Ferry under this franchise, and upon failure to begin work within Ninety (90) days after the signing of said notarial act, the grantee may, upon the payment of the sum of Two Hundred Fifty and No/100 (\$250) dollars, obtain an additional extension of Ninety (90) days more within which to begin work at the discretion of the Police Jury, upon the failure of the grantee to obtain said extension, all rights under this franchise shall be forfeited without any default except a notice from the Police Jury to that effect.

SECTION 6, Be it further ordained etc; that all excavations on streets Highways and in public places, shall be done in a workman-like manner and the surface restored to its present condition by the Grantee. The Grantee however being hereby obligated to always keep the approaches and streets in the vicinity of said Ferry landing in good condition and covered with gravel in order to facilitate pedestrian and vehicular traffic in going off and on the boats.

SECTION 7, Be it further ordained, etc; that this franchise shall exist in favor of the purchaser or his assign and successors for the period of Ten (10) years from and after the date of the notarial act aforesaid and at the expiration thereof, when the franchise is sold for an additional period of years. The purchaser, if he be some one other than the holder of the franchise shall, as a part of the new franchise, be required to purchase the boat or boats, gangways, ramps, ferry house, approaches and all other equipment of the present holder of this franchise at an appraised valuation to be fixed and agreed upon by two appraisers, one of whom is to be selected by the holder of the present franchise and the other to be selected by the purchaser of the new franchise, and in case of disagreement between said two appraisers, then a third person shall be elected by both appraisers and the decision of two of said parties shall be final and binding upon the holder of this franchise and the purchaser of the new franchise. The purchaser of this franchise shall be required to build and construct ramps and approaches from the road parallel to the Mississippi River levee and across the levee, so as to permit of easy access to and from the ferry boats. The purchaser shall also be required to build a waiting room or ferry house on each side of the Mississippi River near the landing place, for the convenience of passengers and to protect them from the elements; said buildings before construction shall be approved by the Parish Engineer.

SECTION 8, Be it further ordained etc; that the following rights, powers, privileges and conditions shall govern the purchaser in the operation of said ferry under this franchise;

(A) POWER - The power used at said ferry shall be by steam or motor; the boat to carry not less than Forty(40) passengers and to be covered, and to have sides to protect passengers from exposure to wind, rain and cold.

(B) SCHEDULE - Trips shall be made according to the following schedule From 5:30 O'clock A. M. to 7: o'clock P. M. not less than one full crossing per hour, provided the purchaser shall have the right to increase the number of crossings should the traffic permit, in which in which event he shall be required to file his schedule with the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for approval, after which the schedule shall remain as then approved until further changed under the same condition.

(C) FARE - - The fare for individual passengers shall not be more than ten (10) cents per person per trip each way, but the purchaser shall have the right to sell tickets in such numbers and for such amounts as may be to the interest of the public. In the event the purchaser shall install a boat sufficiently large to carry automobiles and wagon traffic, in that event the fare shall be for every small five-passenger car, such as Fords, Chevrolets and Stars.

not more than Thirty (30) cents, For every five passenger car the fare shall not be more than Forty (40) cents. For every one ton truck, empty, the fare shall not be more than thirty (30) cents, and loaded the fare shall not be more then forty (40) cents, for every truck of more than one ton the fare shall be thirty (30) cents and ten (10) cents additional

for each additional ton capacity either loaded or empty. For every automobile bus the fare shall not be more than sixty (60) cents and ten (10) cents for each passenger. For every one-horse or mule wagon the fare shall not be more than twenty(20) cents. For every double team wagon the fare shall not be more than thirty (30) cents. For a horse, cow or mule accompanied by an attendant or rider the fare shall be fifteen (15) cents provided that in the case of automobiles and teams the chauffeur or driver shall not be required to pay additional fare, and in the case of automobile buses no charge shall be made for baggage of passengers carried therein, for every barrel, box or package the purchaser shall have the right to charge not more than five (5¢) cents for every such barrel, box or package, the purchaser shall have the right to refuse to cross any vehicle loaded with freight, vegetables or merchandise wherever in his opinion the weight of same would likely cause damage to the approaches and to the ferry boat and thereby effect the schedule or endanger the lives of passengers, and wherever an instance should arise where drays or trucks carrying heavy machinery or other articles desired to be crossed, in that event the rate to be charged shall be agreed upon between driver or chauffeur and the grantee.

(D) CAPACITY OF BOATS - - the boat or boats used in the operation of said ferry shall, in addition to its capacity to carry not less than forty (40) passengers, be of sufficient capacity to carry not less than six (6) passenger automobiles.

(E) CONTRACT - The successful bidder shall be required within ten (10) days of the acceptance of his bid by the Police Jury and written notice delivered to him by the secretary of the Police Jury, to enter into a notarial contract with the President of the Police Jury, embodying all of the terms and stipulations of this ordinance.

(F) BIDS - the president shall offer this franchise for sale at public auction at the front door of the Court House at Gretna Louisiana, said sale to be proceeded by public advertisement once a week for thirty (30) days in a newspaper published in the Parish of Jefferson, and the President shall adjudicate said franchise to the highest bidder at said sale. The terms of said sale to be fifty (50%) per cent of the total amount paid. Shall be paid in cash and the balance due shall be paid by the purchaser in equal installments every year during the term of this franchise the said purchaser to execute promissory notes for the amount of such installments, payable one every year or sooner without interest; the right and option being given to purchaser to take up one and all outstanding notes at any time before the expiration of the franchise.

(G) RIGHT TO REJECT - -The Police Jury shall have the right to reject any and all bids.

SECTION 9, Be it further ordained etc; that the territorial limits of the franchise herein granted shall commence at the upper limits of the City of Westwego and extend to the lower limits fixed in the franchise granted jointly by the City of Kenner, and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for the operation of the ferry between Kenner and South Kenner, and no ferry franchise shall be granted for the operation of any other ferry within the territorial limits herein fixed during the life of the present franchise, except by and with the consent of the owner of this franchise.

SECTION 10, Be it further ordained etc; that the purchaser shall have the right to transfer, assign sell and convey the franchise herein

sold to any person or corporation undertaking to fulfill the obligation of this franchise, and said obligation shall rest upon such transferee, assignee or purchaser without recourse to the Parish of Jefferson by the adjudicatee,

SECTION 11, Be it further ordained etc; that the right is granted to the purchaser to create a corporation for the purpose of receiving the transfer and assignment of the franchise and to operate same upon the terms and conditions named in the preseding sections, and the purchaser, or any transferee or assignee, of same shall have the right to execute a mortgage upon the said franchise, boats, pontoons, gangways and equipment or appurtenances, in order to secure any bonds, notes or other indebtedness of the grantee.

SECTION, 12, Be it further ordained etc; that the grantee shall cross free of charge all school children in accordance with law and also the Police and members of the fire department and all Parish officers, also ambulances.

SECTION, 13, Be it further ordained etc; that this ordinance shall take effect from and after the promulgation of same.

Street, upon the following terms conditions and specifications.
 SECTION 2, Be it further ordained, by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson that all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

or pursuing any business whereby horses are run for purses, and or where any entrance fee is charged for the horse racing, with certain exceptions, and prescribing the mode and method by which said license tax shall be collected; and providing a penalty for violation thereof, and repealing all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith.

AN ORDINANCE

Tax Levy on Race Tracks where Dogs are Run

By Strehle, seconded by Cantrelle, to levy, collect and enforce payment of a license tax upon all persons, associations of persons, or corporations engaged or pursuing any business whereby dogs are run for purses, and, or where any entrance fee is charged for the dogs racing, with certain exceptions; and prescribing the mode and method by which said license tax shall be collected; and providing a penalty for violation hereof, and repealing all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith;

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson That there be and is hereby levied a license tax upon each person, association of persons, or business firm, partnership or corporation engaged in or pursuing any business whereby dogs are run for purses or where any entrance fee is charged or the entrance of the said dogs in race, for each, and every race track operated and which said license shall be graduated upon daily receipt from admissions paid by spectators and entrance fees charged for the entrance of the said dogs in the said races, as follows:

First Class - - When paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for the dogs racing amount to \$10,000.00 or more per day, the license tax shall be \$200.00 per day, for the time or duration, of the race meeting.

Second Class-When paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for the dogs racing amount to \$5,000.00 and less than \$10,000.00 the license tax shall be \$150.00 per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Third Class- When said paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for the dogs racing amount to less than \$5,000.00 per day for the time of duration of the race meeting. Then the License tax shall be \$100.00 per day

Section 2. That the aforesaid license tax shall be collected by the constituted authority charged with the collection of license due to the State.

Section 3. That the minium license tax herein provided shall be paid in advance daily to the constituted authority charged with the collection thereof, and no race shall be run unless same is paid, under penalty said license tax, if any, shall be paid before 3 o'clock P. M. on the following day, the calculation thereof to be in accordance with the herein provided graduated schedule in Section No. 1, and that this license tax shall become due and owing on each and every day that said races are run, and shall become delinquent on the following day, and it is hereby made the duty of the District Attorney of his Parish to enforce the collection of this said license tax, and for the services

rendered in such collection, he shall be entitled to 20 per cent over and above the amount of the license collected from the delinquent debtor, as attorney's fees, which said attorney's fees shall be paid by the said delinquent license debtor, and shall be assessed as costs in case of suit.

Section 4. That all suits for the collection of this license tax shall be summary and be tried in accordance with the law in force for the collection of delinquent licenses or taxes.

Section 5. That the amount of tax due by the aforesaid person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporations, engaged in the aforesaid business shall be determined as follows:

The daily receipts of the paid admissions on entrance charged for the entrance of the said dogs in the said races for the said day shall be added and totaled up and then the license tax calculated thereon in accordance with the provisions of Section One of this Act.

Section 6. That the provisions of this act shall not apply to an association of persons or corporations engaged in holding or conducting a fair solely for the purpose of exhibiting agricultural or manufactured products or natural resources looking toward the advancement of the agricultural or manufactural interest on the development of the natural resources in the said Parish,

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Where said dogs racing is conducted as an auxiliary sport, and as an incident for amusement and entertainment and not for the purpose of profit, provided that said fairs so conducted shall not be for a longer period than 14 days.

Section 7. That any person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporation conducting or operating a race track or races in contravention of the provisions of this Act without having first paid said license tax as aforesaid shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.00 and not less than \$25.00, or by imprisonment of not more than 30 days and not less than 10 days and in Parish jail, or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court, provided that in case the violator be an association, firm, or corporation, the managing officers and agents thereof shall be punishable by such fine or imprisonment, and provided that such fine and imprisonment shall not be construed as relieving said violator from said license tax.

Section 8. That all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith, be, and the same, are hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE.

To levy, and collect and enforce payment of a license tax upon all persons, associations of persons or business firms, partnerships or corporations, engaged or pursuing any business whereby horses are run for purses, and or where any entrance fee is charged for the horses racing, with certain exceptions; and prescribing the mode

and method by which said license tax shall be collected; and providing a penalty for violation thereof, and repealing all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson That there be and is hereby levied a license tax upon each person, association of persons, or business firm, partnership or corporation engaged in or pursuing any business whereby horses are run for purses or where any entrance fee is charged for the entrance of the said horses in a race, for each and every race track so operated, which said license shall be graduated upon daily receipts from admissions paid by spectators and entrance fees charged for the entrance of the said horses in the said race, as follows.

First Class - When said paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for horses racing amount to ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) or more per day, the license tax shall be six hundred dollars (\$600.00) per day, for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Second Class - When the said paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for the horses racing amount to Seventy-Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00) and less than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) per day, the license tax shall be Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Third Class - When said paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for the horses racing amount to Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) and less than Seventy-Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00) per day, the license tax shall be Three Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$350.00) per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Fourth Class - When said paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for the horses racing amount to less than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) per day the license tax shall be Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Section 2. That the aforesaid license tax shall be collected by the constituted authority charged with the collection of license due to the State.

Section 3, that the minimum license tax herein provided shall be paid in advance daily to the constituted authority charged with the collection thereof; and no race shall be run unless same is paid, under penalty herein provided, and the balance of said license tax, if any shall be paid before 3 o'clock P. m. on the following day, the calculation thereof to be in accordance with the herein, provided graduated schedule in Section No. 1; and that this license shall become due and owing on each and every day that the said races are run, and shall become delinquent on the following day, and it is hereby made the duty of the District Attorney of this Parish to enforce the collection of said license tax, and for the service rendered in such collection, he shall be entitled to 20% per cent over and above the amount of the license collected from the delinquent debtor, as attorneys fees which said attorneys fees shall be paid by the said delinquent license debtor, and shall be assessed as cost in case of suit.

Section 4. That all suits or rules for the collection of this license tax shall be summary and be tried in accordance with the law in force for the collection of delinquent licenses or taxes.

Section 5. That the amount of tax due by the aforesaid person, association engaged in the aforesaid business shall be determined as follows:

The daily receipts of the paid admissions and entrance charged for the entrance of the said horses in the said races for the said day shall be added and totaled up and then the license tax calculated in accordance thereon with the provisions of Section No. 1, this act.

Section 6, That the provisions of this act shall not apply to associations of persons, or corporations engaged in holding or conducting a fair solely for the purpose of exhibiting agricultural or manufactured products or mineral resources looking toward the advancement of the agricultural or manufactural interest, or the development of the natural resources in the said Parish, where said horse racing is conducted as an auxiliary sport, as an incident for amusement, and not for the purpose of profit, provided that said fair so conducted shall not be for a longer period than 14 days.

Section 7, That any person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporation conducting or operating a race track or races in contravention of the provisions of this act, without having first paid said license tax as aforesaid, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine not more than \$100.00, and not less than \$25.00, or by imprisonment not more than 30 days and not less than 10 days in the Parish jail, or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court, provided that in case the violator be an association, firm or corporation, the managing officers and agents hereof shall be punishable by such fine and imprisonment and provided that such fine and imprisonment shall not be construed as relieving said violator of said license tax.

Section 8, That all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 1, Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular meeting assembled, that the President be and is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow from the Jefferson Trust and Savings Bank, on behalf of the Police Jury the sum of \$8,500, and such additional sum as may be necessary to pay the interest due or to become due on said amount, for the purpose of paying the current expenses of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1926.

Section 11, Be it further ordained, etc; That the President is further authorized and empowered to execute in favor of said Jefferson Trust and Savings bank a note or certificate of indebtedness for the amount herein above set forth together with the interest due or to become due thereon.

Section 111, Be it further ordained, etc; That for payment of the amount borrowed and note or certificate of indebtedness executed as herein provided, the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, hereby dedicates, appropriates and sets aside the sum of \$8,500, out of the revenues and taxes of the Parish of Jefferson, for the year 1926, together with such other or further sum as may be necessary to pay the interest on said amount.

The said commissioners shall be paid the sum of Three (\$3.00) dollars, for their service, and the said clerks the sum of Ten (\$10.00) dollars, for their service.

The clerks of each and every polling place shall deliver the ballot boxes to the respective polling places, and after the said election shall deliver same to the clerk of court.

Copy of resolution adopted by the Louisiana Tax Commission, on recommendation of the Police Jury adopted while acting as a board of review, in special session September 15, 1926, for the purpose of entertaining complaints from taxpayers whose values had been increased by the Louisiana Tax Commission over those fixed by the Parish Assessor, as follows;

Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

September 23, 1926.

At a meeting of the Louisiana Tax Commission, held this day in its office in the City of Baton Rouge, with a quorum present, consideration was given to the recommendations of the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish, adopted by it at a regular meeting held on September, 15th, while acting as a Board of Review for the purpose of entertaining complaints from taxpayers, whose values had been increased by the Louisiana Tax Commission over those fixed by the local assessing authorities of Jefferson Parish, the pertinent excerpts from the recommendations of the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish are as follows;

Whereas, Penick & Ford, Ltd., Incorporated has filed with this Body an application to eliminate this item of \$1,028,446.00 or in alternative to reduce said item to \$142,841.55, less depreciation, and

Whereas, this body after considering the matter, has concluded that to assess said products at \$1,028,446.00, would constitute a double assessment, and that taxes on said products would be paid twice in the State of Louisiana, in violation of law, except to the extent of said average valuation of \$142,841.55, and, Whereas, this body is of the opinion that the item of \$1,028,446.00 should be reduced to the sum of \$121,415.32, which is the average valuation of \$142,841.55, less depreciation of 15 per cent; therefore

" Be it resolved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson that John Ehret, Assessor of the Parish of Jefferson, be instructed and empowered provided same is approved by the Louisiana Tax Commission, to reduce said item of \$1,028,446.00 to the sum of \$121,415.32.

"Be it further resolved. That this body does declare that it has made a thorough investigation of this application, that it is of the opinion that the same should be approved by the Louisiana Tax Commission and this body does respectfully request the Louisiana Tax Commission to approve this reduction."

On motion of Mr. Broussard, seconded and unanimously adopted, the recommendations of the Police Jury were respectfully denied for the reason that the Louisiana Tax Commission entertains the belief that the language use in Section 4 of Article O of the Constitution of 1921, dealing with the exemption of property from taxation, to-wit: "Agricultural products while owned by the producer;" repeals all existing laws on this question and makes it the mandatory duty of this commission to list for taxation agricultural products of the soil after same have passed out of the hand of the original producer.

It was further resolved that the Police Jury be notified that by reason of the presentation of additional acts by the representatives of Penick & Ford, Ltd. Incorporated, this commission has reduced the assessment of merchandise presently carried on the assessment listings of the Parish of Jefferson, of the year 1926, from \$1,678,956.00 to \$1,311,480.00.

It was further resolved that a copy of these resolutions be sent to the secretary of the Police Jury and to the Assessor of Jefferson Parish for their information and guidance.

MAYER, appearing herein as President of the AVONDALE LAND CO; INC; a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Louisiana, and domiciled in the Town of Gretna Louisiana: said appearer acting and appearing herein under and by virtue of resolution of the Board of Directors held on the 6th day of January, 1926, a certified copy of which is hereto annexed.

WHO DECLARED.

WHEREAS, the said appearers are the owners of adjoining lands situated on the west bank of the Mississippi River in the Parish of Jefferson, as hereinafter more fully described, and

WHEREAS, there is at present a roadway on the line separating the two plantations on tracts of land forty (40) feet in width, with the dividing line between said places, about the center of said roadway and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the respective parties to dedicate said roadway as a public highway for the use and benefit of the public, and.

WHEREAS, the said parties desire to make, fix and establish said roadway as the boundry between said two properties.

THEY DO BY THESE PRESENTS AGREE AND STIPULATE, for themselves their ex-ecutors, administrators, heirs and assigns as follows:

The sole and only heirs of the late James S. Brady and his wife, Mrs. Mathilda J. Burks-Brady, appearers herein, namely EDWIN P. BRADY MRS. RUBY EDNA BRADY, wife of William S. Dirker, MRS. CONNIE LEE BRADY, wife of S. M. Watson and DR. MILO J. BRADY: are the owners of the following described porterty;

A certain plantation on the West Bank of the Mississippi River, in town-ship 13 and 14 south range 24, east; bounded below by Avondale Plantation (now land of Avondale Land Co.;) and bounded above by property of Estate of James Witheraw;

The Avondale Land Co; Inc; one of the appearers herein, the owner of the following described property;

A certain plantation known as Avondale Plantation situated on the West Bank of the Mississippi River in Township 13 and 14 south range 24, east; S. E. Land District west of the Mississippi River bounded a-bove by the first described property and below by the lands of the Standard Oil Co.

Have caused a survey and plan to be made showing the location of said properties and the road way dividing same which said plan is here-to annexed and made part hereof.

That nothing herein shall be construed as an obligation imposed on either of the parties to maintain or keep in order said roadway- the intention being that these matters shall be left for future adjust-ment by agreement between the parties of interest.

Report of Major Frank T. Payne, Parish Engineer and Special Engineer of Road District No. 1, covering work done on Kenner-Hanson City Road, North Line Road, and Orleans-Kenner Highway since last regular meeting, was received.

Report of Bureau of Animal Industry showing the progress of tick eradication of Louisiana for month of November 1926.

Report of committee appointed to take up with the Sheriff the matter of appointing two Highway Traffic Officers for the Parish as recommended by the Police Jury.

District Attorney Jno. R. Fleury member of said Committee reported verbally that the committee called on the Sheriff in reference to traffic officers stated we desire to report we called at Sheriffs Office, and was informed he was not in but would be in later. We called later and he was not in the second time. Three visits were made with the entire committee. A few days later I called personally and was unable to see the Sheriff, the three times he was not in his office. A week or so after the meeting of the Jury Mr. Strehle and myself called at his office by appointment and took the matter up with him, I explained the idea of the committee's call was to see if the difference between him and the Police Jury could not be settled, and the appointment of two traffic officers made, that due to the accident of killing of the little Ragan child at Metairie ridge, that the traffic situation has reached a dangerous point that called for some action, additionally so, because of the present Race Track Meet, and that we felt that something should be done to curb the speeding of automobiles in the Parish particularly on the Metairie Road. I suggested that as a matter of compromise, I understood that he took the position that the Jury ought to permit him to appoint one traffic officer and the Jury appoint the other, and he stated that we were misinformed, and that was not his position at all, but his position was he had the right to appoint both officers, and that if the Jury authorized him to appoint traffic officers that he would appoint both of them, and he also stated that he did not interfere with the Police Jury as far as running its affairs are concerned, and that he did not propose to let the Police Jury interfere with him in the running of his office. I informed the Sheriff that I did not believe that the Police Jury would consent to authorize him to appoint both traffic officers, that owing to the fact the Jury took the position that they had to pay the salaries, and I understood that was the Jury's position, and I argued with him to recede from his position, and thereby permit the Jury and himself

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to appoint one traffic officer each, and thereby settle the whole matter. And incidentally get Police protection on the highways, and that the Police Jury was perfectly satisfied to meet him half-way on the traffic question although they had recommended the appointment of both traffic officers previously.

The Sheriff however reiterated his position and refused to consent

to the suggestion and as a result we were unable to settle the matter, and the matter stands as it stood originally.

AN ORDINANCE:

To levy collect and enforce payment of an annual license tax on all persons, associations of persons, firms and corporations pursuing any trade, professions, vocation, calling or business, in pursuance of Section 8 Article X, of the Constitution of 1921; and Act. 205 of Legislation of 1924; prescribing the mode and method in which all persons subject to license shall make report of their business; providing remedies to enforce compliance therewith; prescribing penalties for making false statements or affidavits in relations thereto; and to repeal conflicting and inconsistent laws.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish that there is hereby levied an annual license tax for the year of 1927, and for each subsequent year, upon each person, association of persons, firm and corporation, pursuing any trade, profession, vocation, calling or business, subject to license under Section 8 of Article X of the Constitution of 1921 and Act. 205 of 1924.

Section 2. That on the second day of January 1927, and of each subsequent year, each tax collector throughout the State shall begin to collect and shall collect as fast as possible from each of the persons or business firms, association of persons and corporations pursuing within his district or parish any trade, profession, vocation, calling or business, a license tax as hereinafter fixed and graduated.

All license shall be due and collectable during the first two (2) months of each year, and all unpaid licenses shall become delinquent on the first day of March of each year, and all persons, firms, association of persons and corporations, who commence business after that date shall become delinquent unless the license is paid within ten days after commencing business.

Section 3. That for each business of carrying on a bank, banking company, trust company, association, corporation or agency, the license shall be based on the declared or nominal capital surplus and undivided profits and shall be fixed and graded, as follows to wit.

First Class- When the declared or nominal capital, surplus and undivided profits amount to two hundred thousand dollars, or more, and less than three hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be three hundred dollars (\$300.00).

Second Class - When the declared or nominal capital, surplus or undivided profits amount to one hundred thousand dollars or more, and less than two hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be two hundred dollars (\$200.00).

Third Class - When the declared or nominal capital, surplus and undivided profits amount to fifty thousand dollars or more; and less than one hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Fourth Class - When the declared or nominal capital, surplus and undivided profits amount to twenty-five thousand dollars or more, and less than fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be seventy-five dollars (\$75.00).

Fifth Class - When the declared or nominal capital surplus and undivided profits amount to less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

The license imposed by this section shall be due and payable by each

branch of a bank, or banking company, trust company, association, corporation or agency, operated separate and apart from the parent or principal bank, banking co.

trust company, association, corporation or agency, where such branch establishment has allotted to, set apart or designated to it, a declared or nominal capital surplus or undivided profit; and such branch bank, banking company, trust company, association, corporation or agency having no such declared or nominal capital, surplus or undivided profits allotted to, set apart or designated to it, shall pay the minimum license fixed in this section.

Section four-That for each business of carrying on a private banking house business or agency, the license shall be based on the total declared capital invested in said business, whether said capital is owned or in or on deposit in this Parish or elsewhere, and shall be fixed and graded as follows, to wit;

First Class- When said capital is five hundred thousand dollars or more, the license shall be six hundred dollars (\$600.00).

Second Class- When said capital is two hundred and fifty thousand dollars the license shall be three hundred dollars (\$300.00).

Third Class- When said capital is one hundred and fifty thousand dollars or more, and under two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be two hundred dollars (\$200.00).

Fourth Class- When said capital is under one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

First Class- When the gross annual commissions are twenty thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and eighty dollars (\$180.00).

Second Class- When the gross annual; commissions are fifteen thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and forty dollars (\$140.00).

Third Class- When the gross annual commissions are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Fourth Class- When the gross annual commissions are five thousand dollars or more and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00).

Fifth Class- When the gross annual commissions are less than five thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Provided, that if any person, firm, or corporation carrying on the business designated this Section shall conduct more than one office or place of business.

Whether in the same or under different names, such person, firm or corporation shall pay a separate license for each and every office or place of business it shall conduct according to the hereinabove classification.

Provided, further, that this Ordinance shall not apply to persons, corporations or institutions carrying on banking business as provided by section three (3) of this Ordinance, and provided further that this Ordinance shall not apply to persons, corporations or companies lending money secured by mortgages upon real estate.

Section 7. That for every wholesale dealer merchandise, not otherwise provided for by the Ordinance or by special laws, whether the business be conducted at a fixed establishment or otherwise, and whether conducted as principal, agent or commission otherwise, the license shall

be fixed and graded in classes, and for each separate establishment where more than one such establishment is kept or conducted by the same, person, firm, association, or corporation they shall be a separate license, as herein fixed and graded, as follows to wit:

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First Class-When the gross sales are two hundred and fifty thousand dollars or more, and less than five hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and fifty dollars, (\$150.00).

Second Class- When the gross sales are one hundred and fifty thousand dollars or more, and less than two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Third Class- When the gross sales are one hundred thousand dollars or more, and less than one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be seventy-five dollars (\$75.00).

Fourth Class- When the gross sales are less than one hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

Provided, that no person or persons shall be deemed wholesale dealers unless he or they sell by the original or unbroken package or barrel only; and provided further, that no person or persons, shall be deemed wholesale dealers unless he or they sell to dealers for re-sale. If they sell in less quantities than original unbroken package or barrel they shall be considered retail dealers and pay license as such.

Section 8. That for every business of selling merchandise at retail not otherwise provided by this Ordinance or by special laws, whether the business be conducted as principal, agent on commission or otherwise, the license shall be fixed and graded in classes, and for each separate establishment where more than one such establishment is kept and conducted by the same person, firm, association or corporation, there shall be separate license, as herein fixed and graded, as follows, to wit;

First Class- When the gross sales are fifty thousand dollars or more, and less than seventy-five thousand dollars, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00).

Second Class-When the gross sales are forty thousand dollars or more, and less than fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty (\$50.00).

Third Class- When the gross sales are thirty thousand dollars or more and less than forty thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty-five dollars (\$35.00).

Fourth Class- When the gross sales are twenty-five thousand dollars or more, and less than thirty thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Fifth Class-When the gross sales are twenty thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty-five thousand dollars the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Sixth Class-When the gross sales are fifteen thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00).

Seventh Class-When the gross sales are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars. (\$15.00).

Eighth Class- When gross sales are five thousand dollars or more, and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be ten dollars

(\$10.00).

Ninth Class- When the gross sales are less than five thousand dollars, the license shall be five dollars (\$5.00).

Provided that if any distilled, vinous, malt or cereal drinks, ice cream, confection, soda water, soda pop, coca-cola, chero-cola, grapico or other similar soft drinks or beverages or refreshments be sold in connection with or in the same establishment with the business of retail merchant, the sale thereof shall be deemed a separate business, and a separate license shall be paid for the pursuit of such business as may be provided by this Ordinance, or by existing laws not hereby repealed, or by subsequent laws.

Provided further, that farmers or planters having stores on their farms or plantations and selling or advancing supplies to their employees exclusively shall not be classed as merchants nor shall they be required to pay a license under this Ordinance.

Section 15. That for carrying on each business of gas light, gas heat or power; electric light; water works cotton compress or ginnery; cotton pickery; slaughter house; distillery rectifying alcoholic or malt liquors; brewing ale, beer, porter or other malt liquors; and for each telegraph, telephone or express business, other than those subject to license under the foreign license Ordinance or special laws, the license shall be based on the gross annual receipts, and shall be fixed, and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class-When the gross annual receipts are one hundred thousand dollars or more and less than one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be three hundred dollars (\$300.00).

Second Class-When the gross annual receipts are seventy-five thousand dollars or more, and less than one hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be two hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$225.00).

Third Class-When the gross annual receipts are fifty thousand dollars or more, and less than seventy-five thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00).

Fourth Class- When the gross annual receipts are thirty-seven thousand dollars or more, and less than fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and fifteen dollars (\$115.00).

Fifth Class- When the gross annual receipts are twenty-five thousand dollars or more, and less than thirty-seven thousand five hundred dollars, the license shall be seventy-five dollars (\$75.00).

Sixth Class-When the gross annual receipts are twenty thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00).

Seventh Class-When the gross annual receipts are fifteen thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty thousand dollars, the license shall be forty-five dollars (\$45.00)

Eighth Class- When the gross annual receipts are less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). Provided, that this section shall not apply to planters and farmers ginning their own cotton or that of their tenants, exclusively nor to those who gin for hire not over four hundred bales of cotton per annum.

Section 16. That for every business of keeping a theatre, opera house, amphitheater, academy of music, exhibition of moving pictures, thatorium or other similar places of amusement the license shall be based upon the gross annual receipts of said business, and shall be fixed and graded as follows to wit:

First Class- When the gross annual receipts are twenty thousand dollars or more, and less than thirty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Second Class- When the gross annual receipts are fifteen thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty thousand dollars, the license shall be seventy-five dollars. (\$75.00).

Third Class-When the gross annual receipts are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

Fourth Class-When the gross annual receipts are five thousand dollars or more, and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Fifth Class-When the gross annual receipts are two thousand five hundred dollars or more, and less than five thousand dollars, the license shall be twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50).

Sixth Class-When the gross annual receipts are less than two thousand five hundred dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00).

Second Class- When the number of persons is one hundred or more, and less than two hundred, the license shall be six hundred dollars (\$600.00).

Third Class- When the number of such persons is seventy-five or more, and less than one hundred, the license shall be four hundred and eighty dollars (\$480.00).

Fourth Class-When the number of such persons is fifty or more and less than seventy-five, the license shall be three hundred and sixty dollars (\$360.00).

Fifth Class- When the number of such persons is thirty or more, and less than fifty, the license shall be three hundred dollars (\$300.00).

Sixth Class-When the number of such persons is twenty or more, and less than thirty, the license shall be two hundred and forty dollars (\$240.00).

Seventh Class-When the number of such persons is ten or more, and less than twenty, the license shall be one hundred and eighty dollars (\$180.00).

Eighth Class-When the number of such persons is five or more, and less than ten, the license shall be one hundred and twenty dollars (\$120.00).

Ninth Class- When the number of such persons is four, the license shall be ninety dollars (\$90.00).

Tenth Class-When the number of such persons is three, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00).

Eleventh Class-When the number of such persons is two, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

Twelfth Class-When the number is one the license shall be thirty-five dollars (\$35.00).

For every hall or balls or entertainments not above provided for are given, the classification for license shall be based upon the number of persons the place is capable of entertaining, and the amount of the license shall be fixed and graded as follows to-wit:

First Class-When the number of seats or spaces is two thousand or more, the license shall be two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00).

Second Class-When the number of seats or spaces is one thousand five hundred or more, and less than two thousand, the license shall be one hundred and ninety dollars (\$190.00).

Third Class-When the number of seats or spaces is one thousand or more, and less than one thousand five hundred, the license shall be one hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$125.00).

Fourth Class-When the number of seats or spaces is seven hundred and fifty or more, and less than one thousand, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Section 18- That for each and every peddler or hawker, other than vendors of ice, shall pay on annual license, which license is hereby fixed classified and graded as follows, to-wit;

(a) When traveling on foot, One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). when traveling on horseback, One Hundred and Twenty Dollars (\$120.00). When traveling in a one-horse vehicle, One Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$150.00). When traveling in any kind of water craft, Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).

(b) Provided, that persons residing in the Parish where the license is issued, and selling their goods exclusively in said Parish, shall pay only one-half of the amounts named in sub-section (a); as above set out.

And provided that peddlers of fresh meat, poultry, eggs, vegetables and fruit shall pay only one-fifth of the graded license herein stipulated, and persons, when vending their own produce, shall pay no license; and provided further, that no person shall be allowed to sell goods as a clerk or clerks of a peddler or hawker, but that he or they must pay a license in his or their name, but that this provision shall not apply to water craft. And provided further, that all parochial or municipal officers are hereby empowered and directed to cause all peddlers and hawkers to exhibit their State license, if any, and the said peddler or hawker failing to exhibit the same, the said officers are directed and empowered by this Act to seize said stock of merchandise and turn the same over to any Court of competent jurisdiction with due information, as to the violation of this Act.

Provided further, that said executive officers shall be entitled to receive as fees the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00) in each and every case from a peddler or hawker, clerk or clerks employed by said peddler or hawker, when peddling without a license in violation of this law; the said amount of ten dollars to be recovered before any court of competent jurisdiction out of the goods so seized. Provided further that no license shall be issued to any peddler or hawker for less than full rate of the current year.

For every business or restaurant, tea room, coffee house or other eating house, whether attached to or conducted separate and apart from a hotel, boarding houses or rooming houses, a separate license shall be paid and such license shall be fixed and graded as provided in Section 8 of this Act for retail dealers; but no license shall be charged for selling refreshments for charitables or religious purposes.

Section 20. That for keeping billiard tables, pigeonhole, Jonny-lind, Pool or bagatelle tables, tenpin alleys, and shooting galleries, from which revenue is derived a license of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for each such table, alley or gallery shall be paid in addition to any other license due by the establishment in which said tables, alleys or galleries may be situated.

Section 21. That all persons, associations of persons, firms and

corporations engaged in the sale at retail, of soda water, ice cream, confections, soda pop, coca cola, chero cola, grapico or other similar soft drinks or beverages or refreshments shall pay a license based on the gross annual sales and such license are hereby fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class-When the gross sales are six thousand dollars or more, and less than eight thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Second Class-When the gross sales are four thousand dollars or more, and less than six thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

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Third Class-When the gross sales are three thousand dollars or more, and less than four thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00).

Fourth Class-When the gross sales are two thousand dollars or more, and less than three thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00).

Fifth Class-When the gross sales are one thousand dollars or more, and less than two thousand dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00).

Sixth Class-When the gross sales are less than one thousand dollars, the license shall be five dollars (\$5.00).

Section 22. That all persons, associations of persons, firms or corporations engaged in the sale at wholesale, of distilled, spiritous, vinous malt, cereal or other liquors or beverages containing any alcoholic content shall pay licenses based upon the gross annual sales, and each separate establishment, place, distributing station or depot from which such beverages are sold and distributed at wholesale, whether conducted as principal, agent or distributor, shall pay a separate license, which licenses are hereby fixed, and graded, as follows, to-wit:

First Class-When the gross sales are forty thousand dollars or more, and less than fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00).

Second Class-When the gross sales are thirty thousand dollars or more, and less than forty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$125.00).

Third Class-When the gross sales are twenty thousand dollars or more, and less than thirty thousand dollars the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Fourth Class-When the gross sales are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty thousand dollars, the license shall be seventy-five dollars. (\$75.00).

Fifth Class-When the gross sales are less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00).

Section 23 That all persons, associations of persons, firms, or corporations engaged in the sale, at retail, of malt or cereal beverages containing any alcoholic content less than one-half of one percent by volume shall pay license based upon the gross annual sales, and each separate establishment at which such beverages are sold at retail, whether conducted as principal agent, or distributor, shall pay a separate license,

which licenses are hereby fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class-When the gross annual sales are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

Second Class-When the gross annual sales are eight thousand dollars or more, and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be forty dollars (\$40.00).

Third Class-When the gross annual sales are six thousand dollars or more, and less than eight thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00)

Fourth Class-When the gross annual sales are four thousand dollars, or more, and less than six thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Fifth Class-When the gross annual sales are three thousand dollars or more, and less than four thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00).

Sixth Class-When the gross annual sales are two thousand dollars or more, and less than three thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00).

Seventh Class-When gross annual sales are one thousand dollars or more, and less than two thousand dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00).

Eighth Class-When the gross annual sales are less than one thousand dollars, the license shall be five dollars (\$5.00).

Nothing in this Act contained shall be construed to authorize the issuance of a license for the sale of any liquor or beverage the sale of which is prohibited by law or ordinance of the United States or of the State of Louisiana or of any municipality or other subdivision thereof.

Provided, that person, association, firm, or corporation engaged in the business mentioned in this Section and having a proper license, may sell in connection with said business any of the commodities mentioned in Section 21 of this Act without paying a separate license, but the total sales from such combined business shall determine the amount of license to be paid according to the classifications in this Section.

Section 24. That every individual, firm, company, or corporation carrying on the profession or business of contractor, shall pay a license based upon the gross annual receipts of said business, which licenses shall be fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class-When the gross receipts are twenty-five thousand dollars or more, and less than fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Second Class-When the gross receipts are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00).

Third Class-When the gross receipts are less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50).

Provided that every individual, firm, company or corporation carrying on the profession or business of master builder or mechanic, who employs assistance where building is done for others on a cost-plus basis, commission or presentage plan, shall pay a license based upon the annual earnings from such business which license shall be fixed and graded as provided in Section 5 of this Act for those carrying on a commission or brokerage business.

Section 25. That every individual, firm, association or corporation carrying on the profession or business of keeping cabs, carriages, hacks, horses, or motor vehicles for hire undertaker, funeral director, agency for steamboats or steamships and owners or leases of toll bridges or ferries, stevedores, and those engaged in the business or profession of bill posting, tacking or advertising, the license shall be based upon the gross annual receipts from such profession or business, and shall be fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class-When the gross annual receipts are six thousand dollars or more, and less than eight thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

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Second Class-When the gross annual receipts are five thousand dollars or more, and less than six thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty-seven dollars and fifty cents (\$37.50).

Third Class-When the gross annual receipts are four thousand dollars or more, and less than five thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Fourth Class-When the gross annual receipts are three thousand dollars or more, and less than four thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Fifth Class-When the gross annual receipts are two thousand dollars or more, and less than three thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00).

Sixth Class-When the gross annual receipts are one thousand dollars or more, and less than two thousand dollars, the license shall be twelve dollars (\$12.00).

Seventh Class-When the gross annual receipts are seven hundred and fifty dollars or more, and less than one thousand dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00).

Eighth Class-When the gross annual receipts are less than seven hundred fifty dollars, the license shall be five dollars (\$5.00).

That any other business not provided for in this Ordinance not otherwise provided for by separate law, except manufacturing shall be graduated the same as above set forth, and shall pay a license as fixed in this Section.

That every individual, firm, association or corporation carrying on the business or profession of physician, osteopath, dentist, oculist attorney-at-law, editor, publisher, printer engraver, lithographer, photographer, architect, civil engineer, mechanical engineer, electrical engineer, decorator, jeweler, or any other professional occupation, shall be graded according to the classification named above, but the license for the various professions included in this paragraph shall be one-half of those established by the foregoing provisions of this Section; provided that no license shall be issued hereunder for less than five dollars (\$5.00).

Section 25 A. That every individual, firm, association or corporation carrying on profession or business of steam dying, steam cleaning, steam pressing or the business of steam electric laundering, the license shall be based upon the gross annual receipts from such profession or business, and shall be fixed and graded as follows. to-wit:

First Class-When the gross annual receipts are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than twelve thousand dollars, the license shall be forty dollars (\$40.00).

Second Class-When the gross annual receipts are eight thousand dollars or more, and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Third Class-When the gross annual receipts are six thousand dollars or more, and less than eight thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Fourth Class-When the gross annual receipts are less than five thousand dollars the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00).

AN ORDINANCE

To levy, collect and enforce payment of a license tax upon all persons, associations, engaged or pursuing any business whereby dogs are run for purses, and, or where any entrance fee is charged for the dogs racing, With certain exceptions; and prescribing the mode and method by which said license tax shall be collected; and providing a penalty for violation hereof, and repealing all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, That there be and is hereby levied a license tax upon each person, association, of persons, or business firm, partnership or corporation, engaged in or business whereby dogs are run for purses, or where entrance fee is charged for the entrance of the said dogs in a race, for each and every race track so operated, which said license shall be graduated upon daily receipts from admissions paid by spectators and entrance fees charged for the entrance of the said dogs in the said races as follows:

First Class-When paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for dogs racing amount to \$10,000.00 or more per day, the license tax shall be \$200.00 per day, for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Second Class-When paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for the dogs racing amount to \$5,000.00 and less than \$10,000.00 the license tax shall be \$150.00 per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Third Class-When said paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for the dogs racing amount to less than \$5,000.00 per day the license tax shall be \$100.00 per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Section 2. That the aforesaid license tax shall be collected by the constituted authority charged with the collection of license due to the State.

Section 3. That the minimum license tax herein provided shall be paid in advance daily to the constituted authority charged with the collection thereof, and no race shall be run unless same is paid, under penalty herein provided, and the balance of said license tax, if any, shall be paid before 3 o'clock P. M. on the following day the calculation thereof to be in accordance with the herein provided graduated schedule in Section No. 1; and that this license tax shall become due and owing on each and every day that said races are run, and shall become delinquent on the following day, and it is hereby made the duty of the District Attorney of this Parish to enforce the collection of this said license tax, and for the services rendered in such collection, he shall be entitled to 20% over and above the amount of the license collected from the delinquent debtor, as attorney's fees, which said attorneys' fees shall be paid by the said delinquent license debtor, and shall be assessed as

costs of suit.

Section 4. That all suits for the collection of this license tax shall be summary and be tried in accordance with the law in force for the collection delinquent licenses for taxes.

Section 5. That the amount of tax due by the aforesaid person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporations, engaged in the aforesaid business shall be determined as follows:

The daily receipts of the paid admissions and entrance fee charged for the entrance of the said dogs in the said races for the said day shall be added and totalled up and then the license tax calculated thereon in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of this Act.

Section 6. That the provisions of this Act shall not apply to an association of persons or corporations engaged in holding or conducting a fair solely for the purpose of exhibiting agricultural or manufactured products or natural

resources looking toward the advancement of the agricultural or manufacturing interest or the development of the natural resources in the said parish, where said dogs racing is conducted as an auxiliary sport, and as an incident for amusement and entertainment and not for the purpose of profit, provided that said fairs so conducted shall not be for a longer period than 14 days.

Section 7. That any person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporations conducting or operating a race track or races in contravention of the provisions of this Act without having first paid said license tax as aforesaid shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of not more than \$1000.00 and not less than \$25.00 or by imprisonment of not more than 30 days and not less than 10 days in parish jail, or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court, provided that in case the violator be an association, firm or corporation, the managing officers and agents hereof shall be punishable by such fine or imprisonment, and provided that such fine and imprisonment shall not be construed as relieving said violator from said license tax.

Section 8. That all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE.

To levy, and collect and enforce payment of a license tax upon all persons, association of persons, or business firms, partnerships or corporations engaged or pursuing any business whereby horses are run for purses, and or where any entrance fee is charged for the horses racing, with certain exceptions; and prescribing the mode and method by which said license tax shall be collected, and providing a penalty for violation thereof and repealing all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, That there be and is hereby levied a license tax upon each

person, association of persons, or business firm, partnership or corporation, engaged in or pursuing any business whereby horses are run for purses or where any entrance fee is charged for the entrance of the said horses in a race for each and every race track so operated, which said license shall be graduated upon daily receipts from admission paid by spectators and entrance fees charged for the entrance of the said horses in the said race, as follows:

First Class - - When said paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for horses racing amount to ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) or more per day, the license tax shall be six hundred dollars (\$600.00) per day, for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Second Class - When the said paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for the horses racing amount to seventy-five hundred dollars (\$7,500.00) and less than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) per day, the license tax shall be five hundred dollars (\$500.00) per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Third Class - When said paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for the horses racing amount to five thousand (\$5,000.00) and less than seventy-five hundred dollars (\$7,500.00) per day, the license tax shall be three hundred and fifty dollars (\$350.00) per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Fourth Class - When said paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for the horses racing amount to less than five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) per day the license tax shall be two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Section 2. That the aforesaid license tax shall be collected by the constituted authority charged with the collection of license due to the State.

Section 3. That the minimum license tax herein provided shall be paid in advance daily to the constituted authority charged with collection hereof, and no race shall be run unless same is paid under penalty herein provided, and the balance of said license tax, if any, shall be paid before 3 o'clock P. M. on the following day, the calculation thereof, to be in accordance, with the herein provided graduated schedule in Section No. 1; and that this license tax shall become due and owing on each and every day that the said races are run, and shall become delinquent on the following day, and it is hereby made the duty of the District Attorney of this Parish to enforce the collection of this said license tax, and for the services rendered in such collection, he shall be entitled to 20% over and above the amount of the license collected from the delinquent debtor, as attorney's fees which said attorney's fees shall be paid by the said delinquent license debtor, and shall be assessed as costs in case of suit.

Section 4. That all suits or rules for the collection of this license tax shall be summary and be tried in accordance with the law in force for the collection of delinquent licenses or taxes.

Section 5. That the amount of tax due by the aforesaid person, associations of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporations, engaged in the aforesaid business shall be determined as follows:

The daily receipts of the paid admissions and entrance fee charged for the entrance of the said horses in the said races for the said day

shall be added and totaled up and then the license tax calculated in accordance thereon with the provisions of Section 1 of this Act:

Section 6. That the provisions of this act shall not apply to associations or persons or corporations engaged in holding or conducting a fair solely for the purpose of exhibiting agricultural or manufactured products or natural resources looking toward the advancement of the agricultural or manufactural interest or the development of the natural resources in the said parish, where said horse racing is conducted as an auxiliary sport, as an incident for amusement and entertainment, and not for the purpose of profit, provided that said fairs so conducted shall not be for a longer period than 14 days.

Section 7. That any person, association of persons, business firms, partnership or corporations conducting or operating a race track or races in contravention of the provisions of this Act, without having first paid said license tax as aforesaid, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine not more than \$100.00 and not less than \$25.00, or by imprisonment of not more than 30 days and not less than 10 days in the parish jail or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court, provided that in case the violator be an association, firm or corporation, the managing officers and agents thereof shall be punishable by such fine or imprisonment and shall not be construed as

relieving said violator of said license tax.

Section 8. That all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Roll being called to vote on the adoption of the above Resolution resulted as follows:

Yeas - Erlinger, Strehle, Dauenhauer, Cantrelle, Petit, Fisher, Ottermann, Bordes.

Nays - None.

Section 31 - That the annual receipts, capital, sales, premiums, commissions and earnings in this Ordinance referred to as a basis of license, are those for the year for which the license is granted; the standard for their estimation shall be prima facie of the proceeding year if the business has been conducted previously by the same party or parties to whom they claim to be successors. If the firm or company be new, the amount of gross sales for the first two months shall be estimated as the annual receipts of such business; provided that any person commencing business after the first of July, peddlers, hawkers, and traveling shows excepted, shall pay one half of the above rates.

Section 32 - That the business of the previous year, as also the actual condition and results of business of the current year, for the new firms, associations, corporations for the purpose of calculating licenses, shall be ascertained by the tax collector in the sworn statements of the person or persons in interest his or their duly authorized agent or officer made before the tax collector, if the tax collector be not satisfied with the said sworn statement, he shall traverse the same by a rule taken in proper court, which rule shall be tried summarily, whether an answer be thereto filed or not. On the trial of said rule, the books and written entries and memoranda of said person or persons,

firms, companies, corporations or parties shall be brought into court, and subject to the inspection and examination of the court, the officer who took the rule, and such experts as he may employ or the court may appoint; provided, that this inspection shall not be construed as entitling the defendant to introduce in evidence said books and documents any more than he would have been without such inspection; provided, also, that the license shall issue in accordance with the said sworn statement, notwithstanding the prospect of pendency of the rule, the final ratification shall be made as ordered by the court.

In addition to the duties and powers herein imposed upon and vested in tax collectors, the Supervisor of Public Accounts shall have authority to review and examine any sworn statements or accounts that may have been or may be rendered or furnished in pursuance of the provisions of this Act; and he shall have authority to demand and examine the books, statements and accounts of any person, firm, association or corporation from whom a license may be due under the provisions of this Act; and to take such proceedings before any court of competent jurisdiction by rule or otherwise, against the tax collector or against any person, firm, association or corporation from whom a license may be due, as may be necessary to enforce a full and fair compliance with the provisions of this Act.

Section 33 - That if any business shall be conducted without a license, in case herein provided, the officer whose duty it is to issue license, shall through the attorney herein provided for, on motion in the proper courts as provided for, in the constitution, and which shall be without deposit or advance cost, take a rule on the party or parties doing such business to show cause on the fifth day, exclusive of holidays, after the service thereof, which may be tried out of term time and in chambers, and shall always be tried by preference, why said party or parties should not pay the amount of the license claimed and penalties, or be ordered to cease from further said business until after having obtained a license; and in case said rule is made absolute, the order thereon rendered shall be considered a judgment in favor of the State, for the amount decreed to be due by the defendant for license and penalty and cost heretofore and hereinafter provided for, and shall be executed in the same manner as other judgments, and every violation of the order shall be considered as a contempt thereof, and punished according to law.

It is hereby expressly provided that each person, association of persons, business firm, or corporations required to take out a license under this Act, shall be required to post the same in a conspicuous place, in his or their place of business, under a penalty of not less than ten nor more than one hundred dollars, recoverable by the tax collector before any court of competent jurisdiction and it shall be the duty of the several tax collectors throughout the state to visit in person or by deputies, the several places of business herein mentioned, and ascertain that the provisions of this section are strictly carried out.

Section 34 - That the only legal evidence that a license has been paid be the appropriate form of license issued by the Auditor of Public Accounts, and no receipts issued by a tax collector in place of the license itself shall be valid, and this clause shall be construed to prevent the tax collector from issuing a receipt, in lieu of the appropriate form to any person, associations of persons, or business

corporations; provided, that nothing herein contained shall be construed so as to exclude oral evidence of loss or destroyed licenses.

Section 35 - That the Ex-officer tax collectors shall prepare and keep a book in which they shall record or file the statements made under oath of all persons, associations, of persons, business firms or corporations, who may apply for license to pursue any trade, profession, vocation, calling or business under this ordinance.

Section 36 - That the ex-officio tax collector charged with the collection of taxes, shall hereby administer oath to any person, president or proper official or agent of any association of persons, business firms or corporations applying for licenses under this Ordinance; and any tax collector or ex-officio tax collector as aforesaid, or any notary public or other officer of the Parish empowered to administer oaths, who shall sign any part or certify to any oath without administering the oath in person to the applicant and having the applicant sign the oath in his presence, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction shall be subject to a fine of not less than one hundred dollars nor more than one thousand dollars or imprisonment of not less than thirty days nor more than ninety days or both in the discretion of the court. That when the oath is taken before the collector, no charge shall be made for same. Any false swearing as to the gross receipts of any person or persons, or corporations through their president or proper officer or agent applying for license, shall constitute the crime of perjury, to be punished as directed by existing criminal laws of the Parish. All licenses shall be paid in the parish wherein is situated or conducted the business for which the license is due. Where an individual is applicant for license, the affidavit must be taken in person; where a partnership, by a member of the firm, and where a corporation by the proper officer thereof.

But in the absence from the parish of the individuals, the member of the firm or the proper officer of the Corporation, same may be taken by a competent agent on personal knowledge of the fact, to be made to appear in the body of the affidavit.

Section 37 - That the tax collectors and ex-officio tax collectors are hereby required to keep a license register, in which they shall enter the names of every person, association of persons, business firm or corporation, with the trade, profession, vocation, calling or business pursued, the class and graduation of the same, the amount of the license thereon, and the date of the collection or payment thereof. On July 1st of each and every year the said collectors shall make and forward to the Auditor of Public Accounts a full and complete transcript of said license register, showing all licenses collected during the proceeding six months. A similar transcript shall be filed by them on December 31st of each and every year showing all licenses collected during the second half of the year. The Auditor of Public Accounts shall lay a copy of these transcripts before the General Assembly at each regular session, the originals of which he shall file in his office for future reference or use.

Section 38 - That the ex-officio tax collector violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance, or who shall wilfully rate any person, association of persons, or business firm or corporation, at a less graduation than the law contemplates, or who shall issue to any said person,

association of persons or business firm or corporation a license for a less sum than that corresponding with their graduation, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor in office and shall, on conviction before a competent authority, be summarily dismissed therefrom.

Section 39 - That the Governor of the State shall designate for each parish including the Parish of Orleans, an attorney-at-law, whose duty it shall be to aid the tax collector or ex-officio tax collector in the parish for which he is appointed in the collection of the State and parish licenses provided by this Act, and upon all licenses and penalties collected through the agency of the said attorney, the delinquent owing the licenses shall pay a commission to him of ten per centum, calculating same upon the aggregate amount of licenses and penalties so collected and paid over to the tax collector. The said attorney shall receive no other compensation. The attorney so appointed shall serve during good behavior, and shall be liable to be summarily removed by the Governor for good and sufficient cause. It shall be the duty of the district attorney of the country parishes to represent the tax collectors of said parishes in the collection of delinquent licenses in case no attorney shall accept such appointment or in case the attorney so appointed refuses to act.

On the second day of March of each year the tax collector or ex-officio tax collector shall deliver to the attorneys herein provided for a complete list of all delinquent license payers, together with their location and kind of business, and the attorney shall immediately proceed to collect same in accordance with this ordinance, and if not collected within thirty days from the date of delivery of the list by the collector of taxes or ex-officio collector of taxes, it shall be the duty of said attorneys to render a written report giving the reasons for non-collection to the collectors, whose duty it shall be to forward such report to the Auditor of Public Accounts. Provided, that the Attorneys herein provided for clerks of courts, sheriffs, constables, or other officers, shall receive no compensation, commission, salary, docket fee or fees for services rendered in any suit or action for the collection of licenses under the provisions of this Act in which the said tax collector or ex-officio tax collector has failed to obtain full and complete satisfaction and payment of any judgment in favor of the state of Louisiana; and provided further, that said attorneys, clerks of court, sheriffs, constables or other officers shall receive no compensation in any license suit for services rendered in which judgment has been rendered against said tax collector or ex-officio tax collector of the State of Louisiana.

Section 40 - That if any tax collector or officer, whose duty it is to issue state licenses shall, through incompetency, negligence or fault on his part, fail to collect licenses in the proper amounts from those by whom they are due, he shall be responsible on his bond for all losses to the State arising therefrom.

Section 41 - That all unpaid licenses shall bear interest at the rate of two per cent per month from the first day of March, and the payment thereon shall be secured by first lien and privilege in favor of the State upon the property, movable and immovable, of the delinquent or in the license, and the tax collector or ex-officio tax collector shall collect said license and interest in the manner prescribed by existing laws.

Section 42 - That all gross receipts derived from any mercantile

business or occupation whatsoever, as hereinbefore provided, whether earned within or without the state, shall form the proper basis upon which all licenses shall be assessed and collected by tax collectors.

Section 43 - That a person, firm or company, having more than one place of business, shall pay a separate license for each place of business.

The above Ordinance was adopted section by section, then as a whole.

The President announced that the Special meeting was called for the purpose of adopting an ordinance relative to the issuance of Thirteen Thousand (\$13,000.00) Dollars public improvement bonds, for roads and bridges in Road District No. THREE of the Parish of Jefferson, providing for the redemption of said bonds, and also for the sale thereof, also to take up the matter of dedicated streets in sub-divisions owned by Stafford, Derbes and Roy, Inc.,

On motion of Mr. Fisher seconded by Mr. Cantrelle, the following ordinance was adopted:

ORDINANCE

An ordinance relative to the issuance of Thirteen Thousand (\$13,000.00) Dollars public improvement bonds for roads and bridges in road district No. 3, of the Parish of Jefferson, providing for the redemption of said bonds, and also for the sale thereof.

Whereas, in the pursuance of an ordinance adopted by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, acting as the governing authority of Road District No. 3, of the Parish of Jefferson, on September 8, 1926, that was held in and throughout Road District No. 3, of the Parish of Jefferson, on October 26, 1926. and election in which

Reading of the minutes was dispensed with and same was approved as published.

Regular order of business was deferred to allow parties to address the jury.

On request of Hon. Geo. Williams representing Mrs. Cayon, request the jury to pass an ordinance that would prevent the construction of houses on the banks of the 17th, street canal at Bucktown, and on motion duly seconded the Parish Engineer was directed to ascertain the ownership of said canal bank and report his findings to the jury at next regular meeting.

On request of Mr. Elmer, of the Elmer Iron Works, Two car loads of gravel was ordered placed on public road leading to said companies plant also lumber to repair bridges on said road.

President Toledano, made a brief address, thanking the jury for their whole-hearted co-operation during the year 1926, making it possible to perform the duties imposed upon them in such an economical way, and hoped for the same spirit of co-operation in the year 1927, he outlined a program of improvements including more roads, and the building of more room for the Clerk of Court, Assessor's and Sheriff's Office. He recommended a committee be appointed to look into these matters.

Mr. Fisher responded by thanking the President for his untiring patients in the past and the manner in which he guided the affairs of the Parish.

On motion of Mr. Bordes seconded by Mr. Cantrelle, the following committee was appointed to investigate the needs of the various office's; W. R. Toledano, President of the Jury, District Attorney, District Judge, Parish Engineer, Chairman of Courthouse and Jail Committee, Sheriff, Clerk of Court, and Assessor. Report to be made at next regular meeting of the Jury.

Mr. Zinsel was given a vote of thanks for the painted photo of the late sheriff Hon. L. H. Marrero presented by him to the Police Jury which

was unanimously accepted by the jury.

On request of Mr. C. A. Buchler, representing citizens of Kenner, the Jury ordered the Road Superintendant to gravel the shoulders of paved road on 3rd. Street Kenner, also instructed the engineer to notify the contractor for said road to repair damages done to water lines. And to take up with the O. K. The following opinion of District Attorney relative to owner of land along the bank of 17th Street Canal at Bucktown, Jefferson Parish, received.

March 23, 1927

Honorable President and Members of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jeff.

Gretna, La.

Gentlemen:

I beg to acknowledge receipt of yours of the 22nd inst., together with inclosure referring to me the question of the present status of property located at East End between the road-way and the 17th Street Canal, buildings, and concerning, which Mrs. Foretich made complaint with the request that some action be taken to have the property removed, I, therefore, beg to advise you that I

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have checked over the report submitted to you by Engineer Frank T. Payne and from the examination of this report, it appears that the property was originally patented by the United States Government for Jean Louis Beaulieu based upon a claim by act before Pierre Pedesclaux, Notary Public for the Parish of Orleans, dated July 15th, 1824. From this date to May, 1917 it appears that the chain of title is perfect, and this property was acquired on August 25th, 1851 by the New Orleans & Carrollton Railway Company by purchase at a sheriff's sale in the matter of "Victor Burthe versus Noel Villars, et al" in the 4th District Court for the Parish of Orleans. On February 3rd, 1851 Victor Burthe sold an additional interest in said property to the New Orleans, & Carrollton Railway Company by act before A. Chiapella, Notary Public for Orleans Parish, and same was recorded in conveyance Book "B" Folio 554 of the Parish of Jefferson and on March 1st, 1852 before the same Notary, the New Orleans & Carrollton Railway company sold said property to the Jefferson & Lake Pontchartrain Railway Company, which act is registered in Book "C" Folio 293 of the Parish of Jefferson, and from this date to 1917 it appears that the Jefferson & Lake Pontchartrain Railway Co. has been the title owner of record.

There is an act recorded in the Conveyance records of New Orleans in Conveyance Book 228, Folio 359 being an act before Robert Legier, whereby the Jefferson & Lake Pontchartrain Railway Company sold to the Sewerage and Water Board of the City of New Orleans, a right-of-way fifty feet wide by the entire length extending through its property for the purpose of excavating and constructing a drainage canal near the dividing line of the Parish of Orleans and Jefferson, subject to certain stipulations, this act being signed by D. D. Curran, President of the Railway Company and was approved by H. Genes Dufour, Attorney for the Railway Company and by Walter A. Gleason,

Special Counsel for the Sewerage & Water Board, the property sold being located in New Orleans.

Therefore, it is clear to my mind, from an examination of the research made by the Parish Engineer and the date submitted that the title to this particular property, which is the subject of the controversy between Mrs. Foretich and Mr. Montat, is not public property and does not belong to the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, but the title thereto is vested in a private owner, nemely, the Jefferson & Lake Pontchartrain Railway Company, and if any action is to be taken to remove the property built by Mr. Montat on this strip of land or to compel him to remove his buildings must be taken by the present owner, and the Police Jury would have no right or cause of action in a Court to compel him to remove the buildings, for the reason that your Honorable Body not being the owner has no title to this property.

A question has been raised in connection with the assessment rolls failing to show the assessment of this property. In connection with this point, I desire to state that failure to pay an assessment or failure to have said property assessed for taxes does not work a forfeiture of the property, but the State and Parish would have the right to collect taxes from the present owner of record for a period of three years past, and if an assessment is made for three years past on this property and the owner refuses to pay same, then it would be up to the Sheriff to proceed in the usual way to give notice and advertise this property for sale and sell it for taxes. This is the only method whereby the title to this property now vested in the Jefferson & Lake Pontchartrain Railway Company could be divested because of Non-assessment or non-payment of taxes.

Mrs. Foretich, as I understand, has no title to the property, therefore she is powerless to compel Mr. Montat to remove the buildings and as you also have no title to the property, you are equally powerless to compel removal of the buildings. The property is not public property and consequently you are powerless to compel removal of the buildings. Under the circumstances, the only thing that Mrs. Foretich can do is to take up her complaint with the owners of the property, the Jefferson & Lake Pontchartrain Railway Company.

To the Honorable members and president of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, Gretna Louisiana.
Gentlemen:

I have the honor to submit herewith report covering research made by me to determine the status of the tract of land lying along the 17th Street Canal immediately adjoining and West of same, within the Parish of Jefferson.

The land in question forms a part of what was originally known as the Beaulieu Tract, being a tract of land containing two arpents front on both sides of Bayou Metairie, extending to the North Side from Bayou Metairie to Lake Pontchartrain, and on the south side from Bayou Metairie to the limits of what was originally McCarty Plantation and not exceeding eighteen arpents.

Research shows that this tract was patented by the United States to

Jean Louis Beaulieu, who based his claim to same on his purchase of this tract from Etienne Griffin, by Notarial Act before Pierre Pedeschoux Notary Public, Parish of Orleans, of date July 15th, 1824, the said Etienne Griffin having purchased the same land from Pierre Maspero by Act before the same Notary on June 30th 1814.

On August 30th, 1849, Marie Beaulieu, wife of Theodore Galieau, Estelle Beaulieu, wife of Noel Galleau, and Louis Beaulieu, as heirs of Gilbert Beaulieu (deceased son of Jean Louis Beaulieu) and as heirs of the succession of Jean Louis Beaulieu, their grandfather, sold to Victor Burthe their undivided $\frac{1}{60}$ th interest in this tract, Act before ~~Joseph~~ Herman, Notary Public Parish of Orleans, which Act was registered in Conveyance Book 18, folio 112, Parish of Jefferson.

On the same date Marie Noel, widow of Jean Louis Beaulieu; Marie Antoinette Beaulieu, wife of Zenon Saulet; Rose Beaulieu, wife of Urbain Beaulieu; Louise Beaulieu, wife of Antoine Corner; and Marie Louise Melitre Beaulieu sold to said Victor Burthe, their undivided nine-tenths ($\frac{9}{10}$ ths) interest in and to this property, Marie Noel as widow in community of Jean Louis Beaulieu, deceased, owing one-half interest., and the other four as children and heirs under the will of the said Jean Louis Beaulieu owning one-tenth ($\frac{1}{10}$ th) interest each. This Act is of record in Conveyance Book 18, folio 112, Parish of Jeff.

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On November 7th, 1849, Victor Burthe, as owner of the undivided $\frac{57}{60}$ ths of this property by virtue of the two proceeding sales, filed suit against Noel Villars, et al, in the Fourth District Court of the Parish of Orleans. In his petition he set forth that he was the owner in indivision of the said $\frac{57}{60}$ ths of this property, the remaining owners being:

Gilbert Beaulieu, one of the children of the aforementioned Gilbert Beaulieu, deceased owner of $\frac{1}{60}$ th.

Florant Beaulieu, another child of the aforementioned Gilbert Beaulieu, deceased, owner of $\frac{1}{60}$ th.

Charlotte Villars and Noel Villars, owners together of $\frac{1}{60}$ th by representation of their deceased mother, Angele Beaulieu, wife of Noel Villars and one of the children of the aforesaid Gilbert Beaulieu, deceased.

In his petition Victor Burthe States that he is desirous of effecting a partition of the said property byt the report of the experts appointed by the Court declared that the property was not divisible in kind, whereupon the Court ordered the property to be sold by the Sheriff of the Parish of Jefferson after due proceedings to law.

The records of the suit shows that the order of the Court was executed by the Sheriff of the Parish of Jefferson, who, on August 25th, 1851, sold the property to P. Crocker, representing the New Orleans and Carrollton Railroad Company, the sale being confirmed by the Court.

Under date of February 3rd, 1851, Victor Burthe transferred all his interest in and to the $\frac{3}{60}$ ths interest purchased by him from

the heirs of Gilbert Beaulieu, and others by Act before L. HERMANN Notary of date August 30, 1849, to the New Orleans, and Carrollton Railroad Company declaring that said sale was affected with funds of the said Railroad Company and for their account this was by Act before A. Chiapella, Notary Public, Parish of Orleans, and is of record in Conveyance Book "B" Folio 554, Parish of Jefferson.

It is hereby agreed between the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana and the Drainage Commission of New Orleans.

The said Police Jury waives any and all objections to the execution of the following work within the limits of the Parish of Jefferson by the said Drainage Commission:

On March 1st, 1852, by Act before Archills Chiapella, Notary Public in and for the Parish of Orleans, the New Orleans and Carrollton Railroad Company sold the property as hereinabove set forth to the Jefferson and Lake Pontchartrain Railway Company, which Act is registered in Conveyance Book "C", folio 293, Parish of Jefferson.

A careful and thorough search of the records of both the Parish of Jefferson and the Parish of Orleans fails to show any sale of this property from the one last above shown to the present time. The search does disclose however, the following document dealing with this tract in question.

"New Orleans, La. September 7th, 1897;

1st. The Connection of the Drainage Canal now being excavated on Seventeenth Street and North Line Street, in the City of Orleans, with the upper Protection Canal, in the Parish of Jefferson.

2nd. The erection, substantially as shown on the accompanying blue print, of a pumping Station, to be known as Metairie No. 6, on and over the Upper Protection Canal, on the river side of the New Orleans & Western Railroad Tracks.

The said Drainage Commission agrees and binds itself not to remove said Station, nor to obstruct or encroach upon the present roadway on the West bank of the canal, nor deposit any material excavated from the canal on the roadway, and also, if it becomes necessary to build a switch track on the West, or excavate a by-pass on the East Bank, for purpose of construction, to promptly remove or fill them as the case may be, on the completion of the Pumping Station.

WHEREAS, There is urgent need for the construction of a levee along the East Bank of the Seventeenth Street Canal from Pumping Station No. 6 to the Shore of Lake Pontchartrain and thence Eastward along the shore of Lake Pontchartrain to a connection with the embankment forming the West End Shell Road on the West Bank of the New Basin Canal, in order to protect a large section of the City of New Orleans against overflow by storm waters of Lake Pontchartrain, and

WHEREAS, The Orleans Levee Board has advised the Mayor of the City of New Orleans that it has the funds necessary to construct the aforesaid

lines of levees and is willing and anxious to proceed with the construction thereof, provided the necessary right-of-way thereto can be secured without cost to the said Board; and

WHEREAS, The Jefferson and Lake Pontchartrain Railroad Company has expressed its willingness to dedicate to the City of New Orleans, for the exclusive purpose of Public levee and highway construction, a piece or parcel of land hereinafter specifically described; and the New Orleans & City Railroad New Orleans Railway & Light Company Lessee) has expressed a willingness to dedicate to the City of New Orleans, for the exclusive purpose of public levee and highway construction, a piece of parcel or its property lying North of Lake Street and extending East from East line of the Hascour Tract, and which Tract is hereinafter specifically described; therefore.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commission Council of the City of New Orleans, that the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City of New Orleans, by Notarial Act to be passed before the City Notary of the City of New Orleans, dedication by the Jefferson & Lake Pontchartrain Railroad Co., (New Orleans Railway & Light Company, Lessee), for the exclusive purpose of constructing a public levee and a public highway, the following described properties, as more fully shown on blue print copy of map signed by City Engineer Pardee, Feb. 1st, 1916, and hereby attached to and hereby made a part of this Ordinance:

A certain piece or parcel of ground included within the following boundaries; Beginning at a point at the intersection of the East Bank of the 17th Street Canal and the North line of the Terminal Railroad Company's right-of-way, said point being 134.23 feet distant from the intersection of the New Orleans Land Company's West line and the North line of the Terminal Company's right-of-way, and measuring along said right-of-way; thence along the East bank by the 17th

Street Canal in a Northerly direction to the shore of Lake Pontchartrain, thence Easterly along the shore of Lake Pontchartrain, to the West of the West line 8 feet; thence Southerly on a line parallel to and 129.16 feet distant to the Breuning and New Orleans Land Company's properties, the said line forming the West line of what was formerly the Hazour Tract, to the North line of the New Orleans, Terminal Company's right-of-way; thence along the North line of the Terminal Company's right of way, 152.17 feet to the point of beginning, and

A certain piece or parcel of ground approximately one hundred and fifty (150) feet in width, lying immediately to the Eastward of the 17th Street Canal and extending from Pumping Station No. 6 to the right-of-way of the New Orleans Terminal Company;

Also a certain piece or parcel of ground lying North of Lake Street and forming a part of the property of the said New Orleans & City Railroad Company (New Orleans Railway & Light Company, Lessee); beginning at a point on the North property line of Lake Street, 100 feet, more or less distant from the intersection of the West property line of Mercer Street, thence alongside North property line of Lake Street in a Westerly direction for a distance of 244.44 feet, thence along said North property line of Lake Street in a South Westerly direction for a distance of 221.56 feet, thence in a Westerly direction for a distance of 465.52 feet to a point

on the East line of Hazeur 141.68 feet to the North of the intersection of the North line of Lake Street and the East line of Hazeur thence in a Northerly direction along the said East line of Hazeur for a distance of 100.64 feet, thence in an Easterly direction for a distance of 917.08 feet, to a point on the division line of the two lots located on the shore of Lake Pontchartrain, in front of Lots No. 8 and No. 9, thence in a Southerly direction along said deviding line for a distance of 37.40 feet to the point of beginning.

Adopted by Martin Behrman, Mayor, Feb. 15th, 1916.

On May 29th, 1917, the Jefferson & Lake Pontchartrain Railway Company granted to the Sewerage & Water Board of the City of New Orleans a right-of-way fifty feet wide by the entire length extending through its said Jefferson & Lake Pontchartrain Railway Company's property" for the purpose of excavating and constructing a drainage canal the said boundary lines being shown on blue print attached to the act. The Act then describes the boundaries of the grant, the description beginning as follows:

"A portion of land in the tract formerly known as the Beaulieu Tract, near the dividing line of the Parishes of Orleans and Jefferson" etc.

The grant is made subject to certain stipulations, as follows;

"That the portions of land above described and over which the said Drainage Canal is to be constructed are not dedicated to the City of New Orleans, but that the said grant or right-of-way is merely a servitude for the construction and operation of said Drainage Canal, and that, should the Drainage Canal, at any time be abandoned the said grant or right-of-way shall ipso facto become null and void and the said property shall immediately revert to the said Jefferson & Lake Pontchartrain Railway Company, its legal representatives or assigns".

The Grant is also to be null and void in the event that the entire right-of-way necessary for the construction of the said Canal is not obtained.

The Jefferson & Lake Pontchartrain Railway Company reserves the right to erect and construct such bridges or crossings as it may find desirable or necessary, and should said Drainage Canal be covered at any time the said Jefferson & Lake Pontchartrain Railway Company shall enjoy the exclusive use of the surface of the ground over said Canal.

This is a Notarial Act before Robert Logier, Notary Public, in and for the Parish of Orleans, recorded in C. O. B. 288, folio 359, Parish of Orleans.

Act signed by D. D. Curran, President of the Jefferson & Lake Pontchartrain Railway Company; Chas. J. Theard; Martin Behrman, Mayor of the City of New Orleans & Ex-Officio President of the Sewerage and Water Board, Theard signed as president protem.

Act approved as to form by H. Genores Dufour, Atty. for Railway Company and approved by Walter A. Gleason, Special Counsel.

From the foregoing it appears that the chain of title from the first owner of this land to the acquisition of same by the Jefferson & Lake Pontchartrain Railway Company in 1852 is without break, and from subsequent documents it appears that the said Jefferson & Lake Pontchartrain Railway Company still exercises the rights of ownership.

An examination of the Assessment Rolls of the Parish of Jefferson in which that portion of the "Beaulieu Tract" is located failed to show any assessment of this property against the Jefferson & Lake Pontchartrain Railway Company, or the New Orleans Public Service Company for the

last ten (10) years.

In view of the foregoing I would respectfully suggest that this matter be turned over to the District Attorney, the legal Advisor of your Honorable Body, for his opinion as to the present status of this property.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish, State of Louisiana, in regular monthly session assembled on April 1927, and by

virtue of the authority vested in this Police Jury by Act 151, 1910, of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, that the dedication of Central Avenue previously dedicated to public use, lying within the above described tract of land and as shown on the plan of Zander above referred to be and the same is hereby formally revoked and set aside, the same being no longer needed for public purposes and having been abandoned, and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Police Jury of the Jefferson Parish, that the said Central Avenue as herein described revert in ownership, to the center line thereof, to the present owner of the land contiguous thereto, i.e. the owner of the parcel of land above described, and

Section 3: Be it further ordained etc., that for payment of the amount borrowed and note or certificate executed as herein provided, the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson hereby dedicates, appropriates and sets aside the sum of \$26,500.00 out of the revenues and taxes of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1927; together with such other or further sum as may be necessary to pay the interest on said amount.
