Gentlemen:

We, the undersigned property holders and tax payers living and residing and owning property on the Right Bank of the Mississippi River, Parish of Jefferson, hereby respectfully petition your Honorable Body to create a reclamation Drainage District to be known as the Sixth Jefferson Drainage District of the Parish of Jefferson and that in creating the same the territorial limits be fixed as follows to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the Mississippi River where the same connects with the lower or east side of the Baratavia and Lafourche Canal (sometimes called the Company's Canal) and thence along the lower or eastern line of the Baratavia and Lafourche Canal where the same intersects, Bayou Segnette about two hundred feet south of the township line, along the present rear line of the Westwego Municipal Drainage District

No. One and thence going in an easterly direction along the rear line of the said Drainage District to a point where the same intersects, the Dugue Canal, thence in a southerly direction on the western side of the Dugue Canal as far as the same extends and meets Bayou Segnette, thence across Dugue Canal on the eastern side to a point going in a northerly direction to present drainage levee at point known as "Flood Gate", at which point it is approximately 7000 feet from the Mississippi River, thence in an easterly direction along said cross canal approximately Thirty five hundred (3500) feet, thence in a south easterly direction along said cross canal approximately twenty-four hundred (2400) feet, thence in an easterly direction along said cross canal approximately eighteen hundred (1800) feet, thence in a northerly direction along said canal to the western edge of Ames Boulevard, a distance of approximately seven hundred fifty (750) feet, thence along said western edge of Ames Boulevard in a southerly direction approximately nine hundred (900) feet, thence in a south easterly direction approximately eighteen hundred (1800) feet, thence in an easterly direction approximately twenty-one hundred fifty (2150) feet, thence in a northerly direction to the line of Lots "B-25" and "B-24," Ames Farm Subdivision, a distance of approximately sixty (60) feet, thence in an easterly direction along the said line between Lots "B-25" and "B-24" to the west side of Baratavia Boulevard, thence in a northerly direction along the west edge of Baratavia Boulevard to the south line of Second Jefferson Drainage District thence along said line of the Second Jefferson Drainage District to the rear line of the property of the estate of L. RESOLUTION

By Jos. Fisher, Seconded by Robert Ottermann.

To Levy collect and enforce payment of a license tax upon all persons, associations of persons, or business firms partnerships or corporations, engaged or pursuing any business whereby dogs are run for purses, and or where any entrance fee is charged for the dogs racing, with certain exceptions; and prescribing the mode and method by which said license tax shall be collected; and providing a penalty for violation hereof, and repealing all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that there be and is hereby levied a license tax upon each person, association of persons, or business firm, or business firm, partnership or corporation engaged in or pursuing any business whereby dogs are run for purses, or where entrance fee is charged for the entrance of the said dogs in a race, for each and every race track so operated, which said license shall be graduated upon daily receipts from

admissions paid by spectators and entrance fees charged for the entrance of the said dogs in the said races as follows:

First Class - - - When paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for dog racing amount to \$10,000.00 or more per day, the license tax shall be \$200.00 per day, for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Second Class - - - When paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for the dogs racing amount to \$5,000.00 and less than \$10,000.00 the license tax shall be \$150.00 per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Third Class - - - When said paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for the dogs racing amount to less than \$5,000.00 then the license tax shall be \$100. per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Section 2. That the aforesaid license tax shall be collected by the constituted authority charged with the collection of license due to the State.

Section 3. That the minimum license tax herein provided shall be paid in advance daily to the constituted authority charged with the collection thereof, and no race shall be run unless same is paid, under penalty herein provided, and the balance of said license tax, if any, shall be paid before 3 o'clock on the following day, the calculation thereof to be in accordance with the herein provided graduated schedule in Section No. 1; and that this license tax shall

become due and owing on each and every day that said races are run and shall become delinquent on the following day, and it is hereby made the duty of the District Attorney of this Parish to enforce the collection of this said license tax and for the services rendered in such collection, he shall be entitled to 20% over and above the amount of the license collected from the delinquent debtor as attorney's fees, which said attorney's fees shall be paid by the said delinquent license debtor and shall be assessed as costs in case of suit.

Section 4. That all suits for the collection of this license tax shall be summary, and be tried in accordance with the law in force for the collection of delinquent licenses for taxes.

Section 5. That the amount of tax due by the aforesaid person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporations, engaged in the aforesaid business shall be determined as follows:

The daily receipts of the paid admissions and entrances charged for the entrance of the said dogs in the said races for the said day shall be added and totaled up and then the license tax calculated thereon in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of this act.

Section 6. That the provisions of this act shall not apply to an association of persons or corporations engaged in holding or conducting a fair solely for the purpose of exhibiting agricultural or manufactured products or natural resources looking toward the advancement of the agricultural or manufactural interest or the development of the natural resources in the said parish, where said dogs racing is conducted as an auxiliary sport, and as an incident for amusement and entertainment and not for the purpose of profit, provided that said fairs so conducted

shall not be for a longer period than 10 days.

Section 7. That any person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporation conducting or operating a race track or races in contravention of the provision of this Act without having first paid said license tax as aforesaid shall be guilty of misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.00 and not less than \$25.00 or by imprisonment of not more than 30 days and not less than 10 days in parish jail, or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court, provided that in case the violator be an association firm, corporation, the managing officers and agents thereof shall be punishable by such a fine or imprisonment and provided that such fine and imprisonment shall not be construed as relieving said violator from said license tax.

Section 8. That all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE

To levy, and collect and enforce payment of a license tax upon all persons association of persons, or business firms, partnerships or corporations, engaged or pursuing any business whereby horses are run for purses, and or where any entrance fee is charged for the horses racing, with certain exceptions; and prescribing the mode and method by which said license tax shall be collected; and providing a penalty for violation thereof, and repealing all laws or parts of laws in conflict therewith.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that there be and is hereby levied a license tax upon each person, association of persons or business firms, partnership or corporation, engaged in or pursuing any business whereby horses are run for purses or where any entrance fee is charged for the entrance of the said horses in a race, for each and every race track so operated, which said license shall be graduated upon daily receipts from admissions paid by spectators and entrance fees charged for the entrance of the said horses in the said race, as follows:

First Class - - - When said paid admissions by spectators and entrance fee for horses racing amount to ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00 or more per day, the license tax shall be six hundred dollars (\$600.00) per day, for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Second Class - - When the said paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for the horses racing amount to seventy-five hundred dollars \$7,500.00 and less than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) per day, the license tax shall be five hundred dollars (\$500.00) per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Third Class. - - - When said paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for the horses racing amount to five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) and less than and less than seventy five hundred (\$7,500.00) per day the license tax shall be three hundred and fifty dollars (\$350.00) per day for the time or duration of the said meeting.

Fourth Class - - - When said paid admissions by spectators and

entrance fees for the horses racing amount to less than five thousand dollars \$5,000.00 per day, the license tax shall be two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) per day for the time or duration of the meeting.

Section 2. That the aforesaid license tax shall be collected by the constituted authority charged with the collection of licenses due to the State.

Section 3. That the minimum licenses tax herein provided shall be paid in advance daily to the constituted authority charged with the collection hereof, and no race shall be run unless same is paid, under penalty herein

provided and the balance of said license tax, if any, shall be paid before 3 o'clock p.m. on the following day, the calculation thereof to be in accordance with the herein provided graduated schedule in Section No. 1; and that this license tax shall become due and owing on each and every day that the said races are run, and shall become delinquent on the following day, and it is hereby made the duty of the District Attorney of this Parish to enforce the collection of this said license tax, and for the services rendered in such collection he shall be entitled to 20% over and above the amount of the license collected from the delinquent debtor, as attorney's fees which said attorney's fees shall be paid by the said delinquent license debtor, and shall be assessed as costs in case of suit.

Section 4. That all suits or rules for the collection of the license tax shall be summary and be tried in accordance with the law in force for the collection of delinquent license or taxes.

Section 5. That the amount of tax due by the aforesaid person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporations, engaged in the aforesaid business shall be determined as follows:

The daily receipts of the paid admissions and entrance charged for the entrance of the said horses in the said races for the said day shall be added and totaled up and then the license tax calculated in accordance thereon with the provisions of Section 1 of this Act.

Section 6. That the provisions of this act shall not apply to associations of persons or corporations engaged in holding or conducting a fair soley for the purpose of exhibiting agricultural or manufactured products or natural resources looking toward the advancement of the agricultural or manufactured interest or the development of the natural resources in the said parish, where said horse racing is conducted as auxiliary sport, as an incident for amusement and entertainment and not for the purpose of profit, provided that said fairs so conducted shall not be for a longer period than 14 days.

Section 7. That any person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporations conducting or operating a race track or races in contrevention of the provisions of this Act, without having first paid said license tax as aforesaid shall be guilty or misdemeanor and punishable by a fine not more than \$100.00 and not less than \$25.00 or by imprisonment of not more than 30 days and not less than 10 days in the parish jail, or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of

the court, provided that in case the violator be an association, firm, or corporation, the managing officers and agents thereof shall be punishable by such fine or imprisonment and provided that such fine and imprisonment and shall not be construed as relieving said violator said license tax.

Section 8. That all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Grand Isle Navigation District.

Dear Sir: - -

In reference to the ordinance left in my office for an opinion, granting to T. G. Markley a gas franchise in the Parish of Jefferson, I beg to advise you that I have checked over the proposed ordinance granting this franchise and I have reached the conclusion that the same is legal insofar as its form is concerned.

As to the provisions of the ordinance other wise I do not render you an opinion, but the provisions and obligations contained therein are matters of agreement between yourself and the parties seeking the franchise.

However, there should be some addition made to this franchise, that I notice are not contained in the franchise as drafted. For instance, some provision should be made that provides that should the gas main be laid on a State Highway, the

same shall be done with the consent of the State Highway Commission in accordance with Act No. 127 of 1924. The Police Jury has no authority to grant a franchise over a State Highway, nor does the grantee have the right to excavate on State Highways without the written consent of the Highway Engineer.

Another suggestion that I would make is that due to the fact that numerous people have in the past obtained franchises for the distribution of natural and artificial gas and that only one concern has so far gone to the expense of supplying the inhabitants of Jefferson Parish on both sides of the river with gas, that a clause be added providing for a bond along the same lines as the franchise held by the present grantee to this extent that the grantee binds himself to proceed with the construction within a certain limited time, and when he does so commence, construction as soon as he shall have pipe in the ground of a certain value, then and in that event the bond Ipso Facto will become cancelled. T Jos os pm; u faor tp tjo .resent francjose given under the terms of which we are now obtaining the benefits of artificial gas.

The Police Jury met this day in special session, members present: W. R. Toledano, President; F. Erlinger, W. E. Strehle, B. P. Daenhauer, A. J. Cantrelle, Jos. Petit, Jos Fisher, Robert Ottermann, Jno. Bordes.

The President announced that the special meeting was called for the purpose of transacting the regular order of business or whatever other business that may come before the Jury that should have been acted upon at the regular meeting on Wednesday November 9th, 1927, which was postponed due to lack of a quorum.

On motion of Mr. Petit and duly seconded the reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting was dispensed with and approved as published.

On motion of Mr. Fisher, duly seconded the regular order of business was deferred to allow various parties to address the Jury.

Mr. R. R. Pricero and F. Horvirn appeared before the Jury and called their attention to bad condition of bridges in Bonnabot Place Metairie Ridge, and requested the Jury to have the bridges repaired to facilitate vehicular traffic. The matter was referred to Road Supt.

Mr. A. Dumestre addressed the Jury on behalf of the voters of the 1st Precinct of the 8th ward stated that due to the large number of qualified voters in the 1st Precinct that it will be impossible for the voters to cast their ballot on election day with only one voting place. Requested the Jury to create more precincts in the Metairie Ridge section, after discussion of the matter same was laid over until an opinion could be had from the District Attorney, as to the legality of same.

La. with reference to the right of way for the proposed intercoastal canal in the Parish was received and on motion duly seconded the President appointed a committee composed of Senator Fisher, Chairman Paul Jones and Jurors Jos. Fisher to secure the right of way required according to Blue Prints submitted.

Communication from Suthen, Songel & Daiglo, relative to a lease to the Metairie Volunteer Fire Co., of certain land at the intersection of Metairie road and Cofifer Boulevard Metairie Ridge who contends that the said land is not the property of the Parish, and requesting that steps should be taken to repeal the ordinance which the Jury proposed to lease the said land to the Metairie Volunteer Fire Co., No. 1, was received and layed over to next meeting.

Fire Plugs

On motion of Mr. Bordes, seconded by Mr. Ottermann, the secretary was directed to notify the Jefferson Water Co., that the jury authorized the installation of four fire plugs on the highway near the residents of Suburban Acres, Jefferson Terrace and Orleans Parkway Sub Divisions of the 7th ward, also two fire hydrants in Metairie Heights and two fire hydrants on the Avonue in Metairie Lawn Sub Division after the first of the year 1928. Peacock, Property owner and Resident of Shrewsbury on behalf of property owners and residents in the vicinity of Shrewsbury Road and Mulford Street appealed to the Jury for the installation of a fire plug on Shrewsbury Road and Mulford Street 7th Ward. Agreed to pay the installation cost, to be reimbursed later out of the revenues of 1928, also Mr. C. C. Adams Representative of the 7th Ward Civic League made a similar appeal for the installation of a fire plug on the Highway and Jefferson Terrace agreeing to pay for installing some to be reimbursed later out of the revenues of the year 1928, and

On motion of Mr. Bordes seconded by Mr. Ottermann, the secretary was instructed to notify the Jefferson Water Company that Police Jury authorized the installation of a fire plug on Shrewsbury Road and Mulford Street and one on the Highway and Jefferson Terrace 7th Ward with the

understanding that the cost of installing the said fire plugs to be paid for by the said Mr. Peacock and Mr. Adam and they to be reimbursed out of the revenues of the year 1928. The motion was carried.

The following opinion of District Attorney, Jno. E. Fleury relative to the law in establishing additional election Precincts in and of the righth Ward,
Opinion of District attorney on additional Precincts in wards of the Parish

Mr. Dauenhauer moved the adoption of a resolution to establish three additional Election Precincts and Polling places in the Eighth Ward of the Parish, and on failure to receive a second the motion was lost.

On motion of Mr. Fisher, seconded by Mr. Bordes, the following resolution was adopted:

November 16th, 1927.

To the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, Gretna, La.

Gentlomen:-

Replying to your request for an opinion as to the right of the Police Jury to establish additional precincts in any of the Wards of this Parish, I beg to advise you that I have hurriedly checked up the law on this question and find that under Act 130 of 1916, which is the General Election Law of La., that under Section 38, each Police Jury Ward in each Parish is fixed as an election precinct, and shall be numbered as such. The Police Jury of the Parish shall direct what number of polls shall be established in each ward, provided, that if more than one polling place is established in any one ward, then the Police Jury shall divide the ward geographically as nearly equal as possible according to the number of polls established, and so arranged as to contain not more than four hundred voters as nearly as practicable as shown in the preceding registration and shall define the limit within the ward for which each poll is established, and said sub-division of the ward in such case shall be each an election precinct

Under Section 39 the Police Jury shall establish as many precincts and polling places as may be deemed necessary in order to carry out the provisions of the preceding section; provided, that there shall never be less than one precinct and polling place in each Police Jury Ward. That when the said polling places and precincts are established that same shall be published in the official proceedings of the Police Jury, and that once established by the Police Jury the precincts and polling places shall not be changed except by a vote of the Police Jury given in favor of said change and then not within three months prior to a general election.

It is therefore, my opinion that the Police Jury has the right to establish additional polling places in a ward, provided, the same are established more than three months prior to a General Election.

It is my further opinion that the Police Jury under said above provisions have the right to establish as many precincts and polling places as they may deem necessary, the matter being one within their discretion, but should the Police Jury establish precincts, they should geographically divide the ward so that each precinct shall not contain more than four hundred voters as nearly as practicable.

The question for the Police Jury to decide, if additional polling places are to be established, is the boundary limits, and also determine the number of voters in each additional precinct. As I am not in a position to give this information I naturally do not base my opinion on this matter, as this information

will have to be obtained, from the population and geographical lines or from some source that is familiar with any of the proposed additional precincts,

If there is any further information you desire, kindly let me know and I shall endeavor to enlighten you further on the subject.

On motion of Mr. Ottermann seconded by Mr. Cantrelle it was resolved that the secretary communicate with and request the Public Service Commission to compel all Railroads in the Parish of Jefferson to place cross bars or some other device at Road crossing in the residential section of the parish that will protect the pedestrians from the danger of fast moving trains.

On motion duly seconded, the secretary was directed to communicate with Mr. Klorer, Engineer of the City of New Orleans, and request what action is being taken in regards to the construction of the proposed bridge over the 17th Street Canal that will connect the paved highway of Jefferson Parish with the City of New Orleans, at the intersection of Claiborne Avenue.

Denechaud, Notary Public, for the Parish of Orleans, the said Suburban Villa, Inc., has dedicated to public use a portion of said Subdivision No. 5 known as Meade Avenue and through which said Drainage Canal Lateral No 5 runs and a portion of Subdivision No. 6 known as Marion Avenue through which said Drainage Canal Lateral No. 4 runs.

Be it further ordained that whatever rights, whether of servitude or otherwise, that the Parish of Jefferson, the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson and the Fourth Drainage District of the Parish of Jefferson may have acquired by reason of the making of the said map of H. L. Zander, on April 22nd, 1915, or to those portions of ground described on the said map of H. L. Zander as being reserved for drainage purposes, are hereby abandoned and relinquished and the dedication of said portions of ground revoked and set aside.

Be it further resolved that the land comprising the parts of these reservations above described shall and do hereby revert in full ownership to the present owners of the tract from which these reservations were originally taken without any right whatsoever, whether of servitude or otherwise thereto and or thereon in the Parish of Jefferson, the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson and the Fourth Drainage District of the Parish of Jefferson.

Be it further ordained that all resolutions or ordinances in conflict herewith be and they are hereby repealed.

Gaudet, attorney representing Ford, Bacon and Davis, Incorporated, request the adoption of an Ordinance granting the said Ford, Bacon and Davis, Inc., a right to lay pipe lines for transportation of gas and to erect, maintain and operate telephone and telegraph lines over, through, upon, under and across any and all roadway, highway and street, on the east side of the Mississippi River in the Parish of Jefferson. And

On motion of Mr. Otterman, seconded by Mr. Bordes, the following ordinance was adopted:

AN ORDINANCE

Granting Ford, Bacon and Davis Incorporated, the right to construct a pipe line under a telephone line over certain roadways, highways and streets in the Parish of Jefferson.

Permit granted
Ford Bacon & Davis

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in legal session convened, that the right is hereby given to Ford, Bacon and Davis, Incorporated, their successors and assigns, to lay, relay, construct, reconstruct, replace, renew, maintain, operate and change the size of and at grantee's pleasure to remove pipe lines for the transportation of gas, petroleum or any of its products, water and other substances or any or either thereof and to erect, maintain and operate telephone and telegraph lines or either of them and such equipment necessary for the operation and fulfillment of the purposes of this ordinance, and to remove the same at the pleasure of the grantee over, through, upon, under and across any and all roadways, highways and streets or the rights of way

thereof in the said Parish of Jefferson at any and all points therein where the grantee's pipe line location from Destrehan, La., to the Jefferson Orleans Parish Line crosses or may cross any and all such roadways, highways and streets or the right of way thereof.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that the conditions upon which this permission to Ford, Bacon and Davis, Incorporated is given as outlined in Section 1. hereof, is that said Ford, Bacon and Davis, Inc., rate'd, will place

said pipe or pipes lines not less than twenty-four (24) inches below and in the clear of the flow line of and all drainage ditches along the said roadways, highways and streets, and that all said telegraph and telephone lines shall have clearance, without obstruction, of not less than twenty (20) feet over and above the surface of driveways in said roadways, highways and streets and should it ever become necessary to change the pipe lines or telephone or telegraph lines in order that roads might be rebuilt, repaved, etc., that the said grantee will make necessary changes in said lines, so placing them that this work might be carried on to good advantage, further that said Ford, Bacon and Davis, Incorporated will at all times during the construction of said line keep open for traffic all such roadways etc., above described, and finally the said Ford, Bacon and Davis, Incorporated, will replace and repair all roads and ditches, in the same condition in which they were before any excavations or alterations were made in constructing, operating, maintaining, relaying or reconstructing any of said lines all of which must be done to the satisfaction of and with the approval of this Police Jury, and further, the said Ford, Bacon & Davis, Incorporated, their successors and assigns, shall be responsible in damage to the public or any private individual for any damages occasioned on account of laying said lines and in the operation of said lines, after same shall have been laid and erected.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc. that the Ford Bacon & Davis, Inc., shall have the right to transfer and assign this franchise and its liabilities accruing thereunder to any one they may choose, with the distinct understanding that said assignees or transferee shall assume all liabilities called for in this ordinance.

Section 4. Be it further ordained, etc., that all ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed and that this ordinance shall take effect immediately after its passage.

AN ORDINANCE.

To levy, collect and enforce, payment on an annual license tax on all persons, associations of persons, firms and corporations, pursuing any trade, professions, vocation, calling or business in pursuance of Section 8, of Article X of the Constitution of 1921, and Act 205 of Legislation of 1924; prescribing the mode and method in which all persons subject to license shall make report of their business, providing remedies to enforce compliance therewith; prescribing penalties for making false statements of affidavits in relations thereto; and to repeal con-

flicting and inconsistent laws.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson that there is hereby levied and annual license tax for the year of 1927, and for each subsequent year upon each person, association of persons, firm and corporation, pursuing any trade, profession, vocation, calling or business, subject to license under Section 8 of Article X, of the Constitution of 1921, and Act 205 of 1924.

Section 2. That on the second day of January, 1927, and of each subsequent year each tax collector throughout the State shall as far as possible from each of the persons or business firms, associations of persons or corporations pursuing within his district or parish any trade, profession, vocation, calling or business a license tax as hereinafter fixed and graduated.

All licenses shall be due and collectible during the first two (2) months of each year and all unpaid licenses shall become delinquent on the first day of March of each year, and all persons, firms, association of persons and corporations who commence business after that date shall become delinquent unless the license is paid on days after commencing business.

Section 3. That for each business or carrying on a bank, banking company trust company, association, corporation or agency, the license shall be based on the declared or nominal capital surplus and undivided profits, and shall be fixed and graded, as follows to-wit:

First Class- - When the declared or nominal capital, surplus, and undivided profits amount to two hundred thousand dollars, or more and less than three hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be three hundred dollars (\$300.00)

Second Class-- When the declared or nominal capital, surplus or undivided profits amount to one hundred thousand dollars or more, and less than two hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be two hundred dollars \$200.00.

Third Class - - When the declared or nominal capital, surplus and undivided profits amount to fifty thousand dollars or more, and less than one hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00)

Fourth Class- - - When the declared or nominal capita, surplus and undivided profits amount to twenty-five thousand dollars or more, and less than fifty

thousand dollars the license shall be seventy five dollars (\$75.00)

Fifth Class - - When the declared or nominal capital, surplus and undivided profits amount to less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00)

The license imposed by this Section shall be due and payable by each branch of a bank, banking company, trust company, association of persons, corporation or agency operated separate and apart from the parent or principal bank, banking company, trust company, association, corporation or agency, where such branch establishment has allotted to, set apart or designated to it, a declared or nominal capital, suplus or undivided profits; and such branch bank, banking company, trust company, association, corporation or agency having no such declared or nominal

capital, surplus or undivided profits allotted to, set part or designated to it shall pay the minium license fixed in this section.

Section Four - - - That for each business of carrying on a private banking house, business or agency, the license shall be based on the total declared capital invested in said business, whether said capital is owned or used or on deposit in this Parish, or elsewhere, and shall be fixed and graded, as follows to wit:

First Class- - When said capital is five thousand dollars or more, the license shall be six hundred dollars (\$600.00)

Second Class - - When said capital is two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be three hundred dollars (\$300.00)

Third Class - - When said capital is one hundred and fifty thousand dollars or more, and under two hundred and fifty thousand dollars the license shall be two hundred dollars (\$200.00)

Fourth Class- - When said capital is under one hundred and fifty thousand dollars the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00)

First Class- - When the gross annual commissions are twenty thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and eighty dollars (\$180.00)

Second Class- - When the gross annual commissions are fifteen thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty thousand dollars the license shall be one hundred and forty dollars (\$140.00)

Third Class- - When the gross annual commissions are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00)

Fourth Class- - When the gross annual commissions are five thousand dollars or more and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00)

Fifth Class- - When the gross annual commissions are less than five thousand dollars the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00)

Provided, that if any person, firm, or corporation carrying on the business designated in this Section shall conduct more than one office or place of business whether in the same or under different names, such person, firm or corporation shall pay a separate license for each and every office or place of business it shall conduct according to the hereinabove classifications.

Provided, further, that this Ordinance shall not apply to persons, corporations or institutions carrying on banking business is provided by section three (3) of this ordinance, and provided further that this Ordinance shall not apply to persons, corporations or companies lending money secured by mortgage upon real estate.

Section 5. That for every wholesale dealer in merchandise, not otherwise provided for by the Ordinance or by special laws, whether the business be conducted at a fixed establishment of otherwise, and whether conducted as principal, agent or commission or otherwise, the license shall be fixed and graded in classes and for each separate establishment where more than one such establishment is kept or conducted by the same person, firm, association or corporation, there shall be a separate license, is herein fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class- - When the gross sales are two hundred and fifty thousand dollars or more, and less than five hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00)

Second Class - - When the gross sales are one hundred and fifty thousand dollars or more, and less than two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00)

Third Class - - When the gross sales are one hundred thousand dollars or more, and less than one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be seventy-five dollars (\$75.00)

Fourth Class - - When the gross sales are less than one hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00)

Provided, that no person or persons shall be deemed wholesale dealers unless he or they sell by the original or unbroken package or barrel only; and provided further that no person or persons shall be deemed wholesale dealers unless he or they sell to dealers for re-sale. If they sell in less quantities than original unbroken package or barrel they shall be considered retail dealers and pay license as such.

Section 6. That for every business of selling merchandise at retail nor otherwise provided by this Ordinance or by special laws whether the business be conducted as principal, agent or commission or otherwise, the license shall be fixed and graded in classes, and for each separate establishment where more than one such establishment is kept and conducted by the same person, firm, association or corporation, there shall be a separate license, as herein fixed and graded, as follows, to-wit:

First Class - - When the gross sales are fifty thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be sixty dollars, (\$60.00)

Second Class - - When the gross sales are forty thousand dollars or more, and less than fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00)

Third Class - - When the gross sales are thirty thousand dollars or more and less than forty thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty-five dollars (\$35.00)

Fourth Class - - When the gross sales are twenty-five thousand dollars, and less than thirty thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00)

Fifth Class - - When the gross sales are twenty thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Sixth Class - - When the gross sales are fifteen thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty-thousand dollars the license shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00)

Seventh Class - - When the gross sales are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars. (\$15.00)

Eighth Class - - When the gross sales are five thousand dollars or more, and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00)

Ninth Class - - When the gross sales are less than five thousand dollars, the license shall be five dollars (\$5.00)

Provided, that if any distilled, vinous, malt or cereal drinks, ice cream, confections, soda water, soda pop, coca-cola, chero-cola, grapico

or other similar drinks or beverages or refreshments be sold in connection with or in the same establishment with the business of retail merchant, the sale thereof shall be deemed a separate business, and a separate license shall be paid for the pursuit of such business, as may be provided by this Ordinance, or by existing laws not hereby repealed or by subsequent laws.

Provided further, that farmers or planters having stores on their farms or plantations and selling or advancing supplies to their employees exclusively shall not be classed as merchants nor shall they be required to pay a license under this Ordinance.

Section 7. That for the business of carrying on, operating or running any horse, steam, gas, gasoline or electric railroad, for the transportation of passengers within the limits of the Parish of Jefferson, the annual license shall be 45-100 of one (1 p.c.) per cent of the annual gross receipts.

Section 8. That for carrying on each business of gas light, gas heat, or power, electric light, water works; cotton compress or ginery; cotton pickery; slaughter house; distillery, rectifying alcoholic or malt liquors; brewing ale, beer, porter or other malt liquors, and for each telegraph, telephone or express business, other than those subject to license under the foreign license Ordinance or special law, the license shall be based on the gross annual receipts, and shall be fixed, and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class - - When the gross annual receipts are one hundred thousand dollars or more, and less than one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be three hundred dollars. (\$300.00)

Second Class - - When the gross annual receipts are seventy-five thousand dollars or more, and less than one hundred and fifty thousand dollars the license shall be two hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$225.00)

Third Class - - When the gross annual receipts are fifty thousand dollars or more, and less than seventy-five thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and fifty dollars. (\$150.00)

Fourth Class - - When the gross annual receipts are thirty-seven thousand dollars or more and less than fifty thousand, the license shall be (\$115.00)

Fifth Class - - When the gross annual receipts are twenty-five thousand dollars or more, and less than thirty seven thousand five hundred dollars, the license shall be seventy five dollars (\$75.00)

Sixth Class - - When the gross annual receipts are twenty thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00)

Seventh Class - - When the gross annual receipts are fifteen thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty thousand dollars. The license shall be forty-five dollars (\$45.00)

Eighth Class - - When the gross annual receipts are less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00)

Provided, that this section shall not apply to planters and farmers ginning their own cotton or that of their tenants, exclusively nor to those who gin for hire not over four hundred bales of cotton per annum.

Section 6. That for every business of keeping a theatre, opera house amphitheater, academy of music, exhibition of moving pictures, theatorium or or other similar places of amusement the license shall be based upon the gross annual receipts of said business and shall be fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class - - When the gross annual receipts are twenty thousand dollars or more and less than thirty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00)

Second Class - - When the gross annual receipts are fifteen thousand dollars or more and less than twenty thousand dollars, the license shall be seventy-five dollars (\$75.00)

Third Class - - When the gross annual receipts are ten thousand dollars the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

Fourth Class - - When the gross annual receipts are five thousand dollars or more and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00)

Fifth Class - - When the gross annual receipts are two thousand five hundred dollars or more, and less than five thousand dollars, the license shall be twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50)

Sixth Class - - When the gross annual receipts are less than two thousand five hundred dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00)

Second Class - - When the number of persons is one hundred or more, and less than two hundred, the license shall be six hundred dollars (\$600.00)

Third Class - - When the number of such persons is seventy five or more, and less than one hundred, the license shall be four hundred and eighty dollars (\$480.00)

Fourth Class - - When the number of such persons is fifty or more and less than seventy five the license shall be three hundred and sixty dollars (\$360.00)

Fifth Class - - When the number of such persons is thirty or more, and less than fifty the license shall be three hundred dollars \$300.00.

Sixth Class - - - When the number of such persons is twenty or more, and less than thirty, the license shall be two hundred and forty dollars (\$240.00)

Seventh Class - - When the number of such persons is ten or more, and less than twenty, the license shall be one hundred and eighty dollars (\$180.00)

Eighth Class - - When the number of such persons is five or more, and less than ten the license shall be one hundred and twenty dollars. (\$120.00)

Ninth Class - - When the number of such persons is four, the license shall be ninety dollars (\$90.00)

Tenth Class - - When the number of such persons is three, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00)

Eleventh Class - - When the number of such persons is two, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00)

Twelfth Class - - When the number is one, the license shall be thirty-five dollars (\$35.00)

For every hall or balls or entertainments not mentioned above provided for are given, the classification for license shall be based upon the

number of persons the place is capable of entertaining, and the amount of the license shall be fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class- When the number of seats or spaces is two thousand or more the license shall be two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00)

Second Class - - When the number of seats or spaces is one thousand five hundred or more, and less than two thousand, the license shall be one hundred and ninety dollars (\$190.00)

Third Class - - When the number of seats or spaces is one thousand five hundred the license shall be one hundred twenty five dollars (125.00)

Fourth Class- - When the number of seats or spaces is seven hundred fifty or more and less than one thousand the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00)

Section 10. That for each and every peddler or hawker, other than vendors of ice, shall pay an annual license, which license is hereby fixed, classified and graded as follows--to-wit:

(a) When traveling on foot, one hundred Dollars (\$100.00), When traveling on horseback, One hundred and twenty Dollars, (\$120.00). When traveling in a one horse vehicle, One hundred and fifty Dollars, (\$150.00). When traveling in a two horse vehicle, motor vehicle, or truck, Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) When traveling in any kind of water craft, Two hundred dollars (\$200.00).

(b) Provided that persons residing in the Parish where the license is issued, and selling their goods exclusively in said Parish, shall pay only one half of the amounts named in subsection (a) as above set out.

And provided that peddlers of fresh meat, poultry, eggs, vegetables and fruit shall pay only one-fifth of the graded license herein stipulated, and persons when vending their own produce, shall pay no license; and provided

further that no person shall be allowed to sell goods as a clerk or clerks of a peddler or hawker, but that he or they must pay a license in his or their name but that this provision shall not apply to water craft, And provided further, that all parochial or municipal officers are hereby empowered and directed to cause all peddlers and hawkers to exhibit their State license, if any and the said peddler or hawker failing to exhibit the same, the said officers are directed and empowered by this Act to seize said stock of merchandise and turn the same over to any Court of competent jurisdiction, with due information as to the violations of this Act.

Provided further, that said executive officers shall be entitled to receive as fees the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00) in each and every case from a peddler or hawker, clerk or clerks employed by said peddler or hawker, when peddling without a license in violation of this law; the said amount of ten dollars to be recovered before any court of competent jurisdiction out of the goods so seized. Provided further that no license shall be issued to any peddler or hawker for less than full rate of the current year.

For every business or restaurant, tea room, coffee house or other eating house, whether attached to or separate and apart from a hotel, boarding house or rooming house, a separate license shall be paid, and such license shall be fixed and graded as provided in Section 8 of this

Act for retail dealers; but no license shall be charged for selling refreshments for charitable or religious purposes.

Section 11. That for keeping billiard tables, pigenhole, Jenny Lind, pool or bagatelle, tables, tenpin alleys and shooting galleries, from which revenue is derived, a license of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for each such table, alley or gallery shall be paid in addition to any other license due by the establishment in which said tables, alleys or galleries may be situated.

Section 12. That all persons, associations of persons, firms and corporations engaged in the sale at retail of soda water, ice cream, confections, soda pop, coca cola, chero cola, grapico or other similar soft drinks or beverages or refreshments shall pay a license based on the gross annual sales and such licenses are hereby fixed and graded as follows. to-wit:

First Class - - When the gross sales are six thousand dollars or more, and less than eight thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00)

Second Class - - When the gross sales are four thousand dollars or more, and less than six thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty five dollars (\$25.00)

Third Class - - When the gross sales are are three thousand dollars or more, and less than four thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty dollars (20.00)

Fourth Class - - When the gross sales are two thousand dollars or more, and less than three thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00)

Fifth Class - - When the gross sales are one thousand dollars or more and less than two thousand dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00)

Sixth Class - - When the gross sales are less than one thousand dollars, the license shall be five dollars (\$5.00)

Section 13. That all persons, associations of persons, firms or corporations engaged in the sale at wholesale, of distilled, spiritous, vinous malt, cereal or other liquors or beverages containing any alcoholic content shall pay licenses based upon the gross annual sales and each separate establishment place, distributing station or depot from which such beverages are sold and distributed at wholesale, whether conducted as principal agent, or distributor, shall pay a separate license, which licenses are hereby fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class - - When the gross sales are forty thousand dollars or more, and less than fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00)

Second Class - - When the gross sales are thirty thousand dollars or more, less than forty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and twenty five dollars (\$125.00)

Third Class - - When the gross sales are twenty thousand dollars or more, and less than thirty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars. (\$100.00)

Fourth Class - - When the gross sales are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty thousand the license shall be seventy five dollars (\$75.00)

Fifth Class - - When the gross sales are less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00)

Section 14. That all persons, associations of persons, firms or corporations, engaged in the sale at retail, of malt or cereal beverages containing any alcoholic content less than one half of one per cent by volume shall pay license based upon the gross annual sales, and each separate establishment at which such beverages are sold at retail whether conducted as principal, agent or distributor, shall pay a separate license, which licenses are hereby fixed and graded as follows-to-wit:

First Class--When the gross annual sales are ten thousand dollars, or more and less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty Dollars, (\$50.00)

Second Class--When the gross annual sales are eight thousand dollars, or more and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be forty dollars (\$40.00)

Third Class--When the gross annual sales are six thousand dollars or more, and less than eight thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00)

Fourth Class-- When the gross annual sales are four thousand dollars or more and less than six thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty five dollars (\$25.00)

Fifth Class--When the gross annual sales are three thousand dollars or more and less than four thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00)

Sixth Class--When the gross annual sales are two thousand dollars or more and less than three thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00)

Seventh Class--When the gross annual sales are one thousand dollars or more and less than two thousand dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00)

Eight Class--When the gross annual sales are less than one thousand dollars, the license shall be five dollars (\$5.00)

Nothing in this Act contained shall be construed to authorize the issuance of a license for the sale of any liquor or beverage the sale of which is prohibited by the law or ordinance of the United States or of the State of Louisiana or of any municipality or other subdivision thereof.

Provided that a person, association, firm or corporation engaged in the business mention in this Section and having a proper license, may sell in connection with said business any of the commodities mentioned in Section 21, of this Act without paying a separate license, but the total sales from such combined business shall determine the amount of license to be paid according to the classifications in this Section.

Section 15. That every individual, firm company or corporation carrying on the profession or business of contractor, shall pay license based upon the gross annual receipts of said business, while licenses shall be fixed and graded as follows-to-wit:

First Class--When the gross receipts are twenty five thousand dollars or more, and less than fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00)

Second Class--When the gross receipts are ten thousand dollars or more and less than twenty five thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00)

Third Class--When the gross receipts are less than ten thousand dollars the license shall be twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50)

Provided that every individual firm, company or corporation carrying on the profession or business of master builder or merchant who employs assistance where building is for others on a cost plus basis, commission or percentage plan shall pay a license based upon the annual earnings from the business which license shall be fixed and graded as provided in Section 5 of this Act for carrying on a commission or brokerage business.

Section 16. That every individual, firm, association or corporation carrying on the profession or business of keeping cabs, hacks, horses, or motor vehicles for home, undertaker, funeral director agency for steamboats or steamships and owners or lessees of toll bridges or ferries, stevedores and to be engaged in the business or profession of bill posting, tacking or advertising, the license shall be based upon the gross annual receipts from such profession or business and shall be fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class--When the gross annual receipts are six thousand dollars, or more and less than eight thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00)

Second Class--When the gross annual receipts are five thousand dollars or more and less than six thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty seven dollars and fifty cents (\$37.50)

Third Class--When the gross annual receipts are four thousand dollars or more and less than five thousand dollars the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00)

Fourth Class--When the gross annual receipts are three thousand dollars or more and less than four thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty five dollars (\$25.00)

Fifth Class--When the gross annual receipts are two thousand dollars and more and less than three thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00)

Sixth Class--When the gross annual receipts are one thousand dollars and more and less than two thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00)

Seventh Class--When the gross annual receipts are seven hundred and fifty dollars or more, and less than one thousand dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00)

Eighth Class--When the gross annual receipts are less than seven hundred and fifty dollars, the license shall be five dollars (\$5.00)

That any other business not provided for in this Ordinance not otherwise provided for by a separate law, except manufacturing, shall be graduated the same as above set forth, and shall pay a license as fixed in this Section.

That every individual, firm, association or corporation carrying on the business or profession of physician, osteopath, dentist, oculist, attorney-at-law editor, publisher, printer, engraver, lithographer, photographer, architect, civil engineer, mechanical engineer, electrical engineer, decorator, jeweler, or any other professional occupation shall be graded according to the classifications names above, but the license for the various professions included in this paragraph shall be one half of those established by the foregoing provisions of this Section; provided that no license shall be issued hereunder for less than five dollars (\$5.00)

Section 17. That every individual, firm, association, corporation carrying on profession or business of steam dying, steam cleaning, steam

pressing, or the business of electric laundering, the license shall be based upon the gross annual receipts from that profession or business, and shall be fixed and graded as follows to-wit:

First Class--When the gross annual receipts are ten thousand dollars or more and less than twelve thousand dollars, the license shall be forty dollars (\$40.00)

Second Class--When the gross annual receipts are eight thousand dollars or more and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00)

Third Class--When the gross annual receipts are six thousand dollars or more and less than eight thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty five dollars (\$25.00)

Fourth Class--When the gross annual receipts are five thousand dollars or more and less than five thousand dollars the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00)

To levy, collect and enforce payment of a license tax upon all persons, associations of persons, business firms, partnerships, corporations, engaged or pursuing business whereby dogs are run for purses, and, or where any entrance fee is charged for the dogs racing, with certain exceptions, and prescribing the mode and method by which said license tax shall be collected; and providing a penalty for violations thereof, and repealing all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, That there be and is hereby levied a license tax upon such persons, association

of persons, or business firm, partnership or corporation, engaged in or pursuing any business whereby dogs are run for purses or where entrance fee is charged for the entrance of the said dogs in a race, for each and every race track so operated which said license shall be graduated upon daily receipts from admissions paid by spectators and entrance fees charged for the entrance of the said dogs in the said race, as follows:

First Class--When paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for dogs racing amount to \$10,000.00 or more per day, the license shall be \$200.00 per day, for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Second Class--When paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for the dogs racing amount to \$5,000.00 or more and less than \$10,000.00, the license tax shall be \$150.00 per day for time or duration of the race meeting.

Third Class--When said paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for the dogs racing amount to less than \$5,000.00 then the license tax shall be \$100.00 per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Section 2. That the aforesaid license tax shall be collected by the constituted authority charged with the collection of license due to the State.

Section 3. That the minimum license tax herein provided shall be paid in advance and to the constituted authority charged with the collection thereof, and no race shall be run unless same is paid, under penalty herein provided, and the balance of said license tax, if any, shall be paid before 3 O'Clock P.M. on the following day, the collection thereof to be in accordance with the herein provided graduated schedule

Section No. 1 and that this license tax shall become due and owing on each and every day that the said races are run and shall become delinquent on the following day, and it is hereby made the duty of the District Attorney of this Parish to enforce collection of this said license tax, and for the services rendered in such collection, he shall be entitled to 20 per cent over and above the amount of the license collected from the delinquent debtor, as attorney's fees, which said attorney's fees shall be paid by the said delinquent license debtor, and shall be assessed as costs in case of suit.

Section 4. That all suits for the collection of this license tax shall be summary and be tried in accordance with the law in force for the collection of delinquent licenses or taxes.

Section 5. That the amount of tax due by the aforesaid person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporations, engaged in the aforesaid business shall be determined as follows:

The daily receipts of the paid admissions and entrance charged for the entrance of the said dogs in the said races for the said pay shall be added and totalled up and then the license tax calculated thereon in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of this Act.

Section 6. That the provisions of this Act shall not apply to an association of persons or corporations engaged in holding or conducting a fair solely for the purpose of exhibiting agricultural or manufactured products or natural resources looking toward the advancement of the agricultural or manufacturing interest or the development of the natural resources in the said parish, where said dogs racing is conducted as an auxiliary sport and as an incident for amusement and entertainment and not for the purpose of profit, provided that said fairs so conducted shall not be for a longer period than 14 days.

Section 7. That any person, association or persons, business firms, partnerships or corporations conducting or operating a race track or races in contravention of the provisions of this Act without having first paid said license tax as aforesaid shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.00 and not less than \$25.00 or by imprisonment not more than 20 days and not less than 10 days in parish jail or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court, provided that in case the violator be an association, firm or corporation, the managing officers and agents thereof shall be punished by such fine or imprisonment, and provided such fine and imprisonment shall not be construed as relieving said violator from said license tax.

Section 8. That all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

Roll being called to vote on the adoption of the above Ordinance, resulted as follows:

AN ORDINANCE

To levy, and collect and enforce payment of a license tax upon all persons, association of persons, or business firm, partnerships, or corporation, engaged in or pursuing any business whereby horses are run for purses, and or where any entrance fee is charged for the horses racing, with certain exceptions and prescribing the mode and method by which said licenses tax shall be collected; and providing a penalty for violations thereof, and repealing all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that there be and is hereby levied a license tax upon each person, association of persons, or business firm, partnership or corporation, engaged in or pursuing any business where by horses are run for purses or where any entrance fee is charged for the entrance of the said horses in a race, for each and every race track so operated, which said license shall be graduated upon daily receipts from admissions paid by spectators and entrance fees charged for the entrance of the said horses in the said race as follows:

First Class--When the said admissions by spectators and entrance fees for horses racing amount to ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) or more per day, the license shall be six hundred dollars (\$600.00) per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Second Class--When the said paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for the horses racing, amount to seventy-five hundred dollars (\$7,500.00) and less than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) the license tax shall be five hundred dollars (\$500.00) per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Third Class--When the said paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for the horses racing amount to five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) and less than seventy five hundred (\$7,500.00) per day, the license shall be three hundred (\$350.00) and fifty dollars per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Fourth Class--When said paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for the horses racing amount to less than five thousand dollars \$5,000.00 per day, the license shall be two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Section 2. The aforesaid license tax shall be collected by the constituted authority charged with the collection of licenses due to the State.

Section 3. That the minimum license tax herein provided shall be paid in advance daily to the constituted authority charged with the collection hereof, and no race shall be run unless same is paid, under penalty herein provided, and the balance of said license tax if any, shall be paid before 3 o'clock p.m., on the following day, the calculation thereof to be in accordance with the herein provided graduated schedule in Section No. 1; and that this license tax shall become due and owing on each and every day that the said races are run, and shall become delinquent on the following day, and it is hereby made the duty of the District Attorney of this Parish to enforce the collection of this said license tax, and for the services rendered in such collection he shall be entitled to 20 per cent over and above the amount of the license collected from the delinquent debts, as attorney's fees which said attorney's fees shall be paid by the said delinquent license debtor, and shall be assessed as costs in case of suit.

Section 4. That all suits or rules for the collection of this license tax shall be summary and be tried in accordance with the law in force for the collection of delinquent licenses or taxes.

Section 5. That the amount of tax due by the aforesaid person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporations engaged in the aforesaid business shall be determined as follows:

The daily receipts of the paid admissions and entrance charged for the entrance of the said horses in the said races for the said day shall be added and totaled up and then the license tax calculated in accordance thereon with the provisions of Section 1 of this Act:

Section 6. That the provisions of this act shall not apply to associations of persons, or corporations, engaged in holding or conducting a fair solely for the purpose of exhibiting agricultural or manufactured products or natural resources looking toward the advancement of the agricultural or manufactured interest or the development of the natural resources in the said parish, where said horses racing is conducted as an auxiliary sport, as an incident for amusement and entertainment, and not for the purpose of profit, provided that said fairs so conducted shall not be for a longer period than 14 days.

Section 7. That any person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporation conducting or operating a race track or races in contravention of the provisions of this Act without having first paid said license tax as aforesaid, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.00 and not less than \$25.00 or by imprisonment of not more than 30 days and not less than 10 days in the parish jail, or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court, provided that in case the violator be an association, firm or corporation, the managing officers and agents thereof shall be punishable by such fine or imprisonment and provided that such fine and imprisonment shall not be construed as relieving said violator said license tax.

Section 9. That all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith be and the same is hereby repealed.

Rolling being called to vote on the adoption of the above Resolution, resulted as follows:

Yeas---Erlinger, Strohle, Dauanhauer, Cantrello, Petit, Fisher, Otterman, Bordes, Nays---None.

Section 18. That the annual receipts, capital, sales, premiums, commissions earnings in this Ordinance referred to as a basis of license are those for the year for which the license is granted; the standard for their estimation shall be prima facie of the preceding year if the business has been conducted previously by the same party or parties to whom they claim to be successors. If the firm or company be new, the amount of gross sales for the first two months be estimated as the annual receipts of such business, provided that any person commencing business after the first of July, peddlers, hawkers, and traveling shows excepted, shall pay one half of the above rates.

Section 19. That the business of the previous year, as also the actual condition and results of business of the current year, for new firms, associations, corporations for the purpose of calculating licenses, shall be ascertained by the tax collector in the sworn statement of the person or persons in interest, his or their duly authorized agent or officer, made before the tax collector be not satisfied with the said sworn statement, he shall traverse the same by a rule taken in proper court which rule shall be tried summarily whether an answer be thereto filed or not. On trial of said rule, the books and written entries and memoranda of said person or persons, firms, companies or parties shall be brought into court and subjected to the inspection and examination of the court, the officer who took the rule, and such experts as he may employ or the court may appoint; provided that this inspection shall not be construed as entitling the defendant to introduce in evidence said books and documents any

more than he would have been without such inspection, provided, also, that the license shall issue in accordance with the said sworn statement, notwithstanding the prospect of pendency of the rule, the final ratification shall be made as

ordered by the court.

In addition to the duties and powers herein imposed upon and vested in tax collectors, the Supervisor of Public Accounts shall have authority to review and examine any sworn statements or account that may have been or may be rendered or furnished in pursuance of the provisions of this Act; and he shall have authority to demand and examine the books, statements and accounts of any persons, firms, association or corporation from whom a license may be due under the provisions of this Act; and to take such proceedings before any court of competent jurisdiction by rule or otherwise, against the tax collector or against any person, firms, association or corporation from whom a license may be due, as may be necessary to enforce a full and fair compliance with the provisions of this Act.

Section 20. That if any business shall be conducted without a license in case herein provided, the officer whose duty it is to issue license shall through the attorney herein provided for, on motion in the proper courts as provided in the Constitution, and which shall be without deposit or advance cost, take a rule on the party or parties doing such business to show cause on the fifth day, exclusive, of holidays, after the service thereof, which may be tried out of term time and in chambers, and shall always be tried by preference why said party or parties should not pay the amount of license claimed and penalties or be ordered to cease from further pursuit of said business until after having obtained a license and in case said rule is made absolute, the order thereon rendered shall be considered a judgment in favor of the State, for the amount decreed to be due by the defendant for license and penalty and cost heretofore and hereafter provided for, shall be executed in the same manner as other judgments and every violation of the order shall be considered as a contempt thereof, and punished according to law.

It is hereby expressly provided that each person, association of persons, business firm, or corporation required to take out a license under this Act, shall be required to post the same in a conspicuous place in his or their place of business, under a penalty of not less than ten or more than one hundred dollars recoverable by the tax collector before any court of competent jurisdiction and it shall be the duty of the several tax collectors throughout the state to visit in person or by deputies the several places of business herein mentioned and ascertain that the provisions of this section are strictly carried out.

SECTION 21. That the only legal evidence that a license has been paid shall be the appropriate form of license issued by the Auditor of Public Accounts, and no receipts issued by a tax collector in place of the license itself shall be valid and this clause shall be construed to prevent the tax collector from issuing a receipt, in lieu of the appropriate form to any person, association of persons, business corporations; provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed so as to exclude oral evidence of loss or destroyed licenses.

Section 22. That the ex-officio tax collector shall prepare and keep a book in which they shall record or file the statements made under oath of all persons, associations of persons, business firms or corporations, who may apply for license to pursue any trade, professions, vocation, calling or business under this ordinance.

Section 23. That the ex-officio tax collector charged with the collection of taxes are hereby to administer oath to any person, president or proper official or agent of any association of persons, business firms, or corporations applying for licenses under this Ordinance; and any tax collector or ex-officio tax collector as aforesaid or any notary public or other office of the Parish empowered to administer oaths, who shall sign any part or certify to any oath with out administering the oath in person to the applicant and having the applicant sign the oath in his presence, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor or and on conviction shall be subject to a fine of not less than one hundred dollars nor more than one thousand dollars or imprisonment of not less than thirty days nor more than ninety days or both in the discretion of the court. That when the oath is taken before the collector, no charge shall be made for same. Any false swearing as to the gross receipts of any person or persons, or corporations through their president or proper officer or agent, applying for license shall constitute the crime of perjury, to be punished as directed by existing criminal laws of the Parish. All licenses shall be paid in the parish wherein is situated or conducted the business for which the license is due. Where an individual is applicant for license the affidavit must be taken in person; where a partnership, by a member of the firm, and where a corporation, by the proper officer thereof. But in the absence from the parish of the individuals the member of the firm or the proper officer of the corporation, same may be taken by a competent agent, on personal knowledge of the fact, to be made to appear in the body of the affidavit.

Section 24. That the tax collectors and ex-officio tax collectors are hereby required to keep a license register, in which they shall enter the names of every person, association of persons, business firm or corporation with the trade, profession, vocation, calling or business pursued, the class and graduation of the same amount of the license thereon, and the date of the collection or payment thereof. On July 1st of each and every year the said collectors shall make and forward to the Auditor of Public Accounts a full and complete transcript of said license register, showing all licenses collected during the preceding six months. A similar transcript shall be filed by them on December 31st. of each and every year showing all licenses collected during the second half of the year. The Auditor of Public Accounts shall lay a copy of these transcripts before the General Assembly at each regular session, the originals of which he shall file in his office for future reference or use.

Section 25. That the ex-officio tax collector violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance or who shall wilfully rate any person, association of persons, or business firm or corporation at a less graduation than the law contemplates, or who shall issue to any said person, association of persons, or business firms or corporations a license less sum than that corresponding with their graduation, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor in office, and shall on conviction before a competent authority be summarily dismissed therefrom.

Section 26. That the Governor of the State shall designate for each parish including the Parish of Orleans, an attorney-at-law, whose duty it shall be to aid the tax collector or ex-officio tax collector in the parish for which he is appointed in the collection of the State and parish licenses provided by this Act, and upon all licenses and penalties collected through the agency of the said attorney, the delinquent owing the licenses shall pay a commission to him of ten per cent, calculating same upon the aggregate amount of licenses and penalties so collected and paid over to the tax collector. The said attorney shall receive no other compensation. The attorney so appointed shall serve during good behavior and shall be liable to be summarily removed by the Governor for good and sufficient cause. It shall be the duty of the district attorneys of the parish to represent the tax collectors of said parishes in the collection of delinquent license or in case the attorney so appointed refuses to act. On the second day of March of each year the tax collector or ex-officio tax collector shall deliver to the attorneys herein provided for, a complete list

of all delinquent license payers, together with their location and kind of business; and the attorney shall immediately proceed to collect same in accordance with this ordinance, and if not collected within thirty days from the date of delivery of the list by the collector of taxes or ex-officio collector of taxes, it shall be the duty of said attorneys to render a written report giving the reasons for non-collection to the collectors, whose duty it shall be to forward such report to the Auditor of Public Accounts. Provided that the attorneys here in provided for clerks of courts, sheriffs, constables or other officers, shall receive no compensation, commission, salary docket fee or fees for services rendered in any suit or action for the collection of licenses under the provisions of this Act in which said tax collector or ex-officio tax collector has failed to obtain full and complete satisfaction and payment of any judgment in favor of the State of Louisiana; and provided further, that said attorneys, clerks of court, sheriffs, constables or other officer shall receive no compensation, commission, salary, docket fee, or fees for services rendered in any suit or action for the collection of licenses under the provisions of this Act in which the said tax collector or ex-officio tax collector has failed to obtain full and complete satisfaction and payment of any judgment in favor of the State of Louisiana and provided further, that said attorneys, clerks of court, sheriffs, constables or other officer shall receive no compensation in any license suit for services rendered in which judgment has been rendered against said tax collector, or ex-officio tax collector of the State of Louisiana.

Section 27. That if any tax collector or officer, whose duty it is to issue state licenses shall through incompetency, negligence or fault on his own part, fail to collect licenses in the proper amounts from those by whom they are due, he shall be responsible on his bond for all losses to the State arising therefrom.

Section 28. That all unpaid licenses shall bear interest at the rate of two per cent per month from the first day of March and the payment thereon shall be secured by first lien and privilege in favor of the state upon the property, movable and immovable, of the delinquent or in the

license, and the tax collector or ex-officio tax collector shall collect said license and interest in the manner prescribed by existing laws.

Section 29. That all gross receipts derived from any mercantile business or occupation whatsoever, as herein before provided, whether earned within or without the state, shall form the proper basis upon which all licenses shall be assessed and collected by tax collectors.

Section 30. That a person, firm or company having more than one place of business shall pay a separate license for each place of business.

Section 31. That the police Jury shall designate the same attorney to represent the tax collector of the Parish of Jefferson as has been appointed by the Governor of the State, to represent the tax collector for the Parish of Jefferson, and he shall receive the same compensation for his services as is provided by the Act 205 of 1924, Section 39.

On the second day of March of each year the tax collector or ex-officio tax collector shall deliver to the attorneys therein provided for a complete list of all delinquent license payer, together with their location and kind of business and the attorney shall immediately proceed to collect same in accordance with ordinance.

Section 32. That if any tax collector or officer, whose duty it is to issue parish licenses, shall through incompetency, negligence or fault on his part fail to collect licenses in the proper amounts from those by whom they are due, he shall be responsible on his bond for all losses to the parish arising therefrom.

Section 33. That all unpaid license shall bear interest at the rate of two (2) per cent per month from the first day of March, and the payment thereon shall be secured by first lien and privilege in favor of the Parish of Jefferson upon the property movable and immovable of the delinquent owing the license, and the tax collector or ex-officio tax collector shall collect said license and interest in the manner prescribed by existing laws.

Section 34. That all gross receipts derived from any mercantile business or occupation whatsoever, as hereinbefore provided, whether earned within or without the Parish of Jefferson, shall form the proper basis upon which all licenses shall be assessed and collected by tax collectors.

Section 35. That a person firm or company having more than one place of business shall pay a separate license for each place of business.

WHEREAS, Messrs Dymond, & Levy, by reason of their experience in the drafting of these laws and their special familiarity with the whole subject matter extending over a period of many years, are particularly well qualified to render this legal

service.

WHEREAS, the public press of New Orleans, have carried a story to the effect that the Board of Commissioners of the Port of New Orleans, known as the Dock Board, is endeavoring to have the limits of the Port of New Orleans extended to the mouth of the Mississippi River, and,

WHEREAS, the said Dock Board has now under its control and within the limits of the Port of New Orleans, all of the River front in the Parish of Jefferson, as well as the river frontage beyond the limits of the Parish of Jefferson, which is more than necessary to take care of any growth in the commerce of the Port of New Orleans for many years to

come, and

WHEREAS, the Dock Board of the City of New Orleans has had control of that portion of the Parish of Jefferson fronting on the Mississippi River such supervision has tendered to stifle the growth of this Parish through the location of industrial establishments along the river front by the reason of the fact that said Dock Board has adopted rules and regulations which prevent said industrial establishments from constructing and obtaining the necessary wharfage space in front of their plants, and,

WHEREAS, we have been informed that although titles to land in the Parish of Jefferson fronting on the Mississippi River gives the purchasers the right of batture which we believe entitle said owners to the right to construct wharves, elevators and conveyors that may be necessary in the conduct of the business of said industrial establishments, nevertheless, the said Dock Board of the City of New Orleans will not permit said industrial establishments to construct such wharves, elevators and conveyors without the permission of the said Dock Board, and in some instances had further required that industrial establishments located in the Parish of Jefferson along the Mississippi River are required to build their own wharves and then compelled, so we have been informed, to turn over the supervision of said wharves to the Dock Board and

in some instances to pay compensation to the Dock Board on wharves on which have been built and paid for by these industrial establishments themselves, and,

WHEREAS, The Dock Board of the City of New Orleans, although it undertakes to supervise the construction and maintainance of the wharves and ware houses along the River front in the Port of New Orleans, and although it has collected tolls and fees from shipping landing at the numerous plants along the river front in the Parish of Jefferson it is a well known fact that said Dock Board has not expended one cent towards the construction of wharves or warehouses to facilitate the commerce of the Port of the Jefferson Parish side of the Mississippi River, but that all of said construction have singularly taken place along the River front in the City of New Orleans, and,

WHEREAS, we feel that such action on the part of the Dock Board of New Orleans constitutes an unfair discrimination between the City of New Orleans and the industries located along the Mississippi River in the Parish of Jefferson and and further extension of said Port limits to the mouth of the Miss. River will unquestionably bring about unfair discrimination and the stifling of private improvements along the River front on the east bank of the river in the sister Parishes of Plaquemines and St. Bernard with whom we feel have a common interest in preventing such extension, and,

WHEREAS, it appears to us that said extension is being made solely and only for the purpose of arresting developments of the River front outside of the Port of New Orleans as now constituted, and not for the purpose of developing the additional River front which they are endeavoring to control, because they have now in the Port of New Orleans

enough River front on the Jefferson Parish side of the River which is greatly in need of wharves and warehouses, which ought to be constructed by the Dock Board for the public benefit in view of the fact that they exact fees and tolls from all shipping landing in the parish,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, in regular meeting assembled that they protest this action on the part of the Dock Board at New Orleans and that we hereby instruct Mr. W. R. Toledano, PRESIDENT of this POLICE JURY to send copies of this resolution to United States Senators Joseph E. Ransdell and Edwin S. Broussard, and to Congressmsn J. Zach Spearing Second Congressional District.

RESOLUTION AND NOTICE OF INTENTION.

1st. WHEREAS, it is necessary for the interest of the Parish of Jefferson that an annex to the present Courthouse be constructed, in order to provide adequate facilities, office room and space for the various Parish offices and Parish boards and to provide additional record room for Sheriff's Office Clerk and Ex-Officio Records Office and the Assessors Office of this Parish and,

WHEREAS, the present Court building of the Parish of Jefferson is inadequate and does not provide sufficient offices and space for the various boards and offices of the Parish, and,

2nd. WHEREAS, it is necessary for the best interest of the Parish of Jefferson that certain repairs be made to the Parish Jail and that a fence be constructed enclosing the said jail; and,

3rd. WHEREAS, it is to the interest of the Parish that its roads be repaired and maintained; and,

WHEREAS, an estimate has been made of the total amount necessary to be raised with which to build said annex and to do the said work necessary to provide an adequate Court building, to make repairs to the Parish Jail and to build a fence around it, and to repair and maintain roads and highways throughout the Parish which estimates amount to the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$150,000.00) DOLLARS and,

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, it is highly important for the welfare of the State of Louisiana as a whole that the local or community roads, which must be built and maintained at the expense of the several Parishes, be developed in such a manner as to keep pace with the progress of road construction and maintenance of the State Highway System; and,

WHEREAS, most of the Parishes of the State are already burdened with taxation for road development so that it is impractical to consider further local taxation by the parishes or local road districts for this purpose in most instances and;

WHEREAS, general conditions throughout Louisiana would prohibit local units from voting any substantial increase in special taxes for each purpose at this time; and,

WHEREAS, it is imperatively necessary that additional revenue be obtained from some source to assist the several parishes if the local road building and maintenance road program is to advance as rapidly as the welfare of the State demands, and,

WHEREAS, we understand that a measure has been introduced in the Legislature of Louisiana proposing to submit to the electorate of this State a proposal to amend the Constitution so as to authorize the Legislature to levy a four (\$.04) cent tax per gallon on gasoline purchased in this State, such an increase be an increase of two (\$.02) cents per gallon over the present tax.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON that it is the sense of this body that if such an increase be made that not less than (\$.01) cent per gallon of said tax as collected in each Parish should be paid to the Police Jury or other governing body of each Parish for road building and maintenance purposes, and we, therefore, respectfully urge upon the Legislature of Louisiana the importance of seeing that such a provision is contained in the proposed Constitutional Amendment before it is submitted to the Electorate of this State for Adoption or rejection.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, that the Louisiana Live Stock Sanitary Board be and it is hereby requested to prohibit the movement over all railroads running into the Parish of Jefferson, from quarantine areas, when said cattle have only been dipped one time previous to shipment.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this request is made because of the fact that such cattle have been discovered to be tick infected on arrival in this Parish and the constant switching of cattle cars has caused some of the tick to fall on grazing land near the railroad right of way, which in most cases are not fenced, and are picked up by tick free cattle, thereby causing small tick infested areas.

AN ORDINANCE

Re-creating Waterworks Dist No 2.

An Ordinance creating the Jefferson Parish Waterworks District Number Two (2) and to provide for the appointment of the Commissioners thereof, and fixing the area of said Waterworks District, fixing the domicile thereof, the date of its first meeting, and to repeal all ordinances in conflict herewith.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, in regular meeting assembled and convened, that the necessity thereof having been made to appear to this Police Jury, that a Waterworks District should be created of the hereinafter described territory,

SECTION 2. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, that a waterworks District to be known as the Jefferson Parish Waterworks District Number Two be and the same is hereby created and formed of the following territory to-wit:

Commencing at a point on the Mississippi River and the upper limits of the City of Gretna, and from the said point of beginning along the Mississippi River to a point intersecting the lower limits of the Town of Westwego, (Known as the Dugue Canal), and from said point in a southerly direction, along the Dugue Canal until it intersects a point One Thousand (1000) feet south of what is presently known as Public Highway (or U. S. Highway No. 90) and from said point which is one thousand feet south of said highway, in an easterly direction parallel at all times with the said highway at one thousand feet south of said highway until it intersects the Western side of Barataria Boulevard, and from said point on Barataria Boulevard along said Barataria Boulevard in a southerly direction until it meets at a point opposite the south side of Ninth Street of the Barataria Boulevard Subdivision, and from said point to extend in an easterly direction to a point where it shall intersect Tenth Street of the Marrero Addition, south side, and thence along the southside of Tenth Street in an easterly direction until it intersects the line of the property of Thomas Allo and the Valley Realty Company, and from said point in a northerly direction along the division line of property of Thomas Allo and Valley Realty Company to a point two thousand (2,000) feet south of the right of way of the Morgan's Louisiana & Texas Railroad (or Southern Pacific) and from said point thence extending in an easterly direction for a distance at all times two thousand feet south of said railroad right of way to a point where it shall intersect with the upper limits of the City of Gretna, and from said point thence in a northerly direction along the upper limits of the City of Gretna, extending towards the Mississippi River, to the point of beginning and containing more than two hundred an fifty resident land owners.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, that the said Waterworks District shall be known as the Jefferson Parish Waterworks District Number Two, and is hereby created and formed under the Constitution of the State of Louisiana, and the provisions of Act Number 343 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1926.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that Messrs. Loo, A. Marrero, Louis C. Fos, and Reuben W. Mayronne be and they are hereby appointed as the first Waterworks Commissioners of the said Jefferson Parish Waterworks District Number Two, their terms of office to be determined by lot in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of Act 343 of the Acts of 1926, and after the appointment of two other Commissioners by the Governor of the State of Louisiana.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., That the Village of Marrero, in this Parish & State, shall be the domicile of the said Jefferson Parish Waterworks District Number Two, and that Wednesday, October 31st, at the hour of ten o'clock A. M. the said Commissioners appointed as members of said Jefferson Waterworks District Number Two shall meet at the said domicile and shall then and there draw lots to determine the duration of their respective terms of office and shall perfect their said organization, all as provided for by Act 343 of the General Assembly for the year 1926.

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that all ordinances, or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, and especially the ordinance of this Police Jury adopted on the 15th day of August, 1928, be and the same is repealed.

AN ORDINANCE

An Ordinance Regulating the operation of garages and Oil Stations

Regulating the operation of garages and oil stations in accordance with the provisions of Act No. 275 of the Legislature of the State of Louisiana of 1928.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, That hereinafter any person, persons, firm, firms, or corporations desiring to operate and conduct a garage of oil business in any locality within the Parish of Jefferson, other than with the limits of any town or city, within the Parish of Jefferson, prior to the issuance of any permit by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, the party desiring such a permit shall address the Petition to the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson which petition shall state the name of the owner or owners, the exact location of the said establishment, and must be accompanied with a written assent of a majority of the property owners, or their agents, within three hundred feet, measuring along the streets or road fronts of the proposed location of said establishment.

SECTION 2. That the Police Jury shall not grant to any person a permit for conducting or operating such establishment located within three hundred feet of any bridge over a river, or on any State Highway and when, at the discretion of the Police Jury, the conducting and operating of such an establishment shall be deemed dangerous and hazardous to the public safety.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance shall become effective after its passage and promulgation due notice having been published for full thirty days in the Jefferson Democrat, the official journal of the Parish of Jefferson, in accordance with Section No. 3 of Act 275 of 1928.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$250.00, and all costs of prosecution, or shall be imprisoned in the Parish Jail for a term not less than thirty days nor more than ninety days, or both such fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the Court.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, In regular meeting assembled, that the President be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow from the Jefferson Trust & Savings Bank on behalf of this Police Jury, the sum of \$10,000.00 and such additional sum as may be necessary to pay the interest due or to become due on said amount for the purpose of paying the current expenses of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1928.

(Ordinance Levying License Tax for year 1928)

AN ORDINANCE

To levy collect and enforce payment of an annual license tax on all persons, association of persons, firms and corporations pursuing any trade, profession, vocation, calling or business, pursuant of Section 8, of Article X of the Constitution of 1921, and Act 205 of Legislature of 1924, prescribing the mode and method in which all persons subject to license shall make report of the business; providing remedies to enforce compliance therewith; prescribing penalties for making false statements on affidavits in relation thereto; and to repeal conflicting an inconsistent laws.

SECTION 1. BE IT enacted by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that there is hereby levied an annual license tax for the year 1919 and for each subsequent year, upon each person, association of persons, firms and corporations, pursuing any trade, profession, vocation, calling or business, subject to license under Section 8 of Article X of the Constitution of 1921 and Act 205 of 1924.

SECTION 2. That on the second day of January 1929, and of each subsequent year each tax collector throughout the State shall begin to collect and shall collect as fast as possible from each of the persons or business firms, association of persons or corporations pursuing within his district or parish any trade, profession, vocation, calling or business, a license tax hereinafter fixed and graduated.

All licenses shall be due and collectable during the first two (2) months of each year, and all unpaid licenses shall become delinquent on the first day of March of each year, and all persons, firms, association of persons and corporations who commence business after that date shall become delinquent unless the license is paid within ten days after commencing business.

SECTION 3. That for each business of carrying on a bank, banking company, trust company, association, corporation or agency the license shall be based on the declared profits and shall be fixed and graduated, as follows, to-wit; .

First Class --- When the declared or nominal capital surplus and undivided profits amount to two hundred thousand dollars, or more, and less than three hundred thousand dollars the license shall be three hundred dollars (\$300.00).

Seconde Class- When the declared or nominal capital, surplus or undivided

profits amount to one hundred thousand dollars or more, and less than two hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be two hundred dollars (\$200.00)

Third Class -- When the declared or nominal capital, surplus and undivided profits amount to fifty thousand dollars or more, and less than one hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00)

Fourth Class -- When the declared or nominal capital, surplus and undivided profits amount to twenty-five thousand dollars or more, and less than fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be seventy-five dollars (\$75.00)

Fifth Class -- When the declared or nominal capital, surplus and undivided profits amount to less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

The license imposed by the section shall be due and payable by each branch of a bank, banking company, trust company, association, corporation or agency operated separate and apart from the parent or principal bank, banking company, trust company, association, corporation or agency, where such branch establishment has allotted to, set apart or designated to it, a declared or nominal capital, surplus or undivided profits allotted to set apart or designated to it, shall pay the minimum license fixed in this section.

SECTION 4. That for each business of carrying on a private banking house, business or agency, the license shall be based on the total declared capital invested in said business, whether said capital is owned or in use or on deposit in the Parish, or elsewhere and shall be fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class -- When said capital is five hundred thousand dollars or more, the license shall be six hundred dollars (\$600.00).

Second Class -- When said capital is two hundred and fifty thousand or more, and under five hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be three hundred Dollars (\$300.00).

Third Class --- When said capital is one hundred and fifty thousand dollars or more, and under two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be two hundred dollars (\$200.00).

Fourth Class -- When said capital is under one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

First Class --- When said gross annual commissions are twenty-thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and eighty dollars (\$180.00).

Second Class-- When the gross annual commissions are fifteen thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and forty dollars. (\$140.00)

Third Class -- When the gross annual commissions are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Fourth Class -- When the gross annual commissions are five thousand dollars or more, and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00).

Fifth Class -- When the gross annual commissions are less than five thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Provided that if any person, firm or corporation carrying on the business designated in this section shall conduct more than one office or place of business whether in the same or under other names, such person, firm or corporation shall pay a separate license for each and every office or place of business it shall conduct according to the hereinabove classification.

Provided further, that this Ordinance shall not apply to persons, corporations or institutions carrying on banking business as provided by section three (3) of this ordinance and provided further, that this ordinance shall not apply to persons, corporations or companies lending money secured by mortgages upon real estate.

SECTION 5. That for every wholesale dealer of merchandise, not otherwise provided for by the Ordinance or by special laws whether the business be conducted by a fixed establishment or otherwise, and whether conducted as principal agent on commission or otherwise, the license shall be fixed and graded in classes and for each separate establishment where more than one such establishment is kept or conducted by the same person, firm, association or corporation there shall be separate license, as herein fixed and graded, as follows to-wit:

First Class -- When the gross sales are two hundred and fifty thousand dollars or more, and less than five hundred thousand dollars the license shall be one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00).

Second Class -- When the gross sales are one hundred and fifty thousand dollars or more and less than two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Third Class -- When the gross sales are one hundred thousand dollars or more and less than one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be seventy five dollars (\$75.00).

Fourth Class -- When the gross sales are less than one hundred

thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

Provided that no person or persons, shall be deemed wholesale dealers un-

less he or they sell by the original or unbroken package or barrel only; and provided further, that no person or persons shall be deemed wholesale dealers unless he or they sell to dealers for re-sale. If they sell in less quantities than original unbroken packages or barrel they shall be considered retail dealers and pay license as such.

SECTION 6. That for every business or selling merchandise at retail not otherwise provided by this Ordinance or by special ordinances, whether the business be conducted as principal agent on commission or otherwise, the license shall be fixed and graded in classes, and for each separate establishment, where more than one such establishment is kept and conducted by the same person, firm, association or corporation, there shall be a separate license, as herein fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class -- When the gross sales are fifty thousand dollars or more and less than seventy five thousand dollars, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00)

Second Class -- When the gross sales are forty thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00)

Third Class -- When the gross sales are thirty thousand dollars, or more, and less than forty thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty-five dollars (\$35.00)

Fourth Class -- When the gross sales are twenty-five thousand dollars or more, and less than thirty thousand dollars the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00)

Fifth Class -- When the gross sales are twenty thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Sixth Class -- When the gross sales are fifteen thousand dollars, or more, and less than twenty thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00).

Seventh Class -- When the gross sales are ten thousand dollars and less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00).

Eighth Class -- When the gross sales are five thousand dollars or more, and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00).

Ninth Class -- When the gross sales are less than five thousand dollars, the license shall be five dollars (\$5.00)

Provided that if any distilled, vinous malt or cereal drinks, ice cream confections, soda water, soda pop, coca cola, chero-cola, grape or other similar drinks or beverages, or refreshments be sold in connection with or in the same establishment with the business of retail merchant, the sale thereof shall be deemed a separate business, and a separate license shall be paid for the pursuit of such business as may be provided by this Ordinance, or by any existing laws not hereby repealed, or by subsequent laws.

Provided further, that farmers or planters having stores on their farms or plantation and selling or advancing supplies to the employees exclusively shall not be classed as merchants nor shall they be required to pay a license under this Ordinance.

Section 7. That for the business of carrying on, operating or running any horse team, gas, gasoline or electric railroad, for the transportation of passengers within the limits of the Parish of Jefferson, the annual license shall be 45-100 of one (1 p.c.) per cent of the annual gross receipts.

SECTION 8. That for carrying on each business of gas light, gas heat, or power; electric light, water works; cotton compress or ginnery; cotton pickery; slaughter house, distillery rectifying alcohol or malt liquor, brewing ale, beer, porter or other malt liquors; and for each telegraph, telephone or express business, other than those subject to license under the foreign license Ordinance or special laws, the license shall be based on the gross annual receipts, and shall be fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class -- When the gross annual receipts are one hundred thousand dollars or more, and less than one hundred and fifty thousand dollars the license shall be three hundred dollars (\$300.00).

Second Class -- When the gross receipts are seventy-five thousand dollars or more, and less than one hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be two hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$225.00).

Third Class -- When the gross receipts are fifty thousand dollars or more and less than seventy-five thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00)

Fourth Class -- When the gross annual receipts are thirty-seven thousand dollars or more, and less than fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred fifteen dollars (\$115.00).

Fifth Class -- When the gross annual receipts are twenty-five thousand dollars or more, and less than thirty seven thousand dollars, the license shall be seventy five dollars (\$75.00)

Sixth Class -- When the gross annual receipts are twenty thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00).

Seventh Class -- When the gross annual receipts are fifteen thousand dollars and less than twenty thousand dollars, the license shall be forty-five dollars (\$45.00).

Eighth Class -- When the gross annual receipts are less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Provided, that this section shall not apply to planters and farmers ginning their own cotton or that of their tenants, exclusive nor to those who gin for hire not over four hundred bales of cotton per annum.

SECTION 9. That for every business, of keeping a theatre, opera house, amphitheatre, academy of music, exhibition or moving picture, theatorium or other similar place of amusement, the license shall be based upon the gross annual receipts of said business, and shall be fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class-- When the gross annual receipts are twenty thousand

dollars or more, and less than thirty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Second Class -- When the gross annual receipts are fifteen thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty thousand dollars the license shall be seventy-five dollars (\$75.00).

Third Class-- When the gross annual receipts are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

Fourth Class-- When the gross annual receipts are five thousand dollars or more, and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty five dollars (\$25.00).

Fifth Class-- When the gross annual receipts are two thousand five hundred dollars, or more, and less than five thousand dollars, the license shall be twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50).

Sixth Class -- When the gross annual receipts are less than two thousand five hundred dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00).

Second Class-- When the number of persons is one hundred or more and less than two hundred, the license shall be six hundred dollars (\$600.00)

Third Class-- When the number of persons is seventy-five or more, and less than one hundred, the license shall be four hundred eighty dollars (\$480.00).

Fourth Class -- When the number of persons is fifty or more, and less than seventy-five, the license shall be three hundred and sixty dollars (\$360.00).

Fifth Class -- When the number of persons is thirty or more, and less than fifty, the license shall be three hundred dollars (\$300.00).

Sixth Class -- When the number of persons is twenty or more, and less than thirty, the license shall be two hundred and forty dollars (\$240.00)

Seventh Class -- When the number of persons is ten or more, and less than twenty, the license shall be one hundred and eighty dollars (\$180.00)

Eighth Class -- When the number of persons is five or more and less than ten, the license shall be one hundred and twenty dollars (\$120.00).

Ninth Class -- When the number of persons is four, the license shall be ninety dollars (\$90.00).

Tenth Class-- When the number of persons is three, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00)

Eleventh Class -- When the number of persons is two, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

Twelfth Class --- When the number is one the license shall be thirty-five dollars (\$35.00).

For every hall or balls, or entertainment not above provided for are given, the classifications for license shall be based upon the number of persons the place is capable of entertaining and the amount of the license shall be fixed and graded as follows to-wit:

First Class-- When the number of seats or spaces is two thousand or more, the license shall be two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00).

Second Class-- When the number of seats or spaces is one thousand and five hundred or more, and less than two thousand the license shall

be one hundred and ninety dollars (\$190.00).

Third Class -- When the number of seats or spaces is one thousand or more, and less than one thousand five hundred, the license shall be one hundred, and twenty five dollars (\$125.00).

Fourth Class-- When the number of seats or spaces is seven hundred fifty or more, and less than one thousand, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

SECTION 10. That for each and every peddler or hawker, other than vendors of ice, shall pay an annual license, which license is hereby fixed and graded as follows to-wit:

(a) When traveling on foot, One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). when traveling on horse back, One Hundred and Twenty Dollars (\$120.00).

When traveling in a one horse vehicle, One Hundred and fifty Dollars (\$150.00).

When traveling in a two horse vehicle, motor vehicle or truck, Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00). When traveling in any kind of water craft, Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).

(b) Provided, that any person residing in the Parish where the license is issued and selling their goods exclusively in said Parish, shall pay only one-half of the amount named in sub-section (a) as above set out.

And provided that peddlers of fresh meat, poultry, eggs, vegetables and fruits shall pay only one-fiftieth license herein stipulated, and persons when vending their own produce shall pay no license; and provided further, that no person shall be allowed to sell goods as a clerk or clerks of peddler or hawker, but that he or they must pay a license in his or their names, but that this provision shall not apply to watercraft and provided further that all parochial or municipal officers are hereby empowered and directed to cause all peddlers and hawkers to exhibit their parish license if any, and the said peddlers or hawkers failing to exhibit the same, the said officers are directed and empowered by this Act to seize said stock or merchandise and turn the same to any court of competent jurisdiction, with due information as the violation of this Act.

Provided further that said executive officers shall be entitled to receive as fees the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) in each and every case from a peddler or hawker, clerk or clerks employed by said peddler or hawker, then peddling without a license in violation of this law; the amount of ten dollars to be recovered before any court of competent jurisdiction out of the goods so seized. Provided further that no license shall be issued to any peddler or hawker for less than full rate of the current year.

For every business of restaurant, tea room, office, hotel or other eating house; whether attached to or conducted separate and apart from a hotel, boarding house or rooming house, a separate license shall be paid, and such license shall be fixed and graded as provided in Section 8 of this Act for retail dealers; but no license shall be charged for selling refreshments for charitable or religious purposes.

SECTION 11. That for keeping billiard tables, pigeonholes, Jenny Lind pool or bagatell tables; tenpin alleys, and shooting galleries from which revenue is derived, a license of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for each such

table ally or gallery shall be paid in addition to any other license due by the establishment in which tables, alleys or galleries may be situated.

SECTION 12. That all persons, association of persons, firms and corporations engaged in the sale of retail of soda water, ice cream, confections, soda pop, coca-cola, chero-cola, grapico or other similar soft drinks or beverages or refreshments shall pay a license advised on the gross annual sales and such licenses are hereby fixed and graded as follows to-wit:

First Class-- When the gross sales are six thousand dollars or more, and less than eight thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Second Class-- When the gross sales are four thousand dollars or more, and less than six thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Third Class-- When the gross sales are three thousand dollars or more, and less than four thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00).

Fourth Class-- When the gross sales are two thousand dollars or more, and less than three thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars. (\$15.00).

Fifth Class -- When the gross sales are one thousand dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00).

Sixth Class -- When the gross sales are less than one thousand dollars, the license shall be five dollars (\$5.00).

SECTION 13. That all persons, association of persons, firms or coporations engaged in the sale at wholesale, of distilled, spiritonous malt, cereal or other liquors or beverages containing any alcoholic content shall pay license based upon the gross annual sales, and each separate establishment, place, distributing station or depot from which such beverages are sold and distributed at wholesale, whether conducted as principal agent or distributor shall pay a separate license which license shall be and hereby fixed and graded, as follows to-wit:

First Class-- When the gross sales are forty thousand dollars or more, and less than fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00).

Second Class -- When the gross sales are for thirty thousand dollars or more and less than forty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$125.00).

Third Class -- When the gross sales are twenty thousand dollars or more, and less than thirty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Fourth Class -- When the gross sales are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty thousand dollars, the license shall be seventy-five dollars (\$75.00)

Fifth Class-- When the gross sales are less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00).

SECTION 14. That all persons, association of persons, firms or corporations engaged in the sale, at retail, of malt or cereal beverages containing any alcoholic content less than one half of one per cent by volume shall pay license

upon the gross annual sales, and each separate establishment at which such beverages are sold at retail whether conducted as principal agent or distributor shall pay a separate license, which licenses are hereby fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class-- When the gross annual sales are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

Second Class -- When the gross annual sales are eight thousand dollars or more, and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be forty dollars (\$40.00).

Third Class-- When the gross annual sales are six thousand dollars or more, and less than eight thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Fourth Class -- When the gross annual sales are four thousand dollars or more and less than six thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Fifth Class-- When the gross annual sales are three thousand dollars or more, and less than four thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00).

Sixth Class-- When the gross annual sales are two thousand dollars, or more, and less than three thousand dollars the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00).

Seventh Class-- When the gross annual sales are one thousand dollars or more, and less than two thousand dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00).

Eighth Class-- When the gross annual sales are less than one thousand dollars, the license shall be five dollars (\$5.00).

Nothing in this Act contained shall be construed to authorize the issuance of a license for the sale of any liquor or beverage the sale of which is prohibited by the law or Ordinance of the United States or of the State of Louisiana or of any municipality or other subdivision thereof.

Provided that a person, association, firm or corporation engaged in the business mentioned in this Section and having a proper license, may sell in connection with said business any of the commodities mentioned in Section 21, of this Act without paying a separate license, but the total sales from such combined business shall determine the amount of license to be paid according to the classifications in this Section.

SECTION 15. That every individual, firm, company or corporation carrying on the profession or business of contractor, shall pay license based upon the gross annual receipts of said business, while licenses shall be fixed and graded as follows to-wit:

First Class -- When the gross receipts are twenty five thousand dollars or more, and less than fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Second Class-- When the gross receipts are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty five thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00)

Third Class-- When the gross receipts are less than ten thousand dollars the license shall be twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50)

Provided that every individual firm, company or corporation carrying on the business or profession of master builder or merchant who employs

assistance, where building is done for others on a cost plus basis, commission or percentage plan shall pay a license based upon the annual earnings from the business which license shall be fixed and graded as provided in Section 5 of this Act for carrying on a commission or brokerage business.

SECTION 16. That every individual, firm, association or corporation carrying on the profession or business of keeping cabs, hacks, horses, or motor vehicles for homes, undertaker, funeral director, agency for steamboats or steamships and owners or lessees of toll bridges or ferries, stevedores and to be engaged in the business or profession of bill posting, tacking or advertising, the license shall be based upon the gross annual receipts from such profession or business and shall be fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class -- When the gross annual receipts are six thousand dollars, or more and less than eight thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

Second Class -- When the gross annual receipts are five thousand dollars or more, and less than six thousand dollars the license shall be thirty seven dollars and fifty cents (\$37.50).

Third Class-- When the gross annual receipts are four thousand dollars or more, and less than five thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Fourth Class -- When the gross annual receipts are three thousand dollars or more, and less than four thousand dollars the license shall be twenty five dollars (\$25.00).

Fifth Class-- When the gross annual receipts are two thousand dollars or more, and less than three thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00).

Sixth Class -- When the gross annual receipts are one thousand dollars or more, and less than two thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars

(\$15.00).

Seventh Class -- When the gross annual receipts are seven hundred and fifty dollars or more, and less than one thousand dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00).

Eighth Class-- When the gross annual receipts are less than seven hundred and fifty dollars, the license shall be five dollars (\$5.00).

That any other business not provided for in this Ordinance not otherwise provided for by a separate law, except manufacturing, shall be graduated the same as above set forth, and shall pay a license as fixed in this Section.

That every individual, firm, association or corporation carrying on the business or profession of physician, osteopath, dentist, oculist, attorney-at-law, editor, publisher, printer, engraver, lithographer, photographer, architect, civil engineer, mechanical engineer, electrical engineer, decorator, jeweler, or any other professional occupation shall be graded according to the classifications named above, but the license for the various professions included in this paragraph shall be one half of those established by the foregoing provisions of this Section; provided that no license shall be issued hereunder for less than five dollars (\$5.00).

SECTION- 17. That every individual, firm, association, corporation, carrying on profession or business of steam dying, steam cleaning, steam pressing, or the business of electric laundering, the license shall be based upon the gross annual receipts from that profession or business, and shall be fixed and graded as follows; to wit:

First Class-- When the gross annual receipts are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than twelve thousand dollars, the license shall be forty dollars (\$40.00).

Second Class-- When the gross annual receipts are eight thousand dollars or more, and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars, (\$30.00).

Third Class-- When the gross annual receipts are six thousand dollars or more, and less than eight thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Fourth Class-- When the receipts are five thousand dollars or less, the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00).

To levy, collect and enforce payment of a license tax upon all persons association of persons, business firms, partnerships, corporations, engaged or pursuing business whereby dogs are run for purses, and or where any entrance fee is charged for the dogs racing, with certain exceptions; and prescribing the mode and method by which said license tax shall be collected; and providing a penalty for violations thereof, and repealing all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith.

Section 1. Be it Ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson,

That there be and is hereby levied a license tax upon such persons, association or persons, or business firm, partnership or corporation, engaged in or pursuing any business whereby dogs are run for purses or where entrance fee is charged for the entrance of said dogs in a race for each and every race track so operated which said license shall be graduated upon the daily receipts from admissions paid by spectators and entrance fees charged for the entrance of the said dogs in the said race, as follows:

First Class -- When paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for dogs racing amount to \$10,000.00 or more per day, the license shall be \$200.00 per day, for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Second Class-- When paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for dogs racing amount to \$5,000.00 or more and less than \$10,000.00, the license tax shall be \$150.00 per day for time or duration of the race meeting.

Third Class-- When the said paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for dogs racing amount to less than \$5,000.00, the license tax shall be \$100.00 per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Section 2. That the aforesaid license tax shall be collected by the constituted authority charged with the collection of license due to the State.

Section 3. That the minimum license tax herein provided shall be paid in advance and to the constituted authority charged with the collection thereof, and no race shall be run unless same is paid, under penalty herein provided and the balance of said license tax, if any, shall be paid before 3 o'clock P.M. on the following day, the collection thereof to be in accordance with the herein provided graduated schedule No. 1, and that this license tax shall become due and owing on each and every

day that the said races are run and shall become delinquent on the following day, and it is hereby made the duty of the District Attorney of this Parish to enforce collection of this said license tax, and for the services rendered in such collection, he shall be entitled to 20 per cent over and above the amount of license collected from the delinquent debtor, as attorney's fees which said attorney's fees shall be paid by the said delinquent license debtor and shall be assessed as costs in case of suit.

SECTION 4. That all suits for the collection of this license tax shall be summary and be tried in accordance with the law in force for the collection of delinquent licenses or taxes.

SECTION 5. That the amount of tax due by the aforesaid person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporations, engaged in the aforesaid business shall be determined as follows:

The daily receipts of the paid admissions and entrance charge for the entrance of the said dogs in the said races for the said day shall be added and totalled up and then the license tax calculated thereon in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of the Act.

SECTION 6. That the provisions of this Act shall not apply to an association of persons or corporations engaged in holding or conducting a fair solely for the purpose of exhibiting agricultural or manufactured products or natural resources looking toward the advancement of the agricultural or manufactural interest or the development of the natural resources in the said parish; where said dogs racing is conducted as an auxiliary sport and as an incident for amusement and entertainment and not for the purpose of profit, provided that said fairs so conducted shall not be for a longer period than 14 days.

SECTION 7. That any person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporations conducting or operating a race track or races in contravention of the provisions of this Act without having first paid said license tax as aforesaid shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.00 and not less than \$25.00 by imprisonment of not more than twenty days and not less than 10 days in the parish jail or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court, provided that in case the violator be an association, firm or corporation, the managing officers and agents thereof shall be punishable by such fine or imprisonment, provided that such fine and imprisonment shall not be construed as relieving said violator from said license tax.

SECTION 8. That all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith be, and the same are hereby repealed.

Roll being called to vote on the adoption of the above Ordinance, resulted as follows:

AN ORDINANCE

To levy, and collect and enforce payment of a license tax upon all persons association of persons, or business firm, partnerships, or corporation, engaged in or pursuing any business whereby horses are run

for purses, and or where any entrance fee is charged for the horses racing with certain exceptions; and prescribing the mode and method by which said license tax shall be collected; and providing a penalty for violations thereof and repealing all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, That there be and is hereby levied a license tax upon each person, association of persons, or business firm, partnership or corporation, engaged in or pursuing any business whereby horses are run for purses or where any entrance fee is charged for the entrance of said horses in a race, for each and every race track so operated, which said license shall be graduated upon daily receipts from admissions paid by spectators and entrance fees charged for the entrance of the said horses in the said race as follows:

First Class-- When the said admissions by spectators and entrance fees for horses racing amount to ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) or more per day, the license shall be six hundred dollars (\$600.00) per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Second Class-- When the said paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for the horses racing, amount to seventy five hundred dollars (\$7,500.00) and less than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) the license tax shall be five hundred dollars (\$500.00) per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Third Class-- When the said paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for the horses racing amount to five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) and less than seventy five hundred (\$7,500.00) per day, the license shall be three hundred and fifty (\$350.00) dollars per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Fourth Class-- When the said paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for the horses racing amount to less than five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) per day, the license shall be two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Section 2. The aforesaid license tax shall be collected by the constituted authority charged with the collection of licenses due to the State.

Section 3. That the minimum license tax herein provided shall be paid in advance daily to the constituted authority charged with the collection hereof and no race shall be run unless same is paid, under penalty herein provided, and the balance of said license tax, if any, shall be paid before 3 o'clock P.M. on the following day, the calculation thereof to be in accordance with the herein provided graduated schedule in Section No. 1, and that this license tax shall become due and owing on each and every day that the said races are run, and shall become delinquent on the following day, and it is hereby made the duty of the District Attorney of this Parish to enforce the collection of this said license tax, and for the services rendered in such collection, he shall be entitled to 20 per cent over and above the amount of the license collected from the delinquent debtors, as attorney's fees which said attorney's fees shall be paid by the said delinquent license debtor, and shall be assessed as costs in case of suit.

SECTION 4. That all suits or rules for the collection of this license tax shall be summary and be tried in accordance with the law in force for the collection of delinquent licenses or taxes.

SECTION 5. That the amount of tax due by the aforesaid person,

association of persons, business firms, partnerships, or corporations engaged in the aforesaid business shall be determined as follows:

The daily receipts of the paid admissions and entrance fee charged for the entrance of the said horses in the said races for the said day shall be added and totalled up and then the license tax calculated in accordance thereon with the provisions of Section 1 of this Act.

SECTION 6. That the provisions of this act shall not apply to association of persons, or corporations engaged in holding or conducting a fair solely for the purpose of exhibiting agricultural or manufacturing products or natural resources looking toward the advancement of the agricultural and manufacturing interest or the development of the natural resources in the said parish, where said horse racing is conducted as an auxiliary sport, as an incident for amusement and entertainment, and not for the purpose of profit, provided that said fairs so conducted shall not be for a longer period than 14 days.

SECTION 7. That any person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporation conducting or operating a race track or races in contravention of the provisions of this Act without having first paid said license tax as afore said, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.00 and not less than \$25.00 or by imprisonment of not more than 30 days and not less than 10 days in the parish jail, or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court, provided that in case the violator be an association, firm or corporation, the managing officers and agents thereof shall be punishable by such fine or imprisonment and provided that such fine and imprisonment shall not be construed as relieving said violator of said license tax.

SECTION 8. That all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith be and the same is hereby repealed.

Roll being called to vote on the adoption of the above Resolution, resulted as follows:

YEAS -- Teoldano, Quinn, Strehle, Dauenhauer, Cantrelle, Ottermann, Dumestre

NAYS- None.

SECTION 18. That the annual receipts, capital, sales, premiums, commissions, earnings in this Ordinance referred to as a basis of license are those for the year for which the license is granted; The standard for their estimation shall be prima facie of the preceding year if the business has been conducted previously by the same party or parties to whom they claim to be successors. If the firm or company be new the amount of gross sales for the first two months be estimated as the annual receipts of such business, provided that any person commencing business after the first of July, peddlers, hawkers, and traveling shows excepted shall pay one half of the above rates.

SECTION 19. That the business of the previous year, as also the actual condition and results of business of the current year, for the new firms, association, corporations for the purpose of calculating

licenses, shall be ascertained by the tax collector in the sworn statement of the person or persons in interest his or their duly authorized agent or officer, made before the tax collector be not satisfied with the said sworn statement, he shall traverse the same by a rule taken in proper court which rule shall be tried summarily whether an answer be thereto filed or not. On trial of said rule, the books and written entries and memoranda of said person or persons, firms, companies or parties shall be brought into court and subjected to the inspection and examination of the court, the officer who took the rule, and such experts as he may employ or the court may appoint; provided, that this inspection shall not be construed as entitling the defendant to introduce in evidence said books and documents any more than he would have been without such inspection, provided, also that the license shall issue in accordance with the said sworn statement, notwithstanding the prospect of pendency of the rule, the final ratification shall be made as ordered by the court.

In addition to the duties and powers herein imposed upon and vested in tax collectors, the Supervisor of public accounts shall have authority to review and examine any sworn statements or accounts that may have been or may be rendered or furnished in pursuance of the provisions of this Act; and he shall have authority to demand and examine the books, statements and accounts of any persons, firms, association or corporation from which a license may be due under the provisions of this Act; and to take such proceedings before any court of competent jurisdiction by rule or otherwise, against the tax collector or against any person, firm association or corporation from whom a license may be due, as may be necessary to enforce a full and fair compliance with the provisions of this Act.

SECTION 20. That if any business shall be conducted without a license, in case herein provided, the officer whose duty it is to issue license shall through the attorney herein provided for, on motion in the proper courts as provided in the Constitution, and which shall be without deposit or advance cost, take a rule on the party or parties doing such business to show cause on the fifth day exclusive, or holidays, after the service thereof, which may be tried out of term time and in chambers, and shall always be tried by preference why said party or parties should not pay the amount of license claimed and penalties or be ordered to cease from further pursuit of said business until after having attained a license and in case said rule is made absolute the order thereon rendered shall be considered a judgment in favor of the State, for the amount decreed to be due by the defendant for license and penalty and cost heretofore and hereinafter provided for, shall be executed in the same manner as other judgments and every violation of the order shall be considered as a contempt thereof, and punished according to law.

It is hereby expressly provided that each person, association of persons, business firm, or corporation required to take out a license under this Act shall be required to post the same in a conspicuous place in his or their place of business, under a penalty of not less than ten or more than one hundred dollars recoverable by the tax collection before any court of competent jurisdiction and it shall be the duty of the several tax collectors throughout the state to visit in person or by deputies the several places of business herein mentioned and ascertain that the provisions of this section are strictly carried out.

SECTION-21. That the only legal evidence that a license has been paid shall be the appropriate form of license issued by the Auditor of Public Accounts, and no receipts issued by a tax collector in place of the

license itself shall be, valid and this clause shall be construed to prevent the tax collectors from issuing a receipt, in lieu of the appropriate form to any person, association of persons, business corporations; provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed so as to exclude oral evidence of loss or destroyed licenses.

SECTION 22. That the ex-officio tax collector shall prepare and keep a

book in which they shall record or file the statements made under oath of all persons, associations of persons, business firms or corporations, who may apply for license to pursue any trade, professions, vocations, calling or business under this ordinance.

SECTION 23. That the ex-officio tax collector charged with the collection of taxes are hereby to administer oath to any person, president or proper official or agent of any association of persons, business firms, or corporations applying for license under this Ordinance; and any tax collector of ex-officio tax collector as aforesaid or any notary public or other officer of the Parish empowered to administer oaths who shall sign any part or certify to any oath with out administering the oath in person to the applicant and having the applicant sign the oath in his presence, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction shall be subject to a fine of not less than one hundred dollars nor more than one thousand dollars or imprisonment of not less than thirty days nor more than ninety days or both in the discretion of the court. That when the oath is taken before the collector, no charge shall be made for same. Any false swearing as to the gross receipts of any person or persons, or corporations through their president, or proper officer or agent, applying for license shall constitute the crime of perjury, to be punished as directed by existing criminal laws of the Parish. All licenses shall be paid in the parish wherein is situated or conducted the business for which the license is due.

Where an individual is applicant for license the affidavit must be taken in person; where a partnership, by a member of the firm, and where a corporation by the proper officer thereof. But in the absence from the parish of the individuals the member of the firm or the proper officer of the corporation same may be taken by a competent agent, on personal knowledge of the fact, to be made to appear in the body of the affidavit.

SECTION 24. That the tax collectors and ex-officio tax collectors are hereby required to keep a license register, in which they shall enter the names of every person, association of persons, business firm or corporation which the trade, profession, vocation, calling or business pursued, the class and graduation of the same, the amount of the license thereon, and the date of the collection or payment thereof. On July 1st of each and every year the said collectors shall make and forward to the Auditor of Public Accounts a full and complete transcript of said license register, showing all licenses collected during the preceding six months. A similar transcript shall be filed by them on December 31st of each and every year showing all licenses collected during the second half of the year. The Auditor of Public Accounts shall lay a copy of these transcripts before the General Assembly at each regular session,

the originals of which he shall file in his office for future reference or use.

SECTION 25. That the ex-officio tax collector violating any of the provisions of this ordinance or who shall wilfully rate any person, association of persons, or business firms or corporations at a less graduation than the law contemplates, or who shall issue to any said person, association of persons, or business firms or corporation a license less sum than that corresponding with their graduation shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor in office, and shall on conviction before a competent authority be summarily dismissed therefrom.

SECTION 26. That the Governor of the State shall designate for each parish including the Parish of Orleans, an attorney-at-law, whose duty it shall be to aid the tax collector or ex-officio tax collector in the parish for which he is appointed in the collection of the State and parish licenses provided by this Act. and upon all licenses and penalties collected through the agency of the said attorney, the delinquent owing the licenses shall pay a commission to him of ten per cent centum, calculating same upon the aggregate amount of licenses and penalties so collected and paid over to the tax collector. The said attorney shall receive no other compensation. The attorney so appointed shall serve during good behavior and shall be liable to be summarily removed by the Governor for good and sufficient cause. It shall be the duty of the district attorneys of the parishes to represent the tax collectors of said parishes in the collection of delinquent license or in case the attorney so appointed refuses to act.

On the second day of March of each year the tax collector or ex-officio tax collector shall deliver to the attorneys herein provided for, a complete list of all delinquent license payers, together with their location and kind of business, and the attorney shall immediately proceed to collect same in accordance with this ordinance, and if not collected within thirty days from the date of delivery of the list by the collector of taxes or ex-officio collector of taxes, it shall be the duty of said attorneys to render a written report giving the reasons for non-collection to the collectors, whose duty it shall be to forward such report to the Auditor of Public Accounts. Provided that the Attorneys herein provided for clerks of courts, sheriffs, constables, or other officers, shall receive no compensation commission, salary, docket fee or fees for services rendered in any suit or action for the collection of licenses under the provisions of this Act in which said tax collector or ex-officio tax collector has failed to obtain full and complete satisfaction and payment of any judgement in favor of the State of Louisiana; and provided further that said attorneys, clerks of court, sheriffs, constables or other officers shall receive no compensation, commission, salary, docket fee or fees for services rendered in any suit or action for the collection of licenses under the provisions of this Act in which the said tax collector or ex-officio tax collector has failed to obtain full and complete satisfaction and payment of any judgement in favor of the State of Louisiana and provided further, that said attorneys, clerks of court, sheriffs, constables or other officers shall receive no compensation in any license suit for services rendered in which judgment has been rendered against said tax collector, or ex-officio tax collector of the State of Louisiana.

SECTION 27. That if any tax collector or officer, whose duty it is to issue state licenses shall, through incompetency, negligence or fault on his own part, fail to collect licenses in the proper amounts from those

by whom they are due, he shall be responsible on his bond for all losses to the State arising therefrom.

SECTION 28. That all unpaid licenses shall bear interest at the rate of two per cent per month from the first day of March and the payment thereon shall be secured by first lien and privilege in favor of the state upon the property

movable and immovable, of the delinquent or in the license, and the tax collector or ex-officio tax collector shall collect said license and interest in the manner prescribed by existing laws.

SECTION 29. That all gross receipts derived from any mercantile business or occupation whatsoever, as hereinbefore provided, whether earned within or without the state, shall form the proper basis upon which all licenses shall be assessed and collected by tax collectors.

SECTION 30. That a person, firm or company, having more than one place of business shall pay a separate license for each place of business.

SECTION 31. That the Police Jury shall designate the same attorney to represent the tax collector of the Parish of Jefferson as has been appointed by the Governor of the State, to represent the tax collector for the Parish of Jefferson, and he shall receive the same compensation for his services as is provided by the Act 205 of 1924, Section 39.

On the second day of March of each year the tax collector or ex-officio tax collector shall deliver to the attorneys therein provided for a complete list of all delinquent license payers, together with their location and kind of business and the attorney shall immediately proceed to collect same in accordance with ordinance.

SECTION 32. That if any tax collector or officer, whose duty it is to issue parish license, shall, through incompetency, negligence or fault on his part, fail to collect licenses in the proper amounts from those by whom they are due, he shall be responsible on his bond for all losses to the parish arising therefrom.

SECTION 33. That all unpaid license shall bear interest at the rate of two (2) per cent per month from the first day of March, and the payment thereon shall be secured by first lien and privilege in favor of the Parish of Jefferson upon the property movable and immovable, of the delinquent owing the licenses, and the tax collector or ex-officio tax collector shall collect said license and interest in the manner prescribed by existing laws.

SECTION 34. That all gross receipts derived from any mercantile business or occupation whatsoever, as hereinbefore provided, whether earned within or without the Parish of Jefferson, shall form the proper basis upon which all licenses shall be assessed and collected by tax collector.

SECTION 35. That a person firm or company having more than one place of business shall pay a separate license for each place of business.

Regulating the Laying out of Subdivision and
Resubdivision in accordance with the provisions of
Act No. 234 of the Legislature of the State of Louisiana
of 1928.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF
THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON

That no person, firm or corporation, owning or leasing any tract of land, or portion thereof, shall subdivide the same into portions, of any size, shape or form without first having submitted said plan of subdivision of said tract of land, or portion thereof to, and obtaining the approval thereof, by the Parish Engineer of the Parish of Jefferson; and provided further, that the said plan of subdivision shall likewise first be submitted to, and approved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that no person, firm or corporation owning or leasing any square of ground, or any portion of a square of ground, which is regularly bounded, measured, and defined by the established streets of the Parish of Jefferson, shall subdivide said square of ground, or any portion of such a square by means of the establishing or creation of private avenues, streets, or alleyways through said square of ground or any portion of such a square for the purpose of selling or leasing such portions of said square of ground, or portion of a square of ground, which are established or created by such private avenues, streets or alleyways, and abutting thereon, without having first submitted said plan of subdivision of said square of ground or portion of such a square of ground to, and obtaining thereon, the approval of the Parish Engineer of the Parish of Jefferson, and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson; it being the intention of this section that no person, firm or corporation, owning or leasing a square of ground as defined in this section, or portion of such a square shall so subdivide

the same into portions by the establishing or creation of private avenues, streets or alleyways through such squares, or portion of a square of ground, for the purpose of creating a residential or business area, or a combination of both, without such plan or subdivision having been first inspected and approved by the Parish Engineer of the Parish of Jefferson and by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that no plan of subdivision of any tract of land, square of ground, or any portion of either, shall be valid unless the avenues, streets, alleyways, and neutral grounds shown on such plans of sub-division shall be formally dedicated to public use by notarial act, properly recorded, by the person, firm or corporation seeking to make such subdivision and such dedication approved by the District Attorney of the Parish of Jefferson, and provided further that all such plans of subdivision shall be first submitted in triplicate to the officials whose approval thereof is made necessary by this ordinance, and who shall inscribe their approval thereon, one copy of which shall be annexed to the notarial act of dedication, and the other shall be filed with the Police Jury as part of the ordinance accepting such dedication, as provided in Section 4, of this ordinance, and the third copy shall be filed in the office of the Parish Engineer. All such plans of subdivisions shall show the measurements and designations of each individual portion of ground; and all boundary marks, or corners of the original tract of land, or square of ground, or portion of square to be subdivided, and all new avenues, streets, or alleyways and intersections created by the new subdivision, shall be properly monumented by iron pipe or in any other permanent manner. Said plans of subdivision shall also show all existing street in intersections within five hundred feet of any side of these proposed subdivisions.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that no plan of subdivision of any tract of land, square of ground, or any portion of either, located within the Parish of Jefferson shall be valid, unless the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson shall, by proper ordinance, accept the dedication made of the avenues, streets, alleys, neutral grounds and parks shown on the plan of subdivision of said property; and the police jury shall not grant such acceptance until the said plans of subdivision have been approved by the various officials whose approval is required by this ordinance; and unless it appears by proper evidence filed with the Police Jury that the person, firm or corporation making such subdivision have made proper arrangements for the improvements and maintenance of such avenues, streets, alleyways, neutral grounds and parks as shall be required by the Police Jury, subject to the inspection of the Parish Engineer of the Parish of Jefferson and the members of the Police Jury appointed to make such inspection.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that this ordinance shall take effect from the date of its adoption and passage.

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor, and upon the conviction thereon shall be fined not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00 or shall be imprisoned in the Parish Jail for a term of not less than ten days nor more than thirty days, or both such fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the Court.

WHEREAS, the City of Gretna and the Parish of Jefferson are desirous of continuing said 11th Street in the direction of McDonoghville and across said tract of land owned by said Brooklyn Land Company, and

WHEREAS, the said Brooklyn Land Company is willing to facilitate said City of Gretna and Parish of Jefferson in the construction of said street or road and has informed his Honor, Dr. Chas. F. Golbko, Mayor of the City of Gretna, and W. E. Strehle, Members of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, Second Ward, that said Company will grant to the City of Gretna, and the Parish of Jefferson a right of way 10 feet in width for the construction of said street or road across said tract of land upon certain conditions more fully set forth in letters addressed to them, and

WHEREAS, the City of Gretna, has by ordinance duly adopted on December 4, 1928 to-wit: Ordinance No. 400, ordaining that said 11th street shall be continued as a street to right angles across the property of said Brooklyn Land Company and as a street or road up to the easterly limits of the City of Gretna.

NOW, therefore, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON that said street or road, continuing said 11th street, shall be continued as a street or road by the Parish of Jefferson, from the point there it terminates at the eastern limits of the City of Gretna, across said tract of land of said Land Company in the direction of McDonoghville, and that for the purpose of constructing such street or road, a right of way 100 ft. in width granted to the Parish of Jefferson by the said Brooklyn Land Company, for the consideration hereinafter set forth, and such right of way is hereby accepted for said purpose and upon such terms and conditions.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that the Parish of Jefferson shall build a standard gravel or shell road or street upon said right of way according to specifications approved by the Highway Commission, within three years from the date of this ordinance, and in any event not later than January 1, 1932; all necessary culverts to facilitate drainage across said land or street to conform to the existing drains to be constructed by said PARISH OF JEFFERSON.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that the said Brooklyn Land Company shall not be called upon to bear any of the costs of construction of said road or street in any manner whatsoever, or to pay any taxes of any kind or nature or local

assessment upon right-of-way and it is hereby further ordained that said Brooklyn Land Company shall not be called on within a period of ten years from the date of the completion of said gravel or shell road or street to contribute to or bear any expense for the paying of said road or street with asphalt or concrete or any other hard surface.

BE IT FURTHER ORADINED, etc., that should said road or street not be constructed within said period of three years, or should such road or street be discontinued as a public road or street and closed at any future time, or should any attempt be made to use for any other purpose than a public road or street, the land across which the right of way is granted by Brooklyn Land Company entirely free of any servitude or right of way or any other encumboance or right of and character in the said Parish of Jefferson.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the President of the Police Jury of said Parish of Jefferson be and is hereby authorized and empowered to sign and execute on behalf of the Parish of Jefferson, any and all Acts accepting the grant of said right of way from said Brooklyn Land Comapny and agreeing to the terms and conditions hereinabove set forth, and generally to do and prfrom all acts incidents to carrying out the purposes of the foregoing ordinance.

Strehle, Members of the Police Jury of said Parish of Jefferson, Second Ward, that said company will grant to the City of Gretna and the Parish of Jefferson a right of way 100 ft. in width for the continuation of said street or road across said tract of land upon certain conditions more full set forth in letter addressed to them and

WHEREAS, The City of Gretna has by ordinance duly adopted on December 4, 1928 to-wit: Ordinance No. 400, ordaining that said 11th Street shall be continued as a street at right angles across the property of said Mrs. L. R. Stumpf et als and as a street or road up to the easterly limits of the City of Gretna,

Now, Therefore, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON that said Street or road, Continuing said 11th street shall

continue as a street or road by the Parish of Jefferson from the point where it terminated at the eastern limits of the City of Gretna, across said tract of land of said Mrs. L. R. Stumpf in the direction of McDonoghville and to the side line of said property nearest to McDonoghville, and that for the purpose of constructing such street or road right of way 100ft. in width be granted to the Parish of Jefferson by said Mrs. L. R. Stumpf et als for the consideration heroinafter set forth and such right of way is hereby accepted for said purpose and upon such terms and conditions.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the Parish of Jefferson shall build a Standard gravel or shell road or street upon said right of way according to specifications approved by the Highway Commission within three years from the date of this ordinance and in any event not later than January 1, 1932; all necessary culverts to facilitate drainage across said road or street conform to the existing drainage and to be constructed by said Parish of Jefferson.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that the said Mrs. L. R. Stumpf et als shall not be called upon to bear any of the costs of constructing said road or street in any manner, whatsoever, or to pay any taxes of any kind or nature or local assessment upon Said right of way, and is hereby further agreed that said Mrs. L. R. Stumpf et als shall not be called on within a period of ten years from the date of the completion of said gravel or shell road or street to contribute to or bear any expense for the paving of said road or street with asphalt or any other hard surface.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that should said road or street not be constructed within said period of three years, or should such road or street be discontinued as a public road or street and closed at any future time, or should any attempt be made to use, for any other purpose than a public road or street, the land across which the right of way is granted by said Mrs. L. R. Stumpf et als, then such land shall revert to Mrs. L. R. Stumpf et als entirely free of any seritudes or right of way or any other encumbrance or right of any character in the Parish of Jefferson.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED etc., that the President of the Police Jury of said Parish of Jefferson be and is hereby authorized and empowered to sign and execute on behalf of the Parish of Jefferson, any and all Acts accepting the said right of way from said Mrs. L. Same having been referred to the oil commission by the Jury November 14, 1928 for investigation and approval of plan.

REPORT OF OIL COMMISSION

The Oil Commission composed of Robert Ottermann, E. Abadie and A. Carbo, make its report through Mr. Ottermann, its chairman, which was to the effect that the Commission approved the plan submitted for the erection of said Refinery, provided it did not increase the Insurance Rates on the property in the vicinity, and that grantee in the construction of said Refinery, would use the most modern methods and machinery made to eliminate as much as possible the odor that emanates from said plant.

Mr. J. H. Payne, Parish Engineer, reported that he had inspected the plan of the proposed plant, and had checked same with the regulations of the National Board of Fire Underwriters, and found same to conform with said regulation, after making certain minor corrections.

The applicant filed with the Jury a petition numerously signed by property holders in the vicinity of said oil refinery, approve the construction and operation of proposed oil refinery under the provisions above outlined by the oil commission, and

On motion of Mr. Ottermann, seconded by Mr. Petit, the following Resolution was adopted.

BE IT RESOLVED that the application of Sam Corniglia for permit to construct and operate an oil refinery in the 7th Ward be and is hereby granted with the right of assigning to any corporation which he may hereafter organize to construct said oil refinery according to plans filed with this Jury, provided the distance between the storage tanks marked A. C. and D. on the plan with this Jury be increased from fifty to sixty feet and that the construction of said plant would use the most modern methods and machinery made to eliminate as much as possible the odor that emanates from said plant, provided further that approval of the Louisiana Fire Prevention Bureau be obtained and filed with this Jury.

Mr. A. Booth addressed the Jury in regards to the construction of a protection levee on the dividing line of the City of New Orleans and the Parish of Jefferson and opposed the action taken by the Orleans Levee Board at a recent meeting held Friday December, 28, 1928, authorizing its Engineers to appropriate a strip of land in the Parish of Jefferson on the East Bank of the Mississippi River for the construction of a so called Protection Levee, request that the Jury adopted Resolutions opposing same, and

On motion of Mr. Ottermann, seconded by Mr. Fisher, the following Resolution was adopted.

WHEREAS, the Orleans Levee Board has on Friday 28th, 1928 passed a Resolution authorizing its Engineers to "appropriate" a certain strip of land in Jefferson Parish from Claiborne Avenue, to the pumping Station lying just across

and above the line that separates upper Orleans Parish from Jefferson Parish.

WHEREAS, the action of said Orleans Levee Board in attempting to "appropriate" said strip of land is arbitrary, unreasonable and illegal, and

WHEREAS, the United States Government has already begun to lay its plans to construct a \$30,000,000.00 Spillway about 30 miles above this contemplated project, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to a recent act of the Louisiana Legislature, there was created a Louisiana Flood Control Commission and which Commission was duly convened and organized in the City of New Orleans on yesterday and

WHEREAS, said Louisiana Flood Control Commission was vested with full power in all flood Control.

WHEREAS, the Construction at this time of the contemplation and so called protection levee by the Orleans Levee Board would be a serious menace to the future development of that section of property situated in the Parish of Jefferson and lying on the East Bank of the Mississippi River, and

WHEREAS, there has been no co-ordination of its contemplated construction with the Louisiana Flood Control Committee and with the Commissions Engineers in charge of the Work being done in its near vicinity by the United States Government, and

THEREFORE, we the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson do protest.

1. The unwarranted action of the Orleans Board in its attempt to "appropriate" any property in Jefferson Parish for the purpose aforesaid.

2. That it would be premature for the construction of this Levee at this time in view of the known plans of the United States Government in constructing within a few miles of its proposed location a gigantic spillway costing over \$30,000,000,00

3. That there is really no reason for the expenditure of the large amount of the tax payers money that will be necessary to build this levee when the main levee itself could be properly constructed.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this unwarranted action of the Orleans Levee Board should be given full publicity and that there should be held two mass meetings of the people of Jefferson Parish, situated on the Left Bank of the Mississippi River, one to be held at the Metairie High School and one at the High School located in the 7th ward for the purpose of protesting the action of the said Orleans Levee Board and that the following named members be appointed on a Committee to have charge of the holding of said mass meetings.

Section 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, in regular meeting assembled and convened, that the necessity thereof having been made to appear to this Police Jury, that a Waterworks District should be created in the Hereinafter described territory.

Section 2. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, that a Waterworks District to be known as the east Jefferson Waterworks District Number One and same is hereby created and formed of the following territory, to-wit:

Commencing at a point on the Mississippi River the line dividing St. Charles Parish From Jefferson Parish and from the said point of beginning along the East of the Mississippi River to a point intersecting and dividing the Parish of Orleans, from the Parish of Jefferson, and from said point in a Northerly direction along the line dividing the Parish of Orleans from the Parish of Jefferson to a point on the shore of Lake Pontchartrain dividing the Parish of Orleans, from the Parish of Jefferson thence along the shores of Lake Pontchartrain to a point on the shores of Lake Pontchartrain being the line dividing the Parish of St. Charles from the Parish of Jefferson thence along the line dividing the Parish of

Water District created in the 7-8-9 ward

St. Charles from the Parish of Jefferson in a Southerly direction to the point of beginning on the Mississippi River.

Section 3. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that the said Waterworks District Number One shall be known as the East Jefferson Waterworks District Number One and is hereby created and formed under the Constitution of the State of Louisiana and the provision of Act Number 343 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1926.

Section 4. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, that Messrs. Numa E. Guillotte, John Hodgson and Gus L. Powell be and they are hereby appointed as the first Waterworks Commissioners of the said East Jefferson Waterworks District Number One, their terms of office to be determined by lot in accordance with the provisions of Section 3, of Act 343 of the Acts of 1926, and after the appointment of two other commissioners by the Governor of the State of Louisiana.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., That the town of Kenner, in this Parish and State, shall be the domicile of the said East Jefferson Waterworks District Number One and that on March 6, 1929, at the hour of 7:00 P. M. the said Commissioners appointed and members of said East Jefferson Waterworks District Number One shall meet at the said domicile and shall then and there draw lots to determine the duration of their respective terms of office and shall perfect their said organization all as provided for by Act 343 of the General Assembly for the year 1926.

Section 6. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., That all ordinances, or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith and especially the Ordinance of the Police Jury adopted on the 16th day of May 1928 be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in special meeting assembled that it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to hereafter subdivide into town lots or lay off public roads or streets or

sell land with reference to a plan of subdivision until permission has been first obtained from the Parish Engineer of the Parish of Jefferson.

SECTION 11. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that all persons seeking permission to subdivide lands into town lots shall first submit a copy of the plan of subdivision to the Engineer of the Parish of Jefferson, and it shall be the duty of the Engineer of the Parish of Jefferson to examine said plan of subdivision in connection to adjoining properties in order that all new roads and streets on said plan of subdivision shall connect with existing roads and streets and said roads or streets shall not be placed at a greater distance than Six Hundred (600) Feet apart, unless ordered to connect with existing roads or streets.

SECTION 111. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all persons at the time of filing applications for approval with the Parish Engineer shall at the time submit in writing the contemplated improvements by placing in said subdivision relative to side walks, streets and drainage, and the Police Jury reserves the right to refrain from maintaining any public roads or streets that may be laid out and which roads or streets are not graveled, paved or hard surfaced by the promoters of the said subdivision, and no responsibility will be assumed by the Police Jury for the maintenance of said streets, unless they are turned over to the Parish in good condition.

SECTION IV. BE IT ORDAINED, etc., that the Parish Engineer shall be allowed a fee not to exceed \$50.00 Dollars for inspecting all plans of subdivisions submitted to him, said fee to be paid at the time of the filing of application with the Parish Engineer.

SECTION V. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that the Parish Engineer shall have a right to approve the plan of subdivision to him or to reject said plan and should said plan be rejected then the applicant shall have a right to appeal to the Police Jury and after due hearing the Police Jury may approve or reject said plan or order changes to be made to suit the conditions existing in the location of the lands relative to roads, streets and drainage.

SECTION VI. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of misdemeanor.

and upon conviction before any court of competent jurisdiction shall be liable to a fine not exceeding One Hundred (\$100.00) DOLLARS or imprisonment not exceeding THIRTY (30) days, or both at the discretion of the court.

Section 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON That no person, firm or corporation, owning or leasing any tract of land, or portion thereof, shall subdivide the same into portions, of any size, shape or form without first having submitted said plan of subdivision of said tract of land, or portion thereof, to, and obtaining the approval thereof; by the Parish Engineer of the Parish of Jefferson; and provided further, that the said plan of subdivision shall likewise first be submitted to, and approved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson.

Section 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that no person, firm or corporation owning or leasing any square of ground, or any portion of a square of ground, which is regularly bounded, measured and defined by the established streets of the Parish of Jefferson, shall subdivide said square of ground, or any portion of such a square by means of the establishing or creation of private avenues streets or alleyways through said square of ground or any portion of a square of ground which is established or created by such private avenues, streets or alleyways and abutting thereon, without having first submitted said plan of subdivision of said square of ground or portion of such a square of ground to and obtaining thereon the approval of the Parish Engineer of the Parish of Jefferson and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson; it being the intention of this section that no person, firm or corporation, owning or leasing a square of ground, as defined in this section, or portion of such a square of ground, shall so subdivide the same into portions by the establishing of creation of private avenues, streets or alleyways through such square, or portion of a square of ground, for the purpose of creating a residential or business area, or a combination of both, without such plan of subdivision having been first inspected and approved by the Parish Engineer of Jefferson and by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson.

Section 3. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that no plan of subdivision of any tract of land, square of ground, or any portion of either, shall be valid unless the avenues, streets, alleyways, and neutral grounds shown on such plans of subdivision shall be formally dedicated to public use by notarial act, properly recorded, by the person, firm, or corporation seeking to make such subdivision, and the form of such dedication approved by the District Attorney for the Parish of Jefferson, and provided further that all such plans of subdivision shall be first submitted in triplicate to the official whose approval thereof is made necessary by this ordinance, and who shall inscribe their approval thereon, one copy of which shall be annexed to the notarial act of dedication, one copy to be filed with the Police Jury and the third copy shall be filed in the office of the Parish Engineer. All such plans of subdivision shall show the measurement and designations of each individual portion of ground; and all boundary marks, or corners of the original tract of land, or square of ground, or portion of square to be sub-divided, and all new avenues, streets, or alleyways, and intersections created by the new subdivision, shall be properly mounted by iron pipe or in any other permanent

manner. Said plans of subdivision shall also show all existing street intersections within five hundred feet of any side of these proposed subdivisions.

Section 4. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that unless otherwise stated in the approval of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, the said approval shall not constitute an acceptance of the dedicated areas on the plan so approved nor an acceptance of the notarial dedication of said areas, nor shall the approval of the Police Jury be as construed an acceptance or dedication.

(4) The rate for the collection of garbage from residences shall

not exceed the sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar per month, and from business places the rate shall not exceed the sum of (\$5.00) Dollars per month.

An Ordinance levying a tax of one cent per gallon on gasoline sold, used or consumed within the territorial limits of the Parish of Jefferson for a period of one year from the first day of the month of July, 1929.

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Legislature by Act No. 15 passed at the special session held in the year 1928 has delegated to the Parish the right, power and authority to levy and collect a tax of one cent per gallon on gasoline sold, used or consumed within their respective territorial limits.

WHEREAS, the Parish of Jefferson through its Police Jury desires to confer to it under the provisions of said act, and has given public notice as requested in said act:

SECTION 1. BE IT THEREFORE ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, that there be and is hereby levied a tax of one cent per gallon on all gasoline sold, used or consumed within the territorial limits of the Parish for a period of one year beginning with the first day of July 1929.

SECTION 11. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that, for the purposes of this Ordinance, any person, firm or corporation selling and distributing gasoline for retail sale, or distributing same to be sold at retail and any person, firm or corporation selling gasoline in bulk direct to the consumer, is hereby classed as jobber.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that such jobber or jobbers shall set forth in such report the names and addresses of all persons to whom such gasoline has been sold or distributed, as well as the quantity thereof sold or distributed to each person.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that such report shall be certified to by the jobber himself or by any person in his employ whose duties as such acquaint him specially with knowledge of the subject matter.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that the first report and remittance herein required shall be for the month of July and shall be made on or before the second day of August, 1929, and subsequent reports and remittances provided for shall be made on or before the second day of each succeeding month.

SECTION III. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that any jobber or agent or employee of such jobber who shall violate the provisions of this Ordinance by selling, delivering or distributing gasoline within the territorial limits of the Parish of Jefferson, without having made and filed with the Parish Treasurer any of the reports herein provided for, and within the time as herein fixed shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or imprisonment in the Parish Jail for a period not to exceed Thirty days, or both, at the discretion of the Court.

SECTION IV. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that the proceeds of the tax herein levied are hereby dedicated for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and repairing the roads and bridges situated within the territorial limits of the Parish of Jefferson.

SECTION V. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that this Ordinance shall take effect from July 1st, 1929, to July 1st, 1930.

Members present: W. R. Toledano, President, W. E. Strehle, B. P. Dauenhauer, A. J. Cantrelle, Jos. Petit, Robert Ottermann and A. C. Dumestre.

Absent-- E. L. Quinn and A. C. Dumestre.

The President announced that the board was ready to act and pass on protests and complaints that may be filed by tax payers on valuations fixed by the Parish Assessor and the State Tax Commission.

Mr. H. C. Dick, representing the Georgia Louisiana Chemical Company and the Western Paper Makers Corporation located in the 4th Ward appeared before the board and protested against the valuation fixed by the State Tax Commission on the Buildings and Machinery of the Georgia Louisiana Chemical Company, request that the value fixed be reduced from \$174,000.00

to \$125,000.00, and that valuation fixed on the Western Paper Makers Chemical Corporation be reduced from \$50,000.00 to \$25,000.00

Mr. Cantrelle, moved seconded by Mr. Strehle, and carried that this Board recommend that the valuation as fixed for assessment purpose on the property of the Georgia Louisiana Chemical Company, be reduced from \$174,000.00 to \$125,000.00, also recommend that the valuation of the Western Paper Makers Corporation for assessment purpose be reduced from \$50,000.00 to \$25,000.00.

(Resolutions)

Baton Rouge, Nov. 5, 1929.

The Louisiana Tax Commission met this day in its office in the City of Baton Rouge, with a quorum present, for the purpose of considering the recommendations of the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish, adopted by said body while acting as a board of reviews to hear complaints of tax payers dissatisfied with the values fixed by this commission, over those of the Assessor and Parish Board of Equalization of said Parish, for the year 1929. Said recommendation being made a part of this record.

In the matter of the Georgia Louisiana Corporation, wherein the Board of Reviewers recommend a value of \$125,000.00 on buildings and machinery, it was moved by Mr. Carville, seconded and unanimously adopted that the recommendation be partially accepted and a value of \$140,000.00 be fixed on the Buildings and Machinery of this Corporation making a reduction of \$13,090.00 on the Buildings and \$12,460.00 on the machinery.

In the matter of the Paper Makers Chemical Corporation, wherein the board of reviewers recommends a total value of \$25,000.00. It was moved by Mr. Carville seconded and unanimously carried, that this recommendation be partially granted and a value be fixed of \$25,000.00 on the Buildings and \$10,000.00 on Machinery, making a reduction of \$5,000.00 on the Buildings and \$2,800.00 on the Machinery.

In the matter of the Pontchartrain Lumber Company wherein the Board of Reviewers recommends an exemption from assessment of certain oak lumber which was destroyed by fire in January 1929, an examination for our records reveals that this item was not included in the value fixed by this Commission at the review. The merchandise was valued on an average of two inventories which did not include the burnt lumber.

In the matter of the plant of Dunbar Dukato Company of Lafitte, wherein the Board of Reviews recommends that the plant be valued at \$12,000.00, it was moved by Mr. Colbert, seconded and unanimously adopted that the recommendation be partially accept by fixing a value of \$15,000.00

on this plant.

In the matter of the recommendation by Board of Reviews that the Naturaline Company and the Texas Company be granted hearings by this Commission, it was moved by Mr. Carville, seconded and unanimously adopted that these Companies be granted a hearing at some date convenient to the Commission and to the two above named tax payers.

AN ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, in regular session assembled, that acting for and on behalf of the Parish of Jefferson, and as the governing authority of Road District No. 1, Road District No. 2, and Road District No. 3 of the Parish of Jefferson, the assessor of the Parish of Jefferson is hereby authorized to levy and extend on his rolls the taxes hereinafter mentioned, and the sheriff-ex-officio, tax collector of the Parish of Jefferson is hereby authorized and empowered to collect said taxes on taxable property in the Parish of Jefferson, for the year 1929, as follows, to-wit:

For Parish Tax	4 mills
For Road District	2 1/2 Mills
For Road District	1 mill
For Road District	3 1/2 mills
For Special new Jail Tax	1/4 mill
For Special School Tax	3 mills

All of the above taxes are to be levied in the respective road districts above mentioned, and all other taxes to be levied throughout the parish of Jefferson.

AN ORDINANCE

To levy, collect and enforce payment of an annual license tax on all persons, associations of persons, firms and corporations pursuing any trade, profession, vocation, calling or business, pursuant of Section 8, of Article X, of the Constitution of 1921, and Act 205 of Legislature of 1924, prescribing the mode and methods in which all persons subject to license shall make report of the business; providing remedies to enforce compliance therewith; prescribing penalties for making false statements on affidavits in relation thereto; and to repeal conflicting and inconsistent laws.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that there is hereby levied an annual license tax for the year 1930 and for each subsequent year, upon each person, association of persons, firms, corporations, any trade, profession, vocation, calling or business, subject to license under Section 8 of Article X of the Constitution of 1921 and Act 205 of 1924.

SECTION 2. That on the second day of January 1930, and of each subsequent year each tax collector throughout the State shall begin to collect and shall collect as fast as possible from each of the persons or business firms, association of persons or corporations pursuing within this distance of parish any trade, profession, vocation of business a license tax hereinafter fixed and graduated.

All license shall be due and collectable during the first two (2) months of each year, and all unpaid licenses shall become delinquent on the first day of March of each year, and all persons, firms, association of persons and corporations who commence business, after date shall become delinquent unless the license is paid within ten days after commencing business.

SECTION 3. That for each business or carrying on bank, banking company, trust company, association, corporation of agency the license shall be based on the declared profits and shall be fixed and graduated as follows, to-wit:

First Class-- When the declared or nominal capital surplus and undivided profits amount to two hundred thousand dollars or more, and less than three hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be three hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be three hundred dollars (\$300.00).

Second Class-- When the declared or nominal capital, surplus, or undivided profits amount to one hundred thousand dollars or more, and less than two hundred

thousand dollars, the license shall be two hundred dollars (\$200.00).

Third Class-- When the declared or nominal capital, surplus and undivided profits amount to fifty thousand dollars or more and less than one hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Fourth Class--When the declared or nominal capital, surplus and undivided profits amount to twenty-five thousand dollars or more, and less than fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be seventy-five dollars (\$75.00).

Fifth Class--When the declared or nominal capital, surplus and undivided profits amount to less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be Fifty Dollars (\$50.00).

The license imposed by the section shall be due and payable by each branch of a bank, banking company, trust company, association, corporation or agency operated separate and apart from the parent or principal bank, such branch establishment has allotted to, set apart or designated to it, a declared or nominal capital, surplus or undivided profits allotted to set apart or designated to it shall pay the minimum license fixed in this section.

SECTION 4. That for each business carrying on a private banking house business or agency, the license shall be based on the total declared capital invested in said business whether said capital is owned or in use or on deposit in the parish, or elsewhere and shall be fixed and graded as follows:

First Class--When said capital is five hundred thousand dollars or more, the license shall be six hundred dollars (\$600.00).

Second Class-- When said capital is two hundred and fifty thousand or more and under Five Hundred Thousand Dollars, the license shall be three hundred dollars (\$300.00).

Third Class-- When said capital is one hundred and fifty thousand dollars or more, and under two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be two hundred dollars (\$200.00).

Fourth Class-- When said capital is under one hundred fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

First Class -- When said gross commissions are twenty thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and eighty dollars (\$180.00).

Second Class-- When said gross annual commissions are fifteen thousand dollars or more and less than twenty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and forty dollars (\$140.00).

Third Class-- When the gross annual commissions are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Fourth Class-- When the gross annual commissions are five thousand dollars or more, and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00).

Fifth Class -- When the gross annual commissions are less than five thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Provided that if any person, firm or corporation carrying on the business designated in this section shall conduct more than one office or place of business whether in the same or under other names, such persons, firm or corporation shall pay a separate license for each and every office or place of business it shall conduct according to the hereinabove classification.

Provided further, that this ordinance shall not apply to persons, corporation or institutions carrying on banking business as provided by Section 3 (three) of this ordinance and provided further, that this ordinance shall not apply to persons, corporations or companies lending money secured by mortgages upon real estate.

Section 5. That for every wholesale dealer of merchandise, not otherwise provided for by the ordinance or by special laws whether the business be conducted by a fixed establishment or otherwise, and whether conducted as principal agent or commission or otherwise, the license shall be fixed and graded in classes and for each separate establishment where more than one such establishment is kept or conducted by the same person, firm, association or corporation there shall be separate license, as herein fixed and graded as follows to-wit:

First Class--When the gross sales are two hundred and fifty thousand dollars or more and less than five hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00).

Second Class-- When the gross sales are one hundred and fifty thousand dollars or more, and less than two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Third Class-- When the gross sales are one hundred thousand dollars or more and less than one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be seventy five dollars (\$75.00).

Fourth Class -- When the gross sales are less than one hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

Provided that no person or persons shall be deemed wholesale dealers

unless he or they sell by the original or unbroken package or barrel only; and provided further, that no person or persons shall be deemed wholesale dealers unless he or they sell to dealers for re-sale. If they sell in less quantities than original unbroken packages or barrels they shall be considered re-tail dealers and pay license as such.

SECTION 6. That every business of selling merchandise at retail not otherwise provided by this ordinance, or by special ordinance, whether the business be conducted as principal, agent on commission or otherwise license shall

be fixed and graded in classes, and for each separate establishment, where more than one such establishment is kept and conducted by the same person, firm, or association or corporation, there shall be a separate license, as herein fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class-- When the gross sales are fifty thousand dollars or more and less than seventy five thousand dollars, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00).

Second Class-- When the gross sales are forty thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty (\$50.00) dollars

Third Class -- When the gross sales are thirty thousand dollars or more and less than forty thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty-five dollars (\$35.00)

Fourth Class-- When the gross sales are twenty-five thousand dollars or more, and less than thirty thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Fifth Class-- When the gross sales are twenty thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Sixth Class -- When the gross sales are fifteen thousand dollars or more and less than twenty thousand dollars the license shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00).

Seventh Class- When the gross sales are ten thousand dollars and less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00).

Eighth Class-- When the gross sales are five thousand dollars or more and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00).

Ninth Class--When the gross sales are less than five thousand dollars the license shall be five dollars (\$5.00).

Provided that if any distilled vinous malt or cereal drinks, ice cream, confections, soda water, soda pop, coca-cola, chero-cola, grape or other similar drinks or beverages or refreshments be sold in connection with or in the same establishment with the business of retail merchandise, the sale thereof shall be deemed a separate business, and a separate license shall be paid for the pursuit of such business, as may be provided by this ordinance, or by any existing laws not hereby repealed, or by subsequent laws.

Provided further, that farmers or planters having stores on their farms or plantations selling or advancing supplies to the employees.

exclusively shall not be classed as merchants and not be required to pay a license under this ordinance.

Section 7. That for the business of carrying on, operating or running any horse team, gas, gasoline or electric railroad, for the transportation of passengers within the limits of the Parish of Jefferson, the annual license shall be 45-100 of one (1 p.c.) per cent of the annual gross receipts.

Section 8. That for carrying on each business of gas, gas light, gas heat, or power; electric light, water works, cotton compress or gin-ery; cotton pickery; slaughter house, distillery rectifying alcohols or malt liquor, brewing ale, beer, porter or other malt liquors; and for each telegraph, telephone or express business other than those subject to license under the foreign license ordinance or special laws, the license shall be based on the gross annual receipts, and shall be fixed and graded as follows-to-wit:

First Class -- When the gross annual receipts are one hundred thousand dollars or more and less than one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be three hundred (\$300.00).

Second Class-- When the gross annual receipts are seventy-five thousand or more, and less than one hundred thousand dollars, the license shall be two hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$225.00).

Third Class -- When the gross receipts are fifty thousand dollars or more and less than seventy-five thousand dollars the license shall be one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00).

Fourth Class-- When the gross receipts are thirty seven thousand dollars or more, and less than fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred fifteen dollars (\$115.00).

Fifth Class-- When the gross receipts are twenty-five thousand dollars or more and less than thirty-seven thousand dollars, the license shall be seventy five dollars (\$75.00).

Sixth Class-- When the gross annual receipts are twenty thousand dollars or more and less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00).

Seventh Class -- When the gross annual receipts are fifteen thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty thousand dollars, the license shall be forty five dollars (\$45.00).

Eighth Class-- When the gross annual receipts are less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Provided that this section shall not apply to planters and farmers grinning their own cotton or that of their tenants exclusive nor to those who gin for hire not over four hundred bales of cotton per annum.

Section 9. That for every business of keeping a theatre, opera-house, amphitheatre, academy of music, exhibition or moving picture theatre or other similar place of amusement, the license shall be based upon the gross annual receipts of said business, and shall be fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class-- When the gross annual receipts are twenty thousand dollars or more, and less than thirty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Second Class-- When the gross annual receipts are fifteen thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty thousand dollars, the license shall be seventy-five dollars (\$75.00).

Third Class-- When the gross annual receipts are ten thousand dollars or more and less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars, (\$50.00).

Fourth Class-- When the gross annual receipts are five thousand dollars or more and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00).

Fifth Class-- When the gross annual receipts are two thousand five hundred dollars or more and less than five thousand dollars, the license shall be twelve dollars (\$12.00).

Sixth Class-- When the gross annual receipts are less than two thousand five hundred dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00).

Second Class-- When the number of persons is one hundred or more and less than two hundred, the license shall be six hundred dollars (\$600.00).

Third Class-- When the number of persons is seventy-five or more, and less than one hundred, the license shall be four hundred eighty dollars (\$480.00).

Fourth Class-- When the number of persons is fifty or more, and less than seventy-five the license shall be three hundred sixty dollars (\$360.00)

Fifth Class-- When the number of persons is thirty or more, and less than fifty, the license shall be three hundred dollars (\$300.00)

Sixth Class-- When the number of persons is twenty or more, and less than thirty, the license shall be two hundred and forty dollars (\$240.00).

Seventh Class-- When the number of persons is ten or more, and less than twenty, the license shall be one hundred and eighty dollars (\$180.00).

Eighth Class-- When the number of persons is five or more and less than ten, the license shall be One Hundred and Twenty Dollars (\$120.00).

Ninth Class -- When the number of persons is four, the license shall be ninety dollars, (\$90.00).

Tenth Class-- When the number of persons is three, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00).

Eleventh Class-- When the number of persons is two, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

Twelfth Class-- When the number of persons is one, the license shall be thirty five dollars (\$35.00).

For every hall or halls, or establishment not above provided for or given the classifications shall be based upon the number of persons the place is capable of entertaining and the amount of the license shall be fixed and graded as follows-to-wit:

First Class--When the number of seats or spaces is two thousand or more, the license shall be two hundred & fifty dollars. (\$250.00).

Second Class-- When the number of seats or spaces is one thousand five hundred or more and less than two thousand, the license shall be One Hundred and ninety Dollars (\$190.00)

Third Class-- When the number of seats or spaces is one thousand

or more and less than twenty five hundred the license shall be one hundred and twenty five dollars (\$125.00).

Fourth Class-- When the number of seats or spaces is seven hundred or more, and less than one thousand, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

SECTION 10. That for each and every peddler or hawker, other than vendors of ice shall pay an annual license which license is hereby fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

(a) When traveling on foot, One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). When traveling on horse back, One Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$120.00). When traveling in a one horse vehicle, One Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$150.00). When traveling in a two horse vehicle, or truck, Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00). When traveling in any kind of water craft, Two Hundred (\$200.00).

(b) Provided that persons residing in the Parish where the license is issued and selling their goods exclusively in said Parish, shall pay only one-half of the amounts named in sub-section (a) as above set out.

And provided that peddlers of fresh meat, poultry, eggs, vegetables and fruit shall pay one fiftieth of the graded license herein stipulated, and persons when vending their own produce shall pay no license, and provided further, that no person shall be allowed to sell goods as a clerk or clerks of peddler or hawker but that he or they must pay a license in his or their name, but that this provision shall not apply to water craft and provided further that all parochial or municipal officers are hereby empowered and directed to call all peddlers and hawkers to exhibit their parish license if any, and the said peddlers or hawkers failing to exhibit same, the said officers are directed and empowered by this act to seize said stock or merchandise and turn the same over to any court of competent jurisdiction, with due information as the violation of this act.

Provided further that said executive officers shall be entitled to receive as fees the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) in each and every case from a peddler or hawker, clerk or clerks employed by said peddler or hawker, then peddling with out a license in violation of this law, the amount of ten dollars to be recovered before any court of competent jurisdiction out of the goods so seized. Provided further that no license shall be issued to any peddler or hawker for less than full rate of the current year.

For every business or restaurant, tea room, office, house or other eating house, whether attached to or conducted separate and apart from a hotel, boarding house or rooming house, a separate license shall be paid, and such license shall be fixed and graded as provided in Section 8 of this Act for retail dealers but no license shall be charged for selling refreshments for charitable or religious purposes.

SECTION 11. That of keeping billiard tables, pigeonholes, jenny-lind pool or bagatell table, tenpin alleys and shooting galleries from which revenue is derived, a license of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for each such table alley or gallery shall be paid in addition to any other license due by the establishment in which tables, alleys or galleries may be situated.

SECTION 12. That all persons, association of persons, firms or corporations, engaged in the sale of retail of soda water, coca-cola, cherocola confection, ice cream, grape or other similar soft drinks or beverages or refreshments shall pay a license advised on the gross annual sale and such licenses are hereby fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class-- When the gross sales are six thousand dollars or more, and less than eight thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Second Class-- When the gross sales are four thousand dollars or more, and less than six thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Third Class-- When the gross sales are three thousand dollars or more, and less than four thousand, the license shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00).

Fourth Class-- When the gross sales are two thousand dollars, or more and less than three thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00).

Fifth Class-- When the gross sales are one thousand dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00).

Sixth Class -- When the gross sales are less than one thousand dollars, the license shall be five dollars (\$5.00).

Section 13. That all persons, association of persons, firms or corporations engaged in the sale at wholesale, of distilled spirit malt, cereal or other liquors or beverages containing any alcoholic content shall pay license based upon the gross annual sales, and each separate establishment, place, distributing station or depot from which such beverages are sold and distributed at wholesale, whether conducted as principal agent or distributor shall pay a separate license, which license shall be and are hereby fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class-- When the gross sales are forty thousand dollars or more, and less than fifty thousand dollars the license shall be one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00).

Second Class-- When the gross sales are for thirty thousand dollars or more and less than forty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$125.00).

Third Class-- When the gross sales are twenty thousand dollars or more and less than thirty thousand dollars, the license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Fourth Class-- When the gross annual sales are ten-thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty thousand dollars, the license shall be seventy-five dollars (\$75.00).

Fifth Class-- When the gross annual sales are less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00).

SECTION 14. That all persons, association of persons, firms or corporations engaged in the sale, at retail of malt or cereal beverages contained any alcoholic contents less than one half of one per cent by volume, shall pay license upon gross annual sales and each separate establishment at which such beverages are sold at retail whether conducted as principal agent or distributor shall pay a license, which licenses are hereby fixed and graded, as follows, to-wit:

First Class-- When the gross annual sales are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than fifteen thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00)

Second Class-- When the gross annual sales are eight thousand dollars

or more, and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be forty dollars (\$40.00).

Third Class-- When the gross annual sales are six thousand dollars, or more and less than eight thousand dollars the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Fourth Class-- When the gross annual sales are four thousand dollars or more and less than six thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Fifth Class-- When the gross annual sales are three thousand dollars or more and less than four thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00).

Sixth Class-- When the gross annual sales are two thousand dollars, or more, and less than three thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00).

Seventh Class-- When the gross annual sales are one thousand dollars or more and less than two thousand dollars, the license shall be (\$10.00).

Eighth Class-- When the gross annual sales are less than one thousand dollars, the license shall be five dollars. (\$5.00).

Nothing in this act contained shall be construed to authorize the issuance of a license for the sale of any liquor or beverage, the sale of which is prohibited by law or ordinance of the United States or of the State of Louisiana or any municipality or other subdivision thereof.

Provided that a person, association, firm or corporation engaged in the business mentioned in this section and having a proper license may sell in connection with said business any of the commodities mentioned in Section 21 of this act, without paying a separate license but the total sales from such combined business shall determine the amount of license to be paid according to the classifications in this section.

SECTION 15. That every individual, firm, company or corporation carrying on the profession or business of contractor, shall pay license based upon the gross annual receipts of said business, while licenses shall be fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class-- When the gross receipts are twenty five thousand dollars or more, and less than fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Second Class-- When the gross receipts are ten thousand dollars or more, and less than twenty-five thousand dollars, the license shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00).

Third Class-- When the gross annual receipts are less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be Twelve Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$12.50).

Provided that every individual, firm, company or corporation carrying on the business or profession of master builder or merchant who employs assistance where building is done for others on a cost plus basis, commission or percentage plan shall pay a license based upon the annual earnings from the business which in Section 5 of this Act for carrying on a commission or brokerage business

SECTION 16. That every individual, firm, association or corporation carrying on the profession or business of keeping cabs, hacks, horses or motor vehicles or steamboats or funeral directors, agency for steamboard or steamships and owners of leases of toll bridges or ferries, stevadore

and to be engaged in the business or profession of bill posting, tacking or advertising, the license shall be based upon the gross annual receipts from such profession or business and shall be fixed and graded as follows, to-wit:

First Class-- When the gross annual receipts are six thousand dollars or more and less than eight thousand dollars, the license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

Second Class-- When the gross annual receipts are five thousand dollars or more and less than six thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty-seven dollars and fifty cents (\$37.50).

Third Class-- When the gross annual receipts are four thousand dollars or more and less than five thousand dollars the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Fourth Class -- When the gross annual receipts are three thousand dollars or more and less than four thousand dollars, the license shall be Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00).

Fifth Class-- When the gross annual receipts are two thousand dollars or more and less than three thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00).

Sixth Class-- When the gross annual receipts are one thousand dollars or more and less than two thousand dollars, the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00).

Seventh Class-- When the gross annual receipts are seven hundred and fifty dollars or more, and less than one thousand dollars, the license shall be ten dollars (\$10.00).

Eighth Class-- When the gross annual receipts are less than seven hundred and fifty dollars, the license shall be Five Dollars (\$5.00).

That any other business not provided for in this Ordinance, not otherwise provided for by a separate law, except manufacturing, shall be graded the same as above set forth, and shall pay a license as fixed in this section.

That every individual, firm, association or corporation, carrying on the business or profession of physician, osteopath, dentist, oculist, attorney-at-law, editor, publisher, printer, engraver, lithographer, photographer, architect, civil engineer, mechanical engineer, electrical engineer, decorator, jeweler or any other professional occupation shall be graded according to the classifications named above, but the license for the various professions included in this paragraph shall be one-half of those established by the foregoing provisions of this section; provided that no license shall be issued hereunder for less than five dollars (\$5.00):

SECTION 17. That every individual, firm, association, carrying or profession or business of steam dying, steam cleaning, steam pressing or the business of electrical laundering, the license shall be based upon the gross annual receipts from that profession or business, and shall be fixed and graded as follows to-wit:

First Class-- When the gross annual receipts are ten thousand dollars or more and less than twelve thousand dollars, the license shall be Forty Dollars (\$40.00).

Second Class-- When the gross annual receipts are eight thousand dollars or more and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00).

Third Class-- When the gross annual receipts are six thousand dollars or more and less than eight thousand dollars, the license shall be

Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Fourth Class-- When the gross annual receipts are five thousand dollars or more the license shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00).

To levy, collect and enforce payment of a license tax upon all persons, associations of persons, business firms, partnerships, corporations engaged in or pursuing business whereby dogs are run for purses, and or where any entrance fee is charged for the dogs racing, with certain exceptions; and prescribing the mode and method by which said license tax shall be collected and providing a penalty for violations thereof, and repealing all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON that there be and is hereby levied a license tax upon such persons, association of persons, or business firm, partnership or corporation, engaged in the pursuing any business whereby dogs are run for purses or where entrance fee is charged for the entrance of said dogs in a race, for each and every race track so operated which said license shall be graduated upon the daily receipts from admissions paid by spectators and entrance fees charged for the entrance of said dogs in said race, as follows:

First Class-- When the paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for dogs racing amount to \$10,000.00 or more per day, the license shall be \$200.00 per day for the time or duration of the race meeting.

Second Class-- When paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for dogs racing amount to \$5,000.00 or more and less than, \$10,000.00 the license tax shall be \$150.00 per day for time or duration of the meeting.

Third Class-- When paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for dogs racing amount to less than \$5,000.00, the license shall be \$100.00 per day for the time or duration of the meeting.

SECTION 2. That the aforesaid license tax shall be collected by the constituted authority charged with the collection of license due to the State.

SECTION 3. That the minimum license tax herein provided shall be paid in advance and to the constituted authority charged with the collection thereof, and no race shall be run unless same is paid, under penalty herein provided and to balance of said license tax, if any shall be paid before 3 o'clock p.m. on the following day, the collection thereof to be in accordance with the herein provided graduated schedule section No. 1, and that this license tax shall become due and owing on each and every day that the said races are run and shall become delinquent on the following day and it is hereby made the duty of the District Attorney of this parish to enforce collection of this said license tax, and for the services rendered in such collection, he shall be entitled to 20 per cent over and above the amount of license collected from the delinquent debtor as attorney's fees, which said attorneys fees shall be paid by the said delinquent license debtor, and shall be assessed as costs in case of suit.

SECTION 4. That all suits for the collection of this license shall be summary and be tried in accordance with the law in force for the collection of delinquent licenses or taxes.

SECTION 5. That the amount of tax due by the aforesaid person, association of persons business firms, partnerships or corporations

engaged in the aforesaid business shall be determined as follows:

The daily receipts of the paid admissions and entrance fee charged for the entrance of said dogs in said races for said day, shall be added and totalled up and then the license tax calculated thereon, in accordance with the provisions of section of this Act.

SECTION 6. That the provisions of this act shall not apply to an association of persons or corporations engaged in holding or conducting a fair solely for the purpose of exhibiting agricultural or manufactured products or natural resources looking toward the advancement of the agricultural or manufacturing interest of the development of the said parish; where said dog racing is conducted as an auxiliary sport and as an incident for amusement and entertainment and not for the purpose of profit, provided that said fairs so condition shall not be for a longer period than 14 days.

SECTION 7. That any person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships or corporations conducting or operating a race track or races in contravention of the provisions of this act without having first paid said license tax as aforesaid shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.00 and not less than \$25.00 by imprisonment of not more than twenty days and not less than ten days in the parish jail, or both, such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court, provided that in case the violator be an association, firm or corporation, the managing officers and agents thereof shall be punishable by such fine and imprisonment, provided such fine and imprisonment shall not be construed as relieving said violator from said license tax.

SECTION 8. That all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE

To levy and collect and enforce payment of a license tax upon all persons, association of persons or business firms, partnerships or business, whereby horses are run for purses and or where any entrance fee is charged for horses racing with certain exceptions, and providing a penalty for violation thereof and repealing all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON that there be and is hereby levied a license tax upon each person, association of persons, or business firm, partnership or corporation, engaged in or pursuing any business whereby horses are run for purses or where an entrance fee is charged for the entrance of horses in said race for each and every race track

so operated, which said license shall be granted upon daily receipts from admission paid by spectators and entrance fees charged for the entrance of the said horse in said race as follows:

First Class-- When the said admission by spectators and entrance

fees for horses racing amounts to ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) or more per day the license shall be six hundred (\$600.00) dollars per day for the time or duration of the meeting.

Second Class-- When the said paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for the horses racing amount to seventy five hundred (\$75,000.00) dollars, or more, and less than ten thousand (\$10,000.00) dollars, the license shall be five hundred (\$500.00) dollars per day, during the time or duration of the race meeting.

Third Class-- When the said paid admissions by spectators and entrance fees for the horses racing amount to five thousand (\$5,000.00) dollars or more and less than seventy five hundred (\$7,500.00) dollars, per day, the license shall be three hundred and fifty (\$350.00) dollars per day for the time of duration of the race meeting.

Fourth Class-- When the said paid admission by spectators and entrance fees for horses racing amount to less than \$5,000.00 per day, the license shall be two hundred and Fifty (\$250.00) dollars, for the time or duration of the race meeting.

SECTION 2. The aforesaid license tax shall be collected by the constituted authority charged with the collection of licenses due to the State.

SECTION 3. That the minimum license tax herein provided shall be paid in advance daily to the constituted authority charged with the collection hereof and no race shall be run unless the same is paid, under penalty herein provided and the balance of said license tax, if any, shall be paid before 3 o'clock p.m. on the following day, the calculation thereof to be in accordance with the herein provided graduated schedule in Section No. 1 and that this license tax shall become due and swing on each and every day that the said races are run and shall become delinquent on the following day and it is hereby made the duty of the district attorney of this parish to enforce the collection of this said license tax and for the services rendered in such collection he shall be entitled to 20 per cent over and above the amount of the license collected from the delinquent debtors, as attorney's fees which said attorney's fees shall be paid by the said delinquent license debtor, and shall be assessed as costs in case of suit.

SECTION 4. That all suits or rules for the collection of this license tax shall be summary and be tried in accordance with the law in force for the collection of delinquent licenses or taxes.

SECTION 5. That the amount or tax due by the aforesaid person, association of persons, business firms, partnerships, or corporations engaged in the aforesaid business shall be determined as follows:

The daily receipts of the paid admissions and entrance charged for the entrance of horses in the said races for the said day shall be added and totalled up and the license tax calculated in accordance thereon with the provisions of Section 1 of this Act.

SECTION 6. That the provisions of this Act shall not apply to association of persons, or corporations engaged in holding or conducting a fair solely for the purpose of exhibiting agricultural or manufactural products or natural resources looking toward the advancement of the agricultural and manufactural interest or the development of natural resources in the said parish, where said horses racing is conducted as an auxiliary sport, as an incident for amusement and entertainment and not for the purpose of profit, provided that said fairs so conducted shall not be for a longer period than 14 days.

SECTION 7. That any persons, association of persons, business firms, partnerships, or corporations conducting or operating a race track or races in contravention of the provisions of this Act without having first paid said license taxes as aforesaid, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.00 and not less than \$25.00 or by imprisonment of not more than 30 days and not less than 10 days in the parish jail or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court, provided that in case the violator be an association, firm or corporation, the managing officers or agents thereof shall be punishable by such fine or imprisonment and provided that such fine and imprisonment shall not be construed as revealing said violator of said license tax.

SECTION 8. That all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Roll being called to vote on the adoption of the above Resolution resulted as follows:

NAYS----None.

SECTION 18. That the annual receipts, capital sales, premiums, commissions earnings in this Ordinance referred to as a basis of license are those for the year which the license is granted; the standard for their estimation shall be prima facie of the preceding year if the business has been conducted previously by the same party or parties to whom they claim to be successors. If the firm or company be new, the amount of gross sales for the first two months to be estimated as the annual receipts of such business, provided that any persons commencing business after the first of July, peddlers, hawkers, and traveling shows excepted, shall pay one half of the above rates.

SECTION 19. That the business of the previous years as also the actual condition and result of business of the current year, for the new firms, associations, corporations for the purpose of calculating license, shall be ascertained by the tax collector in the sworn statement of the person or persons in interest his or their duly authorized agent or officer made before the tax collector be not satisfied with the said sworn statement he shall traverse the same by a rule

taken in proper court which rule shall be tried summarily whether an answer be thereto filed or not. On trial of said rule, the books and written entries and memoranda of said person or persons, firms, companies or parties shall be brought into court and subjected to the inspection and examination of the court, the officer who took the rule and such experts as he may employ or the court may appoint, provided that this inspection shall not be construed as entitling the defendant to introduce in evidence said books and documents any more than he would have been such inspection, provided also that the license shall issue in accordance with the said sworn statement, notwithstanding the prospect of pendency of the rule, the final ratification shall be made as ordered by the court.

In addition to the duties and powers herein imposed upon and vested in tax collectors, the supervisors of public accounts shall have authority

to review and examine any sworn statements or account that may have been or may have been or maybe rendered or furnished in pursuance of the provisions of this act; and he shall have authority to demand and examine the books, statements and accounts of any persons, firms, association or corporation from whom a license may be due under the provisions of this act; and to take such proceedings before any court of competent jurisdiction by rule or otherwise, against the tax collectors or against any person, firm, association or corporation from whom a license may be due as may be necessary to enforce a full and fair compliance with the provisions of this Act.

SECTION 20. That if any business shall be conducted without a license, in case herein provided the officer whose duty it is to issue license shall through the attorney herein provided for, on motion in the proper courts as provided in the constitution, and which shall be without deposit or advance cost, take a rule on the party or parties doing such business to show cause on the fifth day exclusive, or holidays after the service thereof, which may be tried out of term time and in chambers, and shall always be tried by preference why said party or parties should not pay the amount of license claimed and penalties of the order to cease from further pursuit of said business until after such having obtained a license and in case said rule is made absolute the order thereon rendered shall be considered a judgment in favor of the state, for the amount decreed to be due by the defendant for license and penalty and cost heretofore and herein-after provided for, shall be executed in the same manner as other judgments and every violation of the order shall be considered as a contempt thereof, and punished according to law.

It is hereby expressly provided that each person, association of persons business firm, or corporation of persons, business firm, or corporation required to take out a license under this act shall be required to post the same in a conspicuous place in his or their place of business, under a penalty of not less than ten or more, that one hundred dollars recoverable by the tax collector before any court of competent jurisdiction and it shall be the duty of the several tax collectors throughout the state to visit in person or by deputies the several places of business herein mentioned and ascertain that the provisions of the section are strictly carried out.

SECTION 21. That the only legal evidence that a license has been paid shall be the appropriate form of license issued by the auditor of public accounts and no receipts issued by a tax collector in place of the license itself shall be valid and this clause shall be construed to prevent the tax collectors from issuing a receipt, in lieu of the appropriate form to any person, association of persons, business corporation; provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed so as to exclude oral evidence of loss or destroyed license.

SECTION 22. That the ex-officio tax collector shall prepare and keep a book in which they shall record or file the statements made under oath of all persons, association of persons, firms or corporations, who may apply for license to pursue any trade, professions, vocations, calling or business under this ordinance.

SECTION 23. That the ex-officio tax collector charged with the collection of taxes are hereby to administer oath to any person, president, or proper officials, or agent of any association of persons, business firms or corporations applying for license under this ordinance; and any tax collector or ex-officio tax collector; as aforesaid or any notary public or other officer in the parish empowered to administer oaths, who shall sign any part or certify to any oath without administering the oath in person to the applicant and having applicant sign the oath in his presence, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction shall be subject to a fine of not less than one hundred dollars and not more than one thousand dollars or imprisonment of not less than thirty days nor more than ninety days or both in the discretion of the court. That when the oath is taken before the collector, no charge shall be made for same. Any false swearing as to the gross receipts of any person or persons, or corporation through their president or proper officer or agent, applying for license shall constitute the crime of perjury to be punished as directed by existing criminal laws of the Parish. All licenses shall be paid in the Parish wherein it is situated or conducted the business for which the license is due. Where an individual is applicant for licenses the affidavit must be taken in person; where as a partnership, by a member of the firm, and where a corporation by the proper officer thereof. But in the absence from the parish of the individuals the members of the firm or the proper officer of the corporation, same may be taken by a competent agent, on personal knowledge of the facts, to be made to appear in the body of the affidavit.

SECTION 24. That the tax collector and ex-officio tax collectors are hereby required to keep a license register, in which they shall enter the names of every firm or corporation with the trade, profession, vocation, calling or business pursued, the class and graduation of the same the amount of the license thereon, and the date of collection or payment thereof. On July 1st of each and every year the said collectors shall make and forward to the auditor of public accounts a full and complete transcript of said license register showing all licenses collected during the preceding six months. A similar transcript shall be filed by them December 31st of each and every year showing all license collected during the second half of the year. The auditor of public accounts shall lay a copy of these transcripts before the general assembly at the regular session, the original which he shall file in his office for future reference or use.

SECTION 25. That the ex-officio tax collector violating any of the provisions of this ordinance or who willfully rate any person, association of persons; or business firm or corporation at a less graduation than the law con-

templates, or who shall issue to any said person association of persons, or business firms or corporations a license sum than that corresponding with their graduation shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor in office and shall on conviction before a competent authority be summarily dismissed therefrom.

SECTION 26. That the Governor of the State shall designate for each parish including the Parish of Orleans, an attorney-at-law, whose duty it shall be to aid the tax collector or ex-officio tax collector in the parish for which he is appointed in the collection of State and Parish Licenses provided by this act. And upon all licenses and penal-

ties collected through the agency of the said attorney, the delinquent owing the license shall pay a commission to him of ten per cent centum, calculating same upon the aggregate amount of license and penalties so collected and paid over to the tax collector. The said attorney shall receive no other compensation. The attorney so appointed shall serve during good behavior and shall be liable to be summarily removed for cause. It shall be the duty of the district attorneys of the parishes to represent the tax collectors of said parishes in the collection of delinquent taxes or in case the attorney so appointed refuse to act.

On the second day of March of each year the tax collector or ex-officio tax collector shall deliver to the attorneys herein provided for, a complete list of all delinquent license payers, together with the location and kind of business, and the attorney shall immediately proceed to collect same in accordance with this ordinance, and if not collected within thirty days from the date of delivery of the list by collector of taxes or ex-officio collector it shall be the duty of said attorneys to render a written report giving the reasons for non-collection to the collectors, whose duty it shall be to forward such reports to the auditor of public accounts. Provided that the attorney herein provided for, clerks of court, sheriffs, constables or other officers, shall receive no compensation, commission, salary, docket fee or fees for the service rendered in any suit, or action for the collection of licenses under the provisions of this act in which said tax collector or ex-officio tax collector has failed to obtain full and complete satisfaction and payment of any judgment in favor of the State Louisiana; and provided further that said attorneys, clerk of court, sheriffs, constables, or other officers shall receive no compensation in any license suit for services rendered in which judgment has been rendered against said tax collector, or ex-officio tax collector of the State of Louisiana.

SECTION 27. That if any tax collector or officer, whose duty it is to issue licenses shall through incompetency, negligence or fault on his own part, fail to collect licenses in the proper amounts from those by whom they are due he shall be responsible on his bond for all losses to the state arising therefrom.

SECTION 28. That all unpaid licenses shall bear interest at the rate of two per cent per month from the first day of March and the payment thereon shall be secured by first lien and privilege in favor of the state upon the property movable and immovable, of the delinquent on in the license, and the tax collector or ex-officio tax-collector shall collect said license and interest in the manner prescribed by existing laws.

SECTION 29. That all gross receipts derived from any mercantile business or occupation whatsoever as hereinbefore provided, whether earned within or without the state, shall form the proper basis upon which all licenses shall be assessed and collected by tax collectors.

SECTION 30. That a person, firm or company having more than one place of business shall pay a separate license for each place of business.

SECTION 31. That the Police Jury shall designate the same attorney to represent the tax collector of the Parish of Jefferson, as has been appointed by the Governor of the State of Louisiana to represent the Parish of Jefferson, and he shall receive the same compensation for his services as is provided by Act 205 of 1924, Section 39.

On the second day of March of each year the tax collector or ex-

officio tax collector shall deliver to the attorneys therein provided a complete list of all delinquent license payers, together with their location and kind of business and the attorney shall immediately proceed to collect same in accordance with the ordinance.

SECTION 32. That if any tax collector or officer, whose duty it is to issue parish license, shall, through incompetency, negligence or fault on his part, fail to collect license in the proper amounts from those by whom they are due, he shall be responsible on his bond for all losses to the Parish arising therefrom.

SECTION 33. That all unpaid licenses shall bear interest at the rate of two (2) per cent per month from the first day of March and the payment thereon shall be secured by first lien and privilege in favor of the Parish of Jefferson upon the property movable and immovable, on the delinquents owing the license, and the tax collector or ex-officio tax collector shall collect said license and interest in the manner prescribed by existing laws.

SECTION 34. That all gross receipts derived from any mercantile business or occupation whatsoever as hereinbefore provided whether earned within or without the Parish of Jefferson, shall form the proper basis upon which all license shall be assessed and collected by tax collectors.

SECTION 35. That a person, firm or company having more places of business shall pay a separate license for each place of business.

The above ordinance was adopted section by section, then as a whole.

An Ordinance to authorize the President on behalf of the Police Jury, to borrow from the sinking fund of Road District No. 2, the sum of \$4,500.00 and from the fund of the preservation of Wild Fur Bearing Animals, the sum of \$2,100.00 to pay current expenses of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1929 dedicating, appropriating and setting aside the amounts borrowed out of the taxes and revenues of the Parish of Jefferson, for the year 1929, to pay amounts borrowed.

SECTION 1

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, in regular meeting assembled, that the President be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow from the sinking fund of the Road District No. 2, \$4,500.00, and from the fund for the preservation of Wild Fur Bearing Animals, the sum of \$2,100.00 for the purpose of paying the current expenses of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1929.

SECTION 11.

The President informed members of the Jury that because unexpected expenses during the past year, parish affairs would have to be operated during the coming year with the strictest economy for this reason, the Police Jury will be unable to bear any of the expenses of repairing streets in Kenner and Gretna, as has been the practice in the past, stated that the City of Kenner had already taken steps to repair their streets during the coming year and request that the officials of the City of Gretna be informed of the Police Juries economical intentions for the year 1930.

Mr. Dumestre moved, seconded by Mr. Ottormann, and carried, that a committee composed of Mr. Quinn, Strehle, and Dauenhauer, be appointed to confer and take up with officials of the City of Gretna, the matter of repairing streets in Gretna during the year 1930.

On motion of Mr. Dumestre, seconded by Mr. Ottormann, It was resolved that the secretary be instructed to advertize for bids for Caterpillar Thirty Tractor complete with 13, in grouser track shoes and street plates, Top seats, power take off for Williamette Hoist and electric lights to be delivered to road superintendent at Kenner, La.

On motion of Mr. Otterman, seconded by Mr. Dumestre, It was resolved that the state highway commission be notified to gravel the shoulders of the Jefferson Highway from Protection Levee to Shrewsbury road, same being in a bad an dangerous condition for vehicular traffic.

Further resolved that the Land A Railroad Company be notified to repair its crossing over the State Highway at Southport, same being in a dangerous condition.

Further resolved that the Orleans, Levee Board be notified to repair their step crossing for pedestrians over Protection Levee at Southport, on both sides New Orleans and Jefferson, Present steps are decayed and missing and is dangerous to life and limb.

Further resolved, that the Southern Roads Co., be notified to repair hole in

pavement in front of Sierra Place between Labarre Road and Shrewsbury.

The Secretary was instructed to notify the Jefferson Water Company that the two roads entering Metairie Terrace Subdivision by way of the Air Line Highway is in very bad condition due to the face that the water company failed to restbro-said roads to the same condition as they were before pipe lines were layed along the Air Line Highway.

ORDINANCE

To supplement existing ordinances or parts of ordinances, relative to the eradication of cattle fever ticks in the Parish of Jofferson and to prevent re-infection therefrom; to provide for the seizure, dipping, impounding and disposal of cattle, horses and mules entering this parish unless same be accompanied by an official permit signed by a duly authorized inspector, providing penalties for violation of this ordinance and repealing all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, in regular meeting assembled that: - -

Section 1. Should any cattle, horses or mules be hauled or driven into drift, or enter by swimming or in any other manner, the Parish of Jefferson from any parish that is under State or Federal quarantine for cattle fever ticks, unless such cattle, horses or mules are accompanied by an official permit of the Louisiana State Live Stock Sanitary Board or an official certificate of the U. S. Bureau of Animal Industry, such cattle, horses or mules shall be seized, dipped and impounded by an inspector or range rider, employed by the Parish of Jefferson who has been duly commissioned by the Louisiana State Live stock Sanitary Board in tick eradication work. A seizure fee of \$25.00 per head shall be imposed in all cases, which fee shall enure to the benefit of the tick eradication fund of the parish. Such seizure fee shall be paid by the owner or out of the proceeds of the sale of such animals as hereinafter directed. The keeper of the pound or quarantine pasture, at the discretion of the inspector supervising tick eradication work in this parish, shall be entitled to compensation at the rate of 50 cents per day for every day such animal remains in pound or pasture, payable in the same manner as the fees of the person seizing and delivering such animals.

All impounded animals should be sold from time to time at the several pounds or quarantine pastures at public auction, after ten days

advertisement of date, hour and place of sale by two publications, if in a weekly, and by three, if in a daily paper, published in this parish. All sales shall be made for cash without appraisement to the last and highest bidder for what the animal will bring.

All animals that have been in pound or quarantine pastures for a period of ten full days may be sold at such sales. The sheriff of this parish, his deputies and all constables are hereby constitute commissioners, with authority to make, said sales. They shall be compelled to make such sales when called upon to do so by the supervising inspector in charge of tick eradication work in this parish.

Commissioners shall receive 10% on the gross proceeds of all sales made by them as compensation for their services, but in no case shall such compensation be less than \$2.50 for making any one sale.

Out of the proceeds of such sale, the commissioner shall pay all fees, costs and expenses, retain his own commission or fees, and the balance, if any, he shall turn over to the parish treasurer of this parish. Impounded animals may be redeemed by their owners at any time before sale on paying all costs, charges and penalties incurred up to the time, of redemption, including a fee of \$1.00 per head for the commissioner, if redemption be made before day of sale.

All animals seized as aforesaid shall be dipped before being placed in a pound or quarantine pasture and as often thereafter as may be required by the supervising inspector in charge of tick eradication work in this Parish.

SECTION 2. All cattle, horses and mules directly exposed to, or infested with cattle fever ticks in the Parish of Jefferson shall be subject to the same seizure, dipping and impounding as in section one, provided the owners of such cattle, horses and mules have been previously served with a dipping notice, except the seizure fees shall not exceed \$5.00 per head.

Section 3. Whoever shall interfere with or resist any inspector or range rider in the performance of his duties as herein defined, or shall interfere with or resist any person while driving tick infested, or exposed cattle, horses or mules to a pound or quarantine pasture or dipping vat, or shall interfere with or molest such animals while in pound or quarantine pasture, or shall wantonly or maliciously open, destroy or damage the enclosures of any pound or quarantine pasture or dipping vat, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and on trial and conviction shall be fined not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$50.00, or imprisoned for not less than ten days, nor more than thirty days, or both at the discretion of the court.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances of this parish contrary to, or inconsistent herewith, and such ordinances or parts of ordinances only, be and are hereby repealed.

On motion of Mr. Ottermann, seconded by Mr. Petit, the following ordinance was adopted.

ORDINANCE

An ordinance to authorize the president, on behalf of the Police Jury to borrow from the New Jail Sinking Fund the sum of \$8,700.00 and the sum of \$1,000.00 from the Road District No. 3 to pay current expenses of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1929, dedicating, appropriating and setting aside the amount borrowed out of the taxes and revenues of the Parish of Jefferson, for the year 1929, to pay the amount borrowed.

SECTION 1.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, in regular meeting assembled, that the President be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow from the New Jail Sinking Fund the sum of \$8,700.00 and from the sinking fund of Road District No. 3 the sum of \$1,000.00 on behalf of the Police Jury for

the purpose of paying the current expenses of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, for the year 1929.

SECTION 11

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, that for amount borrowed, the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, hereby dedicated appropriates and sets aside the sum of \$9,700.00 out of the revenues and taxes of the Parish of Jefferson, for the year 1929, to pay the amount borrowed;
