

the ward in which inhabitants reside and to be used for the benefit of the roads in said ward as this Jury may direct; and in default of payment of said fine, the person so failing to pay to be imprisoned in the parish jail for not less than ten or more than thirty days; said imprisonment to be enforced by information or indictment before the district court, and it shall be the duty of the different Syndics of the parish to furnish the District Attorney or (District Attorney pro tempore) with a list of all such persons who fail to pay said fine without delay; provided, that any person so summoned shall be excused from road duty upon payment to the syndic by whom he may be summoned the sum of one dollar for each day he may be so summoned, said sum to be payable within the twenty-four hours next after the summons may be served .

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otherwise the penalty provided herein shall be enforced against him; said sum so paid to the syndic to be by him paid over to this Police Jury, and the same to be expended as heretofore provided.

Be it further ordained

That the ordinance shall not be so construed as to relieve certain corporations of their obligations to this Police Jury or Parish.

Be it further ordained

That weather the acting Syndic or other inhabitant be required to serve more than ten days on such road duty within one year, and that the acting syndic is hereby empowered to appoint, to act in his stead at any time, any competent person subject to road duty.

And be it further ordained

That whenever it may be necessary to make new cross bridges, or to repair an old one, the expenses attending the same shall be borne equally between the owner or occupants of all adjoining land within four arpents of such bridge.

And be it further ordained

That all ordinances, or parts of ordinances in conflict with the foregoing be and the same is hereby repealed

And be it further ordained

That the secretary be required to post in each ward of the parish of Jefferson left bank, in some conspicuous place, at least two copies of the foregoing ordinance.

Parish of Jefferson March 1st 1878.

To the Hon President and Members of the Police Jury Left Bank.
Gentlemen

On the matter of the petition of Mr. V. Fortier and the protest of Mr. Paul Koerber, referred to me I have the honor to report as follows

The Police Jury has a general power and supervision over the public roads, of the Parish, and is competent to make such rules and regulations relative to the same, as it may deem proper and expedient.

The Police Jury under the law may cause new roads to be laid out and opened; or ~~old~~ may cause any of the public roads of the parish to parish to be changed and altered with the consent of the contiguous property owners. R. S. 3364, 3368, 3385, CC 665

Now I find by reference to the minutes of September 3^d 1877 that the Police Jury ordered and directed the syndic of the ward to open Danquin Street, and to cause all obstructions to be removed, this action was had on a petition of the widow Saulet and was competent for the Jury to do because Daquin street is in one of the recognized Villages of the parish, and the Jury might in like manner cause any other street of the village to be opened to the public

And I find by further reference to the minutes of October 1st 1877 that a petition of

V. Fortier to open Daquin streed was received and granted This is virtually tantamount to the action of the Jury of the month previous and nothing more.

Only that which appears from the minutes is authority, and what dose not appear on the minutes dose not count and whatever the petitions of Mrs. Soulet and Mr. Fortier may have been is neather here nor there.

Moreover I would state that every person is presumed to know the Law applicable to his interest or case, and if he do not he acts at his own risk and peril, and must take the consequences l R. 86. 16 La 296.

And if the Widow Saulet or Mr. Fortier desired to have the direction of the public road turned or changed to Daquin Street & the old road at the same time stopped and closed, thay ought to have made a showing of consent of the continguous property owners according to law, and requested the Jury in its discretion to adopt an ordinance or special resolution to the effect desired.

However if the concent of all continguous property owners be obtained, the Jury may yet adopt an ordinance in the premises; or the Jury or its syndic may proceed summarly under the law to open and remove all obstructions to the road. R. S. 3380, 3386, CC. 861 - 4 No 2 3 La 563

Say 22 days at \$30 per month 22 - and on Feby. 7th 1876 the salary ordinance was repealed and the Justice remaned to his legal fees. That no salary ordinance exists from

Feb'y 7th 1876 until July 6th 1877 when saleary fixed at \$50.00/100 Fifty Dollars per month and continued at that rate until Sept 3^d 1877, when it was repealed and Justis remanded to his fees. Say fifty nine days at \$50 per. month amts, to \$94.99.



License Ordinances

An ordinance to establish the rate of licenses on trades and occupations or callings, and on the Keepers of any of the hereinafter enumerated establishments and business for the year A D. 1880.

Be it Resolved, That the rate of licenses for the year 1880 on trade, occupations, callings or other business, are hereby assessed and directed to be collected at the sums specially set fourth in the following sections.

Section 1 - Every person Keeping a race corse or ground or cock pit a license of \$250.00

Section 2 - Every person keeping a coffee house, bar room, tavern, cabract or grog shop a licenses of \$100.00

Section 3 - Every grocery or country Store with privilage of selling liquor at Store a licenses of \$50.00

Section 4 - Every restaurant, with privilage of furnishing wines or liquor at, table only \$25 00 but if sold at bar the licenses of grog shop.

Section 5 - Every peddler or huckster of Dry Goods, Fruits, Ice, Fish, oysters, in cart or wagon a licenses of \$5 00 on foot \$2 50 on horse, mule or other animal \$5 00 in skiff, lugger or other water craft \$10 00

Section 6 - Every peddler of Spirituous liquors or merchandise other than those specified in section 5 or person selling the same elsewhere than at his licensed store or place of business a licenses of \$100 00

Section 7 - Every peddler of beer cordials or mineral water a licenses of \$15 00

Section 8 - Every peddler of feed or meal a licenses of \$5 00

Section 9 - Every baker or butcher serving a Cart or Wagon a license of \$5 00

Section 10 - Every, frut oyster candy or mineral water stand license \$10 00

Section 11 - Every junk or rag dealer in cart or wagon a license of \$25 00, in water craft \$50 00

Section 12 - Every oyster, fruit or candy stand selling liquors a licenses of \$100 00

Section 13 - Every checker having boat and lines a. licenses of \$10 00

Section 14 - Every drift wood catcher, or person catching wood on batture other than his property a licenses of \$10 00 Ten Dollars

Section 15 - Every public Cart or Wagon Kept for hire a license of \$5 00

Section 16 - Every public ball a licenses of \$50.00.

Section 17 - Every other public entertainment, except those for the benefit of Church or Education a licenses of \$5 00

Section 18 - All licenses imposed by these ordinances shall be for the year ending December 31st 1880, the issue of Six Months licenses on and after the first of July, (and of Three Months licenses on and after the first of October 1880) are hereby -- authorized to persons commencing buisness at those periods but to such only

Section 19 - Every person doing business, or pursueing any avocation under authority of this ordinance, shall be required to keep hung or posted in a conspicuous place in his Store or place of buisness, proper licenses for the same, and failing in this shall be prosecuted for violating said ordinance

Section 20 - No licenses issued under this ordinance, unless with the written consent of the Police Jury or the President thereof shall be transferred; and every person transferring or accepting a transfer of a licenses without haveing obtained the consent as above provided, shall be liable to a fine of one Hundred Dollars, which shall be collected as other fines, and the license so transferred shall be void

Section 21 - All licenses issued shall be considered as subject to the provisions of this ordinance, and all other ordinances of this parish, now existing or which may hereafter be passed. No license granted shall be construed or understood to give permission to do, or continue to do, any act or business forbidden by any law or ordinance. Should the Police Jury by ordinance or regulation render impossible the carrying on or the continuance of any business for which a licenses shall have been taken out, the holder of the licenses shall have been taken out, the holder of the licenses shall be entitled to a proportionate return of the amount paid for the license, according to the time the business should be suspended; provided, that the revocation of licenses or suspension of buisness shall not entitle the party to any reclamation for discontinuance of his buisness or the closing of his place of buisness, nor shall any right to reclamation exist for the withdrawal of a licenses for cause or on complaint, or in any case arising from the fault of the holder of the license.

Section 22 All licenses imposed by this ordinance, on trade, occupation, or business commenced, or existing at any time during the month of January 1880, shall be due and collectable in said month of January, and if commenced in any quarter year thereafter shall be due and collectable in the first month of said quarter; and any person failing to comply with this ordinance, or transgressing any of the privileges granted, shall pay an additional fine of not less than the amount of the licenses hereby assessed for each and every offence with all cost attending the collection of the same

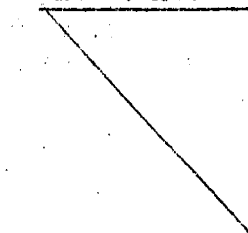

An Ordinance

Providing for the repairs of Streets, Roads, Avenues, Bridges and Ditches within the Parish of Jefferson Left Bank.

Whereas, In conformity with section 3364, of the Revised Statutes, the Police Juries of all the Parishes of this State, are authorized to pass all such Ordinances as they may deem necessary relative to Roads, Bridges and Ditches, and to impose such fines and penalties, to inforce the same as they may deem proper; to be recovered and enforced by ordinary process before any court of competent jurisdiction in the name of the Police Jury of the Parish

Section 1.

Therefore, Be it ordained that, on and after the passage of this ordinance, each and every member of the Police Jury be Ex Officio-Syndic in his ward without Compensation.

Section 2.

Be it further ordained That, a sum not exceeding eight dollars per month, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated and placed at the disposal of each syndic, to be expended by him in such manner as he may deem most expedient for Keeping the Public Roads in good order, a clearing and repairing the Bridges in said ward.

Section 3.

Syndic^s may appoint Deputies

Section 4.

It shall be the duty of the Syndic in there respictive wards to superintend the ward and repairs of the Roads, Bridges & Ditches, fulfilling all the duties prescribed to the inspectors of Road ec

Section 5.

At each regular meeting of the Jury the Syndic shall make a report in writing of the conditions of the Roads, Ditches & Levees in his ward, and allso of all money expended by him during each month.

Section 6.

All the leading ditches, draining the Public Road, and all the ditches on or bordering the fences, in front of properties, shall be kept in good order by the owner or occupant thereof to the satisfaction of the Syndic in each Ward; and any property owner or occupant who shall after haveing received due notice from the Syndic refuse to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$10.--nor more than \$20 - to be recovered-with costs by judgment before any Court of Competent Jurisdiction within the Parish of Jefferson, and-the said fine to be paid by the said Court to this Jury and be placed to the credit of said ward

Section 7

If in any of the wards the acting Syndic shall neglect or refuse to have such work done which is considered indispensable, it shall be the duty of the President after being duly informed to notify the said syndic of the Complaint made of, and proceed with two of the nearest Syndic to the locality complained of. And to have such repairs made as they may deem necessary at the expense of said ward.

Section 8

Must have 4 bars or 3 bars and a barbed wire lenthwise of the fence well secured on top & bottom. If of wire must not have less than 4 strands, secured to posts of standard size, not more than twenty feet apart, with a batten in center between posts. Wires to be secured firmly to posts, or Battens, with stapels or otherwise

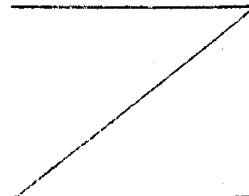

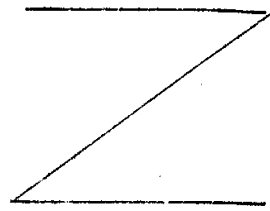

Section 3^d -Every Grocery or Country store with privilege of selling liquor at store a license of \$50.^{XX}

Section 4th -Every Restaurant with privilege of furnishing wines or liquors at table only \$25.^{XX} but if sold at bar \$50.^{XX}

Section 5th -Every peddler or huckster of Groceries, Dry Goods, fruits, Ico, Fish or Oysters in Cart or Wagon a license of \$5.^{XX}, on foot \$2.⁵⁰, on horse mule or other Animal \$5.^{XX}, in skiff, lugger or other water craft \$10.^{XX} And any person convicted of selling liquor in violation of this Section shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$50.^{XX} and not exceeding \$100.^{XX} one half of said fine to be paid to the informer and the other half to the Parish

Section 6th -Every peddler of spirituous liquors or Merchandise other than those specified in Section 5 or person selling the same elsewhere than at his licensed place of business or store a license of \$50.^{XX}

Section 7th. Every peddler of Beer, Cordials, or mineral water, a license of \$5.^{XX}

Section 8th. Every peddler of Feed or Meal a license of \$5.^{XX}

Section 9th. Every Baker or butcher serving in Cart or Wagon a license of \$5.^{XX}

Section 10. Every Fruit, oyster, cake, Candy or Mineral water stand a license of \$5.^{XX}.

Section 11. Every Junk or rag dealer in Cart or wagon a license of \$25.^{XX}, in water craft a license of \$50.^{XX}

Section 12. Every oyster, Fruit or Candy stand selling liquor a license of \$50.^{XX}

Section 13- Every checker having Boat & lines a license of \$5.^{XX}.

Section 14- Every drift wood catcher or person catching wood on Bature other than his property a license of \$10.^{XX}.

Section 15. Every public Cart or Wagon Kept for hire a license of \$5.^{XX}

Section 16. Every public Ball a license of \$50.^{XX}

Section 17. Every other public entertainment except those for the benefit of Church or Education a license of \$5.^{XX}

Section 18. All licenses imposed by these ordinances shall be for the Year ending December 31st 1882, the issue of six months licenses on or

after the 1st of July is hereby authorized to persons commencing business at those periods, but to such only.

Section 19. Every person doing business, or pursuing any avocation under authority of this ordinance, shall be required to keep hung or posted in a conspicuous place in his store or place of business, proper licenses for the same, and failing in this, shall be prosecuted for violating said ordinance_____

Section 20 No licenses issued under the ordinance unless with the written consent of the Police Jury or the President thereof shall be transferred; and any person transferring or accepting a transfer of a license without having obtained the consent as above provided, shall be liable to a fine of one hundred Dollars, which shall be collected as other fines, and the license so transferred shall be void_____

Section 21. All licenses issued shall be considered subject to the provisions of this ordinance and all other ordinances of this Parish now existing, or which may hereafter be passed. No license granted shall be construed or understood to give permission to do, or continue to do, any act or business forbidden by any law or ordinance. Should the Police Jury by ordinance or regulation, render impossible the carrying on or the continuance of any business for which a license shall have been taken out, the holder of the license shall be entitled to a proportionable return of the amount paid for the license, according to the time the business should be suspended; provided that the revocation of license, or suspension of business shall not entitle the party to any reclamation for discontinuance of his business, or the closing of his place of business, nor shall any right to reclamation exist for the withdrawal of a license for cause or on complaint, or in any case arising from the fault of the holder of the license._____

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ordinance on trade, occupation, or business commenced or existing at any time during the month of Jan'y 1882, shall be due and collectable in said month of January, and if commenced in any half Year thereafter, shall be due and collectable in the first month of said half, and any person failing to comply with this ordinance, or transgressing any of the privileges granted, shall pay an additional fine of not less than the amount of the licenses hereby assessed for each and every offense with all costs attending the collection of the same_____ And the above ordinances as amended were adopted

The question of the adoption of a Road ordinance and the election of a Farish Syndic was brought to the attention of the jury by the President, who, putting it to vote vevi voice was lost, the President then called Mr Robbins to the chair, and reading and ammending the old Road Ordinance section by section, it was on motion of L. An Ordinance.

Providing for the repairs of Streets, Roads, Avenues, Bridges and Ditches within the Parish of Jefferson Left Bank

Whereas, In conformity with section 3364, of the Revised Stautes the Police Jurys of all the Parishes of this State, are authorized to pass, all such Ordinances as they may deem necessary relative to Roads, Bridges and Ditches, and to impose such fines and penalties to inforce the same, as they may deem proper; to be recovered and enforced by ordinary

process, before any court of competent jurisdiction, in the name of the Police Jury of the Parish

Therefore, be it ordained that on and after the passage of this ordinance, that the Police Jury appoint a syndic at a salary of \$40.00 per month to be paid from the contingent Levee & Road funds.

Section

The, syndic may appoint Deputies in case of any emergency for Levee work, it shall be the duty of the Syndic, to superintend the work and repairs of Roads, Bridges and Ditches fulfilling all the duties prescribed to the Inspectors, of Roads & Levees.

Section

At each regular meeting of the jury the syndic shall make a report in writing of the conditions of the roads, ditches and levees in the Parish and also of all moneys expended by him during each month

Section

All the leading ditches draining the Public Road, and all the ditches bordering the fences, in front of properties and all necessary repairs on bridges, shall be kept in good order by the owner or occupant thereof to the satisfaction of the syndic; and any property owner or occupant who shall after having received due Notice from the syndic; refuse to comply with the provisions of this ordinance, shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$10.00 or more than \$20.00 to be recovered by Judgment before any Court of competent Jurisdiction within the Parish of Jefferson and the said fine to be paid by the said court to this jury and placed to the credit of the Road fund

Taxes being limited and considering that good Roads would greatly contribute to the prosperity and welfare of this Parish we earnestly request all good citizens and property owners to co-operate with the syndic and give such assistance as to secure for the benefit of all the enforcement of this ordinance.
