PREFACE

The Louisiana Historical Records Survey Project is a unit in the WPA Historical Records Survey Program headed by Dr. Luther H. Evans, Director. In the nation and in each state, the project operates under the administrative control of the Research and Records Section of the Division of Professional and Service Projects, Work Projects Administration. From its beginning as a nation-wide project late in 1935, the Historical Records Survey operated under the Writers' Project until November 1936, when it became an individual part of Federal Project No. 1. The Louisiana unit remained under the Writers' Project until March 1937. Since October 1, 1939, the work has been continued in Louisiana as a state-wide project in the WPA Historical Records Survey Program.

In Louisiana, the Survey began operation in March 1936 under Lyle Saxon. On March 10, 1937, John C. L. Andreassen became State Director of the Survey. Since March 6, 1938 he has been Regional Supervisor, first of the eleven states in WPA Region III, and since April 1939, of the five states in WPA Region VI. Since July 9, 1938, Vergil L. Bedsole has served as State Supervisor in Louisiana during the absence from the state of the Regional Supervisor.

The project is sponsored by the Department of Archives, Louisiana State University. Dr. E. A. Davis is the sponsor's representative. The project is co-sponsored by a considerable number of other governmental agencies as well. In this particular instance, the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish is providing the funds necessary for the publication of this series of volumes, as well as the Inventory of Parish Archives, for Jefferson Parish.

The procedures used in the preparation of these transcripts are detailed in the preface to volume I of this series, published in June 1939, pp. ii - iv. Verne F. Fisher is the editor in charge of transcription work in Louisiana.

It should be noted that these are the minutes of the Police Jury of the Right Bank; for a detailed discussion of the two parish police juries of Jefferson parish of this period see our Inventory of the Parish Archives of Louisiana, No. 26. Jefferson Parish (Gretna), University, Louisiana, January, 1940 and volume III A of the Transcriptions of Parish Records of Louisiana No. 26. which relates to the Jury of the Left Bank for the years 1871-1884. Note also that the French version of the minutes is no longer kept up.

General regulations and procedures applicable to all Historical Records Survey Projects in the forty-eight states have been followed in Louisiana. The officials of WPA in the state have given the project cordial support. The interest and cooperation of Jefferson Parish officials in our undertaking is most

gratifying. The Police Jury through its President, Weaver Toledano, Secretary William Hepting and Treasurer C. V. Bourgeois, assisted in making the minutes readily accessible, and in providing space and facilities for the work. Vic A. Pitre, Clerk of Court provided further needed facilities.

The Bill of J. Capas late Constable 5th Justice Peace, was referred to the Parish Attorney for approval.

The Bill of D. W. F. Bisbee Sheriff, was referred to the Finance Committee.

The following Ordinances and Rules of Order for the government of, the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson Right Bank, were unanimously adopted.

Ordinances.

Be it ordained by the President and Members of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson Right Bank. That the following Articles be adopted, and shall have full force and effect within the limits of the Parish of Jefferson, which are subject to the jurisdiction of said Jury, and all other Ordinances are hereby repealed.

All Bills against the Parish shall be presented to the Police Jury through their Secretary.

Districts.

Art. 1st " The Parish of Jefferson Right Bank shall be divided into Eight Districts, each of which shall be represented by one Member of the Police Jury, as follows:

Right Bank.

- First District, From the line of the Parish of Orleans to the lower Line of the P of Gretna.
- Second " The Village of Gretna.
- Third " From the upper line of Gretna, to the upper line of the plantation of L. A. Villars.
- Fourth " From the upper line of L. A. Villars' plantation to the upper line of L. Millaudon's plantation, extending in the rear as far as the Ross plantation inclusive.

- Fifth District From the upper line of L. Millaudon's plantation, to the upper line of L. La Branche's plantation.
- Sixth " From the upper line of L. La Branche's plantation to the upper line of the Parish.
- Seventh " The Barataria Settlement.
- Eighth " Cheniere Caminada, Grand Terre, and Grand Isle Elections.

Art 2 The annual election of the Members of the Police Jury, shall take place on the First Monday in June, and it shall be the duty of the President of the Police Jury to Issue Writs of Elections in the several Districts; in order to provide for said election; and the Members thus elected shall meet and organize on the First Monday in July.

In case of the failure of an Election, at any time, the Member or Members then in Office, shall hold over until his or their successors are elected, and all the acts, rules, and regulations, and Ordinances passed by the Board, thus holding over, shall be legal and valid, and as binding as if the same had been passed during the term for which they had been elected.

In case of any vacancy in the Police Jury, by death, resignation, or otherwise, it shall be the duty of the President, to issue Writs of Elections in the District were the vacancy shall have occurred.

Art. 3. Each Commissioner, at any Parish Election shall receive Two Dollars for his services, and No bills for refreshments furnished shall be paid by the Jury.

Art. 4. It shall be lawful for the voters of the Eighth Police Jury Districts to elect a non resident of said District, to represent them in the Police Jury, provided, the person so elected be a resident of the Parish, within the jurisdiction of the Jury.

Rules of Order
For the
Government of the Police Jury
of
Jefferson Right Bank.

Art 1. The Jury shall meet on the First Tuesday of each month, at 11 o'clock A. M.

Art. 2. Whenever the Jury may deem it necessary, they may adjourn to any other day of the month and to any other hour.

Art. 3. The President shall preserve good order and decorum, he may speak to points of Order in preference to any other member, and give his decision, subject to an appeal to the Jury by any two members. He shall give his

Opinion on all questions, or whenever the Jury shall exceed its power, without however taking part in the discussion. In case of disorder the President will have a right to order the disturber out.

Art. 4. No One shall have a right to speak during the sittings of the Police Jury, if he is not a member, thereof, without the permission of the Jury.

Art. 5. In case of absence of the President, the Jury shall elect by ballot a President Pro. tem.

Art. 6. If any member of the Jury transgress the present rules, it shall be the duty of the President to call him to order, and the Member so called to order, shall take his seat, unless the President or the Jury, on an appeal granted, allow him to explain himself.

Art. 7. When more than One member shall rise to speak on a subject, the President shall decide who shall speak first.

Art. 8. No member shall speak more than twice on the same subject, nor more than Once before those of the members wishing to speak, have been heard.

Art. 9. No member shall be allowed to vote on a question on the decision of which he is interested.

Art. 10. No motion shall be put to vote unless seconded, and each motion shall be Committed to writing and delivered to the Secretary; just as it had been adopted.

Art. 11. When a question is under debate, no motion shall be received but to adjournment, to lie on the table, postpone until another day, to Commit, or to Amend; which several motions shall have precedence in the Order in which they stand arranged.

Art. 12. When a motion has been Once made and decided it shall be in order for any member, who has voted, with the majority, to make during the session, and not after a motion to reconsider; and said motion shall be laid on the table and made the special order of the day, for the next meeting.

Art. 13. The member presenting a resolution which is referred to a Committee, shall be Chairman of said Committee,

Art. 14. Any member shall have a right to call for the yeas and nays, and enter his protest in the Journal of the day.

Art. 15. The sitting of the Jury shall be opened by the

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reading of the proceedings of the previous sitting.

Art. 16. After reading of the Journal, the Order of business, shall be as follows;

- 1st The unfinished business of the preceding meeting.
- 2^d Reports from standing Committees and their discussion.
- 3^d Communications from the Officers of the Parish.
- 4th Report from special Committees and their discussion.
- 5th All other business.

Art. 17. Whenever the Jury shall deem it necessary, they Can deliberate with closed doors; and in such case, all persons shall be requested to withdraw.

Art. 18. At the first sitting of each Police Jury; there shall be appointed by the President, two standing Committees;

(7, 8)

1st A Finance Committee, 2^d A Judiciary
Committee, and also a member of the
Parish Committee.

Art. 19. Two members of a Committee shall form a quorum, and all reports must be signed by a majority of its members; but the minority may also report.

Art 20. The Finance Committee shall take into Consideration the Report of the Collector, and all propositions relative to the revenues of the Parish referred to them by the Police Jury; they shall take Cognizance of the receipts and expenditures of the Parish, of its resources, of the arrangements which may be necessary, for the economy of the administrations, and they shall make a report at each regular meeting of the Jury.

Art 21. The Judiciary Committee shall attend to all suits in which the parish shall be a party; and give instructions to the Attorney of the Parish; provided, that it be not necessary that said Officer have the authorization of said Committee to bring suits for the recovery of fines on reports made to him. The same Committee shall, moreover, examine the accounts of the Attorney, before they are presented to the Jury, and all accounts for Judicial Costs, as well as the claims which might be Contested in law.

Officers

Art 1. The Officers of the Parish to be elected by the Police Jury, shall consist of:

A President,

A. Secretary, who shall also act as Tax Collector, and General accountant.

A. Treasurer.

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All Officers of the Parish, the Printer and Attorney excepted; shall be residents and voters of that portion of the parish, under the Jurisdiction of the Police Jury.

Art 2. The Officers of the Parish, except the President who shall be elected at the first meeting, shall be elected in the month of July of each year, by the Police Jury, newly elected; and in Case the election of said Officers, shall not take place, at the time, the Officers then in function shall Continue in Office, and act in their respective capacities until an election takes place.

In Case the Officers thus remaining in Office should not be elected, they shall be entitled, to their respective salaries in proportion to the time they shall have remained in function, and no more.

President.

Art. 3. The President shall be elected to ballot, and chosen from among the members elected, to serve in the Police Jury.

He shall preside over the deliberations of the Police Jury.

He shall have no right to take any active part in the debates, except after the appointing of a President, protem, who shall take his place in the chair.

In the election of Officers, and all others questions the President shall have the right to vote; but when he has voted he shall [be] deprived of the Casting vote.

The President shall sign the Bonds and Warrants issued by virtue of ordinances of the Police Jury, He shall issue writs of election for the annual election of members of the Police Jury, and also for the annual election of Commissioners in the several Villages situated on the right Bank, and in Case of vacancy, He shall received no salary as President.

Secretary.

Art 4. The Secretary shall be elected by the Jury for the term of One Year.

Art. 5. The secretary shall Keep a Record in English of all the proceedings of the Police Jury; and it shall be his duty to make them public, and promulgate the Ordinances or Resolutions in such manner as the Jury may direct.

Art 6. It shall be his duty to issue all notices of meetings of the Police Jury, or meetings of Committees when ordered by the Presiding Officer.

Art 7. He shall Keep a book in which he shall enter all accounts approved by the Police Jury, and the date of

their approval.

Art. 8. He shall Keep a separate book in which he shall enter all amendments of the Rules, and Regulations passed by the Police Jury, and also the changes therein under headings that will correspond with the digest of Ordinances.

Art 9. It shall be his duty to act as general accountant of the Finance of the Police Jury; and as such, he shall Keep such books as may be necessary to show at all times the precise Condition of the assets and liabilities of the Jury; he shall at each and every regular sitting of the Jury, report the Balance in the hand of the Treasurer, and accompany his report with a detailed account of the receipts and Expenditures since his last report, showing under their proper heads, the source whence the revenue is derived, and objets for which the disbursements are made; He shall as often as he may be required by the President of the Finance Committee furnished such statements relative to the finances as may be Called for.

Art. 10. The obligations of the Police Jury shall be signed by the President and attested by the Secretary, and shall bear upon their face the date of the Ordinance as Resolution authorizing their issue.

Art 11. Copies of all Contracts, leases, sales, and Bonds of Officers shall be filed in the Secretary's office; and all contracts, where an amount of Five Hundred Dollars, or more is involved shall be executed before a Notary or Parish Recorder, and all Contracts or Bonds and Copies thereof shall be executed at the expense of Contractors or Officers.

Art 12. It shall be his duty as soon as he shall have been notified by any of the Syndics or Inspectors of Roads and Levees, that any animal has been brought to the Pound to give notice by posters in the most public places, that if within the delay of Ten days the said Animal is not claimed, it shall be sold at public auction for the payment of the fines and expenses incurred; and if at the expiration of the aforesaid delay the animal be not claimed, he shall proceed

to sell the same at public auction, and he shall pay the proceeds of sale into the hands of the Treasurer.

Art. 13. The Secretary shall be ex-Officio Tax Collector, And he shall collect the Parish Taxes as fixed by the Police Jury.

Art. 14. He shall make a settlement with the Treasurer on Saturday of each week for the whole amount Collected by him; shall show the names of the parties from whom the Collections were made, the amount paid by each and

the nature of funds in which the payment was made.

Art. 14. He may appoint a Deputy by and with the advice and Consent of the Police Jury, and for whose acts he shall be held responsible.

Art. 15. He shall Call on all Tax payers personally or by deputy for Parish Taxes.

Art 16. The Secretary shall give bond with security to be approved by the Police Jury, in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars, for the faithful performance of all the duties imposed on him.

Art. 17. He shall receive in full Compensation for all services rendered by him in the different Capacities of Secretary, General accountant, and Tax Collector, and for all duties which may be imposed upon him by the Police Jury, the sum of Twelve Hundred Dollars per annum, payable monthly.

Treasurer.

Art. 18. The Treasurer of the Police Jury Right Bank shall be elected for the term of one year. He shall Keep a Cash Book in which he shall enter the different Items of receipts and expenditures numbering each voucher from No^o one upwards. The fiscal year ending on the 31st Day of December of every year; he shall Close his books on that day, and Carry the balance to new account.

Art. 19. It shall be his duty at each and every regular sitting of the Jury, to furnish a statement of the Balance in the Treasury, and he shall Keep an account in One of the State Banks, which shall be designated by the Finance Committee, where all funds liable to be deposited shall be Kept.

Art. 20. He shall pay no money out of the Treasury except upon a Warrant drawn by the President, specifying that the payment has been duly authorized by a resolution or Ordinance of the Police Jury, which shall be his voucher; and he shall require from any payer or depositor of any monies in the Treasury, upon his signing his receipt thereof, a certificate of the amount and the nature of funds so paid into his hands.

Art 21. The Treasurer shall Conform in the discharge of the duties of his Office, to the State Laws, relative to Parish Treasurers throughout the State, and passed at the legislative session of 1853 & 1855.

Art. 22. He shall give bond with good and sufficient security in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars to be approved by the Police Jury, or its Finance Committee, for the faithful discharge of his duties.

Art. 23. He shall receive in full Compensation for

services as Treasurer, the sum of Three Hundred Dollars per annum, payable monthly.

Art. 24. All checks on the Bank, drawn by the Treasurer shall be Countersigned by the President.

Art. 25. The Bank book shall be balanced every three months, and produced to the Finance Committee as evidence of the Balance on Hand. Syndics.

Art 26. Each member of the Police Jury shall be ex Officio syndic for his District without Compensation.

Art 27. It shall be the duty of the Syndic in the limits of their respective Wards, to superintend the works and repairs to the Levees, roads, bridges, and ditches, and to fulfil all the duties prescribed to the Inspectors of Roads & Levees-

Art. 28. In the month of July of every year, the Syndic shall Carefully examine the roads, levees, bridges, and ditches within their respective ward, and from the inspection, they shall draw up a general report of the Work to be made, and they shall send to each inhabitant a statement of the works that Concern him.

Art 29. The syndics shall send a Copy of said general report to the Police Jury,

Art. 30. The Syndics shall Keep a book in which they shall inscribe all orders given to them in their said capacity to the Inhabitants for repairs to the Roads, Levees, Bridges &c. and then report to the Police Jury, as also all denunciation for each violation of the Ordinances which may Come to their Knowledge, and for which a Fine may have been incurred to the Parish Attorney, or Collect the same, and it shall be their duty to lay such books before the Police Jury at each regular meeting.

Art. 31. The Syndics shall see that the Ordinances of the Parish, relative to the Levees, Roads, Bridges, and Ditches, and those relative to the Inns, Taverns, Coffee Houses &c. and the Police of the Parish be executed. It shall be their duty to report to the Police Jury any violation thereof, and in Cases where fines have been incurred to the President.

Art 32. Besides the general inspection which is to take place in the month of July of every year, it shall be the duty of the syndics at all times to see that the Roads, Levees, Bridges, and Ditches be Kept in good order, in their respective wards, and for that purpose to act as directed in the ordinances relative to Roads & Levees.

Art 33. The syndic shall be the principal Officer in his ward, and shall Kept a record of his transactions

in such Capacity.

Art 34. The Syndics may appoint deputies.

Art. 35. A sum not exceeding not exceeding Fifty Dollars per annum is hereby appropriated and placed at the disposal of each syndic, to be expended by him in such manner as he may deem most expedient in the fulfillment of his duties.

Police

Art. 36. It shall be the duties of the Syndics, to Kill or Cause to be Killed, all Hogs found at large, or that upon sufficient proof being produced, as to the Ownership of said hog or hogs, said Owner shall be subject to a fine of Two Dollars and costs, per head, recoverable before the proper Court, said fine to go to the informer.

Art. 37. It shall be the right of any person, and the duty of the different Syndics, to take up and impound all Goats and Sheep found running at large in this parish.

The syndic shall proceed to sell all goats & sheep so brought to the pound, after twenty four hours notice, given at the place where stray Animals are usually sold; if such Goats and Sheep are not claimed within said delay, and the same charges paid therefor as for other stray Animals. "See Strays."

Art 38. Every person who shall have suffered One or more noxious or ferocious animals to roam at large, who shall have set on, or shall not have restrained their dogs attacking or pursuing persons passing by even should no ill or injury result therefrom, shall in either of, and every such cases be liable to a fine of not less than Five, nor more than Twenty Five Dollars.

Art 40. Any person Keeping cattle within the limits of this parish, for the purpose of slaughtering, trading or selling the same shall Keep such Cattle within good enclosures, and shall in no case allow them the run at large, under penalty of a fine of not less Ten or more than Fifty Dollars, for each and every offence, besides being liable for all damages that such animal may cause and for all fines and charges imposed by Police Jury Regulations for Stray Animals.

Art 41. Any person who shall Knowingly allow harmed Cattle, horses, mules, asses, sheep or other stray animals to be Kept or used on his or her property, or the property in his or her charge, forty eight hours after such animals shall have entered, or be found on such property, shall be liable to a fine of not less than Ten nor more than Fifty Dollars for each and every offence, besides being liable in damages to the Owner of such Animal.

Art 42. Any person who shall treat cruelly without necessity, any useful animal, shall be fined in a sum of not less than Five nor more than Fifty Dollars.

Art. 43. Whoever shall without Just cause, Killed or wound any horse, mule, ass, horned Cattle or dog, or any other animal, the property of an other person, shall be fined not less than Five nor more than Fifty Dollars, and be furthermore liable to the proprietors or Owners of such animals for all damages incurred.

Art. 44. It shall not be lawful to allow any Stallions or Jacks to roam at large within this parish, and when any such stallions or Jacks shall have been impounded, the Owner or Owners thereof shall be liable to a fine of Five Dollars, for each and every stallion or Jack; said fine for the use of the Parish, besides being liable for fines & Costs imposed for Stray Animals.

Art. 45. Any person found riding on any Levee or Banquettes within this parish, shall be fined in a sum not less than Ten nor more than Twenty Five Dollars, for each and every Offence, One half to go to the informer,

and the other half to the Parish.

Art. 46. Any person having a horse, mule, or any other animal attacked with the glanders, or any other Contagious disease, who shall allow the same to roam at large, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Fifty Dollars, and the Syndic after having caused said disease to be ascertained by at least two inhabitants, shall Cause such infected animal to be destroyed and buried at the expense of the Owner.

Art 47. It shall not be lawful to Keep a Bear or other ferocious animal within this parish, unless said animal be so secured as not to endanger the public safety, under a penalty of a fine of not less than Ten dollars, nor more than Fifty Dollars.

Art 48. Whenever One or more animals or beasts die in any of the Villages of the Parish, or on any public road or highway, or on any levee or batture, or on any place near a dwelling house or habitation, it shall be the duty of the Owner or Keeper of such animals to bury them, or cause them to be buried, beyond the limits of any Village, and at a sufficient distance from any habitation, And in Case of neglect or refusal on the part of any person to Comply with this regulation, it shall be the duty of the Syndic, to cause all such animals to be buried at the expense of the Owner or Keeper thereof.

Art 49. In case the Owner of any dead animal be unknown, the syndic shall cause such animal to be buried at the Cost of the Parish, and he shall be allowed the following rates; to wit;

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For every Horse, Mule, Ass, or horned Cattle \$3. "

For every Sheep, Goat, Dog or Hog 1. "

The Syndic before presenting his bill for payment shall Cause the same to be approved by the member of the Police Jury, of the Ward said animal may have been buried, and he shall when requested furnish satisfactory proof of due diligence in search of the Owner.

Art 50. No person shall obstruct the footways and banquets, or the gutters adjoining the same under any pretence whatever, nor deposit anything whereby, the passage maybe in commoded, under a penalty of a fine of Five Dollars, besides being liable for the costs incurred by the Syndic, in Causing such obstructions to be removed.

Art. 51. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to wheel or drive any loaded wheel-barrow, or any Cart, Wagon, Carriage, or other vehicle, nor wilfully drive or ride any horse, mule, or Cattle, on the side walks within the Villages in this parish, under a penalty of Five Dollars, for each offence, the said fine for the use of the Village.

Art 52. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to place or deposit any wood, lumber, or other encumbrances, on any streets, road, Levee, or any other public place, under a penalty of a fine not exceeding Ten dollars for every day such lumber or encumbrance shall remain, after due notice given by the Syndic to remove the same, excepting when such wood, lumber or other materials shall have been placed on such roads, levees or streets for building purposes; provided, however, that said building materials shall not occupy more than One third of any street or road; and shall be allowed to remain

there only during the time the building is being put up.

Art. 53 All persons are forbidden to obstruct the running waters in ditches, or throw, or deposit it in any street, road, square or other public way; any filth whatever, under a penalty of a fine from One to two dollars for each Offense.

Art. 54. It shall not be lawful to fasten to the posts, boards, or other pieces of timber forming the Covering of trees, or to any other ornament put on the Levee, by the proprietors, nor across the roads, any barge boat, schooner, flat boat, or other crafts, or any raft or any object whatever, under a penalty of a fine not less than five, nor more than One Hundred Dollars.

Art. 55. It shall not be lawful to dig, or cause to be dug, any Necessary within three feet of any boundary line, under penalty of a fine not exceeding ten dollars for each and every day

such Necessary shall exist, after due notice given by the Syndic to remove the same.

Art 56 It shall not be lawful to run races on the public road or streets of this parish, and any person or persons thus offending shall be liable to a fine of Ten Dollars.

Art. 57. All persons are expressly forbidden to bathe or swim near the bank of the river (Mississippi) in front of any Villages or habitations after 5 O'clock A. M. or before 8 O clock P. M. or also to bathe in an unbecoming manner, or to remain naked on the river bank in sight of passers by, under penalty in either Case of a fine of Five Dollars.

Art. 58. All persons are forbidden to Commit any offence against the rules of public decency, to abuse, provoke, or disturb any person going or walking in the streets, roads, or other public highways, to disturb the peace and quietude of the neighborhood, by cries, noises, charivari, or otherwise, under a penalty on either and every Case, of a fine not exceeding twenty five Dollars.

Art. 59. It shall not be lawful for any person to place, throw, or deposit, on any public streets, roads, Levees, or other public highways, or to Keep on or about his or her premises, any filth, corrupt water, or other object injurious to public health or salubrity, under the penalty of a Fine not exceeding Ten Dollars. And if any person shall refuse to remove such nuisance, after due notice from the Syndic, It shall be the duty of said syndic to have the nuisance removed, at the expense of the Offender; It shall be lawful for the syndic to enter all premises where such nuisances are reported to exist; and it shall be his duty to see that this regulation be strickly enforced.

Art 60. Any person found in the premises of another, without the express permission of the proprietor or owner thereof shall, on Conviction be liable to a fine not less than Five, nor more than Fifty Dollars.

Art 61. Whoever shall enter into an enclosed field whether in Cultivation or not, without the permission of the proprietor or his Representatives; whoever breaks, down fences for the purpose of hunting or gaming on the lands of another; whoever shall fire with balls, or shot, towards the roads, or any inhabited houses, shall be liable for each and every offence, to a fine, of not less than five, nor more than

Fifty Dollars, without prejudice to the damages for which such offender may be liable.

Art 62. It shall not be lawful to open any fence or gate of any plantation, or other tract of land, without permission of the proprietor thereof, or his representative, under penalty of a fine not less than Five, nor more than

Twenty Five Dollars.

Art 63. It shall be the duty of the Syndics, to notify all Owners, occupants, possessors, agents or tenants of any property whereon any dead Animal, or other nuisance may exist to remove the same, within such reasonable time as from the nature of the nuisance, it may appear to the syndic that the same ought to be removed; and should said nuisance not be removed within the time prescribed, the syndic shall cause the same to be removed at the expenses of such delinquents who shall be, moreover, liable to a fine not less than Five nor more than Twenty Five Dollars.

Art 64. Any person Keeping a slaughter house shall Keep a book in which shall be registered the brand of every animal Killed in said slaughter house, and said book shall be open to the inspection of the public., And any person offending against this, and the following provisions shall be liable to a fine of Five Dollars.

Art 65 It shall be the duty of every Butcher or other person who shall slaughter or caused to be slaughtered any Animal, within the Jurisdiction of the Police Jury, to do the same in a slaughter house, and not in the open air, said slaughter house, and the lot on which it is situated shall be kept clean, all blood, and filth shall be removed immediately.

Art. 66. No blood, beeves feet, heads or any other matter, which may exhale a disagreeable odor, shall not be deposited or left in any street, lot or square of Ground within any of the villages in the Parish, under a penalty of from Ten to Fifty Dollars, for each and every offence.

Art. 67. If any slaughterhouse or lot upon which it is situated, emits or exhales any offensive odor, the occupant or Owner shall be liable to a fine of not less than Five, nor more than Twenty Five Dollars.

Art 68. If any blood, feet, heads, or other parts of slaughtered animals, are found in any slaughter house, or upon any lot within any of the Villages, which emit or exhale a bad Odor, the Owner or Occupant of said slaughter or lots shall be liable to a fine of Twenty Five Dollars.

Art 69. The Syndics shall visit, at least once in every week, each any every slaughter house or place where animals are Killed, and see that the provisions Concerning the same are strickly observed.

Art 70. It shall be the special duty of the several constables within the limits of the Jurisdiction of this Jury, to have all the Police Ordinances and Regulations of the same complied with.

Patrols.

Art 71. All male residents of the Parish above the age of Eighteen years, and under the age of Forty Five years shall be subject to Police duty, as ordered by the Cheif of Police, Parish of Jefferson, Right Bank, except in case of sickness, or some other plausible cause. Provided, any person called upon to perform patrol duty shall be permitted to put another person in his place.

The Patrols shall Consist of not less than three men; but in Case the public safety be threatened the Cheif of Police or Syndic, may order out any number of men they may deem necessary. The patrol shall have power to arrest all vagrants or suspicious persons they may meet on the road, or other place within their districts, and bring them before the Justice of the Peace, of the district to be dealt with according to law.

Rail Roads.

Art 72. All Rail Roads which Cross any streets or public highways, or any private roads shall be Constructed in such a way as to afford such a suitable slope or bank for the passage of Carts, Carriages, or other Vehicles.

Art 73. The Right of Way is granted to the New Orleans Opelousas and Great Western Rail Road Company, across, through, or along any streets, alleys, avenues, or highways, that may be desired by the said Company for their Rail Road in and through all this part of the Parish of Jefferson Right Bank of the Mississippi river, and over which the Police Jury have now the authority or right to grant legally the right of way, including Gretna, Mechanicham, &c. Provided, the said Company shall so Construct their road or Works as not to obstruct the free use of any street, avenue, highway or road.

Roads & Levees.

Art 74. Every Owner of land who shall let in water from the river through the Levee, shall be bound to secure the rivulet with a good timber work so that through the whole thickness of the Levee, the water so let in shall pass entirely upon the wood, without Coming in Contact with the earth; provided, that as well on the Levee as on the highway, across which said rivulet shall pass, said rivulet to be entirely Covered with a bridge; Provided, also that in no case shall such rivulet be wider than one foot; and that any person opening such an outlet, shall be held responsible for all damages arising therefrom.

Art. 75. Every Owner of lands situated on the Banks of any river, Bayou, or any other water Course throughout the Parish, shall be bound to give for the use of the public a road at least twenty five feet wide, on the whole front of his property; and Keep the land Constantly in good order and repair; according to existing Ordinances of the Police Jury, and such other ordinances as may be hereafter passed by said Jury.

Art. 76. Any party to whom money may be due for work done to roads by virtue of Ordinances of this Police Jury, shall have a privilege on the property, on which such work shall have been done, and such privilege shall have precedence over the other privilege, even over the vendor of the soil.

Art. 77 The breadth of the highways throughout the whole parish, shall be at least twenty five feet, and have a swell towards the Center, sufficient to facilitate the drainage of pluvial waters, and be lined on each side by a draining ditch, two feet wide and One foot deep. The roads when

passing on the Levees shall be of the same breadth as others.

Art. 78. The Syndics shall see that the regulations Concerning roads, bridges, ditches and levees are strickly enforced, and any person or persons, who shall refuse, or neglect to execute any of the work ordered by the Syndics, within the specified delay; shall be liable to a fine, which shall not exceed twenty Five Dollars, except in Cases especially provided for, and the Syndics shall have the work done at the expense of the Owners of the property, provided the amount of work does not exceed fifty Dollars, otherwise the Syndic shall let out said Work, by public sale to the lowest bidder.

Art 79. The Syndics shall cause to be removed immediately all trees, hedges, or other encumbrances that may obstruct the passage on the roads, and any person who after due notice shall refuse or neglect to remove such obstruction shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty-five dollars.

In this regulation are not comprised such trees as are planted on the side of the ways to form alleys, and not obstructing the passage.

Art. 80. The Owners of property fronting on Caminada Bay shall deliver and Keep in Order for public use a road along said Bay, in accordance with the regulations concerning roads.

Art. 81. Barbaria Road is hereby located as follows;

On the left bank of Bayou des Familles, from the plantation of J. P. Waters to Bayou Ouacha, thence on the right bank of Bayou Ouacha to the Rigolets. Resolution Dec^r. 6th 1847, of Police Jury of Jefferson.

Boats.

Art. 82. That within the limits of this parish, subject to the Jurisdiction of said Police Jury, no permanent check post shall be allowed to stand along the bank of the river Mississippi, in front of, or on any riparian estate, for the purpose of moving any species of Watercraft, unless placed by the riparian Owner, his agent or representative or with his or their Consent, and no permanent check post shall be allowed to stand, or be placed in front of any Village subject to the Jurisdiction of the Police Jury, along the bank of the river Mississippi, without the Consent of the Commissioners of such Village, and the Owner of any riparian estate, his or their lawful agent, tenant or representative, or the Commissioners of any such Village, in front of, or in which any such permanent check post may stand or be placed, may Remove the same, and in Case of opposition or resistance to such Removal may require the Syndic of the Ward to effect such removal, and in Case of application by any Owner or tenant of any riparian estate, or the lawful agent of such Owner or tenants, or the Commissioners of any such Villages, it shall be the duty of the Syndic of the Ward to cause to be removed any permanent check posts, standing in front of or on any riparian estate or Village, and he may employ a sufficient force for that purpose, at the charge of the offending party; and if any person or persons shall presume to oppose or resist the Syndic in the performance of his duty, such

person or persons shall be liable to a fine of One Hundred Dollars, for each and every offence which said expenses and charges, and fine shall be recoverable by the Attorney representing the Parish, for its benefit, before any Court of Competent Jurisdiction, without prejudice to the recourse of the riparian proprietors, Villages, or other parties injured, against the offending parties by action at law, and such legal remedies as the law affords them.

Art 83. That within that part of the Parish subject to this Police Jury, no raft, pirogue, barge, scow, steamboat, flat boat, schooner, ship, or any other vessel or Watercraft, shall be allowed without the Consent of the riparian Owner or Commissioners of Villages to remain moved along the banks of this Mississippi river, longer than ten days, in front of any plantation or estate having riparian or batture rights, or in front of any Village; and it shall be the duty of the Syndic of the ward in which any raft, barge, pirogue, scow, flatboat, steamboat, schooner, ship, or any other vessel or watercraft, shall be moored in front of any such

plantation or other estate or Village, upon the fact being reported to said syndic, by the Owner of such plantation or by a Commissioner of a Village, as the case may be, to give notice to the Owner or Owners, or to the Keeper or Keepers of such raft, pirogue, barge, scow, flatboat, Steamboat, schooner, ship or any other Vessel or watercraft to remove the same immediately, when the delay aforesaid shall have already expired, or if the delay be not expired, then at the expiration of the said delay of ten days, as the Case may be; and in case the removal be not effected in pursuance of the notice so given by the Syndics, the Owner or Owners, Keeper or Keepers of such rafts, pirogue, barge, Scow, flatboat, steamboat, schooner, ship or any other vessel or watercraft, shall be liable in solido to a fine, of Ten Dollars for each and every day, for each and every raft, pirogue, barge, scow, flatboat, steamboat, schooner, ship, or any other vessel or watercraft which shall remain in front of any such plantation, or other riparian estate, or Village, from and after the expiration of said delay of ten days; said fine and costs to be with privilege on such raft, pirogue, barge, scow, flatboat, steamboat, schooner, ship, or any other vessel or watercraft, without prejudice to the recourse of the riparian proprietors, Villages, or other parties injured, against the offending parties, by action at law, and such legal remedies as the law afford them; and the said fines shall be recoverable by the Attorney, representing the parish for its benefit, before any Court of Competent jurisdiction; provided, that the said Attorney, be, and he is hereby empowered and authorized, if he should deem it advisable, to [is] sue out injunctions, or to institute, in the name and on behalf of the Parish, such other legal proceedings as he may deem necessary for the purpose of Carrying this Ordinance with effect, and of obtaining the immediate removal of any raft, pirogue, barge, scow, flatboat, steamboat, schooner, ship, or any other vessel or watercraft remaining in front of any plantation or other riparian estate, or Village in violation of this Ordinance.

Bridges.

Art. 84. The length of the bridges throughout the limits of the parish under the Jurisdiction of this Jury, shall not be less than the breadth of the roads, and their width shall be at least three feet. They shall be made of planks of sufficient thickness, and supported by Joists placed at a distance of four feet from each other, and Constructed in such a way, as to be two inches below the level of the road.

Art. 85. Bridges on Canals shall be solidly constructed of planks, twenty feet long, and at least three inches thick,

They shall be secured with rails, and the ascent to them shall be easy and Commodious.

Carts, Dray &c

Art 86. All carts, Drays, Wagons, or other vehicles used as public Carriers, shall be subject to an annual Tax of Five Dollars each, and all private Carts, Drays, Wagons, or other vehicles used to carry Merchandise, as a private carrier on the public roads, shall be subject to an annual Tax of Two Dollars, and the Secretary on application to him shall issue a license to any Citizen of this parish for running the same, upon payment of the Tax above specified, One Dollar of said License issued by him, shall be allowed the Secretary, and in return therefor, he shall furnish two plates with the letters J. P. R. B. with the number of license.

And all such licenses shall expire on the 31st day of December of each year; and the Secretary shall inscribe in a book Kept for that purpose the names with the numbers of all persons taking licenses under the above provisions. Provided, that no License shall be required for such vehicle as are to be used exclusively on the proprietors property, or on the road in front thereof.

Cemeteries

Art. 87. The Union Cemetery Association is authorized to use Square N^o 25, (Original plan of Gretna,) as a burial Ground, and the Hook and Ladder Company N^o One, are also authorized to use as public Burying Ground Lot N^{os} One, Two, and Three of Square N^c 3 A, as per Original plan of Mechanicham, and also the Union Social Association in square N^o 28 in Gretna.

And it shall be the duty of the Secretary, Owner, or President of the different societies to Keep a record of the burials which shall take place in their respective Grave Yards. and shall make a monthly return thereof to the Secretary of the Police Jury, and in default of their Complying with the above regulations, the Sexton, President or Owner of said Grave yard, shall be subject to a fine not exceeding twenty five Dollars, for each and every offence.

Coffee Houses.

Art. 88. Any person Keeping a Tavern, Coffee House, or any other establishment for the sale of spirituous liquors shall have a sign in a conspicuous place of such establishment with the name of the proprietor, and Number

of the License, painted in letters and figures, not less than two inches in length under a penalty of Ten Dollars.

Art. 89. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons Keeping a tavern, Coffee House, Cabaret, or any other establishments, wherein beer, wine, or spiritous liquors are sold, to place or cause to be placed in front of the doors, or windows of such taverns, Coffee Houses, Cabarets &c, any screens, shutters, or any obstruction whatever, that might at any time prevent, or hinder a full view or sight of the bar or Counter; nor paint or cause to be painted, the glasses, of the doors or windows, of such establishment under penalty of a fine of not less than five nor more than Fifty Dollars, for each and every day, such, screens, shutters, painted glasses or any other obstruction, shall be kept up after notice given by the Syndic to remove the same.

Art. 90. All Tavern, and Coffee House Keepers, and retailers of Spiritous liquors are forbidden to Keep their Houses open after 9 O'clock in the evening from the 1st day of September to the 15th day of March, and after 10 O'clock in the evening from the 15th day of March to the 1st day of September, under penalty of a fine of Ten dollars for each and every Contravention, unless they be authorized so to do, by special permission from the Police Jury.

Art 91. All Tavern and Coffee House Keepers, are required to prevent all persons who may be in their establishments from disturbing by Cries, songs, noises, or otherwise the peace and tranquility of the neighborhood, and any person keeping a public house, who shall tolerate such a disorder in his or her house, shall pay a fine of Twenty Five Dollars, for each and every offence.

Art. 92. All penalties herein above mentioned, in Articles 89 and 90 shall be Over and above the penalties imposed by the State Laws.

Constables

Art. 93. In lieu of the Tax Costs which by existing laws, should be paid by the Police Jury in criminal prosecutions, the Constable for the Justice's Court sitting in Gretna, shall receive an annual salary of Four Hundred Dollars, payable monthly.

Art. 94. The Constable for the Justice's Court sitting in Gretna, where a temporary Jail exists, shall be entitled, for receiving and Keeping of prisoners, to the same fees, as are allowed by law to the Keeper of the Parish Jail.

Coroner.

Art 95. The Parish shall receive an annual salary of Three Hundred and Sixty Dollars, payable monthly, in full Compensation of all services rendered as Coroner, for which the Police Jury Right Bank, may be liable, and in Case of his refusal or neglect to make any inquest or inquests, the sum paid to a Justice of the Peace for holding such inquest or Inquests, shall be deducted from his salary.

Justice of the Peace.

Art 96. In lieu of the Tax Costs, which by existing laws, should be paid by the Police Jury in Criminal prosecutions, the Justice of the Peace for the Right Bank, sitting in Gretna, shall receive an annual salary of Six Hundred Dollars, payable monthly, It shall be the duty of the Justice of the Peaces imposing and Collecting fines to make

monthly returns to the Secretary of the Police Jury, and to pay the same to the Treasurer.

Fences.

Art 97. Adjacent proprietors of land shall Contribute equally to the making and repairs of the fences on their dividing line, The dividing fences shall in all cases extend as far back as the privileges of pasture or of Cultivation are enjoyed by both adjacent proprietors.

Art 98. All dividing fences shall be at least five feet six inches high, and when made with rails, shall be at least four rails with posts not less than two inches thick.

Art. 99. Whenever a Syndic shall be called upon to cause a dividing fence to be made, or repaired he shall summon at least two disinterested inhabitants to assist him; and according to the decision of said inhabitants, he shall order said fence to be put up or repaired, and fix the delay in which the same shall be done, And any person refusing or neglecting to Cause said fence to be made and Completed within the delay fixed as above, shall be liable to a fine of not less than twenty five, nor more than One Hundred Dollars, for each and every Offence.

Fines

Art. 100. Of all fines imposed by the rules and regulations of this Police Jury, One half shall go

to the benefit of the informer, and the other half for the use of the Parish, except in cases where it is otherwise specially provided.

Art 101. Parents and Guardians shall be held responsible for the payment of all fines incurred by minors, or wards, under their charge, for any violation of the Ordinances of this Police Jury.

Licenses.

Art. 102. All persons wishing to follow any of the trades or occupations, who Keep any of the establishments enumerated in the following sections, shall be bound to take out to that effect the Licenses assessed on the same as follows, or as amended.

All Licenses shall be payable in advance, and shall expire on the 31st day of December following.

Art 103. For each Coffee House, Beer House, or Tavern, where Wines, Beer or spirituos liquors are retailed by the glass, or when being sold in quantities more than a pint, or drank in the house, or about the premises a License of One Hundred Dollars.

" . 104. For each Coffee House, or Tavern, where a Grocery store is attached, or for any general store selling Liquor or retailing less than a gallon a License of One Hundred & Fifty Dollars.

" 105. For each Grocery store where Wines and liquors are sold, not to be drank on the premises, by the Bottle, or in any quantity not less than a pint, a License of Fifty Dollars

" 106. For each Grocery store, not previledged to sell Wines, Beer, or Liquors, a License of Fifteen Dollars.

" 107. For each Dry Goods store, where boots and shoes are sold a License of Thirty Dollars.

- Art. 108. For each Dry Good store, a License of Fifteen Dollars.
" 109. For each Store where Boots, or shoes are sold a License of Fifteen Dollars.
" 110. For each Retail Store not specified, above a License of Fifteen Dollars.
" 111. For each Feed Store, a License of Ten Dollars.
" 112. For each Corn Mill, a License of Ten Dollars.
" 113. For each Brewery, or syrup manufactory a License of Twenty Dollars.
" 114. For each Distillery a License of One Hundred Dollars.
" 115. For each Candie, Fruit, Oysters, or Soda Water stands, a License of Five Dollars.
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- Art. 116. For each Public Ball or Balls given in a Public House, a License of Five Dollars.
" 117. For the privilege of selling liquor at each Public Ball, a License of Five Dollars.
" 118. For each Butcher, a License of Ten Dollars.
" 119. For each Bakery, Bake shop, a License of Ten Dollars.
" 120. For each pedler of Goods, ware, Merchandize &c other than Wines and liquors, pedling on foot a License of Ten Dollars.
" 121. For each Pedler of Goods, Ware, Merchandize &c other than Wines and liquors, pedling on a Horse, a License of Fifteen Dollars.
" 122. For each Pedler of Goods, Ware, Merchandize &c other than Wines and liquors, pedling in Cart or Boat, with the Number, a License of Twenty Dollars.
" 123. For each Pedler selling spirituous liquors or Wines, a License of Fifty Dollars.
" 124. For each Cart, Dray, Wagon, &c used as public Carriges including the Number, a License of Five Dollars.
" 125. For each Cart, Dray, Wagon &c used by the Owner for his Own use on the public road including the number a License of Two Dollars. Out of which one Dollar is allowed to the Secretary for painting and furnishing said Number.
" 126. Any person or persons who shall enter into any of the Trades or occupations enumerated in the foregoing sections without having priviously taken out a License to that effect, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding the amount of the License assessed on which trade or occupation, said fine recoverable before any Court of Competent Jurisdiction.
" 127. All Licenses obtained pursuant to existing ordinances shall be personal, and not transferable, except by express resolution of the Police Jury.
" 128. All Parish Committee Warrants, regularly drawn and authenticated by the Secretary of the said Parish Committee, shall be submitted for approval to the Finance Committee, and upon being approved by the Chairman of said Committee, shall be submitted to the Jury.

Strays.

Art 129. Shall be considered as strays;

All animals found grazing on the highways, or on the Levees and Battures, in front of the property of persons other than that of the Owner of said animals.

Also all animals belonging to persons not residing in the Parish, and found grazing at large, on the open field or Commons.

It shall be lawful for any person to take such animals to the Pound.

Art 130. The Syndic shall not receive any stray animals in the Pound without a Certificate, or note, signed by the person who shall have taken such animals; and when the Syndic shall have arrested them himself, he shall Cause the fact to be Known by at least of his neighbors.

Art 131. If any person or persons shall stop or take away, or attempt to stop or take away any animals which may have been seized or arrested, in execution of Police Jury Regulations, whether he or they take them at the moment, when they are to be conducted to the Syndic, or to the pound, or by opening or breaking the gates, fences, or walls, so as to allow said animals to come out, before the costs and fines incurred have been duly paid; such person or persons on Conviction thereof, shall be liable to a fine of not less than five, nor more than Fifty Dollars, for each and every offence.

Art. 132. It shall be the duty of the Syndics as soon as any animal shall have been brought to the Pound, to notify the Secretary of the fact, giving as full a description as possible of the animal so impounded.

Art. 133. For each and every stray animal taken to the Public Pound, or delivered as strays to the Syndics, the following fees shall be Charged,

Fine	\$1. "
For keeping & feeding per day	".25.
" taking up and delivering to the Syndic	".25.

And in case the stray remains 24 hours in the Pound unclaimed it shall be advertised, and a further charge of \$1.50 shall be made.

Art 134. The Secretary shall sell strays at the Pound, or at some public place within the Jurisdiction of this Police Jury, as provided by Law.

Villages

Art. 135. The different Syndics shall order the removal of all fences crossing any streets, in any of the villages within this Parish, in a delay of Thirty days, at

the request of six property holders in such Village.

And any person who shall refuse or neglect to Comply with such Order of Syndics, shall be liable to a fine of Five Dollars, for each and every day said street shall have remained obstructed after the

delay allowed; And the Syndic shall cause such street to be cleared at the expense of the Offender.

Art 136 Any person or persons who shall divide, and lay out into squares, or lots, or otherwise subdivide any track of land, shall submit said plan of division to the Jury for approval, and deposit a duly certified Copy of the same in the Office of the Secretary. He or they shall moreover, take or put in good order all necessary ditches, bridges, and the division fences between the property so laid out, and the adjacent lands; which bridges, ditches, and fences, must be examined and duly received by the Syndic, Assisted by two disinterested land Owners of the vicinity.

Any person or persons offending against any of the above provisions, shall be liable in each and every case to a fine of One Hundred Dollars; and if the amount of said fine be not paid on demand to the Secretary, such offender shall be liable to a further fine of Twenty Five Dollars per day, from the date of demand, until fully paid.

Art. 137. The Commissioners of Public Works, in and for the different Villages shall be vested with the same powers and authority, which are Conferred on the Syndics, by the Police Jury Regulations, and the State Laws; so far only as it concerns the infringements of Ordinances relative to streets and sidewalks,

They are also empowered to cause all Nuisances to be removed and all dead animals to be buried, pursuant to the Ordinances, within the limits of their respective Villages.

An Act;

Authorizing the appointment of a Parish Committee by the several Corporations Comprising the Parish of Jefferson.

Section 1st Be it enacted &c. That on the First Sunday of July of ^h every year, the respective Councils and Police Jury in the Parish of Jefferson, shall separately appoint, out of their Own bodies, members to form a Parish Committee, the basis of representation of said Committee to be in proportion of the amount of State Tax assessed within the respective limits of said Corporations, but each corporation to be entitled to at least one member of said Committee.

Sect. 2

Be it enacted &c; That the duties of said Committee shall be; First, annually, and as soon as the assessment roll shall have been Completed, to determine and fine the prorata of Contribution by each Corporation, towards defraying the expenditures which by law bear upon the proportion of State taxes assessed within the limits of said Corporations. Second, to examine

all bills of claims which may be set up against the Parish, and to report upon them to the several Councils and Police Jury, who shall act finally thereupon.

Sect. 3. Be it further enacted, &c: That the Parish Committee shall have the power when deemed necessary to appoint a Secretary to Keep a Record of their deliberations, and also a Physician for the Parish Jail, but the salaries of said Officers which will be paid by the Parish Committee, shall be submitted to the respective Corporations for Approval.

Sect. 4. Be it further enacted &c; That the Parish Committee shall in no case have the power to enter into any Contract, binding the Corporations of the Parish of Jefferson, without having been first duly authorized by special resolutions adopted by a legal majority in each of the Corporate bodies constituting the Parish of Jefferson.

An Act.

To create and establish two Police Jury Districts, in and for the Parish of Jefferson. Acts 1858, page 103.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Louisiana, in General Assembly Convened, That that portion of the territory of the Parish of Jefferson, now under the Jurisdiction of the Police Jury, of said Parish, be and the same divided into two Police Jury Districts, as follows to wit: All that portion of the Parish of Jefferson, lying on the Right Bank of the River Mississippi; shall constitute One Police Jury District, to be known under the name and style of Police Jury of Jefferson Right Bank, and the wards thereof to remain as now divided by law and Police Jury ordinances, entitled each to one Police Juror. All that portion of the Parish of Jefferson situated on the left Bank of the River Mississippi, with the exceptions of the two Corporations known as the City of Jefferson, and City of Carrollton, shall form and constitute another Police Jury Districts, to be known under the

name and style of Police Jury Left Bank.

Sect. 2. Be it further enacted &c. That on the First Monday of June next and every year thereafter, an election shall be held in each of the several Wards for, One Police Juror, to serve for and during the term of One year; the said election to be held and conducted in the manner now provided by Law.

- Sect. 3. Be it further enacted &c, That the Police Juries created by the present law shall each, within their respective limits, have full power to perform all and every duty that is incumbent by law on the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, now superceded by the creation of two Police Jury Districts; as heroin before provided for.
- Sect 4. Be it further enacted &c. That the said Police Juries shall each be represented in the Parish Committee in the manner provided for; by an act entitled an act authorizing the appointment of a Parish Committee, by the several Corporations Composing, the Parish of Jefferson, approved March 19th 1856.
- Sect. 5. Be it further enacted, &c, That the Police Juries now created by the first section shall have power to make a settlement of all assets and liabilities, if any there be, of the Police Jury of Jefferson; the basis of which shall be the amount of State Taxes assessed within their respective limits.
- Sect. 6. Be it further enacted &c, That in the appointment of Commissioners to hold general elections, or the establishments of new election precincts, the two Police Juries shall meet, upon the call of either or both the Presidents of the said Police Juries, at the Court House in the City of Carrollton.
- Sect 7. Be it further enacted &c That the two Police Juries shall each have the power to alter the limits of the Wards, now established, or increase the number of said Wards, by a vote of Two-thirds of the members elected.
- An Act relative to Roads & Levees.
an act of 1855. N^o 212. Page 294.
- Sect 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly Convened, That

- The Police Juries of all the Parishes throughout this State, are authorized to pass all such Ordinances as they may deem necessary; relative to roads, and levees, bridges and ditches, and to impose such fines and penalties, to enforce the same as they may Judge proper and expedient, to be recovered and enforced by indictment or information.
- Sect 2. That the Police Juries shall direct in what manner notice shall be given to resident and non resident proprietary of the Works to be done to their Levees, roads, and ditches.
- Sect 3. That in all cases of adjudication of works to be done to the levees, roads, ditches, and bridges or other public works it shall be the duty of the officers adjudicating, the same, to cause the process verbal of adjudication, to be recorded in the mortgage record, which shall operate as a lien on the land, or in case of non-payment, the undertaker shall be entitled to an order of

seizure, and sale upon presentation of said act thus recorded, annexed to his petition, together with his oath showing the amount due him, and in cases of non-residents, it shall be the duty of the Judge to name an attorney for the nonresidents, upon whom service shall be made, as provided for in executory proceedings by the Code of Practice, and said Attorney shall be entitled to such compensation as the Judge may think proper, to be taxed as part of the costs. The order of seizure and sale shall be executed by the Sheriff of the Parish, without the benefit of appraisal in the same manner, and subject to the same formalities, as in ordinary cases of seizure.

Sec 4.

That whenever the works to the Levees, roads &c of any parish of the State shall have been made at the expense of the Parish, it shall be lawful for the Police Jury to sell the person for whose account the work or repair were made, and to obtain reimbursement of the said amount by privilege on the land subject to the works.

Sect 5.

That the general and special law relative to Roads and Levees, shall remain in force until the enactment of laws regulating the roads and levees, by the Police Jury, and no longer.

An Act.

Relative to Public Works and Improvements in the Villages of the Parish of Jefferson. See acts of 1856, N^o 55, Page 39 & acts 1858, N^o 20 page 15.

Sect. 1.

Be it enacted by the State and House of Representatives of the State of Louisiana in General Assembly convened, That on the First Monday of April 1856, and every year thereafter, there shall be elected by the qualified voters of each Village, situated in the Parish of Jefferson, Three Commissioners of Public Works, to act within the respective limits of each of said Village; the qualifications of said Commissioners to be a qualified voter and resident owner of real Estate in the village; the notice of election to be given, and the same to be held and Conducted in the manner now provided for by law, for the election of Members of the Police Jury in said Parish.

Sec. 2.

Be it further enacted, &c, That before entering on the discharge of their duties, the said Commissioners shall take the Oath of office before a Justice of the Peace, or President of the Police Jury, and within sixty days after their election the said Commissioners of each of the Villages shall make an estimate of the Costs of such works as may be necessary during the year, which estimate shall be posted

up in each village, in at least three of the most public places; and designating a day and place on which the sense of the qualified voters in each Village shall be taken by ballot; and should a majority of voters at said election vote in favor of the proposition submitted by the Commissioners, the said Commissioners shall without delay, proceed to lay and collect the contribution or improvement tax from the property holders in the manner hereafter provided for.

Sec 3.

Be it further enacted &c, That the Contribution or Improvement Tax shall be regulated as follows, to wit: Tax for the Cost of Construction or repairs of Levees, the Keeping in order of Roads, Streets and Bridges, the contribution levied shall be in proportion of the assessed valuation of real estate by the

State Assessor; and for the cost of sidewalks or banquettes, or repairs for the same, each proprietor shall be liable for the whole cost in front of his property. That all works to be done shall be let out to the lowest bidder.

Sec. 5.

Be it further enacted &c, That said Commissioners shall not be entitled to any compensation or remuneration for the performance of any duties performed by them, but they shall have power to appoint a competent person to collect the contributions levied, and to act also as disbursing agent; and the Compensation of said Officer shall not exceed ten per cent, on the amount Collected by him, and he shall be required to give a bond with good and sufficient security for the faithful performance of his duties, an amount at least equal to the amount to be collected.

Sec 6.

As amended in 1858, See acts of 1858, Page 15. N^o 20.

That in case there should be in front of any Village, a batture or front property which is the common property; or for the common use of all the property holders of the Village, it shall be lawful for said Commissioners to lease the same to the highest bidder, after public advertisement ten days previous to adjudication in the official paper of the parish, if any there be, and in at least two Newspapers published in New Orleans, for Warehouse buildings, depot or depots of merchandise, shipyards, or for the purpose of moving dry dock or docks, for a period not exceeding ten years, the amount of lease to be paid annually in advance; but should there be no bidders for the purposes above set forth, the said batture or front property, may be leased out for wood yards, but in that case the lease shall be limited to one year; It being well understood that the front of each street perpendicular to the

river shall be left free, and open for public use; and provided further, that the proceeds of such leases, shall be exclusively applied to defraying the costs of improvements in the Villages in front of which the bature may be; and provided further, that in all

- cases the Commissioners shall have the right to reject any or all bids if they see fit to do so.
- Sec 7. Be it further enacted &c, That the said Commissioners shall act separately in each of their respective Villages.
- Sec 8. That the several Commissioners in each of the Villages shall, at least once a year, and that on the first Monday of March of every year, make a detailed statement of their doings to the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, for purposes of publication.
- An Act Relative to Police Juries

- Sec 1. Be it enacted &c, That all the duties heretofore imposed on the Parish Judges by the laws of this State, in connection with Police Juries, shall be performed by the President of said Police Juries, if not otherwise provided for by law,
- Sec 2. Makes it the duty of the President of the Police Juries to order elections to fill vacancies.
- Sec 3. Police Juries to elect a President from their own body.
- Sec. 4. Election shall be conducted according to existing laws regulating elections.
- Sec. 5. That a vote of a Majority of all Members elect of Police Juries, shall be required to levy any Parish Tax, or to make any appropriation; provided, that in levying parish taxes, the Police Juries shall levy a uniform per centum, an every species of property, trade or profession, on which the State assesses a Tax.
- Sec 6. That the Police Juries of the several parishes for the State; before they shall fix and decide on the amount of taxes assessed in their respective parishes for the current year, shall cause to be made out an estimate, exhibiting the various items of expenditures, required for said parishes respectively, and cause the same to be published in one newspaper published in the parish; or in such parishes where a newspaper is not published, then by posting up written statements in at least

three of the most public places in such parishes, at least thirty days before their meeting, to fix and decide on the amount of taxes to be assessed as aforesaid.

Sec 7. That the President, when desirous of resigning, shall tender his resignation to the Police Jury.

Sec. 8. That nothing in the Fifth Section of this Act shall be so construed as the present police Juries in the River Parishes from levying a special Tax on land for the construction and support of the Levees.

Relative to the duties and Powers of the Police Juries of this State and the Constituted Authorities of Incorporated Towns & Cities. Acts 1853. Page 234. N^O 258.

Sec. 1. That the Police Juries of the several parishes of the State, and the Constituted Authorities of Incorporated Towns and Cities in this State, shall not hereafter, have power to contract any debts as pecuniary liability, without fully providing in the ordinance creating the debt, the means of paying the principal and interest on the debt contracted &c.

Sec. 2. That the ordinance or enactment providing for the payment of the principal and Interest of any debt created by the Board of Police, or authorities of Incorporated Towns and Cities, shall remain in full force until the debt and interest are paid.

Sec. 3. That whenever Police Juries or Authorities of Incorporated Towns or Cities shall have provided for the payment of a debt, by levying a Tax, and shall fail or refuse to cause said tax to be collected for the purpose of paying the debt and interests for which it was imposed, it shall be the duty of any District Court of the Districts in which such refusal or failure may occur, on motion of the Attorney of any of the Creditors of said Parish or Incorporated Town or City, after having obtained a judgment in their favor, to issue the mandate directed to the Sheriff or other Tax Collector

or Collectors, of the Parish or incorporated town or City, in which said Judgment may have been obtained to proceed forthwith to collect said Taxes in the same manner as is prescribed by existing laws; and the same shall be appropriated to the payment of said judgment and Costs; the Sheriff or other Tax Collector retaining the same Commissions as are allowed by law for the Collection of Parish Taxes, as compensation for his services.

I have the honor to Inform you that C. P. Ames M. D. was duly elected Sanitary Inspector for the portions of the Parishes of Orleans and Jefferson situated on the Right Bank of the Mississippi River, on March 29th 1870, to take effect on April 1st 1870, and that his salary was fixed at Fifteen Hundred (1500) Dollars per Annum.

Of this amount the proportion for the City of New Orleans is Eighty three 33/100. Dollars per month, and the portion for the Parish of Jefferson Right Bank, is Forty one 67/100 Dollars per month.

For each Coffee House, Beer House, or Tavern, where Wines, Beer, or spirituous liquors are retailed by the glass, or when being sold in quantities more than a pint, are drank in the house or about the premises, a License of One Hundred Dollars.

Art 103.

For each Coffee House or Tavern, where a Grocery Store is attached, as for any general Store selling liquor or retailing less than a Gallon, a License of One Hundred and Fifty Dollars.

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Art 104.

For each Grocery Store, where Wines and liquors are sold not to be drank on the premises, by the bottle or in any quantity not less than a pint, a License of Fifty Dollars.

Art 105.

For each Grocery Store not privileged to sell Wines, Beer or Liquors, a License of Fifteen Dollars.

Art 106.

For each Dry Goods Store, where Boots and Shoes are sold, a License of Thirty Dollars.

Art 107

For each Dry Good Store, a License of Fifteen Dollars.

Art. 108.

For each Store where Boots or Shoes are sold, a License of Fifteen Dollars.

Art 109.

For each Retail Store not specified above a License of Fifteen Dollars.

Art 110.

For each Feed Store, a License of Ten Dollars.

Art 111.

For each Corn Mill, a License of Ten Dollars.

- Art 112. For each Brewer or Syrup Manufactory a License of Twenty Dollars.
- Art 113. For each Distillery, a License of One Hundred Dollars.
- Art 114. For each Candy, Fruit, Oyster, or Soda Water Stand, a License of Five Dollars.
- Art 115. For each Public Ball or Balls given in a public House, a License of Five Dollars.
- Art 116. For the privilege of selling liquor at each Public Ball, a License of Five Dollars.
- Art 117. For each Butcher, a License of Ten Dollars.
- Art 118. For each Bakery, (Bake Shop) a License of Ten Dollars.
- Art 119. For each Pedler of Goods, ware, Merchandise &c other than Wines, and Liquors pedling on foot a License of Ten Dollars.
- Art 120. For each Pedler of Goods, Ware, Merchandize &c other than Wines and Liquors pedling on Horse, a License of Fifteen Dollars.
- Art 121. For each Pedler, of Goods, Ware, Merchandize &c other than Wines and Liquors, pedling in Cart or Boat with the Number, a License of Twenty Dollars.
- Art. 122. For each Pedler selling spirituous liquors or Wines a License of Fifty Dollars.
- Art. 123. For each Cart, Dray, Wagon &c used as public carrier, including the Number, a License of Five Dollars.

- Art 124. For each Cart, Dray, Wagon &c used by the Owner for his Own use on the public road, including the Number, Two Dollars; out of which One Dollar is allowed to the Secretary for painting and furnishing said Number.
- Art 125. Any person or persons who shall enter into any of the trades or occupations enumerated in the foregoing sections without having priviously taken out a License to that effect. shall be liable to a fine not exceeding the amount of the License assessed on which trade or occupation; said fine recoverable before any Court or Competent Jurisdiction.
- Art. 126. All Licenses obtained pursuant to existing Ordinances shall be personal, and not transferable except by express resolution of the Police Jury.
- The Yeas and Nays having been taken Messrs, Gardère, Harvey, Osgood Fazende, Muntz, S^t Amand, & Hubeau voted yea, and the same was unanimously adopted.
- On Motion of J. H. Harvey, seconded The Parish Tax for the year 1870 was proposed to be fixed at One per Cent,

The following report from the special Committee appointed to Consult with the Board of School Directors of the Parish of Jefferson Right Bank was read and ordered to be spread on the Minutes.

We the Special Committee appointed to Consult with the Board of School Directors for the Parish of Jefferson Right Bank, beg to report that upon the exhibit of the Secretary & Treasurer of said School Board, it appears that they as a Board have received in funds for School purposes from 25th March 1871 to 10th March 1872, the amount of \$6,508.35, that the total expenditures within the same time has been \$14,412.25, with a balance on hand of \$18.37, leaving an Amount due to teachers and for rent and incidental expenses of \$7,923.27 up to 1st June 1872.

Your Committee have been informed by the School Board that this debt incurred and due to teachers was incurred Conditionally with the said

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teachers and therefore Cannot be Considered as positively binding the Board to aid and assist the Schools of the Parish, and as far as is reasonable and proper to give them support, we your Committee would recommend that an amount equal to two mills on the dollar upon the taxable property within the Parish as per Assessment Roll of 1871, be appropriated for this purpose and to be paid quarterly as follows, viz: the Amount of assessment being \$1,980,965. the amount of the Two mills per dollar will be \$3960.93, Consequently that the Amount of \$990.48 would be the quarterly allowance made by the Police Jury.

And further your Committee would not Close their report without Stating to the Jury their regret that the finances of the Schools should have fallen into such a way, and would recommend greater Caution and economy in their administration for the future.

- Sixth, Proposals of F. H. Hatch to sell land, and offering to build: Court House & C. for the use of the Parish upon condition detailed in his said proposal.
- Seventh, Letter from L. Dolhande proposing to give and Convey to the Parish a title donating the whole of a square of Ground, or as much of it as will be needful for the purpose of erecting Court House, and other Parish buildings free of Charges, provided the Parish build upon the same a Court House and

other buildings.

After having discussed the several proposals the Jury took a recess of half an hour to examine the buildings of Philip Drumm and William Tell Hook & Ladder C^o. The Jury having reassembled; amoded propositions were received and read, from Harvey, Drumm, and William Tell Hook and Ladder C^o.

One Thousand Dollars per annum for each of the Second and Third Years, and Twelve Hundred Dollars per annum for each of the Fourth and Fifth Years, payable quarterly, and give also the privilege of renewal of lease for from One to Five Years at an annual rent of Fifteen Hundred Dollars payable as above.

The undersigned members of the Police Jury, of the Parish of Jefferson, Right Bank, have been appointed a Committee to call the attention of your Board to the Condition of the recently overflowed Districts in the rear of Gretna & Contiguous Villages, caused by the Cultivation of Rice, above & below said Villages, & to ask the consideration of the Board as to the Effect upon the public health resulting from such Cultivation & overflow.

Since the subsidence of the Waters large Surfaces are Covered with decomposing bodies of fish, marine animals, & animalculae giving out a very offensive, effluvial, which is believed to be the cause of the sickness now prevailing in that neighborhood.

The Committee are informed that the Cultivation of Rice is prohibited within a certain distance from the Cities of Charleston & Savannah, on account of its danger to the public health.

The dangerous period of this Cultivation is in the months of July & August, the time when Yellow Fever usually appears, & it is a question of Medical Science to determine whether the development of Malarial Fevers at this Season is likely to take the form of this dread visitant.

The careful investigation of the whole subject by your Board is respectfully requested with such action as it may be within your province to adopt & such suggestions to the Jury as in your Judgment the nature of the Case demands.

It is gratifying to your Grand Jurors, as well as to Law abiding Citizens to know that peace & harmony prevail all over the Parish of Jefferson-
