PREFACE

The Louisiana Historical Records Survey Project is a unit of the WPA Historical Records Survey Program headed until March 1, 1940 by Dr. Luther H. Evans. In the nation and in each state, the project operates under the administrative supervision of the Research and Records Section of the Division of Professional and Service Projects, Work Projects Administration. From its beginning as a nation-wide project late in 1935, the Historical Records Survey operated under the Writer's Project until November, 1936, when it became an individual part of Federal Project No. 1. The Louisiana unit remained under the Writer's Project until March, 1937. Since October 1, 1939, the work has been continued in Louisiana as a state-wide project.

In Louisiana, the Survey began operation in March, 1936, under Lyle Saxon. On March 10, 1937, the writer became the State Director of the Survey. Since March 6, 1938, Vergil L. Bedsole has served as Supervisor in Louisiana, during the absence of the writer from the State on regional business.

The project is sponsored by the Department of Archives, Louisiana State University, Dr. Edwin A. Davis, Archivist, and co-sponsored by some 65 governmental agencies throughout the state. In this particular instance, the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson has provided the funds necessary for the publication of this series of volumes, as well as the Inventory of Parish Archives, for Jefferson Parish.

The procedures used in the preparation of these transcripts are detailed in the preface to volume I of this series, published in June, 1939, pp. ii-iv. Hedda M. Johnson succeeded Verne F. Fisher as the editor-in-charge of transcription work in Louisiana. The indexes have been prepared under the supervision of David E. Lott. This volume has been duplicated under the supervision of Louise Webb.

General regulations and procedures applicable to all Historical Records Survey Projects in the forty-eight states have been followed in Louisiana. The officials of WPA in the state have given the project cordial support. The interest and cooperation of Jefferson Parish Officials is most gratifying. Special thanks is due Weaver Toledano, Wm. Hepting, C. V. Bourgeois and Vic. A. Pitre.

On motion duly seconded, the sum of \$100⁰⁰ or so much thereof as might be necessary, was appropriated at the request of Mr. Hock. for use of opening gaps in the rear protection levee and repair of bridge in 2d ward.

On motion duly seconded, the sum of \$150.⁰⁰, or so much thereof as might be necessary, was appropriated at the request of Mr. Gardey, for use in repairing damages in the 6th ward caused by the recent flood.

On Motion duly seconded, the president was authorized to purchase eight dozen electric light globes for use in the District Court building

The secretary reported the receipt of a communication from the Conservation Commission, announcing the opening of the deer season for Jefferson Parish on Sept 1st and the closing date Dec. 31.st

On motion duly seconded Geo. A. Cox was elected parish printer under the

terms of Act No. 141 of 1912, and the president was authorized to enter into and sign a contract with Mr. Cox to make all such publications required of him as parish printer for the price of \$500 ⁰⁰/_{xx} per year, said Contract to be for a period of one year.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were read and approved.

On motion, duly seconded, the regular order of business was suspended to allow Mr. A. T. Dusenbury to address the jury relative to the creation of a new drainage district.

After a discussion of the matter and consideration of the accompanying petition of property owners, the following ordinance was, on motion duly seconded, Adopted:

An Ordinance

Creating the Jefferson Drainage District No. 3, situated in the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, and appointing commissioners therefor.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular session convened, that there be, and there is hereby, created a drainage district, situated in the Parish of Jefferson, to be known as the Jefferson Drainage District No. 3, bounded and described as follows:

Bounded on the north by Bayou Aux Ories until said bayou intersects the section line between section 44 and 63, thence along this line to a point from which a line due east will intersect the northeast corner of the southeast quarter, of the northeast quarter of Section 63; thence due south along the line between Sections 62 and 63 until said line intersects Bayou Dupont; thence up said bayou to its intersection with Bayou Barataria; thence along Bayou Barataria to its junction with Bayou Aux Ories- being lots or Sections 3, 4, 5, 13, 23, 24, 25, 26, and that portion of 36 lying north of Bayou Dupont in Township 16 South, Range 23 East. The south half of the north half and the south half of Section 63; all of Sections 54 and 55 and that Portion of Section 45 lying north of Bayou Dupont in Township 16 South, Range 24 East. All that portion

of Section 6 in Township 17 South, Range 24 East, lying north of Bayou Dupont.

Section. 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that this Police Jury having received a petition

signed by the property owners of said drainage district owning more than two-thirds of the acres of land in said district, and the said property owners by petition having recommended the appointment of Isidore Fisher, A. B. Graves and A. T. Dusenbury, property owners of said district, they being assessed with property exceeding \$500⁰⁰, be and the said above-named parties are hereby appointed as commissioners of said drainage district; Isidore Fisher and A. B. Graves being appointed for two years and A. T. Dusenbury. for the term of four years.

Sec. 3 Be it further ordained etc; that all the duties imposed and conferred upon drainage district and Drainage commissioners as set forth in Act No. 317 of the acts of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1910, and amendment to Article 281 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana as adopted by the people at the Congressional election held on November 8, 1910, be and the same are hereby conferred upon said drainage district and the Commissioners thereof.

Sec. 4. Be it further ordained, etc; that the Town of Lafitte, Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana, be and is hereby designated as the domicile of the Jefferson Drainage District No. 3.

Sec. 5 Be it further ordained, etc., that the drainage commissioners herein appointed, and the two commissioners to be appointed by the Governor, who shall constitute the Drainage Commissioners of the Jefferson Drainage District No. 3, shall on 2nd, day of November, 1912, meet at Lafitte, Louisiana, at 10 oclock Am., at the residence of John Behn, in said town, as temporary headquarters, for the purpose of organization, and shall then and there elect from among their number a president and a vice-president and shall elect a secretary-treasurer, all as provided by Act 317 of the Acts of the General Assombly of the state of Louisiana for the year 1910.

Sec. 6, Be it further ordained, etc., that all ordinances of the Police Jury that may be in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

The regular order of business was then resumed.

Be it further ordained, etc., that such amount of the proceeds of sale of said road district bonds as may be necessary shall be issued for the purpose of paying for the cost of surveying the route of all roads above referred to, the cost of printing said bonds and the cost of the general organization and maintenance expense of said Road District

Be it further ordained, etc., that under the authority granted by the qualified property tax paying electors of Road District No. Two (2) of the Parish of Jefferson, at the election held August 6th 1912, the "right is reserved by

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the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, to levy from year to year, as same may become necessary in addition to tax necessary to pay interest and principal of bonds falling due each year a special tax not to exceed five (5) mills in any one year, in order to furnish the funds necessary to maintain the roads, constructed in said "Road District No. Two (2) of the Parish of Jefferson," and to maintain the organization of said road district, it be impossible at this time in the absence of data and experience to justly and accurately fix the amount necessary

Section: 1, That there is hereby levied an annual license tax for the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1913 upon each persons, association of persons, or business firm and corporation pursuing any trade, profession, vocation, calling or business conducted, pursued, carried on or operated within the limits of the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana, which may be subject to such license tax under article 229 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana.

Sec. 2, That the annual license hereby levied is declared to be the same as and to be graduated in accordance therewith, to-wit:-

with the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, now in force, and is hereby declared to be the same as to graduation and amount as the license laws of State of Louisiana now in force provided for State purposes and are to be determined in accordance with Act 171 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana of the Session of 1898 and the subsequent acts of the General Assembly of Louisiana. It is hereby declared to be the intention of this body to herein levy the same license tax for parochial purposes, both as to graduation and amount, as is now imposed by the General Assembly for state purposes, to which laws special reference is

hereby made as being part hereof for the purpose aforesaid; provided, further, that hereafter for every business of conducting a barroom, cabaret, coffee house, cafe, beer saloon liquor exchange, drinking saloon, grog shop, beer house beer garden or other place where spirituous, vinous or malt liquors, or intoxicating beverages, bitters or medicinal preparations of any kinds, are sold directly or indirectly, in quantities of less than five gallons, the license shall be based on the annual gross receipts of said business as follows, to-wit:-

First Class: When said gross annual receipts are \$50,000 or more the license shall be \$2,000.

Second Class: When said gross receipts are \$40,000 or more, and less than \$50,000 the license shall be \$1,800.

Third Class: When said gross annual receipts are \$30,000 or more and less than \$40,000 the license shall be \$1,500.

Fourth Class: When said gross receipts are \$20,000 or more and less than \$30,000 the license shall be \$1,200.

Fifth Class: When said gross annual receipts are \$10,000 or more and less than \$20,000 the license shall be \$1,000.

Sixth Class: When said gross receipts are \$5,000 or more, and less than \$10,000 the license shall be \$800.

Seventh Class: When said gross receipts are less than \$5,000 the license shall be \$500.

Provided, that no license shall be charged for selling refreshments for charitable or religious purposes; provided further; that no establishment selling or giving away of otherwise disposing of spirits wines, alcoholic or malt liquors in less quantity than five gallons shall pay a license of less than \$500; provided, further, that for the business of selling malt and vinous liquors, exclusively in quantities less than five gallons the license shall be on half of that provided for the general sale of alcoholic beverages; provided further, that nothing in this ordinance shall be so construed as to exempt druggists who sell alcoholic vinous or malt liquors or other intoxicating beverages on the prescription of a physician or otherwise from the payment of the license herein imposed; provided, further, that this ordinance shall not apply to the sale by druggists of tincture or drug compounds in the preparation of which such liquors or intoxicating beverages are used and sold on the prescription of a physician or otherwise, and which tinctures and compounds are not intoxicating beverages prepared in the evasion of this ordinance nor of the local option law; provided, further, that in all other respects the provisions of act 176 of 1908 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana are hereby adopted as a part of the ordinance and the penalties and procedure relative to the collection of said licenses therein provided are hereby adopted and made a part of the ordinance.

Sec. 3, That for all traveling shows giving performances in this Parish a tax of \$5.00 shall be paid for each and every day, performances are given.

Sec. 4 Be it further ordained, That the procedure in the collection of parochial licenses herein levied, and that to ascertain the amounts due for same by the tax collector, shall be the same as is now provided by

the law for state purposes, and particularly in Act 171

of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana of the session of 1898, as amended by subsequent acts of the said General Assembly and at subsequent sessions; and the penalties imposed upon and interests and costs to be collected from delinquents are declared to be the same and to be collected in the same manner as provided by said act of the General Assembly, as amended by subsequent acts, for state purposes.

Sec. 5, Be it further ordained, That the parochial licenses which are herein levied are declared to be for the purposes which may be required by the constitution and laws of this State for parochial purposes, Be it further ordained, that from and after the adoption of this ordinance the tax collector shall begin to collect from each of the persons and firms, associations of persons and corporations pursuing within the limits of said Parish any trade, profession, calling vocation or business a license tax as herein provided. All licenses shall be due and collectable during the first two months of each year, and all unpaid licenses shall become deligent on the 1st., day of March of each year, and all firms who commence business after that date shall become deligent unless the license is paid within ten days.

The role being called on the adoption of the above ordinance the vote resulted as follows:

Yeas---St. Martin, Schurb, Hock, Ehret, Terrebonne, Guidry, Gardey, Ristroph.

Nays---None.

Absent---Betz.

On motion duly seconded the following ordinance was adopted:

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that each automobile owner and operated by parties residing in Jefferson parish shall be subject to an annual license for the year 1913 of \$2.50, and each motorcycle so owned and operated shall be subject to an annual license for the year 1913 of \$1.00, all moneys collected from such licenses to go to the fund for building and maintenance of good roads.

On motion duly seconded, the following ordinance was adopted:

Dog Tax

Be it ordained by the Police Jury that a tax of \$1.00 is hereby levied on each and every dog in the Parish for the year 1913. Said tax shall be due and payable to the Sheriff of the Parish immediately after the publication of the proceedings of this meeting.

Be it further ordained that wherever and whenever the owner of a dog or dogs shall refuse to pay such tax, the sheriff shall have authority to put said dog or dogs to death by such means as he may elect.

Be it further ordained that all taxes collected by the sheriff from this source shall be paid over by him to the School Board of the Parish and shall be expended by said board in beautifying the school grounds and in keeping in good repair the public school houses in the ward or wards in which the house or houses are located.

Be it further ordained, that the sheriff be and he is hereby authorized to provide a tag, which is to be attached to the neck of the dog for which a license has been paid at all times; and the absence of this tag from the neck of said dog shall be full authority to any officer to kill said dog.

The Jury then adjourned.

The undersigned citizens and tax payers of wards Seven, Eight and Nine, Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, being and constituting more than one third of the property tax payers in said wards Seven, eight and Nine, Jefferson Parish, La., entitled to vote in the election herein prayed for in number and value, respectfully requests your Honorable body to order a special election to be held in wards Seven, Eight and Nine, Jefferson Parish La., for the purpose of submitting to the property tax-payers of said wards Seven, Eight and Nine, Jefferson Parish, La., who are qualified to vote in said election under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, the question whether they the said property tax payers, will authorize your honorably body, the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish to assess, levy and collect annually from year to year, for a period of ten years, a special tax on all the assessable property in said Wards Seven, Eight and Nine, Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, at the rate of five mills on the Dollar per annum, or at such other rate less than five mills as may be required to realize, collect and pay in each year the sum of seventy-seven hundred and fifty dollars, until the full sum of seventy-seven thousand five hundred dollars shall have been realized and collected during the ten years, for the purpose of aiding in the construction and operation of an electric railway on the east bank of the Mississippi River, extending from the Parish line between Jefferson and St. Charles Parishes, Louisiana, to the parish line between Jefferson and Orleans Parishes, Louisiana, such special tax to be annually levied and collected for each of the years 1914, 1915, 1916, 1917, 1918, 1919, 1920, 1921, 1922, 1923, and the proceeds thereof, up to the full total sum of seventy-seven thousand five hundred dollars, to be annually paid as collected to the Orleans-Kenner Electric Railway Company, as a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Louisiana and domiciled at New Orleans, Louisiana, or its successors or assigns, to be by it used solely in the construction and operation of such a railway, the benefits of the said tax to be however, forfeited unless the said railway shall be completed and in operation on or before the first day of April 1914, provided that in case of delay caused by litigation of any character regarding the construction or operation of said railway, or by unforeseen circumstances

beyond the control of the said railway company, there shall be added to said time mentioned a further delay equal to the time said construction or operation may have been retarded.

The undersigned requests that the special election be ordered and held pursuant to Article 270 of the Constitution of the State of

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Louisiana, Act 202, page 483, of the General Assembly of Louisiana, in the year 1898 Act 23, page 26, of the General Assembly of Louisiana, of the year 1904, and Act 43 page 68, of the General Assembly of Louisiana, of the year 1910, and in all respects according to law, not sooner than thirty days after the official publication of this petition and the ordinance of your honorable body ordering said election.

The undersigned finally requests that such ordinances shall be passed as shall be necessary to secure the election desired and the enforcement of same according to law after due and legal returns of said election by proper provision for the promulgation of such returns and for the annual levying of the tax hereinabove requested and described in the event of the favorable issue of such election.

Thereupon the following ordinance was presented by Mr. Ristroph and read, and on motion duly seconded, was adopted:

AN ORDINANCE

Ordering an election in pursuance to petition of the property tax payers entitled to vote, in wards Seven, Eight and Nine, of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, for the purpose of submitting to the property tax payers entitled to vote thereat, the proposition whether or not they will authorize the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, to levy and collect annually for a period of ten years, a special five mill tax on the dollar, or so much thereof as may be necessary, on all of the assessable property in wards Seven, Eight and Nine, Jefferson Parish Louisiana, so as to realize and collect annually the full sum of seventy-seven hundred and fifty dollars until the full sum of seventy-seven thousand five hundred dollars is realized and collected during the ten years, said tax to be levied for and said sum to be paid to the Orleans-Kenner Electric Railway Company for the purpose of aiding in the construction and

operation of an electric railway from or near the Parish line between Jefferson and St. Charles Parishes, and extending to the Parish line between Jefferson and Orleans Parishes, Louisiana; said special tax to be levied and collected during and for the years, 1914, 1915, 1916, 1917, 1918, 1919, 1920, 1921, 1922, and 1923, and the proceeds thereof, as above stated to be annually paid, as collected, to the said Orleans-Kenner Electric Railway Company, its successors or assigns; provided that the said railroad shall be completed and in operation on or before the first day of April 1914, except in case of unavoidable delays, beyond their control. And herein

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fixing the date and providing the manner of holding said election.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana, in regular monthly session, assembled, that by reason of the foregoing petition of property tax payers entitled to vote, which were presented and read, that an election of the legally qualified property tax payers, entitled to vote, of said Wards Seven, Eight and Nine, of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, be held on Tuesday the first day of April, 1913, at the polling places in said wards, at which the last preceding general or congressional election was held in accordance with the general election laws of this State, so far as applicable and especially Article 270 of the constitution of Louisiana, Act 202 of the General Assembly of Louisiana, of 1898 Act 23 of 1904, Act 43 of 1910 and Acts amendatory thereof for the purpose of taking the sense of the property tax payers entitled to vote, in said Wards Seven, Eight and Nine of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, upon the question of levying annually from year to year, for a period of ten years, a special tax of five mills on the dollar, or so much thereof as may be necessary, on all the assessable property in said wards Seven, Eight and Nine, of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, subject to taxation, so as to realize and collect annually the full sum of seventy-seven hundred and fifty dollars until the aggregate amount of seventy-seven thousand five hundred dollars is realized and collected during the ten years, and paid as collected to the Orleans-Kenner Electric Railway Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Louisiana, and domiciled at New Orleans, to aid in the building, construction and operation of an electric railway from, or near the Parish line between Jefferson and St. Charles Parishes, and extending to the Parish line between Jefferson and Orleans Parishes, Louisiana. Said special tax to be levied and collected for and during the years 1914, 1915, 1916, 1917, 1918, 1919, 1920, 1921, 1922 and 1923, and the proceeds thereof as above stated to be annually paid, as collected, to the said Orleans-Kenner Electric Railway Company, its successors or assigns, provided; that the said railroad shall be completed and in operation on or before the first day of April 1914, except that in case of delays caused by litigation of any character regarding the construction of said railway, or unforeseen circumstances beyond the control of said company, there shall be added to said time mentioned, a further delay equal to the time said construction was retarded.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, that the petition of the tax payers and notice of election fixing the time and polling place and the manner of holding said election, and giving names and commissioners of

election, and prescribing the manner of counting the votes and making returns thereof shall be published for more than thirty days preceding the holding of said election, in the official journal of Jefferson Parish.

Section 3. Be it further ordained etc., that all of the property tax payers voting at this election shall be registered voters (Except Women tax payers) of Wards Seven, Eight and Nine, Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, and

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that in order to determine the assessed value of the property to be voted, the voter shall endorse his name on the ballot, together with the amount of property voted, before depositing the same in the ballot box; the form of the ballot to be used at said election shall be as follows;

For a special tax of 5 mills, or so much of said five mills as may be necessary to produce each year for a period of ten years, seventy-seven hundred and fifty dollars, thus aggregating the sum of seventy-seven thousand five hundred dollars beginning with the year 1914, and extending to and including the year 1923, in aid of and for the benefit of the Orleans-Kenner Electric Railway Company.

AGAINST the special tax of 5 mills or so much of said 5 mills as may be necessary to produce each year for a period of ten years; seventy-seven hundred and fifty dollars, thus aggregating the sum of seventy-seven thousand five hundred dollars, beginning with the year 1914 and extending to and including the year 1923, in aid of and for the benefit of the Orleans-Kenner Electric Railway Company.

SECTION 4. Be it further ordained etc., that the tax assessor is hereby directed and required to furnish to the commissioners of election at each polling place in wards Seven, Eight and Nine, Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, a full and complete list of the qualified tax paying voters and those entitled to vote at this election, with the amount of property assessed to each.

Section 5. Be it further ordained etc., that the returns of said election shall be made in accordance with the law by the commissioners of election to the board of supervisors of election of Jefferson Parish Louisiana, and also to the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana not later than the second day of April, 1913, after said election, and the result of said election shall be promulgated by the said Police Jury, and also by the said board of supervisors of election in the manner prescribed by law.

SECTION 6. Be it further ordained etc., that the following named persons properly qualified tax-paying voters, are hereby appointed commissioners and clerk of said election, to wit:-

At Ward Seven: Emilio Geisenhoimer, Edward O'Dwyer, A. H. Ahten, commissioners; Joseph Roach, Clerk.

At Ward Eight:- A. S. Thompson, Alfred Bonnabot, Chas. Root, commissioners; Frank Faget, Clerk.

At ward Nine:- J. T. Fitzgerald, E. J. Deshautreaux, John Clancy Commissioners; E. Lochbaum, Clerk.

SECTION 7. Be it further ordained etc., that this ordinance shall

take effect from and after its promulgation. The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance the vote resulted as follows:-

Yeas: St. Martin, Schurb, Hock, Ehret, Terrebonne, Guidry, Gardey, Ristroph, Betz.

NAYS: NONE.

Petition from Citizens and property holders of West Wego was read, asking that the Police Jury take steps to have the landing place of the Westwego ferry

removed from its present location to Sala Avenue.

On motion duly seconded, the following resolution was adopted:

Be it resolved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, That the head of Sala Avenue or First Avenue in Westwego, be and the same is hereby fixed by this jury as the landing Place for the ferry at said point.

Be it further resolved, That the Secretary be and he is hereby instructed to notify the Westwego Ferry Company to establish their landing at the above place and establish such boat landing or ferry house and all other equipment as may be required by the franchise.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance, the vote resulted as follows:

Yeas: St. Martin, Schurb, Hock, Ehret, Terrebonne, Guidry, Gardy, Ristroph, Betz.

NAYS: NONE.

On Motion duly seconded, the following resolution was read and adopted:

Whereas, there has been collected in Road District No. 1 and No. 2 of the Parish of Jefferson, by a special 5 mill tax, for the purpose of constructing, improving and maintaining the public roads and highways, within the respective road districts, an amount of money equal to about \$10,000; and;

Whereas, the Louisiana Petrolithic Construction Company has already been awarded certain road contracts, which will about equal in payment the sum above stated; and,

Whereas, the said company is willing to proceed with the work immediately;

Be it resolved; That the President be authorized to use the funds so collected for the payment of such work; and that he be further authorized to cancel the first interest coupons on the road bonds of the said districts, thus releasing the districts from the obligation to pay the first years interest, for which purpose the funds cancelled would otherwise be used.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above resolution, the vote resulted as follows:-

On motion duly seconded, permission to operate barrooms for colored people was granted to Michel Moulliet, George S. Seymour, and Melchionne Lazarone.

On motion duly seconded, permission to operate a bar room for colored people was granted to Charles Jacobs, Mr. Terrebonne voting nay and Mr. Guidry voting blank on call of the roll.

The question of the ownership of the police patrol wagon and two horses was taken up, and after discussion, the President having announced that the wagon and one horse had been purchased by subscription with funds realized from social events given by the members of the late parish police force, it

was resolved that the wagon and one horse be sold and the money derived therefrom be turned over to the members of the late police force.

The question of the disposition of the other horse was then taken up. Mr. Ehret moved that the horse be sold, Mr. Hock offered as a substitute that the horse be turned over to him for use in the garbage wagon that is now being operated in his ward. On call of the roll the motion of Mr. Ehret was lost, and the horse was ordered to be given in charge of Mr. Hock, to be maintained by him; without expense to the Parish.

The petition of David Crockett Steam Fire Engine Company No. 1 and Mechanics Hook and Ladder and Hose Company No. 1, asking for an appropriation of \$100.00 each for repairs and fire apparatus, were referred to the finance committee.

The special committee appointed to investigate certain switch track privileges and waiting room at the head of Copericus Avenue requested by the New Orleans and Western Railroad Company, reported that they had granted the rights asked for in accordance with sketch submitted, subject to the approval of the parish surveyor.

On motion duly seconded the reports was received and the action, of the committee was approved.

H. L. Zander, special engineer of Good Road District No. 1, reported that he had started the preliminaries for the work of making the profile and estimate for the roads in the district, and on motion duly seconded, he was ordered to continue with the work.

Communication was received from Mr. John W. Todd, vice-president of the New Orleans Acid and Fertilizer Company endorsing report of special committee of the Police Jury recommending proposed extension of track of said company on Amelia Avenue, in Gretna, and on motion duly seconded, the communication was ordered filed, and the action of the special committee, in the matter was approved.

Communication from the Metairie Road Communication; asking the Jury to appropriate to the credit of said

THEREFORE, be it ordained, by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that the Fourth Drainage District is hereby created and its boundaries are fixed as follows:

All that portion of the Parish of Jefferson lying on the East bank of the Mississippi River and bounded by the lower line of the Parish of St. Charles Lake Pontchartrain, the upper line of the Parish of Orleans and the Mississippi River, And the territory thus included within said boundaries shall constitute a drainage district to be known as the Fourth Jefferson Drainage District and the said

Drainage district as thus organized is given all of the powers necessary under and by virtue of the terms and conditions set forth in Article 281 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana, and of Act 256 and 317 of the Legislature of 1910, and the amendments of said acts adopted by the Legislature of 1912; and the said drainage district, thus constituted by the Ordinance is given all of the Powers necessary to carry into effect work of drainage and reclamation of said district in conformity with the Constitution and laws herein above quoted.

Be it further ordained; that the said Fourth Jefferson Drainage District as thus organized, shall have the powers of a corporation under the law to incur debt, levy taxes, sue and be sued, hold necessary elections and to do and perform all of the acts incident and necessary to drainage and reclamation of lands conformably with the Constitution and laws of this State, and that the domicile of said drainage district is fixed at Kenner, Louisiana, within the limits of said drainage district, and that its board of Commissioners, as created by the terms of this ordinance, will meet for the purpose of organization on the 22nd., day of March 1913.

Be it further ordained, that conforming to a petition of more than twenty-five (25) property owners in said district, which comprised more than forty (40) property owners within its limits, Messrs A. H. Ahten, Peter Betz and E. J. Deshautreaux are hereby nominated and elected as the three Commissioners to be chosen by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson for the Fourth Jefferson Drainage District, Messrs A. H. Ahten and Peter Betz to serve for a term of two (2) years, and Mr. E. J. Deshautreaux to serve for a term of Four (4) years.

The President further stated that the said Ordinance and Notice of election referred to included a notification that the Police Jury would in open session at the hour of 12, M. on April 2nd., 1913 proceed to open the Ballot Boxes examine and count the ballots in number and amount examine and canvass the returns, examine the assessment rolls of the said wards for the year 1912, as well as the registration and poll tax rolls, and which was now in order.

AN ORDINANCE

An ordinance promulgating the result of Special election held in in Wards Seven, Eight and Nine of Jefferson Parish Louisiana, pursuant to the petition of the property tax payers of sid wards entitled to vote there-in an ordinance of the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish Louisiana, adopted at its meeting on February 12th,m 1913 as well as the notices of election by the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish on the proposed special tax of five mills or so much thereof as may be necessary on all the taxable prop-erty situated in wards seven eight and nine of Jefferson Parish Louisiana, annually for Ten years beginning with the year 1914 and extenng to the year 1923, inclusive so as to realize annually the sum of seventy seven hundred and fifty dollars or a total of seventy-seven thousand five hund-red dollars, for the said ten years, in favor and aid of the construction and operation by the Orleans Kenner Electric Railway Company of an Elec-tric railway from the Parish line between Jefferson and St. Charles Parishes to the Parish line between Jefferson and Orleans Parishes, La., upon condition that same be completed and operated on or before the first day of april 1914: levying the special tax and providing for the assess-ment and collection of the same and its payment when collected to the Orleans Kener Electric Railway Company.

Whereas, upon the petition of more than one-third of the property taxpayers entitled to vote in the election therein prayed for, and pur-suant to Ordinance of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, La., adopted on the Twelfth day of February 1913, and pursuant to a notice of election of said Police Jury of date March 1, 1913 the said petition ordinance and notice of election having been duly advertised by publica-tion in the Jefferson Democrat, a weekley newspaper and the official Journal published in Gretna, Parish of Jefferson, La., according to law, for more than thirty clear days prior to the first day of April, 1913, a special election was held according to law in Wards seven, eight and nine of Jefferson Parish, La., on Tuesday, the First day of April 1913, at the Polling places in said ward, at which the last general election was held, to-wit:- In the Seventh, Ward at Hylands, Place; in the Eighth Ward at Metairie School; in the Ninth Ward at Kenner Fire Com-pany's Hall.

Whereas, the returns of said election have been made according to law in accordance with the said ordinance and notice of election by the police Jury of Jefferson Parish, La., and,

Whereas the said Police Jury of Jefferson Parish, La., in open ses-sion at the Court House of said Parish, at Gretna, La., at the hour of

12, M on this the second day of April 1913, did proceed to open the bal-lot boxes of the said wards Seven, eight and Nine of Jefferson Parish La., examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns, examine the assessment roll of the Seventh, eighth and Ninth Wards, of Jefferson Parish, La., for the year 1912, as well as the registration and poll tax rolls, and after this having been done, and it was ascertained that Forty-seven votes of the Seventh ward having been assessed property value of Sixty-four Thousand eight hundred and twenty five dollars, Forty-nine voters of the eighth ward having an as-sessed property value of fifty-one thousand and fifty dollars, fifty seven voters of the Ninth ward having an assessed property value of fif-ty-four thousand seven hundred and fifty-five Dollars aggregating a to-tal of one hundred and fifty-three Voters, having an assessed property value of one hundred and seventh thousand, six hundred and Thirty dollars, hav voted in favor of the proposition of a special tax as embodied in ordinance hereinbefore referred to, and that One voter of the eighth ward having an assessed property value of four hundred Dollars, three voters of the ninth ward having an assessed property vala of twenty-seven hundred dollars aggregating a total of Four Voters, having an as-sessed property value of thirty-one hundred dollars, against said prop-

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osition.

And it appearing from the said registration, poll tax and assess-ment rolls that two hundred voters were legally entitled to vote at said election, these having an aggregate assessment of property amounting to one hundred and ninety four thousand three hundred and fifty-five dol-lars, it was thus found and ascertained that a majority in number and a-mount of assessed value of the property taxpayers of the seventh, eighth and ninth wards legally entitled to vote at said special election of A-pril, 1, 1913 had voted in favor of the said proposition of a levy of a special tax as provided in said ordinance; now, therefore,

SECTION 1, Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jef-ferson, La., convened in regular monthly session; that the said Police Jury does horoby declare promulgate and proclaim that the majority in number and assessed value of the property tax payers of said Wards Sev-en eight and nine of Jefferson Parish, La., legally entitled to vote at said election, voted in favor of said levy of said special tax as afore-said and does hereby proclaim and promulgate the result of said special election in favor of said special tax and in aid of the said Orleans-kenner Electric Railway Company.

SECTION 2. Be it further ordained that in accordance with the re-sult of the said special election, a special tax of Five (5) mills on the dollar, or so much so far as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby levied upon all of the assessable property in wards Seven, Eight and Nine of Jefferson Parish, La., subject to taxation annually, from year to year, for a period of ten years, so as to realize and collect annually the full sum of Seventy seven hundred and fifty dollars until the aggregate amount of Seventy seven thousand five hundred dollars is realized and collected during the ten years, and paid annually, as col-lected to the Orleans-Kenner Electric Railway Company, a corporation

organized under the laws of the State of Louisiana, and domiciled at New Orleans, Louisiana, through its proper officer or its assigns, after deducting lawful commissions for the assessment and collection of same, to aid in the building construction and operation of an electric Railway from the Parish Line between Jefferson and St. Charles Parishes to the Parish Line between Jefferson and Orleans, Parishes, Louisiana.

Said special taxes to be levied and collected in ten equal installments of \$7,500.00 each for and during the years, 1914, 1915, 1916, 1917, 1918, 1919, 1920, 1921, 1922 and 1923.

Said special tax to be levied and assessed and collected annually during said years in addition to other taxes as aforesaid, and the collection of same to be enforced by the same authority and means as is authorized or may be authorized by law for the collection of other taxes.

Provided, that the said railroad shall be completed and in operation on or before the first day of April 1914, except that in case of delays caused by litigation of any character regarding the construction of said railway, or unforeseen circumstances beyond the control of said Company, there is to be added to the time mentioned a further delay equal to the time of said construction was retarded.

Sec. Throo Be it further ordained that this ordinance shall take effect from and after its promulgation, according to law.

WHEREAS, by an ordinance of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson adopted on the 3rd. day of April, 1912, Road District No. One of the Parish of Jefferson, was duly created and its limits defined and WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Article 281 of the constitution of the state of Louisiana, and act 256 of the Geberal assembly of Louisiana, for the year 1910 the said Police Jury acting in the name and as the Governing Authority of Road District Number One of the Parish of Jefferson, did adopt an ordinance calling and providing for the special Election to be held in the aforesaid road district on June 2nd., 1913, for the purpose of determining whether or not it was the sence of the majority of the property tax paying electors qualified to vote under the constitution and laws of this State to authorize the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, acting as the governing authority of the aforesaid road district to incur an indebtedness of one hundred thousand dollars and to issue and sell negotiable semi annual interest bearing coupon bonds to evidence the said indebtedness the said bonds to bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum payable semi annually and the interest and principal to be payable in such amounts and in such places and times as the governing authority may determine to hold issue however to be paid within a space of forty years from the date of the bonds and both the principal and the interest to be secured and paid by sufficient tax to be levied and collected each in accordance with the provisions of article 281 of the Constitution of Louisiana, the said indebtedness and the proceeds of the said bonds realized from their sale at not less than par ~~value~~ to be used in constructing, improving and maintaining the Public roads and highways, within the aforesaid road district and more particularly the Metairie Ridge Road to Shrewsbury, and a road starting at the intersection of the Protection levee and oak street, to Shrewsbury and thence to Kenner, La., along a route between the Mississippi River and the Yazoo and Mississippi Valey Railroad.

WHEREAS, said election was duly held and conducted in accordance with law and the Ordinance of this Police Jury on June 2nd., 1913, and WHEREAS, in accordance with notice previously advertised, the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, did meet as the governing authority of road district No. One of the Parish of Jefferson in open session on the fourth day of June 1913, at the District Courthouse, in Gretna, La., and having opened the ballot

boxes returned by the Officers of the special election held June 2nd., 1913, having examined and canvassed the returns and having counted the ballots cast both in number and amount, did find the result to be that One hundred and Twenty two votes with a taxable valuation of One hundred and fifty nine thousand nine hundred and fifty dollars had been cast in favor of the proposition, the above mentioned and that no votes of taxable valuation had been cast against the said proposition and having made a process verbal in triplicate of the manner of the opening boxes and of the results found the Secretary was instructed to and did file one with the Secretary of the State, at Baton Rouge, La., which was duly recorded in book of special elections No. 3, kept by him another was filed with the Clerk of Court, for the Parish of Jefferson, and the same was duly recorded according to law, in Mortgage Book No. 46 folio 782, while the third was preserved among the archives of the Police Jury and WHEREAS the result of said special election was duly promulgated by the President and Secretary of the Police Jury by due publication of Saturday June 7th., 1913, in Jefferson Democrat the Official Journal of the Parish of Jefferson, and whereas the taxable valuations used in the said special election were based upon the assessment roll for the year 1912, since the roll for the year 1913, had not as yet been completed and filed at the time of the said election and as said assessment roll for the year 1912, shows as assessed valuation in road District No. One of the Parish of Jefferson, of One Million Five hundred and fifty-five thousand four hundred and twenty-four dollars, of which one hundred thousand dollars is less than ten per cent, therefore be it ORDAINED, by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, acting in the name and as the governing authority of Road District Number One of the Parish of Jefferson, that by virtue of an under the authority the authority granted and vested in this Police Jury by the law and the special election heretofore mentioned, it does hereby authorize, the incurring of an indebtedness of One hundred thousand dollars for the purpose of building good roads as above stated and to evidence and represent the said indebtedness the said Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, does hereby authorize the issuance of One hundred and fifty negotiable bonds to be numbered from One to One hundred and fifty both inclusive bonds numbered from One to One hundred inclusive shall be each of Five hundred Dollars (\$500) denomination, while bonds Numbered from One hundred and One to One hundred and fifty (101 to 150) inclusive shall be each of One thousand Dollars denomination,. Zander who is engineer for the First and Second Good Road District, the Supervisor and General Superintendent as well as Engineer, whose duty shall be to make plans and Estimates for the complete good roads as contemplated, to notify such property owners and to provide ditches, rights of way the moving of fences necessary to allow the road to be as straight as possible, to report the total estimated expense for said highways to make recommendations to the Police Jury, to consult the members wherein the road districts are located governing said roads and report their findings.

His compensation shall be paid out of the road districts on itemized bills for work performed exclusively for said roads.

Railroads or other corporations consolidating on said highways are to have their interest apportioned for any services rendered by said Superintendent and Engineer and chargeable to their account.

On Motion of Mr. Guidry, seconded by Mr. Hock, the following resolutions were adopted,

WHEREAS; The Orleans-Kenner Electric Railway Company appeared before the Police Jury of this Parish, in the early part of this Year and stated its intention of building and operating an Interurban road from the heart of the business center of New Orleans, through Parish of Jefferson to the boundary lines of the Parishes of St. Charles and Jefferson, and in order to further the project of such Interurban facilities the people of the Section through which the road was to operate voted by a practically unanimous vote on the First of April this year to levy a tax of five mills for ten years in aid of the construction and operating of such a road by the said Orleans-Kenner Electric Railway Co.,

And Whereas, the results of this election were duly promulgated by the Police Jury of this Parish on the 2nd., day of April 1913.,

And Whereas the said Orleans-Kenner Electric Railway Co., made a complete survey of the route for the construction of such a road and have by their actions shown every evidence of good faith in their plan to construct such a road. AND WHEREAS the said Orleans-Kenner Electric Railway Co., have been over six months litigimately endeavoring to obtain from the commission Council of the City of New Orleans, a franchise or right of way for a route into the heart of the business Centen of the City of New Orleans, over its own tracks, in order that the people of Jefferson Parish may have direct and streight transportation into the business center of said City.

And WHEREAS the Commission Council of the City of New Orleans, have rejected the application of the said Orleans-Kenner Electric Railway Company for said direct route.

WHEREAS, It is the sense of this Police Jury that unless a route is selected under which the Orleans-Kenner Electric Railway Company will construct this road the whole project will be defeated and both the Parish of Jefferson and City of New

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Orleans, will be deprived of the Material benefits to be derived from the construction of this route.

AND WHEREAS, It is the opinion of this Police Jury that unless a route satisfactory to the Orleans-Kenner Electric Railway Company is selected it will not bid on Franchise and that no other Company now in existance or to be organized in the future under present conditions would or could construct said railroad.

AND WHEREAS, That as in the opinion of this Police Jury the construction of an Interurban Railroad running from the Parish of Jefferson, into

Be it ORDAINED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, :
SECTION 1. That there is hereby levied an annual license tax for the Parish of Jefferson for the year 1914, upon each person, Associations of persons or

business firm and corporation pursuant any trade profession, vocation calling or business conducted pursued, carried on or operated within the limits of the Parish of jefferson, Louisiana, which may be subject to such license tax under Article 229 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana.

Section 2. That the annual license hereby levied is declared to be the same as and to be graduated in accordance with the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, now in force and is hereby declared to be the same as to graduation and amount as the license laws of the State of Louisiana, now in force provided for state purposes and are to be determined in accordance therewith; to-wit:-Act 171 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana of the Session of 1898, and the subsequent acts of the General Assembly of Louisiana, It is hereby declared to be the intention of this body to herein levy the same license tax for parochial purposes both as to graduation and the amount as is now composed by the General Assembly for State Purposes to which laws special reference is hereby made as being part hereof for the purposes aforesaid provided further that hereafter for every business of conducting a bar room cabaret, coffee house, cafe, beer saloon, liquor exchange, drinking saloon, grog shop, beer house, beer garden, or other place where spirituous vinous or malt liquors or intoxicating beverages, bitters or medicinal prepreations of any kinds are sold directly or indirectly in quantities of less than five gallons the license shall be based on the annual gross receipts of said business, as follows-to-wit:-

First Class:- When said gross annual receipts are Fifty thousand Dollars or more, the license shall be Two thousand Dollars.

Second Class; When said gross annual receipts are Forty Thousand Dollars or More, and less than Fifty Thousand Dollars the license shall be One Thousand Eight hundred Dollars.

Third Class: When said gross annual receipts are Thirty thousand dollars or more and less than Forty Thousand Dollars the license shall be One thousand Five hundred Dollars--.

Fourth class: When said Gross annual receipts are twenty thousand dollars or more and less than thirty thousand dollars the license shall be One thousand two hundred dollars,.

Fifth class:- When said gross annual receipts are ten thousand

dollars or more and less than twenty thousand dollars the license shall be one thousand dollars.

Sixth Class:- When said Gross annual receipts are Five Thousand Dollars or more and less than ten thousand dollars, the license shall be eight hundred dollars.

Seventh class, When said Gross annual receipts are less than five thousand the license shall be five hundred dollars.

Provided that no license shall be charged for selling refreshments for charitable or religious purposes, provided further that no establishment selling or giving away or otherwise disposing of spirits wines, alcoholic, or malt liquors in less quantities than five gallons shall pay a license of less than Five hundred Dollars. Provided further that for the business of selling malt and vinous liquors exclusively in quantities of less than five gallons the license shall be

ono half of that provided for the general sale of alcoholic beverages, provided further that nothing in this ordinance shall be so construed as to exempt druggist who sell alcoholic venous or malt liquors or other intoxicating beverages on the prescription of a phycial or otherwise from the payment of the license herein imposed provided further, that this Ordinance shall not apply to the sale by druggist of tinctures of drug Compount in the preperation of which such liquors or intoxicating beverages are used and soled on the prescription of a physician or otherwise, and which tinctures and compounds are not intoxicating beverages prepared in the evation of this ordinance nor of the local option option law; Provided further that in all other respects the provision of act 176 of 1908 of the general Assembly of the State of Louisiana are hereby adopted as part of the Ordinance and the Penalties and procedure relative to the collections of said license therein provided are hereby adopted and made a part of the Ordinance.

Section 3. That for all traveling shows giving performances in this Parish a Tax of Five Dollars shall be paid for each and every day performances are giving,

Section 4. Be it further Ordained that the procedure in the collection of parochial license herein levied and that to ascertain the amount due for same by the Tax collector shall be the same as is now provided by the law for State purposes, and particularly in act 171 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, of the Scession of 1898, as amended by subsequent acts of the said General Assembly and at subsequent sessions and the penalties imposed upon and interests and costs to be collected from deliquent are declared to be the same and to be collected in the same manner as provided by said act of the General Assembly, as amended by subsequent acts for state purposes.

Section five, be it further Ordained that the Parochial license which are herein levied are declared to be for the Purposes which may be required by the constitution and laws of this State for parochial purposes.

Be it further Ordained that from and after the adoption of this Ordinance the Tax collector shall begin to collect from each of the persons and firms, associations of persons and corporations pursuing

within the limits of said Parish, any trade, calling profession vocation or business a license tax as herein provided, all license are due and collectable during the first Two monts of each year, and all unpaid license shall become delinquent on the First day of March each year and all firms who commence business after that date shall become delinquent unless the license is paid within ten days.

Section Six, Be it further Ordained that each Automobile owned and operated by partics residing in Jefferson Parish shall be subject to an annual license for the year 1914 for Two Dollars and Fifty Cents, and each Motor Cycle so owned and operated shall be subject to an annual license for the year 1914 of One Dollar; all monies collected from such license to go to the fund for building and maintainance of good roads.

BE IT RESOLVED, That this Police Jury appropriate the sum of Two hundred and fifty Dollars or as much thereof as is needed, One hundred and Twenty-five Dollars for the digging of the Conrad Canal and the Balance to be expended for the Lafayette Madison, Monroe and Jefferson Canals, in the Second wards.

The Secretary was instructed to notify Messrs Sharp and Marrero to open up the drainage ditches through their property in order to drain the public road between Amesville and Westwego.

The Secretary was instructed to notify the I. C. R. R. Company, and the Y. & M. V. R. R. Company, to open up their culverts from Protection Levee to Shrewsbury,.

On Motion of Mr. Hock, duly seconded, the Clerk of Court was authorized to cancel the bond of J. S. Erlinger, former Parish Treasurer.

On Motion duly seconded the bills of the several syndics were re-

ferred to the finance Committeed as was also the request of the clerk of Court or certain supplies for his office.

Complaint was received from residents of Mechanicksham relative to the nuisance caused by the water discharge into the gutters by the N. K. Fairbanks, Company and on motion duly seconded the Secretary was instructed to notify all manufacturing plants to dis-continue the running of refuse water into ditches, and that if the practice is not stopped by the next meeting of the Jury, action will be taken to abate the nuisance.

The following petition was presented and read;

To the Honorable, President and members of the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish

The petition of the undersigned constituting a majority in number and amount of the abutting property of the holders along the public road in Jefferson Parish hereinafter mentioned, respectfully requests your Honorable body to advertise and sell on such conditions and specifications as your Honorable body may deem proper, a franchise to construct, Maintain and operate for ninety-nine years an electroc railway along and across the following roads,

Route 1. Commencing at a point on the Parish line between Jefferson and Orleans not less than Five hundred feet and not greater than one thousand five hundred feet south of the right of way of the Y & M. V. Railroad thence in a westerly direction through the village or settlement of New Carrollton and West Carrollton crossing Dagan Street, Lake Avenue and Brooklyn Avenue, thence in a southerly direction parallel

with brooklyn Avenue of West Carrollton to a point of not less than one thousand five hundred feet and not greater than two thousand five hundred feet from the Bank of the Mississippi River, thence in a westerly direction over and through private property at a distance of not less than one thousand feet and not greater than two thousand feet from the bank of the Mississippi River crossing Labarre Road to the Settlement of Harlem thence through Harlem crossing Harlem Avenue or Costa Avenue to the settlement of Shrewsbury thence crossing Hall Street, Shrewsbury Road or Severn Avenue and over private property at a distance of not less than one thousand feet and not greater than four thousand feet from the bank of the Mississippi River, crossing Pearch Street and Arnault Road to the corporate limits of the Town of Kenner.

Route 2. And also beginning at a point on the Parish line between Orleans and Jefferson at or near the intersection of Northline Street and said Parish line thence along Northline Street or in the vicinity thereof to Hector Avenue or in the vicinity thereof, thence along Hector Avenue or in the vicinity thereof, to its intersection with Friscoe Avenue, thence crossing Friscoe Avenue over and through private property in a Northwesterly direction to and crossing Metairie Ridge Road, thence along Metairie Ridge Road, the lake side or in the vicinity thereof in a westerly direction to its intersection with the Shrewsbury road or in the vicinity thereof, thence within a mile thereof connecting with

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the road to Kenner.

The Termini of said railway is to be as follows:

The Eastern Terminus of Route One, at a point on the Parish line between Jefferson and Orleans, not less than Five hundred feet and not greater than one thousand five hundred feet south of the right of way of the Y. & M. V. R. R. and the Western Terminus at the beginning of the corporate limits of the Village of Kenner, between the right of way of the Y. & M. V. R. R. and the Mississippi River.

The Western Terminus of route Two to be at or near the intersection of the Metairie Ridge road and the Shrewsbury road and the Eastern Terminus at or near the intersection of Northline Street and the Parish line between Jefferson and Orleans Parishes.

Your petitioners as aforesaid are abutting property holders along the public road hereinabove enumerated.

On Motion of Mr. Ristroph, seconded by Mr. Guidry the Police Jury proceeded to canvass the petition so presented and the canvass showing that a majority in number and amount of the abutting property holders on the Public roads and highways mentioned therein had signed the petition. The following Ordinance was then Introduced by Mr. Ristroph, seconded by Mr. Hock and was read and adopted, Section by Section and then the entire Ordinance was read and adopted as the whole.

ORDINANCE

Providing for the sale of a franchise for an Electric Railway along and across certain Public roads and highways in the Parish of Jefferson.

Franchise
of O. K.
Line

WHEREAS, Petitions have been presented to the Police Jury of Jefferson Parish signed by a majority in number and amount of abutting property holders along certain public roads mentioned therein praying that this police Jury advertise and sell the franchise to construct, maintain and operate for Ninety Nine years an electric railway and across said Public Roads, and

WHEREAS, as required by law, the Police Jury has canvassed the signatures to said petition and have ascertained that a majority in number and amount of the abutting property holders along the Public roads mentioned in said petition have signed the same therefore.

Section 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson that there be advertised for sale at public auction to the highest bidder for cash once a week for four weeks in the Official Journal of the Parish of Jefferson, the franchise right of way, and right to construct, maintain and operate for Ninety Nine years a single or double track Electric Railway (together with all tracks, curves, switches and other appertanances necessary thereto) along and across the following roads in the Parish of Jefferson but no bids shall be received or considered or no adjudication shall be made for less than one thousand dollars cash.

Route 1. Commenceing at a point from the Parish line between Jefferson and Orleans not less than five hundred feet and not greater than one thousand five hundred feet south of the right of way of the Y. & M. V. R. R. thence in a westerly direction through the village or settlement of New Carrollton and West Carrollton

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crossing Dagan Street, Lake Avenue and Brooklyn Avenue thence in a southerly direction parallel with Brooklyn Avenue of West Carrollton to a point not less than one thousand five hundred feet and not greater than Two thousand five hundred feet from the Bank of the Mississippi River, thence in a Westerly direction over and through private property at a distance not less than one thousand feet and not greater than Two thousand feet from the bank of the Mississippi River crossing Labarre Road to the settlement of Harlem, thence through Harlem crossing Harlem Avenue or Costa Avenue to the settlement of Shrewsbury thence crossing Hull Street shrewsbury road or Severn Avenue and over private property at a distance of not less than one thousand feet and not

greater than four thousand feet from the Bank of the Mississippi River, crossing Pearch Street and Arnoult division road to the corporate limits to the town of Kenner.

Route Two. And also commencing at a point on the Parish line between Orleans and Jefferson at or near the Intersection of Northline Street and said Parish line, thence along Northline Street to Hector Avenue, thence along Hector Avenue to its intersection with Frisco Avenue, thence crossing Frisco Avenue over and through private property in a Northwesternly direction to and crossing Metairie Ridge Road to the lake side thereof, or in the vicinity thereof, thence along the lake side of Metairie ridge road in a westerly direction to its intersection with Shrewsbury road or in the vicinity thereof thence within a mile thereof of connecting with the road to Kenner.

The Termini of said roads to be as follows:-

The Eastern Terminus or Route One at a point on the Parish Line between Jefferson and Orleans, not less than five hundred feet and not greater than one thousand five hundred feet south of the right of way of the Y. & M. V. R. R. and the western Terminus at the beginning of the corporate limits of the Village of Kenner, between the right of way of the Y. & M. V. Railroad and the Mississippi River.

The Western Terminus or Route Two to be at or near the intersection of the Metairie Ridge road and the Shrewsbury Road and the Eastern Terminus at or near the intersection of Northline Street and the Parish line between Jefferson and Orleans Parish.

The purchaser of this Franchise, right of way and right to construct maintain and operate an electric railway his successors and assigns shall be obliged to begin with Ten (10) days after the contract has been executed and accepted by the President of the Police Jury, the active construction of said Electric Road and shall prosecute said work continuously until completion of the entire line between the different Termini at Orleans Parish line and the Village of Kenner, as herein before mentioned, and shall complete and have in operation within ninety (90) days from the date of signing and acceptance of the contract as aforesaid that portion of said electric railway from the Corporate limits of the village of Kenner to or in the vicinity of Shrewsbury and within ninety days as aforesaid that portion of said Electric Railway from

or in the vicinity of Shrewsbury to either the Eastern Terminus of Route One or the Eastern Terminus of Route Two as hereinabove described, and within Twelve months as aforesaid to complete and have in operation said Electric Railway over which ever of the aforesaid Two routes viz:- From or in the Vicinity of Shrewsbury to the Eastern Terminus of Routes One and Two as hereinabove described may not be completed within the said ninety (90) days.

In default of which either through failure to begin active work and prosecute same continuously or to complete and have in operation the said electric railway with the time stated the said purchaser his successors or assigns shall be liable to the Parish of Jefferson as liquidated damages in the sum of Five thousand (\$5000.00 Dollars, under a bond to be furnished by the purchaser his successors or assigns hereinafter provided for.

Every bidder as a condition precedent to the receiving of his bid by the President of the Police Jury shall deposit with him in his said capacity in cash or certified check the sum of Five Thousand Dollars.

The deposits of all un-successful bidders shall be returned to them upon the final award of the contract.

The deposit of the highest bidder shall be held as security that he will sign the contract and give the bond hereinafter provided for as a guarantee that he will begin active work, prosecute said work continuously and have in operation the said electric railway within a time hereinabove stated.

In case of failure of the successful bidder to sign the contract and give the bond hereinafter provided for within five days after notice from the president of the Police Jury, that the contract is ready for signature the adjudication under this ordinance shall be null and void and the said Five Thousand Dollars shall be forfeited to the Parish of Jefferson as liquidate damages and in case said successful bidder shall sign the contract and give the bonds hereinafter provided for within the said five days the said five thousand dollars shall be turned to the said purchaser his successors or assigns.

The successful bidder shall be required within five days after notice from the president of the Police Jury that the contract is ready for signature to enter into a Notarial Contract before the Clerk of the Court and Ex-Officio Notary Public in the Parish of Jefferson, embodying all the conditions, terms and specifications set forth in this ordinance and furnish a good and solvent bond in the sum of Five thousand dollars that he will begin at his work, prosecute same continuously and have completed and in operation the said Electric Railway within the time hereinabove stated, and the President of the Police Jury is hereby authorized for and in the name of the Parish of Jefferson to sign a Notarial Contract with the party or parties, their successors or assigns to whom this franchise may be adjudicated subject to all the terms and conditions of this Ordinance and for the price of adjudication.

Section TWO. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., That the said Sale by President of the Police Jury shall be made upon the following terms, conditions and specifica-

tions.

CONSTRUCTION.

The Railway provided for herein shall be, operated by the system known as the overhead electric Trolley.

The Construction of said Electric Railway and of all tracks, Curves, switches, poles and other appliances necessary thereto and the type and weight of rail to be used shall be subject entirely to the approval of the engineer selected by the Police Jury.

All work shall be done in thoroughly first class manner, and the construction necessary to transmit and deliver current to the cars shall be in all respects according to standard methods and the most approved type, all subject to the approval of said engineer. The cars shall be of modern type and pattern and shall at all times be kept

clean and neat and in good order and condition, and shall be provided with ventilators.

The purchaser of this franchise shall have the right to enter on the public roads named herein to make excavations therein as may be necessary to construct, alter and repair the tracks, holes etc., provided for herein, provided that such public roads are restored to their original conditions, after completion of such construction, alterations or repairs.

The Purchaser his successors or assigns shall at all times maintain in good condition all drains, bridges and culverts crossed by their tracks and shall construct and maintain all drains, bridges and crossings which in the judgment of the Police Jury may be necessary.

SCHEDULE

Cars shall run as often as traffic and travel requires, but at no greater interval than every two hours, between five A. M. and 7 P. M. and every three hours between 7 P. M. and Mid Night, but after Three years from the completion and operation of the said road the schedule shall not be at greater intervals than every hour between 5 a. m. and 7 p. m. and every two hours between 7 p.m. and midnight.

Each car shall have a motorman and a conductor but where trailers are used not more than one conductor shall be required, the motor cars may haul one or more trailers.

RIGHT TO CARRY.

The purchaser, successors or assigns is authorized to use the road provided for herein for carrying mail, express and baggage as well as passengers, provided the cars used for the purpose shall be of the type in general use for such service and shall be maintained in the same manner both as to condition and appearance as the cars used exclusively for passenger service.

FARE

All fares shall be on the basis of not more than Two cents per mile but no single fare shall be less than five cents, except in the discretion of the purchaser of this franchise his successors or assigns.

DEPOSIT FOR ADVERTISEMENT

All bidders shall deposit with the President of the Police Jury an amount sufficient to cover all costs of advertisement for selling this franchise before their bid shall be received by him.

In case of adjudication the deposit of the successful bidder shall be applied to the payment of the costs of advertisement and selling and all other deposits shall be returned, it being the object of this provision of the Ordinance to avoid any liability on the part of the Parish of Jefferson for the Cost of advertisement or selling the franchise.

It is well understood that the purchaser of this franchise herein provided for or his successors or assigns may extend its line of railway the maintenance and operation of same provided the assent of the

Private rights to be acquired by purchase

proper authority is obtained.

PRIVATE RIGHTS OF WAY

It is well understood that portions of the right of way described herein may be owned privately and that the necessary rights through same shall be obtained or acquired by the purchaser without any cost to the Parish of Jefferson.

The purchaser of this franchise shall not have the right to transfer or assign the same to any person firm or corporation without first obtaining the consent of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, First had and obtained.

WHEREAS, there have been presented to this Body petitions signed by property holders along the public roads and highways to be crossed by an electric railway asking that this body advertise and sell according to law a franchise to cross such public roads and highways therefor,

BE IT RESOLVED, That in complying with the said petition this Police Jury still maintain until a final determination by the Court of the said case that its course in granting on December 3rd, 1913, with the right to cross certain Public roads and highways was legal and proper.

Creating the Fifth Jefferson Drainage District.
WHEREAS, There exists the necessity for the organization of a drainage District in the Parish of Jefferson on the West Bank of the Mississippi River; and,

WHEREAS, the owners of the lands in said proposed dainage district seemed desirous of having their lands incorporated within the limits of a drainage district.

THEREFORE, be it Ordained, by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that a drainage district be created in said Parish, comprising that Part of Jefferson Parish on the West Bank of the Mississippi River, bounded as follows:-

Location and Boundaries:

This Drainage District is situated partly in Township 14 South, Range 23 East, and Partly in Township 15, South, Range 23 East, between the Mississippi River on the North, Bayou Barataria on the South, Bayou Des Familles on the East, and Bayous Segnette and Boardeaux on the West.

Its Boundaries are as follows:-

Beginning at the Point designated by the letter "A" upon the map herewith presented, which point is the Northeast corner of Section 64, Township 14 South, Range 23 East, and thence in a southerly direction, meandering the west bank of Bayou Des Familles for a distance of Twenty-One Thousand Nine hundred and Ninety-four feet to point "B" which is the North East Corner of Christmas Plantation.

Thence South 34 deg. 45 min. East along the Easterly boundary of Christmas Plantation Ten Thousand Two hundred feet to point "C" which is the South East Corner of said Plantation.

Thence South 56 deg. west along the Southerly boundary of said Plantation 3,836.58 feet to point "D" which is the southwest corner of said plantation.

Thence along the westerly boundary of said plantation 18,255 feet to point "E" which will be the ~~interesection~~ intersection of this boundary line with the line dividing Township 14 South and 15 South.

Thence West along said Township line 2,900 feet to the point "F" which is the Southwest corner of Section 84, Township 14 South, Range 23 East.

Thence North along the Section line between Sections 83 and 84 and 79 and 80, 10,843.60 feet to point "G" which is the point of intersection of said section line with the southerly bank of Black Bayou.

Thence North 67 deg. East following the southerly bank of the Stella Plantation 4,600 feet to point "H" which is the point of intersection of said Canal Bank with the Northerly Boundary line of Section 64, Township 14 South, Range 23 East.

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Thence, South 83 deg. 30 min. east along said boundary line 6,980 feet to point "A" the point of beginning.

The whole of which boundaries are shown on a map attached to this ordinance and made part hereof, within the limits of which drainage district there are more than five land owners; that the said drainage district thus created by this ordinance with the boundaries as set forth shall be known as the Fifth Jefferson Drainage District and its domicile is fixed at Amesville in the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, the said domicile being outside of the drainage district, but more convenient of access from all parts thereof; that the said drainage district shall be governed by a board of commissioners composed of five members, three to be elected by this Police Jury and Two to be appointed by the Governor of the State; That the said Board of Drainage Commissioners when elected and appointed, is hereby given all the Powers of a corporation under the law and shall conform to the terms and conditions of article 281 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana, and of acts 256 and 317 of the Legislature of 1910, and the laws amendatory thereto, and generally shall conform to the laws of the State. The said Board of Drainage Commissioners shall have full and complete authority to drain and reclaim the lands within its limits; to hold all necessary elections in conformity with law; to sue and be sued; to contract obligations; issue bonds; dispose of the same; and to do and to form all that is necessary to carry out and accomplish the drainage of said District within the pure view of the laws of the State.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the said Drainage District is conferred with all the powers necessary for the accomplishment of the proposed in view and all of the powers intended to be conferred by the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, that the said Board of Drainage Commissioners shall immediately upon their appointment organize in accordance with law, elect its proper officers, its seal and do all things that are necessary to carry out the objects and purposes for which it is created.

Benton for the Term of Four years each of said commissioners being a duly qualified elector of the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, and according to the Certificate of the Assessor of the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, each of said commissioners being assessed for more than Five hundred Dollars worth of property in said drainage district.

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Ordinance For

On Motion duly seconded, the following Ordinance was adopted:-

An Ordinance for the sale of a ferry franchise for the Maintenance and operation of a ferry to carry passengers, freight and vehicles, said Ferry boat to use Steam or motor power and ply from the Town of Kenner to the Left Bank of the Mississippi River and South Kenner or Union Plantation on the Right Bank of the Mississippi River of the Parish of Jefferson.

WHEREAS, It has become necessary that a Ferry Boat for the purpose of accomodating passengers, vehicals, and freight to be sold and operated to ply between the town of Kenner on the left bank of the Mississippi River and South Kenner on the Right Bank of the Mississippi River,.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Alderman of the Town of Kenner that this Honorable Body, through its Mayor and the President of the Police Jury for the Parish of Jefferson, jointly to advertize and sell such ferry franchise, under the following Terms and conditions on the 23rd. day of May 1914 to the Highest Bidder at the front Door of the District Court building at Gretna, at 11 o'clock A. M.

BOAT

That the Ferry Boat to be used by the lessee purchasing said Franchise shall, in the operation

thereof, use either a Steam or Gasolene power boat capable of crossing at least two vehicals, horse drawn, such boat to be constructed in such was as to permit the driving on of any horse or horses and vehicals from either landing to said boat safely and conveniently; that said boat shall be propelled by its own power and strictly understood that said boat is not to be towed or pulled in said Mississippi by any other boat or boats only in case of accident, and that said boat shall be not less than 50 Fifth feet long by 20 Twenty feet wide, and to be worth not less than One thousand Dollars.

PONTOONS AND LANDINGS

That the party or parties to whom this franchise if adjudicated shall maintain in good repair and condition during the continuance of this franchise substantial pontoons and drive waws at each of the landings on each side of the river so as to provide a convenient and safe landing for the boat and proper connections with the shore for passengers and vehicles.

The Pontoons or floating wharfs to be strong and substantial and of proper dimentions, properly decked.

Such Pontoons as or in the opinion of the Engineer of the Parish and the City of Kenner, insufficient in dimensions or are deteriorated to such an extent as to be unsafe, will be replaced by a new one which will be built of such dimentions and in such manner and according to such plans as will be approved by said engineers.

The Connection which will be made between these pontoons against which the boat lands, and the shore for the passage of vehicles and passengers will be of such construction as will admit of the slope at extreme high or low water to be of such as will be required by the Honorable Council and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson jointly; these inclines to be as easy as the condition existing at the different points will admit.

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TRIPS.

The purchaser of this franchise shall run or cause to be run, during the continuance of this franchise, a Ferry boat between the hours of Six A. M. and Six P. A. this boat to leave each side of the river as often as is necessary to accomodate its patrons and at such time as business demands, a schedule time shall be maintained, but shall be not less than one crossing each hour. The Purchaser shall at his own proper expense have the boat examined by qualified United States Inspectors at least once every Twelve Months, and certificates of inspection thus made properly framed will be placed in a conspicuous place on the Boat. The Boat is to be properly painted and every precaution to be used to prevent accidents and measures to be adopted to secure the safety and comfort of the passengers.

CHARGES.

Following shall be the maximum charges:

For every foot passengers the fare shall be Ten cents for one way.

For every passenger on Horse or mule back, both inclusive, Twenty cents.

For every head of cattle, Horse, Mule, Cow or calf Fifteen Cents.

For every hearse, Seventy-five Cents.

For every Vehicle, except when loaded with lumber, when drawn by one

horse or mule, Twenty Cents.

For every Tallyho drawn by Two Horses including One to Four Passengers Sixty-Five cents.

For every vehicle except loaded floats or cotton wagons, drawn by two horses or horse kind, whether loaded or unloaded, Fifty-cents.

For every loaded float or cotton wajor, One Dollar and fifty cents.

For every vehicle drawn by three or more horses or horse kind, whether loaded or unloaded, One Dollar.

For every vehicle drawn by Oxen or Ox kind whether loaded or unloaded One Dollar.

For every two wheel vehicle loaded with Lumber Forty Cents.

For every Automobile, runabout Forty-cents, Two passengers, Ten Cents additional for each other passenger.

For Motorcycles Twenty Cents.

For Automobile Touring car, Sixty-cents.

For goods in sacks, Boxes, Crates or barrels also brick Lumber and any other kind of freight not carried or loaded by a consignor or consignee, such charges as are mutually agreed upon by and between lessee and consignee shall prevail.

PILOTS AND ENGINEERS

The purchaser shall employ as Pilot and Engineer non but such as are thoroughly competent and who shall have certificates from the proper office or Officer appointed by the United States Government of their qualifications.

RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES.

The exclusive right of these ferry privileges shall embrace from the

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Parish of St. Charles line and Jefferson Parish on the left bank of the Mississippi River and the Providence Plantation on the south end or left bank of the Mississippi River, and the line of the Parishes of St. Charles and Jefferson on the right Bank of the Mississippi River and Lower end or line nearest the City of New Orleans of the Live Oaks Plantation on the Right Bank of the Mississippi River and no other franchise shall be offered for sale within these limits.

SURRENDER AND TRANSFER OF PRIVILEGES.

The purchaser of this franchise on its expiration or at the termination of any extended time, shall peaceably surrender and yield the said ferry as also the Ferry property and boats and improvements with all the rights prived and appurtenances thereunto belonging, at proper costs into the possession of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson and the City Council of the City of Kenner, or to such party or parties to whom may be adjudicated the privilege for continuing the ferry, at a fair appraised valuation to be fixed by two appraisers; One to be Appointed by the owner of the franchise, one by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, jointly with the Town of Kenner, . In case of Disagreement of said Two appraisers, the said appraisers shall appoint an empire who shall decide between them and the finding of the majority of said board of appraisers shall be binding.

TERM OF FRANCHISE

The privilege of operating said ferry to be for the full term of ten years and to be in accordance with the terms and conditions herein set forth, and to begin immediately on the expiration of the present franchise or as soon thereafter as the purchaser has qualified and secured said boat, pontoons and landings.

PAYMENTS-

The party or parties to whom is adjudicated the privilege of operating this ferry shall upon the adjudication, pay in equal parts to the Treasurer of the Town of Kenner and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, One half of the Purchase price of said franchise, to-wit:-

One half of the Purchase price to the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson and One half to the City of Kenner.

DEPOSIT

All parties desirous of bidding for this privilege before being eligible to do so, shall on the day before the sale deposit with the City Treasurer of the City of Kenner the sum of One hundred Dollars in Currency or Certified Check, which deposit will be exhibited to the Mayor of the City of Kenner and President of Police Jury at the time of sale and which deposit will be to insure the signing and completion of the contract. This deposit will be returned to all unsuccessful bidders on the adjudication of the contract, and to the successful bidder on the signing of the contract.

This franchise shall be advertised for thirty days in the Official Journal of the Parish of Jefferson, and according to law in the Town of Kenner for Thirty days prior to adjudication.

WHEREAS, It becomes necessary in order to obtain the proper width for the said good road that a certain amount of private property be taken, and

WHEREAS, The property owners along the proposed good road are willing to extend the necessary amount of land adjoining the proposed good road for an equal amount of land on Carrollton Street in the said Division of Harlem and Shrewsbury.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular meeting assembled that the Street Known as Carrollton Street in the Divisions of Harlem and Shrewsbury be and the same is hereby closed.

BE it further Ordained, etc., that the Good Roads

Engineer be and he is hereby instructed to prepare the necessary surveys and plans for the proposed good roads through the divisions of Harlem and Shrewsbury.

Be it further Ordained, etc., that the President of this Police Jury be and he is hereby authorized to exchange with the property owners whose lands may be taken for the right of way for the proposed good roads, an equal amount of land on Carrollton Street hereby ordered closed for that purpose, and the land taken for the road is hereby dedicated to the Public.

On Motion of Mr. Hock Seconded by Mr. Ristroph, the following was adopted:-

BE IT RESOLVED, tha, in accordance with the request of the various fire companies of the Parish, that a day be set aside to be known as firemans day, it is hereby ordered that the day prior to Labor day of each year be known as FIREMANS DAY, and shall be declared a Holliday throughout the Parish.

BE IT RESOLVED, that Albert Fabacher be and he is hereby given permission to temporarily close Hamilton Street in McDonoghville from and beyond the Intersection with the Grand Isle Railroad for the purpose of repairing same and makeing it passable.

On Motion duly seconded the protest of Citizens and Tax payers of Gretna against the continuance and operation of a Saloon at the Northeast Corner of Copernicus Avenue and Fourth Streets in Gretna, was ordered filed.

On Motion of Mr. Hock seconded by Mr. Ristroph, the following ORDINANCE was adopted.

AN ORDINANCE providing for the sale at public auction for cash to the highest bidder of a franchise or right-of-way for an Interurban Electric Railway from or near the Intersection of Canal Street and University place in New Orleans to the Town of Kenner in the Parish of Jefferson,.

WHEREAS, in order to further project of frequent

Car Line

and rapid transportation between the City of New Orleans and the neighboring Parish of Jefferson by means of an Electric Interurban Railway the construction of which will involve a large amount of Money and which improved railway facilities will greatly redound to the benefit and advantage of the People of the City of New Orleans and the Parish of Jefferson and which will require a sale of a franchise and right of way over the routes necessary for that purpose, therefore,

Section 1. Be it Ordained by the Commission Council of the City of New Orleans, and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, acting herein under and by virtue of act No. 36 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, of 1902, That the commissioner of Public Utilities of the City of New Orleans be and he is hereby directed to advertise for sale at Public Auction according to law to the highest bidder for cash upon the following terms, conditions and specifications, the franchise, rights-of-way, right to construct, maintain and operate, together with all tracks, curves, switches, and other appurtenances necessary thereto, an Interurban Electric Railway over the route and through the Streets, roads, highways, places in the City of New Orleans and the Parish of Jefferson, hereinafter set out and described.

The amount of cash bid shall be divided between the City of New Orleans and the Parish of Jefferson, in the proportion to the total trackage over which the Purchaser may operate his cars under this purchase whether said trackage is laid or is to be laid by him or whether he uses and employs in whole or in part the trackage of any existing line.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that the terms, conditions, and specifications upon which said franchise and rights-of-way shall be sold shall be as follows to-wit:-

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ROUTE

Beginning at the Corporate limits of the Town of Kenner, thence Eastward passing through private property to Arnoult division, thence crossing Arnoult Division Road and Peuch Street and over private property at a distance of not less than One thousand (1,000) feet and not greater than Four Thousand (4,000) Feet from the Bank of the Mississippi River, thence crossing Severn Avenue or Shrewsbury Road and Hill Street to the Settlement of Shrewsbury, thence Crossing Harlem Avenue or Costa Avenue to the Settlement of Harlem, thence crossing Labarre Road in an easterly direction and over and through private property to West Carrollton at a distance of not less than One Thousand feet and not greater than Three Thousand feet from the Bank of the Mississippi River thence in a Northerly direction parallel with Brooklyn Avenue of West Carrollton, thence in an Easterly direction through the Village or settlement of New Carrollton and West Carrollton crossing Brooklyn Avenue, Lake Avenue and Dakin Street to a point on the Parish line between the Parish of Jefferson and the City of New Orleans, not less than Five Hundred feet and not greater than fifteen Hundred feet south of the Right-of-way of the Yazoo and Mississippi Valley Railroad.

Thence entering the City of New Orleans, at the intersection of Clairborne Avenue and Protection Levee between Jefferson and Orleans Parishes and proceeding on and over the Tracks of the New Orleans Railway and Light Company or any of its subsidiary or allied companies now

existing or to be laid under franchise rights already granted by the City, of New Orleans as follows, to-wit:-

Along Clairborne Avenue to Carrollton Avenue thence along Carrollton Avenue on the Neutral Ground thereof to Tulane Avenue, thence Along Tulane Avenue on the Neutral Ground thereof to South Rampart Street, thence along South Rampart Street on the Neutral Ground thereof to Calan Street, thence along Calan Street on the Neutral Ground thereof to University place by single track only to Common Street thence along common Street by a single track only to South Rampart Street with the privilege of not extending said track from University place to common Street, then along Common Street to South Rampart Street but passing from University Place to South Rampart Street through private Property to be acquired by the purchaser of this franchise. The true intent and meaning hereof is to confine the exercise of the rights granted under this franchise so far as concerns operations in the City of New Orleans to the track or tracks of the said New Orleans Railway and light Company or its subsidiary or allied companies wherever the same exists or are to be laid under franchise rights as aforesaid, no right or privilege being concurred by this franchise to lay any additional tracks or equipments on said streets where said tracks exist or are to be laid as aforesaid; the City of New Orleans however assuming no obligations whatsoever of obtaining or guaranteeing the exercise of the right of way, use or employment of said tracks of the said New Orleans Railway and Light Company or its subsidiary or allied companies; the purchaser of this franchise being obligated to make satisfactory arraignments for the use thereof with the said New Orleans Railway and Light Company or its Subsidiary or allied Companies.

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In the event that the track or tracks of the said New Orleans Railway and light company or of any of its subsidiary or allied companies and over which the purchaser of this franchise is to operate his cause should be removed or abandoned by the said New Orleans Railway and light Company or any of its subsidiary or allied Companies then and in that event the purchaser of this franchise, his successor or assigns is given the right to replace same by laying his own tracks and appliances under plans and specifications to be approved by the commissioner of Public Property of the City of New Orleans and in the event that a single track shall not be laid by the said New Orleans Railway and Light Company or its subsidiary or allied companies, on Clairborne Avenue from its intersection with the Protection Levee to its intersection with Carrollton Avenue to enable the purchaser of this franchise to operate his cause thereover as soon as practicable after this franchise shall have become daily operated but in all events within sixty days thereafter, provided the purchaser of this franchise shall be then prepared to operate his cause over the remainder of the entire route specified in this franchise, then and in that event, the purchaser of this franchise his successors or assigns is given the right to lay his own single track along Clairborne Avenue from its intersection with the protection levee to its intersection with Carrollton Avenue to connect with the tracks on Harlem Avenue of the said New Orleans Railway and light Company or its subsidiary.

or allied Companies.

Cars shall be operated under this franchise by the Purchaser thereof his successors or assigns for the transportation of through of Interurban passengers, mail, express or baggage from points within the boundary limits of the City of New Orleans to points without such boundary limits or from points without such boundary limits of the City of New Orleans to points within such boundary limits and such cars shall not be stopped within the boundary limits of the City of New Orleans to take on or discharge passengers, mail express or baggage except at a fixed point or points specifically designated therefor by said purchaser, his successors or assigns and in accord with the traffic regulations of the City of New Orleans; it being expressly understood that the purchaser of this franchise, his successors and assigns shall not have any right thereunder to operate cars for transporting or to make any charge for transporting any passengers, mail, express or baggage between points within the boundary limits of the City of New Orleans, as at present constituted.

The purchaser of the above described franchise, privilege and rights-of-way his successors or assigns shall be except as herein otherwise indicated, obligated to construct and operate the line of railway above described within Six months from the signing of the contract hereinafter provided for and in case said purchaser his successors or assigns shall fail to construct said railway line and have it in operation within said six (6) months it shall forfeit to the City of New Orleans and the Parish of Jefferson in the proportion stated in section One hereof as liquidated damages, the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars.

All work shall be done in a thoroughly first class manner and all materials furnished shall be first class and subject to the approval of the duly authorized officer in incorporated Cities or Towns through which the road may run. The type of rail and the rate of same in Cities or Towns shall be designated by the duly authorized officials thereof.

Wherever designated by such authorities suitable Culverts shall be placed under the tracks upon plans to approved by said authorized officials to provide for the drainage under the tracks. All drains crossed by tracks whether in the City of New Orleans or in the Parish of Jefferson shall be protected by means of suitable bridges or culverts.

The overhead construction necessary to transmit and deliver current to the cars in the Incorporated Cities through [which] the road may pass shall be in all respects according to standard method and most approved type and the wires, brackets, cross arms etc, erected along the right-of-way or in the streets, allies or other public places in such incorporated cities shall be erected in a manner approved by the duly authorized officials. The Cars shall be of modern type and pattern and shall at all times be kept clean and neat and in good order and condition.

Cars shall be run as often as traffic and travel require, but at no greater interval than every two hours between sun-rise and sun-set and every three hours between sunset-and mid-night.

Each car shall have a Motorman and a Conductor, but when trailers are used not more than one Conductor shall be required. The Motor cars may haul one or more trailers. All fares shall be on the basis of not

more than three cents per mile but no single fare shall less than five cents except in the direction of the purchaser of this franchise his successors or assigns. Provided that all children attending the Schools in the City of New Orleans and Parish of Jefferson shall be afforded transportation over the route of said Interurban Road at a price not exceeding Three fifths of the Regular fare, provided that each such child shall have the right of such reduced fare only when going to or returning from school, and only when in possession of a certificate from the Principal of the School which said child attends, declaring that the said child is a pupil of said school.

In Incorporated Cities the purchaser his successor or assigns shall keep in good order and repair all streets and the pavements thereon between the tracks between the rails and for eighteen inches on the outside of each outside rail where said tracks and rails are owned by said purchaser his successors or assigns

The purchaser his successors or assigns shall at all times maintain all culverts and crossings constructed by him in good order and repair. On failure to do so it will become the duty of the proper officer or officers to notify the said purchaser, his successors or assigns of the work to be done and without further putting in default the said officer or officers, may it proceed to do the work at the expense of the purchaser, his successors or assigns of said officer or officers may proceed under act No. 135 of 1888 or in any other legal manner to have the work done.

In Incorporated cities plans for crossings of steam or other railroads shall

be submitted to and approved by the duly authorized officer and the Cost of installation and maintenance thereof shall be governed by the provisions of local ordinances and state laws relating thereto.

The Purchaser of this franchise shall have the rights to enter on the streets allies and other public places and to make excavation therein as may be necessary to construct altar or repair the tracks, poles etc., provided for; herein provided that such streets, allies and other public places are restored to their original condition after the completion of such construction alterations or repairs.

The speed of cars in incorporated towns shall not exceed Twenty Miles an hour except on Neutral ground where it may be twenty-five miles an hour.

The purchaser of said franchise shall have the right to assign and convey the same to any person or corporation competent to hold and exercise same with the consent of the commission council of the City of New Orleans and of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson.

Should any unpaved Street be ordered paved or should a paved Street be ordered repaired by order of the duly constituted authorities where the cars under this franchise operate over tracks owned by the purchaser hereof his successors or assigns under authority of this ordinance the purchaser of this franchise shall pay the cost of paving or repairing between the tracks between the rails and eighteen inches on the outside of each outside rail.

The purchaser is authorized to use the road provided for herein for carrying mail, express, and baggage as well as passengers provided the cars used for the purpose shall be of a type in general use for such service and shall be maintained in the same manner both as to condition and appearance as the cars used exclusively for passenger service.

The purchaser shall have the right to construct, maintain, and use the necessary switches, curves etc., to connect with other railway tracks, it may cross or adjoin the location described herein.

The purchaser shall also have the right to construct, maintain, and use the necessary switch tracks to connect tracks provided for herein with any shop, barns, yards etc, that it may be desirable to construct provided they are not located at a greater distance than two squares from the main track.

Every bidder shall as a condition precedent to the receiving of his bid by the commissioner of Public utilities of the City of New Orleans deposit with the Commissioner of public finances a certified check on any State or National bank domiciled in the City of New Orleans or the Parish of Jefferson to the order of said commissioner of public finances for the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) as a guarantee that the depositor of said check will if his bid is accepted, accept the franchise in accordance with the advertisement and adjudication within ten days after notice from the City

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Notary that the instrument is ready for signature.

The commissioner of public utilities shall not recognize bidders who have not prior to the commencement of the bidding, deposited with the commissioner of public finances the above described guaranty check and submitted his receipt therefor.

The Commissioner of Public Finances shall at the conclusion of the bidding return the guaranty check of unsuccessful bidders, but the Commissioner of Public Finances shall not return the check of the successful bidder until such bidder has accepted the franchise and furnished the hereinafter described bond in which event the said guaranty check shall then be returned to the successful bidder.

Should the bidder to whom the Franchise is awarded fail to accept the franchise and furnish the hereinafter described bond within the allotted time the Five Thousand (\$5000.) Dollars guarantee deposited by him shall ipso facto be forfeited to the City of New Orleans and the Parish of Jefferson, not as a penalty but as an acknowledged and liquidated damages without the formality of being placed in default and without Judicial Proceedings and divided between them according to the milage in each Parish intended to be operated under this franchise.

DEPOSIT FOR ADVERTISEMENT.

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The Mayor of the City of New Orleans and the President of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson are hereby authorized for and in the name of the City of New Orleans and the Parish of Jefferson respectively to sign a Notarial contract with the party or parties to whom this franchise may be adjudicated their heirs, successors and assigns subject to all the terms and conditions of this Ordinance and for the price of the adjudication.

This Ordinance shall not take effect until after the same shall have been concurred in and favorable acted upon and adopted as an ORDINANCE by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson.

A certified copy of said Ordinance as adopted shall be furnished the City of New Orleans.

On Motion of Mr. Betz, seconded by Mr. Hock, the following Ordinance was adopted:

AN ORDINANCE

PROVIDING FOR THE SALE OF A FRANCHISE FOR AN ELECTRIC RAILWAY ALONG AND ACROSS CERTAIN PUBLIC ROADS AND HIGHWAYS IN THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON.

Whereas petitions have been presented to the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, signed by a majority in Number and amount of abutting property holders along certain Public roads mentioned therein praying that this Police Jury advertise and sell a franchise

to construct, maintain and operate for ninety nine years an electric Railway along and across said Public Roads and,

WHEREAS, as required by law the Police Jury has canvassed the signatures to said petitions and ascertained that a majority in number and amount of the abutting property holders along the Public Road mentioned in said petitions have signed the same therefore.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson that there be advertised for sale at Public Auction to the highest Bidder for cash in the Official Journal of the Parish of Jefferson to be sold on Saturday January 30th, 1915, at the front door of the Court house in Gretna La., at 11 o'clock A. M. the franchise, right-of-way right to construct maintain and operate for Ninety-nine years single or double track electric railway (together with all tracks, curves, switches and other appurtenances, necessary thereto) along and across the following roads in the parish of Jefferson.

ROUTE

Commencing at a point on the Parish line between Orleans and Jefferson at or near the Intersection of Metairie Ridge road and the said Parish Line, thence over Metairie Avenue lake side thereof but not over the present shell road, thence along the lake side of Metairie Road over private or public property but not over said shell road in a western direction to the intersection of Fagot Avenue prolonged or in the vicinity thereof, thence Fagot Avenue through Ridgway Terrace subdivision thence over private property and intervening and cross streets and roads in the settlement of Harlem, thence over private property and intervening and cross streets in the settlement of Shrewsbury to Severn or Shrewsbury Road.

The Purchaser of this Franchise, right or way and right to construct, maintain and operate an electric railway, his successors and assigns shall be obliged to begin within sixty days after the contract has been executed and accepted by the President of the Police Jury, the active construction of said electric Road and shall prosecute said work continuously until completion of the entire line, between the different termini at Orleans Parish Line and the Shrewsbury Road as hereinbefore mentioned and shall complete and have in operation within eight months from the date of the signing and acceptance of the contract as aforesaid. In default of which either through failure to begin active work and prosecute same continuously or to complete and have in operation the said electric railway within the time stated the said purchaser his successors or assigns shall be liable to the Parish of Jefferson as liquidated damages in the sum of Five Thousand Dollars under a bond to be furnished by the purchaser, his successors or assigns, herein-after provided for.

Every bidder as a condition precedent to the receiving of his bid

by the president of the Police Jury, shall deposit with him in his said capacity in cash or certified check, the sum of Five Thousand dollars. 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a Notarial contract with the party or parties their successors or assigns to whom this franchise may be adjudicated subject to all the terms and conditions of this Ordinance and for the price of adjudication.

SECTION 2. Be it further Ordained etc., that the said sale by the President of the Police Jury shall be made upon the following terms, conditions and specifications;

Construction.

The railway provided for herein shall be operated by the system known as the overhead electric trolley.

The construction of said Electric Railway and of all tracks, curves, switches poles, and other appliances necessary thereto and the type and weight of rails to be used shall be subject entirely to the approval of the engineer selected by the Police Jury. All work shall be done in a thoroughly first class manner and the construction necessary to transmit and deliver current to the cars shall be in all respects according to standard method and the most approved type all subject to the approval of the said engineer. The cars shall be of Modern type and pattern and shall at all times be kept clean and neat and in good order and condition and shall be provided with ventilators.

The purchaser of this franchise shall have the right to enter on the Public road named herein to make excavations therein as may be necessary to construct altar or repair the tracks, poles etc.,

provided for herein, provided that such public roads are restored to their original conditions after completion of such construction, alterations or repairs.

The Purchaser, his successors or assigns shall at all times, maintain in good condition, all drains, bridges and culverts crossed by their tracks.

SCHEDULE

Cars shall run as often as traffic and travel require, but at no greater interval than every One Half Hour between Six. (6) A. M. and Seven (7) P. M. and every one hour between Seven P. M. and Mid-night.

SECTION 2. That the Annual license hereby levied is declared to be the same as and to be graduated in accordance with the constitution and Laws of the State of Louisiana, now in force and is hereby declared to be the same as to graduation and amount as the license laws of the State of Louisiana, now in force, provided for States purposes and are to be determined in accordance therewith to: wit:- Act 171 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, of the Session of 1898 and the subsequent acts of the General Assembly of Louisiana,. It is hereby declared to be the intention of

this body to herein levy the same license tax for parochial purposes both as to graduation and amount as in now imposed by the General Assembly for State Purposes to which laws special reference is hereby made as being hereof for the purpose aforesaid provided further that hereafter for every business of conducting a bar-room, cabaret, Coffee House, Cafe, Beer Saloon, Liquor exchange, Drinking saloon, Grog shop, beer house, beer garden, or other place where spirituous vinous or malt liquors or intoxicating beverages, bitters or medicinal preparations of any kinds are sold directly or indirectly in quantities in less than Five gallons the license shall be based on the annual gross receipts of said business as follows to-wit:-
First class:- When said gross annual receipts are \$50,000.00 or more, the license shall be \$2,000.00
Second Class, When said gross annual receipts are \$40,000.00 or more and less than \$50,000.00 the license shall be \$1,800.00.
Third Class, When said Gross annual receipts are Thirty Thousand Dollars or More and less than Forty Thousand Dollars the license shall be \$1,500.00
FOURTH Class, When said gross annual receipts are \$20,000.00 or more and less than \$30,000.00 the license shall be \$1,200.00.

FIFTH Class When said Gross annual receipts are \$10,000.00 or more and less than \$20,000.00 the license shall be \$1,000.00.
 SIXTH CLASS, When said gross annual receipts are \$5,000.00 or more and less than \$10,000.00 the license shall be \$800.00.
 SEVENTH CLASS, When said gross annual receipts are less than \$5,000.00 the license shall be Five Hundred Dollars.

PROVIDED that no license shall be charged for selling refreshments for charitable or religious purposes, provided, further that no establishment selling or giving away or otherwise disposing of spirits, wines, alcoholic or malt liquors in less quantities than five gallons shall pay license less than Five Hundred Dollars, Provided further that for the business of selling malt and vinous liquors, exclusively in quantities of less than five gallons the license shall be One half of that provided for the general sale of alcoholic beverages, Provided further that nothing in this ordinance shall be so construed as to exempt druggist who sell alcoholic vinous or malt liquors or other intoxicating beverages on the prescription of a Physician or otherwise from the payment of the license herein imposed, Provided further that this ordinance shall apply to the sale by, druggist, tinctures or drug compound in the preparation of which such liquors or intoxicating beverages are used and sold on the prescription of a physician or otherwise and which tinctures and compounds are not intoxicating beverages prepared in the evasion of this Ordinance nor of the local option law, Provided further that in all other respects the provisions of act 176 of 1908 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana are hereby adopted as part of the ordinance and the penalties and procedure relative to the collection of said license therein provided are hereby adopted and made a part of the ordinance.

SECTION THREE. That for all traveling shows giving performances in this Parish a tax of Five Dollars shall be paid for each and every day performances are given.

SECTION FOUR. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the procedure in the collection of Parochial licenses herein levied and that to ascertain the amounts due for same by the Tax Collector shall be the same as is now provided by the law for the State purposes and in particularly in act 171 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, of the session of 1898 as amended by subsequent acts of the General Assembly and at subsequent sessions and the penalties imposed upon the interest and costs to be collected from delinquents are declared to be the same and to be collected in the same manner as provided by said act of the General Assembly as amended by subsequent Acts of State Purposes.

Be it further Ordained that the Parochial Licenses which are herein levied are declared to be for the purposes which may be required by the constitution and laws of this State for Parochial Purposes. a penalty for violation of its provisions.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson;

SECTION. 1, That from and after the promulgation of this Ordinance, all Vehicles using the Public roads in this Parish shall conform to the following regulations:

Buggies, Carriages, and other family vehicles and light platform spring wagons used in carrying weight less, than one thousand pounds (1000) shall not use tires of a smaller width than one and One-half (1-1/2) inches.

Upon application for license plates for light spring wagons carrying less than One thousand pounds the applicant shall before obtaining the license made an affidavit that said wagon will not be used for hauling a greater weight than one thousand pounds. All persons using such wagons shall paint or print the weight allowed on the body of the wagon the hauling or dragging of plows, harrows, or other farming impliments over the public roads in the manner that will result in the damaging of said road is prohibited.

All vehicles carrying load of from 1000 to 3000 pounds the tires shall not be less than three inches wide those carrying weight of from 3000 pounds to 4500 pounds shall have a tire of not less than three and one half inches.

Those carrying loads of from 4500 pounds to 6000 pounds, the tires shall be not less than four inches wide.

Those carrying weight over 6000 pounds and not more than four ton

the tires shall be of a width not less than six inches.

No loads of over four ton shall be permitted to be hauled over said roads without first having obtained a special permit for said purpose from a Member of the Police Jury, its secretary or the road inspector.

Within 24 hours after a rain no vehicle of any kind shall haul a load over the road of a greater than Two ton.

Motor cars shall not travel at a faster rate of speed than twenty miles per hour and motor truck and delivery wagons shall not travel at a faster rate of speed than Twelve miles per hour.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of misdemeanor and subject to a fine of not less than Five Dollars and not more than Twenty-five Dollars or imprisonment in the Parish prison not exceeding Thirty-days or both at the discretion of the Court.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED than all ordinances of parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

through its said representative accepted said grant and privilege and agreed to cause a large ditch or canal to be dug through the strip of land above granted on the property of the said Mrs. Conrad at the sole expense of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson State of Louisiana and were to keep the same up in good order so that it would always be capable of receiving the water from the Village line in front and about same.

And, Whereas, A Drainage District has now been formed in the Parish of Jefferson State of Louisiana and the said ditch or canal is of no further use or benefit because the drainage is now being taken care of by the system now in operation and for which the property that was formerly owned by the said Mrs. Conrad is paying a drainage tax therefor.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson State of Louisiana, do now waive and abandon the right and privilege and digging and maintaining a ditch or canal to drain a town situated in front of the property formerly belonging to Mrs. Harriet Conrad and now owned by the Mechanisham Realty Company and which is known as the Conrad canal.

That the annual license hereby levied is declared to be the same as and to be graduated in accordance with the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana now in force and is hereby declared to be the same as to graduation and amount, as the license laws of the state of Louisiana now in force provided for state purposes and are to be determined in accordance therewith to-wit:- ACT 171 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana of the session of 1898 and the subsequent acts of the General Assembly of Louisiana.

It is hereby declared to be the intention of this body to herein levy the same license tax for parochial purposes, both as to graduation and amount as is now imposed by the general Assembly for the State purposes to which laws special reference is hereby made as being part hereof for the purposes for aforesaid; provided

further than hereafter for every business of conducting a bar-room,

cabarett, coffee house, cafe, beer saloon, liquor exchange, drinking saloon, grog shop, beer house, beer garden or other place where spirituous vinous or malt liquor or intoxicating beverages, bitters or medicinal preparations of any kind are sold directly or indirectly in quantities of less than five gallons, the license shall be based on the annual gross receipts of said business as follows, to-wit:-

FIRST CLASS:- When said gross annual receipts are \$50,000 or more the license shall be Two Thousand Dollars.

Second class:- When said gross annual receipts are \$40,000 or more and less than \$50,000 the license shall be \$1,800.00.

Third Class, When said gross annual receipts are \$30,000 or more and less than \$40,000 the license shall be \$1,500.00

Fourth class:- When said gross annual receipts are \$20,000 or more and less than \$30,000 the license shall be \$1,200.00

Fifth class:- When said gross annual receipts are \$10,000 or more and less than \$20,000 the license shall be \$1,000.00

Sixth class, When said gross annual receipts are \$5,000 or more and less than \$10,000 the license shall be \$800.00

Seventh class:- When said gross annual receipts are less than \$5,000 the license shall be \$500.00.

Provided that no license shall be charged for selling refreshments for charitable or religious purposes; provided further, that no establishment selling or giving away or otherwise disposing of spirits, wines, alcoholis or malt liquors in less quantities than five gallons, shall pay a license of less than five hundred dollars; provided further that for the business of selling malt and vinous liquors exclusively in quantities of less than five gallons the license shall be one half of that provided for the general sale of alcohol beverages; provided further that nothing in this ordinance shall be so construed as to exempt druggists who sell alcoholic vinous or malt liquors or other intoxicating beverages on the prescription of a physician or otherwise from the payment of the license herein imposed; provided further that this ordinance shall not apply to the sale by druggists of tinctures of drugs, compounds in the preparations of which such liquors or intoxicating beverages are used and sold on the prescription of a physician or otherwise and which the tinctures and compounds are not intoxicating beverages prepared in the evasion of this ordinance, nor of local option law; provided further that in all respects the provision of act 176 of 1908 of the General Assembly by the State of Louisiana are hereby adopted as part of the ordinance and the penalties and procedures relative to the collection of said license therein provided are hereby adopted and made a part of the ordinance.

Section 3. That for all traveling shows, giving performance in this Parish a tax of Five Dollars shall be paid for each and every day performances are given.

Section 4. That for every Automobile operated publicly as a jitney an annual tax of Ten Dollars shall be paid by the owner or operator thereof.

Section 5. Be it further ordained that the procedure in the collection of parochial license herein levied and that to ascertain the amount due for the same by the tax collector, shall be the same as is now provided by the law for State purposes, and particularly in act 171 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana of the session of 1898 as

amended by subsequent acts of the General Assembly and at subsequent sessions and the penalties imposed upon and interests and costs to be collected from delinquents are declared to be the same and to be collected in the same manner as provided by said act of the General Assembly as amended by subsequent acts for State purposes.

Section 6, Be it further ordained that the parochial license which are herein levied are declared to be for the purposes which may be required by the constitution and laws of this State for parochial purposes. WHEREAS, the result of said special election was duly promulgated by the President and Secretary of this Police Jury by due publication on Saturday December 25th, 1915, in the Jefferson Democrat the Official Journal for the Parish of Jefferson and,

WHEREAS, the taxable valuations used in the said Special Election were based upon the Assessment Rolls for the year 1915 and the said Assessment Rolls for the year 1915 shows as assessed valuation in Road District Number Three (3) of the Parish of Jefferson of One Hundred & Forty Thousand (\$140,000) Dollars in less than Ten (10%);

On Motion of Mr. Terrebonne seconded by Mr. Hock, it was resolved that the Sheriff be and he is hereby authorized to send the Prisoners of the Parish to road District Number Three for the purpose of constructing the contemplated road in the said District.

Ordinance creating Road Dist #3 Comprising of Grand Isle repealed

On Motion of Mr. Gardey seconded by Mr. Guidry, the following ordinance was adopted;
WHEREAS, This Police Jury at the meeting held November 5th., 1913 created a road District out of that portion of the Parish, known as Grand Isle and appointed commissioners to act and conduct the affairs of the said road dirtsiect and,

WHEREAS, no steps were ever taken to carry out the purposes of the said Ordinances and in order to avoid a conflict with road districor Number Three created by
