Whereas, the result of said Special Election was duly promulgated by the President and Secretary of this Police Jury, by due publication on Saturday in the Jefferson Democrat the Official Journal for the Parish of Jefferson; and

Whereas, the taxable valuation used in the said Special election were based upon the assessment roll for the year 1916, and as said assessment roll for the year 1916 shows an assessed valuation in Sub-Road District "S" ["A"] of Road District Number One (1) of the Parish of Jefferson of over Thirty Two Thousand (\$32,000.00) Dollars, of which \$3,600.00 is less than ten (10%) per cent.

The said bonds shall be dated September 1st., 1916, and bear interest at the rate of Five (5%) per cent per annum from date until paid, and there shall be attached to each of said bonds of semi-annual interest bearing coupons to represent the said interest, which coupons shall and are hereby made payable on the first day of September and the first day of March of each year, while the

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Commission Council of the City of New Orleans and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that in addition to the privilege of transporting passengers, mail express or baggage granted to the Orleans-Kenner Electric Railway Company, its successors or assigns, as provided in an ordinance Number 1959, Commission Council Series, adopted on November 17th., 1914, the adjudication made on December 18th., 1914 and notarial contract entered into on December 22nd., 1914, that the said Franchise ordinance and contract be so ammended so as to provide that the said Orleans-Kenner Electric Railway Company, its successor or assigns, shall have and it is hereby granted the additional right of transporting freight over its own or leased lines within the Parish of Jefferson; nothing herein however, to be construed permitting or allowing the operation of freight cars within the limits of the City of New Orleans.

WHEREAS it appears that the said parties above mentioned have also advertised the said franchise, that the upper limits of said Ferry Franchise would extend to the lower limits of the Louisiana Avenue Ferry Boat franchise in the Parish of Jefferson: and

Whereas, it appears that the City of Gretna and the City of New Orleans jointly have no jurisdiction over the sale of franchise in the Parish of Jefferson unless the Police Jury of said Parish is a party thereto, and that the City of Gretna cannot sell a franchise of the character beyond its own limits and cannot extend the limits into the Parish of Jefferson; and,

Whereas the Parish of Jefferson has a financial interest and certain property rights in franchises that extend into and operate within the Territory limits of the Parish and steps should be taken to protect its rights: THEREFORE

BE IT RESCLVED, that it is the sense of this Jury that proceedings be instituted on behalf of the Parish of Jefferson and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson to stop sale, by injunction, of said franchise herein referred to, and that counsel be employed to look after the interest of this Parish;

Be it further resolved, that, oweing to the death of our legal adviser and the emmergency existing in this matter, the President of this Police Jury be and he is hereby authorized to employ counsel to represent this Jury and the Parish of Jeffersan in any proceedings that may be necessary in the matter, and to take any and all necessary proceedings and sign all papers looking to the protection of our interest.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in regular meeting assembled that the President and Secretary of the Police Jury be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to execute, sign, seal and deliver on behalf of this Police Jury, representing the Parish of Jefferson, Four (4) certificates of indebtedness each for the sum of Nine Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$9,500.00) to evidence the aforesaid indebtedness.

Be it further ordained, etc., that the said certificates of indebtedness shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum from the date of certificates until paid.

Be it further ordained, etc., that the said certificates of indebtedness shall be dated January 10th., 1917 and shall be payable one, (1) year after date of said certificate, The Police Jury hereby specially reserves the right and privilege to cancel any, all or part of the aforesaid certificates, before maturity, upon the payment of the face value thereof, together with accrued interest, if any may be due.

Be it further ordained, etc., That in order to secure the payment of the said certificates of indebtedness, both in principal and interest, the Police Jury does hereby specially bind itself to set aside and to dedicate, out of its excess revenues after paying statutory, necessary and usual expenses, one half $(\frac{1}{2})$ of a mill of the general Parish taxes, which said tax is hereby specially pledged and is to be devoted exclusively to the redemption of the aforesaid certificates of indebtedness, both in principal **and** interest.

Be it further ordained, etc., that this special dedication of onehalf of a mill shall be set aside each year not to exceed ten years until the whole debt herein secured and all of the certificates of indebtedness herein provided for shall be paid both in principal and interest.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson:

Section 1. That there is hereby levied an annual license tax for the Parish of

Jefferson for the year 1917 upon each person, association of persons, or business or corporation purchasing any trade, profession, vocation, calling or business conducted, carried on or operated within the limit of the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana, which may be subject to such license tax under Article 229 of the Constitution of Louisiana. Section 2, That the annual license hereby levied is declared to be the same as to be graduated in accordance with the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana now in force, and is hereby declared to be the same as to be graduated in accordance with the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana now in force, and is hereby declared to be the same as to graduation and amount as the license laws of the State of Louisiana now in force provided for State purposes, and are to be determined in accordance therewith to wit: Act III of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana of the session of 1898 and the subsequent acts of the General Assembly of Louisiana. It is hereby declared to be the intention of this body to herein levy the same license tax for the parochial purposes, both as to graduation and the amount, as is now imposed by the General Assembly for the State purposes, to which laws special reference is hereby made as being part hereof for the purpose aforesaid: provided further, that hereafter for every business of conducting, a Barroom, Cabaret, Coffee house, Cafe, Beer Saloon, Liquor exchange, drinking saloon Grog Shop, Beer house, beer garden, or any place where spirituous, vinous or liquor, or intoxicating beverages, bitters or medical preparations of any kinds, are sold directly or indirectly in quantities or less than five gallons, the license shall be based on annual gross receipts of said business as follows; to-wit:-

First Class: When said gross annual receipts are Fifty Thousand Dollars or more the license shall be two thousand dollars. Second Class: Where said gross annual receipts are forty thousand dollars or more and less than fifty thousand dollars, the license shall be One thousand eight hundred dollars.

Third Class: When said gross annual receipts are thirty thousand or more and less than forty thousand the license shall be one thousand five hundred dollars.

Fourth Class: When said gross annual receipts are twenty thousand or more and less than thirty thousand the license shall be one thousand two hundred dollars:

Fifth Class: When said gross annual receipts are ten thousand dollars or more and less than twenty thousand the license shall be one thousand dollars.

Sixth Class: When said gross annual receipts are five thousand dollars or more and less than ten thousand dollars the license shall be eight hundred dollars.

Seventh Class: When said gross annual receipts are less than five

thousand; the license shall be five hundred dollars.

Provided that the license shall be charged for selling refreshments for charitable or religious purposes; provided, further that no establishment selling or giving away, or otherwise disposing of spirits, wines, alcoholic or malt liquors in less quantities than five gallons shall pay a license less than \$500.00; provided further that for the business of selling malt and vinous exclusively in quantities of less than five gallons the license shall be one-half of that provided for the general sale of alcoholic beverages; provided that nothing in this ordinance shall be so construed as to exempt druggist who sell alcoholic, vinous or malt liquors or other intoxicating beverages on the prescription of a physician or otherwise from the payment of the license herein imposed: provided further that this ordinance shall not apply to the

sale by druggist of tinctures or drug compounds in the preparations of which such liquors or intexicating beverages are used and sold on the prescription of a physician or otherwise, and which tinctures and compounds are not intexicating beverages prepared in the evasion of this ordinance nor of the local option laws; provided further, that in all other respects the provisions of act 176 of 1908 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, are hereby adopted as part of the ordinance and the penalties and procedures relative to the collection of said licenses therein provided are hereby adopted and made a part of the ordinance.

Section 3. That for all traveling shows, giving performances in this Parish a tax of five dollars shall be paid for each and every day performances are givon.

Section 4. That for every automobile operated publicly as a jitney, an annual tax of ten dollars shall be paid by the owner or operator thereof.

Section 5. Be it further ordained that the procedures in the collection of parochial licenses herein levied and that ascertain the amount due for same by the tax collector shall be same as is now provided by the law for State purposes and particularly in act 171 of the General

Assembly of the State of Louisiana of the Session of 1898 as amended by Subsequent acts of the said General Assembly and at subsequent sessissons and the penalties imposed upon and interest and costs to be collected from delinquents are declared to be the same and to be collected in the same manner as provided by said act of the General Assembly as amended by subsequent acts for State purposes.

Section 6. Be it further ordained that the Parochial Licenses which are herein levied are declared to be for the purposes which may be required by the Constitution and laws of this State for parochial purposes. Be it further ordained that from and after the adoption of this ordinance the tax collector shall begin to collect from each of the persons and firms, associations of persons and corporations pursueing within the limits of said Parish, any trade, calling, profession, vocation or business a license tax as herein provided. All licenses are due and collected on or after the first two months of each year, and all unpaid licenses shall become delinquent on the 1st., day of each year, and all firms, who commence business after that date shall become delinquent unless the license is paid within ten days.

Hon. Jules G. Fisher, President Police Jury,

Parish of Jefferson.

Doar Sir:

The separation values for State purposes from local taxes will place a much larger responsibility upon your body acting as a Board of Review, when you convene on the first Monday in June next, We have nothing whatever to do with your local taxes, hence we would impress the necessity of a closer inspection of all assessments and beg your earnest co-operation in the matter of equalization between individual tax payers.

in the

The need of suitable maps with which to check lands and city property is a crying need and will prevent the omission of much valuable property from the tax rolls.

We are doing every thing in our power to see that the Revenue Laws of the State are properly carried out, and if much property finds its way on the tax roll, your Parish will receive a much larger share of the benefit to be derived therefrom. It is not our desire to raise any assessment this year on account of the high tax rates but as soon as the mileage rate can be reduced we will place the assessment something like what is correct without increasing burdens on the people.

Unless your parish is free from heavy local or special taxes do not undertake to follow values this Board might fix for State purposes, otherwise you will materially increase taxes on your people. We want to give you this timely thought for your consideration. We shall just a little later visit your Parish and will be pleased to discuss with the jury any matters you may desire to have clarified, in order that we may understand each other.

Please have this read at your next meeting and spread on the minutes for reference.

Whereas, the said amount of \$38,000.00 has been reduced to a Judgment of Court in accordance with the provisions of act 277 of 1916 in the matter No. 2346 of the docket of the 28th., Judicial District Court, Parish of Jefferson entitled Jefferson Commercial and Savings Bank vs. Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson:

Section 1. Therefore be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of

Whereas, by ordinance duly adopted the route from Barataria Boulevard commencing from the present terminis of said railway to Westwego has been changed so as to construct on a 30 feet strip neutral ground beginning at Barataria Road or Boulevard about 1500 feet west of Morgan's Louisiana and Texas Railroad & Steamship Company, and Texas & Pacific Railroad Company's tracks extending to Westwego and the Mississippi River which strip or portion thereof extends across the Southside Plantation, and other property according to a plan of survey designated by the Number 213, drawn by H. L. Zander, Engineer of this Police Jury and on file in the possession of this Police Jury, here referred to and made part hereof and greater Certainty: and,

Whereas, by reason of the time required for said Company grantee and assignee of said Franchise, to acquire said private rights of way necessary to carry out and complete extension from Barataria Boulevard, at the present terminis of said Railway at Amesville to Westwego, and by reason of present conditions constituting difficulties in securing prompt delivery of material supplies, rails, poles, wires, etc., thereof,

Be it ordained, that the West New Orleans Light & Traction Company, transferee, assignee, owner and possessor of the railway franchise under said original

and amendatory ordinances, evidencing the same, be and is hereby authorized to construct, maintain, and operate said railway extension from Barataria Boulevard at the present terminis in Amesville to Westwego, under and by virtue of said Ordinances and Franchises, and that said railway extension be completed on or before December 6th., 1917 without prejudice to any of its rights under the original ordinance granting said franchise, requiring completion within five years from June 6th.,

1914 that is to say on or before June 6th., 1919.

That certificates of indebtedness of the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana, are hereby authorized and directed to be issued in the aggregate amount of THIRTY EIGHT THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$38,000.00). Cattle roaming at large

Petition of property owners of Metairie Ridge Section asking the Police Jury to take steps to remedy the nuisance of Cattle and other live stock roaming at large was read, and on motion of Mr. Thompson, seconded by Mr. Clancy the following ordinance was adopted.

AN ORDINANCE.

Making it a misdeameanor for any person to permit any animal belonging to them to be upon the public road of the Parish of Jefferson, providing the penalty thereof

and the method of collecting said penalty.

Section 1, Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular session assembled that it shall be unlawful for any person or corporation to wilfully permit any animal belonging to them or it to be upon any public road of the Parish of Jefferson, except such animal be actual use at the time, or under the proper restraint in being taken from one place to another; that no loose or stray horses, goats, hogs, Cows, or other animals of any description shall be permitted upon the public roads of the Parish of Jefferson at any time, and all persons violating this Section of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction before any court of competent jurisdiction shall pay the fine of not less than one nor more than ten dollars for each animal, or suffer prisonment in the Parish jail for not less than five or more than twenty days.

Section 2, Be it further ordained, that the constables and deputy sheriffs of the Parish of Jefferson are hereby empowered to seize any animal found loose or astray upon the public roads and restrain the same in their possession until the owner pays the fine and cost assessed against him, and said animal shall be thus held as security for said fine and costs, and in the event said fine and costs are not paid within two days after said fine is assessed, then the said constable shall have the right to then and there auction the said animal off and sell it to the highest bidder for cash.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc, that in all cases arising under thos ordinance the owner of the Animal shall have right to obtain possession of his property by paying the mimimum fine of one dollar to the Justice of the Peace of the ward which the animal was taken, together with two dollars to the constable and two dollars to the Justice of the Peace as costs; provided in all cases where the owner of the Animal fails or refuses to pay that case shall be tried before the District Court.

Section 4, Be it further ordained, that whenever any officer shall take into his possession any animal astray or loose upon the public roads he shall immediately give the owner of said animal notice of said seizure, and if the owner fails or refuses to pay the fine and costs provided for in Section 3 of this ordinance, then the said officer shall make an affidavit against him for violating the provisions of this ordinance, place the said owner of the said animal under arrest, and forward the record to the District Court for action; provided that if said officer cannot ascertain who owns said animal by due inquiry then he shall post a notice of such seizure, together with a description of said animal at the office of the Justice of the Peace for that ward for four days, and if no one appears or claims said animal, then such officer shall immediately auction said animal to the last and highest bidder for cash to pay costs, fine, and expenses.

Section 5, Be it further ordained etc., that all fines collected under this ordinance shall be turned over to the Treasurer of the Parish of Jefferson and by him credited to the Road Funds, and each Justice of the Peace of Jefferson

on; the First of each month the number of arrests made under this ordinance, the amount of the fines collected, the number of animals sold and the price obtained thereof; provided that when animals for which no owner can be found are sold, the excess of the sale price over and above the fine and costs shall be remitted to the Parish Treasury and shall be spent on the Public roads.

Section 6. Be it further ordained, etc., that any Justice of the Peace failing to report to the District Attorney as provided in Section 5, of this Ordinance shall not be paid his salary until such report and remittance is made.

Section 7, Be it further Ordained, etc., that when ever any animals belonging to a Corporation shall stray upon the public road the person in charge of said animal shall be held liable under this ordinance, but the animal shall at all times be held to secure the payment of fine costs, and expenses.

Section 8, Be it further Ordained, etc., that all ordinances in conflict herewith or on the same subject matter be and the same are hereby

Be it Ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson: Whereas, the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, held in regular session on June 5th., 1889 adopted the following ordinance:

An ordinance granting rights of way etc., to the New Orleans, Fort

Jackson & Grand Isle Railroad Company.

Be it ordained, that the New Orleans Fort Jackson & Grand Isle Railroad Company and its assigns be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to construct, maintain and operate a railroad by steam or other motor power, with necessary tracks and bridges on Madison Street, from the lowerline of the Parish of Jefferson, Village of McDonoghville, as far as Hamilton Street, then across Hamilton Street, and then to enter from the rear of Copernicus Avenue, in the Village of Mechanickham and build a double track to the river on said street with the privilege to build all necessary switches and passenger depots, the specifications of same to be decided hereafter at the head of said Street necessary to operate said road, provided that the tract on Madison Street from the lower line of the Parish of Jefferson be laid on stringers to the intersection of this road with the Southern Pacific tracks and the streets through which they run be properly graded, repaired and kept in good order, with all necessary bridges and culverts, under the direction of the Parish authority, provided further that the double track on Copornicus Avonue be built on the Public neutral ground nearest the lower gutter, said gutter to be kept open to a width and a depth of two feet and a half and to be kept open and in good condition; and

Whereas, a controversy has arisen between the Police Jury and the City Council of the City of Gretna, and the New Orleans and Lower Coast Railroad

running through Madison Street.

(2) The grading of Madison Street.

(3) The removal of said tracks from the river side of Madison Street to the center thereof.

(4) The construction of said tracks on stringers.

Whereas, the New Orleans & Lower Coast Railroad Co., does not admit any legal obligation upon its part to remove said tracks or to cause same to be laid upon stringer, or otherwise to comply with the demand made on it by the Police Jury for the Parish of Jefferson and the City Council of the City of Gretna; and

Whereas, for the purpose of settling their difference and avoiding litigation, the Police Jury for the Parish of Jefferson, The City Council of the City of Gretna, and the New Orleans and Lower Coast Railroad Co., have compromised their differences and have agreed that said New Orleans and Lower Coast Railroad Co., its successors and assigns, shall do and perform the work hereinafter, referred to and described in full and complete satisfaction of all obligations assumed by and pertaining to it as the successor and assignee of the New Orleans, Fort Jackson & Grand Isle Railroad Co., and particularly all obligations of said New Orleans, Fort Jackson & Grand Isle Railroad Co., under the ordinance hereinabove set forth:

Now, therefore, be it ordained, The New Orleans and Lower Coast Rail-road Company its successors and assigns, shall be and it is hereby permitted to maintain its tracks now on Madison Street in its present location and construction, but said Company shall remove its track on Madison Street between Virgil and Americus Streets from its present location to the point at or above the middle of the street and relay same with proper railroad construction, but not on stringers as provided in said original ordinance;

Be it further ordained, that said New Orleans and Lower Coast Railroad Company, its successors and assigns, shall, with reasonal promptness, make all repairs necessary to the Culverts under its track on Madison Street, and that it be required to grade said street within the limits hereinabove mentioned, namely, between Virgil and Americus Street.

Be it further ordained, that the performance by the New Orleans and Lower Coast Railroad Company, its successors and assigns of the above and foregoing conditions shall be in satisfaction of its obligations as the successor and assignee of the New Orleans, Fort Jackson, and Grand Isle Railroad Company of the franchise granted in the foregoing ordinance.

All Culverts, grading and removals to be made subject to the approval of the Parish Engineer.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance the vote resulted as follows:

On motion of Mr. Burbank seconded by Mr. Thompson the regular order of business was suspended to allow I. B. Rennyson and others to address the Jury.

place a crossing at Surburan Acres, as instructed by the Jury, and on Metion duly seconded the matter was referred to the district attorney.

Mayor Gelbke of the City of Gretna, addressed the Jury, requesting that this body act in conjunction with the Board of Alderman of Gretna to build a public road from Gretna to the outfall canal: and on Motion of Mr. Rouprich seconded by Mr. Strehle a committee of three was appointed to take the matter up with the Board of Alderman of Gretna and property owners in that vicinity. The President appointed this committee Messrs. Rouprich, Burbank, Strehle.

School superintendent I. C. Ellis requested a donation of \$50.00 for the purpose of a canning outfit to demonstrate the canning of vegetable product of the Parish, and motion duly seconded the amount asked for was appropriated.

City Alderman A. G. Gugel asked the Jury to agree to pay on-half salary of \$60.00 per month for the chauffer of David Crockett Fire Company to operate the fire tractor, and on motion of Mr. Strehle seconded by Mr. Thompson a committee composed of Messrs. Terrebonne, Thompson and Durbank was appointed by the president to take up the matter with the Board of Alderman of Gretna.

On Motion of Mr. Thompson seconded by Mr. Clancy the secretary was instructed to have 500 cards printed warning owners of cattle and live stock roaming at large they will be prosecuted according to law.

Dr. Vinheder addressed the Jury relative to cattle dipping and advised the suspension of operation until the spring of 1918, but on motion duly seconded the doctor was instructed to continue dipping operations.

On Motion of Mr. Clancy seconded by Mr. Thompson the following ordinance was adopted:

AN ORDINANCE.

To regulate the Police of cattle in the Parish of Jefferson; to regulate live stock sanitary matters; to prevent the introduction and spread of Texas fever, or any infectious or contageous diseases of live stock; to provide for the appointment of two live stock sanitary inspectors for the Parish, prescribing their powers, duties and qualifications, to clothes all sanitary inspectors appointed by the Louisiana State Live Stock Board for this Parish with the same authority as the two inspectors created under this ordinance; and to prescribe penanties for the violation of this ordinance, and to repeal all ordinances or resolutions of this Jury in Conflict herewith.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson State of Louisiana, in regular session convened. That, in order
to carry out the proper measures concerning the Police of cattle, as
well as all other live stock in the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana,
there shall be, from and after the passage of this ordinance, two live
stock inspectors for the Parish of Jefferson, each of said inspectors
shall be appointed by the president of the Police Jury immediately after
the promulgation of this ordinance; they shall each receive a salary of
\$60.00 per month while actual engaged in the work they shall be required
to do

as hereinafter provided, payable out of the funds heretofore set aside by this Police Jury for cattle tick cradication in the Parish of Jefferson; and the said inspectors shall be residents of this Parish and State.

Section 2. Be it further ordained. That this rolice Jury does hereby accept from the Louisiana State Live Stock Sanitary Board and the United States Governor such finance and other assistance as the said Board and the said United States Government may offer for the eradiction of cattle fever tick and other infectious and contagious diseases among cattle and other live stock in this Parish, and to that end. and all live stock sanitary inspectors appointed by the Louisiana State Live Stock Board for this Parish are hereby clothed with the same authority as the two inspectors created under Section 1, of this Ordinance, with full power and authority to carry out the provisions of this Ordinance in this Parish, provided that all inspectors thus appointed by said Board, for this Parish shall not be paid any salary or other Compensation for their services by the Police Jury of this Parish unless it be out of funds contributed by said Board to this Parish for the purpose of paying said State inspectors, in which event, the said inspectors shall be paid only such amounts as may be designated by the Louisiana State Live Stock Sanitary Board.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that it shall be the duty of said Parish Live Stock Sanitary inspectors to carry out the provisions of this Ordinance relative to the Compulsory disinfecting of cattle in the Parish of Jefferson and the proper disinfection of cattle in the Parish of Jefferson and to the proper disinfecting of other live stock as hereinafter provided, and to do all other things required them by the rules and regulations of the Louisiana State Live Stock Sanitary Board for the eradication of cattle fever tick and other contagious diseases among cattle and other live stock in the Parish of Jefferson.

The said two inspectors shall serve during such periods of time as may be designated by the Chief Executive Officer of the Louisiana State Live Stock Sanitary Board, and as aforesaid, receive their compensation as above provided for the months in which they are actually occupied as inspectors under this ordinance.

Section 4; Be it further ordained, etc., that from and after the passage of this Ordinance, no cattle shall be driven, allowed to drift or move by rail, boat or other carrier into the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana, from area in the United States that is Quarantined by the United States Secretary of Agriculture to prevent the spread of splentic or tick fever in cattle until they have been dipped in an approved manner in the standard medical solution or otherwise disenfected under the supervision of a duly authorized inspector of the Louisiana Live Stock Sanirary Board or a veterinary inspector of the United States Bureau of Animal industry duly commissioned as an inspector of the Louisiana Live Stock Sanitary Board.

Section 5. Be it further ordained. That from and after the passage of this ordinance, Horses and mules entering the Parish of Jefferson shall be free of cattle ticks (Narharopus annulatus). When any cattle horses or mules are received at a railroad station in this Parish at any point in the United States that is quarantined by the United States Secretary of Agriculture to prevent the spread of splentic or tick fever in cattle, it shall be the duty of the said railroad agents

live stock sanitary inspector, and the cattle, horses or mules, must not be removed from the station stock-pen until permission has been received from the live stock sanitary inspector of this Parish, who may be nearest to the said railroad stock-pen or from a duly authorized inspector from the Louisiana State Live Stock Sanitary Board.

Section 6. Be it further ordained, that from and after the passage of this ordinance all persons owning or having in their charge as owners, agents or otherwise, cattle in the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana, that they are infected with or exposed to cattle fever tick, shall have all or such cattle at a regular disinfecting station situated in the Ward in which said person may reside, or in which his cattle may be, at such times as may be designated by the Parish Live Stock Sanitary Inspector or infected or by any of the inspectors appointed by the Louisiana Live Stock Sanitary Board working in this Parish for the purpose of having said cattle properly disinfected, provided, that all such persons shall, when said inspector intends to disinfect said cattle for the first time after the passage of this ordinance, receives a written notice from said inspector or inspectors, starting the day and date and place at which said cattle are to be brought and thereafter all of said persons shall be required, without further notice, to bring all of their cattle to the same station (unless another station be designated by the inspector in writing), for the purpose of hacing said cattle properly disinfected every 14 days, after the date of the first disinfecting, provided that if the 14th day fall on Sunday, said cattle shall be brought to said station for the purpose stated on the Monday following the said Sunday. That the words "Properly disinfected" within the meaning of the Section of this ordinance is intended to mean that said cattle shall be dipped in the standard arsenical solution provided for that purpose by the Parish of Jefferson.

Section 7. Be it further ordained. That from and after the passage of this ordinance, all persons owning or having in charge, as agents or otherwise in the Parish of Jefferson, any horses or mules that are infected with the said cattle tick, (Nargarepus Annalutus), shall have all of said horses and mules at regular disinfecting station in this Parish, situated in the ward in which said horses or mules may be at such times as may be designated by the Parish Live Stock Sanitary Inspector or Inspectors in the manner prescribed in Section 6 of this ordinance for the purpose of having said horses or mules properly disinfected, provided, that in the sense of this section "Properly disinfected" are intended to mean that said horses and mules shall be dipped in the standard arsenical solution provided for that purpose.

Section 8. Be it further ordained, that should any cattle horses or mules from any infected area drift, swim, or otherwise enter this Parish in violation of this ordinance, the same shall be quarantined and disinfected at the expense of the owner or owners thereof. Any infected cattle horses or mules within the Parish of Jefferson, the owner or owners of which, after due notice shall fail to disinfect in a manner

satisfactory to the inspector of this Parish,

shall be placed in quarantine and disinfected at the expense of the owner or owners and if the owner or owners, of said animals be unknown to the said inspectors, such animals shall be quarantined, disinfected, cared for, and any expense incurred shall be paid by the owner of such animals before the same are released by the inspector; all money thus collected shall be turned over to the Parish Treasurer and placed in the set aside for the eradication of cattle tick and other contagious diseases of cattle.

Section 9, Be it further ordained, That nothing in this ordinance shall be construed to amend, alter or modify any of the rules of Louise iana Live Stock Sanitary Board with reference to the authority to appoint inspectors, or the power of authority of said inspectors granted by the Statutes of the State of Louisiana, it being intended that the provisions of this ordinance shall be applied in conjunction with said Louisiana Live Stock Sanitary Board and the United States Bureau of Animal Industry.

Section 10. Be it further ordained, That any person, persons, inedividual, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction shall, for the first offense be fined the sum of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$20.00, or shall be imprisoned in the Parish jail subject to work on the public roads of the Parish for a term not less than 10 or more than 15 days, and on conviction of the second or subsequent offense shall be fined in the sum of not less than \$25.00, nor more than \$100.00, or imprisoned in the Parish Jail, Subject to work on the public roads of the Parish for a term not less than 20 days nor more than thirty days, or both such fine and imprisonment, in the discreation of the court.

Section 11, be it further ordained, That all ordinances or resolutions previously passed by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson in conflict with ordinance, be and the same are hereby revoked, especially a resolution previously adopting the rules and regulations of the Louismiana Live Stock Sanitary Board.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance the vote resulted as follows:

On Motion duly seconded the Jury then proceeded to the election of two inspectors of cattle dipping vats for Jefferson Parish, whereupon after a ballot, Messrs, F. L. St. Martin and John Ernst were duly elected to said positions.

On Motion of Mr. Clancy seconded by Mr. Rouprich the president was authorized to subscribe to \$200.00 of Liberty Loan bonds on behalf of the Parish.

The Jury then went into executive session as a board of reviewers of the assessment rolls of 1917.

After inspection of the assessment rolls as complied by Assessor J. B. Dauenhauer, Jr., it was resolved on motion of Mr. Rouprich seconded by Mr. Stritzinger that the rolls as submitted by the assessor be

approved and adopted, subject to the changes made in same.

Therefore, be it ordained that a building of said extension be completed on or before January 1st, 1920.

Roll being called on adoption of the above ordinance, the vote resulted as follows:

That there is hereby levied an annual license tax for the Parish of Jefferson for the year of 1918 upon each person, association of persons, or business firms or corporations pursuing any trade, profession, Vocation, calling or business

conducted, pursued, or carried on or operated within the limits of the Parish of Jefferson, Louisiana, which may be subject to such license tax under article 229 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana.

Section 2. That the annual license hereby levied is declared to be the same as and to be graduated in accordance with the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana now is force, and is hereby declared to be the same as to graduation and amount as the license laws of the State of Louisiana now in force provided for State purposes, and are to be determined in accordance herewith, to wit: Act 171 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana of the session of 1898 and the subsequent acts of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana. It is hereby decalred to be the intention of this body to herein levy the same

Annual tax Levee license tax for parochial purposes, both as to graduation and amount, as is now imposed by the General Assembly for State purposes, to which laws special reference is hereby made as being part hereof for the same purposes aforesaid; provided, further, that hereinafter for every business conducting a barroom, cabaret, coffee house, cafe, beer saloon, liquor exchange drinking saloon, grog shop, beer house, beer garden or other places where spirituous vinous or malt liquors, or intoxicating beverages, bitters or medical preparations of any kinds, are sold, directly or indirectly, in quantities of less than five gallons, the license shall be based on the annual gross receipts of said business as follows, to wit:

First Class -- When said gross annual receipts are \$50,000 or more, the license shall be \$2,000.

Second Class - When said gross annual receipts are \$40,000 or more, and less than \$50,000, the license shall be \$1,800.

Third Class -- When said gross annual receipts are \$30,000 or more and less than \$40,000, the license shall be \$1,500.

Fourth Class -- When said, gross annual receipts are \$20,000 or more, and less than \$30,000, the license shall be \$1,200.

Fifth Class- - When, said gross annual receipts are \$10,000 or more, and less than \$20,000, the license shall be \$1,000.

Sixth Class -- When said gross annual receipts are \$5,000 or more, and less than \$10,000, the license shall be \$800.

Seventh Class - When said gross annual receipts are less than \$5,000 the license shall be \$500. provided that no license shall be charged for selling refreshments for charitable or religious purposes; provided, further, that no establishment selling or giving away or otherwise disposing of stirits wines, alcholic or malt liquors in less quantities than five gallons shall pay a license less than \$500; provided further, that for the business of selling malt and vinous liquors exclusively in quantities of less than five gallons the license shall be one-half of that provided for the general sale of alcoholic boverages; provided, further, that nothing in this ordinance shall be construed as to exempt druggist who soll alcholic, vinous or malt liquors or other intoxicating beverages on the prescription of a physician or otherwise from the payment of the license herein imposed; provided, further that this ordinance shall not apply to the sale by druggist of tinctures or drug compounds in the preparation of which such liquors or intoxicating beverages are used and sold on the prescription of a physician or otherwise, and which tinctures and compounds are not intoxicating beverages

prepared in the evasion of this ordinance, nor of the local option laws; provided, further, that in all other respects the provisions of Act 176 of 1908 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana are hereby adopted as part of the ordinance and the penanties and procedure relative to the collection of said license therein provided are hereby adopted and made a part of the ordinance.

Section 3. That for all traveling shows giving preformances in this Parish a tax of \$5 shall be paid for each and every day preformances.

Section 4. That for every automobile operated publicly as a jit-ney" an annual tax of \$10. shall be paid by the owner or operator thereof.

Section 5 - - Be it further ordained that the procedure in the collection of parochial license herein levied, and that to ascertain the amounts due for same by the tax Collector, shall be the same as is now provided by the law for the State purposes, and particularly in Act 171 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana of the session of 1898, as amended by the subsequent acts of the said General Assembly and at subsequent sessions; and the penanties imposed upon and interest and costs to be collected from delinquents are declared to be the same and to be collected in the same manner as provided by said Act of the General Assembly as amended by subsequent acts, for State purposes.

Section 6 -- Be it further ordained, that the parochial license which are herein levied are declared to be for the purposes which may be required by the Constitution and laws of this State for the parochial purposes. Be it further ordained that from and after the adoption of this ordinance the tax collector shall begin to collect from each of the persons and firms, associations of persons and corporations pursuing within the limits of said Parish any trade calling, profession, vocation or business a license tax as herein provided. All license are due and collectable during the first two months of each year, and all unpaid license shall become delinquent on the first day of March of each year, and all firms who commence business after that date shall become delinquent unless the license is paid within ten days.

YEAS -- Rouprich, Strehle, Terrebonne, Burbank, Thompson, Luke, Clancy, NAYS -- NONE.

On motion of Mr. Rouprich seconded by Mr. Clancy the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, on account of the small salary of \$3000.00 presently paid to the District Judges of the State, one of the District Judges of the 28th Judicial District, whereof this parish is a part, has resigned, or is about resign, thereby causing a vacancy to exit in said office which must be filled by an election by the people, and.

WHEREAS, it is a well known fact, that out of the salary of \$3000. paid to our District Judges, their are compelled to pay their personal expenses, such as railroad fare, hach hire, and other incidental expenses in traveling from one parish to another in this District in the preformance of their duties, which leaves them a small income, for themselves and their families to live on, which income is not commensurate with the ability and learning on the men nor

does it comfort with the importance and dignity of the office; and,
WHEREAS, the present salary of \$3000.00 paid to our District Judges
was fixed twenty years ago, in the year 1898, and has never been changed,
although the purchasing power of said salary has decreased, while litigations has increased and the expenses of said Judges has correspondingly
become heavier as time elapsed:

WHEREAS, we understand that the stenographers of the Civil District Court in the City of New Orleans; cortain employees of the Dock Board, a large number of the Clerks of Court throughout the State, and in fact

numerous other clerical employees of public Boards in the State of Louisiana, equipped with nothing more than an ordinary literary education, are paid far more salary than the Judges of the District Court in the county Parishes, which said clerical Positions do not require the study or special training as is required of Judges of the District Courts; and,

WHEREAS, we believe their is a present necessity for a rearrangement and reorgainzation of the entire Judiciary system of the State of Louisiana, looking to a more efficient administration of the Courts of Justice, in order that able and efficient lawyers may remain in these positions or that some inducement may be held out to them to obtain the services of high class lawyers for these Judicial positions; and,

WHEREAS, we believe that although we have two District Judges in this 28th Judicial District, each of whom receive \$3000.00, per annum, one of them could handle this entire district and give the people a very efficient Administration of the Courts of this District and at the same time save money for the State and Tax-payers, provided that the salary of the one Judge be increased to the sum of \$5000.00, at least and that the term of office be increased to not less than eight years therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, That it is the sense of this Jury, that the 28th Judicial District of Louisiana, Comprising the Parishes of Jefferson, St. Charles, and St. John the Baptist, be placed upon a one Judge basis; that one of the Judgeships, in this District, be abolished entirely and the other Judgeship be placed upon a salary basis of not less than (\$500000) per annum, and that the office be filed by and through an election by the people and the term of said office be increased to not less than eight years; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we recommend to the Governor of Louisiana, the State Board of Affairs, the Louisiana Bar Association and the General Assembly of Louisiana, that some joint action be suggested or taken by them with a view of adopting an amendment to the Constitution of this State, reorganizing and re-arranging the Judicial system of Louisiana and the 28th Judicial District of Louisiana in particular, said action we hope, will be such as to carry into effect the object and purpose of this resolution, otherwise, if no relief is available or obtainable, then we suggest that the antiquated system now prevailing be continued and the paltry salary now paid to our District Judges be allowed to stand as at present.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the secretary of this Jury be and he is hereby instructed to forward a certain copy of this resolution to the Governor of Louisiana, the State Board of Affairs, the Louisiana Bar Association and the General Assembly of Louisiana.

AN ORDINANCE.

Permits to Lay pipe across public Road.

Prohibiting the construction of culverts, rice, flumes, syphons, water trunks, boxes, pipes or other conduits across the public roads of the Parish of Jeferson without permission being first obtained from the Police Jury, and requiring a deposit of \$25.00 to be made with the secretary of the Police Jury as a requisit for obtaining the permit; requiring the grantee of said permit to remove said culverts,

rice flumes, syphons, water trunks, boxes, pipes or conduits and requiring said grantee to replace said road in the same condition as previous to the construction of said works, or on his default providing for replacing of said road by the Police Jury at the expense of the grantee and providing a penalty for the violation of this ordinance.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, that from and after the passage of this ordinance it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, to construct any culvert, rice flumes, syphon, water trunks, box. pipe or other conduit under or across the public road in the Parish of Jefferson without permission being previously obtained from the Police Jury of the Parish of Jeferson.

SECTION 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that any person, firm or corporation desiring to construct any culvert, rice flumes, syphon, water trunks box, pipe or other conduits under or across a public road shall first make application, either to the Police Jury in regular or special session, or to the Police Juror of the ward in which the work is to be done, for a permit to cross said road with said work, and at the time of making said application for such permit shall deposit the sum of twenty five (\$25.00) dollars, which deposit shall be turned over to the Secretary of this Jury and on receipt of said deposit together with the approval of this Police Jury or the approval of the Police Juror in whose ward the work is to be constructed, the secretary

of this Police Jury shall issue a permit authorizing the construction of said work under or across the public road, and the secretary shall retain the deposit until such time as the Police Jury shall authorize him to refund same to the grantee of the permit.

SECTION 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that in the construction of said culvert, rice flumes, syphon, water trunk, box, pipe or other conduit across or under the public road, the grantee shall, after the laying and completion of said work repair and replace the said public road in the same shape and condition in which it was before any excavations were made or the construction work started, and shall be incumbent on said grantee to keep said road in good serviceble and passable condition and to so replace it as to eliminate holes and ruts and at the same time avoid the construction of a hill in said road until such time as the said culvert. rice flume, syphon, water trunk, box pipe or other conduit shall have been removed, and in case of the failure of the grantee to comply with the provisions of this ordinance, then and in that event the Police Juror in whose ward the work has been done. or the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson shall have the right to have said road repaired and replaced in the former condition and kept in shape at the expense of the grantee, and the expense therefore, shall be deducted from the deposit made by the grantee with this Jury.

SECTION 4. Be it further ordained, etc., that the said sum of Twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars shall remain on deposit with the secretary of this Police Jury as long as the culvert, rice, flume, water trunk, syphon, box, pipe

or other conduit remain under or across the public road, and before the grantee shall be entitled to the return of said deposit it shall be incumbent, as a condition precedent for the return of said deposit, to remove said culvert, rice flume, syphon, water trunk, box, pipe or other conduit and repair the said public road and replace it in the same condition as it was before the said work was laid across or under said road, and the repair and replacement of said public road shall be made with the same or likewise material, approved by this Jury, in a manner satisfactory to the Police Juror in whose ward said work is done, and in the event the grantee fails to comply with the provisions of this section within a reasonable time, say not exceeding thirty days after said work shall have been removed from under or across said road or should said works be abondoned by the grantee, then and in that event, the Police Jury shall have the right to remove said culvert, rice flumes, syphon, water trunk, box, pipe or other conduit and repair and replace said road in its former condition, and the expense for doing same shall be deducted from the deposit of the grantee, after which the balance, if any, shall be returned to the grantee.

SECTION 5. Be it further ordained, etc., that any one violating the provisions of Section 1, of this ordinance shall, upon conviction in court of competent jurisdiction, be fined not less than (\$5.00) nor more than twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars, or be imprisoned in the Parish Jail for not less than ten nor more than thirty days, or both in the discretion of the court.

SECTION 6. Be it further ordained, etc., that all ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be and they are hereby repealed, provided that this ordinance shall not apply to any franchise pursuant to law.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance,

the vote resulted as follows:

than 12 m. on June 5, 1918.

The Jury then adjourned and immediately reconvened in executive session as a board of reviewers of the assessment rolls for the year 1918. After inspection of assessment rolls as complied by Assessor J. B. Dauenhauer, Jr., it was resolved, on motion of Mr. Rouprich seconded by Mr. Terrebonne, that the rolls as submitted by the assessor be approved and adopted, subject to the corrections offered by the members of the Police Jury.

AN ORDINANCE

Granting to the CANADIAN OIL COMPANY, its survivors, lessees, successors and assigns, the right and privilege of laying in, through, and under the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, its streets alleys, bridges, highways, and other public ways and places, mains, pipes, conduits, paraphernalia, and other adjuncts and appurtenances, necessary, pertinent and convenient to vending and delivering, and to vend and deliver natural gas and gas fuel to consumers thereof, in the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, and any addition which may be hereafter made thereto, and prescribing the methods of exercising said rights and privileges.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson State of Louisiana, that the CANADIAN OIL COMPANY, its survivors, lesses, successors and assigns, be and it is hereby granted the privilege, right, power and authority to erect, construct and maintain at its own expense in, through and under the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, its streets, alleys, highways, bridges, and other public ways and places, mains pipes, conduits, manholes holders reducers, paramphernalia and other adjuncts and appurtenances necessary, pertinent and convenient to vending and delivering, and to vend and to deliver, natural gas and fuel gas, and to establish and to extend the same as may be required to furnish and vend natural gas and fuel gas to customers there-

of in said Parish of Jefferson, and any additions which may hereafter be made thereto and, also, to construct, maintain and operate one or more mains across the Mississippi River, and across any water or channel within the limits and jurisdiction of said Parish, and, also, to construct, maintain and operate reducers, generators, retorts, purifiers, condensers, and holders, boilers, engines, and such other necessary machinery and do all the things that become necessary to carry out the purpose and objects of said grantee, subject always to the limitations and conditions contained in the ordinance, or any other that may be in force at the time of the approval of this ordinance, and which affects the same, providing that his grant shall be limited to a period of twenty-five(25) years from the date of the acceptance by the

said grantee, its survivors, lessees, successors and assigns, by Notarial Act, and herein after prescribed and provided further, that this privilege is granted upon the following terms and conditions, to wit:

(A) That the said grantee, its survivors, lessees successors and assigns, shall pay semi-annually unto the Treasury of said Parish of Jefferson, three (3) per cent of the gross receipts from all sales of natural gas in said Parish, the amount of sales to be determined from the meter readings, and said semi-annual payments to begin six (6) months after the delivery of gas to consumers and patrons will have commenced, and to continue during the life of this franchise, and to be made each six months thereafter, each payment to be for gross receipts for the

period of six (6) months then ending,

That all connections with gas mains shall be made at the cost of said grantee, its survivors lessees, successors and assigns, from the gas mains of the edge of the foundation of the building on the property line, then to the property line itself, and from that point on they shall be made at the cost and expense of the owner of the property, provided, however, that the meters and other appliances for ascertaining the quantity of gas consumed by patrons, shall be installed and furnished the consumers and patrons, by the grantee, it survivors lessees, successors and assigns, without cost to said consumers and patron or patrons. Provided however that the said meter and appliances for ascertaining the quantity of gas consumed shall remain the property of said grantee, its survivors, lesses, successors and assigns; and that said grantee, its survivors lessees successors and assigns, shall vend and deliver gas along the line of any of the gas mains, to all responsible consumers, who are willing to pay therefor, and shall be obligated to make extensions to their mains when an average of one responsible customer to each 200 feet of such extensions enter into a written contract to purchase gas; the natural gas to be supplied under the ordinance shall be pure natural gas, and shall contain not less than eight hundred (800) British Thermal Units, to each cubic foot, measured at standard pressure temperature; and that it shall be the duty of the Parish Engineer, or other officer or officers, designated by the Sheriff and Police Jury of said Parish of Jefferson, to anylize from time to time, said natural gas, in order that the same may, at all times, be maintained at the standard herein provided for.

(C) That the said Grantee, its survivors, successors, lessees and assigns shall construct, acquire or acquire the use of gas in said Parish of Jefferson, and to be ready to supply has in one year from the acceptance of this ordinance, as hereinafter prescribed, provided, however, that any delays in operations caused by injunctions or other legal proceedings, or by conditions produced or growing out of the war, and by any causes not due to the default or negligence of the grantee, its survivors, lessees, successors and assigns, shall not be counted as a part of the period herein specified, but that the said period shall be extended for period of such delays.

SECTION II. Be it further ordained, etc., That all work to be done in the streets, alleys, highways and other public ways, and places, of said Parish of Jefferson by the grantee, its survivors, lessees, successors and assigns, under the provision of this ordianace, including all excavation for the purpose of relaying, repairing, removing and replacing any of the mains and service pipes or portions thereof, and of making connections for consumers, shall be done under the supervision, and to the

satisfaction of the Parish Engineer, or such officer or officers, as may be designated by the Sheriff and Police Jury of said Parish; provided that no street or alley shall be disturbed without the written consent and permission of said Parish Engineer, or other officer or officers, as the case may be; that all excavations shall within Thirty (30) days after the completion of the work or the accomplishment of the purpose for which same were made, be refilled, and the street, alley, or other public way or place, restored to the grantee its survivors, lessees, successors, and assigns with the same character of material or a like material to as good condition as it was before the excavations were made, and that in the event the street, alley or other public way or place, shall have not been restored within such time, through the fault or negligance of the grantee, its survivors, lessees, secessors and assigns, the said Parish shall have the right in the event the work of making the repairs shall have not begun within eight (8) days after written notice and demand, to make or cause such repairs to be made at the cost of the grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors and assigns, and in anything done under the provisions of this ordinance shall result in fury or damage to any person or persons, or to public or private property, the grantee, its sruvivors, lessees, successors and assigns, shall hold the said Parish harmless as against all loss arising to it from such injury or damage. SECTION III. Be it further ordained, etc., That the grantee, its suvivors lessees, successors, and assigns, shall during the life of this franchise vend and deliver natural gas and fuel gas, for general use for domestic and manufacturing purposes and the generation of power, at the following prices per month to each customer and patron, to-wit: Forty cents per one thousand cubic feet for first 100,000 feet.

Thirty-five cents per thousand cubic feet for next 900,000 cubic feet

Twenty-five cents per one thousand cubic feet for next 4,000.000 cubic feet. Fifteen cents per one thousand cubic feet for next 5,000.000 cubic feet, per month, delivered to him; provided that if payment of gas by consumers and patrons shall be made within ten days after presentation of monthly bills -- all consumers and patrons, paying an amount in excess of twenty cents per thousand cubic feet, shall be entitled to a rebate of five cents per thousand cubic feet. SECTION IV. Be it Further Ordained, etc., That the said grantee, its survivors, lessees, successors, and assigns, shall be permitted to make special rates to consumers of gas for manufacturing purposes, or for generation of power, on such terms as may be mutually agreed upon; provided, that the said rates shall not exceed the maxium rates provided for. SECTION FIVE. Be it Further Ordained, etc., That for the purpose of ascertaining the correctness of any statement of gross receipts rendered by the grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors and assigns, and the amount or amounts due the Parish of Jefferson as provided for in Paragragh "A" of Section 1, the Sheriff and Police Jury of said Parish, or such officer or officers as may be designated, shall have the right at such time as they may deem desirable and through such person or persons as they may from time to time be designated for the purpose, to have access to all the meters or other appliances for the determination of gas sold and delivered

and to all the books, accounts and papers of the Grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors and assigns showing the quantity of gas sold and delivered and the gross receipts therefore provided, that said right shall be exercised at such reasonable times and hours as not seriously to interfere with the ordinary conduct of the business of the grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors and assigns.

SECTION VI. Be it further Ordained, etc., That the grantee, its survivors. lessees, successors and assigns, shall be ready, as herein provided. to supply gas in said Parish of Jefferson, within one year from the date of acceptance hereof, and it will hold said Parish harmless against all loss arising from injury or damage to private property, which may be caused in the construction of mains and other works. SECTION VII. Be it Further Ordained, etc; That as a condition precedent to the exercise by the grantce its survivors, lessees, successors and assigns to the rights under the franchise, the said grantee, its suvivors lessees, successors and assigns, bind and obligate itself to furn- . ish to and deposit with the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, within three months after the date of the passage of this ordinance and on the date of acceptance of this franchise a surety amounting to the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) represented either in cash or Liberty Bonds of the United States of America as an evidence of good faith and to guarantee the faithful performance of this contract; provided, that the grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors and assigns, shall be prohibited from exercising the rights herein granted under this ordinance until the acceptance hereof and the deposit of the amount of the surety as herein provided for; and, provided further, that in the event of the failure of the grantee, its survivors, lessees, successors and assigns, to deliver gas in the Parish of Jefferson within twelve months from the date of acceptance of this franchise, then and in that event the said grantee, its suvivors, lessees, succesors and assigns shall ipso facto forfeit said Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) so deposited as hereinabove provided for, to the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson.

SECTION VIII. Be it Further Ordained, etc. That the said grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors and assigns shall at all times maintain sufficient pipe lines from gas well, or wells to furnish a maximum supply of thirty million cubic feet per day, for the requirements of the said Parish of Jefferson; provided, however, that until the said Parish requirements shall have reached the maximum of thirty million cubic feet per day, the said grantee, its suvivors, lessees successors and assigns, shall have the right and privilege to vend the surplus of the unconsumed maximum of the thirty million cubic feet of gas per day to other consumers and patrons.

SECTION IX. Be it Further Ordained, etc; That expenses incurred in the printing and promulgation of said franchise herein shall be borne by the grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors and assigns herein.

SECTION X. Be it Further Ordained etc; That this ordinance shall have full force and effect from and after its promulgation, and that all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed, insofar as they conflict therewith.

The roll being called on the adoption of the above ordinance, the vote resulted as follows:

The ordinance was thereupon adopted. The committee appointed by the mayor of the City of Gretna composed of Aldermen Gugel, Flesch and Tusson, appeared before the Jury to solicit co-operation with the City of Gretna to provide improved drainage in the rear of that city by the digging of a canal or ditch in the rear section.

On motion of Mr. Stritzinger seconded by Mr. Strehle, it was resolved that the Jury appropriate \$250 for said purpose, this amount to be tendered to the Gretna Board of Aldermen, and the work to be approved by the Parish Engineer.

On appeal of Mrs. G. L. Odom and Miss Cecile Gardere, the Jury appropriated \$25 to assist the Child's Welfare Work in Jefferson Parish.

The Jury then adjourned.

The sum of \$12 received from E. Goissenheimer, for ferry Franchise at Nine Mile Point, was ordered to be deposited to the credit of the general fund. The following agreement between the Jefferson Plaquemines Drainage District, represented by Geo. A. Hero, president, and the Police Jury, represented by Jules G. Fisher, president was read:

This agreement entered into this 7th day of August 1918 by and between the Jefferson Plaquemines Drainage district herein represented by Geo. A. Hero, President, Duly authorized by resolution of the Board, and the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, herein represented by Jules G. Fisher, its President, duly authorized by resolution of said Police Jury witnesseth:

The said Drainage District agrees to build, dig and construct a certain drainage Canal from the Outfall canal to and connecting the Verett Canal for the actual cost of construction not to exceed the sum of \$3,000.00, of which the sum of \$375.72 has been paid for work already done and receipt of which is acknowledged, and the balance is to be paid as follows:

\$624.28 when one third of the work is completed. \$1,000.00 when two-thirds of the work is completed. \$1,000.00 when the whole work is finally completed and accepted.

The above amounts are to be paid by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson. Should the cost not be equal to the sum of \$3,000.00 the said Police is to pay of construction

The Drainage District agrees to keep their drodge boat continuously on this work and not remove same until work is completed.

It is further agreed that the Drainage District shall dig a Canal from the Verret Canal, to about Lafayette Street, in the City of Gretna, for actual cost of construction, to be paid by the Police Jury, and after completing the work provided for in previous paragraph, said Drainage District shall continue to use their dredge boat on the work herein provided for and shall not remove same until both canals are completed.

On motion of Mr. Conzelmann seconded by Mr. Strehle the following resolution was adopted:

Be it resolved, that the assessor of the Parish of Jefferson be and he is hereby requested not to extend on the assessment roll for the year 1918 the special tax for the benefit of the said railway company.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, in regular meeting assembled, that it shall be unlawful for any railway corporation, its officers, agents, and employers to block or otherwise abstruct with its trains or cars, the public road crossings in this Parish for a longer period than ten minutes;

Be it further ordained, that any person, firm or corporation convicted of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable to a fine of \$25 or imprisonment in the Parish prison not exceeding thirty days, or both at the discretion of the court.

The Police Jury met this day in regular session, Members present -- Jules G. Fisher, president; A. Rouprich, Wm. E. Strehle, E. Stritzinger, E. M. Conzelmann, H. P. Burbank, A. S. Thompson, Wm. Luke, John Clancy.

Reading of the minutes of the last meeting was dispensed with, and they were approved as published in the Official Journal.

The regular order of business was deferred with to allow various

parties to address the Jury. On the request of Prof. L. W. Wilkinson, it was resolved, on motion of Mr. Conzelmann duly seconded, that the Police Jury appropriate \$50 per month to assist the Parish Council of Defense to provide Steno-

graphers and clerical help to the Council. . D. H. Theard, representing the Canadian Oil Company, whose franchise to furnish Natural gas throughout Jefferson Parish had become void after Sept. 16 through failure of the company to furnish bond submitted a propersition to the Police Jury offering full paid capital stock of

the Gulf State-Corporation to the amount of \$10,000 in lieu of a bond. On motion of Mr. Thompson seconded by Mr. Luke the proposition was rejected and the company required to furnish a bond.

On motion of Mr. Clancy seconded by Mr. Burbank, the following ordinance was adopted:

AN ORDINANCE.

Granting the Canadian Oil Company, its suvivors, lessees, successors and assigns, the right and priviledge of laying in, through, and under the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, its streets, alleys, bridges, highways, and other public ways and places, mains, pipes, conduits, paraphanalia, and other adjuncts and appurtenances, necessary, pertinent and convenient to vending and delivering, and to vend and deliver, natural gas, and fuel gas to consumers thereof, in the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, and any additions which may be hereinafter made thereto, and prescribing the methods of exercising said wrights and priviledges. SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson

State of Louisiana, that the CANADIAN OIL COMPANY, its survivors, lessees, successors and assigns, be and it is hereby granted the priviledges, right, power and authority to errect, construct and maintain at its own expense, in, through, and under the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, its streets, alleys, highways bridges and other places, mains conduits, pipes, manholes, holders, reducers, parapheralia and other adjuncts and appurtenances necessary, pertinent and convenient to vending and delivering, and to vend and deliver, natural gas and fuel gas, and to establish and extend the same as may be required to furnish and vend natural gas and fuel gas to customers thereof in said Parish of Jefferson, and any additions which may be hereinafter made thereto, and, also, to construct and maintain and operate one or more

mains across the Mississippi River, and across any other water or channel within the limits and jurisdiction of said Parish, and, also, to constrct maintain, and operate reducers, generators, retorts, purifiers, condensors, and holders, boilers, engines, and such other machinery, and do all the things that become necessary and expident to carry out the purpose and object of said grantee, subject always to the limitations and conditions contained in the Ordinance, or any other that may be in force at the time of the approval of this Ordinance and which affects the same, providing, that this grant shall be limited to a period of twenty-five years (25), from the date of the acceptance by the said grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors, and assigns, by Notarial Act, as hereinafter prescribed, and provided further, that this priviledge in granted upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

(A) That the said grantee, its successors, survivors lessees, and ase signs, shall pay semi-annually unto the Treasury of said Parish of Jefferson, three percent of the gross receipts for all sales of Natural gas in said Parish, the amount of sales to be determined from the meter readings and said semi-annual payments to begin six (6) months after the delivery of gas to consumers and patrons will have commenced and to continue during the life of this franchise, and to be made each six months thereafter, each payment to be for gross receipts for the period of six

(6) months then ending.

(B) That all connections with gas mains shall be made at the cost of said grantee, its survivors, lessees, successors and assigns, from the gas mains to the edge of the foundation of the building on the property line, or if there are no foundations of the building on the property line, than the property line itself, and from that point on they shall be made at the cost and expense of the owner of the property, provided, however, that the meters and other appliances for ascertaining the quantity of gas consumed by patrons, shall be installed and furnished to the consumers and patrons, by the grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors, and assigns without cost to the consumers and patrons, or patron. Provided, however, that the said meter and appliances for ascertaining the quantity of gas consumed shall remain the property of said grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors and assigns; that the said grantee, its survivors, lessees, successors, and assigns shall wend and deliver gas along the line of any of the gas mains, to all responsible consumers, who are willing to pay thereof, and shall be obliged to make extentions to their mains when an:

average of one responsible customer to each two-hundred (200) feet of such extensions enter into a written contract to purchase gas, the natural gas to be supplied under the ordinance, shall be pure natural gas, and shall contain no less than eight-hundred (800) British Thermal Units to each cubic foot, measured at standard pressure temperature; and that it shall be the duty of the Parish Engineer, or other officer or officers, designated by the Sheriff and Police Jury of said Parish of Jefferson, to anylize from time to time said natural gas, in order that the same may at all times, be maintained at the standard herein provided for. (C) That the said grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors and assigns

shall construct, acquire or acquire the use of gas mains in said Parish of Jefferson, and be ready to supply gas in one year from the acceptance of this ordinance, as hereinafter prescribed, provided, however that any delays in operation caused by injunctions, or other legal proceedings, or by conditions produced or growing out of the war, and by causes not due to the fault or negligence of the grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors, and assigns shall not be counted as part of the period herein specified, but that the said period shall be

extended of such delays. SECTION (II) BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc. that all work to be done in the streets, alleys, highways, and other public ways, and places, of said Parish of Jefferson by the grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors and assigns, under the provisions of this ordinance, including all excavations for the purpose of relaying, repairing, removing and replacing any of the mains, and service pipes or portions thereof, and of making connections for consumers shall be done under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Parish Engineer, or such officer or officers, as may be designated by the Sheriff and Police Jury of said Parish; provided that no street or alley, or other public ways or p places shall be distrubed without the written consent and permission of said Parish Engineer, or other officer or officers, as the case may be: that all excavations shall within thirty (30) days after completion of the works or the accomplishment of the purpose for which same were made, be refilled, and the street, alley, or other public way or place, restored by the grantee, its survivors, lessees, successors and assigns, with the same character of material or a like material to as good conditions as it was before the excavations were made, and that in the event the street, alley, or other public ways or places, shall have not been restored within such time, through the fault or negligence of the grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors and assigns the said Parish shall have the right in the event the work of making the repairs shall have been begun within eight (8) sayd after written notice and demand, to make or cause such repairs to be made at the cost of the grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors and assigns, and if any thing done under the provisions of this ordinance shall result in injury or damage to any person or persons or to public or private property, the grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors and assigns, shall hold the said Parish harmless as against all loss arising to it from such inquiry or damage.

SECTION (III) BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc; that the grantee, its suvivors lessees, successors and assigns, shall during the life of this franchise vend and deliver gas and fuel gas, for general use for domestic and manufacturing purposes, and for generation of power, at the following prices per month to each customer and patron or patrons, towit:

Forty cents per one thousand cubic feet for first 100,000 cubic feet. Thirty five cents per one thousand for next 900,000 cubic feet. Twenty five cents per one thousand cubic feet for next 4,000,000 cubic

Fifteen cents per one thousand cubic feet for next 5,000,000 cubic

Twelve cents per one thousand cubic feet for next 5,000,000 cubic feet Ten cents per one thousand cubic feet for next 5,000,000 cubic feet per month delivered to him; provided that if payment of gas by consumers and patrons shall be made within ten days after presentation of monthly bills, and consumers and patrons, paying an amount in excess of twenty—cents per thousand cubic feet, shall be entitled to a rebate of five cents per thousand cubic feet.

SECTION (IV). BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that the said grantee, its survivors, lesses, successors and assigns shall be permitted to make special rates to consumers of gas for manufacturing purposes, or for generation of power, on such terms as may be mutually agreed upon; provided, that the said rates shall not exceed the maximum rates herein provided for.

SECTION (V) BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that for the purpose of ascertaining the correctness of any statement of gross receipts rendered by the grantee, its survivors, lessees, successors and assigns and the amount or amounts due the Parish of Jefferson as provided for in "Parahrag" A". of Section 1, the Shoriff and Police Jury of said Parish, or such officer or officers, as may be designated, shall have the right as such time or times as they may deem desirable and through such person or persons as they may from time to time be designated for the purpose to have access to all the meters or other appliances for the determination of gas sold and delivered and to all the books, accounts and papers of the grantee, its survivors, lessees, successors and assigns showing the quantity of gas sold and delivered and the gross receipts therefore, provided, that said right shall be exercised at such reasonable times and hours as not sreiously to interfere with the ordinary conduct of the business of the grantee, its survivors, lessees, successors, and assigns.

SECTION (VI) BE IT FURTHER CRDATUED, etc., that the grantee, its survivors lessees, successors and assigns, shall be ready, as herein provided, to supply gas in said Parish of Jefferson, within nine months from the date of acceptenance here of, and it will hold said Parish harmless against all loss arising from inquiry or

damage to private property, which may be caused in the construction of mains and other works. SECTION (VII). BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that as a condition precedent to the exercise by the grantee, its survivors, lesees, successors, and assigns, of the right under this franchise, the said grantee, its survivors, lessees, successors and assigns binds and obligates its self to furnish to and deposit with the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson, within three months after date of the passage of this ordinance and on the date of acceptance of this franchise, a surety amounting to the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) represented either by a bond or in cash or in Liberty Bonds of the United States of America as an evidence of good fate and to guarantee the faithful performance of this contract; provided, that the grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors, and assigns shall be prohibited from exercising the rights herein granted under this ordinance until the acceptance hereof and the deposit of the amount of the surety as herein provided for; and provided, further, that in the event of the

failure of the grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors, and assigns to deliver gas in the Parish of Jofferson, within nine months from the date of acceptance of this dranchise, then and in that event the said grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors and assigns shall ifso facto forfeit said Five Thousand Dollars, (\$5.000.00) so deposited as hereinabove provided for, to the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson. SECTION (VIII). BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that the said grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors and assigns shall at all times maintain sufficient pipe lines, from gas well or wells to furnish a maximum supply of thirty million cubic feet per day, for the requirement of the said Parish of Jefferson; provided, however, that until the said Parish requirements shall have been reached the maximum of thirty million cubic feet per day, the said grantee, its suvivors, lessees, successors and assigns, shall have the right and priviledge to vend the surplus of the unconsumed maximum of thirty million cubic feet of gas per day to other consumers and patrons.

SECTION (IX). BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that any expense incurred in the printing and promulgation of said franchise herein shall be borne by the grantee, its survivors, lessees, successors, and assigns herein. SECTION (X). BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that this ordinance shall have full force and effect from and after its promulgation, and that all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed, in so far as they conflict therewith.
